PRIOR TO PLAYING

Louisville men's basketball heads into its second ACC road game of the year to take on the Virginia Cavaliers in Charlottesville, Va. on Saturday afternoon. The 4 p.m. game will be broadcast on ACC Network.

Both programs won their most recent league contest with Louisville beating North Carolina 83-70 on New Year's Day after Virginia beat NC State 70-67 the day prior.

Head coach Pat Kelsey has never faced the Hoos in his career. Louisville is 5-24 all-time against Virginia and has not bested the Cavaliers since Feb. 9, 2020. The Cardinals last won a game in Charlottesville on Feb. 17, 1990, its lone away victory in the series. **The full series between the two teams can be found on Page 46.**

CARDINAL NOTES

- Current redshirt center **Aly Khalifa** is up against his former head coach for the second time now this season. Virginia's Ron Sanchez coached Khalifa at Charlotte for two seasons before he played for current Kentucky head coach Mark Pope at BYU.
- Louisville's five losses have all come to teams now ranked in the AP Top 25: No. 1 Tennessee, No. 4 Duke, No. 10 Kentucky, No. 12 Oklahoma and No. 24 Ole Miss. As of Jan. 2, those teams are a combined 59-6.
- Against North Carolina on Jan. 1, **Chucky Hepburn** made 16 free throws, tying the program record for free throws made in a single game.
- Louisville played five ranked opponents before the New Year. The Cardinals have the 13th best strength of schedule according to KenPom as of Jan. 2. **See 'Stiff Competition' on Page 6.**
- As of Jan. 2, Louisville is eighth in the country in 3-point attempts per game (32.0), 39th in free throw attempts per game (23.7) and 50th in free throws made per game (16.9). **Find the full ranking summary on Page 4.**
- As of Jan. 2, **Chucky Hepburn** is 12th in the country in steals per game at 2.57 and sixth in total steals with 36. **Reyne Smith** is second in the country total 3-point attempts (128), sixth in total 3-pointers made (48) and 14th in 3-pointers per game at 3.43.
- Sophomore forward **James Scott** is ninth in the country in dunks as of Jan. 2 with 27 on the year, according to Bart Torvik. He leads the ACC in that category.
- Senior guard **Reyne Smith** was named ACC Player of the Week on Dec. 23 for his 27-point performance at Florida State. It was just the third time in the program's 11 years in the ACC that Louisville has had multiple ACC Player of the Week awards as **Chucky Hepburn** also earned that title on Dec. 2.
- Against Florida State on Dec. 21, **Chucky Hepburn** and **Terrence Edwards Jr.** both logged eight assists apiece; it was the first Louisville game to have two Cardinals log at least eight assists each in the same game since Peyton Siva and Gorgui Deng both had eight against Syracuse in the 2013 Big East Tournament championship game.
- Louisville's 89-61 victory over No. 14/15 Indiana in the quarterfinals of the Battle 4 Atlantis was Louisville's first win over a ranked team since beating No. 19/20 Virginia Tech 73-71 on Jan. 6, 2021. It's the highest ranked opponent the Cards have beat since beating No. 3 Duke 79-73 on Jan. 18, 2020.
- In the win over Indiana, UofL's **Chucky Hepburn** logged 16 points, 10 assists and seven steals. He's the first DI player with at least those marks since Markquis Nowell of Kansas State did it against West Virginia with 23 points on Dec. 31, 2022.

Credentials are held at Media Will Call, located inside the Suite Entrance on the Second Street side of the KFC Yum! Center (front right side of the arena). Credentials will not be mailed. Passes are limited to WORKING MEDIA ONLY. The media room is located on the event level, the first door to the right after entering the Suite Entrance/Media Entrance. Media seating is either at courtside or at tables in designated corner areas of the arena in Section 120.

INTERNET ACCESS: Wireless internet access is available throughout the KFC Yum! Center. A password is required for special media access. Wired connections are also available in the media room.

TELEPHONES: Media desiring personal phone service should have a phone installed through the KFC Yum! Center by calling (502) 690-9000 in advance. Please list Dana Brown as the contact for placement.

PHOTO: Photographers are limited to working within designated boxes on the baseline at each end of the court. An upper photo area position may be provided if requested in advance. Photo work space, equipped with wired internet access, is available within the media work room (two digital photo rooms). Specific protocols will be provided to those who receive limited credentials.

PARKING: Limited media parking is available in garages within one block of the KFC Yum! Center. Some require a pass to have in hand in advance, others are operated from a list supplied by UofL. Requests should be made well in advance to Dana Brown.

NOTES/STATS: Game notes and statistics will be available online at www.GoCards.com/mbbmedia. Live statistics will be available during the event

online on GoCards.com, the CardsMobile app and Louisville.statbroadcast.com. A pdf of the final statistics will be posted postgame on GoCards.com. Broadcast personnel will have access to a computer monitor displaying live game statistics throughout the game.

MEDIA ROOM: The KFC Yum! Center media room will open two hours prior to tipoff and will close two hours after conclusion of the game. Only those who make special arrangements with Dana Brown (dana@gocards.com) in advance will be permitted in the media areas any earlier. If you anticipate needing additional time postgame, you may wish to work from home or another location.

FOOD/REFRESHMENTS: A pregame buffet meal and fountain drinks are planned on game day through our partnership with our concessionaire Centerplate.

POSTGAME: Louisville head coach Pat Kelsey and select Cardinal players will be available to the media postgame as soon as possible following the NCAA-mandated cooling off period. Please coordinate with the visiting SID to confirm their planned postgame protocol. If agreed to by the visiting coach, that coach will come to the interview room at a time which best fits their postgame schedule.

INTERVIEWS: Coach Pat Kelsey (or an assistant coach) and selected players are generally available by news conference prior to each game, schedule permitting. NOTES ON THE PROGRAM

TRADITION OF WINNING

Louisville has an all-time record of 1,793-1,016 in 111 seasons of intercollegiate basketball. The Cardinals rank among the top-15 all-time in winning percentage (does not include 123-3 record vacated by NCAA). The Cardinals played their first official men's basketball game on Jan. 28, 1912 when they lost 35-3 to Louisville YMCA, but did not field teams in 1916-17, 1922-23 or 1942-43. The Cardinals have produced winning seasons in 73 of the last 79 years, including winning 20 or more games in 18 of the last 22 seasons and 30 or more in three of the last 13 years in on court results.

TOURNAMENT SUCCESS

UofL is tied for eighth nationally with eight Final Four appearances. No other school went to the Final Four four times during the 1980s, and Louisville won two NCAA titles in that decade, winning the national championship in 1980 and 1986. Louisville's 39 NCAA Tournament appearances are tied for eighth best all-time, and its 102 NCAA Tournament games ranks 10th for most played in the event (61-41 record) (does not include four NCAA appearances, a 15-3 record, two Final Fours and the 2013 national championship vacated by the NCAA). The Cards have reached the Sweet 16 on 17 occasions and have advanced to the Elite Eight 11 times.

PRO CARDS

The Cardinals have had 77 players drafted by the NBA, including 25 first-round selections. David Johnson was the latest Cardinal chosen with the 47th pick in the 2021 draft by the Toronto Raptors. Donovan Mitchell was UofL's latest first round selection in the 2017 draft as the 13th overall pick by the Denver Nuggets and was subsequently traded to the Utah Jazz. He's now with the Cleveland Cavaliers and is a five-time NBA All-Star. Jordan Nwora (2021) and Damion Lee (2022) have both won NBA championships, and Carlik Jones was the 2022-23 G League Most Valuable Player. Nineteen Cardinals have played in the NBA over the last 10 years, while at least 22 former UofL players are expected to play professionally this year in the NBA, G League or overseas.

CROWD SUPPORT

Louisville has ranked among the top seven nationally in average home attendance in 40 of the last 43 years. UofL has played 14 full seasons in its spectacular home, the 22,090 seat KFC Yum! Center in downtown Louisville. The Cardinals have a 196-63 record in 14 seasons in the KFC Yum! Center (.757). Louisville attracted approximately 4.2 million fans in its first 14 years in the Yum! Center, including a total attendance of 298,846 in 18 games in 2019-20 (last year pre-COVID).

CHAMPIONSHIP GUESTS

The eventual national champion has played in Louisville's home arena, the KFC Yum! Center, in seven of the arena's 14 seasons in existence. Louisville faced eventual champions Connecticut (2011, 2014), Duke (2015) and Virginia (2019) in home games, Kentucky (2012) won a pair of games in the 2012 NCAA second and third rounds in the KFC Yum! Center, 2016 champion Villanova won the NCAA South Regional in Louisville, and UofL won the 2013 itself (later vacated).

NATIONAL SPOTLIGHT

The Cardinals are one of the most televised teams in college basketball. UofL games will be televised on national networks during the 2024-25 regular season on double-digit occasions. Every possible UofL game over the past 41 years has been televised on either a live or delayed basis – a total of over 1,300 games – including over 600 national television appearances.

AMERICA'S TOP BASKETBALL MARKET

Louisville is consistently the highest-rated television market for college basketball. Louisville has been the top market for more than 20 years since organizations began tracking the data. Louisville's 4.2 rating during the 2018-19 season was well above the next closest market (Knoxville with a 2.9 rating). Louisville has historically been the top television market for the NCAA Tournament as well.

AT HOME IN THE TOP 25

The Cardinals have been ranked on 656 occasions in the AP poll, sixth most all-time. Louisville has been among the top ten on 302 occasions, including 14 times in the 2019-20 season. Louisville's No. 1 ranking in the Dec. 2 and 9, 2019, Associated Press polls were just the third and fourth times UofL has ever been ranked as the No.1 team in the nation in the AP poll. The other two were March 16, 2009 in the final AP poll of the season; and Jan. 14, 2013. UofL has been ranked as the No.1 team in the nation in the coaches poll on five occasions, including twice in 2019-20. The other three were in the 1986-87 preseason UPI coaches poll; in the ESPN/USA Today poll on March 15, 2009; and in the final USA Today coaches poll of 2012-13 on April 8, 2013.

RANKED COMPETITION

Louisville has won 46 of its last 118 games against AP ranked opponents. The Cardinals most recently broke a 16-game losing streak and beat No.

14/15 Indiana in its last Top 25 matchup. UofL has a 63-84 record against Top 25 teams over the last 15 years. The Cards have been victorious 10 of the last 31 times they have faced an AP top-five foe. UofL has won 23 of its last 63 games when facing Top 10 teams.

NON-CONFERENCE DOMINANCE

UofL has a 258-83 record (.757) against non-conference opponents over the last 24 seasons (includes postseason), including a 188-27 record in home regular season non-conference games. The Cardinals are 112-18 at home in regular season non-conference games over the last 15 seasons.

STIFF COMPETITION

Louisville played five ranked teams all before Dec. 15. UofL played No. 12 Tennessee on Nov. 9 in the KFC Yum! Center in front of 16,976 fans. The Cardinals beat No. 14/15 in the quarterfinals of the Battle 4 Atlantis tournament. Louisville played No. 23/20 Ole Miss, then opened ACC play with No. 9 Duke. The Cards then played on the road at No. 5 Kentucky on Dec. 14.

THE 1K CLUB

Louisville is tied for second nationally, behind North Carolina, with 69 all-time 1,000 point scorers. Jordan Nwora (1,294 points in three seasons) was the latest Cardinal to reach that milestone in 2019-20.

ACADEMIC STANDARD

The Cards have attained a collective 3.0 GPA in 27 of the last 32 semesters. They posted a 3.017 team GPA for the entire 2023-24 academic year. UofL was recognized in July as a recipient of the Team Academic Excellence Award from the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC). In order to receive the award, a program must achieve a team GPA of 3.0 or higher for the previous academic year.

NOTES ON GAMES

BATTLED IN PATLANTIS

Louisville took its second trip to the Bahamas to compete in the Battle 4 Atlantis Nov. 27-29. The Cardinals opened the trip with a resounding 89-61 victory over No. 14/15 Indiana. Against Indiana, Louisville's 23 assists were its most since having 23 in a 90-66 win against Syracuse on Feb. 19, 2020. It's 15 steals were the most since logging 15 in a 77-54 win over Georgia Tech on Feb. 8, 2018. Next, UofL beat West Virginia 79-70 in its first overtime game of the season. It was UofL's largest margin of victory in an overtime game since beating North Carolina 78-68 on Jan. 31, 2015, and the biggest overtime win away from home since beating West Virginia 82-71 in double overtime on March 8, 2007, in the Big East Tournament. Louisville eventually fell in the Battle 4 Atlantis Championship 69-64 against undefeated Oklahoma.

BIG WINNERS

Louisville's 48-point season-opening victory over Morehead State on Nov. 4 was Louisville's largest margin of victory since a 104-54 win vs. Southern on Nov. 13, 2018, and largest in a season opener since a 92-38 win vs. South Alabama on Nov. 18, 2001.

DENY, DENY, DENY

Against Winthrop on Nov. 22, Louisville logged 10 blocks, including seven in the first half. Sophomore James Scott blocked five on his own. The 10 total, seven in a half and Scott's five were all the first time those feats happened for the Cardinals since March 7, 2018 against Florida State.

FLYING IN THE FIRST HALF

Louisville's 48 first-half points against Bellarmine on Nov. 19 were the most since leading Eastern Kentucky 50-32 at halftime on Dec. 14, 2019.

DEFENSIVE PROWESS

In its season opener against Morehead State on Nov. 4, the Cardinals held the Eagles to a 23.1% clip from the floor. It's the lowest field goal percentage of any Louisville opponent since Nov. 13, 2015 when the Cards held Samford to 21.0%.

LIVING ON ISLAND TIME

The Cardinals took a foreign tour trip to the Bahamas in late July/early August to compete in two exhibition games as part of the Baha Mar Hoops Summer League. Louisville won the first exhibition game played in July in the program's record, defeating the Bahamas Select team 111-59 on July 30, 2024. The Cardinals dished out 38 assists in the victory which would have been a program record in a regulation game. Louisville defeated the Calgary Dinos 111-71 on August 1 to finish off the trip.

NOTES ON THE CARDINALS

HEPBURN'S HOT HAND

Chucky Hepburn was named ACC Player of the Week on Monday, Dec. 2 after his dominant performance in the Battle 4 Atlantis. It's Louisville's first Player of the Week accolade since Feb. 20, 2023. Over the three contests, Hepburn averaged 20 points per game, shooting 62.5% from the field, netting 20 of 32 attempts. He added a 77.8% clip from the charity stripe and totaled 16 assists against just nine turnovers. He

A THIEF IN THE NIGHT

Chucky Hepburn is the first Cardinal since Russ Smith (2011-12) to log three games of six or more steals in a single season. He grabbed six against No. 12 Tennessee and West Virginia and seven against No. 14/15 Indiana.

DOUBLE-DOUBLE DEBUT

In his Louisville debut, fifth-year senior **Kasean Pryor** logged a double-double of 18 points and 12 rebounds against Morehead State on Nov. 4. He is one of seven Cardinals since 1965 to produce a double-double in their first time on the court in a Louisville uniform. Others include Chane Behanan (14 and 12, 11/11/11), David Padgett (17 and 10, 12/3/05), Marvin Stone (19 and 11, 12/18/02), Greg Minor (16 and 10, 11/23/91), Larry Williams (10 and 14, 11/29/75) and Wes Unseld (19 and 28, 12/1/65).

THE OLDEST KIDS ON THE BLOCK

The Cardinals are one of the more experienced teams in the country this season. Between the 17-man roster, the average amount of years in college basketball is 3.0 years with just two underclassmen on the roster. The Cards have 12 players designated as seniors this season, tied with Western Kentucky for the most on any team in men's DI college basketball. Louisville is one of four programs with seven or more fifth-year seniors or older.

UNDERCLASSMEN UNDERDOGS

Louisville has just two underclassmen in freshman Khani Rooths and sophomore James Scott. Louisville is one of just 11 schools in DI that has two or fewer underclassmen on their roster, and the only Power Four school in that list. Nicholls and Texas Southern have zero, Florida A&M has one and Texas State, Northern Arizona, Wagner, Howard, NC Central, Mississippi Valley State and FIU all have two like Louisville.

WINNERS WIN

Louisville has 11 players who were on teams that played in the 2024 NCAA Tournament. The roster in total has made 14 NCAA Division I Tournament appearances at their previous schools, playing in 20 NCAA Tournament games across their careers. Louisville has 12 players that were on teams that won 20 or more games in the 2023-24 season.

NEW NUMERALS

For the first time since 1955, there will be Louisville Cardinals wearing single-digits above the numeral of 5. Reyne Smith will don the number 6, **Kasean Pryor** 7 and **Khani Rooths** 9. For the first time ever, the number 93 will be worn by a Cardinal on the court as **Noah Waterman** dons that jersey.

THE TOP TRANSFER CLASS

According to On3, Louisville had the top transfer class in the country after overhauling its roster. Louisville was amongst the top transfer classes by other recruiting services, including 247Sports who placed the Cardinals at 27th in the country.

Uofl has 11 active scholarship players headed into the 2024-25 season as **Kobe Rodgers** and **Aly Khalifa** intend to rehab injuries and redshirt. The 11 players have logged 19,989 Division I minutes prior to the start of the 2024-25 season. Louisville adds four countries other than the United States as well as **Reyne Smith** hails from Australia, **Aly Khalifa** from Egypt, **Frank Anselem-Ibe** from Nigeria and **Aboubacar Traore** from Côte D'Ivoire. The Cardinals are one of just eight programs across the country that have 11 or more states represented on their roster: Army (16), Navy (14), Missouri (12), Vanderbilt (12), Kansas (11), Indiana (11) and Milwaukee (11). The service academies do not have a roster limit, therefore Army and Navy have 27 and 29 players on their rosters, respectively.

Pat Kelsey, a proven program builder who's won nearly 70% of his career games, was named the new men's basketball head coach at the University of Louisville on March 28, 2024.

Kelsey's contract with the Cardinals will be for five years, extending through the 2028-29 season.

Kelsey has been a dominant winner across his 12+ seasons as a head coach, including the last three at College of Charleston and the previous nine at Winthrop. He boasts an impressive 270-127 record (68.0%) across his head coaching career with 11 total conference championships and four NCAA Tournament bids.

The Cincinnati native Kelsey is the 24th head coach in Louisville's 110-year history, and the 10th in the past 79 years.

In 2023-24, College of Charleston finished 27-8, claimed the Coastal Athletic Conference regular season and tournament titles, and earned a No. 13 seed in the NCAA Tournament before falling to fourth-seeded Alabama.

The Cougars became the first team in seven years to win back-to-back CAA titles. Kelsey was named the league's Coach of the Year, in addition to three All-CAA player honors and a Sixth Man of the Year award for Bryce Butler.

College of Charleston ranked in the top 25 nationally last season in 3-point attempts per game (3rd, 30.6), made 3-pointers per game (8th, 10.5), bench points per game (11th, 30.1), winning percentage (18th, 77.1), rebounds per game (20th, 39.8), assist-to-turnover ratio (22nd, 1.5) and offensive rebounds per game (23rd, 13.1).

During his second season at the helm in Charleston, the Cougars set numerous records with a 31-4 mark and the program's first CAA title since 2008. They won 20 straight games, claimed the 2022 Charleston Classic and spent four weeks in the AP Top 25, peaking at No. 18. Kelsey was named the USBWA and NABC District Coach of the Year, and was on the Naismith Coach of the Year Watch List.

Kelsey arrived in Charleston from Winthrop, where he became the fifth all-time winningest coach in the history of the Big South Conference. He averaged 20.7 wins per game in nine seasons in Rock Hill, S.C., compiling more overall wins and conference wins than any other team in the league.

In his final season at Winthrop, Kelsey guided the Eagles to a 23-2 campaign, a school-record 21-game win streak, a Big South tournament title and a trip to the NCAA Tournament where they fell to Villanova. Kelsey was named 2021 Big South Coach of the Year.

Kelsey also led Winthrop to NCAA Tournament berths in 2020 (canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic) and 2017.

A two-time finalist for the Skip Prosser Man of the Year Award and finalist for the 2021 Jim Phelan Coach of the Year Award, Kelsey compiled a 186-95 (.662) overall record and an impressive 110-46 (.705) mark in conference play at Winthrop. The Eagles also won the Big South regular-season title four times in 2016, 2017, 2020 and 2021.

In all, 16 Winthrop players were selected all-conference, while three were tabbed Big South Player of the Year, one Big South Freshman of the Year and two Big South Tournament Most Valuable Player honors.
