### March 18-20, 2020 Virginia at NCAA Championships

Championship History: UVA makes its 41st appearance  
Last Season: Virginia finished 23rd in the 2019 event  
Of Note: UVA's best finish is tied for 10th in 1957



### QUICK SHOTS

- UVA finished the regular season ranked No. 20 in the NWCA Coaches Poll released on February 23
- Virginia found itself in the NWCA coaches poll for the fourth consecutive week at No. 20, entering the rankings after a win over then No. 12 Pittsburgh at home on January 29
- The win over No. 12 Pitt was the first over a ranked foe since a win over No. 16 Arizona State (1/12/19)
- The Cavaliers have eight wrestlers selected to compete at the NCAA Championships, tying with the 2014 squad for the second most individuals selected in program history. Nine wrestlers competed in 2013.
- Jake Keating returned to the lineup after redshirting in the 2019-20 campaign. He made the most of his action this season, twice picking up ACC Wrestler of the Week honors after wins over top 10 opponents.
- Virginia is coming off a fourth-place finish at the ACC Championships, edging 16th ranked Pitt for the fourth position and coming in eight points behind No. 14 North Carolina for third.
- The Cavaliers had three wrestlers take runner-up finishes and three wrestlers take third at their weight classes. Every UVA wrestler who at least advanced to the third-place match earned an NCAA bid.

### THE CAVALIERS IN THE NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

- UVA makes its 34th consecutive appearance in the NCAA Championships in 2019
- The Cavaliers' best finish under head coach Steve Garland is 15th in 2010 and 2017
- The best finish all-time for UVA came in its first appearance - a 10th-place finish in 1957
- UVA has had four finalists - Henry Jordan (1957 - HWT), Steve Garland (2000) - 125, George DiCamillo (2017 - 141) and Jack Mueller (2019 - 125).
- In addition to his finals appearance in 2019, Mueller also advanced to the semifinals in the 2017 NCAA Championships and took a sixth-place finish after having to medically withdraw
- All-time, Virginia has had 16 wrestlers garner All-America honors. Of those 16, three of them earned the honor multiple times with Chris Henrich, Nick Sulzer and Jack Mueller all being three-time All-Americans.

### HOOS HEADING TO ST. LOUIS

- Virginia has eight wrestlers headed to St. Louis for the NCAA Championships with two making their third appearance, two earning their second consecutive bid and four making their first entry
- Jay Aiello (197) earned his third consecutive bid with his runner-up finish at the ACC Championships.
- Louie Hayes (133) earned his third NCAA bid - but not consecutive - after first making the field in 2018 and then missing selection in the 2019 season after starting the year at 125. He earned a bid last year after returning to 133 pounds.
- Justin McCoy (157) and Quinn Miller (285) earned a second consecutive bid, but will be making their first appearances on the mat on the big stage after the 2020 event was canceled due to COVID-19.
- Brian Courtney (141), Jake Keating (165), Patrick McCormick (125) and Vic Marcelli (174) all earned the first NCAA bid of their careers with their selection to the field for 2021.

- Virginia turned in a fourth-place finish at the 2021 ACC Championships, tallying 55.0 points at the event
- It was the second straight year for UVA to turn in a fourth-place finish, finishing ahead of Pitt and Duke in 2021.
- Virginia had three wrestlers advance to the finals with Jay Aiello (197), Jake Keating (165) and Justin McCoy (157) all taking runner-up finishes at their weight classes.
- Three other Hoos took third place in Louie Hayes (133), Patrick McCormick (125) and Quinn Miller (285)
- In all, eight Virginia wrestlers advanced to either the consolation finals or the overall finals at their weight class for the second consecutive season.

- The last time the Hoos traveled to the Gateway to the West it was a productive and exciting trip for Virginia
- The 2017 NCAA Championships at the Enterprise Center (then the ScottTrade Center) saw UVA take 15th overall
- In that event, George DiCamillo advanced to the finals, while Jack Mueller advanced to the semifinals
- Mueller fell to Dean Heil of Oklahoma State in the 141 pound finals, while Mueller fell to Ethan Lizak of Minnesota in the semifinals. Mueller was forced to medically forfeit the rest of the event and took sixth place.

- Jake Keating was named ACC Wrestler of the Week on Tuesday (1/19) after his win over No. 10 Thomas Bullard
- Keating got a pair of takedowns, the only ones in the match, on the way to a 4-3 decision over Bullard
- It was the first ACC dual for Keating since the 2018-19 season after he redshirted last season for the Hoos
- It was the first ACC Wrestler of the Week honor for Keating who is a redshirt junior

- Jake Keating was named ACC Wrestler of the Week on Tuesday (2/16) after his win over No. 11 Kennedy Monday
- Keating trailed Monday by a score of 11-3 in the second period before beginning a furious comeback at UNC
- The Cavalier won the match 18-15 with a flurry of takedowns and even locked up the riding time point
- It was the second time earning the weekly honor for Keating in the 2021 season

- The Cavaliers knocked off No. 12 Pittsburgh on January 29 to launch the Hoos back into the national rankings
- UVA defeated the Panthers 17-16 in Charlottesville, making the first win over a nationally-ranked team since 2019
- In that last win over a top-25 team, the Hoos defeated then No. 16 Arizona State at the Virginia Duals (1/12/19)
- The appearance in the top 20 was the first for Virginia since a ranking of No. 22 the week of January 7, 2020
- In the win over Pitt, UVA got wins at five weight classes with a pair of major decisions to edge the Panthers

### CEDENO, HUDSON TURN IN STRONG FIRST YEARS IN SHORTENED 2021 CAMPAIGN

- A pair of true freshmen turned in exceptional outings in their first year of competition with the Cavaliers as both Dylan Ceden (141) and Hudson Stewart (184) went 6-1 on the shortened season
- Both wrestlers went undefeated at the App State Open to start their collegiate careers with Ceden posting two bonus-point victories with a major decision and a pin. Stewart also went 3-0 with a technical fall.
- Ceden's lone loss of the season came on a 7-6 decision to Colin Gerardi of Virginia Tech, while Stewart dropped a 6-3 decision to Jacob Ferreira of NC State.

### ALL-AMERICA COACHING STAFF FOR THE HOOS

- Virginia's coaching staff consists of four All-Americans, including a pair of NCAA finalists and an NCAA Champion.
- Head coach Steve Garland was the national runner-up at 125 pounds in 2000.
- Assistant coach Travis Paulson was a three-time All-American at Iowa State.
- Assistant coach Trent Paulson was a three-time All-American at Iowa State and 2007 NCAA Champion. Trent was also a World Team member in 2009.
- Volunteer assistant coach Earl Hall is in his first season in the role and was a two-time All-American at Iowa State.

### VIRGINIA HEAD COACH STEVE GARLAND AT A GLANCE ...

- Head coach Steve Garland is in his 15th year at the helm of his alma mater.
- He is the winningest coach all-time in the Virginia wrestling program, passing George Edwards with a win over Southern Virginia (11/2/20)
- His UVA wrestlers have won 13 All-America honors and 18 individual ACC titles.
- Garland guided UVA to six straight top-30 finishes at the NCAA Championships (2000-15) marking the first time UVA recorded six straight NCAA top-30 finishes in program history.
- The 2010 ACC Coach of the Year, Garland led Virginia to an ACC championship and a 15th-place finish at NAAs in 2010 (UVA's best NCAA finish since 1957) and matched that 15th-place finish in 2017.
- He is an alum of the program and was the NCAA runner-up at 125 pounds in 2000 and the 1997 ACC champ at 126 pounds.

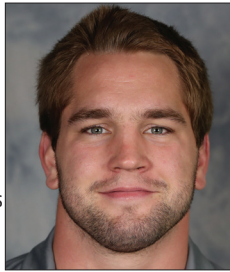
