## ACC FOOTBALL NOTES

### FOUR ACC TEAMS IN CFP TOP 25 RANKINGS

• Four ACC teams are ranked in the CFP Top 25 Poll released Tuesday, Dec. 1 – No. 2 Notre Dame, No. 3 Clemson, No. 10 Miami and No. 17 North Carolina.

### THREE ACC TEAMS IN AP TOP 25 RANKINGS

• Three ACC teams are ranked in the AP Top 25 Poll and all three are in the top 10. No. 2 Notre Dame leads the way and is followed by No. 4 Clemson and No. 9 Miami. This is the sixth time this season that three ACC teams have been ranked in the top 10. North Carolina has the most votes of any team outside the top 25. NC State is also receiving votes.

• In the Amway Coaches Top 25 Poll, Notre Dame is No. 2, followed by No. 3 Clemson and No. 9 Miami. North Carolina, NC State and Boston College are also receiving votes.

### FOOTBALL SCHEDULE CHANGES; NOTRE DAME SECURES BERTH IN ACC FCG

• The ACC announced Tuesday, Dec. 1, several football schedule changes, as well as adjustments to its Medical Advisory Group Report. The league's Athletic Directors voted to preserve the integrity of the ACC Football Championship Game by evaluating each of the three teams in contention (Clemson, Miami and Notre Dame) based on a nine-game conference schedule. As a result, Clemson and Notre Dame will conclude the regular season this weekend.

• Wake Forest, which was scheduled to play Notre Dame on Dec. 12, will now play at Louisville. Florida State will play host to Duke on Saturday, Dec. 12, and Florida State will travel to Wake Forest on Dec. 19.

• Should a game involving Clemson, Miami or Notre Dame not be played this weekend, the ACC has the option to reschedule games on Dec. 12 as needed. Based on the current standings and results to date, Notre Dame holds all tiebreakers and has therefore secured a berth in the ACC Football Championship Game.

• Clemson can clinch a spot opposite Notre Dame in the ACC Football Championship Game with a win this weekend over Virginia Tech or a Miami loss to Duke.

### ADJUSTMENTS MADE TO TESTING PROTOCOL

• Following guidance from the ACC Medical Advisory Group, adjustments have been made to the testing of football teams. Each team will be required to have a PCR test administered on Thursday with a result prior to the visiting team traveling to the game locale. The Chief Medical Officers from each team will confirm results and attest that there is every expectation that the game will be played. While the Medical Advisory Group has not identified evidence of virus transmission during competition, this adjustment will mitigate the chances of unnecessary interaction between team members and outside individuals that are inevitable during travel. ## ACC CHAMPIONSHIP GAME SET FOR DEC. 19

• The 2020 ACC Football Championship Game will be played at 4 p.m. on Saturday, Dec. 19, at Bank of America Stadium in Charlotte, North Carolina. The game will be televised by ABC. This year, the ACC Championship Game will feature the league's top two teams based upon highest winning percentage in conference games. Notre Dame has clinched a spot in the game. Capacity for the event will comply with North Carolina state and local regulations, which currently allows for seven percent capacity at outdoor venues of greater than 10,000 fans. Further information on seating capacity and tickets locations will be updated on theACC.com as it becomes available.

## AROUND THE LEAGUE

• Through games of Nov. 28, the ACC has played 74 of its 85 scheduled games (87.1 percent). To date, no conference has played more total games than the ACC. Several changes to the last three weeks of the season were announced Sunday and can be found on theACC.com.

• Home teams are 38-22 in ACC play (.633) this season. From 2015-19, ACC home teams won 53.9 percent of the time (151-129).

• Through games of Nov. 28, scoring in conference games is on a record pace. The average scoring in league games this year is 60.0 points, just ahead of the average of 59.3 points in 2012.

• The ACC leads all Power 5 conferences with 18 wins over teams with a .500 record-or-better. The next closest conference has 12.

• The ACC leads all Power 5 conferences in points per game (31.2) and total offense (417.4). The ACC also leads in sacks per game (2.84) and tackles for losses per game (7.1).

• Clemson (28) and Notre Dame (23) have the two longest home winning streaks in the country. Miami has won five straight at home.

## RENCHER EARNS DISNEY SPIRIT AWARD

• Clemson running back Darien Rencher has been named the 2020 recipient of the Disney Spirit Award, presented annually to college football's most inspirational player, coach, team or figure. Rencher, who overcame knee injuries at T.L. Hanna High School in Anderson, S.C. to walk-on and eventually earn a scholarship at Clemson, becomes the first Clemson player to win the award since its inception in 1996 and the first ACC member to win it since Pitt's James Conner in 2016 following Conner's return to football after beating Hodgkin lymphoma. Rencher has been a staple in the Upstate South Carolina community, serving as a frequent community servant and public speaker. This past offseason, he helped organize the Clemson Community Peaceful Demonstration and helped mobilize players nationwide to rally in support of playing safely during the pandemic.

## ACC PLAYERS EARN NATIONAL RECOGNITION

• Three ACC players have been named semifinalists for the Butkus Award, which is presented annually to the nation's top linebacker. Semifinalists from the ACC are North Carolina's Chazz Surratt, Notre Dame's Jeremiah Owusu-Koramoah and Virginia's Charles Snowden. Finalists will be announced next week.

• Clemson QB Trevor Lawrence and Notre Dame QB Ian Book have been named to the Davey O'Brien Great 8 weekly list for their performances last week. Lawrence, who was also named a Manning Award "Star of the Week," completed 26-of-37 passes for 403 yards with two touchdowns and no interceptions. He improved to 32-1 as a starter in the Tigers' win over Pitt. Book led the Irish to a 31-17 win over No. 19 North Carolina, completing 23-of-33 pass attempts for 279 yards and a touchdown and adding eight rushes for 48 yards. Book improved to 29-3 as a starter.

• NC State wide receiver/return specialist Thayer Thomas has been named to the Paul Hornung Award weekly honor roll for his performance in the win over Syracuse. Thomas had nine catches for 102 yards and touchdowns of 15 yards, 31 yards and nine yards. He also had a 44-yard kickoff return that led to an NC State score and one punt return of four yards.

• Pitt punter Kirk Christodoulou has been named the Ray Guy Award Punter of the Week for his performance against Clemson. Christodoulou punted 10 times for a total of 461 yards. His gross and net average was 46.1 yards due to zero returns. Five of his punts ended up inside Clemson's 20-yard line and he had a long punt of 53 yards.

## WINNING IN THE ACC

• Notre Dame has the nation's longest current winning streak (15) dating back to last season. The Irish have also won 23 straight games at home.

• Notre Dame is fifth all-time with 917 wins. In the ACC, the Irish are followed by Clemson (14th, 766), Virginia Tech (16th, 755), Georgia Tech (19th, 741), Pitt (21st, 737), Syracuse (22nd, 725) and North Carolina (29th, 704).

## PAIR OF 1,000-YARD RUSHERS

• North Carolina running backs Javonte Williams (896 yards) and Michael Carter (864) are on pace to rush for 1,000 yards this season. The last time a pair of ACC running backs from the same team rushed for 1,000 yards was Pitt in 2018 (Qadree Ollison 1,213 yards and Darrin Hall 1,144 yards).

## CHASING RECORDS

• Clemson's Travis Etienne is the ACC's career rushing leader with 4,730 yards. In the Tigers' win over Boston College he moved past NC State's Ted Brown, who had held the record since 1978. Etienne also holds the ACC career record for rushing touchdowns (68) and total touchdowns (76).

• Etienne is also second in ACC history with 6,409 career all-purpose yards. He is second to former Tiger C.J. Spiller, who had 7,588 yards from 2006-09.

• Clemson's Trevor Lawrence has thrown for 85 touchdowns, which ranks fourth in ACC history. Clemson's Tajh Boyd has the league record with 107 TDs, followed by NC State's Philip Rivers (95) and Clemson's Deshaun Watson (90).

• Pitt place-kicker Alex Kessman has booted an ACC-record 12 field goals of more than 50 yards in his career. The previous mark of nine was held by Wake Forest's Sam Swank (2005-08). For his career, Kessman has kicked 12 of 18 field goals of 50-plus yards. His 66.7% success rate from that range is currently an NCAA record, surpassing Arizona's Max Zendejas, who converted 14 of 23 (60.9%) from 1982-85.

#### CONSECUTIVE PASSES WITHOUT AN INTERCEPTION

• Notre Dame QB Ian Book has attempted 237 consecutive passes without an interception, which ties for the nation's longest active streak and ties for the sixth-longest in ACC history. Wake Forest QB Sam Hartman has attempted 234 consecutive passes without an interception, which is the third-longest active streak nationally.

In 2019, he moved past Pitt's James Conner (2013-16), who previously held the ACC career rushing TD record with 52. In addition to his 68 rushing touchdowns, Etienne has eight scores as a receiver.

• Etienne has scored a touchdown in an FBS-record 44 career games. The record was held previously by San Diego State's Donnell Pumphrey (41 games) from 2013-16.

#### ACC COMMITTEE FOR RACIAL & SOCIAL JUSTICE

The ACC's Committee for Racial and Social Justice (CORE - Champions of Racial Equity) announced three initiatives in conjunction with its member institutions on Sept. 3.

- Mandatory diversity and inclusion training for student-athletes, athletic department and conference staff
- Creation of ACC Unity Symbol as a visual representation of solidarity among the ACC's 15 institutions
- ACC Unity Statement to be read prior to every league contest

"I applaud the work of ACC CORE and the initiatives collaborated on and adopted by our schools," said ACC Commissioner John Swofford. "It is critically important for our country to unite as one. The ACC is committed to creating meaningful change, eradicating racism, and upholding the values of equality, diversity and non-discrimination."

"In a time of great challenges where society seems more divided than ever before, we the student-athletes of the ACC want to take a stand against racism, discrimination and any other form of injustice," said Leon Krapf from the NC State Men's Soccer Team and the ACC's representative to NCAA SAAC. "As athletes, we know that sport has the power to unite people from all backgrounds. However, we are more than just athletes. Therefore, we want to use our platforms to advocate for a more tolerant, understanding and inclusive environment on our campuses and beyond. We will overcome our current challenges if we act together and united. #UNITE!"

Student-athletes, athletic department and conference office staff will be required to attend annual diversity and inclusion training. The initiative was unanimously approved by the conference athletic directors. The focus of this year's training will be anti-racism.

The ACC's unity symbol – "UNITE" – will be displayed in venues and on video boards throughout the league, as well as at ACC Championship events and on social media.

CORE also has introduced a Unity Statement, which will be read at all ACC events: **"We, the ACC, are committed to seeing each other as equals, supporting each other, and treating each other with respect and dignity at all times, recognizing that our differences don't divide us, but they make us stronger."**

CORE's work is ongoing and guided by its mission statement, which is "to promote and encourage racial equity and social justice through education, partnerships, engagement and advocacy."

Among CORE's actions to date: the ACC Office's recognition of Juneteenth as a holiday; working with its institutions to increase voter education and vote, with some ACC schools serving as polling places; engaging in conversations and education throughout the conference with staff and student-athletes and initiating partnerships with local organizations and community groups; empowering students and student-athletes to engage with fans around the topic of social justice to minimize misunderstandings.

- Create meaningful, lasting change by improving systems, organizational structures, policies, practices and attitudes
- Have representation at all levels that is reflective of the make-up of the student-athlete population
- Inclusion and empowerment of diverse individuals
- Accountability for hiring practices
- Integrity
- Fairness

### THREE FROM ACC ON AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

• Three ACC players – Clemson QB Trevor Lawrence, Duke OG Rakavius Chambers and NC State P Trenton Gill – have been named to the 11-man FBS Allstate AFCA Good Works Team, which recognizes extra efforts by players and student support staff off the field. The ACC is tied for the most players on the team from any conference. The Allstate AFCA Good Works Team was established in 1992 by the College Football Association.

### ETIENNE AIMS FOR THIRD POY AWARD

• Clemson running back Travis Etienne returned for his senior season and has an opportunity to become the first player in ACC history to win player of the year honors three times. Last season, he became the seventh player in league history to be voted ACC Player of the Year twice and the second in a four-year span (Louisville quarterback Lamar Jackson in 2016-17). He is also the first running back since North Carolina's Mike Voight (1975-76) to win the honor in multiple years.

• The six other players to win the award twice are NC State's Roman Gabriel (QB) in 1960 & 1961, North Carolina's Don McCauley (RB) in 1969 & 1970, North Carolina's Mike Voight (RB) in 1975 & 1976, Clemson's Steve Fuller (QB) in 1977 & 1978, Florida State's Charlie Ward (QB) in 1992 & 1993, and Louisville's Lamar Jackson (QB) in 2016 & 2017.

• The only player in a Power 5 conference to win three league Player of the Year awards was Georgia's Herschel Walker (1980, 1981 & 1982).

### ELEVEN ACC QBS MAKE NFL START

• The ACC leads the country with 11 quarterbacks making at least one NFL start this season – Boston College's Matt Ryan (Falcons), Clemson's Deshaun Watson (Texans), Duke's Daniel Jones (NY Giants), Louisville's Lamar Jackson (Ravens) and Teddy Bridgewater (Panthers), North Carolina's Mitch Trubisky (Bears), NC State's Mike Glennon (Jaguars), Philip Rivers (Colts), Russell Wilson (Seahawks), Virginia Tech's Tyrod Taylor (Chargers) and Wake Forest's Kendall Hinton (Broncos).

### SIX FROM ACC NAMED SENIOR CLASS AWARD

#### SEMIFINALISTS

• Six ACC players – the most of any conference – have been named semifinalists for the 2020-21 Senior CLASS Award, which honors excellence both on and off the field. Selected were North Carolina LB Chazz Surratt, Notre Dame QB Ian Book, Notre Dame OL Robert Hainsey, Pitt C Jimmy Morrissey, Syracuse DE Kingsley Jonathan and Wake Forest DE Carlos Basham Jr. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I FBS senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.

### 2020 PRESEASON ALL-ACC PICKS

• Clemson was selected by the media as the clear favorite in the league's preseason football poll. The nationally top-ranked Tigers are predicted to finish first in the ACC by 132 of the media panel's 134 voters and are also picked to win the ACC Football Championship Game. In addition, Clemson junior quarterback Trevor Lawrence was selected as the ACC Preseason Player of the Year, and the Tigers led all schools with five players voted to the 27-member 2020 Preseason All-ACC Team. Notre Dame, which will compete as an ACC football member this season, received the remaining two first-place votes. North Carolina placed third in the preseason balloting, followed by Louisville, Virginia Tech and Miami.

■ Two new coaches joined the ACC in 2020, Boston College's Jeff Hafley and Florida State's Mike Norvell. Hafley moved to Chestnut Hill after a successful stint as Ohio State's co-defensive coordinator. He was a finalist for the 2019 Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach. Norvell took over in Tallahassee after spending four seasons as the head coach at Memphis where he won the 2019 AAC championship. His .717 winning percentage was the highest in Memphis history.

■ Twelve head coaches in the ACC have won at least 50 career games, including five with more than 100 victories. North Carolina's Mack Brown is tops among active coaches with 257 wins, and Notre Dame's Brian Kelly (coaching in the ACC for the first year) has 251. The other 100-win coaches in the ACC are Clemson's Dabo Swinney (138), Wake Forest's Dave Clawson (130), Virginia's Bronco Mendenhall (128) and Duke's David Cutcliffe (118). No other conference has as many coaches with 100 career wins.

■ Clemson's Dabo Swinney's 138 victories ranks second all-time in the ACC. He only trails former FSU head coach Bobby Bowden (173).

■ Among active coaches, Clemson's Dabo Swinney, Notre Dame's Brian Kelly, Florida State's Mike Norvell and North Carolina's Mack Brown and rank among the top 25 in the nation in career winning percentage. Swinney's .811 winning percentage leads the nation.

■ Two of the five active coaches to win a national title reside in the ACC. Dabo Swinney led Clemson to national titles in 2016 and 2018. North Carolina's Mack Brown won a national title at Texas in 2005.

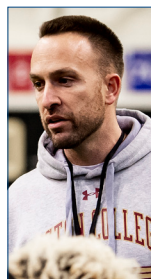
■ Clemson head coach Dabo Swinney is one win shy of FSU's Bobby Bowden's ACC mark for bowl victories, which includes CFP National Championship Games. Bowden leads with 11 Bowl/CFP wins during his tenure in the ACC. Swinney ranks second with 10. Louisville's Scott Satterfield is 4-0 with three bowl victories at Appalachian State and last year's win over Mississippi State in the Music City Bowl.

■ Mack Brown's 14 bowl victories at Texas (10) and North Carolina (4) ranks fourth all-time and second among active coaches. Dabo Swinney's 10 bowl wins are fifth among active coaches, while Duke's David Cutcliffe and Virginia's Bronco Mendenhall are tied for 10th with seven bowl victories.

■ Five current league coaches have won ACC Coach of the Year honors - North Carolina's Mack Brown in 1996, Duke's David Cutcliffe in 2012 & 2013, Clemson's Dabo Swinney in 2015 & 2018, Virginia Tech's Justin Fuente in 2016 and Louisville's Scott Satterfield in 2019.

### 2020 ACC FOOTBALL TIEBREAKER POLICY

The ACC Champion will be decided by a game between the two postseason eligible teams with the highest percentage of wins during all regular season conference competition.

However, for any team to be eligible for the ACC Football Championship Game, or to be considered in a tiebreaker, such team must have played within one (1) total conference game of the average number of conference games played by all conference teams (rounding up/down at .5) during the 2020 season. For example, if the average number of conference games played in the 2020 season is 9.25 (value of nine (9) when rounded down), a team would be eligible to participate in the ACC Football Championship Game, or be considered in a tiebreaker, if that team played eight (8) or more conference games. Furthermore, in the event there is an unequal total number of conference games played among teams tied in the loss column, head-to-head results will take precedence over win-percentage.

If teams remain tied, existing procedures will be applied to determine the ACC Football Championship Game representative(s). Overall conference standings will be calculated on a percentage basis, using the ten conference games which are part of the schedule. If teams are tied for the best win percentage or second best win percentage in its conference games then, in order to determine the Championship Game representative, the procedures listed below will be followed.

#### Two-Team Tie

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
2. Head-to-head competition versus the team with the best overall win percentage and proceeding through the conference. Multiple ties within the conference will be broken from first to last using the league's tiebreaker policies.
3. Overall win percentage versus all common conference opponents.
4. Win percentage versus common conference opponents based upon their order of finish (overall conference win percentage) and proceeding through other common conference opponents based upon their conference order of finish.
5. The tied team with the higher ranking by the Team Rating Score metric provided by SportSource Analytics following the conclusion of regular season games.
6. The representative shall be chosen by a draw as administered by the Commissioner or Commissioner's designee.

#### Three-Team (or More) Tie

- (Three-team (or more) tiebreaker procedure will be used to break all ties to identify the Championship game representative. Once a team is eliminated from the tie, the tiebreaker procedures restart for the remaining teams. If the three-team (or more) tie can be reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaker format will then be applied).
1. Combined head-to-head win percentage among the tied teams.
  2. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the conference with the best overall conference win percentage and proceeding through the conference. Multiple ties within the conference will be broken first to last, using the league's tiebreaker policies.
  3. Combined win percentage versus all common conference opponents.
  4. Win percentage versus common conference opponents based upon their order of finish (overall conference win percentage) and proceeding through other common conference opponents based upon their conference order of finish.
  5. The tied team with the higher ranking by the Team Rating Score metric provided by SportSource Analytics following the conclusion of regular season games.
  6. The representative shall be chosen by a draw as administered by the Commissioner or Commissioner's designee.
- Note: Conference games against otherwise postseason ineligible teams will always be counted in the league standings and in application of the tie breaker policies.



## NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

- The ACC has won seven national championships in football, men's basketball, women's basketball and baseball since 2015. That is the most of any conference. The ACC is the only conference to win each of those four titles over that stretch.
- The ACC has won three of the last seven football national titles (ties for most of any conference) and three of the last five men's basketball national championships (most of any conference) since 2015.
- The ACC has had a team in either the College Football Playoff or the BCS National Championship Game in each of the past seven years.
- Clemson (15-0) won the league's eighth football national championship in 2018 with a 44-16 win over previously unbeaten Alabama. The 28-point margin of victory was the largest over a No. 1 ranked team in ACC history.

## ACC FCG IN CHARLOTTE

- In April 2018, the ACC and the Charlotte Sports Foundation announced a 10-year agreement that will keep the ACC Football Championship Game in Charlotte through the 2030 season. The game will be played annually at Bank of America Stadium on the first Saturday in December.
- The ACC Football Championship Game has sold out four times in Charlotte (2010, 2011, 2015, 2017).
- The economic impact of the 2019 game was close to \$30 million, with more than \$185 million of economic impact over the last six games played in Charlotte.

## BOWL SUCCESS

- A nation's best 10 ACC teams played a postseason bowl game following the 2019 season – Boston College (TicketSmarter Bowl), Clemson (CFP), Florida State (Tony the Tiger Sun Bowl), Louisville (Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl), Miami (Walk-On's Independence Bowl), North Carolina (Military Bowl presented by Northrop Grumman), Pitt (Quick Lane Bowl), Virginia (Capital One Orange Bowl), Virginia Tech (Belk Bowl) and Wake Forest (New Era Pinstripe Bowl).
- The ACC is the only conference to send every team to at least one bowl game over the previous four seasons (2016-19).
- The ACC is tied for the most bowl teams (42) among all conferences over the last four years (11 in 2016, 10 in 2017, 11 in 2018, 10 in 2019).
- Since 2013, the ACC has the second-best record of any Power 5 conference in the BCS, New Year's Six and CFP games, and is tied for the most national championships (Florida State in 2013, Clemson in 2016 & 2018).

## BOWL PARTNERSHIPS

- The ACC is in its sixth year of a 12-year agreement with the Capital One Orange Bowl, which will host an ACC team—either its champion or next available team—in all years when the Orange Bowl is not a semifinal site for the College Football Playoff. The opponent will be the highest ranked available team from the SEC, Big Ten or Notre Dame. The ACC has won five of the last seven Orange Bowls that featured an ACC team, including five in a row from 2012-16.
- A new six-year bowl lineup begins in 2020, and includes the addition of the San Diego County Credit Union Holiday Bowl and the newly created Fenway Bowl in Boston. In addition to those two bowls, the ACC has agreements through 2025 with the *Cheez-It* World Bowl, Duke's Mayo Bowl, Military Bowl, New Era Pinstripe Bowl, TaxSlayer Gator Bowl and Tony the Tiger Sun Bowl. The league will also send a team to either the Gasparilla Bowl, Birmingham Bowl or SERVPRO First Responder Bowl on an annual basis. In addition, the ACC will send a team to the Outback Bowl if the league's opponent in a non-semifinal Capital One Orange Bowl is from the Big Ten.

## ACC & THE NFL DRAFT

- Since the 2005 season, the ACC has had 570 players chosen in the NFL Draft, including 89 first-round picks, the second highest totals of any conference.
- The ACC has had 289 players selected since 2013 - the second-highest total among all conferences - and has had 40 or more players picked in four of the last seven drafts. The ACC's 45 draftees in 2018 was its third-highest ever.
- Current ACC teams have had a total of nine players chosen as the first overall selection in the NFL Draft. The most recent was Florida State's Jameis Winston, who was tabbed first in 2015 by the Tampa Bay Bucs. Miami (Vinny Testaverde, 1987, Tampa Bay; and Russell Maryland, 1991, Dallas) and Virginia Tech (Bruce Smith, 1985, Buffalo; and Michael Vick, 2001, Atlanta) each had two top selections while Florida State (Jameis Winston, 2015, Bucs), NC State (Mario Williams, 2006, Texans), Virginia (Bill Dudley, 1942, Steelers) and Syracuse (Ernie Davis, 1962, Redskins) each had one. Also, NC State's Roman Gabriel, the No. 2 overall selection in the 1962 draft, was chosen No. 1 in the AFL Draft by the Oakland Raiders.

## ACADEMIC SUCCESS

- Virginia linebacker Jordan Mack was a finalist for the 2019 William V. Campbell Trophy® presented by Mazda, announced by the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame (NFF). Celebrating its 30th year in 2019, the award recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation for his combined academic success, football performance and exemplary leadership. An ACC player has won three of the last six Campbell Trophies, including Duke's David Helton in 2014, Virginia's Micah Kiser in 2017 and Clemson's Christian Wilkins in 2018.
- Ten ACC football teams have an APR above the Division I average of 968, which ranks second among peer conferences. In all sports, the ACC is second among Power 5 conferences with 83 teams from member schools recognized in the most recent NCAA APR Public Recognition Awards.
- Ten of 14 ACC Football teams earned a graduation success rate (GSR) at or above the FBS average. That was second-most among Power 5 conferences, both in terms of percentage and in total number.
- The ACC remains the only Power 5 conference to have multiple teams score 90 or higher in GSR each year since 2005. Duke (96), Louisville (91) and Boston College (90) reached that plateau this year.
