March 5, 2023 Virginia at NCAA Championships

Championship History: UVA makes its 43rd appearance
 Last Season: UVA had three wrestlers in the blood round
 Of Note: UVA has four qualifiers for 2023 event



QUICK SHOTS

- The Hoos four wrestlers in the 2023 field with three earning a return bid to the NCAA Championships while Neil Antrassian is making his first trip to the NCAA Championships
- Justin McCoy** earned his fourth consecutive bid to the NCAA Championships and is the 14th four-time NCAA qualifier in Virginia program history
- McCoy claimed the ACC Championship at 165 pounds to earn his third All-ACC honor earlier this month
- McCoy also took fifth at the Midlands Championships with his only two losses coming to No. 10 Izzak Olejnik (N. Illinois) and No. 15 Dan Braunagel (Illinois)
- Michael Battista** earned a bid for the second consecutive season after earning his first bid last year at 184 pounds
- Grad transfer **Jarod Verkleeren** - who is in his second year with the Hoos - earned a bid to the 2020 NCAA Championships that was canceled due to COVID
- Grad transfer **Neil Antrassian** was named as an alternate to the 2022 NCAA Championships for Penn and earned his first outright bid to the tournament this season
- Antrassian took third at the Midlands Championships with wins over No. 30 Anthony Carman (West Virginia) and No. 12 Brian Soldano (Rutgers) in his final two matches
- All four wrestlers appear in the most recent Coaches Ranking and RPI: Jarod Verkleeren (28/28), Justin McCoy (15/18), Neil Antrassian (18/23) and Michael Battista (26/17)

VIRGINIA IN THE NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

- UVA had wrestlers receive bids to the NCAA Championships for the 39th consecutive season in 2023
- The Cavaliers' best finish under head coach Steve Garland is 15th in the 2010 and 2017 championships
- The best finish all-time for Virginia came in the program's first appearance - 10th place in 1957
- Virginia has had four finalists at the NCAA Championships - Henry Jordan (1957 - HWT), Steve Garland (2000 - 125), George DiCamillo (2017 - 141) and Jack Mueller (2019 - 125)
- In addition to his finals appearance in 2019, Mueller also advanced to the semifinals in the 2017 NCAA Championships and took a sixth-place finish after having to medically withdraw from competition
- All-time, Virginia has had 17 wrestlers garner All-America honors. Three of them earned the honor multiple times with Chris Henrich, Nick Sulzer and Jack Mueller being three-time All-Americans
- Brian Courtney advanced to the quarterfinals last season to mark five consecutive UVA quarterfinalists

HOOS AGAINST THE FIELD

- Jarod Verkleeren wrestled nine matches against wrestlers in his bracket with wins over Alec Hagan of Ohio and Nate Higley of George Mason
- Justin McCoy wrestled nine matches against the bracket with wins over Connor Brady (Virginia Tech), Maxx Mayfield (Northwestern), Will Formato (App. State) and Josh Kim (Harvard)
- Neil Antrassian had 10 matches against the field with wins over Carman, Reece Heller (Pitt), Caleb Hopkins (Campbell), Brian Soldano (Rutgers) and Zayne Lehman (Ohio)
- Battista has 12 matches against the field with wins over Jaxon Smith (Maryland), Jacob Koser (Navy), Max Shaw (UNC) and Cole Urbas (Penn).

CAVALIERS WELCOME HIGHLY-TOUTED NEWCOMERS

- Virginia welcomed a group of newcomers to Grounds for the 2022-23 season that includes the No. 8 signing class in the nation according to FloWrestling.
- Among those freshmen were six wrestlers ranked in the top 100 nationally and included nine wrestlers who won state titles in their senior campaigns and two state runners-up.

FRESHMEN SHINE AT VIRGINIA DUALS

- A group of freshmen made a big impact when inserted into the lineup at the Virginia Duals this season with Garrett Grice (133), Michael Gioffre (149) and Nick Hamilton (165) combining to go 11-1 on the weekend
- Grice and Hamilton both went 4-0 on the weekend, while Gioffre went 3-1
- Grice tallied a pin and a pair of major decisions in his four wins, while Hamilton posted a pair of wins over nationally-ranked wrestlers with decisions over No. 32 Jordan Sliyka of Ohio and No. 25 Enrique Munguia of Kent State
- Gioffre picked up a pair of nationally-ranked wins as well with a decision over No. 31 Alec Hagan of Ohio and a pin of No. 32 Kody Komora of Kent State. His one loss came to No. 28 Ethen Miller of Maryland.

MICHAEL GIOFFRE TAKES FIFTH AT SOUTHERN SCUFFLE

- Michael Gioffre kicked off the new year with a big performance at the Southern Scuffle to start the new year.
- Gioffre opened the tournament with an upset over top-seeded and No. 16 ranked Jaden Abas of Stanford.
- The freshman finished fifth after dropping his semifinal match to No. 21 Victor Voinovich of Oklahoma State

ALL-AMERICA COACHING STAFF

- UVA's coaching staff consists of four former All-Americans, including a trio of NCAA finalists and an NCAA Champion.
- Head coach Steve Garland was the national runner-up at 125 pounds in 2000.
- Assistant coach Travis Paulson was a three-time All-American at Iowa State.
- Assistant coach Trent Paulson was a three-time All-American at Iowa State and 2007 NCAA Champion. Trent was also a World Team member in 2009.
- Volunteer assistant Jack Mueller was a finalist in the 2019 season and a three-time All-American (2017, 2019, 2020).

VIRGINIA HEAD COACH STEVE GARLAND AT A GLANCE ...

- Head coach Steve Garland is in his 17th year at the helm of his alma mater.
- He is the winningest coach all-time in the Virginia wrestling program, passing George Edwards with a win over Southern Virginia (11/2/20)
- His UVA wrestlers have won 12 All-America honors and 17 individual ACC titles.
- Garland guided UVA to six straight top-30 finishes at the NCAA Championships (2000-15) marking the first time UVA recorded six straight NCAA top-30 finishes in program history.
- The 2010 ACC Coach of the Year, Garland led Virginia to an ACC championship and a 15th-place finish at NCAAs in 2010 (UVA's best NCAA finish since 1957) and matched that 15th-place finish in 2017.
- He is an alum of the program and was the NCAA runner-up at 125 pounds in 2000 and the 1997 ACC champ at 126 pounds.






