GAME OVERVIEW

- Virginia (3-3) returns to Klöckner Stadium for the first time in nearly a month to face its second ranked opponent of the season Saturday (March 15), when the Cavaliers welcome No. 1 Maryland (6-0).
- Opening faceoff from Klöckner Stadium is set for 4 p.m. on ACC Network and WINA (1070-AM/98.9-FM).

A WIN FOR THE CAVALIERS WOULD...

- Give the Hoos their first win over the nation's top-ranked team since sweeping Notre Dame – which was ranked No. 1 both times – in the 2023 regular season.
- Be UVA's first over a ranked opponent this year.
- Give Virginia its first win over the Terrapins at Klöckner Stadium since the dramatic seven-overtime thriller in 2009, when it defeated the UMD 10-9 on Brian Carroll's game-winning goal.
- Give the Hoos their first win as the nation's No. 18 team or lower. UVA's lowest ranking when defeating a No. 1 team was when the then-No. 17 Cavaliers upended top-ranked Johns Hopkins on March 27, 2004, at Klöckner Stadium.

THE UNIVERSITY OF VIRGINIA

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAHOOWA

The origin of "Wahoowa" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wa."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

SERIES HISTORY

- Maryland leads the all-time series with Virginia, which began in 1926, 51-47, but the Hoos snapped the Terrapins' three-game win streak in the series with its 14-10 win at SECU Stadium in the regular season last year on March 16.
- On Saturday, Virginia will face Maryland for the 99th all-time meeting, which will tie with Johns Hopkins (99) for the most head-to-head matchups in UVA history.
- The last time the two teams met at Klöckner Stadium, in 2023, Maryland's Daniel Kelly scored the game-winning goal with 2:19 left in overtime to seal a 14-13 win over then-No. 1 Virginia.
- The 2023 matchup at Klöckner Stadium hosted 5,745 spectators, which at the time was the most for a UVA men's lacrosse home game since 2013.

VIRGINIA-MARYLAND: NO. 1 RANKING HISTORY

- Virginia is a combined 12-10, including 4-3 at Klöckner Stadium, when either team has been ranked No. 1 by the USILA coaches poll.
- The Cavaliers are 5-7 all-time when facing the top-ranked Terrapins, including 2-3 in Charlottesville.

VIRGINIA AND MARYLAND IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

- Virginia and the Terrapins have met 10 times in the NCAA Tournament, including in four of the last five NCAA Tournaments: 2019, 2021, 2022 and 2024.
- UVA is 5-5 all-time against Maryland in the NCAA Tournament.
- Among those 10 NCAA Tournament contests, two of them were title games, 2011 and 2021. The Cavaliers won both matchups 9-7 and 17-16, respectively.
- The most recent NCAA Tournament matchup was in the 2024 semifinals at Lincoln Financial Field, when the Terrapins won, 12-6. Maryland went on to fall in the finals to Notre Dame.
- The two teams also met in the 2022 quarterfinals at Ohio Stadium (Columbus, Ohio), when the Terrapins downed Virginia, 18-9, before capping an undefeated season and capturing the program's fourth NCAA title.

LARS TIFFANY VS. JOHN TILLMAN ALL-TIME

- Virginia's **Lars Tiffany** and Maryland's John Tillman are two of the most accomplished head coaches in Division I history and have gone head-to-head 11 times as head coaches.
- Tiffany is 6-5 all-time against Tillman in matchups when the two are head coaches. While Tiffany leads the series in head-to-head, Tillman-coached teams have combined to outscore Tiffany-coached teams by an average of only 0.64 goals.
- Six of the last eight meetings between the two head coaches have been at neutral sites, including five NCAA Tournament games.
- Tiffany and Tillman are two of just four active Division-I head coaches with at least two NCAA Tournament titles. The other two are Duke's John Danowski and Notre Dame's Kevin Corrigan.

LAST TIME THEY MET

- In the 2024 NCAA Tournament semifinals, No. 6 seed Virginia's season came to a close after the Cavaliers fell 12-6 to seventh-seeded Maryland at Lincoln Financial Field (Philadelphia) on May 25.
- The Terrapins won 10 of the first half's 12 total faceoffs to help them leap out to a 7-3 lead by the break. The Cavaliers led for nearly four minutes of game time, but Maryland quickly flipped the score late in the first and did not look back.
- Virginia's starting attack of then-freshman **McCabe Millon** (2g), Connor Shellenberger (1g, 1a) and Payton Cormier (1g, 1a) recorded two points each.
- Goaltender **Kyle Morris** made his first career start and tallied five saves in over 42 minutes of action. **Matthew Nunes** entered the game late in the third quarter and surrendered only one goal the rest of the way.
- UVA's six goals marked a season low.

MORE ON VIRGINIA AGAINST THE NATION'S NO. 1 TEAM

- Virginia is 18-31 all-time against the No. 1 team in the USILA poll, including 3-5 under head coach **Lars Tiffany** (since 2017).
- UVA's three wins over top-ranked teams under Tiffany include two regular-season victories over Notre Dame in 2023, which went on to win the national championship that year, and a 17-16 thriller over Maryland in 2021 NCAA championship game.

SCOUTING THE TERRAPINS

- Maryland (6-0) is one of only three undefeated teams nationwide and the only unbeaten team among the ACC, Big Ten, and Ivy League.
- The Terrapins are led by head coach John Tillman, who led UMD to national championships in 2017 and 2022.
- In addition to win percentage, the Terps lead the nation in clearing percentage (.935) and turnovers per game (12.67). Maryland is also second nationally in scoring defense (7.17), and third saves (14.50) and man-down defense (.900).
- Maryland has not surrendered more than 10 goals in any of its first six games this season.
- Goalie Logan McNaney, the 2022 NCAA Tournament Most Outstanding Player, is third among all Division-I players in save percentage (.656) and fourth in saves per game (7.17).

LAST TIME OUT

- Texas natives **Matthew Nunes** (The Woodlands) and **Thomas Mencke** (Dallas) played pivotal roles in Virginia's 11-6 victory over Towson last Saturday (March 8) to snap a two-game losing skid.
- In his first start of the season, Nunes (1-0) tallied 15 saves, including 11 in the second half. Nunes' 15 saves are his most in a single game since last year's regular-season contest at Syracuse, when he also tallied 15 saves after facing a whopping 57 Orange shots.
- Nunes and the UVA defense held Towson scoreless for 30:43, the longest scoring drought by a Virginia opponent this season.
- Mencke recorded career highs in both goals (three) and points (four). His third and final goal came with five seconds left in the third quarter and proved to be the game-winner.
- After Virginia was 2 of 8 at the faceoff X in the first half, **Henry Metz** (4-7 FO) gave the Cavaliers a nice lift in second half.
- The Cavaliers were flagged for seven penalties in contrast to Towson's single personal foul. UVA's man-down successfully killed five of the Tigers' seven EMO chances.
- The neutral-site meeting contested at The Kinkaid School (Houston) marked UVA's first-ever game held in the state of Texas.

THE EMERGENCE OF RYAN COLSEY

- Through Virginia's first six games, attackman **Ryan Colsey** (17-6-23) is leading the Cavaliers in goals and is second in points.
- Colsey's 2.83 goals-per-game average is tied for 25th among all Division-I players nationally, also good for third among all ACC players.
- He had a breakout game against High Point (Feb. 18), when he recorded career highs in goals (6) and assists (3).
- Colsey started in 16 of UVA's games at midfield in 2024 and finished with 19 goals, including five on man-up, and four assists.
- Colsey's younger brother, Kyle, is redshirting this season due to injury. Their father, Roy, is a Professional Lacrosse Hall of Fame class of 2023 inductee. Roy Colsey was an All-American midfielder at Syracuse, where he helped the Orange to two national titles (1993 & 1995) and was a three-time first-team All-American from 1993-95.

VIRGINIA'S STINGY MAN-DOWN UNIT

- Virginia's man-down defense is much improved from last year to this.
- Through their first six games this season, the Cavaliers have only surrendered two goals on 26 opponent extra-man opportunities, a clip of 88.5 percent, which leads the ACC and is fifth nationally as of March 11.
- Last year, UVA opponents scored on 50.9 percent (28-55) of their EMO chances.
- UVA's man-down unit is coached by assistant coach and former UVA close defenseman **Logan Greco** '19.

MAKE IT, TAKE IT

- The combination of **Anthony Ghobriel** (52-93) and **Andrew Greenspan** (26-45) helped Virginia achieve a 53.9 faceoff win percentage this year.
- Virginia finished above 50 percent at the faceoff X in its first four games of the season.
- Ghobriel transferred to UVA in 2024 after playing his first two seasons of college lacrosse at Navy. Last season, he was the Cavaliers' top-performing FOGO with a 55.5 faceoff win percentage.
- Greenspan transferred to UVA last summer after competing as a member of Notre Dame's 2024 national championship team. Greenspan's most productive game at Notre Dame came against UVA in the ACC Tournament semifinals, when he finished 6 for 8 at the faceoff X and collected five ground balls.

VIRGINIA IN THE POLLS

- Following its 11-6 win over Towson (March 8), Virginia returned to the top-20 of the USILA coaches poll.
- After starting the season 2-3, the Cavaliers fell out of the top-20 in the March 3 edition of the coaches poll for the first time since the 2018 preseason poll.
- UVA has been in ranked in 96 percent of USILA coaches polls all-time, which began in 1973.
- This week, the Cavaliers are ranked No. 15 in the USA Lacrosse and No. 18 in the Inside Lacrosse weekly media polls.

HOOS IN THE NATIONAL STATISTICAL RANKINGS

- Virginia is currently third in the nation in ground balls (37.50/gm), fifth in man-down defense (.885), 13th in assists (8.33/gm) and 15th in caused turnovers (10.00/gm).
- Among all individual Division-I players, **Truitt Sunderland** is 10th in points (5.00/gm) and 13th in assists (2.33/gm). Sunderland and **Ryan Colsey** are tied for 18th in man-up goals (3). **Ben Wayer** is 19th in ground balls (6.17/gm) and Colsey is tied for 25th in goals (2.83/gm).

THE CAVALIERS AT KLÖCKNER STADIUM

- Virginia owns a 182-48 (.791) all-time record at Klöckner Stadium, including a 2-1 mark in 2025, and has won 20 of its last 25 games played at the historic edifice.
- The Cavaliers' average margin of victory in their last 25 games at Klöckner Stadium is 5.9 goals.
- Virginia is 56-16 (.778) all-time at Klöckner Stadium under head coach **Lars Tiffany**.
- UVA is also 15-3 all-time at Klöckner Stadium in NCAA Tournament contests.
- Lacrosse debuted in Klöckner Stadium in 1993.

ON THE HORIZON

- The Cavaliers continue their four-game homestand on Tuesday (March 18), when they host UAlbany (2-4).
- Opening faceoff from Klöckner Stadium is set for 4 p.m. on ACC Network Extra and WINA (1070-AM/98.9-FM).
- The Great Danes play at Bryant Saturday night at 7 p.m.

LARS TIFFANY AMONG THE VIRGINIA'S ELITE COACHES

- Lars Tiffany** is in his ninth season as UVA head coach and 21st of his head coaching career with stops at Stony Brook (2005-06) and Brown (2007-16).
- Tiffany guided the Cavaliers to the program's eighth and ninth national championships overall in 2019 and 2021, marking the only pair of back-to-back titles in program history (note: COVID-19 forced the cancellation of the 2020 NCAA Tournament).
- He has also steered the Hoos to four of the last five Championship Weekends (2019, 2021, 2023, 2024), and is the nation's only head coach accomplish that feat.
- A native of LaFayette, New York, Tiffany entered the 2024 season eight wins away from the 100th of his UVA career.
- Tiffany-coached teams, including his 2016 Brown squad which also reached Championship Weekend, have finished top-2 in the nation in ground balls per game in the last nine consecutive seasons.
- Tiffany graduated from Brown University in 1990, where he played defense and was a two-time captain under Dom Starsia, who would later become UVA's head coach following the 1992 season.

VIRGINIA IS A GROUND BALL MACHINE

- Virginia has led the nation in ground balls in seven of the last nine years
- UVA has also finished in the top-2 nationally in ground balls the last nine consecutive seasons.
- UVA is the only program in the nation to finish in the top-3 nationally in ground balls per game 15 times over the last 16 seasons.
- The only program in 2016 to finish with more ground balls per game was UVA head coach **Lars Tiffany**'s 2016 Brown team.

MATTHEW NUNES: ONE OF UVA'S MOST ACCOMPLISHED GOALIES

- Senior goalie **Matthew Nunes** set the Virginia single-season program record with 213 saves in 17 games in 2023.
- His 313 saves shattered Alex Rode's previous program record of 212 saves, which Rode achieved in 16 games during UVA's 2021 national championship run.
- Also in 2023, Nunes led all ACC goalies in save percentage (.551) among conference games only, and finished second overall in the ACC in both goals-against average (11.95) and saves per game (14.33).
- In 2022, Nunes set the program's freshman saves record (159).
- At then-No. 16 Harvard in 2024, Nunes scored the game-winning goal and made 17 saves to help UVA mount a successful comeback. Virginia trailed by as many as five goals in the third quarter. Nunes' goal was the first by a UVA goalie since Adam Ghitelman did so against Duke in the 2010 ACC Tournament.
- Nunes has been at his best in the biggest of games (see chart below).

ACC CHAMPIONSHIP PEDIGREE

- Virginia has claimed at least a share of 19 ACC championships, including two (2019 & 2022) under head coach **Lars Tiffatny**.
- The Cavaliers won 11 titles (1962, 1964, 1969, 1970, 1971, 1975, 1980, 1983, 1984, 1985 and 1986) prior the ACC establishing a tournament from 1989-2019 to determine the champion.
- Virginia has won seven ACC Tournaments: 1997, 1999, 2000, 2003, 2006, 2010 and 2019.
- In the 2019 ACC Tournament, which was held at Klöckner Stadium, UVA defeated Notre Dame 10-4 in the championship game.
- From 1989-2019, Virginia won 14 regular-season titles (1990, 1993, 1994, 1995, 1997, 1999, 2000, 2002, 2003, 2006, 2009, 2010, 2012 and 2019), more than any other ACC school.
- The ACC Tournament returns this season and will once again be contested at American Legion Stadium in Charlotte, N.C., on May 3 and 5.

McCABE MILLON'S RECORD-SETTING FRESHMAN SEASON

- The Cavaliers have turned to sophomore **McCabe Millon** to quarterback the offense this season, following the departure of attackmen Connor Shellenberger and Payton Cormier.
- Millon is UVA's top returning producer in goals, assists and points.
- As a true freshman, he started on attack in 17 of UVA's 18 total games in 2024. The only game he did not start in was on the Cavaliers' Senior Day against Notre Dame.
- Millon scored 41 goals and logged 25 assists to lead all Division-I freshmen in both goals and points (66).
- His 41 goals are a UVA freshman record, while his 66 points stand at No. 2.
- A native of Reisterstown, Maryland, Millon burst on to the scene in his career debut against Michigan, when he scored five goals. In the Cavaliers' 11-10 double overtime thriller over Johns Hopkins in the NCAA quarterfinals, Millon scored three goals and dished out two assists to help UVA advance to Championship Weekend for the fourth time in the previous five opportunities.
- Millon was named a second-team preseason All-American by both Inside Lacrosse and USA Lacrosse, and was also ranked No. 16 on IL's preseason top-50 watch list.

BEN WAYER EYEING ALL-AMERICAN SENIOR YEAR

- Virginia senior LSM **Ben Wayer** was ranked No. 20 on Inside Lacrosse's preseason top-50 watch list.
- Wayer was also dubbed a second-team preseason All-American by both Inside Lacrosse and USA Lacrosse.
- In 2024, Wayer led all Division-I non-faceoff specialists in ground balls (98), the most by a UVA non-FOGO in program single-season history, and ground balls per game (5.44).
- Wayer also proved to be a dual-threat in transition after finishing the 2024 season with seven goals and six assists. Wayer registered at least one point in 11 of UVA's 18 total games.
- In 2024, he was voted an All-American honorable mention by both the USILA and USA Lacrosse.

VIRGINIA'S SEVEN PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

- Seven Cavaliers in **McCabe Millon** (second team), **Griffin Schutz** (second team), **Ben Wayer** (second team), **Noah Chizmar** (honorable mention), **Johnny Hackett** (honorable mention), **John Schroter** (honorable mention) and **Joey Terenzi** (honorable mention) were named Preseason All-Americans by Inside Lacrosse.
- Virginia was the only program nationally with three selections on the second team and one of three teams with at least seven honorees.

SEASON OVERVIEW

- The Cavaliers host nine regular-season games at Klöckner Stadium this year, including ACC contests against Syracuse (March 29) and Duke (April 26).
- Virginia returns six starters from its 2024 roster, including preseason All-Americans **McCabe Millon** (attack), **Griffin Schutz** (midfield) and **John Schrater** (defense), and veteran netminder **Matthew Nunes**.
- UVA also returns Second Team Preseason All-American LSM **Ben Wayer**, who led the team in ground balls (98) last season, its primary faceoff specialist **Anthony Ghobriel** and goalie **Kyle Morris**, who saw action in all three NCAA Tournament games last season.
- The Hoos look to fill the void left by All-Americans Connor Shellenberger, the program's only three-time Tewaaraton Award finalist and four-time First Team All-American, Payton Cormier, the NCAA Division-I all-time leading goal scorer, and four-year starting defenseman Cole Kastner.

TRANSFERS ADD DEPTH ON OFFENSE AND AT FACEOFF X

- This offseason, Lars Tiffany added five transfers to his squad: **Charles Balsamo** (Duke), **Andrew Greenspan** (Notre Dame), **Johnny Hackett** (Bryant), **Chase MacCartee** (Kenyon College) and **John Totaro** (Denver).
- The group makes up the nation's No. 3 transfer class – best among all ACC teams – according to Inside Lacrosse.
- Balsamo spent the past two seasons at Duke, where he competed as a midfielder in 38 games, including 21 starts. Over his two-year career with the Blue Devils, Balsamo recorded 27 goals, 20 assists and 16 multi-point efforts. In 2023, Balsamo finished the season with 31 points, which is good for second all-time in Duke freshman history.
- Greenspan, a faceoff specialist, was a member of Notre Dame's national championship team as a true freshman in 2024. Greenspan graduated high school from the Brunswick School, where he was the nation's No. 35 overall prospect (according to Inside Lacrosse), a High School All-American and a member of the U.S. National Team's U18 roster.
- Hackett played the previous two years at Bryant as a midfielder, where he was a two-time First Team All-America East selection, and the 2023 America East Rookie of the Year. In 31 appearances, including 29 starts, Hackett combined for more than 100 points on 64 goals and 37 assists.

VIRGINIA'S FIRST-YEAR (FRESHMAN) CLASS

- The Cavaliers' freshman class was ranked No. 1 in the nation by Inside Lacrosse.
- The class consists of five-star signees: **Hudson Hausmann** (Brunswick), **Luke Hublitz** (Brunswick), **Sean Browne** (Episcopal School of Dallas), **Kyle Colsey** (Ridgefield) and **Ryan Duenkel** (St. Johns College HS).
- UVA's list of four-star prospects consists of **JP Lagunowich** (Chatham), **Tommy Snyder** (St. Anthony's) and **Luke Jamin** (Taft).
- Goalie **Troy Capstraw** (Daphne, Ala.) and faceoff specialist **Christian Gross** (Wellesley, Mass.) round out the Cavaliers' freshman.
- Additionally, the Cavaliers added first-year **Reese Stepanian** (Houston, Texas) to the squad this past fall.
- Earlier this year, it was announced that Browne, Colsey and Duenkel will miss the 2025 season due to injuries.

ORANGE & BLUE: IT RUNS IN THE FAMILY

- The Cavalier lacrosse program has a long history of sibling connections and this year is no different.
- Brothers **Ryan** ('26) and **Kyle** ('28) **Colsey** are both attackmen on this year's team. Ryan redshirted as a true freshman in 2023 – as will be the case for Kyle this year after suffering an injury in the fall. Their father, Roy Colsey, played midfield at Syracuse, is a Lacrosse Hall of Fame inductee, and was recently named head coach of the PLL's Carolina Chaos.
- Brendan Millon ('29), the younger brother of **McCabe Millon** ('27), signed with UVA this past fall and will join the Hoos as a true freshman in the fall of 2025.
- Defenseman **Griffin Kology** ('25) has a younger sister, Lara ('26) on the UVA women's lacrosse team. Griffin and Lara's older brother, Kyle ('21) was a member of both the 2019 and 2021 national championship teams and a USILA Third Team All-American.
- The sister of attackman **Tucker Mullen** ('25), Taylor, played for the UVA women's lacrosse team as a graduate transfer in 2023.
- Other notable UVA lacrosse sibling connections include: Chris and Casey (sister) Bocklet, Shamel and Rhamel Bratton, Brian and Kevin Carroll, Matt and Mark Cockerton, Rob and Matt Emery, Adam and Jake Ghitelman, Brendan, Connor and Gavin Gill, Billy, Danny and Pat Glading, and Griffin and Miles Thompson.

MCNEAL RESIDES IN COVETED, SACRED SPACE ON GROUNDS

- This year, senior LSM **Tommy McNeal** joins an exclusive list of high-achieving students to live in residence buildings – designed by Thomas Jefferson – on the University's iconic Lawn.
- Living on the Lawn is one of the University's greatest honors and most enriching experiences for undergraduates.
- Students who are accepted to live on The Lawn must demonstrate, "commitment to academic exploration and growth," "meaningful and engaged participation" in extracurricular activities and a "willingness to embrace the ideals of The Lawn community."
- Former UVA midfielder John Fox, who captained the 2021 national championship team, also lived on The Lawn.
- Other notable UVA alumni to live on the lawn include: broadcast journalist Katie Couric and basketball legend Ralph Sampson.

VIRGINIA & THE TEWAARATON AWARD TROPHY

- Since its inception in 2001, three Virginia Cavaliers have laid claim to the Tewaaraton Trophy, college lacrosse's most prestigious award.
- Virginia, Duke, Maryland and Syracuse are the only four schools nationwide to have had three recipients each.
- Duke (15) and UVA (13) are the only two schools to have had at least 13 finalists.
- Last year, former UVA attackman Connor Shellenberger – along with former Notre Dame attackman Pat Kavanagh, the winner of the 2024 Tewaaraton Trophy – became two of only eight three-time finalists in the history of the award.
