2nd-Ranked Florida State Finishes First Unbeaten ACC Season Since 2000

No. 25 Duke Takes Lead in Coastal Division; Miami, Virginia Tech Look To Keep Hopes Alive
Boston College and Record-Setting TB Andre Williams Head to Maryland; 8 ACC Teams Bowl Eligible

Florida State remains 2nd in the weekly BCS Standings for the third consecutive week...The Seminoles of Coach **Jimbo Fisher** concluded their ACC season unbeaten with an 8-0 mark...It was the 8th unbeaten Conference season for FSU since joining the ACC in 1992, but their first since 2000...The Seminoles have clinched the Atlantic Division title and a berth in the 9th Annual Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship, which will be played on Dec. 7 at Charlotte's Bank of America Stadium...Florida State, led by QB **Jameis Winston** and CB **Lamaricus Joyner**, steps out of conference this Saturday, as they host Idaho at Doak Campbell Stadium in Tallahassee (3:30 pm, ESPNU)...Upstart Duke, coached by **David Cutcliffe**, took a big step last Saturday toward becoming the Seminoles' Championship Game opponent...In defeating Miami, 48-30, coupled with Georgia Tech's loss to Clemson, the 25th-ranked Blue Devils (AP) are now in the drivers' seat for the Coastal Division crown...Wins by Duke this Saturday at Wake Forest and on Nov. 30 at North Carolina, would give the Blue Devils the Coastal Division crown and a berth in the ACC title game...A win this Saturday would guarantee Duke at least a co-division championship

and give them a ninth victory, something the school has not accomplished since 1941...The Blue Devils are led by the QB tandem of **Brandon Connette** and **Anthony Boone** and WR-PR **Jamison Crowder** in facing the Demon Deacons this Saturday at BB&T Field in Winston-Salem (ESPN2, Noon)...Wake Forest, coached by **Jim Grobe** will counter with senior QB **Tanner Price** and a defense led by NG **Nikita Whitlock**...Saturday's contest will be the 94th meeting of the schools on the gridiron in a series which began in 1889 in Raleigh...A stumble by the Blue Devils in either of their remaining games would send them into a tie with Georgia Tech, which has already completed its ACC campaign at 5-3, and also with possibly Miami, Virginia and North Carolina depending on how those teams finish...Divisional tiebreakers are located on page 22 of this release...The Jackets of Coach **Paul Johnson** will host Alabama A&M this Saturday at Bobby Dodd Stadium in Atlanta (1:30 pm, ESPN3)...Tech is led by RB **Robert Godhigh**, who had over 100 yards rushing (126) and receiving (103) against 7th-ranked Clemson last Thursday...Miami, looking to keep its Champi-

onship Game hopes alive, hosts Coastal Division foe Virginia this Saturday at Sun Life Stadium in Miami Gardens (Noon, ESPNU)...The Hurricanes, coached by **Al Golden** and led by QB **Stephen Morris**, need to win their final two games, have Duke lose and hope for an advantageous tie with teams they have beaten (UNC, GT)...They will be facing a Virginia team, coached by **Mike London** and led by QB **David Watford** that is coming off an open date and is looking to snap a seven-game losing streak...Virginia Tech has an open date this week, but the Hokies, who have dropped three of their last four games, still have hope if Duke cannot win out...Coached by **Frank Beamer**, Virginia Tech has defeated several of the teams with which it is likely to be tied, including Georgia Tech, Miami and North Carolina, but will first need to defeat their arch-rival Virginia on Nov. 30 and have Duke lose at least one of its final two games...Meanwhile, one of the impressive stories of the 2013 football season will continue to unfold this Saturday, when Boston College visits Maryland at

Capital One Field Byrd Stadium in College Park (3:30 p.m., Regional Sports Networks)...**BC TB Andre Williams** obliterated the ACC single-game and single-season rushing records last week on the same play, running for 339 yards on 42 carries against NC State, breaking the single-game mark of 329 yards set by Wake Forest's John Leach vs. Maryland in 1993...He has 1,810 yards this season, which bettered the old ACC standard of 1,798 by UVA's Thomas Jones in 1999...Maryland, coached by **Randy Edsall**, is coming off an impressive overtime win over Virginia Tech and will look to counter with an attack based around **QB C. J. Brown** and a defense led by **DL Andre Monroe**...The Terrapins and Eagles both became bowl eligible last Saturday and are two of the eight ACC teams that have qualified for the postseason...Two more league schools could become bowl eligible this Saturday as Pitt, coached by **Paul Chryst** and led by **DT Aaron Donald**, travel to Syracuse, coached by **Scott Shafer** and led by **QB Terrel Hunt**, for a game at the Carrier Dome (12:30 pm, ACC network)...Each team has five wins and the winner will be bowl eligible, while the loser of the game will still have an opportunity for postseason eligibility with a win on Nov. 30...North Carolina, coached by **Larry Fedora** and led by sophomore **QB Marquise Williams**, is also looking for bowl eligibility...The Tar Heels have won four straight games and host Old Dominion this Saturday at Kenan Stadium in Chapel Hill (12:30 pm, Regional Sports Networks)...They will be facing an ODU team coached by **Bobby Wilder** and led by **QB Taylor Heinicke**, who has completed 72 percent of his passes for over 3,800 yards this year... A few miles away, NC State, coached by **Dave Doeren**, hosts in-state rival East Carolina at Carter-Finley Stadium in Raleigh, N.C. (12:30 p.m., ACC Network)...The Wolfpack, led by **RB Shadrach Thornton** and **LB Robert Caldwell**, are looking to snap a 7-game losing streak while the Pirates are coached by **Ruffin McNeill** and led by **QB Shane Carden**, who has completed 72.5% of his passes for 3,320 yards and 29 TDs....7th-ranked Clemson completes the weekend when the Tigers of Coach **Dabo Swinney** host The Citadel Saturday at Memorial Stadium in Clemson (noon, ESPN3) in the final home game for senior **QB Tajh Boyd**... Boyd is already the ACC's career-record holder in touchdown passes (97) and TDR (121) and has thrown for over 11,000 yards in his career...A win by the Tigers would give them a minimum of 10 wins for the third straight year for only the second time in school history (1987-90).

Boston College's Andre Williams, UNC's Kareem Martin Named Walter Camp National

Offensive and Defensive Players of the Week

Boston College senior **RB Andre Williams** (Schnecksville, Pa.), who set ACC single-game (339) and single season (1,810) rushing records in the Eagles' 38-21 win over NC State and North Carolina senior **DE Kareem Martin** (Roanoke Rapids, N.C.), who had 3.5 sacks, forced two fumbles and recovered one in the Tar Heels' 34-27 win over Pitt, were named the Walter Camp National Offensive and Defensive Players of the Week. They become the 8th and 9th ACC players named Walter Camp National Players of the Week.

Boston College's Andre Williams

Re-Writes ACC Rushing Record Book;

Named Athlon Sports National Offensive Player of the Week

Boston College senior **RB Andre Williams** (Schnecksville, Pa.) was named National Offensive Player of the Week by Athlon Sports for his performance against NC State. On Williams' final carry of the day, a 17-yard run, he broke both the ACC single-game rushing record and the conference's single-season mark. He ended up with 339 rushing yards on the day, bettering the previous mark held by Wake Forest's John Leach against Maryland in 1993 (329). The yardage total also gave him 1,810 yards for the year, which is an ACC single-season record, breaking the old mark of 1,798 yards set in 1999 by Virginia's Thomas Jones.

Florida State Piling Up the Points

With 59 points against Syracuse, **Florida State** is the only team in ACC history to score at least 41 points in 10 straight games. FSU has scored 527 points in just 10 games this year, already the fourth-best single season total in league history. The record is 550 points scored by FSU last year in 14 games. The Seminoles are scoring at a league-record pace, averaging 52.7 points a game, which is four points higher per game than the league mark of 48.4 set in 1995 by the Seminoles.

Duke Ranked 25th By AP; 24th By USA Today Coaches Poll

For the first time since 1994, Duke finds itself ranked in the nation's Top 25 by the Associated Press. The Blue Devils were last ranked in the final AP poll of the 1994 campaign, when they were 25th. They debuted in the national polls this week: 25th for AP and 24th in the USA Today Coaches poll.

Clemson's Tajh Boyd Shatters ACC Marks for Passing TDs, TDR

Clemson senior **QB Tajh Boyd** (Hampton, Va.), who ranks 2nd on the ACC's career lists for career passing yardage (11,013) and total offense (12,015), broke the conference record for career touchdown passes last week against Georgia Tech. Boyd had previously broke the ACC standard for touchdown responsibility (TDR) and now has 121. His TD pass total is now 97, breaking the old mark of 95. Both records were held by former NC State standout Philip Rivers.

Georgia Tech's Godhigh Records Rare Double

Georgia Tech senior **A-Back Robert Godhigh** (Acworth, Ga.) recorded a rare double when he rushed for 126 yards on just 12 carries and caught five passes for 103 yards against 8th-ranked Clemson. Godhigh became the first ACC player to accomplish the feat since his former teammate, Orwin Smith did it against Kansas on Sept. 17, 2011. Before that, the next previous ACC player was Virginia's Mikell Simpson against Maryland in 2007.

North Carolina's Switzer Takes Back Two Punts for TDs in Same Game

North Carolina true freshman **WR Ryan Switzer** (Charleston, W.Va.) tied a UNC and ACC single-game record when he returned a pair of punts for touchdowns Saturday against Pitt. Switzer had a 65-yarder for a score in the 2nd quarter to give the Tar Heels a 24-3 lead. Then, with the game tied in the fourth quarter, he returned a punt 61 yards for the game-winning score with 4:46 remaining in the game. Switzer now has 3 punt returns for scores this year.

NC State's Ted Brown, Miami's Vinny Testaverde:

Standout Players from ACC Schools Named to Prestigious College Hall of Fame



A pair of standout players from Atlantic Coast Conference schools—NC State's Ted Brown and Miami's Vinny Testaverde will be inducted into the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame at its annual awards banquet on Tuesday, Dec. 10 at the Waldorf Astoria Hotel in New York City.

Since 2006, ACC schools have had 18 former players and coaches inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame and now total 95 inductees.

Brown and Testaverde will be inducted as part of the 2013 College Football Hall of Fame Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) Class at the 56th NFF Annual Awards Dinner on December 10, 2013, at the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel in New York City. They will be honored guests at the National Hall of Fame Salute at the Allstate Sugar Bowl in New Orleans on January 2, 2014 and officially enshrined in the summer of 2014.

Brown, a native of High Point, N.C., is one of the great running backs in Atlantic Coast Conference history. He is still the ACC's all-time record holder for career rushing yardage, having totaled 4,602 yards in a spectacular four-year (1975-78) career for the Wolfpack. Brown played in an era where bowl game statistics were not included among career totals, which would have added an additional 399 yards, giving him 5,001 yards for his career. A consensus All-American as a senior, Brown is the only football player in ACC history to be named first-team All-ACC four times. He still holds ACC career marks for most 100-yard games (27) and most rushing touchdowns (49) and he topped 1,000 rushing yards in three of his four seasons with the Wolfpack. He went on to an eight-year career in the National Football League with the Minnesota Vikings, rushing for over 4,500 yards and 53 touchdowns.

Brown becomes seventh former NC State player or coach to be inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame joining Dennis Byrd (2010), Lou Holtz (2009), Jim Ritches (1998), Roman Gabriel (1989), Jack McDowall (1975) and Buck Shaw (1972).

One of the most celebrated players in a Miami program stocked with mythical talent, Vinny Testaverde claimed virtually every major award during his senior season in 1986. He becomes the ninth Hurricane to be inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame joining Jimmy Johnson (2012), Russell Maryland (2011), Gino Torretta (2009), Bennie Blades (2006), Don Bosseler (1990), Ted Hendricks (1987), Andy Gustafson (1985) and Jack Harding (1980).

As a senior, Testaverde (1982, 1984-86) earned unanimous First-Team All-American honors, and he won the Heisman Trophy, the Walter Camp Player of the Year, Maxwell, Davey O'Brien and UPI Player of the Year awards. He led the Canes to three consecutive bowls, including the 1987 Fiesta Bowl National Championship game. He finished his collegiate career with more than 6,000 passing yards and 48 touchdown passes, and he still ranks in the top five in virtually every passing category in school history. Testaverde, who was a redshirt on Miami's 1983 National Championship team, went 23-3 as a starter playing for legendary coaches Howard Schnellenberger and Hall of Famer Jimmy Johnson.

Tampa Bay selected Testaverde as the No. 1 overall selection in the 1987 NFL Draft, and his pro career spanned 21 seasons with seven different teams. The 1998 All-Pro and two-time Pro Bowl selection finished his NFL career seventh all-time in passing yards (46,233) and eighth in touchdowns (275). The Elmont, N.Y., native currently resides in Florida where he plays an active role with the Children's Cancer Center of Tampa. Testaverde remains among only four Hurricanes to have their jerseys retired at Miami.

2013 ACC FB Game Summaries -- Nov. 14-16

Clemson 55, Georgia Tech 31

QB Tajh Boyd threw for 340 yards and four touchdowns to lead the eighth-ranked Tigers (9-1, 7-1), as they closed out the ACC portion of their 2013 schedule with a Thursday night win over Georgia Tech (6-4, 5-3) at Death Valley. Boyd now has 97 career touchdown passes, breaking the previous ACC record of 95 set by NC State's Philip Rivers from 2000-03. Boyd left Thursday night's game with a bruised collarbone and bruised sternum, but expects to play in next Saturday's home finale against The Citadel. WR Sammy Watkins had touchdown catches of 41 and 44 yards for the Tigers. Freshman WR Martavis Bryant had five catches for a career high 176 yards, including a 76-yard touchdown pass from Boyd. Watkins finished with 104 yards, his seventh game over the century mark this season. Georgia Tech RB Robert Godhigh rushed for 126 yards and two touchdowns and also had 103 receiving yards.

Florida State 59, Syracuse 3

The second-ranked Seminoles (10-0, 8-0) closed out ACC regular-season play unbeaten and officially clinched the Atlantic Division championship for the second straight year with a convincing win over the visiting Orange (5-5, 3-3) on Saturday. Redshirt freshman QB Jameis Winston completed 19 of 21 passes for 277 yards and two touchdowns in two quarters of playing time. RB James Wilder Jr. rushed for a pair of touchdowns, the second of which came on a career-long 37 yard run, and freshman Kermit Whitfield had 74-yard run for a touchdown, one week after returning a kickoff 98 yards for a score. TE Nick O'Leary caught a 19-yard scoring pass from backup QB Sean Maguire to set the FSU school record for career touchdowns by a tight end with 11. The Seminoles forced two turnovers -- their fifth consecutive game with more than one takeaway -- when DE Chris Casher stripped Syracuse backup quarterback Drew Allen and scooped and scored from 31 yards out, and then fellow DE Dan Hicks intercepted a pass on the next Orange drive.

Duke 48, Miami 30

QB Brandon Connette rushed for four touchdowns and passed for another as the Blue Devils (8-2, 5-2) won their sixth straight and took over sole possession of first place in the ACC Coastal Division with two games left to play. The win over the 23rd-ranked Hurricanes (7-3, 3-3) marks the first time since 1971 that the Blue Devils have beaten two ranked teams in the same season, and the eight wins are the program's most since 1994. Duke set a David Cutcliffe-era standard for rushing yards with 358 against Miami. RB Josh Snead led the way with 138 yards on just nine carries. RB Shaq Powell caught a 22-yard touchdown pass and had a 33-yard scoring run with 6:50 to play to help the Blue Devils break open the game. RB Dallas Crawford rushed for 115 yards, and QB Stephen Morris threw for 379 and two touchdowns to lead Miami.

Boston College 38, NC State 21

RB Andre Williams shattered a pair of ACC rushing records in his final home game as the Eagles (6-4, 3-3) posted their third straight win and earned bowl eligibility. Williams rambled for 339 yards to set an ACC single-game record (breaking former Wake Forest's John Leach's record of 329 set in 1993), and his 1,810 yards this season are also a conference record (breaking Virginia's Thomas Jones' mark of 1,798 set in 1999). Williams, who scored two touchdowns, also amassed the highest rushing total by an FBS player this season and broke Boston College's previous single-season rushing record of 1,726 yards held by Mike Cloud. PK Nate Freese also had a record-setting day for the Eagles, converting three field goals and three extra points to become the school's all-time leading scorer with 299 points. Three players -- starting QB Pete Thomas, WR Rashard Smith and reserve QB Garrett Leatham -- threw touchdown passes for NC State (3-7, 0-7). Smith was also on the receiving end of Thomas' scoring throw, a 9-yard toss midway through the second quarter.

Maryland 27, Virginia Tech 24 (OT)

QB C.J. Brown rushed for 122 yards and two touchdowns, including the game-winner on a 3-yard run in overtime as Maryland (6-4, 2-4) snapped a three-game losing streak and earned bowl eligibility for the first time since 2010 with an ACC road win at Virginia Tech (7-4, 4-3). DB William Likely had a 63-yard punt return for a touchdown as Maryland built a 21-7 lead, saw Virginia Tech scrap back to tie the game in regulation, but stood firm to prevail in OT. Brown's winning touchdown run in overtime came four plays after the Terrapins had limited Virginia Tech to a field goal on its opening possession of the extra period. RB Trey Edmunds led the Hokies with 61 yards rushing and one touchdown on 16 carries, and QB Logan Thomas threw a pair of touchdown passes. Maryland recorded 11 tackles for lost yardage, including three sacks and by DL Andre Monroe, in limiting the Hokies to 54 net rushing yards and 264 yards total.

North Carolina 34, Pitt 27

WR Ryan Switzer had touchdown punt returns of 65 and 61 yards -- the second for the go-ahead score with 4:46 remaining in the game -- as the visiting Tar Heels (5-5, 4-3) won their fourth straight game and moved to within one win of earning bowl eligibility. Switzer's winning touchdown return came after Pitt (5-5, 2-4) had rallied from a 27-3 second-half deficit to tie the score. The Panthers still weren't finished after Switzer's second return, as they drove as far as the UNC 26-yard line with 1:10 left to play, but Tar Heel DE Norkeithus Otis led a charge that stopped Pitt RB James Connor for no gain on a fourth-and-1 play. The Tar Heels sacked Pitt QB Tom Savage seven times, including 3.5 sacks by UNC DE Kareem Martin. Savage still managed to throw for 313 yards and two touchdowns as he attempted to rally the Panthers in the second half. UNC QB Marquise Williams had a pair of touchdown runs. Switzer also had an 85-yard punt return for a touchdown in last week's win over Virginia, giving him a school record three run-backs for the year.

ACC Notes By The Numbers

2 - North Carolina true freshman **Ryan Switzer** tied an ACC single game record with two punt returns for touchdowns against Pitt. The Charleston, W.Va., native, had punt returns of 65 yards and 61 yards for scores against the Panthers, the latter proving to be the game-winning play. Switzer tied an ACC record originally set by Andre Purvis of UNC in 1993, but really set by Miami's Devin Hester in 2004 against Louisiana Tech. Hester's were actually returns, while Purvis recovered blocked punts in the end zone.

3 - Maryland **QB C.J. Brown** topped 100-yards rushing for the third time this year when he ran for 122 yards on 23 carries, twice finding the end zone in the Terrapins' 27-24 overtime win over the Hokies. It marked the 5th 100-yard rushing game of his career.

5 - The number of TDR for Duke **QB Brandon Connette** in the Blue Devils' 48-30 win over Miami. Though he attempted just 9 passes, Connette scored four rushing TDs of 1,2,3 and 4 yards and added a 22-yard TD pass to Shaquille Powell.

9 - The number of times an ACC student-athlete has been honored by the Walter Camp Foundation as one of its National Offensive or Defensive Player of the Week this year. Boston College **RB Andre Williams** and North Carolina **DE Kareem Martin** were named the Walter Camp National Offensive and Defensive Players of the Week for their play last Saturday against NC State and Pitt, respectively. This marked the 2nd time this year the ACC swept both of the Walter Camp National weekly awards (Sept. 22). Martin is the 6th ACC player named National Defensive Player of the Week joining Virginia's **Anthony Harris** (Sept. 1); Maryland's **A.J. Hendy** (Sept. 22); Florida State's **Lamarcus Joyner** (Oct. 20), Duke's **Kelby Brown** (Oct. 27) and Duke's **DeVon Edwards** (Nov. 10). Williams joined FSU's **Jameis Winston** (Oct. 6) and Pitt's **Tom Savage** (Sept. 22) in earning National Offensive Player of the Week honors.

9.5 - The average number of yards per carry for Georgia Tech senior **RB Robert Godhigh**. Godhigh has run for 1,046 yards in his career on only 110 carries. His per-carry average would be an ACC career record for a minimum of 1,000 rushing yards. Former Georgia Tech A-Back Orwin Smith currently holds the mark with a 9.19 average.

13 - The number of years since **Florida State** started posted an undefeated season in ACC play. This year, FSU recorded its 8th undefeated ACC campaign, since joining the conference in 1992, but its first undefeated league year since 2000.

14 - Clemson junior **WR Sammy Watkins** recorded the 14th 100-yard receiving day of his career against Georgia Tech. Watkins had 5 catches for 104 yards, including TD grabs of 41 and 44 yards. Only Duke's Clarkston Hines (17), NC State's Jericho Cotchery (15) and Mayland's Jermaine Lewis (15) have had more.

20.5 - The average number of yards per catch for Clemson junior **WR Martavis Bryant** this year. Bryant has 34 catches for 698 yards and 4 touchdowns.

23 - Incredibly, **Syracuse** held more than a 23-minute advantage in time of possession (41:42-18:18) in its 59-3 loss to Florida State. The Seminoles ran just 45 plays in scoring 59 points.

28 - The number of touchdown passes for Florida State redshirt freshman **QB Jameis Winston** in just 10 games this year. Winston's total is an ACC freshman record, snapping the old mark of 25 set by NC State's Philip Rivers in 2000.

27.0 - The number of career QB sacks for Georgia Tech **DE Jeremiah Attaochu**. He is currently tied for 13th on the ACC career sack list with Virginia Clint Sintim (2005-08).

41 - The number of victories Florida State head coach **Jimbo Fisher** has led the Seminoles to in less than four seasons as head coach in Tallahassee. That is more wins than any other ACC coach in their first four seasons of coaching. Fisher has compiled a 41-10 mark with an .800 winning percentage. Fisher's predecessor at FSU, Bobby Bowden, holds the mark for any coach in their first four years in the ACC, having compiled a 43-5-1 record from 1992 through 1995.

48 - Duke's 48 points in a 48-30 win against 23rd-ranked Miami was the most points the Blue Devils have scored against a ranked opponent during the ACC era. The 18-point victory margin was also the highest for the Blue Devils since they have been in the ACC.

52.7 - The scoring average for **Florida State** this year. If maintained, it would be an ACC single-season record. The Seminoles have scored 52.7 points in 10 games and rank 2nd nationally. They are the first ACC team in history to score 41 or more points in their first 10 games of the year.

72 - The number of seasons since **Duke** won nine games in a season. With an 8-2 record, the Blue Devils have a chance with two games remaining to win 9 games for the first time since 1941. No Duke football team has ever won 10 games in a single year.

94 - Saturday's game between **Duke** and **Wake Forest** will be the 94th time the two teams have played each other in football since the series began in 1889 in Raleigh.

97 - The number of career passing touchdowns for Clemson senior **QB Tajh Boyd** at Clemson. He has broken the ACC career mark of 95 set by former NC State All-America Philip Rivers during the 2000-03 seasons. Boyd previously broke Rivers' long-standing record for career touchdown eligibility (112) now has 97 career TD passes and 24 rushing touchdowns for 121 TDR.

151.22 - The career pass efficiency rating for North Carolina senior **QB Bryn Renner**, who had his college career cut short with an injury last week. Renner is currently the ACC's career leader, nudging past Florida State QB Chris Weinke (151.15) who previously held the mark. Clemson **QB Tajh Boyd** (153.42) will have a chance to better Renner's mark as he completes his career this year.

265 - Virginia Tech head coach **Frank Beamer** has a total of 265 coaching victories in his career and leads all active NCAA FBS head coaches. Beamer is in 6th place on the NCAA FBS all-time wins list. The late Joe Paterno (298) is next on the list.

339 - The number of rushing yards for Boston College senior **RB Andre Williams** in the Eagles' 38-21 win over NC State. The total is an ACC single-game record, breaking the former mark of 329 yards, recorded by John Leach of Wake Forest against Maryland in 1993. On the same play on which he broke the ACC single-season record, he also bettered the ACC single season standard. The 17-yard run for BC's final score

386 - The number of career points for Clemson **PK Chandler Catanzaro**. He is 3rd on the ACC's career scoring lists with 65 field goals and 191 PATs and needs just eight points this week to move into second place.

763 - The pass receiving yardage for North Carolina **TE Eric Ebron** through 10 games this season. Ebron has set North Carolina school records for a tight end in receptions (49) and receiving yardage this year. He needs just 109 more yards in his final three regular season games to break the ACC single-season receiving yardage record for tight ends, set by Maryland's Vernon Davis (871) in 2005.

Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer Is NCAA FBS Active Career Leader in Wins

Virginia Tech's **Frank Beamer** is now the leading active head coach in the NCAA's FBS in career victories with a total of 265 triumphs in his 33-year coaching career. With a win over Rutgers in last year's Russell Athletics Bowl, Beamer passed former BYU head coach LaVell Edwards for 6th place on the all-time NCAA FBS coaching victory list. Penn State's Joe Paterno, with an NCAA adjusted total of 298, is next on the list in 5th place. Georgia Tech head coach Paul Johnson ranks 12th on the active FBS list with 153 career wins. Former Florida State head coach Bobby Bowden, who retired after the 2009 season, is now the NCAA FBS all-time leader with 377 victories.

Johnson, Beamer, London Among Top 20 Active Coaches in Wins Per Season

The ACC has four coaches who rank among the Top 25 active football coaches in the NCAA in wins per season with five or more seasons as a head coach. Georgia Tech's **Paul Johnson** leads the way among ACC coaches, currently averaging 9.19 wins per full season. Johnson's record puts him in 8th place nationally among active head coaches with five or more years of experience. Virginia Tech's **Frank Beamer** (17th, 8.06), Virginia's **Mike London** (tied for 18th, 8.00) and Clemson's **Dabo Swinney** (tied for 18th, 8.00) join Johnson among the Top 25 coaches in the nation in the NCAA's FBS. Florida State's **Jimbo Fisher** is off to an impressive start in his career as well, averaging 10.33 wins a year in his first three seasons at the helm at Florida State. NC State's new head coach **Dave Doeren** is also off to a strong start, averaging 11.5 wins a year in his first two seasons at Northern Illinois.

record (.804). His winning percentage has him in 2nd place among all ACC head coaches after four seasons, ahead of such prominent figures as NC State's Lou Holtz, Clemson's Danny Ford, Maryland's Ralph Friedgen and Georgia Tech's Bobby Ross. The best mark recorded by an ACC head coach in his first four years in the league was by Fisher's predecessor at FSU, Bobby Bowden, who posted a 45-5-1 record (.892). Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer has the 3rd-best record at 42-11-0 (.792), followed by Fisher and Clemson's Danny Ford (.772).

Clemson's Memorial Stadium Is Home Sweet Home for Tiger's Dabo Swinney



Clemson head coach **Dabo Swinney** has enjoyed coaching in the cozy and imposing confines of the Tigers' home field, also known as Death Valley. Now in his

sixth season as head coach of the Tigers, Swinney's teams won 19 of the first 22 home ACC games, a winning percentage of .864. That is second-best among ACC coaches who have coached a minimum of four seasons. He is only behind former Tiger coach Ken Hatfield, who posted a 12-1-1 mark in four seasons (.893). He is just ahead of legendary FSU coach Bobby Bowden, who also won more ACC home games than any other coach, with 62 triumphs in his 18 years in the league. Bowden's successor at Florida State, Jimbo Fisher is on a very good pace himself, having won 14 of his first 16 ACC home games and tying Swinney percentage-wise but needs this entire season to qualify for this list. Four Clemson coaches rank in the Top 10 including Hatfield (1st), Swinney (3rd), Danny Ford (7th) and the legendary Frank Howard (tied for 9th).

North Carolina Sets Offensive Records Under Larry Fedora

North Carolina Head Coach **Larry Fedora's** fast-paced offense had his team scoring at a school-record pace in his first year in Chapel Hill. UNC ranked 8th nationally in scoring offense in 2012, averaging 40.6 points a game while also ranked 14th nationally in total offense,



■ In Fedora's first 22 games as head coach at UNC, North Carolina has topped the 40-point mark 8 times.

■ Also, in his first 22 games, UNC has topped the 30-point mark on 14 occasions.

■ In his first 22 games at UNC, the Tar Heels have gained 400 or more yards of total offense 17 times.

■ UNC set school records in 2012 for most points, highest scoring average and highest average of total offense (485.6).

■ UNC's 487 total points in 2012 were the 7th-highest single-season total in ACC history.

NC State's New Head Coach Dave Doeren Among Nation's Winningest Coaches in 2011-12

NC State Head Coach, **Dave Doeren**, who has not wasted time in winning games in his first three years as a head coach at the FBS level. In fact, only one other coach in the Football Bowl Subdivision--Alabama's Nick Saban--has won more games than has Doeren in the past two seasons. He guided Northern Illinois to a 23-4 mark in 2011 and 2012, including the school's first berth in the BCS bowl game, a slot in the 2013 Discover Orange Bowl this past January. Only Saban, among current FBS coaches, posted more wins in the past two years than Doeren's teams at Northern Illinois. In all, three current ACC Coaches rank among the Top 11 coaches nationally in wins among current college coaches th past two years. Both Florida State's Jimbo Fisher and Clemson's Dabo Swinney have 21 wins in 2011 and 2012, tying Kansas State's Bill Snyder for the 8th.



Duke Experiencing Success Under ACC Coach of the Year David Cutcliffe

With an 8-2 record this year, David Cutcliffe, the ACC's 2012 Coach of the Year, has led the Blue Devils to 29 victories since coming to Durham in 2008. That may not sound like a great record, except when you consider that it is more wins than the Blue Devils totalled in the 14 seasons before Cutcliffe came to Durham. Cutcliffe led the Blue Devils to a 6-7 mark in 2012, their first appearance in a bowl game since 1994 and came within a few yards of claiming the Blue Devils' first winning season in 18 years and their first bowl triumph since 1961.



■ Duke is now bowl eligible for the 2nd straight year. The Blue Devils have never been to back-to-back bowl games.

■ In the five-plus years that Cutcliffe has been in Durham, he has already mentored a pair of quarterbacks who finished their careers ranked in the ACC's top seven of career passing yardage. **Thaddeus Lewis** (2006-09) threw for 10,065 yards, the second-highest total in league history and **Sean Renfree** (2009-12), threw for 9,465 career yards, the 7th-best total by an ACC player.

■ Also, under his guidance, Duke **WR Conner Vernon** became the all-time leading pass receiver in ACC history setting conference career marks for pass receptions (283) and pass reception yardage (3,749).

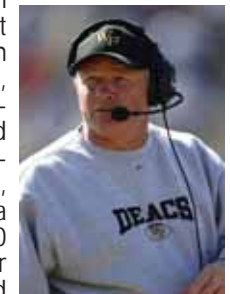
Wake Forest's Jim Grobe is Longest Tenured Coach in ACC Play

Wake Forest head coach Jim Grobe is in his 13th season as head coach of the Demon Deacons, the most of any current coach in Atlantic Coast Conference play. Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer, of course, is in his 27th year as head of the Hokies, but has been in ACC play only since 2004,

Grobe led his 2006 Wake Forest squad to the ACC championship.





ACC Announces 2013 Football Championship Game Legends Class

National Football Foundation College Hall of Famers

Terry Kinard, Tom Scott, Floyd Little and Johnny Majors;

ACC 50th Anniversary Team Members Kinard and Boomer Esiason Headline 2013 Class

Led by four members of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame and two members of the Atlantic Coast Conference's prestigious 50th Anniversary team, the ACC has announced the 2013 Class of Legends for its 9th Annual Dr Pepper Football Championship Game, which will be played in Charlotte, N.C. on December 7.

Leading this year's class are former Maryland quarterback **Boomer Esiason (East Islip, N.Y.)**, Clemson safety **Terry Kinard (Sumter, S.C.)**, Virginia defensive end **Tom Scott (Baltimore, Md.)**, Syracuse running back **Floyd Little (New Haven, Conn.)** and former Pitt head coach **Johnny Majors (Lynchburg, Tenn.)**.

Esiason and Kinard were both chosen in 2003 to be members of the ACC's 50th Anniversary team, which honored the 50 best players of the league's first 50 years, while Kinard, Scott, Little and Majors are members of the National Football Foundation and College Football Hall of Fame.

The Legends will be honored during this year's Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game weekend. They will be honored at the ACC Night of Legends sponsored by the Belk Bowl on Friday, Dec. 6, and on Dec. 7, during ceremonies at Bank of America Stadium for the 9th Annual Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship, which will be nationally televised with either a 7:45 pm (ESPN) or 8 p.m. (ABC) kickoff.

The group of 15 former gridiron standouts from current ACC schools includes a former ACC Football Player of the Year; 10 former All-Americans, including six first-team All-America honorees; and 12 players who combined for 97 years in the National Football League. Twelve of the Legends were drafted into the NFL, including six first- or second-round draft choices.

In all, the collection of players combined for two national championships, five ACC Championships and one Super Bowl title.

Joining the aforementioned selections are Boston College running back **Mike Cloud (Portsmouth, R.I.)**, who ended his collegiate career in 1998 as the Eagles' all-time leading rusher with 3,597 yards; Duke halfback and end **Wes Chesson (Edenton, N.C.)**, who ended his career with nine 100-yard receiving games, at the time the most in ACC history; Florida State guard **Jamie Dukes (Orlando, Fla.)**, a consensus first-team All-America for the Seminoles in 1985; and Georgia Tech tailback "**Rambling**" **Robert Lavette (Cartersville, Ga.)**, who is still the leading career rusher in Yellow Jacket history with 4,066 yards.

Completing the ACC Football Legends Class of 2013 are Miami's **Edgerrin James (Immokalee, Fla.)**, one of the most successful running backs in Hurricane history; North Carolina's **Ken Willard (Richmond, Va.)**, a second-team All-America fullback for the Tar Heels; NC State's famed Buckey twins, **Dave Buckey (Akron, Ohio)**, an All-ACC quarterback, and **Don Buckey (Akron)**, an All-ACC wide receiver, who keyed the Wolfpack's football resurgence in the 1970s under then head coach Lou Holtz; Virginia Tech wide receiver **Andre` Davis (Niskayuna, N.Y.)**, a first-team All-America and explosive performer who was one of the leaders of Tech's 2000 team which reached the BCS National Championship Game; and Wake Forest quarterback **Jay Venuto (Salem, N.J.)**, the 1979 ACC Player of the Year who led the Deacons to wins over three nationally-ranked foes that year.

ACC Divisional Tiebreaker

If more than one team in the same division is tied for the best winning percentage in its Conference games then, in order to determine the divisional champion, the procedures listed below will be followed.

A. Two-Team Tie

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
2. Winning percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall winning percentage (divisional and non-divisional), and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken from first to last using the league's tie-breaking procedures.
4. Overall winning percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined winning percentage versus all non-divisional opponents.
6. Winning percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based upon their order of finish (overall conference winning percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional opponents based upon their order of finish within the division.
7. The tied team with the higher ranking in the full Bowl Championship Series Standings following the conclusion of regular season games. If both tied teams are not ranked in the full Bowl Championship Series Standings, the computer ranking portion of the Standings will be used, eliminating the high and the low computer ranking, and averaging the remaining rankings.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw as administered by the Commissioner or Commissioner's designee.

B. Three (or More) Team Tie

(Three team (or more) tiebreaker procedure will be used to break all ties to identify the Championship game representative. Once a team is eliminated from the tie, the tie-breaking procedures restart for the remaining teams. If the three (or more) team tie can only be reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaking procedure will then be applied).

1. Combined head-to-head winning percentage among the tied teams.
2. Winning percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall (divisional and non-divisional) Conference winning percentage, and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken first to last, using the league's tie-breaking procedures.
4. Combined winning percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined winning percentage versus all non-divisional opponents.
6. Winning percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based upon their order of finish (overall conference winning percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional opponents based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking in the full Bowl Championship Series Standings following the conclusion of regular season games, unless the second of the tied teams is ranked within five-or-fewer places of the highest ranked tied team. In this case, the two-team tiebreaking procedure shall be applied between the top two ranked tied teams. If all tied teams are not ranked in the full Bowl Championship Series Standings, the computer ranking portion of the Standings will be used, eliminating the high and the low computer ranking, and averaging the remaining rankings.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw as administered by the Commissioner or Commissioner's designee.

2013 ACC Bowl Selection

Bowl Championship Series

The winner of the Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game will be selected to play in the Bowl Championship Series. Unless the winner of the Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game is ranked No.1 or No. 2 in the final BCS Standings and plays in the BCS National Championship Game, then the ACC Champion will serve as the host team of the Discover Orange Bowl in Miami, Fla. This year's Vizio BCS National Championship Game will be hosted by the Rose Bowl on Jan. 6 in Pasadena, Calif. The BCS may also select a second ACC team, if one is eligible for selection (Won at least nine regular season games and is ranked among the Top 14 in the final BCS Standings), and there is an At-Large berth available and the team is selected by one of the four BCS Bowl Games—Discover Orange (only if the ACC Champion is in the BCS National Championship Game), Allstate Sugar, Tostitos Fiesta and the Rose Bowl Game presented by Vizio.



After the BCS selections, then the selection order is:

3. Hyundai Sun Bowl, El Paso, Tex.
4. Belk Bowl, Charlotte, N.C.

Conditional Agreement*

*If Pac-12 or BYU is unable to fill their obligations and ACC has an available team

Conditions:

1. The runner-up of the ACC Championship Game, provided, is guaranteed not to fall further than the Hyundai Sun Bowl. The Sun Bowl will select the ACC Championship Game runner-up in any year that team is available to them.
2. Otherwise, if the bowl does not select the team available with the best Conference record, then it must choose a team that is within one conference win of the team (The "One-Win Rule") with the best conference record (ie. 5-3 to 6-2), The bowl may take a team that has more than a one game difference, only if the team is ranked more than five spaces above the team with the best Conference record in the final BCS Standings.
3. If, after all bowl selections have been made, and the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl has an opening due to the inability of either the Pac-12 Conference or BYU to provide a team, and the ACC has an available, eligible team, then the ACC will send a team to the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl

Selection Time Frame

The Bowl Championship Series will announce its selections on the BCS ESPN Selection Show on Sunday, December 8. In conjunction with the BCS selections, each Atlantic Coast Conference affiliated bowl game will make their selections in the order specified above. The ACC, the Bowls and individual schools will announce the selections after all selections are completed on Sunday.

Bowl Championship Series

Heading into its 16th and final year of determining the National Championship in college football, the **Bowl Championship Series (BCS)** is a five-game arrangement that is designed to match the two top-rated teams and to create competitive match ups among eight other highly regarded teams in four other games.

The bowl games participating are the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl, the Discover Orange Bowl, the Rose Bowl Game presented by Vizio and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. In addition, the BCS National Championship Game is played at one of the bowl sites, this year at Rose Bowl Stadium in Pasadena, Calif., on January 6, 2014.

The term "BCS conference" frequently is used incorrectly. Actually, all 10 NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) conferences are "BCS conferences" because the BCS arrangement is managed by the commissioners of the 10 NCAA FBS conferences and the director of athletics at the University of Notre Dame. The conferences are Atlantic Coast, The American Athletic Conference, Big Ten, Big 12, Conference USA, Mid-American, Mountain West, Sun Belt, Pacific-12, and the Southeastern.

Six conferences (ACC, American, Big 12, Big

Ten, SEC and Pac-12) have earned annual automatic qualification for the 2010-13 seasons by virtue of contracts to host the bowl games, and/or by having met a four-year metric based on competitive results (The ACC champion plays in the Discover Orange Bowl, the Big Ten and Pac-12 champs in the Rose Bowl presented by Vizio, Big 12 in the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl and SEC in the Allstate Sugar Bowl). Additionally, the highest-ranked champion of Conference USA, Mid-American, Mountain West, or Sun Belt conferences will be guaranteed a slot in a BCS game if that team is ranked 12th or higher in the final BCS standings, 16th or higher if its ranking is higher than that of a champion from one of the six conferences with automatic qualification. Other teams are eligible to be selected at large by a bowl game if they finish among the top 14.

The champions of the Big Ten and the Pac-12 will play in the Rose Bowl if they do not qualify for the National Championship Game. Other "regional consideration" tie-ins include the SEC champion in the Sugar Bowl, the ACC champion in the Orange Bowl and the Big 12 champion in the Fiesta Bowl if those teams are not ranked No. 1 or No. 2 in the final BCS Standings.

BCS Standings

The BCS Standings are composed of three elements that are weighted equally: the USA Today Coaches poll, 2) the Harris poll, and 3) the average of six computer poll rankings. The highest and lowest computer ranking is discarded each week with the computer average based on the remaining four rankings. The BCS Standings are compiled and released by the National Football Foundation eight times during the season, beginning this year on Sunday, October 20 and ending on BCS Selection Sunday, December 8. The first Harris Poll will be released on Sunday, Oct. 13.



COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

Beginning with the 2014-15 season, college football will enter a new era when a postseason playoff will begin. The format is simple: top four teams, two semifinals played in bowl games, and a national championship game played in a different city each year. Each semifinal will be played during the New Year's holiday with the national championship game in prime time on a Monday night at least a week later. It will be the best of all worlds, and the biggest innovation to the sport in decades.

A selection committee will choose the four teams for the playoff based on their performance during the regular season, including, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, championships won, and other factors. The teams will be seeded so that #1 will play #4 in one semifinal and #2 will meet #3 in the other, with the winners advancing to the national championship game.

The semifinals will rotate among six different bowls, extending the experience to more fans. In the years when the bowls are not hosting semifinals, the bowls will feature eight other teams in four compelling matchups.

The ACC and the BCS

The Atlantic Coast Conference has been a member of the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) since its inception for the 1998 season. ACC Commissioner John Swofford, is the only Commissioner to twice serve as BCS Coordinator, having done so in the 2000 and 2001 seasons and again in the 2008 and 2009 campaigns, as the ACC successfully administered the BCS on two separate occasions. Swofford is also the last Commissioner to serve as BCS Coordinator. In 2009, the BCS group named longtime college administrator Bill Hancock to serve as the first Executive Director of the Bowl Championship Series. Hancock has since assumed the duties previously handled by the coordinator. Prior to being named Executive Director, Hancock served four years as the Administrator for the BCS.

Bowl Championship Series; College Football Playoff

Longtime athletics administrator Bill Hancock achieved a unique triple accomplishment at the upper echelon of intercollegiate athletics when he was named the first Executive Director of the of the College Football Playoff, which begins after the 2014 season. Previously, Hancock was named the first full-time director of the NCAA Final Four and then was named the first executive director of the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) in 2009, a role he continues in this year until the completion of the BCS with this year's national championship game. Hancock served for 13 years as director of the NCAA's Division I Men's Basketball Championship--the three-week March Madness event that culminates at the Final Four. After a family tragedy, he retired in 2002 and for three years was the tournament's media coordinator on a consulting basis before being named BCS administrator in October of 2005. He is a 1972 journalism graduate of the University of Oklahoma and worked in sports information at his alma mater and also on the staff of the Big Eight Conference before being named director of the Final Four in 1989.

ACC Overtime Games

The ACC & Overtime

When Virginia Tech and Maryland ended regulation tied at 21 in week 12 of the 2013 season, it marked the 64th game featuring an ACC team that has had to go to extra sessions. Of the 64 overtime contests, a large portion of them--27--have been played in the month of September. Games have gone into overtime for ACC teams a total of 15 times in November, while 12 have been played in October, three in August, five in December and two in January (2006 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2012 Allstate Sugar Bowl). Of the 64 overtime contests, 32 have been ACC games while 32 nonconference games have gone into overtime. The home team has a 35-21 advantage in the 56 games played on campus. The team which wins the toss has a 33-31 record. Fifty of the games were decided in the first overtime with nine games in double overtime and five in triple overtime.
