#7 Virginia vs. Penn State

Series History: Virginia leads 10-8-1

Last Meeting: A 1-0 UVA win at home on Sept. 4

Of Note: Fifth-ever meeting in NCAA Tournament play

QUICK KICKS

- Virginia is a one seed in the NCAA Tournament for the fifth time in program history (2013, 2015, 2019, 2021 and 2025) and is one of three one seeds this season from the ACC
- The Hoos advanced to the second round with a 5-0 win over High Point last weekend in which five Cavaliers scored - including a goal and a two-assist game from **Maggie Cagle**
- Virginia has advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament 34 times in its 37 appearances
- The Hoos are looking to advance to the third round of the NCAA Tournament for the 26th time
- **Maggie Cagle** continues to be efficient in her chances this season, rankings second in the ACC in shot accuracy (.651) and sixth nationally with 28-of-43 shots on frame and nine goals
- With her two assists against High Point, **Cagle** is now fifth all-time at Virginia in game-winning assists (13), while **Lia Godfrey** is tied for sixth (12) in a career
- **Cagle** and **Godfrey** have been a potent duo for UVA with a combined 56 goals and 63 assists between the two for their careers - both rank in the top five for all active D1 players in career assists
- **Godfrey** is second among active D1 players in career assists, while **Cagle** ranks fifth
- **Cagle** and **Godfrey** are one of two active duos in the country to have tallied at least 50 goals and 50 assists in a career along with Stanford's Jasmine Aikey and Andrea Kitahata
- The Hoos played the nation's toughest schedule heading into NCAA Tournament
- Virginia played 14-of-19 games against teams in the RPI top 50 and eight against the RPI Top 15
- **Pearl Cecil** and **Kira Waller** each notched their first career assists in the last outing vs. HPU
- The shutout of High Point was the 12th of the season for the Cavaliers

THE SERIES WITH PENN STATE

- Virginia and Penn State have met 19 times with the Hoos leading the series 10-8-1 over the Nittany Lions
- The Hoos are 3-4-0 against Penn State in games played at Klöckner Stadium, but lead in games played on the road
- Virginia and Penn State met earlier this season with the Hoos taking the 1-0 victory at Klöckner Stadium on a Maggie Cagle goal
- This is the fifth meeting between the teams in the NCAA Tournament and first post-season meeting at Klöckner Stadium
- Virginia leads 3-1-0 in games played in the NCAA Tournament against the Nittany Lions and have won three straight

CAVALIER TRIO NAMED TO PRESEASON WATCH LISTS BY UNITED SOCCER COACHES

- Senior Maggie Cagle, junior Ella Carter and junior Viki Safradin were all named to preseason watch lists by the coaches association
- Cagle was named to the Forwards to Watch list, while Carter was named to the Midfielders to Watch list
- Safradin was one of 13 keepers named to the organization's Goalkeepers to Watch list heading into the season

CAGLE NAMED PRESEASON ALL-ACC HONOREE

- Senior Maggie Cagle, a three-time All-ACC selection and two-time All-Region selection was named to the preseason All-ACC team
- Cagle tallied the most assists by a freshman in her debut campaign with 12 in the 2022 season
- She followed it up by leading the team in goals in both her sophomore and junior seasons

HOOS BACK FOR THE CAVALIERS

- UVA returns 20 players from last year's squad that posted an 13-5-6 record and advanced to the NCAA second round
- Among those returning are All-ACC forward Maggie Cagle and two-time All-American Lia Godfrey in the midfield
- The Hoos return a stout defensive group with three of four starters from last season along the back line in Laney Rouse, Tatum Galvin and Kiki Maki in front of returning keeper Victoria Safradin
- Also returning to the lineup is dynamic midfielder Jill Flammia who missed the 2024 season with injury

VIRGINIA WELCOMES ANOTHER HIGHLY-RANKED RECRUITING CLASS TO GROUNDS

- UVA welcomed the fourth-ranked recruiting class to Grounds for this season with a group of 10 signees in the freshman class
- Two players - Jordyn Hardeman (4) and Addison Halpern (5) - were ranked among the top five recruits nationally
- Halpern was also the United Soccer Coaches National Player of the Year and Gatorade National Player of the Year
- Three players - Pearl Cecil (39), Carrie Helfrich (43) and Wicki Dunlap (49) - ranked in the top 50
- Cecil reclassified for the 2025 class and played with the U.S. U17 Team in Concacaf qualifying in the spring and captained the team for the match against Honduras in which she scored
- Rounding out the eight players ranked in the top 200 are Loretta Talbott (70), Marin McCormack (127) and Helen Olszewski (190)
- Also signed is two-time All-State selection Molly Carlson and international player Liv Rademaker
- Rademaker played for two-time Dutch U19 National Champion AFC Ajax and was a member of AFC Ajax roster for UEFA Champions League season (2024, 2025) as well as member of three Dutch National Team squads (U16, U17, U19)

CECIL TABBED FOR SERVICE WITH US U17 WOMEN'S NATIONAL TEAM

- Virginia freshman Pearl Cecil played with the U.S. U17 team in Concacaf qualifying and is currently at the FIFA U17 WWC
- Cecil, who represented the US in Concacaf qualifying tournament, suited up for two friendlies in Spain earlier this season
- The games were played August 28 and August 31 against Spain at Stadi Olimpic Cailo Cano in Alicante
- Cecil captained the team and the US won the first game 2-0 before playing to a 0-0 draw in game two

THREE HOOS NAMED TO MAC HERMANN TROPHY MIDSEASON WATCH LIST

- A trio of UVA players were recognized at the halfway point with selection to the midseason MAC Hermann Trophy Watch List
- Lia Godfrey, Laney Rouse and Victoria Safradin were on the MAC Hermann Trophy Midseason Watch List as the trio are part of the 35 player list from the United Soccer Coaches

FIVE UVA PLAYERS NAMED TO TOP DRAWER SOCCER MIDSEASON PLAYER RANKINGS

- Virginia had four players named to the Top Drawer Soccer Midseason Top 100 Players - defender Laney Rouse (7), midfielder Lia Godfrey (16), defender Tatum Galvin (24) and forward Maggie Cagle (82)
- Two Hoos made the Midseason Top 100 Freshmen - defender Liv Rademaker (16) and forward/midfielder Addison Halpern (22)

SAFRADIN COMES UP BIG WITH PK SAVE AGAINST PITT

- Victoria Safradin came up big against Pitt with the save of a penalty chance from Katie Ellermeyer to post her eighth shutout
- A penalty chance in the 89th minute gave Pitt it's best chance to score, but Safradin made the diving save to her left
- It was the first PK save not in a shootout by a UVA keeper since Chantel Jones at Penn State in the 2010 season

SAFRADIN POSTS FIFTH LONGEST SHUTOUT STREAK BY A KEEPER IN PROGRAM HISTORY

- Victoria Safradin posted the program's fifth longest shutout streak by a keeper with 623:54 of shutout soccer
- The streak dated back to the first round of NCAA Tournament play against Princeton in the 2024 season
- Safradin's streak ended with a goal surrendered against No. 16 Georgetown (8/31) and included five clean sheets

MCDERMOTT DELIVERS QUICK DAGGER AT CLEMSON

- Forward Meredith McDermott has had a penchant for quick strikes with the Hoos and the Clemson contest was no different
- McDermott hit a goal 45 seconds into the second half to put the Cavaliers up 2-0 on the homestanding Tigers
- McDermott scored a first-minute goal in both 2023 and 2024 on top of this goal in the opening minute of the CU second half
- The 46th minute goal was the first by a Cavalier since Alexa Spaanstra vs. NC State (10/23/22) at the same 45:45 mark

CAGLE DELIVERS SIXTH MULTIPLE-ASSIST GAME WITH PAIR AGAINST CLEMSON

- Forward Maggie Cagle delivered a pair of second half assists at Clemson to mark her sixth multiple-assist game in her career
- Cagle connected with Meredith McDermott in the 46th minute for her first assist of the contest
- She connected with Allie Ross in the 52nd minute for the second assist of the contest as UVA took the 3-0 lead on the Tigers

CARTER NAMED ACC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Midfielder Ella Carter earned her first ACC Offensive Player of the Week honor after wins over No. 2 Duke and VCU
- Carter hit the game-winning goal against Duke and added an assist on the third goal in a 3-1 win over the Blue Devils
- It was the second game-winning goal of the season for Carter who has two goals this season

ROUSE SHOWS OUT FOR HOOS IN WEEK FIVE ACTION

- Defender Laney Rouse delivered for the Hoos in week five of action against No. 2 Duke and VCU
- Rouse assisted on the game-winning goal vs. Duke and added her own goal to cap the 3-1 victory
- The defender then assisted on a goal against VCU and helped the Hoos hold the Rams to one shot in the shutout victory
- The goal for Rouse against Duke was her second career goal and first since the 2022 season

CAGLE STRIKES QUICKLY AGAINST NO. 9 PENN STATE

- Forward Maggie Cagle delivered a quick strike in the Hoos' win over No. 9 Penn State with a score 1:22 seconds into the game
- Cagle's goal was the 13th fastest goal scored in the regular season by a Cavalier in program history
- The goal held up as Virginia went on to post the 1-0 victory over the Nittany Lions in that matchup

SAFRADIN NAMED ACC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Goalkeeper Victoria Safradin was named ACC Defensive Player of the Week following wins over Xavier and Liberty
- Safradin tied a career high with six saves against the Musketeers and then posted her third straight shutout at Liberty
- It was her second ACC Defensive Player of the Week honor of her career

GODFREY OPENS SEASON WITH THREE STRAIGHT GOALS FROM FREE KICKS AND FACTORS IN EARLY UVA SUCCESS

- Lia Godfrey started the season with a bang, scoring her first three goals of the year from direct free kicks
- The first strike came against Xavier with the third goal of the contest to cap the Virginia scoring
- Her second came with the opening, and game-winning goal, on the road at Liberty in the next outing
- Godfrey's third came against No. 16 Georgetown to start the scoring in what would be a 1-1 draw with the Hoyas
- Godfrey also assisted on two game-winning goals in that opening five-game stretch (at West Virginia, vs. Xavier)

CARTER HITS FIRST GAME WINNER IN SEASON-OPENING VICTORY AT WEST VIRGINIA

- Midfielder Ella Carter scored the first game-winning goal of her career with her header at West Virginia
- The strike in the 64th minute was the third goal of Carter's career
- With the win, Virginia improved to 24-2 in season-opening games under Steve Swanson and 4-1 in road openers under Swanson

HOOS SEE UNBEATEN STREAK SNAPPED AT NO. 3 STANFORD

- Virginia had a streak of 16 straight games unbeaten snapped with the 2-1 loss at No. 3 Stanford on October 12
- The streak dated back to the 2024 season with the last loss coming at the hands of Florida State on October 17 that year
- The Hoos went 13-0-3 in that unbeaten streak with draws against Wisconsin in the 2024 NCAA second round, at home against No. 16 Georgetown and at Cal this season it also included wins over No. 9 Penn State and No. 2 Duke

CAVALIERS RESPOND WELL AFTER A LOSS UNDER SWANSON

- Responding after a loss has been a trend for the Cavaliers throughout Steve Swanson's tenure at UVA
- Throughout the 26 seasons under Swanson, Virginia holds a 67-12-16 record in matches following a loss
- The number does not include season-ending losses where the next match would be part of a new season

THE HOOS IN OVERTIME IN THE SWANSON ERA

- The Hoos won't be going to overtime until postseason play due to changes in rules, but UVA is no stranger to OT
- Virginia has gone to extra time in 90 matches during the Steve Swanson era with a 24-13-54 record in those matches
- In those 54 draws, 16 have come in the postseason with the Cavaliers surviving shootouts in six of those 16 matches
- The Cavaliers played the first OT of the season at No. 6 FSU in the ACC quarterfinal and claimed the shoot 6-5

SWANSON GRABS 500 CAREER WINS AS D1 HEAD COACH

- UVA head coach Steve Swanson hit a rare milestone vs. Boston College (10/30/25), hitting the 500 career win mark
- As a head coach, Swanson holds a 500-179-78 record through stops at Dartmouth, Stanford and Virginia
- Currently only a handful of D1 coaches have hit the 500-win milestone with three of them currently active
- Swanson is one of only four coaches who has recorded 500 wins all at a D1 institution
- In his coaching career, he has taken all three teams to league titles and the NCAA Tournament

SWANSON APPROACHING HIS 400TH WIN AS UVA HEAD COACH

- Head Coach Steve Swanson picked up his 300th wins as the head coach of the Cavaliers vs. Liberty (8/25/19)
- Currently, Swanson holds a 397-116-67 record as UVA head coach and is 158-58-27 in ACC matches
- He has 26 consecutive winning seasons at Virginia and 34 overall as a head coach

HOOS CONTINUE STRONG PRESENCE IN PROFESSIONAL RANKS ON NWSL ROSTERS

- UVA has a strong presence in professional soccer in the U.S. with 17 players on NWSL roster to open the season.
- 2023 first-round pick Alexa Spaanstra plays for the Portland Thorns where longtime stalwart Becky Sauerbrunn retired this season and defender Moira Kelley started the season
- Houston picked up 2015 first-round pick Danielle Colaprico in a trade with San Diego in the offseason
- 2020 first-round pick Courtney Petersen plays for Racing Louisville
- Orlando has Morgan Gautrat who was the first overall pick of the 2015 Draft and two-time MAC Hermann Trophy winner
- Makenzy Robbe (Doniak) and Kristen McNabb play for San Diego, while Veronica Latsko and Phoebe McClermon are with Seattle Reign.
- Megan Reid was continues her stay in Los Angeles as she is in her fourth straight season with Angel City FC.
- 2023 first-round pick Haley Hopkins plays for Kansas City Courage along with goalkeeper Laurel Ivory
- 2024 first-round pick Talia Staude is a defender for the North Carolina Courage
- Taryn Torres continues her career with the NY/NJ Club as does Emily Sonnett who joined the club prior to the 2024 season
- Brittany Ratcliffe is in her second season with the Washington Spirit after stints at Boston, Utah and North Carolina
- Diana Ordoñez started the year in Houston before leaving the NWSL to join Liga MX Femenil club Tigres UANLin Mexico.
- Virginia is one of only two schools to have a player taken in every NWSL Draft prior to it ending after the 2024 draft

HOOS FINDING HOMES IN USL SUPER LEAGUE AS PROFESSIONAL RANKS GROW

- UVA has a presence in the USL Super League that launched its second season on August 23
- The Hoos currently have five program alums in the league across three rosters
- Defender Sarah Clark competes for the Spokane Zephyr FC
- The duo of Claire Constant, a 2022 graduate, and Alexis Theoret (2025) currently play for DC Power FC
- Samantha Rosette, a 2019 graduate, holds down a spot with Brooklyn FC for the second year in a row
- Samar Guidry, a 2025 graduate, is currently on the roster for Dallas Trinity FC

HOOS EARN UNITED SOCCER COACHES TEAM ACADEMIC AWARD FOR 16th CONSECUTIVE YEAR

- The Cavaliers were named a recipient of the Team Academic Award by the United Soccer Coaches for the 2024-25 year
- It marks the 16th consecutive season for the Hoos to receive the award from the coaches organization
- Teams must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 to be named as a recipient of the award each season

HEAD COACH STEVE SWANSON

Entering his 36th seasons as a head coach, and his 26th year at the helm of Virginia's program, Swanson has established himself as one of the elite coaches in collegiate soccer, and certainly one of the most respected. Swanson has led his teams to six conference championships, 29 NCAA Tournament appearances and 34 consecutive winning seasons during his career. He also has accumulated 501 career wins as a head coach making him one of a small group of NCAA Division I women's soccer coaches to hit the 500-win milestone.

In his time as Virginia's head coach, he has compiled a 397-116-67 record and coached 12 ACC Player of the Year selections, four ACC Freshman of the Year selections and been named the ACC Coach of the Year three times. He also coached back-to-back MAC Hermann Trophy winner, Morgan Brian. In all, he has coached 22 Virginia players to All-America honors in his time at the helm of the program.

His accomplishments over the last 13 years are staggering with successes experienced on the pitch as both a collegiate coach and with the US Women's National Team - including winning a pair of World Cup Championships and taking the Cavaliers to the College Cup three times.

The 2024 season saw Swanson coach his team to the program's 38th consecutive winning season and 25th under his leadership. The program made its 36th appearance in the NCAA Tournament, the second most of any program, and advanced to the second round of competition. It came on the heels of the 2023 season in which defender Talia Staude became the 22nd Virginia player drafted by the NWSL when she was selected by the North Carolina Courage with the 24th overall pick.

In 2022, Virginia advanced to the Elite Eight for an overtime showdown with eventual NCAA Champion and top-seeded UCLA. It was the 17th time in the last 18 seasons the Hoos advanced to at least the Round of 16 in the NCAA Tournament. The Cavaliers posted a pair of road wins over top-five programs - including a second-half rally for a 3-2 win at No. 2 North Carolina. Lia Godfrey earned All-America honors for the third straight season and was a semifinalist for the MAC Hermann Trophy. Haley Hopkins and Alexa Spaanstra were both first-round picks in the NWSL Draft.

In the fall of 2021, the Cavaliers claimed the ACC regular-season for the third time and advanced to the Round of 16 in the NCAA Tournament. He coached Diana Ordoñez to ACC Offensive Player of the Year honors and she was a semifinalist for the MAC Hermann Trophy in addition to earning All-America honors along with Lia Godfrey.

In the 2020-21 season, Swanson led the Cavaliers to the semifinals at the College Cup with Virginia storming through the NCAA Tournament and posting four consecutive shutouts before falling in a penalty kick shootout in the semifinals. Godfrey was named an All-America selection and the ACC Freshman of the Year.

He appeared on the international stage as an assistant coach with the US Women's National Team, helping the United States claim back-to-back World Cup Championships in the summers of 2015 and 2019 and an Olympic appearance in the Games in Brazil in the summer of 2016.

In the summer of 2015, Swanson served as an assistant coach for the United States as the Americans triumphed over Japan to win its third World Cup while he was watching two of his former UVA standout players, Morgan Brian (Class of 2015) and Becky Sauerbrunn (Class of 2007), play the entire 90 minutes of the final.

That fall, he led Virginia to the ACC regular-season title and coached both the ACC Offensive Player of the Year in Makenzy Doniak and the ACC Defensive Player of the Year in Emily Sonnett. Sonnett was also named the ESPNW National Player of the Year. She, Doniak and Brittany Ratcliffe all were drafted in the NWSL with Sonnett taken first overall, marking the second consecutive season for a Cavalier player to be the top pick in the draft. Swanson was also named ACC Coach of the Year for the second time.

In 2014, the Cavaliers made their second-consecutive College Cup appearance and their first-ever College Cup Final. UVA (23-3-0, 9-1-0 ACC) advanced to the ACC final and, for the second-straight season, Brian was honored with the Hermann Trophy as the nation's best collegiate player.

During his tenure as head coach of the Virginia women's soccer team, Swanson has had a dramatic impact on the program since he replaced former United States National Team Head Coach April Heinrichs in the spring of 2000.

Swanson's track record of success, not only on the collegiate level but also at the international level, was evident in 2012. That year he won a pair of championships, leading Virginia to its second ACC title and guiding the United States to the FIFA U-20 Women's World Cup Championship in Japan. For those feats, he was one of ten coaches named to the shortlist for FIFA Women's World Coach of the Year.

Swanson came to Virginia after two highly successful stops at Stanford and Dartmouth. At Dartmouth, Swanson guided the Big Green to national prominence. He did an equally impressive job at Stanford, helping maintain the program's standing as one of the premier teams in the country while leading the Cardinal to two Pac-10 titles in four seasons. In 2004, he led Virginia to the first ACC Championship in school history, making him the only coach in Division I history to win titles in three different conferences. He has since become the only coach in history to win multiple conference championships in three difference conferences. Swanson also enjoyed success as a player in college and as a professional.

In addition to his collegiate coaching experience, Swanson has been associated with the United States youth national teams for more than a decade. He was the head coach of the U-20 Women's National Team from 2011-12, leading the team to a World Cup championship. In December 2013, Swanson was named the head coach of the United States U-23 National Team. It is the fourth different age group he has led for the US Soccer Federation.

UVA IN THE ACC CHAMPIONSHIPS

- The Cavaliers made their 36th appearance in the ACC Tournament and have only missed two tournaments
- Virginia holds a 24-27-10 record in the ACC Championship following the 2025 Championships
- The Hoos have won the ACC Championships twice in program history - 2004 and 2012
- In its 10 draws, the Cavaliers have advanced on PKs three times, once being the 2004 title

UVA WINS THE ACC CHAMPIONSHIP IN 2004, 2012

A DEEPER LOOK AT VIRGINIA IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

- Virginia holds a 56-29-8 record in matches played in the NCAA Tournament all-time
- That record is impressive in the Swanson era with a 53-19-7 mark under his leadership
- The Cavaliers have out-scored foes 196-to-95 in NCAA Tournament matches
- That score margin is more pronounced under Swanson coming in at 185-to-71 all-time

HOOS HAVE BEEN A MAINSTAY IN THE POSTSEASON WITH A STRETCH OF DEEP NCAA RUNS

- The Hoos have been a mainstay in the NCAA Tournament with 37 appearances overall
- The 37 appearances is second all-time behind only North Carolina
- Virginia had an active streak of 14 consecutive appearances in the Sweet 16 until the 2019 season's loss to eventual College Cup participant Washington State in the second round
- The appearance in the Sweet 16 in 2022 at Penn State was the 17th in an 18-year stretch for the Cavaliers
- Virginia has made eight appearances in the quarterfinals under head coach Steve Swanson - making it in 2001, 2005, 2011 2013, 2014, 2015, the 2020-21 season and again in 2022
- The appearance in the quarterfinals against UCLA in 2022 was the ninth all-time for UVA
- UVA advanced to the College Cup in the 2013, 2014 and 2020 seasons - making a finals appearance in 2014
- UVA also advanced to the quarterfinals in 1991 when Virginia went on to make its first semifinal appearance



HOW THE HOOS ADVANCED TO THE SECOND ROUND

- Virginia advanced to the second round after picking up a 5-0 win over High Point in first round action
- Maggie Cagle tallied a goal and two assists - including an assist on the game-winning goal vs. the Panthers
- Five players scored for the Hoos: Ella Carter, Allie Ross, Addison Halpern, Cagle and Sophia Bradley

WHAT'S ON THE LINE THURSDAY

- Virginia and Penn State face off looking to advance to the Round of 16 of the NCAA Tournament
- The winner of Thursday's contest will face the winner of a matchup between Arkansas and Washington
- That third round game will be played at Klöckner Stadium at 2 p.m. on Sunday afternoon
- Arkansas is the five seed and is ranked No. 4 nationally, while Washington is the 4 seed and ranked No. 13
- Virginia is 2-0-0 against Arkansas with meetings in the 1991 and 1992 seasons
- The Hoos are 1-0-0 against Washington with the one meeting coming in the 1997 season

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

- Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.
- First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process. This tends to be used less in athletic eligibility references.
- Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

- Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."
- Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.
- Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

- The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

UNIVERSITY COLORS: ORANGE AND BLUE

- Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.
- One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAHOOWA

- The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.
- Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."
