VIRGINIA-MIAMI SERIES

- Virginia leads the all-time series, 22-21, and has won five straight series against the Hurricanes.
- UM's last series win against the Cavaliers came in 2009 in Charlottesville.
- UVa took two of three games last season in Coral Gables, Fla.
- Since 2010, UVa is 13-4 against Miami.

LINEUP DOMINATED BY FRESHMEN

- Virginia has put at least four freshmen in 34 of the 35 starting lineups this year, including eight games with five rookies and three contests with six.
- Adam Haseley (RF/CF) and Pavin Smith (1B/LF) have started every game this year. Ernie Clement (CF/2B) missed his first game of the year on Wednesday.
- UVa has had first-years in all three outfield positions in eight games.
- Fourteen of UVa's 30 players are freshmen.

MCCARTHY BOOSTS LINEUP IN RETURN

- Junior OF Joe McCarthy returned to the Cavaliers' lineup Wednesday after missing 11 weeks following back surgery on Jan. 29.
- McCarthy went 2-for-3 with a walk and a run scored in his return.
- A 2015 Preseason All-American, McCarthy started all 69 games last season, batting .301 with six home runs and 49 RBI. He led the team with 16 doubles and 11 stolen bases and was one off the team lead with 77 hits.
- During his first two seasons at UVa, McCarthy was a .317 batter with 152 hits in 129 games.

TOWNS STEPS UP TO MAN CLEANUP SPOT

- Senior Kenny Towns has been UVa's top run producer out of the cleanup spot with a team-high 40 RBI. He ranks fifth in the ACC in RBI and is four shy of matching his career high for RBI, set in 2013.
- Towns is batting a team-leading .331 (17th in ACC) and also leads the team in hits (48) and doubles (13).
- He also leads the team in multiple-hit (14) and RBI (11) games.
- His streak of reaching base safely in 36 straight games came to an end in the first game of the March 7 doubleheader against Pitt; it ranked fourth in Division I baseball and tops amongst ACC players at the time.

WEATHER WREKS HAVOC ON HOME SCHEDULE

- Inclement weather has forced UVa to postpone or cancel four midweek games and relocate three weekend series.
- In all, Virginia has had 14 home games altered because of inclement weather.
- UVa was forced to shift its series with Marist (Feb. 20-22) to Charleston, S.C., and its round-robin tournament with Hartford and Seton Hall to Myrtle Beach.
- UVa played its first home game March 11 (but not until after a two-hour rain delay). UVa's midweek games with VCU and GW have yet to be rescheduled.

HASELEY GETS BAT GOING

- After a slow start at the plate to begin his career, Adam Haseley has gotten it going over the last three weeks.
- He hit .169 over his first 15 games, but is batting .333 since (30-for-90).
- Haseley is batting .313 in 23 games as the Cavaliers' leadoff hitter.
- He went 13-for-23 during UVa's five-game road swing from March 25-31, including 7-for-13 (.538) in the Notre Dame series.

INJURIES FORCE CAVALIERS TO JUGGLE LINEUP

- Virginia has been forced to alter its lineup after injuries have hampered three of its returning starters.
- The Cavaliers already have trotted out 19 different starting lineups in the first 36 games.
- Kenny Towns (3B) and Daniel Pinero (SS) are the lone Cavaliers to start every game at the same position.

THE WALKING WOUNDED

- In all, Virginia position players have combined to miss 113 games because of injuries this season.
- Starters Ernie Clement and Matt Thaiss each were out for the first time Wednesday and are day-to-day.
- Two-year starting OF Joe McCarthy had back surgery in late January and missed 11 weeks prior to his return Wednesday.
- Catcher Robbie Coman injured his knee on Feb. 21 and missed eight games.
- John La Prise is out for the season with a hip injury that limited him to four games early this season.
- Freshman Jack Gerstenmaier (hamstring) was sidelined since the end of September but also made his season debut Wednesday.
- Pitcher Riley Wilson (shoulder) also has been sidelined and has not played this season.

THAISS PROVIDES THUNDER IN UVA LINEUP

- Sophomore catcher Matt Thaiss has given the Cavaliers' lineup a jolt of power this season. He has blasted seven home runs (sixth in the ACC).
- Thaiss leads the team in batting (.328) and on base percentage (.444).
- Thaiss is batting a team-best .305 in ACC games.

DOHERTY GIVES CAVALIERS ANOTHER OPTION

- Junior Kevin Doherty has given Virginia a boost this season, both on the mound at the plate.
- He has been one of UVa's top left-handed options out of the bullpen, pitching in 12 games, which is third most on the team (1-1, 3.76 ERA, 2 saves, 26.1 IP, 21 K, .185 BAA).
- Doherty has stepped up of late at the plate and been in the lineup in each of the last 20 games, including 18 starts in the outfield.
- He has reached base safely in 17 of the last 20 contests. In 23 games total, he is batting .257 with 14 RBI.

KIRBY AIMS FOR ANOTHER QUALITY START

- Nathan Kirby has a penchant for earning quality starts during his two years as a starter.
- In the last two seasons, Kirby has recorded 21 quality starts in 27 attempts (quality start = at least six IP and three earned runs or fewer allowed).
- He has six quality starts in nine starts this year after recording 15 in 18 starts in 2014.
- Kirby currently leads the ACC in strikeouts (73) and is seventh in ERA (2.40).
- He also ranks 12th nationally in strikeouts.
- Currently with 222 career strikeouts, Kirby needs seven punchouts to reach the top 10 in the Virginia career annals.

VETERAN WADDELL SET FOR 44TH START

- Brandon Waddell has been a consistent presence in UVa's rotation in his three seasons. This marks his 37th straight regular-season weekend start, dating to opening day in 2013.
- Waddell is scheduled to make his 44th career start Sunday. That ranks as the sixth-most starts in program history.
- Waddell has an 18-8 career record and needs a pair of wins to reach the top 10 in UVa history.
- He also is nearing the UVa top 10 in innings pitched – with 247 2/3 innings, Waddell needs 1 2/3 innings to match Tyler Wilson for 10th in program history.

WALKS WILL HAUNT

- Virginia's pitching staff has been plagued at times by walks this year. UVa has walked six or more batters in 11 games (3-8 in those games).
- UVa walked 34 batters in the three-game series with Florida State and 22 last weekend at Georgia Tech.
- It marked by far the most walks in a three-game series during Brian O'Connor's tenure – the previous high was 21 in a 2007 series vs NC State.
- UVa ranked No. 1 nationally in walks/hits per nine innings (WHIP) at 1.03 last year and was tops in the ACC in fewest walks per nine innings (2.88).

FRESHMEN PROVIDE BOOST

- Virginia's freshmen have played a key role this year.
- UVa's first-year players have combined to record 49 percent of the position player starts and just over 50 percent of the at bats.
- The first-years also are responsible for 45 percent of the hits and runs.

JONES SETTLES INTO STARTING ROLE

- In his first season in the UVa rotation, Connor Jones has been solid, with a 4-2 record and 3.83 ERA.
- In 51 2/3 innings, Jones is limiting opponents to a .240 batting average, but he has walked 27 batters.
- Jones went a career-best 7 2/3 innings in the Game 2 win at Notre Dame. He also struck out a career-high nine batters.
- He has worked five innings or more in eight of his nine starts.

SBORZ TAKES OVER AS CLOSER

- Josh Sborz moved into the bullpen and the closer role this season and has recorded eight saves (second to FSU's Billy Strode with 10).
- Sborz is limiting opponents to a .159 batting average.
- He went 6-4 with a 2.92 ERA in 17 games (15 starts) during the 2014 season, primarily as the Saturday starter.
- Sborz took over for All-American Nick Howard, who saved an ACC-record 20 games last year and was taken 19th overall by the Cincinnati Reds in the MLB Draft.
- UVa closers own 155 saves in the 12 seasons under the current coaching staff (13.5 saves per season).
- Six of the seven closers since 2004 have been selected in the MLB Draft, including five in the top 10 rounds.

LA PRISE OUT FOR SEASON

- Virginia INF/OF John La Prise had hip surgery on Wednesday (April 1) and will miss the remainder of the season.
- His scheduled recovery period is approximately six months.
- La Prise was slated to be the Cavaliers' starting center fielder heading into the year but played in just four games early this season while battling the injury.
- La Prise batted .348 with 10 doubles and 17 RBI in 2014. He was fifth on the team with 62 hits and had the second-most hits of any returning Cavalier this year.

CAVALIERS ADD PAIR FROM CLUB TEAM

- With injuries causing some major depth issues early this season, Virginia has added a pair of players to the roster. Both were members of the UVa club team.
- Catcher Ben Cassillo, a freshman, is wearing No. 41, while senior infielder Kevin Radford sports No. 5.
- Cassillo is a native of Latham, N.Y., while Radford hails from Norfolk, Va. (Maury HS).

UVA STARTS SEASON 10-0 FOR FOURTH TIME

- Virginia recorded a 10-0 start for the fourth time in program history – all during Brian O'Connor's 12 seasons as head coach. All 10 games were away from home (three road, seven neutral).
- UVa won 19 consecutive games to begin the 2009 season. That remains the longest win streak at any point in program history.
- UVa won 11 straight to open the 2008 season and 14 straight to begin the 2013 campaign.
- The Cavaliers were one of the last two unbeaten teams in the nation, joining Texas A&M.

CAVALIERS CAPTURE 18-INNING MARATHON

- Virginia defeated Marist 5-4 in 18 innings on Feb. 22 in Charleston, S.C. It is the longest game by innings in program history.
- The previous high was a 17-inning game, ironically also in Charleston, in 2006 against College of Charleston.
- It is believed to be the second-longest game by time (5:08), behind the 2006 Coff game, which lasted 5:19.
- Virginia shut out Marist over the final 11 innings.
- Freshman Christian Lowry's first college hit, a one-out single in the 18th, scored Matt Thaiss with the winning run.

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

- Three Cavaliers were named preseason All-Americans: LHP Nathan Kirby, OF Joe McCarthy and LHP Brandon Waddell.
- Kirby was a unanimous first-team All-America selection, while McCarthy and Waddell each were named to various teams.

KIRBY, WADDELL ON GOLDEN SPIKES WATCH LIST

- Virginia left-handed pitchers Nathan Kirby and Brandon Waddell each were named to the preseason Golden Spikes Award watch list.
- The list consists of 50 players in amateur baseball.
- Virginia is one of seven schools who have multiple players on the list, joining Cal State Fullerton, Florida, Miami, TCU, UCLA and Vanderbilt.
- A preseason First-Team All-American, Kirby was a semifinalist for the 2014 Golden Spikes Award.

VIRGINIA LANDS NO. 2 RECRUITING CLASS

- Virginia reeled in the No. 2-ranked recruiting class for 2014 according to Baseball America, behind only LSU. It marked the best recruiting ranking in program history.
- The class is comprised of 13 student-athletes.
- Three were selected in the 2014 MLB Draft: RHP Derek Casey (22nd round, St. Louis), 1B/LHP Pavin Smith (32nd round, Colorado) and RHP Tommy Doyle (35th round, Washington).

WHO'S GONE?

- Virginia has plenty of holes to fill after losing five position players and three key members of its bullpen to the 2014 MLB Draft.
- Virginia had three first-round picks, just the seventh program in the last 20 years to do so in one year: RHP Nick Howard (No. 19), OF Derek Fisher (No. 37) and OF Mike Papi (No. 38).

- While in Costa Rica, the team toured the Doka Coffee Plantation, zip-lined through the rainforest, hiked through the Arenal Volcano National Park and went white-water rafting on the Savegre River.
