VIRGINIA-MARYLAND SERIES

- Virginia owns a 101-73-1 lead in the all-time series with Maryland – it marks UVa's most wins against any ACC opponent.
- UVa has posted a 20-1 record against Maryland under the current coaching staff (since 2004) – the only loss came April 4, 2009, at Davenport Field.
- UVa swept the Terrapins last year in College Park (5-1, 27-4, 11-2).

VIRGINIA BASEBALL APPROACHING 2,000 WINS

- With 21 wins this season, the Virginia baseball program now owns 1,996 all-time wins (against 1,610 losses and 40 ties).
- Virginia currently is playing its 122nd baseball season.

PITCHING, DEFENSE COMBINE FOR LETHAL COMBO

- Virginia boasts a strong tandem of pitching and defense this year.
- UVa has allowed just 2.5 runs per game, third fewest in Division I. Texas A&M (2.1) and UCLA (2.3) are the only teams to allow fewer runs per game.
- Virginia owns a .985 fielding percentage this season; UVa entered the week at .984, which was third best nationally (San Francisco, .987; Texas A&M, .985).
- The Cavaliers set a school record in 2010 with a .977 fielding percentage.

PITCHING HAS BEEN LINCHPIN TO SUCCESS

- Virginia is the lone team to rank among the top 20 nationally in ERA, strikeouts per nine innings and fewest hits and walks allowed per nine innings.
- UVa's ranks in those categories as of the Monday report: ERA (13th, 2.27), strikeouts (2nd, 10.8), fewest hits/9 inns (7th, 6.68), BB/9 inns (17th, 2.37).
- UVa has recorded seven shutouts this year (two in 2010) and has allowed no more than four earned runs just once this year.

VIRGINIA CUTS DOWN ON BASES ON BALLS

- UVa pitchers have reduced their bases on balls by more than one per game this season, walking just 52 batters (2.2/9 innings). In 2010 UVa averaged 3.31 walks per nine innings.
- This has been key to UVa racking up an ACC-leading 2.08 team ERA.

HULTZEN CONTINUES TO DOMINATE

- Danny Hultzen leads the nation in strikeouts this season with 62. Trevor Bauer of UCLA ranks second with 58.
- He has struck out at least 10 batters in each of his five starts this season (16.27 per nine innings).
- Hultzen has issued only four walks (15.5:1 strikeout to walk ratio).
- UVa is 5-0 in Hultzen's starts this year and 29-8 in his career, including 19-2 since 2010; UVa is 12-0 when Hultzen racks up 10 or more strikeouts.
- Virginia has won 11 straight series openers with Hultzen pitching, dating to April 2, 2010 at NC State.
- He has allowed no more than six hits in any start.

- Hultzen broke the Virginia career strikeouts record last week. With 292 career strikeouts Hultzen has passed Seth Greisinger (1994-96), who had 290.
- By passing Greisinger Hultzen also moved into the top 25 on the ACC's all-time strikeouts ledger. He needs four strikeouts to move into 24th place.

HULTZEN CLIMBS VIRGINIA CHARTS

- Danny Hultzen continues his march up the all-time Virginia pitching charts.
- He is now second in career wins at UVa with 24; the record is 27, set by Jacob Thompson (2006-08).
- Hultzen is first in career winning percentage (.923; 24-2), just ahead of Robert Poutier (.917; 11-1).
- His career ERA of 2.28 stands fourth in UVa history, while his 292 strikeouts ranks first.
- He stands just outside the top 10 in innings pitched with 236.1. With 9.2 innings he will reach the top 10.

CAVALIERS SHUT DOWN BIG OFFENSES

- Virginia is yielding just 2.5 runs per game – third fewest in Division I baseball (Texas A&M, 2.1; UCLA, 2.3).
- It's not like UVa is padding its numbers against inferior offenses. UVa has played seven games (six wins) against top 20 offenses in the nation this year.
- UVa swept three games from Clemson (No. 10, 8.2 runs/game), won two of three against Florida State (No. 16, 7.9) and picked up a 7-3 midweek victory over James Madison (No. 1, 10.9).

SHUTOUTS PILING UP

- Virginia has recorded seven shutouts in its 21 wins this season. That represents more than the last two seasons combined (four in 2009, two in 2010).
- The school record for shutouts in a season is 11, set in 2005. That mark is tied for the ACC record with the 1977 Clemson team.

CAVALIERS GRIND OPPONENTS' RUNNING GAME TO A HALT

- Virginia has virtually stopped its opponents on the basepaths, giving up just seven stolen bases in 15 attempts (46.7 percent success rate).
- UVa has allowed the fewest stolen bases of any ACC team (FSU ranks second with 11 stolen bases allowed).
- In throwing out 53.3 percent of potential base stealers, UVa easily tops the ACC. UNC is second at 45.5 percent.

HICKS SWINGING A HOT STICK

- John Hicks has been on fire at the plate to start the year.
- He is batting a team-best .404, which ranks fourth in the ACC.
- Hicks is the lone Cavalier to reach base in every game this season.
- Hicks riding a team-best 10-game hit streak entering the weekend.
- Hicks has racked up a .407 batting average in six ACC games this season.

PROSCIA SCORCHING IN ACC PLAY TOO

- Steven Proscia boasts Virginia's best batting average in ACC play, swinging it at a .423 clip (11-for-26).
- He has driven in a team-high eight runs during UVa's ACC series against Clemson and Florida State.
- His .448 on base percentage in ACC play is second on the team only to Hicks at .452.

PROSCIA ETCHES NAME IN VIRGINIA CAREER RECORDS BOOK

- Steven Proscia continues to stand out as one of Virginia's top run producers.
- He has moved into eighth place in career RBI at Virginia with 147; he needs seven RBI to match Mike Lindner (1987-90) for seventh and 10 to tie Dan Grovatt (2008-10) for sixth.
- He is 20 shy of Sean Doolittle's school record of 167.
- Proscia also owns 48 career doubles, which is tied with Brian Sherlock (1995-98) and Bobby Rivell (1987-90) for sixth in the Virginia career annals.
- With his next double Proscia will tie Ryan Gilleland (1995-98) for fifth at UVa.

KLINE EMPHATICALLY SHUTS THE DOOR

- In his first season as the Virginia closer, sophomore righty Branden Kline has been brilliant with eight saves in as many opportunities.
- He ranks third nationally in saves, trailing only Tulane's Nick Pepitone and East Tennessee's Bo Reeder, who each own nine saves.
- Kline has struck out 19 in 14.0 innings. In that span he has allowed two runs, nine hits and four walks (1.29 ERA).
- He pitched in 24 games (eight starts) as a freshman and was entrusted with big starts in the championship games of both the NCAA regional and super regional.

TAYLOR SETS THE TABLE

- Chris Taylor has filled the leadoff slot in every game this season and has proven to be strong on that role.
- He ranks third on the team with a .313 batting average.
- He has notched hits in 20 of his 23 games this year and scored at least one run in all but five games.
- Taylor had 59 at bats in 29 games last year (13 starts) and hit .305.

VIRGINIA RANKS 20TH IN ATTENDANCE

- Entering the week (through 15 games), Virginia ranked 20th nationally in total attendance in 2011 with a total of 35,746 (15 games).
- UVa also stood 22nd in average attendance at 2,749 fans per game.
- Through 15 games last season, Virginia had recorded 32,945 fans, good for an average of 2,353 per game.

ROTATION SETS TONE FOR CAVALIERS

- Virginia's starting rotation of Danny Hultzen, Tyler Wilson and Cody Winiarski collectively has been strong over the first five weekends.
- The three have combined to go 9-1 with a 2.32 ERA in 89 innings. The trio has allowed just 64 hits and 20 walks while striking out 120.
- They have allowed more than two runs in a start just four times this year.

LAST WEEKEND: VIRGINIA WINS 2 OF 3 IN CLASSIC SERIES WITH FLORIDA STATE

- Virginia won two of three games against Florida State last weekend in a great series at Davenport Field.
- It also was UVa's second straight series win over FSU.
- For the first time in UVa history, three straight games went to extra innings.
- In the opener after a great pitching duel between Danny Hultzen and Sean Gilmartin, UVa rallied from a 3-1 deficit to send the game to extras, where Steven Proscia singled in John Hicks in the 11th for the 4-3 win.
- On Saturday the Cavaliers scored a run in the ninth to send the game to extra innings, where Jared King connected on his first career homer to provide UVa a 4-3 walkoff win in 11 innings.
- On Sunday the Seminoles rallied from a three-run deficit in the seventh before the Wahoos came back from four down in the eighth to send the game to the 10th, where FSU's Rafael Lopez won it on a solo homer.

2010: VIRGINIA SWEEPS MARYLAND

- Virginia swept Maryland last year in College Park (April 23-24), winning 5-1 in the opener and 27-4 in the second game of the Friday DH. UVa finished the weekend with an 11-2 win on Saturday.
- Virginia outscored Maryland 43-7 in the series and racked up 51 hits.
- Kenny Swab went 8-for-18 (.444) with four extra-base hits and seven RBI, while Steven Proscia was 7-for-18 (.389) with three homers and 11 RBI.
- Virginia picked up 19 doubles and 26 extra-base hits in the series.
- UVa's starting weekend rotation of Danny Hultzen, Robert Morey and Cody Winiarski each worked at least seven innings and gave up two runs or fewer.
- UVa scored its second-most runs ever in an ACC game in the 27-4 win.
- The Cavaliers extended their winning streak in College Park to 13 games.

WILSON SEAMLESSLY MOVES TO ROTATION

- After pitching out of the bullpen for most of his first three seasons, including 51 straight relief outings entering the season, Tyler Wilson has shifted to the weekend rotation in 2011.
- He is 3-0 with a 2.54 ERA this year. In 28.1 innings he has allowed just 24 hits and eight walks with 34 strikeouts..
- Wilson now owns 20 career wins, which is tied for seventh in Virginia history (20-7, 3.08 ERA).
- He ranks fourth in career pitching appearances at UVa with 77 (eight starts). Interestingly, one of his three starts prior to this season came against Maryland in 2009 (5.0 IP, 2 ER, 6 H, BB, 5 K); he also earned the win.

WILSON A CANDIDATE FOR SENIOR CLASS AWARD

- Tyler Wilson has been named one of 30 candidates for the 2011 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award.
- An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.
- A biology major, Wilson is planning to go into the medical field and become an orthopedic surgeon after his baseball career concludes.

SOUTHPAWS GIVE UVA MORE OPTIONS OUT OF 'PEN

- Virginia has added a quartet of left-handed options to its bullpen this year, with a healthy Scott Silverstein, sophomore Aaron Stull and freshmen Kyle Crockett and Ryan Ashoo.
- The lefties have combined to work 15.1 innings out of the bullpen and 19.1 innings total in 18 appearances.
- In 65 games last year, left-handers made just 25 appearances out of the bullpen for the Cavaliers.
- Silverstein did not pitch his first two seasons at UVa while recovering from shoulder surgery.

LEVINE MAKES MOST OF OPPORTUNITY

- Ryan Levine has played well when given the chance to DH; he did not play last year as a freshman.
- In 14 games (eight starts), Levine is batting .306 (11-for-36) with a pair of doubles and 10 RBI.
- He had two hits Tuesday against Towson.
- In the Saturday contest at Clemson, Levine went 2-for-4 with a pair of RBI singles.
- The switch-hitter has hit out of the cleanup position six times and once each out of the five- and six-holes in the last two weeks; UVa is 8-0 in those games.

HULTZEN NAMED NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE WEEK – AGAIN

- Virginia LHP/utility Danny Hultzen was named one of *Collegiate Baseball's* National Players of the Week Monday (March 11). He joined Baylor RHP Logan Verrett and Georgia Tech RHP Mark Pope in earning the honor.
- It marks the second time in three weeks that Hultzen gleaned this distinction from *Collegiate Baseball*.
- Hultzen improved to 4-0 on the season after firing 6.2 shutout innings Friday against Clemson, which came into the game as the top hitting team in the ACC with a .343 batting average. He fanned 14 Clemson batters and struck out at least two batters in six of the seven innings he worked during a 5-0 win against the Tigers.
- Hultzen also went 3-for-8 with three RBI at the plate for the week.

HULTZEN, COLEMAN GET ANOTHER CHANCE IN LINEUP

- After seeing little action at the plate last year, Danny Hultzen and David Coleman each have started strong at the dish.
- The two combined to get just 80 at-bats last season, but they already have eclipsed that total in 2011 – Coleman with 56 and Hultzen with 57 (113 combined).

UVA EARNS NATIONAL PITCHING STAFF OF THE WEEK AWARD

- Virginia's pitching staff was honored Monday (March 7) by InsidePitching.com as the National Pitching Staff of the Week following a 6-0 week.
- UVa's pitchers combined for three shutouts and posted a minuscule 0.67 team ERA for the week. UVa struck out 60 and walked just 12 in 54 innings.

O'CONNOR RANKS FOURTH IN WIN PERCENTAGE ENTERING 2010

- UVa head coach Brian O'Connor entered 2011 with a career record of 316-118-1 (.728) and a 126-71-1 record in ACC play.
- O'Connor's 72.8 winning percentage ranked as the fourth best mark among active NCAA Division I coaches entering the 2011 season.
- The only coaches who own a higher winning percentage are Mike Martin (Florida State), Mike Fox (North Carolina) and Gene Stephenson (Wichita State).

DEMAND RESULTS IN RECORD ATTENDANCE

- A school-record 125,959 fans walked through the turnstiles at Davenport Field in 2010 (14th nationally). UVa averaged 3,148 fans per game.
- Virginia obliterated all of its previous attendance records. The previous season highs were 1,774 per game and 65,661 total in 2007.
- Virginia played in front of 11 home sellout crowds, including a school-record 4,825 for the May 16 contest with North Carolina.

HULTZEN A PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN

- UVa junior southpaw Danny Hultzen was named a 2011 Preseason First-Team All-American by Baseball America, *Collegiate Baseball* and the NCBWA.
- The reigning ACC Pitcher of the Year, Hultzen posted an 11-1 record with a 2.78 ERA in 2010. In 106.2 innings he allowed 75 hits and 24 walks while striking out 123. Batters hit a league-low .193 against him.
- Hultzen led the ACC with 11 wins and 123 strikeouts. He ranked ninth nationally in fewest hits allowed per nine innings (6.33), 13th in strikeouts and 36th in ERA. He pitched at least six innings in 14 of his 16 starts.

EXPERIENCED PITCHING STAFF RETURNS

- Virginia returns 10 pitchers who saw time on the mound in 2010. In all, the group represents 73 percent of the total innings tossed by UVa hurlers last season.
- The group has combined to appear in 237 career games and pitch over 650 innings.
- Weekend starters Danny Hultzen and Cody Winiarski are both back, as is Tyler Wilson, who primarily has been a reliever in his career. Branden Kline and Will Roberts, who each spent time as weekday starters in 2010, also are in the pitching mix.
- Bullpen stalwarts Chad O'Connor, Shane Halley, Justin Thompson, Corey Hunt and Mayberry all return with plenty of experience.

PLENTY OF BATS BACK TOO

- Virginia returns five position starters from the 2010 team which was the second straight UVa squad to top the ACC in batting average.
- UVa hit a league-high .331 last season after leading the conference with a .327 average in 2009.
- The five returning starters all hit at least .300 last year, led by Keith Werman, who hit .414 last year – the fifth-highest average in program history.
- John Barr (.373), Kenny Swab (.328), Steven Proscia (.314) and John Hicks (.307) all topped the .300 mark.

NINE WAHOOS SELECTED IN 2010 MLB DRAFT

- Virginia had a school-record nine players selected in the 2010 MLB First-Year Player Draft.
- Seven of the nine signed contracts:
 - OF Jarrett Parker (2nd round, SF), 2B Phil Gosselin (5th round, ATL), RHP Robert Morey (5th round, FLA), RHP Kevin Arico (10th round, CIN), OF Dan Grovatt (11th round, PIT), INF Tyler Cannon (12th round, CLE) and Neal Davis (36th round, PHI).
 - RHP Tyler Wilson (35th round, CIN) and C/1B/OF Kenny Swab each have returned for their senior seasons.
 - The previous UVa high for draft picks in a year was six.

VIRGINIA LEADS NATION IN ERA LAST SIX YEARS

- Virginia led all NCAA Division I teams in ERA over the past six seasons, boasting a 3.26 team ERA.
- UVa is the only school to rank in the top 20 in the country in ERA each of the last six seasons, including No. 3 marks in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2009.
- Virginia also is the only team in Division I to rank among the top 20 nationally in ERA, strikeouts and fewest hits allowed each of the last three years.
