ROSE BOWL: THE 34th YEAR

The 2015 season marks the 34th year that the Rose Bowl will serve as home of the Bruins.

UCLA moved to Pasadena from the L.A. Coliseum in the summer of 1982 and went 6-0-1 in that first year, capping the season with a victory over Michigan in the Rose Bowl game.

The 2006 season-opening win against Utah was UCLA's 100th at the Rose Bowl. The Bruins own a record of 137-62-2 since moving to Pasadena, including a 3-2 record in Rose Bowl games.

UCLA is 13-6 under Coach Mora in games played in the Rose Bowl. The Bruins are 18-7 in the last 25 home contests and most recently posted an unbeaten home season in 2005 (6-0).

UCLA OPENS 2015 SEASON VS. VIRGINIA

UVa at UCLA on Sept. 5; Six Home Games on the 2015 Schedule

Bruins Ranked 13th in AP Poll / 14th in Coaches Poll



2015 SEASON KICKS OFF VERSUS VIRGINIA ON SEPT. 5 — UCLA opens the 2015 football season on Saturday, Sept. 5 at 12:30 p.m. PT in the Rose Bowl. The honorary captain will be record-setting running back DeShaun Foster (1998-2001). The game will be televised by FOX. Calling the game will be Joe Davis, Brady Quinn and Kris Budden. The Bruin IMG Radio Network (Bill Roth, Matt Stevens and Wayne Cook) will radio broadcast the contest on 570am LA Sports. The contest will also be aired over Sirius/XM (112/103), uclabruins.com and tunein.com and the Tuneln App.

UCLA will open at home for just the second time in the past six seasons. The Bruins captured last season's opener at Virginia by a score of 28-20 in Charlottesville. UCLA opened the 2013 season at home with a win over Nevada, but played on the road to begin the 2012 (W at Rice), 2011 (L at Houston) and 2010 (L at Kansas State) campaigns.

The Bruins finished 10-3 overall in 2014 and in a three-way tie for third in the South Division of the Pac-12 with a 6-3 record. UCLA faced 10 bowl eligible teams last season and posted a 7-3 record in those contests. Fourth-year head coach Jim Mora (29-11), who led the Bruins to victory in the Valero Alamo Bowl over Kansas State to match the school record for wins in a season (10-3) welcomes back 19 (8 defensive, 8 offensive, 3 specialists) returning starters. Additions to the coaching staff include, Tom Bradley (Defensive Coordinator) and Scott White (Linebackers/Special Teams) who each joined the program for spring practice.

VS. VIRGINIA / THE ACC — This will be the second meeting between the Bruins and the Cavaliers on the gridiron. UCLA captured the win in last year's season opener which was the first meeting between the programs, taking advantage of three defensive touchdowns in the second quarter. UVa produced a 5-7 mark last year. Two of the wins came over Miami (Fla.) and Louisville. Head Coach Mike London is entering his sixth season. UCLA is 18-13 all-time vs. teams in the current Atlantic Coast Conference -- Virginia (1-0), Virginia Tech (1-0), Duke (1-0), Florida State (0-1), Miami (2-1), NC State (2-0), Pitt (9-5), Syracuse (2-6).

TICKETS — Season tickets for 2015 are on sale at uclabruins.com/tickets. The Bruins have six home games at the Rose Bowl – Sept. 5 vs. Virginia (12:30 pm), Sept. 19 vs. BYU (7:30 pm), Oct. 3 vs. Arizona State, Oct. 22 vs. Cal (6 pm), Oct. 31 vs. Colorado (homecoming) and Nov. 14 vs. Washington State.

**UCLA has won 11 of its last 12 non-conference matchups, eight in a row since losing to Baylor in 2012 Holiday Bowl. It has won all nine regular season non-conference games and is 2-1 in bowl games under coach Mora.

**With the win at the Valero Alamo Bowl, UCLA captured its 10th straight win in a game played away from the Rose Bowl, matching the school record set in 1997-98.

**Redshirt junior Paul Perkins was the first Bruin to lead the conference in rushing since DeShaun Foster in 2001. His total of 1,575 yards (15th in NCAA) was the second-highest single-season total in school history. Perkins also became the first Bruin to surpass the 2,000-yard rushing mark in his first two seasons of action. He has run for at least 80 yards in 15 career games, including all 13 contests in 2014.

**Junior LB Myles Jack recorded a career-best 13 tackles in last season's matchup vs. Virginia. He ranked second on the team in tackles with 88 last season. In 2013, Jack became the first player in Pac-12 Conference history to be selected both Freshman Offensive and Defensive Player of the Year.

**UCLA is 9-6 against ranked teams since 2012.

**Coach Mora's 29 wins are the most by any UCLA head football coach in his first three seasons.

**UCLA tied the school record with five 500-yard total offense performances in 2014.

**The 2014 team became the ninth in school history to register a school-record tying 10 wins in a season.

**UCLA's six wins in the 2014 *regular season* games away from home were the most in school history.

**PK Ka'imi Fairbairn has connected on 29 straight career field goal attempts from 35 yards and in; and has been successful on 13 of his last 14 attempts from any distance.

**UCLA is 22-4 under Coach Mora when scoring first, 10-1 when doing so at home; the Bruins are 25-0 under Mora when ahead at the half.

**33 returning position players have starting experience.

**At their best vs. Virginia -- Jordan Payton had a career-best eight catches at UVa; Kenny Clark recorded a career-best eight tackles last season v. the Cavs.

**Returning defensive players who saw action on offense in 2014 include - LB Myles Jack (RB); DL Eddie Vanderdoes (H back/TE); DL Kenny Clark (H back/FB); DB Ishmael Adams (REC) - Primarily defensive players have scored 15 touchdowns while playing on offense since 2012

**Receiver Jordan Payton enters 2015 having caught a pass in a team-best 16 straight games

**Junior receiver Thomas Duarte led the Pac-12 (15th in NCAA) with a per catch average of 19.3 yards. He matched the school true freshman record with three scoring receptions in 2013 (also Raymond Burks-1973)

HONORARY CAPTAIN -- DeShaun Foster is one of the most accomplished UCLA running backs in school history. He completed his career second on the all-time touchdowns scored list (44), third on the school's all-time rushing list (3,194 yds) and fifth on the all-time Bruin scoring list (266 pts). Foster was ranked 18th on the Pac-10 career rushing list. His 722 career rushing attempts were the most in school history. His 13 100-yard career rushing games ranked fifth on UCLA's all-time list. He was named a first-team All-Pac-10 selection following the 2001 and 2000 seasons.

As a senior in 2001, he led the Pac-10 in rushing with a 138.6 yards per game average, in scoring with a mark of 9.75 points per game and in all-purpose yardage at 154.75 yards per game. He rushed for 1,109 yards, the 10th highest total in school history, after becoming the first Bruin to reach the 1,000-yard mark in as few as seven games. On Oct. 13, playing against a University of Washington defense which had not allowed a rushing touchdown all year, Foster exploded for a school-record 301 yards and four touchdowns on 31 carries. His final scoring run of the contest came on a 92-yard run, the second-longest in school history. He became just the third Pac-10 player, at the time, to have rushed for over 300 yards in a game.

In 2000, he ran for 1,037 yards and scored 13 touchdowns. In the season-opener against Alabama, he tied a school record with 42 carries and finished with 187 rushing yards and three touchdowns. In 1999, he was limited to 375 rushing yards after suffering a severe ankle sprain early in the season. He also played five defensive snaps in the Bruin secondary that season.

In 1998, Foster burst onto the college scene with a school freshman record 673 yards rushing and scored 12 touchdowns. He was the first true freshman to lead a UCLA team in rushing since Skip Hicks in 1993. He scored all four touchdowns (three rushing and one receiving) in UCLA's 34-17 win over USC to tie the school record and set a new mark for Bruin true freshmen.

As a Tustin High School senior, Foster rushed for 3,398 yards and scored 59 touchdowns. He set single-season (55) and career (90) CIF Southern Section marks for rushing touchdowns.

Foster was selected by Carolina in the second round of the 2002 NFL Draft. He played with the Panthers from 2003-2007. He made two memorable scoring runs for Carolina in the 2004 NFC Championship Game against the Philadelphia Eagles and in Super Bowl XXXVIII versus the New England Patriots. Foster played the 2008 season for the San Francisco 49ers.

UCLA HEAD COACH JIM MORA

On December 10, 2011, former Atlanta Falcons and Seattle Seahawks head coach Jim Mora was named UCLA's 17th head coach in school history.

In 2014, Coach Mora guided the Bruins to the ninth 10-win season in school history, matching the school record for wins in a season. It marked the third straight year in which Mora's Bruins had produced at least nine wins, a first in program history. His 29 total wins are the most-ever by a UCLA coach in his initial three seasons on the job.

Following the victory in the 2015 Alamo Bowl, UCLA had captured wins in 10 straight games away from the Rose Bowl to tie that school record, including a school-best 7-0 slate in 2014. That win was also the team's third over teams ranked among the Associated Press' Top 15 at the time of the contest, which was the most by the program since it defeated four such teams in 1952. The Bruins capped off the season ranked No. 10 in the final AP poll which was the highest for the program since 1998.

Linebacker Eric Kendricks, who became the school's all-time leading tackler during the 2014 season, went on to be UCLA's first recipient of the Butkus Award and the second-straight winner of the Lott IMPACT Trophy. Quarterback Brett Hundley set numerous school career records, including bests for most touchdown passes and total offense. Running back Paul Perkins led the Pac-12 in rushing and produced the second-highest rushing yardage total in school history.

In 2013, Mora led the Bruins to the eighth 10-win season in school history, tying the school mark for most wins in a season. UCLA remained in the AP rankings throughout the full 2013 season for the first time since 1998. Linebacker Anthony Barr was selected as a first-team All-America and as the school's first winner of the Lott IMPACT Trophy. A school record 18 true freshmen saw action during the season and seven true freshmen position players started in a game to match that school record. Five Bruins, the most by the program since 2002, were selected in the 2014 NFL Draft, headed by Barr's pick at No. 9 overall by the Minnesota Vikings.

In his first year, Mora guided the Bruins to the 2012 South Division Championship of the Pac-12 Conference and matched the school-record for wins by a first-year coach, with nine. The Bruins, who played in the Holiday Bowl, set numerous offensive records during the course of the 2012 season, including establishing a new school rushing leader, in Johnathan Franklin, and several passing marks achieved by Hundley. On defense, Barr emerged as one of the most dynamic performers in the country in his first season as a linebacker and led the nation in sacks for a good portion of the year. Kendricks led the conference in tackles, ranking 11th in the country. Four players were selected in the 2013 NFL Draft, including defensive lineman Datone Jones in the first round by the Green Bay Packers.

Mora came to UCLA after spending part of 2010 and most of 2011 as a television analyst and contributor for the NFL Network and the NFL on Fox. He brought 25 years of NFL coaching acumen with him to UCLA, including four years of NFL head coaching experience while at the helm of the Atlanta Falcons (2004-06) and the Seattle Seahawks (2009).

Mora took over for Mike Holmgren as head coach of the Seattle Seahawks in 2009. He had served as assistant head coach and defensive backs coach for Seattle in 2007 and 2008. The Seahawks went 10-6 and finished first in the NFC West in the 2007 season and won the Wild Card game. In his initial season as the head coach of the Falcons in 2004, Mora guided the team to an 11-5 record, becoming just the eighth rookie head coach in NFL history to win 11 games and the 11th to bring home a Division title. Atlanta captured the NFC South title and earned an appearance in the NFC Championship game for only the second time in franchise history. Mora was selected as the NFC Coach of the Year.

The Falcon's defense improved from a league ranking of 32nd in 2003 to No. 14 overall the next season, fueled by a league-leading and franchise record 48 quarterback sacks. Atlanta topped the NFL in rushing in all three of coach Mora's seasons as head coach. In 2006, Michael Vick became the first quarterback in NFL history to rush for at least 1,000 yards.

Mora had joined the Falcons from the San Francisco 49ers where he spent seven seasons, from 1997-2003, including the last five as the defensive coordinator. In his first year, the 49ers finished No. 1 in the NFL in total defense, No. 2 in pass defense (with 25 interceptions), takeaways (41) and run defense, as well as No. 3 in the League in sacks (with 54). The 1998 squad tied for No. 1 in the NFC, and No. 4 in the NFL, with 21 interceptions. The 1997 team advanced to the NFC Championship Game, while the 1998 and 2002 squads captured Wild Card Game wins.

Mora worked the previous five seasons (1992-1996) on the staff of his dad, Jim E. Mora, as the secondary coach with the New Orleans Saints. His defensive expertise began to take shape and the Saints boasted the No. 1 pass defense in the NFL during his first two years. In 1985, Mora broke into the NFL coaching ranks with the San Diego Chargers under head coach Don Coryell. He spent seven seasons with the Chargers, advancing from the league's first quality control coach position to defensive backs coach.

Mora began his coaching career in 1984 at the University of Washington. He joined the staff of Don James in the role of defensive assistant following a four-year playing career as a defensive back for the Huskies. While at UW, Mora had the opportunity to be a part of two Rose Bowl teams (1981-loss to Michigan and 1982-win over Iowa) as a player, in addition to helping the Huskies land a berth in the 1985 Orange Bowl (win over Oklahoma) as a graduate assistant. During his five seasons in the Husky program, Washington compiled a 48-12 record, ranked among the nation's top 10 teams on three occasions, and did not finish lower than second in the Pac-10 standings.

LINEBACKER — True junior linebacker **MYLES JACK (#30-Anthropology major)** ranked second on the team in tackles in 2014 with 88 and was named a second-team all-conference selection. He had at least six stops in 10 games with a high of 13 stops at Virginia. Jack also had a rushing attempt on offense in nine games and totaled 113 yards on 28 carries with three scores.

In 2013, he became the first player in conference history to be named both Offensive and Defensive Freshman of the Year by the Pac-12 coaches. He was a second-team all-conference selection and his 75 tackles ranked fifth on the team and as the second-most ever by a UCLA true freshman player behind only Kenny Easley who had 93 in 1977. Jack's 11 pass defenses led the team. He was also a finalist for the Horning Award as the nation's most versatile player.

Jack joined the starting lineup at linebacker in game two of 2013 at Nebraska. He had recorded eight tackles, including a tackle for loss, in the season-opener against Nevada. He was credited with his first interception at Utah. Jack forced a fumble and blocked a punt at Oregon. He returned an interception for a score against Virginia Tech.

He played on offense for the first time in 2013 at Arizona (game 9) and ran six times for 120 yards, including a 66-yard touchdown jaunt. His total of four rushing touchdowns against Washington set a true freshman record (old mark Wendell Tyler, 1972 and DeShaun Foster, 1998 - 3). Jack made his first start at running back against Arizona State and carried 16 times for 86 yards and a touchdown.

RUNNING BACKS —

In 2014, redshirt junior **PAUL PERKINS (#24-Sociology major)** 2014 became the first Bruin to lead the Pac-12 in rushing since DeShaun Foster in 2001. His total of 1,575 yards rushing was the second-highest total in a season ever by a UCLA

back. He ranked 15th in the NCAA in rushing yards (1,575), 16th in rushing yards per game (121.2) and 29th in the nation in all-purpose rushing (136.6). Perkins had six 100-rushing games, topped by a 194-yard performance in the bowl win over Kansas State. He also ran for 190 yards on 22 carries against Oregon and went for 180 yards at Colorado, including a 92-yard scoring run which tied for the second-longest in school history. Perkins recorded his first two scoring receptions in the win at Cal. He was an honorable mention all-conference selection by the coaches. Named Offensive MVP of the Valero Alamo Bowl, Perkins became the first Bruin to rush for more than 2,000 yards in his initial two seasons in the program during the bowl game.

Perkins saw his first game action in 2013 and made four starts. He ran for scores in games vs. Nevada, at Nebraska, Cal, ASU, USC and Virginia Tech. He caught three balls at USC for 79 yards and four balls vs. NMSU for 36 yards. Perkins ran for 92 yards on 16 carries at Utah and 93 yards on 22 carries at Oregon. He was named honorable mention academic all-conference.

KICKER — True senior kicker **KA'IMI FAIRBAIRN (#15)** has made 29 straight field goals from 35 yards and in. Last season he became the first Bruin to record three 100-point seasons. Fairbairn has handled all of the Bruin placekicking chores in his first three seasons in the program. He is sixth on the all-time school field goal list (48) and fifth in career scoring (306).

In 2014, Fairbairn ranked 19th in the nation and third in the Pac-12 with his .818 field goal percentage after connecting on 18 of 22 field goal attempts. He finished the season by converting 13 of his last 14 attempts. His total of 18 made field goals tied for 10th -best on the school season list. Fifty of his 80 kickoffs went for touchbacks.

His 33-yard kick in 2012 at Arizona State, with no time left, provided the winning points in a 45-43 victory. His 104 points scored, rank tied for 11th on the school list and as the most ever scored by a Bruin true freshman.

The 2015 season is UCLA's 19th with Clear Channel Radio. This will be the ninth year for the Bruins games to be aired on AM 570 LA Sports (or am 1150 KTLK) in Southern California. The broadcasts are produced by IMG, UCLA's corporate and media-rights holder.

The Los Angeles all-sports station's broadcast includes a two-hour pre-game show (one hour local, one hour network) and a post-game show. Hall of Fame broadcaster Bill Roth will be the new voice of the Bruins. Former Bruin quarterback Matt Stevens ('83-86) is set to begin his 19th year on the broadcast team and his 15th as the analyst in the booth. Former Bruin quarterback Wayne Cook ('91-94) is in his 14th season as sideline reporter.

AM 570 LA Sports also provides ancillary programming, including head coach and player interviews during game weeks.

UCLA IMG Sports Network games are available nationally through an agreement with Sirius XM Satellite Radio, the Official Satellite Radio Partner of UCLA Athletics.

Games can also be heard via internet at uclabruins.com and on tuneln.com and the Tuneln App.

UCLA ON TELEVISION

Following the bowl game vs. Kansas State, 135 of UCLA's last 136 games have been televised live, including 71 in a row.

All of UCLA's games in the 2014, 2013, 2012 and 2011 seasons were on live TV. In 2010, each of the 12 contests were broadcast live. The Oregon State game in 2009 is the last game not to be aired live (it was delayed).

The Pac-12 Networks will air conference games and ancillary programming which will feature football coach and player interviews during the season.

DID YOU KNOW...

Three Bruin coaches and 12 players, including 2014 inductee John Sciarrà, 2012 inductee Jonathan Ogden, 2010 inductee Randy Cross and 2008 inductee Troy Aikman, are enshrined in the National Football Foundation Hall of Fame.

UCLA has 15 former players working in the broadcast media - Troy Aikman, Charles Arbuckle, Wayne Cook, Randy Cross, Terry Donahue, Danny Farmer, Ryan Nece, Rick Neuheisel, David Norrie, Ron Pitts, Tom Ramsey, Matt Stevens, J.J. Stokes, Rick Walker, James Washington.

Five Bruins have been voted in to the NFL Hall of Fame-OL Johnathan Ogden-2013; QB Troy Aikman-2006; DB Jimmy Johnson-1994; WR/ coach Tom Fears-1970; QB/P/KD Bob Waterfield-1965.

The selection of linebacker Anthony Barr by the Minnesota Vikings in the first round of the 2014 NFL draft marked the 31st time a UCLA player has been taken in round one.

Twenty-two UCLA players have been selected to CoSIDA Academic All-America teams a total of 27 times. Offensive lineman Chris Joseph (2006, 2007) and wide receiver Cormac Carney (1981, 1982) were two-time first-team selections.

UCLA is the only school to produce six quarterbacks — Troy Aikman, Steve Bono, Billy Kilmer, Tommy Maddox, Tom Ramsey, Jay Schroeder — to have played that position on a Super Bowl team.

Quarterback Drew Olson finished eighth in the 2005 Heisman Trophy balloting. It marked the 21st time that a Bruin has finished in the top 10 of the Heisman Trophy voting.

UCLA has had at least one former player participate in 31 of the last 34 Super Bowl games.

The only three-time consensus All-Americans in Pac-10 history are Bruins (LB Jerry Robinson and S Kenny Easley).

Since 2000, UCLA has had 19 finalists / winners of National player awards -- 2014 Eric Kendricks - Lott IMPACT Award winner; Butkus Award winner; Brett Hundley - Manning Award finalist, Unitas Award finalist; 2013 Anthony Barr - Lott IMPACT Trophy winner, Lombardi Award finalist, Bednarik Award finalist; Myles Jack - Hornung Award finalist; 2012 Johnathan Franklin - Doak Walker Award finalist; 2009 Kai Forbath - Groza Award winner; 2005 Marcedes Lewis-Mackey Award winner; 2004 M. Lewis, Mackey finalist; 2002 Mike Seidman-Mackey finalist; 2004 Chris Kluwe-Ray Guy Award finalist; 2003 Dave Ball-Bronco Nagurski Award finalist; 2001 Robert Thomas-Dick Butkus Award finalist; 2000 Freddie Mitchell-Fred Biletnikoff Award finalist; 2003 D. Ball-Vince Lombardi Award finalist; 2006 Justin Hickman-Ted Hendricks Award finalist; 2003 D. Ball-Ted Hendricks Award finalist; 2003 D. Ball-Chevrolet National Defensive Player of the Year Award.

On May 13, 2007 UCLA became the first school in history to win 100 NCAA team championships. The Bruins currently have 112 NCAA titles to their credit (winning Men's Water Polo in 2014).

BRUINS IN THE POLLS — The Bruins finished ranked in the final polls in 2013 for the first time since the 2005 season. It was most recently in the top five of the Associated Press poll in the 2001 season, when it spent two weeks at No. 4 after winning its first six games. It opened at #22 in the 2014 season's initial College Football Playoff poll and rose to as high as #8 before finishing at #14.

NON-SATURDAY GAMES — UCLA will play a pair of Thursday night affairs in back-to-back weeks this season at Stanford and in the Rose Bowl versus California. Last season on Thursday night at Arizona State, the Bruins bested the Sun Devils and on Friday of Thanksgiving week, at home, in the Rose Bowl against Stanford, the Cardinal dropped the Bruins.

In 2013, the Bruins won at Utah on a Thursday night and at home versus Washington on a Friday night. The last time UCLA had played a Friday game during the regular season was in 2011 at Arizona State. The most recent previous home game to have been played on Friday was against Arizona on Oct. 27, 1978.

In 2012, UCLA opened the season with a win at Rice on a Thursday evening. In 2011, it played at Arizona on a Thursday evening. In the 2010 season, the Bruins played three non-Saturday games - Oct. 21 at Oregon, Nov. 18 at Washington and Nov. 26 at Arizona State.

Prior to 2010, the last time the Bruins played a regular-season non-Saturday game was Friday, Nov. 28, 2008 at Arizona State, dropping a 34-9 decision. The Bruins also played a Monday night game that year, defeating Tennessee, 27-24 in overtime on Labor Day night (Aug. 30). Before 2008, UCLA had not played on a week night since Thurs., Sept. 30, 1993, a 52-13 victory at San Diego State. The Bruins also played at San Diego State on Thurs., Sept. 26, 1991 (won, 37-12).

BRUIN FRESHMEN OVER THE YEARS — Seven true freshmen saw action in the 2014 opener at UVa -- OL Najee Toran, DB Jaleel Wadood, WR Mossi Johnson, LB Zach Whitley, LB Kenny Young, DL Jacob Tuoti-Mariner, DL Matt Dickerson. RB Nate Starks took the field v. Memphis and a ninth frosh, WR Alex VanDyke, saw his first action at ASU.

The Bruins established a new school mark in 2013 when guard Scott Quessenberry took the field at Oregon as the 18th true freshman to see action that season. Fifteen true frosh saw action in the 2013 opener against Nevada. UCLA played 12 true freshmen in 2012. One first-year player saw action in 2011. In both 2009 and 2010, UCLA played 10 true freshmen. UCLA has started a true freshman in each of the last three season-openers along the offensive line. The last true freshman defender to start an opener was safety Rahim Moore in 2008 vs. Tennessee.
