The University of Michigan men's lacrosse team (0-0), receiving votes in both the Inside Lacrosse Media and USILA Coaches Poll, opens the 2023 season on the road against No. 1-ranked Virginia on Saturday (Feb. 11) at Noon at UVA's Klockner Stadium.

Wolverine Bites

- The Wolverines were picked sixth in the Big Ten Preseason Coaches poll, and are receiving votes in both in the Inside Lacrosse Media and USILA Coaches Polls. Senior Ryan Schriber, junior Justin Brown, and sophomore Ryan Cohen were named to the Big Ten Preseason Player to Watch List.

- Michigan returns one of the top attack units in the entire country, led by senior and First Team All-Big Ten honoree Josh Zawada (43g, 34a, 77 points), as well as Cohen (33 g, 30a, 66 points) and junior Michael Boehm (29g, 24a, 53 points). Collectively, the group collected 193 points, the sixth-most returning points for an attack unit in the entire country.

Also returning to the fold is graduate student attackman Bryce Clay, U-M's third-leading scorer in the 2021 season. In his three seasons as a primary starter on attack, he has collected 65 goals, 12 assists for 77 points.

- Zawada was named to the preseason Tewaaron Award Watch List, as well as honorable mention All-America by Inside Lacrosse.

- Boehm enters the season on the cusp of becoming the seventh player in program history to eclipse 100 points in their careers, as he sports 54g, 45a for 99 points. Clay is also within range of reaching 100 with his 77 points.

- Zawada, already the program's all-time leading scorer in points (148), is nine goals away from breaking the U-M career record for goals. He owns 93 scores, trailing program leader Brent Noseworthy (2016-19) with 102.

- The midfield group returns the entirety of its top three midfield lines from a season ago, and is paced by senior Jake Bonomi (26g, 4a, 30 points), sophomore Aidan Mulholland (16g, 9a, 25 points), and junior Isaac Aronson (13g, 6a, 19 points). Brown, (13g, 3a, 16 points) also saw time with the first line in his breakout campaign from a season ago. Georgetown graduate transfer and Ann Arbor native Peter Thompson will be also looked at to contribute. Thompson played in 43 games in four seasons for the Hoyas, notching 17g, 8a and 25 points over her career as a Hoya.

• The defensive midfield group returns its top options from a season ago as well, and is led by seniors Michael Cosgrove and Oliver Mirer, both of whom boast significant experience with 34 games played in their U-M careers. Cosgrove has emerged as one of the top shortsticks in the conference with a breakout junior season, collecting 21 ground balls, six caused turnovers, and six points (2g, 2a). Sophomore Lucas Delgado and Justin Ennis also saw extensive run as freshmen.

• U-M's longpole group is led by five-year starter Andrew Darby, who has featured as U-M's top cover man the past four seasons. Darby has 46 starts in his Wolverines career to his name and 99 ground balls to go along with 33 caused turnovers. He will be joined by junior Jack Whitney, who started every game a year ago and had 26 pickups to accompany 11 caused turnovers. Junior Wilson Sneath sat out last season after transferring from Vermont where he was the top cover man for the Catamounts during the 2021 season.

• Graduate student Nick Rowlett and junior Justin Wietfeldt will team up once again to form the top faceoff duo in the country. Both specialists ranked in the top-20 nationally in win percentage a season ago, with Wietfeldt winning 62 percent (120-of-195), while Rowlett ranked No. 20 (124-of-200). In all, Michigan is the only school in the country to return two specialists ranked in the top-20 and win above 50 percent of draws.

The duo also enters the season ranked first and second in winning percentage in school history, with Wietfeldt sitting at 61 percent and Rowlett at 54 percent. Rowlett is the program leader in career ground balls with 198.

Rowlett enters the year on the brink of history and is tied for the U-M record for faceoff winning percentage in a career (53 percent) and has the second-most wins at the dot in school history (245). He also boasts 139 ground balls and is within striking distance of Brad Lott's (2013-16) program record of 178.

• Junior Shane Carr will return as the teams goaltender after starting all 15 games a year ago and earned second team All-Big Ten accolades. He stopped 54 percent of shots faced and had a goals-against average of 11.32, with both numbers ranking third in the conference. He will be backed up by highly-touted freshman Hunter Taylor, who enters U-M as a four-star recruit and was ranked the No. 90 player in the Inside Lacrosse Power 100 and No. 9 goalie recruit.

• The matchup is U-M first-ever versus the Cavaliers. U-M has faced the No. 1 team in the country four times, taking on Maryland (2014), Penn State (2019), Maryland (2021) and Maryland (2022).

Newcomers

The Wolverines will welcome 11 newcomers to the fold for the 2023 campaign, and is ranked No. 14 nationally and fourth in the Big Ten per Inside Lacrosse.

The class includes three from the state of Michigan in Bo Lockwood (Hartland, Mich./Hartland), Ryan Lyngklip (Bloomfield Hills, Mich./Detroit Country Day), and Carson Billig (Brighton, Mich./Brighton).

Four members of the class also feature in the Inside Lacrosse Power 100, highlighted by Lockwood (No. 62), No. 64 Jimmy Pisani (Clarendon Hills, Ill./Culver (Ind.)), No. 90 Hunter Taylor (Rockville, Md./Landon), and Billig (No. 99).

Ann Arbor native and Georgetown transfer Peter Thompson also joins the fold after spending four seasons as a Hoya and helping lead the team to a 2022 Big East Championship.

Schedule

The Wolverines open the season on the road at No. 1 Virginia on Saturday (Feb. 11) before hosting Hofstra (Feb. 18) and Canisius (Feb. 21) at U-M Lacrosse Stadium. U-M then plays a stretch of three road matchups against Marquette (Feb. 25) in the Southwest Florida Shootout in Naples, Fla, before traditional matchups at Delaware (March 4) and Harvard (March 11).

A home contest against Notre Dame (March 18) wraps up non-conference play, before Big Ten action begins. Johns Hopkins (March 25), as well as Penn State (April 16) and Ohio State (April 21 at home sandwich Big Ten road contests at

KEVIN CONRY
Head Coach
Sixth Season

Kevin Conry was announced as the second head coach in the history of Michigan men's lacrosse on June 21, 2017. He arrived in Ann Arbor after spending the last five seasons at the University of Maryland as defensive coordinator, and the past two as associate head coach.

Conry's tenure got off to a host start with 7-2 record in non-conference play, and Michigan had a program-best 5-2 home record on the campaign, winning the first five home contests of the season at the brand new U-M Lacrosse Stadium. The Wolverines set new high water marks for highest rankings in both national polls, checking in as high as No. 15 in the Maverik media poll and 17th in the USILA poll. Wins over ranked opponents on the road vs. No. 4 Notre Dame on March 21 and No. 14 Penn State in overtime finished out the season on a high note.

In all, U-M ended the season with an 8-6 overall record.

Conry, who was named head coach John Tillman's top lieutenant prior to the 2016 campaign, was part of one of the most successful eras of Maryland men's lacrosse, including the Terrapins' 2017 national championship. In five seasons, he helped lead the Terps to four NCAA Final Fours and five Big Ten Conference titles.

In 2017, Conry's defensive unit earned a long list of accolades, including the Schmeisser Award, which was presented to Tim Muller for being the nation's top defenseman. Isaiah Davis-Allen earned First Team USILA All-America honors for the second straight year, becoming the first Maryland defender to achieve the feat since 1975-76.

The 2016 Maryland defense featured a bevy of experience developed under his guidance, including five USILA All-Americans. The Terrapins won a school-record 17 games en route to their third consecutive NCAA Final Four appearance. Conry's defense ranked 10th nationally in scoring defense (8.35 goals/g) and third in man-down defense (73 percent).

In 2014, Maryland ranked third in the nation, allowing just 7.24 goals-per-game as goalkeeper Niko Amato and defender Goran Murray captured

USILA All-America first team honors. The stout defense helped the Terps advance to their third NCAA Final Four in four seasons, while Amato received the Kelly Award for the nation's top goalkeeper.

Conry made the transition to College Park after a successful four-year stint at Fairfield University, where he was the Stags' associate head coach for two seasons. He was responsible for turning around a defensive unit that ranked 39th in the nation prior to his arrival into a unit that ranked among the top 16 in the country in each of the past three seasons.

A 2004 graduate of Johns Hopkins University, Conry was a four-year member of the Blue Jays' lacrosse team, helping the squad to a runner-up finish in the 2003 NCAA Division I Championship. He earned a bachelor's degree in political science at Johns Hopkins and went on to earn a Master's of Science in Education from the University at Albany in 2006.

A native of Rockville Centre, N.Y., he is married to the former Elizabeth Hannan. The couple has three daughters, Izzy (9), Lily (6), and Charlie (4).



JIM ROGALSKI
Associate Head Coach
Defensive Coordinator
Sixth Season

Jim Rogalski enters his fifth season as defensive coordinator for the Wolverines, after previously serving as head coach at Lafayette for five seasons (2013-17). In addition to his coordinator duties in his initial season in Ann Arbor, he helped guide goalie Tommy Heidt to the top goals-against mark in program history (10.11). Prior to his time at Lafayette, he was the head man at Division III Scranton, where he led the Royals to the 2011 Landmark Conference Championship and the program's first NCAA Tournament appearance in his first season on the sidelines. He compiled an 18-15 record after two consecutive winning seasons and also coached Scranton's first All-American. He has also served as an assistant coach at Drexel University, Washington & Lee University, Goucher College, Western New England College, and St. Mary's College of Maryland, his alma mater. During his undergraduate days at St. Mary's, Rogalski was a four-year letterman and three-year starter, in addition to a two-time All-Capital Athletic Conference honoree. Rogalski is the owner of Ski Lax, Inc., and co-owner of Coast to Coast Lacrosse Camp, Inc. He and his wife, Susan, have two daughters, Ella and Lia, and a son, Colton.



SCOTT BIEDA
Assistant Coach
Offensive Coordinator
First Season

Scott Bieda was named the program's newest assistant coach on July 20, 2022.

Bieda, a Rutgers alum, has spent the last six seasons as an assistant coach at Lafayette College, including four seasons as offensive coordinator. The Leopards averaged 12.07 goals-per-game in 2022, and he mentored Peter Lehman, who earned second-team All-Patriot League in 2022 and the league's rookie of the year honor in 2021.

The Bridgewater, NJ native began his coaching career under current U-M associate head coach Jim Rogalski, serving as volunteer assistant coach during the 2017 season.

Bieda had a standout career at Rutgers, earning Big Ten Player of the Year in 2016. In addition, he was a First-Team All-Big Ten member in 2015 and 2016 and was a three-time All-Tournament team honoree. He went on to craft his trade of the Boston Cannons of Major League Lacrosse during the 2017-18 seasons, where he was teammates with former Wolverine standout Kyle Jackson.



MARK BIEDA

Mark Bieda was named the program's newest assistant coach prior to the 2023 season.

Bieda, a Delaware alum, has spent the last four years as a midfielder for the Blue Hens and earned a degree in economics, departing Delaware in the spring of 2022.

The Bridgewater, NJ native will begin his coaching career as a volunteer assistant along side his brother, assistant coach Scott Beida.

Bieda had an incredible career at Delaware, earning All-CAA second team midfielder in 2022. His senior year, he served as a captain and led the team in assists. The team won their first CAA championship in over ten years and knocked off No. 2 Georgetown in the NCAA tournament under his leadership.

Additionally, he ranked in the top three in assists his senior year, as well as ranking in the top ten in career assists for the CAA. Bieda will work with the face-off unit at Michigan in addition to film breakdown.
