VIRGINIA AND OHIO MEET IN THE "MUSIC CITY"

- The University of Virginia and Ohio University have moved its contest to Nashville, Tenn., due to Hurricane Florence.
- The game will be played at Vanderbilt Stadium, where UVA has played six times against Vanderbilt, most recently in 1975.
- Saturday is UVA's first regular season neutral-site game since UVA played Notre Dame in the 1989 Kickoff Classic at the Meadowlands in New Jersey.

 Ohio and Virginia are meeting for the second time in series
- history.

VIRGINIA VS. OHIO

- Virginia leads the all-time series with Ohio, 1-0.
- The Cavaliers won the only previous meeting with the Bobcats, 41-7, in 1993 at Scott Stadium.
- Former UVA quarterback Symmion Willis set a thenschool record with five touchdown passes against the Bobcats, playing into the third quarter before giving way to Mike Groh.
- The Cavalier defense held the Bobcats to an average of 2.8 yards per play as Ohio managed just 198 yards of total offense on 70 plays.
- Former UVA Cavalier and former two-time Super Bowl Champion with the Pittsburgh Steelers, James Farrior, earned Atlantic Coast Conference Rookie of the Week honors after posting a team-high 18 tackles in the win.



QB Bryce Perkins has rushed for 100+ vards in each of his first two career games at Virginia, which is a first in program history.

FIVE TOP STORYLINES

- · Virginia is playing a Mid-American Conference team for the fourth time in six seasons. Saturday is the first UVA owns a 12-2-1 all-time record against teams from
- When UVA first met Ohio in 1993, it broke a streak of 44 years between meetings with a team from the Mid-American Conference (Miami of Ohio, 1949).
- · QB Bryce Perkins rushed for 123 yards at Indiana last Saturday to become the first UVA quarterback since Bill Dudley in 1941 to rush for 100+ multiple times in the same season. Perkins' 123 rushing yards ranks No. 7 on UVA's single-game list for quarterback rushing. Perkins joins Dudley (4) and Bob Davis (2) as the only UVA quarterbacks to have at least two career games with 100+ yards rushing.
- · Virginia blocked a PAT (Juan Thornhill) and a field goal attempt (Charles Snowden) at Indiana last time out. It was the first time UVA blocked two kicks in the same game since the 2008 Richmond game when Matt Conrath and Nick Jenkins each blocked field goals.
- HB Olamide Zaccheaus has 168 career receptions. He needs 43 catches to break Billy McMullen's UVA record of 210. With 32 receptions, Zaccheaus will become only the second player in program history to reach 200 career receptions.

#NewStandard: BY THE NUMBERS

QB Bryce Perkins has been responsible for six touchdowns through UVA's first two games (four passing, two rushing).

Saturday is the Cavaliers' 16th all-time meeting with a team from the Mid-American Conference. UVA is 12-2-1 all-time against the MAC.

HB Olamide Zaccheaus has a reception in 31-straight games. The streak started in Miami against the Hurricanes on Nov. 7, 2015.

VIRGINIA FACTS

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT
The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

The first documented Cavalier on horseback was Francis Bell, a Virginia student from Dublin, Va., in 1947. Bell rode onto the field dressed as Cavaliers for Virginia's home football game with Harvard on the afternoon of October 11.

The Cavalier on horseback returned as the University's mascot in 1963. The UVA Polo Club provided both the horse and rider. However, the mounted Cavalier and his horse parted company in 1974 with the inception of AstroTurf at Scott Stadium.

The mounted Cavalier made its return in the Florida Citrus Bowl at the end of the 1989 football season. Due to its instant popularity, the Cavalier on horseback returned the following season on a regular basis and continues to lead the Virginia football team onto the field at the beginning of all home games.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wahhoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

- Virginia has three players that hail from the state of Ohio. QB Brennan Armstrong (Shelby), Chris Glaser (Solon) and C.J. Stalker (West Chester) all call Ohio home.
- Former Ohio head football coach Brian Burke was the head coach of the Bobcats from 1979-84. Prior to becoming the head coach at Ohio, Burke spent the 1977-78 seasons at Virginia as the offensive coordinator on two Dick Bestwick-coached teams. Under Burke at Ohio, a young graduate assistant got his first college coaching gig current Michigan State head coach, Mark Dantonio.
- Ohio associate head coach and defensive coordinator, Jimmy Burrow, was the defensive backs coach at Washington State and coached against student-athlete Bronco Mendenhall in 1986, Mendenhall's junior season at Oregon State. Ohio co-defensive coordinator and linebackers coach, Ron Collins, was a senior strong safety on that 1986 Washington State team that played against Bronco's Oregon State team.
- Ohio defensive line coach, Pete Germano, coached for five years at Fresno State and faced Bronco Mendenhall's 2015 BYU team in Provo. Eight current members of UVA's coaching staff were on that 2015 BYU staff. BYU won the game, 52-10.
- Ohio's senior associate AD for development, Ryan White, spent 11 years in Charlottesville as an assistant director with the Virginia Athletics Foundation.

OHIO SERIES NOTES

CAVALIERS IN NASHVILLE

- Saturday is UVA's 14th all-time game played in the Music City and only second at a neutral site.
- UVA is playing its first game in Nashville since winning the 2005 Music City Bowl against Minnesota, 34-31. That game was played at Nissan Stadium.
- UVA is playing at Vanderbilt Stadium for the first time since 1975.
- UVA has played at Vanderbilt Stadium six times, starting in 1928.
- UVA played at Vanderbilt five other times before the opening of Vanderbilt Stadium in 1922, which were played at Old Dudley Field.
- UVA also playd in 1902 at the University of Nashville, a 27-0 win.

UVA VS. THE MID-AMERICAN CONFERENCE

- Virginia is 12-2-1 all-time against teams that currently represent the Mid-American Conference.
- UVA is 2-0 vs. Akron, 0-1 against Ball State, 2-0 vs. Buffalo, 2-0 vs. Central Michigan, 1-0 vs. Eastern Michigan, 1-0 vs. Kent State, 1-0-1 vs. Miami (Ohio), 1-0 vs. Ohio and 2-1 vs. Western Michigan.
- The Cavaliers have never faced the MAC's Bowling Green, Northern Illinois or Toledo.
- When UVA first played Ohio in 1993 the Cavaliers had only previously played Miami (Ohio) from the MAC. Those two contests with Miami (Ohio) were played at Scott Stadium in 1948 and 1949.

VIRGINIA VS. THE STATE OF OHIO

- Saturday's game against Ohio will be UVA's eighth alltime game against a school from the state of Ohio.
- UVA is 5-1-1 all-time against schools from the state of Ohio.
- UVA lost at Ohio State in 1933 (75-0), tied Miami of Ohio in 1948 (14-14) and beat the RedHawks in 1949 (21-18).
- After the 1949 meeting with Miami (Ohio), UVA went 44 years before facing another team from the state of Ohio, when Ohio University came to Scott Stadium in 1993. UVA beat the Bobcats, 41-7.
- Akron came to Scott Stadium in 2002 and 2004, both were UVA wins. UVA beat Akron 48-28 in 2002 and shutout Akron, 51-0, in 2004.
- Kent State came to Scott Stadium in 2014 and lost, 45-13

OHIO VS. COMMONWEALTH OF VIRGINIA

- The Commonwealth is no stranger to the Ohio Bobcats.
- Ohio University has faced five of Virginia's 10 DI football programs and holds an all-time record of 5-6.
- Ohio has faced Hampton (1-0), Richmond (2-1), Virginia (0-1), Virginia Tech (0-4) and VMI (2-0).
- Saturday is Ohio's sixth all-time game in the Commonwealth of Virginia.
- The Bobcats have played three times at Virginia Tech, once at Virginia and once at Richmond. They also faced Richmond in the 1968 Tangerine Bowl in Florida.

MENDENHALL VS. THE MAC

• UVA head coach Bronco Mendenhall is facing a MAC team for only the second time in his career. He is currently 1-0 against the MAC after picking up his first career win at UVA in 2016 vs. Central Michigan, 49-35.

OHIO BAND PERFORMED AT 2002 UVA GAME

• While the Ohio football team played at Scott Stadium one previous time in 1993, the Ohio University Marching Band, known as the Marching 110, performed at the 2002 installment of the South's Oldest Rivalry when North Carolina visited Charlottesville. UVA won, 37-27.
• UVA had various college bands play at football games in 2002 during a transition period when UVA went from the pep band to today's current Marching Band.

Last Meeting

UVA quarterback Symmion Willis tied a then-Virginia school record by passing for five touchdowns as the Cavaliers coasted to a 41-7 Homecomings victory over Ohio the last time these teams played.

Willis completed 11-of-41 passes for 279 yards before being relieved by Mike Groh late in the third quarter. Groh's third-quarter scoring pass set a then-new UVA team mark for most touchdown passes in a game.

Willis threw for four touchdowns in the first half as Virginia took a commanding 28-0 halftime lead. He threw TD passes of 21 and 30 yards to wide receiver Tyrone Davis, seven yards to tailback Jerrod Washington and 87 yards to wide receiver Larry Holmes. Willis added a 49-yard touchdown strike to wide receiver Patrick Jeffers in the third quarter.

Trailing 34-0, Ohio managed a scoring drive late in the third quarter before UVA answered with a seven-yard touchdown pass from Groh to Jeffers.

Tailback Kevin Brooks finished as Virginia's leading rusher with 60 yards.

The Cavaliers averaged 9.51 yards per play, while Virginia held the Bobcats to only 198 yards of total offense. Linebacker James Farrior earned Atlantic Coast Conference Rookie of the Week honors after posting a team-high 18 tackles, including 10 unassisted. Linebacker Randy Neal was in on 17 tackles, 13 of them unassisted.



PERKINS CREATED MORE UVA FIRSTS AT INDIANA

- QB Bryce Perkins rushed for 123 yards at Indiana to become the first UVA quarterback to rush for 100+ yards in multiple game in a season since Bill Dudley did it four times in 1941.
- Perkins is also the first Cavalier in program history to rush for 100+ yards in each of his first two career games. Perkins also rushed for 108 yards in his UVA debut against Richmond on Sept. 1.
- •The only Cavalier to become relatively close to the feat was Gary Helman who rushed for 100+ yards in two of his first three career games in 1969. He rushed for only 40 yards in his collegiate debut against Clemson, but followed up in career game No. 2 with 158 rushing yards against Duke. Then Helman rushed for 148 yards in career game No. 3 against William & Mary.

CAVALIERS STRONG ON THIRD DOWN THROUGH THREE GAMES

- Through two games, Virginia has done well when its faces a third down situation of 10 yards or less. UVA is 9-of-12 (.750) on third downs where it needs 10 yards or fewer for a first down.
- Overall, UVA is 16-of-31 (51.6 percent) on third downs, which is No. 3 in the ACC and No. 24 nationally.

PERKINS ONE OF THE NATION'S TOP RUSHING QBS

- QB Bryce Perkins is No. 2 in the nation in quarterback rushing (231) among QBs that don't play in a triple-option offense. He is No. 4 in the national among all quarterbacks in rushing.
- Syracuse's Eric Dungey (244) is slightly ahead of Perkins among QBs that don't play in a triple-option.
- Navy's Malcolm Perry (274) and Georgia Southern's Shai Werts (246), both triple-option quarterbacks, rank No. 1 and No. 2 in the nation among quarterback rushing.

ZACCHEAUS APPROACHES 3,000 CAREER ALL-PURPOSE YARDS

- HB Olamide Zaccheaus needs 18 all-purpose yards to become the 19th Cavalier all-time to reach 3,000 career all-purpose yards.
- When Zaccheaus reaches 3,000 career all-purpose yards he will become the fifth Cavalier to pass the 3,000 all-purpose yard mark since 2012.
- Since the 2012 season Perry Jones, Kevin Parks, Darius Jennings and Taquan Mizzell all crossed 3,000 career all-purpose yards.

THORNHILL ALL OVER THE PLACE AT INDIANA

- SS Juan Thornhill helped UVA hold Indiana scoreless in the second half.
- •Thornhill blocked a IU PAT and returned it for a defensive two-point score. It was the first time UVA scored defensive extra points since Joe Crocker did so against NC State in 1994. Crocker's points came off an interception of a two-point conversion.
- Thornhill also intercepted the eighth pass of his career in the game and added seven tackles.

TOUCHDOWNS COMING AT A DISTANCE

- Of UVA's eight touchdowns in 2018, six of them have been scored from 20+ yards out.
- Byrce Perkins' 38-yard touchdown pass to Olamide Zaccheaus vs. Richmond is the longest scoring strike of the season for the Cavaliers.
- Perkins' 36-yard rushing touchdown against the Spiders is the second-longest scoring play of the season.

A PROGRAM FIRST AGAINST RICHMOND

- For the first time in program history, UVA had a quarterback run for at least 100 yards, a second player rush for at least 100 yards and a receiver collect at least 100 receiving yards in a game. Against Richmond QB Bryce Perkins rushed for 108 yards, TB Jordan Ellis rushed for 146 yards and HB Olamide Zaccheaus recorded 101 receiving yards.
- Twice before UVA had a quarterback rush for a 100+ yards, while another Cavalier also rushed for 100+ yards: 1967 vs. Buffalo (Frank Quayle, 151 and QB Gene Arnette, 119); 1975 vs. Maryland (QB Scott Gardner, 120 and Billy Copeland, 100).

TRUE FRESHMAN STARTING ON THE DEFENSIVE LINE

• Against Richmond, NT Jordan Redmond became the first UVA true freshman to start a season opener on the defensive line since 2002 when DE Kwakou Robinson started against Colorado State. He is only the fourth UVA freshman (true or redshirt) since 1986 to start a season opener on the defensive line. The others are DE Matt Conrath (RS-Fr., 2008 vs. USC) and NT Tim O'Conner (RS-Fr., 1986 vs. South Carolina).

ELEVEN CAVALIERS MAKE COLLEGIATE DEBUT IN SEASON-OPENING WIN

• UVA had 12 collegiate debuts against Richmond. QB Brennan Armstrong**, DT Tommy Christ, DT Aaron Faumui**, OT Bobby Haskins**, WR Tavares Kelly**, HB Billy Kemp**, OT Ryan Nelson, WR Ugo Obasi**, NT Jordan Redmond**, ILB Robert Snyder, OT Ryan Swoboda, OLB Noah Taylor**. **-denotes true freshman

PERKINS SHINES IN VIRGINIA DEBUT

- QB Bryce Perkins made his UVA and FBS debut against Richmond in the season opener.
- He finished with 108 rushing yards, 185 passing yards and accounted for four touchdowns (two rushing, two passing).
- With two rushing touchdowns, Perkins became the first UVA quarterback to rush for two touchdowns in a game since Jameel Sewell at Southern Mississippi in 2009.
- Perkins finished with 108 rushing yards, becoming the first UVA quarterback to rush for at least 100 yards in a game since Sewell (104) did so against Virginia Tech in 2009.
- Perkins finished with 185 passing yards, giving him the 10th most by a UVA quarterback starting his first game.
- Perkins' 36-yard rushing touchdown in the first quarter against Richmond was the longest rush by a UVA quarterback since Matt Johns' 42-yard rush against Kent State in 2014. Perkins followed that up with his career long rush of 47 yards at Indiana.

2018 VIRGINIA FOOTBALL

FIRST CAREER STARTS AGAINST RICHMOND

• LT Ryan Nelson, QB Bryce Perkins, NT Jordan Redmond, OLB Charles Snowden and CB Darrius Bratton all made their first collegiate starts against Richmond in the season opener.

VIRGINIA RUSHING GAME SPRINTS IN OPENER

- Virginia rushed for 301 yards against Richmond in the season opener, the most rushing yards so far in the Bronco Mendenhall era.
- It was the first time the Cavaliers rushed over 200 yards since tallying 262 against Virginia Tech in 2015 and the first time reaching 300 rushing yards in a game since putting up 357 rushing yards against VMI in 2013.

ARMSTRONG SEES TIME IN SEASON OPENER

- QB Brennan Armstrong made his collegiate debut against Richmond in the fourth quarter.
- Armstrong is the first UVA true freshman to play quarterback in a season opener since David Watford came off the bench against William & Mary in the 2011 opener.
- Armstrong enrolled early and took part of spring practice this year (like Watford in 2011).

BRONCO MENDENHALL IS IN SPECIAL COMPANY

- Bronco Mendenhall is one of three active coaches that has inherited at least two programs in his career that were coming off a losing season and in year one, or year two, played in a bowl game. The others to do it are Nick Saban (Alabama, LSU, Michigan State) and Mark Dantonio (Michigan State/Cincinnati).
- Mendenhall inherited a BYU team that went 5-6 in 2004 and in his first season the Cougars went 6-6 and played in the 2005 Las Vegas Bowl. Mendenhall took over a Virginia team that went 4-8 in 2015 and took the Cavaliers to the 2017 Military Bowl in year No. 2, finishing 6-7.

UVA HAS THIRD-MOST UNDERCLASSMEN IN THE NATION

- UVA has the third-most underclassmen on its roster in the nation with 88.
- UVA ranks No. 4 in the nation with 71 percent of its roster being underclassmen.
- UVA has 26 sophomores, 18 redshirt freshmen and 44 freshmen on its roster of 123.

- (OT) Marcus Applefield, (TE) Evan Butts, (P) Lester Coleman, (ILB) Malcolm Cook, (TB) Jordan Ellis, (OG/C) Jake Fieler, (CB) Tim Harris, (WR) Ben Hogg, (LS) Joe Spaziani, (ILB) C.J. Stalker and (DL) Dylan Thompson all hold their undergraduate degrees.
- Seven of the 11 walked "The Lawn" in May 2018 as graduates of UVA.
- Marcus Applefield ('18, Rutgers) and Dylan Thompson ('18 Ohio State) joined Virginia as transfers.
- UVA was No. 1 in the nation with 15 college graduates on its roster in 2016 and No. 1 in the nation with 13 college graduates on its 2015 roster

JOE REED IS A THREAT ON KICK RETURN

- In 2017, wide receiver Joe Reed returned 29 kicks in 2017 for 861 yards (29.7 yards per return), which was No. 1 in the ACC and No. 8 nationally.
- Reed had eight returns of 30 yards or more. That is the most by a Cavalier since Cedric Peerman returned nine kicks in 2005 for 30 yards or more.
- With only 56 kick returns to his career resume, Reed already ranks No. 4 all-time at UVA in career kick return yards with 1,539.
- Reed's 861 kick return yards in 2017 are the second most in a season by a Cavalier, trailing only Khalek Shepherd's single-season program record of 929 in 2012.
- Reed's best game this season was against Georgia Tech when he had a career-high 170 return yards and the program's eighth-longest return which went 92 yards for a touchdown
- Reed's 25.1 yards per kick return average was No. 3 in the ACC and No. 21 in the nation in 2016.

2018 VIRGINIA FOOTBALL

RETURN OF THE MACK

- Junior inside linebacker Jordan Mack is UVA's leading returning tackler after finishing 2017 with 114 tackles.
- While former Cavaliers Micah Kiser (145) and Quin Blanding (137) finished No. 1 and No. 2 in the ACC in tackles three years in a row, Mack finishing No. 5 in the ACC and No. 28 nationally in tackles was mostly an afterthought. In 2017 UVA was the only "Power 5" to have three players with at least 100 tackles. New Mexico State was the only other school in the nation to also accomplish that feat in 2017.
- Mack returns the second-most tackles in ACC entering 2018, chasing only Duke's Joe Giles-Harris (125), who finished No. 3 in the ACC in tackles in 2017.
- Mack is tied for No. 14 in the nation among all tacklers returning in 2018.

A THORN IN THE SIDE OF AN OFFENSE

- SS Juan Thornhill is one of the nation's best at what he does on defense.
- •Thornhill has played corner and safety at UVA and entered 2018 with 23 career starts between the two positions.
- Thornhill earned third-team All-ACC honors in 2017 after finishing No. 3 in the ACC in both interceptions (4) and passes defended (16).
- •Thornhill also is a stellar tackler, finishing 2017 with 63 tackles, including a career-high three for a loss against Navy in the Military Bowl.
- He also finished No. 2 on the team with seven special teams tackles.

STRONG SECONDARY RETURNS IN 2018

- While UVA lost a lot on defense with the graduation of FS Quin Blanding, DE Andrew Brown and ILB Micah Kiser, it returns a pretty good secondary that finished No. 7 in the nation and No. 2 in the ACC with 165.8 passing yards allowed per game.
- UVA's defense also ranked No. 9 nationally and No. 2 in the ACC in Red Zone defense in 2017.
- UVA entered 2018 with defensive secondary starts from Bryce Hall (13), Brenton Nelson (13), Juan Thornhill (12), Chris Moore (7), Joey Blount (1) and Tim Harris (1).
- CB Myles Robinson started three games in 2016 before suffering a season-ending injury.
- CB Tim Harris has 22 career starts entering 2018, but has missed most of 2016 and 2017 with injury.

BLOUNT LOOKS TO MAKE DEFENSIVE IMPACT IN YEAR TWO

- With the graduation of UVA's all-time career tackle leader Quin Blanding, sophomore Joey Blount looks to have a big impact on defense.
- As a first year in 2017, Blount led UVA with 13 tackles on special teams, 11 of which came on kickoffs.
- Blount recorded his first career double-digit tackle game against Boston College, notching 10 stops while seeing his most playing time on defense in 2017.
- Blount made his first collegiate start at cornerback at Pitt in 2017 for the injured Juan Thornhill.
- Blount is the son of former UVA safety, Tony Blount, who played for the Cavaliers from 1976-79 and owns the 11th-longest interception return (63) in program history.

DEFENSE GETS COOK AND HARRIS BACK FOR SIXTH SEASON

- UVA's defense welcomes the return of ILB Malcolm Cook and CB Tim Harris, each returning for a sixth season.
- Cook missed the entire 2016 season with a medical condition, while Harris received a medical hardship after appearing in two games. Harris suffered a season-ending injury in the 2017 season opener against William & Mary, receiving a second medical hardship in as many years.
- Harris owns 22 career starts, while Cook was slated as a starter at OLB in Bronco Mendenhall's 3-4 in 2016 before a medical condition almost halted his athletic career.
- Of Harris' 22 starts, 21 of them took place between 2013-15. Harris missed the 2013 season opener against Mendenhall's BYU team with an injury, but played in the last 11 games of the year. He later played in the 2014, 2015, 2016 and 2017 season openers.
- Injuries slowed Cook in 2014 and 2015 before missing 2016 with a medical condition. He made six starts in 2017, including a career-high 13 tackles in the season-opening win against William & Mary.
- Harris and Cook, both hail from Richmond, enrolled together in 2013.

COLEMAN A PROVEN COMMODITY IN THE PUNT GAME

- Senior Lester Coleman returns to the fold in 2018 after earning second-team All-ACC honors as a number
- Coleman finished 2017 No. 4 in the ACC with a 43.7 punting average. He led the ACC with 23 punts of 50 yards or more and was No. 2 in the ACC, No. 7 nationally, with 29 punts inside the 20. Also, 16 of his 29 punts inside the 20 were downed inside the 10-yard line. Coleman also set a UVA single-season record with six punts of 60 yards or more.
- Coleman sat his first three years on Grounds before making his collegiate debut in the 2017 season opener against William & Mary. He sat the 2015 and 2016 seasons behind former first-team All-ACC punter Nicholas Conte.
- Coleman did not punt in high school until his senior season. He had played defensive line and receiver at Woodberry Forest. His high school needed a punter and because Lester's older brother, James, had walked on to UVA as a punter in 2012, Lester was asked to punt without any experience. Lester's brother, James, redshirted at UVA in 2012 and punted two times over three seasons (2013-15) before using his fifth year to be the starting punter at Western Michigan in 2016.
- Lester Coleman averaged 52.3 yards per punt over his seven punts against Boston College (Oct. 21) to break the single-game UVA punting record.
- The previous record belonged to Ryan Weigand, who averaged 51.6 yards per punt at Wyoming in 2007.

ZACCHEAUS IS A BIG OFFENSIVE WEAPON

- Senior Olamide Zaccheaus returns for his fourth season with Virginia. The HB led UVA with 895 receiving yards and a UVA single-season record 85 receptions. He added five touchdowns.
- Zaccheaus is the only UVA receiver in program history to record two receptions of 80 yards or more. Zaccheaus notched a career-high 82-yard touchdown against Central Michigan in 2016. He then scored on an 81-yard touchdown strike at North Carolian in 2017.
- · Olamide is Nigerian for "the blessing has come."

- HB Olamide Zaccheaus has a reception in 31 straight games, which is tied for the second-longest active streak in the nation.

BRYCE PERKINS NOTES

IT IS A PERK TO HAVE A NEW QB ON THE BLOCK

- QB Bryce Perkins made his first career FBS start at quarterback against Richmond in the season opener.
- Perkins transferred to UVA last January from Arizona Western Community College after leading the Matadors to the 2017 NJCAA Championship game, before falling 31-28 to East Mississippi.
- Perkins originally signed as a top recruit with hometown Arizona State, but never saw action during his two seasons in Tempe. He redshirted the 2015 season and missed the 2016 season with an injury.
- Perkins' father, Bruce, lettered at Arizona State in 1988 and 1989 as a full-back and later played briefly in the NFL. Perkins' older brother, Paul, was a three-year letterwinner at running back with the UCLA Bruins and currently plays with the New York Giants. Perkins' uncle, Don Perkins, played eight seasons in the NFL with the Cowboys.
- Perkins, who passed for 1,311 yards and rushed for 353 yards (5.1 avg.) at Arizona Western in 2017, is replacing Kurt Benkert as UVA's quarterback in 2018. Benkert set UVA's single-season passing mark (3,207) and total offense (3,144) record in 2017.

PERKINS IS UVA'S STARTING QUARTERBACK

- Bryce Perkins, a transfer from Arizona Western Community College, became (vs. Richmond) just the second Cavalier quarterback to start his UVA debut since 1977 when Bryan Shumock started the season opener against NC State. Shumock switched to defensive back for the 1978 season and led UVA with four interceptions.
- Former UVA quarter bak Kurt Benkert also started his UVA debut against Richmond in 2016.
- Perkins was the 12th different UVA starting quarterback to start an opener in the last 14 seasons. The list includes: Kurt Benkert (2016-17), Matt Johns (2015), Greyson Lambert (2014), David Watford (2013), Michael Rocco (2011-12), Marc Verica (2010), Vic Hall (2009), Peter Lalich (2008), Jameel Sewell (2007), Christian Olsen (2006) and Marques Hagans (2005).

UVA QUARTERBACKS IN THEIR FIRST-CAREER START

- QB Bryce Perkins, a transfer from Arizona Western Community College, made his first collegiate start for the Cavaliers against Richmond (Sept. 1) in the season opener.

SCOTT STADIUM, HOME OF THE CAVALIERS

The Carl Smith Center, home of David A. Harrison III Field at Scott Stadium, with its unique architectural design, scenic setting on the University's Grounds and exceptional sight lines, is one of the nation's finest college football settings.

Opened in 1931, Scott Stadium might be one of the oldest campus college football stadiums in the nation, but you could never tell from its appearance. Numerous upgrades and expansions make it a modern home for the Cavaliers and their fans.

Scott Stadium was the gift of Frederic William Scott and Elisabeth Strother Scott, and was dedicated to the memory of his parents, Frederic Robert Scott and Frances Branch Scott.

Virginia played its dedication game at Scott Stadium on Oct. 15, 1931 against the Virginia Military Institute before a then-capacity crowd of 22,000. Prior to that season, the Cavaliers staged their home games at the University's Lambeth Field. Virginia has played 465 games in the historic venue. UVA's all-time record at Scott Stadium stands at 261-192-12.

Bronco Mendenhall Head Coach • Third Season

Bronco Mendenhall is in his third season as Virginia's head football coach after being named the program's 40th head coach on Dec. 4, 2015.

In Mendenhall's second season on Grounds in 2017 he directed UVA to its first bowl game since 2011. He oversaw a defense that ranked No. 7 in the nation and No. 2 in the ACC against the pass (165.8). The group was headed by three-time first-team All-ACC player Quin Blanding, ACC Defensive Rookie of the Year Brenton Nelson and third-team All-ACC cornerback Juan Thornhill. Blanding finished his illustrious career with more All-America honors and as UVA's all-time record holder with 495 career tackles. The 495 career tackles rank tied for No. 6 all-time

in ACC history and are the most by any ACC defensive back. Blanding finished each of his four seasons No. 2 in the ACC in tackles. Inside linebacker Micah Kiser was named the Campbell Trophy winner (Academic Heisman) and led the ACC in tackles for the third year in a row. Only Boston College's Luke Kuechly (2009-11) had previously accomplished the feat in league history. Kiser was also a three-time first-team All-ACC honoree and received multiple All-America honors over the 2016 and 2017 seasons, including becoming the first Cavalier since Tiki Barber in 1996 to earn both academic and athletic All-America honors in the same season when he was a second-team CoSIDA Acdemic All-American in 2016.

Mendenhall saw the conclusion of quarterback Kurt Benkert's collegiate career in 2017. Mendenhall saw the conclusion of quarterback Kurt Benkert's collegiate career in 2017. The UVA quarterback became the first player in program history to throw for over 3,000 yards in a season. Benkert finished 2017 with 3,207 passing yards and a single-season program record 298 completions. Benkert's 25 passing touchdowns in 2017 rank No. 2 all-time at UVA for a season. The starting quarterback for each of Mendenhall's first two seasons at Virginia, Benkert leaves No. 3 all-time at UVA in career passing yards (5,759) and passing touchdowns (46), which came in 24 career games for the Cavaliers.

In Mendenhall's first season on Grounds he oversaw a secondary that boasted first-team

In Mendenhall's first season on Grounds he oversaw a secondary that boasted first-tean All-ACC honoree and All-American, Quin Blanding. Blanding finished the season No. 2 in the ACC in tackles for the third year in a row with 120 stops. Inside linebacker Micah Kiser, an All-American and first-team All-ACC honoree, thrived to lead the ACC in tackles for the second year in a row with 134, which is tied with former Cavalier great Wali Rainer for fourth-most in a single season in program history. Kiser was also a second-team CoSIDA Academic All-American, becoming the first Cavalier since Tiki Barber in 1996 to earn both academic and athletic All-America honors in the same season.

Offensively, in Mendenhall's first season, Taquan Mizzell became the first player in

ACC history to record at least 1,500 career rushing and 1,500 career receiving yards. UVA quarterback Kurt Benkert set a couple of passing marks in UVA's new offense, including a program record for passing yards in a game with 421 against Central Michigan, which was only the second time in program history a UVA quarterback surpassed 400 passing yards in a game. Benkert reached 1,000 passing yards in four games and 2,000 passing yards in eight games, setting a program

record for fastest to that standard in a season.

Mendenhall came to Charlottesville after 11 years as the head coach at Brigham Young University. In his 11 seasons, from 2005-2015, Mendenhall compiled an overall record of 99-43 at BYU to rank 12th in total wins among all FBS teams during that time.

In the three seasons prior to Mendenhall becoming the head coach at BYU, the Cougars compiled an overall record of 14-21. Over Mendenhall's 11 years at BYU, the Cougars were one of only 11 programs to advance to a bowl game each season (includes the 2015 season). BYU joined by Alabama, Boise State, Clemson, Florida State, Georgia, LSU, Oklahoma, Oregon, Virginia Tech and Wisconsin on that list.

Among those 11 teams, only Florida State has achieved more bowl

wins (seven) than BYU's six bowl game victories.

The success of Mendenhall's leadership approach in running the BYU football program was highlighted in a management book, Running Into the Wind: Bronco Mendenhall — 5 Strategies for Building a Successful Team, written by Alyson Von Feldt and Paul Gustavson, a leading management consultant specializing in leadership development and organizational design.

Mendenhall was elected in 2013 to the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees as the District 8 Representative and also serves on the AFCA Ethics Committee.

- Ellis rushed for at least 100 yards for the second time in his career. He rushed for 136 yards at North Carolina in 2017.
- With both Perkins (108) and Ellis (146) rushing for over 100 yards, the duo becomes the 29th Cavaliers to do so in the same game. The last UVA to each rush for at least 100 yards in a game was Daniel Hamm (136) and Kevin Parks (135) in 2013 against VMI.
- With six catches, Olamide Zaccheaus has now recorded a reception in 30-straight games.
- Zaccheaus finished with 101 receiving yards, his fourth career game over 100 receiving yards
- With 101 receiving yards, Zaccheaus passed Heath Miller (1,703) and Patrick Jeffers (1,785) into seventh on UVA's all-time receiving yards list.
- With six receptions, Zaccheaus passed Kris Burd (162) for No. 3 all-time at UVA in career receptions.
- With Ryan Nelson's start at left tackle, UVA has now started a redshirt freshman at left tackle in a season opener two years in a row. In 2017, Dillon Reinkensmeyer started at left tackle against William & Mary.
- DE Mandy Alonso's sack in the second quarter is the first solo sack of his career. He shared a sack at Miami in 2017.
- In the second quarter, WR Chuck Davis returned the first punt of his career (-1).
