STARTING FIVE:

1. NCCU begins its 90th season with over 1,200 wins.
2. LeVelle Moton is now the second coach to reach 400 games in program history.
3. NCCU ranked third or higher in the MEAC in eight different team statistics last season.
4. NCCU will face three first-time opponents in the 2022-23 season.
5. NCCU is 24-1 at home in nonconference games since 2016.

EAGLE QUARTET EARN PRESEASON HONORS

Four Eagles earned Preseason All-MEAC honors, the most in the Division I era at NCCU. Justin Wright was listed on the First Team, Eric Boone and Kris Monroe both were named to the Second Team, and Brendan Medley-Bacon was placed on the Third Team.

ALLOW ME TO REINTRODUCE MYSELF...

Brendan Medley-Bacon is no stranger to NCCU or the MEAC, as he started his career at Coppin State from 2018-20. He earned Third Team All-MEAC acclaim as a sophomore in 2019-20, and ranked 31st nationally with 2.1 blocks per game. Of note, current Director of Operations Patrick Cole also started his career at Coppin State in 2012-13 where he was a MEAC All-Rookie selection, and later transferred to NCCU to finish his career from 2015-17 where he won a championship, and recorded the only triple-double at NCCU in the Division I era.

NO SOPHOMORE SLUMP

Sophomore guard Justin Wright broke out for an impressive sophomore campaign, and became the youngest Eagle to be named First Team All-MEAC in the Division I era last season. Wright is the 10th Eagle to be named First Team All-MEAC in the Division I era, and it marked four consecutive years with a First Team selection for NCCU. Wright scored 20+ points seven times against MEAC opponents, including a career-high 32 points against Delaware State. In 11 MEAC games, he averaged 20.1 points per game.

ALL-MEAC ALL-AROUND GUARD

Eric Boone was a dynamic player on both sides of the ball, and the agile guard earned a Second Team All-MEAC nod last season. Boone finished the regular season ranked fourth in the nation with 2.5 steals per game, and ranked second in the MEAC with 3.7 assists per game. Offensively, Boone chipped in 9.6 points per game to rank in the top-20 of the MEAC.

RUN IT BACK

Just one season after returning only three student-athletes, NCCU brings back 10 players and three starters from the 2021-22 season. Notably, Nicolas Fennell will suit up for his fifth season as an Eagle.

UNFAMILIAR GROUNDS

NCCU will play three different opponents for the first time in program history, all in Virginia, beginning with the season opener. The Eagles will meet Virginia on Nov. 7, Liberty on Nov. 14, and Radford on Dec. 1.

DOWN, BUT NOT OUT

NCCU proved that it won't relent until the game has ended when the Eagles recovered 34 points in two games against Howard and Norfolk State. The Eagles trailed by 24 in the first half against the Bison and forced that game into overtime after taking the lead with seven minutes to go. NCCU then went on to win after trailing NSU by 10 by snatching the lead with just 1:37 remaining after a three by Kris Monroe. The Eagles have come back to take leads after trailing by 10 points or more six times last season, and won five of those games.

LEAVING A LEGACY

NCCU stole the spotlight in the opening game of the inaugural Invesco QQQ Legacy Classic on Dec. 18, and came away with a big 86-53 win over Delaware State. The 33-point margin of victory is the sixth-largest against a MEAC opponent in the regular season, and the Eagles drilled an impressive 13 treys.

BUSINESS IS BOONE-ING

Eric Boone showed off his court vision at the Invesco QQQ Legacy Classic, and dished out a season-best 13 assists. 13 assists at the time was the sixth-most in a single game in NCAA Division I this season, and tied for the fourth-most all-time at NCCU. Boone has also been one of the top defenders in the nation, as he's third in NCAA DI with 2.7 steals per game, and is sixth in total steals with 66.

RUNNING EAGLES

NCCU has turned defensive into offense multiple times in 2019-20, highlighted by the Eagles holding Florida A&M scoreless for the final 8:37 of a tied game to spark a 16-0 run on the way to a 61-45 win to start league play. NCCU brought that same intensity to its 2021-22 home opener against Warren Wilson as the Eagles started the game with an 18-0 run in the first 3:39. The Eagles again posted a giant scoring streak to start the game against WWC on Feb. 10, when they made their first eight shots from the floor and first five treys on the way to a 23-0 start. LONG ROAD HOME

NCCU started the last two seasons with four consecutive road games, and this year it will be three games away from McDougald-McLendon Arena to start the year. The Eagles will visit Virginia, Appalachian State, and Liberty from Nov. 7-14, and later will go on another three-game road trek from Dec. 6-17 at Marquette, LSU, and Gardner-Webb.

LEAVING A MARK

Head coach LeVelle Moton is in his 13th year at the helm of the Eagle men's basketball program and reached the 300-game plateau in his career on Dec. 8, 2018 at App State. Moton coached his 308th game on Jan. 19, 2019 against Coppin State to move past John McLendon into second place on the list. He's second all-time on the list, and just the third coach to reach 300 games. Here's a look at coaches with the most games coached at NCCU.

50-50

NCCU started MEAC play by knocking down over half of its shots in consecutive games against league opponents for the first time since the 2014-15 season. The Eagles shot 51.2 percent (21-41) at Delaware State, and then 50.0 percent (25-50) for a combined 50.5 percent on Jan. 22-24. The Eagles once again shot over 50 percent in consecutive games during its home-opening two-game set against Warren Wilson and Apprentice on Nov. 23 and 27. NCCU made a total of 81 field goals, and shot 55.1 percent in those two games. NCCU knocked down over 50 percent of its shots in back-to-back games in the 2020-21 season by registering a 54.2 percent rate against Carver on Jan. 29, and a 60.8 clip against SC State on Feb. 1. The SCSU performance was the best shooting display by the Eagles against a conference opponent since making 61.9 percent of shots against Bethune-Cookman on Feb. 8, 2014. CLOSING TIME

NCCU has excelled with a lead in the second half over the past few seasons, as the Eagles were 15-2 after leading after 20 minutes in the 2019-20 season. NCCU was also 16-1 when leading with both five minutes and one minute remaining. Since 2016, the Eagles are 75-15 when leading at the half, 91-8 when leading with five minutes left, and 93-5 when leading with one minute.



-NCCU came back to win five times after trailing by 10 or more points last season, and also erased a 24-point deficit against Howard in a game the Bison eventually won in overtime.

-The Eagles led the league in rebounds allowed, holding teams to just 33.0 boards per game.

-NCCU also ranked second in field goal percentage at 45.0 percent, and in three-point percentage allowed at 32.3 percent.

LEVELLE MOTON

HEAD COACH • 14TH SEASON

A 1996 graduate of NCCU with a bachelor's degree in recreation administration, Moton became the school's third all-time leading scorer with 1,714 points during his historic hardwood career as an Eagle from 1992-96, earning the nickname "Poetry 'n Moton."

During his junior and senior seasons, Moton was voted All-CIAA First Team, NCAA Division II South Atlantic All-Region First Team and NCAA Division II All-America Honorable Mention. He was named the 1996 CIAA (Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association) Men's Basketball Player of the Year and was inducted into the NCCU Athletic Hall of Fame in 2004.

Among NCCU's all-time career leaders, Moton ranks first in 3-point field goals made (213 of 529), third in scoring (1,714 points), fourth in free throws made (363 of 467), fifth in assists (278), eighth in field goals made (569 of 1,159), 10th in scoring average (16.6 points per game), and 11th in steals (110).

As a junior (1994-95), he topped the CIAA and was No. 16 in NCAA Division II in scoring with an average of 23.5 points per game. His 87 made three-point field goals that year remains the school's single-season record.

As a senior (1995-96), he placed second in the CIAA with 21.3 points per game and ranked among the conference's top 10 statistical leaders in assists, free throw percentage and 3-point field goal percentage.

Moton played on three CIAA Southern Division Championship teams and made two trips to the NCAA playoffs, including an NCAA Division II South Atlantic Regional Championship title in 1993.

After NCCU, Moton played four years of professional basketball in Indonesia (1996-97) and Israel (1998-99). Throughout his professional playing career, Moton averaged 25.0 points per contest, and dished out a little more than five assists per game as a pro.

Moton is a 1992 graduate of Enloe High School in Raleigh, N.C., where he was named Cap5 Player of the Year as a senior.

In December of 2013, Moton received his Master's degree in Special Education with a focus on Learning Disabilities.

He and his wife, Bridget, married on June 28, 2008. They have two children Brooke and LeVelle Jr.

On March 25, 2009, arguably one of the greatest players in school history was elevated from Assistant Coach to the position of Head Coach, becoming the 17th to be named in that spot in the program's history.

In 2019, the Eagles accomplished something that had not been done before in school history as it clinched a third-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance by winning the MEAC Tournament for a third-straight year. Moton was named Most Outstanding Coach of the tournament as the Eagles took down both top seeds of Norfolk State and North Carolina A&T on the way to the title. The Eagles achieved another top-three regular season finish and stayed true to their defensive principles as they finished second in the league by holding opponents to just 67.4 points per game and had a positive scoring margin of 4.8 points per game. They also led the league by holding opponents to just 30.7 rebounds per game and outrebounded the opposition by 6.6 boards per contest.

In 2018, the Eagles caught fire in Norfolk and went on a run to win back-to-back MEAC Tournament championships for the first time in program history, earning consecutive berths into the NCAA Tournament for the first time as well. Moton was named MEAC Tournament Most Outstanding Coach as the Eagles won four games in six days, winning the conference tourney for the first time as a six-seed. NCCU again topped the MEAC defensively, allowing just 65.1 points per game, 33.3 rebounds per game, and 41.7 percent of field goal attempts.

During the 2016-17 season Moton led the Eagles to a 25-9 overall record and a 13-3 MEAC mark, and he joined rare company with John B. McLendon as the only coaches with four 20-win seasons at NCCU. NCCU captured its third MEAC regular-season championship and second MEAC Tournament championship within a four year span to make its second Division-I NCAA Tournament appearance. The Eagles also made history with their first win over an SEC opponent with a wire-to-wire 62-52 win at Missouri. NCCU went on a 13-game win streak during conference play, the second-longest win streak in the Division I era. The Eagles continued to pride itself on defense by being second in the nation in three-point defense, allowing just 29.0 percent of made attempts. NCCU was also top-10 in field goal percentage defense (39.1), top-25 in scoring defense (63.4 points per game) and top-15 in scoring margin (11.7 points per game).

Close to 25 years after the magical run of the 1989 NCAA Division II National Championship team, and just 10 days shy of the fifth anniversary of the day of his official hiring, NCCU soared to its first MEAC Tournament Championship on March 15, 2014 following its 71-62 victory over Morgan State in front of a near-capacity crowd inside the Norfolk Scope Arena. The 2013-14 Eagles tied a school record in wins (28), won the most games in a season for any squad in MEAC history, and was the lowest seed for any league champion in the NCAA Tournament as the maroon and gray earned a 14-seed in the East Region. Moton's squad finished 15-1 in conference play earning the school's first Division I regular season title and won 20 straight contests, which set a new NCAA Division I level record for the program.

The following year, his sixth season as head coach at NCCU, Moton guided the 2014-15 Eagles to a 25-8 overall record, including a 19-3 mark during the final three-and-a-half months, as well as the school's first appearance in the National Invitation Tournament. The 2014-15 squad made history by becoming the first men's basketball team in school history to post an unbeaten regular-season conference record at 16-0 to repeat as MEAC regular-season champions. The Eagles were among the top five defenses in Division I, ranking second in field goal percentage defense (behind Kentucky), fourth in three-point field goal percentage defense and fifth in scoring defense. NCCU completed the campaign by extending the second-longest home win streak in Division I at 35 victories in-a-row (behind Arizona).

Moton joined hall of fame coach John McLendon and national championship coach Michael Bernard as the only coaches in NCCU men's basketball history to lead the Eagles to three straight 20-win seasons.

With the rings of a champion came the accolades as Moton earned MEAC Coach of the Year honors, MEAC Tournament's Most Outstanding Coach award, and was named the BoxtoRow.com HBCU National Coach of the Year, while earning finalist spots in the Hugh Durham National Coach of the Year Award (Top-Mid-Major Coach), and the Top Minority Coach honor, the Ben Jobe National Coach of the Year Award.

He initially returned to his alma mater as assistant men's basketball coach in July 2007.
