NEWS AND NOTES

CAMPBELL NOTABLES

- Campbell has shot over 50.0 percent from the field in back-to-back games for the first time in the Ronny Fisher Era (since 2016-17 season)
- Return 10 of 11 players from last year's team that finished 16-15 overall and 10-8 in Big South Conference play
- Campbell's leading returning scorers and rebounders include preseason All-CAA selections Shy Tuelle (13.0 ppg, 4.3 rpg) and Christabel Ezumah (10.6 ppg, 9.2 rpg) along with Brittany Staves (9.3 ppg, 4.7 rpg)
- Added freshmen guards Jessica Woods (Columbia, S.C.), Hadleigh Dill (Candler, N.C.) and forward Peris Smith (Graniteville, S.C.) along with senior walk-on guard Taylor Cotter (Fairfax, Va.)
- Voted to finish 10th out of 14 teams in the CAA preseason poll

CAMELS IN THE CAA

- The 2023-24 season marks the first for Campbell as members of the Coastal Athletic Association after departing for the league this past summer from the Big South
- Full CAA membership includes College of Charleston, Delaware, Drexel, Elon, Hampton, Hofstra, Monmouth, North Carolina A&T, UNC Wilmington, Northeastern, Stony Brook, Towson and William & Mary
- Monmouth won the CAA Championship last season to earn the conference's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament
- Towson and Drexel both earned bids to the WNIT

LAST TIME OUT

- Brittany Staves scored a career-high 25 points on 9-of-10 shooting (including 5-of-5 from three) to lift Campbell past Coppin State 68-55

- After being outscored 17-9 in the third quarter, Campbell limited the Eagles to four points on 2-of-16 shooting in the final period
- Christabel Ezumah added 11 points and six boards while Gemma Nunez provided nine points and five boards for the Camels who shot 53.2 percent (25-of-47) from the floor

STAVES' CAREER NIGHT

- Brittany Staves' 25 points at Coppin State (11/9) marked a new career-high for the fifth year Camel from nearby Raleigh, N.C.
- Staves scored 17 of her 25 in the first half and made 9-of-10 shots from the field, 5-of-5 from three and 2-of-3 from the charity stripe
- She became the first Camel to score 25+ since former guard Luana Serranho (2018-22) dropped 26 in a win against Hampton on Jan. 24, 2022

NATIONALLY RANKED DEFENSE

- Campbell is one of two programs (UConn) to be ranked in the top-25 for scoring defense in each of the past six seasons
- The Camels finished the 2022-23 season ranked No. 5 nationally in scoring defense, holding foes to an average of 52.5 points per game
- The Camels also ranked No. 8 in field goal percentage defense, holding teams to shoot 35.1 percent from the field and No. 60 in three-point field goal percentage defense, limiting teams to shoot 28.6 percent from behind the arc
- Additionally, the Camels ranked No. 52 nationally with 39.7 rebounds per game, No. 12 with a rebound margin of 8.4 and No. 51 averaging 4.1 blocks per game
- Campbell has held 39 opponents to 40 points or less and 94 opponents to 50 points or less in the Ronny Fisher era

NEWS AND NOTES

SERIES HISTORY (UVA leads 2-1)

- Fourth all-time meeting, Campbell is 1-2 in the series
- Virginia won last season 62-41. Gianni Boone led all scorers with 16 points for the Camels who led 12-10 at the end of the first quarter and just trailed 22-18 at the half. Camryn Taylor scored 13 points while London Clarkson added 10 for the Cavaliers
- Campbell won the first meeting in the series, 87-79 during the 1978-79 season

- 89.7% of its steals (176 of 196 steals)
- 99.2% of its blocks (127 of 128 blocks)
- Campbell also returns its top four scorers (Ezumah, Staves, Boone, Fuller) and top five rebounders (Ezumah, Fuller, Nurenberg, Staves, Boone)

TUELLE RETURNS

- Shy Tuelle returns to the Camels for her sixth season
- Her 2022-23 season came to an end just seven games in after suffering an injury that put her out for the final 24 games last season
- Before her injury, Tuelle ranked No. 2 in the nation with 3.7 threes per game, No. 5 shooting 56.5% from behind the arc and No. 15 with 26 made threes
- Tuelle is the program's all-time leader in 3-pointers made and ranks 16th on the all-time scoring list with 1,133 points

EZUMAH EMERGENCE

- Senior forward Christabel Ezumah blossomed into one of Campbell's top options on both ends of the court in 2022-23
- Ezumah started all 31 games last season and set career-highs averaging 10.6 points, 9.2 rebounds and 1.9 blocks
- An All-Big South first team selection, Ezumah scored in double-figures 18 times and had two 20-point outbursts against UCF and Gardner-Webb

SCOUTING THE CAVALIERS

- Virginia (1-0) opened the season with a 76-52 win over Maryland Eastern Shore on Wednesday
- The Cavaliers returns eight players from last season's squad including All-ACC second team selection Camryn Taylor along with forward Sam Brunelle, who was named to the 2024 Katrina McClain Watch List (nation's top power forward)
- Picked to finish 10th out of 15 teams in the ACC Blue Ribbon Panel predicted order of finish
- Led by second-year head coach Amake "Mox" Agugua-Hamilton

A WIN ON SUNDAY WOULD...

- Be the 790th win in program history (789-594)
- Be head coach Ronny Fisher's 235th career win (234-220)
- Be Coach Fisher's 138th win at Campbell (137-76)

STRENGTH IN RETURNERS

- Entering the 2023-24 season, Campbell returns 10 of 11 letterwinners from last season with the lone departure being guard Erika Joseph who graduated last May
- Overall, Campbell returns:
 - 88.1% of its minutes (5,463 of 6,200 minutes)
 - 88.4% of its scoring (1,595 of 1,803 points)
 - 94.6% of its rebounding (1,166 of 1,232 rebounds)
 - 94.3% of its assists (367 of 389 assists)

HEAD COACH RONNY FISHER

- A three-time Big South Coach of the Year, Ronny Fisher is in his eighth season at the helm of Campbell women's basketball
- Over the previous six seasons Campbell has won 119 games for an average of 19 wins per season
- Before leaving the Big South for the CAA, Fisher was the longest-tenured Big South coach in his 15th season and led all active coaches in the league with 232 wins overall including 146 in Big South play

- Under Fisher, the Camels claimed the 2019-20 and 2021-22 Big South regular season titles and finished as Big South tournament runners-up in 2019, 2021 and 2022
- Fisher has also led Campbell to its first-ever WNIT berth in 2021-22 along with two other postseason appearances in the WBI. He helped the Camels claim their first ever postseason win in the 2019 WBI
- Previously served as head coach at Presbyterian (2008-16)

ADVANTAGE IN THE CREEK

- Under head coach Ronny Fisher, Campbell has compiled a 93-30 (.774) record at home including a 43-13 (.813) mark over the past four seasons
- Over the past seven seasons Campbell has held foes to 49.4 points per game and outscored its opponents by an average of 12.0 points when playing inside Gore Arena
- Since the 2016-17 season, the Camels have held foes to 40 points or less 27 times at home

CAMELS WORLDWIDE

- Campbell's 2022-23 roster features players from seven different states and three different countries including Spain, Luxembourg and Australia

WANDA WATKINS DAY - NOV. 18

- Campbell is set to honor legendary former head coach Wanda Watkins as part of the first Wanda Watkins Day on Nov. 18 vs. Western Carolina after she announced her retirement from Campbell Athletics effective at the end of the 2023-24 academic year
- A fixture in the Fighting Camel Athletics program for the last four decades, Watkins currently serves as Senior Associate Athletics Director and Senior Woman Administrator. After a 37-year coaching career, she moved into athletics administration at her alma mater in September 2016
- For 35 years, Watkins served as head coach of the Campbell women's basketball team before moving to an administrative position in June of 2016. While in charge of the Camels on the court, Watkins led her teams to 549 victories, 10 appearances in Division I conference championship games and the program's first-ever trip to the NCAA tournament
- Watkins was named in Campbell Magazine as one of 14 trail blazing women who shaped the University. In June 2022, the Big South Conference announced that its annual female athlete of the year award would be named in Watkins' honor
- She was inducted into the Campbell Sports Hall of Fame in February 2017, and the Big South Conference Hall of Fame in 2019, as well as the Johnston County Hall of Fame in 2008.
- A 1979 Campbell graduate, Watkins led her teams to the 1989 Big South and 2000 Atlantic Sun Conference

tournament titles. In addition, Campbell was the 1988 (co-champion) and 1991 Big South regular season champion, as well as the 2001 A-Sun regular season champion.

- Her 2000 team defeated Georgia State in the championship game and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history. That Lady Camel squad, which lost to Duke in the Big Dance, posted a 22-9 record.
- Watkins was the school's first female athletic scholarship recipient after graduating from nearby South Johnston High School in 1975. She was a member of that school's 1974 North Carolina state championship team.
- She served as team captain of the Lady Camels basketball team as a senior and captained the softball team for three years. Despite suffering an injury in her final season, Watkins was named MVP of the 1978-79 team and selected as Campbell's Outstanding Female Athlete

2022-23 SEASON RECAP

- Finished 16-15 overall, 10-8 in Big South games
- Reached the semifinals of the Big South Championship for a fourth straight time
- Christabel Ezumah was named All-Big South first team
- Brittany Staves was named honorable mention all-conference and Scholar-Athlete of the Year
- Gianni Boone was named to the all-freshman team
- Finished the season nationally ranked No. 5 in scoring defense (52.5 ppg allowed), No. 8 in field goal percentage defense (35.1%) and No. 12 in rebound margin (8.4)
- Ezumah ranked No. 30 nationally averaging 1.9 blocks and No. 48 with 9.2 rebounds

WHY THE FIGHTING CAMELS?

- While many stories exist, the most prevalent is the result of a misunderstanding after a fire destroyed much of Campbell's original campus. As the school's founder and president, Dr. James Archibald Campbell bemoaned the fate of the institution, Mr. Z.T. Kivett encouraged him, "Your name's Campbell; then get a hump on you! We've got work to do." Dr. Campbell thought that Mr. Kivett said, "You're a camel, get a hump on you."
- Campbell's athletic teams were originally named the "Hornets." At the time, other references to the athletic teams were "The Campbells" or the "Campbellites."
- The changing of the mascot to a camel came in late 1933 or early 1934
- Campbell is the only NCAA Division I competitor (of 363 members in 2022-23) with a "Camel" as its mascot
- NCAA Division III member Connecticut College athletic teams are also nicknamed the Camels

ABOUT CAMPBELL UNIVERSITY

- Founded as Buies Creek Academy on Jan. 5, 1887 by James Archibald Campbell
- Since then, Buies Creek Academy has evolved to become Campbell Junior College (1926), Campbell College (1961), and Campbell University (1979)
- 1,500 acre main campus located 30 miles south of Raleigh
- Fields 23 NCAA Division I athletics programs
