ACC FOOTBALL NOTES

SEVEN ACC TEAMS IN AP TOP 25

• For the second consecutive week, seven ACC teams are ranked in AP Top 25 poll. Clemson remains No. 1 for the third consecutive week. The Tigers are followed by No. 7 Notre Dame, No. 11 North Carolina, No. 12 Miami, No. 20 Virginia Tech, No. 21 Pitt and No. 24 Louisville. Virginia and Boston College are also receiving votes.

• Prior to this season, the last time the ACC had seven teams ranked in the AP Top 25 poll was 2005.

• Clemson is atop the AP poll for the 19th time in school history.

• In the coaches top 25 poll, Clemson is No. 1, followed by No. 7 Notre Dame, No. 12 North Carolina, No. 14 Miami and No. 24 Virginia Tech. Pitt, Louisville, Virginia, Boston College, NC State and Georgia Tech are receiving votes.

WINNING IN THE ACC

• Clemson has won an ACC record 31 consecutive regular-season games. The Tigers moved past Florida State (30 straight, 2013-15) with last week's 49-0 win over The Citadel. Clemson's last regular-season loss was at Syracuse in 2017.

• According to ESPN Stats & Info, Clemson is tied with Oklahoma (1953-57) for the most consecutive Saturday wins with 45. The Tigers, who are off this weekend, play host to Virginia next Saturday, Oct. 3.

• Notre Dame is tied for fifth all-time with 910 wins. In the ACC, the Irish are followed by Clemson (14th, 760), Virginia Tech (16th, 751), Georgia Tech (19th, 739), Syracuse (22nd, 724) and North Carolina (29th, 699).

• Notre Dame, which won its 20th straight home game last week vs. USF, has the nation's second-longest current winning streak with eight consecutive victories dating back to last season. North Carolina has won four in a row and Pitt owns a three-game win streak.

THE WEEK AHEAD - SEPT. 26

• Virginia and Virginia Tech are slated to begin the season this weekend in a pair of conference games. The Cavaliers welcome Duke to Charlottesville and the 20th-ranked Hokies play host to NC State. Virginia has had four different scheduled openers since the initial schedule was announced in January - Georgia (canceled), VMI (canceled), Virginia Tech (postponed) and Duke. Duke has been the scheduled opening opponent for four different teams - MTSU (canceled), Notre Dame, Boston College and Virginia.

• One of only three games between ranked teams this week, No. 21 Pitt plays host to No. 24 Louisville on Saturday at noon on ACCN. This is the first meeting between the old Big East rivals since 2015, Pat Narduzzi's first year at Pitt.

• Wake Forest plays host to Notre Dame for the second time in three seasons. Saturday's game, originally scheduled for Charlotte's Bank of America Stadium, was moved to Truist Field in Winston-Salem due to the concerns related to the COVID-19 pandemic.

• Georgia Tech plays at Syracuse Saturday at noon. It's the first meeting between the two schools since Syracuse's inaugural season in the ACC in 2013.

• ESPN College GameDay will be in Miami this weekend for the Florida State at No. 12 Miami game. This is the eighth time Miami has hosted GameDay and the Hurricanes are 6-1 in previous matchups with wins over Florida State (2), UCLA, Virginia Tech, Syracuse and Notre Dame. The only loss came to FSU in 2006.

• Florida State is making its 35th appearance on College GameDay, which is the fifth-most in the nation. FSU will be without head coach Mike Norvell, who announced Sept. 19 that he had tested positive for COVID-19. Deputy head coach Chris Thomsen will handle in-person coaching duties in Norvell's absence.

• Boston College welcomes Texas State to The Heights for a non-conference matchup at 6 p.m. on RSN. Last week, head coach Jeff Hafley earned his first win at BC with a 26-6 win over Duke. WR Zay Flowers (5 receptions, 162 yards, TD) earned BC's first ACC Receiver of the Week award since 2013.

PITT'S WEAVER NAMED WALTER CAMP NATIONAL DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

• Pitt senior defensive end Rashad Weaver posted a team-high seven tackles (five solo), three for losses and two quarterback sacks as the 25th-ranked Panthers defeated Syracuse, 21-10. Weaver is the eighth Pitt player to earn the recognition since 2004, and first since former running back Darrin Hall (Nov. 5, 2018). Each week, the Walter Camp Football Foundation honors one offensive and one defensive player as its national FBS player of the week during the regular season.

FOUR ACC QBS SELECTED TO DAVEY O'BRIEN GREAT 8

• Four ACC quarterbacks (most of any conference) have been named to the Davey O'Brien Award Great 8 list for their performances Saturday, Sept. 19. Boston College's Phil Jurkovec, Miami's D'Eriq King, Notre Dame's Ian Book and Pitt's Kenny Pickett earned the honor. Any player named to a Great 8 list during the season who was not previously named to the Preseason Watch List will be added to the Midseason Watch List and will be eligible to be voted a semifinalist for the Davey O'Brien National Quarterback Award. Jurkovec and Pickett join the watch list this week.

THREE ACC QBS NAMED MANNING AWARD STARS OF THE WEEK

• Three ACC quarterbacks have been named Manning Award "Stars of the Week" - Boston College's Phil Jurkovec, Miami's D'Eriq King and Pitt's Kenny Pickett. Fans can now go to the Allstate Sugar Bowl Facebook page to [vote](#) for what they think was the best performance from this past weekend. When voting closes on Thursday at noon, the top vote-getter will be announced as the Manning Award Quarterback of the Week.

Phil Jurkovec, Boston College (17-of-23, 300 yards, 2 TDs, 1 INT, QBR: 84.1) - Jurkovec, making his first career start, led the Eagles to a TD on their first drive, then completed 6-of-7 third-quarter passes for 151 yards and a pair of TDs as Boston College claimed a 26-6 road victory over Duke.

D'Eriq King, Miami (18-of-30, 325 yards, 3 TDs, 0 INT, QBR: 77.3) - King tallied his sixth career 300-yard game, which included a 75-yard third-quarter TD pass that broke open a tight game as the Hurricanes earned a road victory with a 47-34 victory over No. 18 Louisville.

Kenny Pickett, Pitt (25-of-36, 215 yards 2 TDs, 1 INT, QBR: 56.1) - Pickett, who also rushed for a touchdown, accounted for all three Panthers' scores in a 21-10 victory over Syracuse.

TWO FROM ACC ON HORNUNG AWARD HONOR ROLL

• Two ACC players earned recognition on the Paul Hornung Award Honor Roll for the week of Sept. 19 - Georgia Tech freshman running back/return specialist Jahmyr Gibbs and NC State junior running back/return specialist Ricky Person, Jr. The Paul Hornung Award presented by Texas Roadhouse, now in its 11th season, is given annually to the most versatile player in major college football by the Louisville Sports Commission and football legend and Louisville native Paul Hornung.

• Gibbs accounted for 219 all-purpose yards and two scores in the Yellow Jackets loss to UCF. Gibbs opened the game with a 75-yard kickoff return that set up Tech's first score. He caught a nine-yard touchdown pass late in the first half and rambled 33 yards for a score on the ground early in the second half as Georgia Tech narrowed UCF's lead to 28-21.

• Person touched the ball four different ways and accounted for touchdowns two different ways, including the winning score, as the Wolfpack outlasted Wake Forest 45-42 in Raleigh. Pearson scored on a one-yard run in the second quarter, threw a two-yard touchdown pass in the third quarter and ran three yards for the winning score with 3:21 remaining. He also caught two passes and handled three kickoffs.

NINE ACC QBS MAKE START IN NFL

• The ACC leads the country with nine starting quarterbacks in the NFL - Boston College's Matt Ryan (Falcons), Clemson's Deshaun Watson (Texans), Duke's Daniel Jones (NY Giants), Louisville's Lamar Jackson (Ravens) and Teddy Bridgewater (Panthers), North Carolina's Mitch Trubisky (Bears), NC State's Philip Rivers (Colts) and Russell Wilson (Seahawks) and Virginia Tech's Tyrod Taylor (Chargers).

RETURN TO COMPETITION

• The ACC Board of Directors announced July 29 that if public health guidance allows, ACC sponsored fall sports would begin competition during the week of Sept. 7-12. The announcement followed several months of discussion and scenario planning among the league membership and Medical Advisory Group. The Medical Advisory Group continues to meet and update its [report](#).

2020 ACC Football:

- The season's first games took place Sept. 10-12
- The 2020 scheduling model includes 11 games (10 plus one: 10 conference and one non-conference)
- All non-conference game opponents, selected by the respective school, must be played in the home state of the ACC institution, and all non-conference opponents must meet the medical protocol requirements as agreed upon by the ACC
- The 11 games will be played over at least 13 weeks with each team having two open dates
- There will be one division
- Notre Dame will also play a 10-game conference schedule and be eligible to compete in the 2020 ACC Football Championship Game
- All television revenue for the 2020 season, including Notre Dame's home games broadcast by NBC, will be shared equally by all 15 institutions
- The ACC Football Championship Game will be played on either December 12 or 19 at Bank of America Stadium in Charlotte, North Carolina, and will feature the top two teams based upon highest conference-game winning percentage
- All 15 teams will continue to be part of the ACC's bowl selection process; should Notre Dame win the ACC Football Championship Game it would be eligible for the Orange Bowl, if not selected as a College Football Playoff semifinal team

RETURNING STANDOUTS

• For the first time in ACC history, the league returned two quarterbacks (North Carolina's Sam Howell and Clemson's Trevor Lawrence) who threw 35 or more touchdown passes the previous season. Add in Miami's D'Eriq King, who threw 36 TDs in 2018 at Houston, and the ACC has the only three QBs in the country playing this fall who have thrown 35 or more touchdowns in a single season. The only other returning quarterback who threw 35-plus touchdowns last year was Ohio State's Justin Fields.

• The ACC is the only FBS conference with two returning 1,500-yard rushers in Clemson's Travis Etienne (1,604 yards) and Louisville's Javian Hawkins (1,525 yards). The

only other time the ACC returned two 1,500-yard backs was 2016 with Florida State's Dalvin Cook and Clemson's Wayne Gallman. North Carolina's Michael Carter (1,003 yards in 2019) gives the ACC three returning 1,000-yard rushers.

- Clemson is the first ACC team since Florida State in 1995 to return the first-team all-conference quarterback (Trevor Lawrence) and a first-team running back (Travis Etienne). The 1995 FSU team returned QB Danny Kanell and RB Warrick Dunn.

CHASING RECORDS

- Clemson's Travis Etienne rushed for 68 yards last week against The Citadel and is now fifth all-time in ACC career rushing yards. He is 394 yards shy of the career record held since 1978 by NC State's Ted Brown. Etienne already holds the ACC career record for rushing touchdowns (57) and total touchdowns (63).

- Etienne is also 10th in ACC history with 5,394 career all-purpose yards. He is chasing former Tiger C.J. Spiller, who had 7,588 yards from 2006-09. North Carolina's Leon Johnson is second with 5,828 yards.

- Clemson's Trevor Lawrence has thrown for 70 touchdowns, which ties Miami's Jacory Harris for sixth in ACC history. NC State's Russell Wilson is fifth with 76. The top three in the ACC are Tajh Boyd of Clemson with 107, Philip Rivers of NC State with 95 and Deshaun Watson of Clemson with 90.

- Pitt place-kicker Alex Kessman has booted eight field goals of more than 50 yards in his career, which is just one shy of the ACC mark held by Wake Forest's Sam Swank (2005-08).

ACC COMMITTEE FOR RACIAL & SOCIAL JUSTICE

The ACC's Committee for Racial and Social Justice (CORE - Champions of Racial Equity) announced three initiatives in conjunction with its member institutions on Sept. 3.

- Mandatory diversity and inclusion training for student-athletes, athletic department and conference staff
- Creation of ACC Unity Symbol as a visual representation of solidarity among the ACC's 15 institutions
- ACC Unity Statement to be read prior to every league contest

"I applaud the work of ACC CORE and the initiatives collaborated on and adopted by our schools," said ACC Commissioner John Swofford. "It is critically important for our country to unite as one. The ACC is committed to creating meaningful change, eradicating racism, and upholding the values of equality, diversity and non-discrimination."

"In a time of great challenges where society seems more divided than ever before, we the student-athletes of the ACC want to take a stand against racism, discrimination and any other form of injustice," said Leon Krapf from the NC State Men's Soccer Team and the ACC's representative to NCAA SAAC. "As athletes, we know that sport has the power to unite people from all backgrounds. However, we are more than just athletes. Therefore, we want to use our platforms to advocate for a more tolerant, understanding and inclusive environment on our campuses and beyond. We will overcome our current challenges if we act together and united. #UNITE!"

Student-athletes, athletic department and conference office staff will be required to attend annual diversity and inclusion training. The initiative was unanimously approved by the conference athletic directors. The focus of this year's training will be anti-racism.

The ACC's unity symbol – "UNITE" – will be displayed in venues and on video boards throughout the league, as well as at ACC Championship events and on social media.

CORE also has introduced a Unity Statement, which will be read at all ACC events: **"We, the ACC, are committed to seeing each other as equals, supporting each other, and treating each other with respect and dignity at all times, recognizing that our differences don't divide us, but they make us stronger."**

CORE's work is ongoing and guided by its mission statement, which is "to promote and encourage racial equity and social justice through education, partnerships, engagement and advocacy."

Among CORE's actions to date: the ACC Office's recognition of Juneteenth as a holiday; working with its institutions to increase voter education and vote, with some ACC schools serving as polling places; engaging in conversations and education throughout the conference with staff and student-athletes and initiating partnerships with local organizations and community groups; empowering students and student-athletes to engage with fans around the topic of social justice to minimize misunderstandings.

CORE's central values and goals:

- Create meaningful, lasting change by improving systems, organizational structures, policies, practices and attitudes
- Have representation at all levels that is reflective of the make-up of the student-athlete population
- Inclusion and empowerment of diverse individuals
- Accountability for hiring practices
- Integrity
- Fairness

ETIENNE AIMS FOR THIRD POY AWARD

• Clemson running back Travis Etienne returned for his senior season and has an opportunity to become the first player in ACC history to win player of the year honors three times. Last season, he became the seventh player in league history to be voted ACC Player of the Year twice and the second in a four-year span (Louisville quarterback Lamar Jackson in 2016-17). He is also the first running back since North Carolina's Mike Voight (1975-76) to win the honor in multiple years.

• The six players to win the award twice are NC State's Roman Gabriel (QB) in 1960 & 1961, North Carolina's Don McCauley (RB) in 1969 & 1970, North Carolina's Mike Voight (RB) in 1975 & 1976, Clemson's Steve Fuller (QB) in 1977 & 1978, Florida State's Charlie Ward (QB) in 1992 & 1993, and Louisville's Lamar Jackson (QB) in 2016 & 2017.

• The only player in a Power 5 conference to win three league Player of the Year awards was Georgia's Herschel Walker (1980, 1981 & 1982).

2020 PRESEASON ALL-ACC PICKS

• Clemson was selected by the media as the clear favorite in the league's preseason football poll. The nationally top-ranked Tigers are predicted to finish first in the ACC by 132 of the media panel's 134 voters and are also picked to win the ACC Football Championship Game. In addition, Clemson junior quarterback Trevor Lawrence was selected as the ACC Preseason Player of the Year, and the Tigers led all schools with five players voted to the 27-member 2020 Preseason All-ACC Team. Notre Dame, which will compete as an ACC football member this season, received the remaining two first-place votes. North Carolina placed third in the preseason balloting, followed by Louisville, Virginia Tech and Miami.

Clemson's victory over Alabama in the 2019 CFP National Championship marked the eighth national title by an ACC school since the league's inception in 1953, and the 15th by a school currently in the league. Of current membership, Miami leads the way with five national titles, followed by Clemson (3), Florida State (3), Pitt (2), Georgia Tech (1) and Syracuse (1).

■ Two new coaches have joined the ACC in 2020, Boston College's Jeff Hafley and Florida State's Mike Norvell. Hafley comes to Chestnut Hill after a successful stint as Ohio State's co-defensive coordinator. He was a finalist for the 2019 Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach. Norvell takes over in Tallahassee after spending four seasons as the head coach at Memphis where he won the 2019 AAC championship. His .717 winning percentage was the highest in Memphis history.

■ Twelve head coaches in the ACC have won at least 50 career games, including five with more than 100 victories. North Carolina's Mack Brown is tops among active coaches with 252 wins, and Notre Dame's Brian Kelly (coaching in the ACC for the first year) has 244. The other 100-win coaches in the ACC are Clemson's Dabo Swinney (132), Wake Forest's Dave Clawson (126), Virginia's Bronco Mendenhall (124) and Duke's David Cutcliffe (116). No other conference has as many coaches with 100 career wins.

■ Among active coaches, Clemson's Dabo Swinney, Notre Dame's Brian Kelly, Louisville's Scott Satterfield and North Carolina's Mack Brown and rank among the top 25 in the nation in career winning percentage. Swinney's .810 winning percentage leads the nation. The ACC has more coaches in the top 25 in winning percentage than any other conference.

■ Two of the five active coaches to win a national title reside in the ACC. Dabo Swinney led Clemson to national titles in 2016 and 2018. North Carolina's Mack Brown won a national title at Texas in 2005.

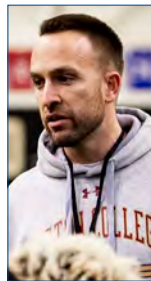
■ Clemson head coach Dabo Swinney is one win shy of FSU's Bobby Bowden's ACC mark for bowl victories, which includes CFP National Championship Games. Bowden leads with 11 Bowl/CFP wins during his tenure in the ACC. Swinney ranks second with 10. Louisville's Scott Satterfield is 4-0 with three bowl victories at Appalachian State and last year's win over Mississippi State in the Music City Bowl.

■ Mack Brown's 14 bowl victories at Texas (10) and North Carolina (4) ranks fourth all-time and second among active coaches. Dabo Swinney's 10 bowl wins are fifth among active coaches, while Duke's David Cutcliffe and Virginia's Bronco Mendenhall are tied for 10th with seven bowl victories.

■ Five current league coaches have won ACC Coach of the Year honors - North Carolina's Mack Brown in 1996, Duke's David Cutcliffe in 2012 & 2013, Clemson's Dabo Swinney in 2015 & 2018, Virginia Tech's Justin Fuente in 2016 and Louisville's Scott Satterfield in 2019.

2020 ACC FOOTBALL TIEBREAKER POLICY

The ACC Champion will be decided by a game between the two postseason eligible teams with the highest percentage of wins during all regular season conference competition.

However, for any team to be eligible for the ACC Football Championship Game, or to be considered in a tiebreaker, such team must have played within one (1) total conference game of the average number of conference games played by all conference teams (rounding up/down at .5) during the 2020 season. For example, if the average number of conference games played in the 2020 season is 9.25 (value of nine (9) when rounded down), a team would be eligible to participate in the ACC Football Championship Game, or be considered in a tiebreaker, if that team played eight (8) or more conference games. Furthermore, in the event there is an unequal total number of conference games played among teams tied in the loss column, head-to-head results will take precedence over win-percentage.

If teams remain tied, existing procedures will be applied to determine the ACC Football Championship Game representative(s). Overall conference standings will be calculated on a percentage basis, using the ten conference games which are part of the schedule. If teams are tied for the best win percentage or second best win percentage in its conference games then, in order to determine the Championship Game representative, the procedures listed below will be followed.

Two-Team Tie

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
2. Head-to-head competition versus the team with the best overall win percentage and proceeding through the conference. Multiple ties within the conference will be broken from first to last using the league's tiebreaker policies.
3. Overall win percentage versus all common conference opponents.
4. Win percentage versus common conference opponents based upon their order of finish (overall conference win percentage) and proceeding through other common conference opponents based upon their conference order of finish.
5. The tied team with the higher ranking by the Team Rating Score metric provided by SportSource Analytics following the conclusion of regular season games.
6. The representative shall be chosen by a draw as administered by the Commissioner or Commissioner's designee.

Three-Team (or More) Tie

(Three-team (or more) tiebreaker procedure will be used to break all ties to identify the Championship game representative. Once a team is eliminated from the tie, the tiebreaker procedures restart for the remaining teams. If the three-team (or more) tie can be reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaker format will then be applied).

1. Combined head-to-head win percentage among the tied teams.
 2. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the conference with the best overall conference win percentage and proceeding through the conference. Multiple ties within the conference will be broken first to last, using the league's tiebreaker policies.
 3. Combined win percentage versus all common conference opponents.
 4. Win percentage versus common conference opponents based upon their order of finish (overall conference win percentage) and proceeding through other common conference opponents based upon their conference order of finish.
 5. The tied team with the higher ranking by the Team Rating Score metric provided by SportSource Analytics following the conclusion of regular season games.
 6. The representative shall be chosen by a draw as administered by the Commissioner or Commissioner's designee.
- Note: Conference games against otherwise postseason ineligible teams will always be counted in the league standings and in application of the tie breaker policies.

NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

- The ACC has won seven national championships in football, men's basketball, women's basketball and baseball since 2015. That is the most of any conference. The ACC is the only conference to win each of those four titles over that stretch.
- The ACC has won three of the last seven football national titles (ties for most of any conference) and three of the last five men's basketball national championships (most of any conference) since 2015.
- The ACC has had a team in either the College Football Playoff or the BCS National Championship Game in each of the past seven years.
- Clemson (15-0) won the league's eighth football national championship in 2018 with a 44-16 win over previously unbeaten Alabama. The 28-point margin of victory was the largest over a No. 1 ranked team in ACC history.

ACC FCG IN CHARLOTTE

- In April 2018, the ACC and the Charlotte Sports Foundation announced a 10-year agreement that will keep the ACC Football Championship Game in Charlotte through the 2030 season. The game will be played annually at Bank of America Stadium on the first Saturday in December.
- The ACC Football Championship Game has sold out four times in Charlotte (2010, 2011, 2015, 2017).
- The economic impact of the 2019 game was close to \$30 million, with more than \$185 million of economic impact over the last six games played in Charlotte.

BOWL SUCCESS

- A nation's best 10 ACC teams played a postseason bowl game following the 2019 season – Boston College (TicketSmarter Bowl), Clemson (CFP), Florida State (Tony the Tiger Sun Bowl), Louisville (Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl), Miami (Walk-On's Independence Bowl), North Carolina (Military Bowl presented by Northrop Grumman), Pitt (Quick Lane Bowl), Virginia (Capital One Orange Bowl), Virginia Tech (Belk Bowl) and Wake Forest (New Era Pinstripe Bowl).
- The ACC is the only conference to send every team to at least one bowl game over the previous four seasons (2016-19).
- The ACC is tied for the most bowl teams (42) among all conferences over the last four years (11 in 2016, 10 in 2017, 11 in 2018, 10 in 2019).
- Since 2013, the ACC has the second-best record of any Power 5 conference in the BCS, New Year's Six and CFP games, and is tied for the most national championships (Florida State in 2013, Clemson in 2016 & 2018).

BOWL PARTNERSHIPS

- The ACC is in its sixth year of a 12-year agreement with the Capital One Orange Bowl, which will host an ACC team—either its champion or next available team—in all years when the Orange Bowl is not a semifinal site for the College Football Playoff. The opponent will be the highest ranked available team from the SEC, Big Ten or Notre Dame. The ACC has won five of the last seven Orange Bowls that featured an ACC team, including five in a row from 2012-16.
- A new six-year bowl lineup begins in 2020, and includes the addition of the San Diego County Credit Union Holiday Bowl and the newly created Fenway Bowl in Boston. In addition to those two bowls, the ACC has agreements through 2025 with the *Cheez-It* World Bowl, Duke's Mayo Bowl, Military Bowl, New Era Pinstripe Bowl, TaxSlayer Gator Bowl and Tony the Tiger Sun Bowl. The league will also send a team to either the Gasparilla Bowl, Birmingham Bowl or SERVPRO First Responder Bowl on an annual basis. In addition, the ACC will send a team to the Outback Bowl if the league's opponent in a non-semifinal Capital One Orange Bowl is from the Big Ten.

ACC & THE NFL DRAFT

- Since the 2005 season, the ACC has had 570 players chosen in the NFL Draft, including 89 first-round picks, the second highest totals of any conference.
- The ACC has had 289 players selected since 2013 - the second-highest total among all conferences - and has had 40 or more players picked in four of the last seven drafts. The ACC's 45 draftees in 2018 was its third-highest ever.
- Current ACC teams have had a total of nine players chosen as the first overall selection in the NFL Draft. The most recent was Florida State's Jameis Winston, who was tabbed first in 2015 by the Tampa Bay Bucs. Miami (Vinny Testaverde, 1987, Tampa Bay; and Russell Maryland, 1991, Dallas) and Virginia Tech (Bruce Smith, 1985, Buffalo; and Michael Vick, 2001, Atlanta) each had two top selections while Florida State (Jameis Winston, 2015, Bucs), NC State (Mario Williams, 2006, Texans), Virginia (Bill Dudley, 1942, Steelers) and Syracuse (Ernie Davis, 1962, Redskins) each had one. Also, NC State's Roman Gabriel, the No. 2 overall selection in the 1962 draft, was chosen No. 1 in the AFL Draft by the Oakland Raiders.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

- Virginia linebacker Jordan Mack was a finalist for the 2019 William V. Campbell Trophy® presented by Mazda, announced by the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame (NFF). Celebrating its 30th year in 2019, the award recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation for his combined academic success, football performance and exemplary leadership. An ACC player has won three of the last six Campbell Trophies, including Duke's David Helton in 2014, Virginia's Micah Kiser in 2017 and Clemson's Christian Wilkins in 2018.
- Ten ACC football teams have an APR above the Division I average of 968, which ranks second among peer conferences. In all sports, the ACC is second among Power 5 conferences with 83 teams from member schools recognized in the most recent NCAA APR Public Recognition Awards.
- Ten of 14 ACC Football teams earned a graduation success rate (GSR) at or above the FBS average. That was second-most among Power 5 conferences, both in terms of percentage and in total number.
- The ACC remains the only Power 5 conference to have multiple teams score 90 or higher in GSR each year since 2005. Duke (96), Louisville (91) and Boston College (90) reached that plateau this year.
