#### PLAYER NOTES

- Felicia Aiyeotan is the fifth player in program history to be named to the ACC All-Defensive Team, joining Renee Robinson (a member of the inaugural team in 2000), LaTonya Blue (2004-05), Monica Wright (2008, 10) and Lexie Gerson (2012, 14)
- Aiyeotan leads the ACC in blocked shots per game (2.1). She is 33rd in the nation with 65 blocked shots this season. As a sophomore, she is already fifth in program history in blocked shots with 119 in her two seasons
- Aiyeotan is 10th in the ACC in rebounding (7.0 per game) and 11th in field goal percentage (51.2 percent)
- Dominique Toussaint was an honorable mention in All-ACC voting
- Toussaint leads the team in scoring at 11.3 ppg. She had a strong end to the season, scoring in double figures in 6 of her last 8 games
- Toussaint is 10th in the ACC in assists, averaging 3.7 per game. She has 126 field goals and 115 assists so far this season
- Jocelyn Willoughby and Lauren Moses were named to the ACC All-Academic Team. It is the second straight year earning the honor for both
- Willoughby is third on the team in scoring (9.6 points per game) and second in rebounding (5.4 per game)
- Aliyah Huland El scored a team-high 19 points in the ACC Tournament win over Georgia Tech. It was her first double-digit scoring effort since contributing 13 points at Florida State on Feb. 8. She scored 13 points against Notre Dame in the ACC quarterfinals, to average 16.0 points per game in the ACC Tournament
- Huland El has led the team in scoring (or shared the team lead) in seven of the last 13 games
- Both Moses and Huland El reached the 1,000 carer point benchmark this season, with Huland El hitting it on Feb. 1 against Louisville and Moses on Feb. 15 against Notre Dame
- Moses flirted with a pair of double-doubles in her last four games, with 10 points and nine rebounds at Louisville and 12 points with nine rebounds in the ACC Tournament win over Georgia Tech
- J'Kyra Brown hit a three-pointer in the first half against Notre Dame, extending her streak to 25 games in which she has made at least one three-pointer this season

#### **TEAM NOTES**

- The Cavaliers are making their first appearance in the NCAA Tournament since 2010 and their 25th overall appearance in the championship
- The Cavaliers appeared in the tournament every year from 1984 through 2003, including three appearances in the Final Four from 1990-92 (and the national championship game in 1991), returning in 2005, and then making three-straight appearances from 2008-10
- This is the Cavaliers first appearance in the tournament under head coach Joanne Boyle. Boyle took four teams to the NCAA Tournament in her six seasons at Cal (2006-09) and once made the tournament in three seasons at Richmond (2005)
- Virginia is looking to win a game in the NCAA Tournament for the first time since topping Marist, 68-61, in a 2009 first round game. Virginia lost to California (coached by Joanne Boyle) in the 2nd round that year
- Virginia's last appearance in the tournament was a 67-69 first-round upset by 12-seed Wisconsin-Green Bay in 2010
- This is Virginia's first time as a 10-seed. It is the lowest the team has ever been seeded
- Virginia is 10-7 in NCAA tournament first round games and has advanced to the Sweet 16 twelve times in program history (the team started in the second round seven times from 1987 to 1993)
- The ACC had eight teams selected to the tournament to match a league record (2014 and 2015), and are the most of any conference this year. It is also the fourth time in the last five years at least seven ACC teams have earned berths in the Big Dance, and the 11th time in the last 14 years at least six teams have been selected.
- This season, Virginia played the third-toughest schedule in the country. Only Notre Dame and Oklahoma had higher strength of schedules
- Virginia faced five ranked opponents in its last nine games, taking on No. 4 Louisville twice, No. 5 Notre Dame twice and No. 12 Florida State
- Virginia is receiving votes in the USA Today Coaches' polls for the 10th straight week
- The Cavaliers finished tied for sixth place in the ACC with Miami and Syracuse. It was the highest finish for the team since a sixth-place finish in 2013. The ACC had eight teams selected to the NCAA
- Virginia's 10 ACC wins are the most in Joanne Boyle's seven seasons as the Cavaliers' head coach. The last time the Cavaliers tallied 10 conference wins was the 2007-08 season when they went 10-4 and finished in a tie for third place
- Virginia's 8-1 start to conference play was its best since starting the 1999-00 season at 9-1 in ACC games. The Cavaliers started ACC play 5-0 start for the first time since the 2000 as well
- The Cavaliers had an eight-game win streak (December 17-January 11), its longest since the 2008-09 season when the squad won nine straight. The Cavaliers were 4-6 after falling at Rutgers on Dec. 4. They returned from finals break to rattle off the eight-game win streak and improve to 12-6
- The Cavaliers' defense has held 23 of its 31 opponents to shooting under 40.0 percent. Only one opponent, Notre Dame, has managed to shoot better than 50.0 percent
- Notre Dame is the only team to score more than 80 points against the Cavaliers this season, twice scoring 83
- Virginia held Louisville to 51 points in their game at Louisville, the second-lowest point total of the season for the Cardinals (and the fewest points in a Cardinal victory). The Cavaliers have held 14 opponents to scoring under 60 points this season
- The Cavaliers have had balanced scoring throughout the season. Only two players have scored 20 or more points in a game, J'Kyra Brown with 24 points in the overtime win against Indiana and Aliyah Huland El with 21 points at Georgia Tech. Dominique Toussaint leads the team with 21 double-digit scoring performances
  - Virginia is 2-2 all-time against Cal and has lost the last two meetings
- Virginia is 3-2 all-time against South Carolina. This is the first meeting of the two teams since 2007





# CALIFORNIA GOLDEN BEARS

- Joanne Boyle was the head coach at Cal from 2005 until she was named as Virginia's head coach on April 9, 2011 (six seasons), being replaced at Cal by current head coach Lindsay Gottlieb
- Gottlieb spent three seasons working on Joanne Boyle's staff at Cal, serving as an assistant coach for two seasons 2005-07, before being elevated to associate head coach in 2007-08. Gottlieb left in 2008 to become the head coach at UCSB, the position she held before returning to Cal to replace Boyle
- Boyle (HC) and Gottlieb (asst.) first worked together for three years at Richmond, with Gottlieb going with Boyle when Boyle took the head job at Cal
- Current Cal associate head coach Charmin Smith was on Boyle's staff from 2007-11 (four seasons) and was the lone Boyle assistant to transition to Gottleib's staff
- Boyle and Smith signed the No. 1 recruiting class in 2008 (the 2009-10 freshman class that included Layshia Clarendon, Talia Caldwell and Gennifer Brandon)
- Boyle took the program to its first-ever Sweet 16 in 2009. Gottlieb took the program to its first Elite Eight and Final Four in 2013
- Boyle defeated Virginia to take the Bears to the 2009 Sweet 16
- In Boyle's six seasons at Cal, she was named 2006-07 Pac-10 Coach of the Year and the 2007-08 Russell Athletic/WBCA Region 8 Coach of the Year. Her 2008-09 team spent four weeks at a program-best No. 3 ranking in both the AP and USA Today-ESPN Coaches' polls
- Her players earned All-Pac-10 honors 17 times and Pac-10 All-Freshman accolades 11 times. She coached three All-Americans in Devanei Hampton, Ashley Walker, and Alexis Gray-Lawson. Gray-Lawson was also the 2010 Frances Pomeroy Naismith Award winner, an honor given to the top player in the nation 5-8 and under
- Five of Boyle's Cal players went on to play in the WNBA (Ashley Walker Seattle Storm; Alexis Gray-Lawson Phoenix Mercury; Layshia Clarendon Indiana Fever/Atlanta Dream (was an All-Star for the Dream this year); Gennifer Brandon Chicago Sky; Talia Caldwell New York Liberty)
- Additionally, Brittany Boyd and Reshanda Gray were Boyle recruits in her final signing class at Cal (2010), but were freshmen when Gottlieb took over the program (2011-12 season). Both went on to be drafted by the WNBA with Boyd about to start her third season with the New York Liberty
- Virginia associate athletics director for basketball administration Sarah Holsinger was Boyle's director of operations at Cal and moved with her to Virginia. Virginia media relations director Melissa Dudek worked at Cal with Boyle for four seasons and spent one season working with Gottlieb before moving to Virginia where she has spent the last six seasons working with Boyle
- This will be the second time that Boyle and Gottlieb have coached against one another. Virginia and Cal played one another in Boyle's first season at UVA. The two teams met in the Rainbow Wahine Showdown in Honolulu, with Cal picking up a 59-50 victory (11/27/11)

# SOUTH CAROLINA GAMECOCKS



- Head coach Dawn Staley is the most accomplished and decorated player in the history of Virginia basketball
- Staley helped lead UVA to three trips to the NCAA Final Four, including a championship game appearance in 1991
- Staley was a two-time National Player of the Year (1991, 1992) and three-time Kodak All-American (1990, 1991, 1992) and was the Honda Broderick Award winner in 1991 (collegiate woman athlete of the year)
- ACC Player of the Year in 1991 and 1992
- NCAA Final Four MVP in 1991
- Finished her career as the only player in ACC history to record more than 2,000 points, 700 rebounds, 700 assists and 400 steals, Staley is one of three players at Virginia to have her jersey retired
- Finished her career with 2,135 points. Was surpassed in 2010 as Virginia's all-time leading scorer by Monica Wright
- Only player in program history to have a triple double, a feat she accomplished twice in the 1991 season
- Staley was named to the ACC's 50th Anniversary Women's Basketball Team in 2002 and earned a spot on ESPN.com's "Top Players of the Past 25 Years."
- Inducted into the Virginia Sports Hall of Fame in 2008
- Olympic gold medals in 1996, 2000 and 2004 highlight her collection of 10 gold medals and one bronze on the world stage. She was the flag bearer for the United States in Olympic Games Opening Ceremony in 2004
- This would be the third time that Staley has coached against her alma mater. Her Temple Owls have twice played UVA in Charlottesville, falling 72-71 on Dec. 28, 2003 and falling 71-65 on Nov. 29, 2006. She is looking for her first win against the Cavaliers
- Staley and Boyle squared off five times as head coaches when they were both in the A-10. Temple went 4-1 against Richmond in those meetings

#### QUICK HITTERS AND FUN FACTS ABOUT THE HOOS

- Members of the team were included in a Good Morning America feature on AD Carla Williams that ran on February 14. Jocelyn Willoughby and Lauren Moses were both featured in the Robin Roberts Black History Month piece on Williams appointment as the first African-American athletics director of a Power-5 conference school
- Jocelyn Willoughby was appointed as the non-voting, student-athlete member of the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Oversight Committee. Willoughby is the lone student-athlete on the 15-member committee with her tenure running through June 2020. The goals of the committee are to advance the game and perception of women's basketball, improve the student-athlete experience and put an emphasis on the personal growth of student athletes. Along with the goals, it will also work to supervise qualifications and/or selection procedures for the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Championship and provide direction to the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Rules Committee regarding playing rules
- Willoughby was recently selected to be one of 25 fellows at the University of Virginia's Meriwether Lewis Institute for Citizen Leadership. This is a very prestigious 2.5-year immersive leadership program that brings together a diverse group of UVA students that enroll in a Foundations in Design Thinking class their sophomore year before undertaking a six-week program in the summer before their junior year. As third and fourth year students, the Fellows apply what they've learned to key University issues, participating in independent and small group projects aimed at improving the University
- · Aliyah Huland El is majoring in kinesiology and wants to be a pediatrician
- J'Kyra Brown is an accomplished bowler. She took up bowling at four years old and holds several lane records back home at the Rocky Mount Bowling Center. Her all-time best is a 275 and she also has a 248 game. She owns five different bowling balls. The Black Widow is her baby, but she also has a SpongeBob ball that she got when she was 10 that she uses for spares, for straight balls or corner shots
- Dominique Toussaint's dream one-on-one match-up is to go up against Sue Bird. Her favorite sports team is the New York Liberty
- Lauren Moses' brother, Dezman, played for the Green Bay Packers (2012) and the Kansas City Chiefs (2013-15), including seeing action in the 2015 Divisional Playoff against the Patriots
- Moses will be pursuing her masters degree next year at Maryland, attending the Philip Merrill College of Journalism
- Felicia Aiyeotan did not start playing basketball until she was 15 as "Most schools just have soccer fields. There weren't basketball courts or gyms at my school because it was a public school. They don't have a lot of resources for that. Where I lived, though, there was an outdoor basketball court. I would go there on the weekends because during the week, I had to go to tutoring. At that time I wasn't fully into basketball. Since it was outdoors, the weather would sometimes mess your schedule up because it would rain." She came to the United States before her freshman year in high school. She spent three years at Neumann Goretti High in Philadelphia (where they were the No. 1 team in the nation her junior year before transferring to Blair Academy in New Jersey for her senior year. Pounded Yam Egusi Soup is her favorite dish from home that her mom makes. "Pounded yam looks like dough, like mashed potatoes and then Egusi soup is made out of melon and vegetables. You can add whatever you want, if you want beef or fish, but it is spicy." She really misses the spice of Nigerian food.
- Aiyeotan is the tallest active player in NCAA women's basketball right now. The next tallest is Sara Hamson of BYU at 6-7. Nancy Mulkey of Rice is also 6-9, but she is a soph transfer from Oklahoma sitting out the season
- The Cavaliers took a foreign tour this summer, spending seven days in Costa Rica in August, taking on a Canadian team as well as the Costa Rican National Team. It allowed the squad time to practice as well as the experience of getting three exhibition games under their belt. While in Costa Rica, the team went zip lining through a jungle while others went on an ATV tour. Some of them took surfing lessons as well as seeing wildlife that included a river filled with crocodiles. Their favorite part of the trip, however, was a trip to an orphanage, an activity they enjoyed so much, the itinerary of the trip was altered to allow a return visit to see the kids

#### **HEAD COACH** JOANNE BOYLE **QUICK FACTS**

- Seventh season at Virginia
- Career record of 332-190
- 128-97 at Virginia;
- First NCAA Tournament appearance with the Cavaliers
- This is the sixth time she has led a team to the NCAA Tournament (once with Richmond, four times in six seasons at Cal)
- · Her 2009 Cal team advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16
- 2011 WBCA Carol Eckman Award winner
- 2006-07 Pac-10 Coach of the Year
- Named 2007-08 Russell Athletic/
- WBCA Region 8 Coach of the Year
- Served as an assistant coach at Duke from 1993 to 2002. During that nineyear span the Blue Devils recorded a 225-121 record, advancing to the NCAA Championships the last eight seasons and making Final Four appearances in 1999 and 2002
- Four-year letterwinner at Duke, Boyle graduated in 1985 with a degree in economics and obtained a master's of science degree in health policy and administration from North Carolina in 1989
- · Prior to starting her coaching career at her alma mater she played professionally in Luxembourg and Germany for three years
- · Has a six-year-old daughter, Ngoty, who she adopted from Senegal in 2014

#### THE LANGUAGE OF BASKETBALL

- Lisa Jablonowski is fluent in four languages (English, German, Luxembourgish and French) as well as being able to speak some conversational Polish and a little Spanish
- Felicia Aiyeotan is fluent in Yoruba
- Aliyah Huland El and Lauren Moses studied abroad in Valencia, Spain, during the summer of 2016 and spoke nothing but Spanish while they were living there. Jocelyn Willoughby is very involved in the UVA Spanish club

#### **WHAT'S IN A NAME**

- Felicia Aiyeotan: Felicia means "fortunate, lucky". This is actually her middle name. Her legal first name: Oluwafunmilola, means "the Lord has granted me wealth"
- Dominique Toussaint was "named after the country my parents are from: Dominica"
- Jocelyn Willoughby: "There's a jazz singer named Jocelyn Brown. My dad really liked her name, Jocelyn, and decided that if he had a daughter, that would be her name."
- J'Kyra Brown: "My initials are JMB, the same initials of my Dad's name as well as his two brothers"



### Willoughby Appointed to NCAA Women's Basketball Oversight Committee VirginiaSports.com

CHARLOTTESVILLE -- Virginia women's basketball sophomore Jocelyn Willoughby (East Orange, N.J.) has been appointed as a non-voting, student-athlete member of the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Oversight Committee.

"I am extremely honored and grateful for having been appointed the non-voting student athlete member of the Women's Basketball Oversight Committee," Willoughby said. "It was a pretty competitive selection process. Sarah Holsinger (associate athletics director for basketball operations) brought the opportunity to my attention. I did some research to get a better understanding of the Committee's mission and came away feeling like it was the perfect opportunity for me. I felt that their goals aligned with my own goals and what I try to emulate as a well-rounded student-athlete and women's basketball player."

Willoughby joins the 15-member committee through June 2020. The goals of the committee are to advance the game and perception of women's basketball, improve the student-athlete experience and put an emphasis on the personal growth of student athletes.

Along with the goals, it will also work to supervise qualifications and/or selection procedures for the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Championship and provide direction to the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Rules Committee regarding playing rules.

"I truly value the opportunity to be the voice of student athletes--particularly women's basketball players," Willoughby said. "It's incredible to think that I get to provide a perspective to the committee that will influence long-term decisions, the direction in which the game progresses, and hopefully have a positive impact on the growth of the game and improvement of the student-athlete's collegiate experience. I am looking forward to taking on this role, in addition to the opportunity to meet, work with, and network with the other members on the committee."

An All-ACC Freshman Team and All ACC-Academic Team selection, Willoughby was second among conference freshmen in rebounding (6.2 per game) and scoring (9.8 points per game), while leading the rookies in steals per game (1.7 per game).

# Women's Basketball Takes Costa Rica Summer Trip VirginiaSports.com

CHARLOTTESVILLE -- This summer, the Cavaliers headed down to Costa Rica, going on a foreign tour of the country from August 5-13. The trip included plenty of sightseeing, team bonding and fun activities, but started with basketball. Lots of basketball. The team flew down on a Saturday and then played games on three straight days from Sunday through Tuesday, taking on Ottawa and the Costa Rican National Team.

"All of the games were played with international rules, which are a little different than what we were used to," said junior forward Moné Jones. "For me, the side out-of-bounds rules were a big difference where you couldn't pass backcourt if you were already on one side. Also, on the free throw line, there were times that you didn't have someone underneath the basket, the opponents would be clear off the lane and standing back. I didn't understand that rule. The shot clock was a big difference. It was 24 seconds and off an offensive rebound, it doesn't reset to the full 24, it only resets to 14. You had to move in the offense really quick. On an offensive rebound, it either had to be a putback or a quick shot."

"Ottawa was more of a screening team with a lot of sets," redshirt sophomore forward Shakyna Payne recalled. "They set a lot of screens and didn't really look inside. They relied mostly on their guards. They had a lot of talent and were a fun team to play. We also appreciated being able to play against the Costa Rican National Team. They definitely were guard heavy. It was cool to play the national team in their home country."

The second half of the trip involved more sightseeing and fun activities. The team headed out to Jaco Beach, stopping at a bridge over the Tárcoles River to see some of the largest crocodiles on the planet. They also went zip lining and ATV riding in the Los Sueños rain forest. Some of the players even hit the waves and took surfing lessons. The team also had some epic volleyball matches at the hotel pool.

In addition to everything that the players saw, they also got to experience new foods. Sophomore guard Jocelyn Willoughby really enjoyed casado, a traditional dish of rice and beans. Senior guard J'Kyra Brown was one of the players who enjoyed trying something new.

"I'm a very picky eater, so trying new things was an accomplishment," she said. "It was fun."

The favorite activity from the trip, however, were two visits the team took to the Asociación Obras de Espiritu Santo orphanage in San José.

"We got to play with some toddlers and some babies," said senior guard Aliyah Huland-El. "We also played basketball and jumped rope with some young school-aged kids and brought them some new soccer balls and other equipment. It was such a great experience and so humbling."

The team, who brought gifts of gear, playground equipment and other toys to the orphanage, enjoyed the first visit so much, they asked to change the trip's itinerary to make room for a second trip to visit.

"When we travel during the year as a team, we go, play a game and then come home, but this trip as something special," said head coach Joanne Boyle. "This was quality time away. This was bonding. This was creating memories and having a really good time, with us working together to get ready for the season."





### Aiyeotan Settling Into Comfort Zone By Jeff White (jwhite@virginia.edu)

CHARLOTTESVILLE -- Back home in Nigeria this summer, Felicia Aiyeotan saw her family for the first time in a year. Her parents and two brothers had no trouble recognizing her, but they were struck by how much she'd changed.

"Yeah, because I got bigger and stronger," Aiyeotan said.
"They think I got taller too, I guess because they haven't seen

me in a while, but I'm pretty much the same."

At 6-9, Aiyeotan has more than enough height to excel on the basketball court. But her first season on the University of Virginia women's team made clear to Aiyeotan that she needed more bulk if she was to win low-post battles.

"When I was in high school, I was like, `I can't wait to go to college, where I'm just going to be guarded by one person,'
"Aiyeotan said. "In high school, because I was taller, I was always guarded by two or three people. I was always pushed around, and I was like, `College is supposed to be five-on-five, so I shouldn't expect [double- and triple-teaming]. It should just be one person on me."

"But I got to college and I was like, `Oh, no, Felicia, you're wrong.' Because the people I'm playing against, they're faster, they're stronger, they think really fast, and they correct their mistakes. In high school, people might guard you the same way the entire game. But here in college, if they're front-guarding you and see it's not working, they might guard you from the back. If they see it's not working, they might put two people on you.

"After my first few games, I realized that I needed to get more strength and put more muscle on, and I'm still in that

process right now."

Working with Robb Hornett, UVA's strength and conditioning coach for women's basketball, Aiyeotan (pronounced EYE-oh-Ten) has added about 15 solid pounds, and opposing post players can no longer push her around so easily.

"She looks a lot better," Hornett said.

"And she's done really well in the classroom, and that's given her confidence," Virginia head coach Joanne Boyle said. Aiyeotan, who did not start playing basketball until she was

Aiyeotan, who did not start playing basketball until she was a teenager, came to the United States before her freshman year in high school. She spent three years at Neumann Goretti High in Philadelphia before transferring to Blair Academy in New Jersey for her senior year.

As a girl in Nigeria, she learned to speak English fluently, so she did not have to clear a language barrier in Charlottesville. Still, she's happy to have her first year of college behind her.

"This summer, everything is much better compared to last summer," Aiyeotan said, "because last summer I didn't know what I was getting myself into. I didn't know anything in general: locations, classes, everything. But this year I know what to expect. I know where I'm going. It's less questions, less curiosity."

Aiyeotan went home for three weeks early in the summer and delighted in catching up with her family. She didn't play much basketball while she was in Nigeria, "but she came back ready to work," Hornett said. "She had a good mentality."

Not only is Aiyeotan significantly stronger as she heads into her second season, Hornett said, "I think she definitely has better stamina. Being in the program another year has definitely helped her. She's confident, and when she lets it rip in running, she can fly, which is good."

The Cavaliers open practice on Sept. 14. When the season begins in November, Hornett said, "I think the first non-conference games are going to be critical for [Aiyeotan] to get minutes and see that all the work she's put in is paying dividends."

In 2016-17, Aiyeotan came off the bench in every game for a UVA team that finished 20-13 after losing in the WNIT's second round. She averaged 4.6 points, 3.7 rebounds and 12.5 minutes per game and led the Wahoos with 54 blocked shots, nearly twice as many as her closest teammate, Lauren Moses (28). Aiyeotan's average of 1.64 blocks per game ranked third among ACC players.

"Just looking back at last season and reflecting on the things that I've done and things I could do better," she said, "I definitely think I could do much more than I did last year. I'm looking forward to that."

Boyle expects Aiyeotan's role to be considerably larger this season. In early August, the Cavaliers spent a week in Costa Rica, where they played three games, defeating the University of Ottowa twice and the Costa Rica national team once.

In the first game, against Ottowa, Aiyeotan totaled 10 points, 14 rebounds and four blocks. In the final game, against Costa Rica, she made 8 of 11 shots from the floor, scored 16 points, grabbed eight rebounds and blocked three shots in only 16 minutes.

A knee injury kept the 6-2 Moses from playing on the trip, and Aiyeotan started at center. She enjoyed a huge size advantage over UVA's opponents.

"There was no one that could cover her," Hornett said. "She still had some ball-control issues, but she did play well. Whatever she does, even if she doesn't do anything offensively, she's going to make an impact defensively."

Boyle said: "It's just hard to score over 6-9. It's just a bonus to have that size on the floor."

The trip highlighted the progress Aiyeotan has made working with Hornett and assistant coach La'Keshia Frett Meredith, who was an All-America post player at Phoebus High School in Hampton and at the University of Georgia.

"Fe's getting her body in a better position," Boyle said, and Aiyeotan's improved balance, footwork and post moves were on display in Costa Rica.

"I thought she finished better," Boyle said, "and demanded the ball more. It's not, 'Oh, gosh, Fe's arrived,' but she's made some huge strides in those areas where last year we were saying, 'Wait till she puts on 15 pounds of muscle. Wait till she gets better balance.' Now some of these things are starting to come into play."

Aiyeotan, whose roommates this school year include teammates (and classmates) Jocelyn Willoughby and Dominique Toussaint, won't soon forget the trip to Central America.

"I loved it," she said. "Some of the stuff was similar to [Nigeria], especially the market. I don't know any Spanish, but I could easily relate to the environment with where I'm from. I loved the tours and where we went. We went to the orphanage, which was really huge for me, because I love helping people and seeing people from different backgrounds."

In the coastal town of Herradura, virtually all of the players went zip-lining through the rain forest one day. Aiyeotan -- all 6-9 of her -- was among those who partook in the experience.

"I was scared, but I got through my fears," she said, smiling. Her willingness to take on challenges is one of Aiyeotan's many attributes.

"She wants to be good," Boyle said, "and when I walk in the gym at certain hours in the morning or certain times at night, she's in there.

"She really works. She really finds her time to put in outside of the time we require of her, and she wants to do it. She wants to be a pro, she wants to be a dominant player in [the ACC]. She's not just sitting on the couch eating bonbons. She's in the gym working.

"I give her credit. She's done an amazing job in the classroom, and that has not been easy. So she's really kind of taken the entire UVA experience and used it to the best of her ability, to position herself for good things in the classroom, on the court, and later in life."





# Cavaliers Counting on Second-Year Class By Jeff White (jwhite@virginia.edu)

CHARLOTTESVILLE --The University of Virginia women's basketball team includes four seniors, three of whom figure to be in head coach Joanne Boyle's rotation this season: Lauren Moses, Aliyah Huland El and J'Kyra Brown.

How the Cavaliers fare in 2017-18, however, may hinge as much on their promising sophomore class, which consists of 6-0 Jocelyn Willoughby, 5-9 Dominique Toussaint, 6-9 Felicia Aiyeotan and 6-3 Lisa Jablonowski. All are expected to play key roles for UVA, which opens the season Friday night at No. 7 Mississippi State.

Willoughby and Toussaint joined Boyle for a preseason question-and-answer session Monday afternoon at John Paul Jones Arena.

"We have a lot of talent on this team, and obviously the sophomore class, and these two on both sides of me, were a huge contributing factor to our success last year and in building the platform [for more success]," Boyle told reporters. "So they're going to be a major part moving forward these next three years."

Willoughby started all 33 games for a team that narrowly missed making the NCAA tournament last season. Toussaint started 30. Jablonowski, who's from Luxembourg, started nine. Aiyeotan, a native of Nigeria, came off the bench in every game last season, and her role should grow significantly in 2017-18.

"I always say, any time freshmen play a lot of minutes, they're just so much better as sophomores, juniors and seniors moving forward," said Boyle, who's in her seventh year at UVA, where her record is 110-85.

Willoughby (9.8 ppg, team-high 6.2 rpg) and Toussaint (9.5 ppg) were named to the ACC's all-freshman team in 2016-17. Toussaint will feature prominently for the Wahoos on opening night, but whether Willoughby plays against Mississippi State is uncertain. An ankle injury has hindered her this fall.

"Hopefully I'll be able to play," Willoughby said Monday, "but for me it's more about the long term and making sure that I'm healthy and my ankle will be healthy and be able to sustain the duration of the season."

Virginia lost only one player from a team that finished 20-13 last season, point guard Breyana Mason, but she averaged 35.2 minutes per game. In Mason's absence, Toussaint, Brown and freshman Brianna Tinsley, a graduate of nearby St. Anne's-Belfield School, will split the point guard duties.

"I just want to be more consistent," said Toussaint, who was second on the team with 74 assists last season.

"You don't really have the excuse that you're a freshman any more. You know what to expect when you go on the floor, and you have to bring it every game. You have more responsibility to the team, being a second-year. I think that's the biggest change for me."

Asked about playing the point, Toussaint said, "I've just been working with the coaches. They've been guiding me through it, because usually I'm just a combo guard. I come off the wing. It's just a mental change in knowing that I have to lead on the court. I have to be the connection between the team and the coaches. But I feel like I'm transitioning into the position well, and I have J.B. beside me to help me with that."

Boyle said Toussaint is stronger and fitter than in 2016-17. Willoughby's injury has slowed her progress, but she's emerged as one of the team's leaders.

"There's just a maturity [with Toussaint and Willoughby]," Boyle said. "I think they're both mature in their games to begin with, and I know they just want to improve. I just think they can handle more. Mentally they can grow and physically they can grow. I think they are both starting to want more responsibility, and that's always a great thing for a coach."

Aiyeotan is the most intriguing member of the class. She's added 15 solid pounds since the end of last season and can more easily hold her position on the block. As a freshman, she averaged 4.6 points, 3.7 rebounds and 12.5 minutes per game and led the `Hoos with 54 blocked shots. Her average of 1.64 blocks per game ranked third among ACC players.

"I think a lot with Fe last year was just the newness of playing in this type of environment," Boyle said. "She's a late bloomer, so she's not been playing the game that long," unlike Toussaint and Willoughby.

In early August, the `Hoos spent a week in Costa Rica, where they played three games.

In UVA's first game, against the University of Ottowa, Aiyeotan totaled 10 points, 14 rebounds and four blocks. In the final game, against the Costa Rica national team, she made 8 of 11 shots from the floor, scored 16 points, grabbed eight rebounds and blocked three shots in only 16 minutes.

"She's definitely improved in terms of understanding how to post up, how we want her to post up," Boyle said. "Obviously, there's going to be growth for the next three years with her, but she is a presence for us.

"She's working hard, and she runs the floor ... She's always been a decent rebounder for us. The defensive end of the floor is still her sweet spot. She still blocks shots every day in practice, and I think she's just getting more comfortable at the offensive end of the floor. For me it's still about [Aiyeotan] finishing better and being confident and continuing to get stronger, but there's been a lot of growth in her."

Jablonowski averaged only 2.4 points per game as a freshman, but her energy and high basketball IQ earned her a spot in the rotation.

"For us she was always that spark that came off the bench, got all the hustle plays, kept balls alive, rebounded the basketball well and played good defense," Boyle said. "I want her to continue to do that and hopefully be able to give us a little bit more scoring. I'm never going to pigeonhole a player into a box and say, 'She can only do this.' She's really been working on her shot with [assistant coach Tim Taylor], and I think she's definitely more comfortable [on offense].

"Is she going to be putting up 10, 12 points a game this year? I don't know. But I want her growth to be in that area, and I want her to be better in the things that she was really good at, and that's those things I mentioned: her hustle, her defense and her rebounding and keeping balls alive."

Virginia suffered an offseason blow when freshman Amandine Toi, a 5-11 guard from France who was expected to compete for a starting job, tore the anterior cruciate ligament in her left knee. She'll miss the season.

"It was really hard on her for a couple days, up to a week," Boyle said, "because obviously [basketball is a big part of] the reason why she came here. But she's a great teammate. These guys" -- Toussaint and Willoughby -- "will vouch for that. She'll be a great leader for us. She understands that she gets the year back and she's got five [years] and all those good things, but I think it's hard for her, like any player, to sit there and watch practice and know that you're not going to be a part of it. But every team deals with [injuries]. We're not the only one."

UVA's home opener is Sunday at 2 p.m., against Central Connecticut State at JPJ. First, however, comes a date with Mississippi State, which lost to South Carolina in last year's NCAA title game.

Boyle wanted to beef up the Cavaliers' non-conference schedule, "and I think this is a great opportunity for a little bit more of a veteran team to go into [a hostile] environment early ... We need that kind of exposure. We're at the point where we need those type of games early to just see where we are. I'm looking forward to it."

In voting among the ACC's head coaches last month, Virginia was picked to finish fifth in the conference.

"After our season last year, we're more mature," Willoughby said. "We understand what we need to do, and now it's just a matter of doing what we need to do to get it done."

Boyle said: "Our goal is to get off of that [NCAA] bubble and not have it be somebody else's decision if we're in the tournament or not."



# Willoughby Rounding Into Form For 'Hoos By Jeff White (jwhite@virginia.edu)

CHARLOTTESVILLE -- She had a stellar first season for the University of Virginia women's basketball team, and there was every reason to believe Jocelyn Willoughby would be more productive in 2017-18.

Early in the fall, however, Willoughby suffered a high-ankle sprain that sidelined her for almost all of preseason. She was cleared to play in the Cavaliers' opener and hasn't missed a game this season, but Willoughby has been less consistent than expected.

The long layoff "set me back in terms of not being able to [build] chemistry and get the reps with the team," Willoughby said, "and going from 0 to 100 [mph], that causes other issues of compensation. So not having the conditioning and gradual build-up to the season was hard, but I'm going through it now."

UVA hosted ACC rival Clemson on Sunday afternoon at John Paul Jones Arena, and Willoughby entered the game not having made more than three field goals in a game since Dec. 4. That streak is over. She went 5 of 9 from the floor (2 for 3 from beyond the arc) and scored a team-high 16 points in the Wahoos' 70-41 victory over the Tigers.

Clemson's head coach is Audra Smith, a former UVA player and assistant.

The victory was the seventh straight for the `Hoos, who are 4-0 in the ACC for the first time since 1999-2000.

"Today was definitely a better day, and it's boosted my confidence, just kind of getting back to where I was before," Willoughby said, "just shooting and being aggressive and just being the offensive player that I know I'm capable of, and continuing on the defensive end."

A 6-0 wing from East Orange, New Jersey, Willoughby started every game for the Cavaliers last season and was named to the ACC's All-Freshman team. She was the second-leading scorer (9.8 ppg) and top rebounder (6.2 per game) on a UVA team that narrowly missed the NCAA tournament.

This season, she's second on the team in scoring, at 10.7 ppg, behind classmate Dominique Toussaint (11.4), first in steals (1.9 per game), and third in rebounding (4.5 per game). Willoughby is shooting 52.2 percent from 3-point range and 80.6 percent from the line, both team highs.

She continues to have her right ankle heavily taped, Willoughby said, and "I'm still kind of favoring it a little bit, but in terms of playing, it's not hindering me."

Four players scored in double figures for UVA against Clemson (10-6, 0-3): Willoughby, Toussaint (10 points), senior Lauren Moses (11), and sophomore Felicia Aiyeotan (10).

"Somebody said to me after the game today, `You just never know who is going to be your leading scorer, huh?' "Virginia head coach Joanne Boyle said. "That's one of the great things about us."

Willoughby, also one of the team's best students, has "put in a lot of work," Boyle said. "Sometimes for shooters, it is a mental game and you get in a little bit of a slump, and I think she's really worked hard to get herself to where she's at."

A graduate of Newark Academy, Willoughby said the "past few games I've kind of been passive and hesitant and not quite looking to be aggressive. Just talking to the coaches, it's all mental for me, so looking to score, looking to make the right play. I think that was ultimately the change. I put in the work, I get up extra shots every day, but just knowing in the game when to take my shot and look for that, I think that was probably the biggest difference for me."

Aiyeotan, who stands 6-9, led the Cavaliers with 10 rebounds and also had four blocked shots, two assists and one steal. The double-double was the fifth of the season for Aiyeotan, a native of Nigeria who attended high school in the United States.

In the first 60 seconds Sunday, she grabbed an offensive rebound, blocked a shot and made a layup on which she was fouled. Later in the first quarter, fans at JPJ chuckled at the sight of Clemson's Alexis Carter, who's 5-7, being guarded in the paint by Aiyeotan.

A reserve as a freshman, Aiyeotan is now a starter and

leads the `Hoos in rebounding and blocked shots. She also averages 7.1 points per game and is shooting 50 percent from the floor.

Aiyeotan did not start playing hoops until she was a teenager, and "I think she hasn't even scratched the surface [of her potential], to be honest," Boyle said.

Workouts with assistant coaches La'Keshia Frett Meredith and Tim Taylor are paying off for Aiyeotan, who's finishing more consistently around the basket than she did in 2016-17.

"I want the defense to have to worry about her on every possession, and that's what we want to get to," Boyle said.

For Aiyeotan, the keys are "building her confidence and understanding we want to get her a touch every other time down the floor, if possible, whether to shoot it or just make a decision for somebody else," Boyle said. "On the defensive end, it's just for her to continue to be a presence, and I think she can even be a greater presence for us."

Early last month, the Cavaliers played at Rutgers and suffered a loss that left them with a 4-6 record. For a team with hopes of making the NCAA tournament for the first time since 2010, it was a disappointing start, but Boyle said Sunday that she never lost faith.

"I think if we had played a very poor non-conference schedule that might not have been the [case]," Boyle said. "But I just really feel we challenged ourselves, and for the right reasons, to be in a situation that we're in here now."

Willoughby said: "It was not the start to the season that we wanted, but I think we were challenged in so many ways. We played a bunch of teams of different styles, and that would prepare us and help us down the road. It was a challenging non-conference season, but it's helped us."

Virginia's next home game is Jan. 21 against Virginia Tech. Before that Commonwealth Clash contest, UVA will play two road games, at Boston College on Thursday night and Sunday afternoon at No. 17 Duke.

The NCAA tournament remains the Cavaliers' goal, "but we know each day we have to focus on what's in front of us in the present in order to get to that big picture," Willoughby said. "It's definitely motivation to look down the road and see,

"It's definitely motivation to look down the road and see, OK, this is where we want to go, and in the present these are the immediate steps that we have to take to get there. We really just focus day in and day out on getting better."

UVA's winning streak started Dec. 17 against Ohio at the West Palm Invitational in Florida.

"We've gotten a lot of injured people back," Boyle said, "and I think their rhythm has been really good thus far. I think that there's been a lot of maturity this year, especially since [the Florida tournament] ... I think we've made great adjustments at games and I think the girls really follow through on that. One of the biggest things we always talk about is our effort and attention to detail, and I feel like we have been more consistent this year with that."





### Dominique Toussaint - Sawing Through the Competition By Kristin Watkins

January 10, 2018

An All-ACC Freshman Team selection last season, Dominique Toussaint has picked right back up where she left off for her sophomore campaign. Toussaint put in a lot of work in the offseason to be sure she was ready from the first game.

"We focused on what I need to get better at this summer, like my scoring, assists and game I.Q.," Toussaint said. "Each practice the coaches would pick on those things and push me even harder than they did last year because they expect a lot more. I think that is what contributed to me coming into this year at the same level as when the season ended last year and continuing to get better."

The Staten Island, N.Y. native currently leads Virginia with 11.5 points per game. She has had several huge games for UVA this year, including a 16-point performance against Pitt to open the ACC season and 18 points against Maryland. She leads the team with 11 double-digit scoring efforts this year.

"We have a knew shooting gun so I have been working on my shooting more, making sure my open shots will go in," Toussaint said.

When she is not putting the ball in the hoop, she is finding her teammates with a team-leading 62 assists. Toussaint has even elevated her play in the four ACC games, leading the conference in assist-to-turnover ratio with 19 assists to just six turnovers in that span.

"Most of that is game I.Q." Toussaint said. "I am the type of person that likes assists more than points. An assist to me is just like me scoring a point. I just look for the people on the floor. We have a lot of weapons out there, especially people like Felicia [Aiyeotan] it is easy to get her the ball in the paint. I am always looking for my players and trying to break down the defense. I really like this team. Everyone brings what they can bring on a consistent basis. I am never worried on the court, I always have backup."

Toussaint has played a large part in UVA's success this season. The Cavaliers have opened ACC play 4-0, marking the first time since 2000, and it is an exciting time for the team.

"I am feeling really good and confident about the way we have been playing," Toussaint said. "In the back of my mind I'm thinking we still have better competition coming up so we have to focus on that as well. It is good to start off this well in ACC play."

Having someone like Toussaint that can score as well as find her open teammates, is a weapon that head coach Joanne Boyle knows is key for Virginia.

"I am extremely proud of Nicky and all that she has done for our team this season," Boyle said. "She has consistently been a presence for us all year and is really taking charge out on the floor. While Nikki has always been a great scoring guard, I think she has elevated her entire game by making her teammates better with her unselfish play. She is putting in the extra time it takes to be a great player and I think we are all seeing the benefits. Her conditioning is much better this year and she often draws the assignment of handling the opposing player's best perimeter scorer. I love the balance she has with her teammates on the floor."

Despite basketball taking up most of her time, Toussaint takes time to relax and one of her favorite ways to do that is by watching movies and television shows on Netflix. This past Halloween, she discovered one of her favorite movie series. "I love the Saw movies," Toussaint said. "I think there are

"I love the Saw movies," Toussaint said. "I think there are seven of them, maybe more. I watch them and wonder how someone planned out all of these movies, because the first movie relates to the last one and the middle movie relates to the fifth movie. It is really confusing and the endings always have a giant twist. It is not even like a scary movie, it is more of a thriller so there is nothing popping out at you but they are really interesting. Around Halloween I was watching them on Netflix. They were so good, I watched them all of them in three days. I really like the concept of how everything is connected. For example, the guy that got caught in the first movie is alive in the last movie and is taking over everything. The concept is just crazy."

She became interested in the movies because of one coming out this year, but as soon the series started that became the priority.

"There is a movie that came out this year called Jigsaw and I wanted to go see it," Toussaint said. "I haven't seen it yet, but my goal was to finish the Saw movies so I could go see that movie. After I saw the second one I knew I had to watch them all."

Her interests expand beyond just thrillers as she is also an action/adventure enthusiast.

"I am a big movie person," Toussaint said. "A lot of people on the team watch Netflix but I love movies and television shows. I really like action/adventure movies. I am a big fan of the Marvel movies. I'm excited for Black Panther and Infinity War to come out this year. I don't know if Marvel made the Netflix series, Bright, with Will Smith but I have enjoyed watching that as well. It is similar to all of those movies. I just really like action/adventure movies because they are really entertaining. When I am watching them, I picture myself being a superhero and being able to have superpowers to save the world. If I could be one of the Avengers, I would definitely be Black Widow. It is an easy choice."

Movies have always been a part of Toussaint's life, even as a child she used them as a way to be transported to another place

"Movies are more interesting than my real life so I think that is what I like about them so much," Toussaint said. "The lifestyle you see in movies and TV shows is really interesting. When I was younger, I watched a lot of documentaries. That was more because I wanted to see what was happening outside of my small, State Island home. Now I have moved to action/adventure to keep my mind flowing."

Now that she is in college and taking foreign languages, Toussaint's interests have expanded into Foreign Films and gets a little help from some of her teammates.

"I am trying to get into foreign films," Toussaint said. "I don't have a problem watching movies with subtitles. When I was watching Bright, I had French subtitles on. It was interesting to see that because I am learning French right now in school so I was trying to connect what I have learned to what they are saying and what I was reading. My teammate, Amandine (Toi), is from France and I was looking through her Netflix to see what foreign films she has."

Learning to speak French is something that hits close to home for Toussaint, whose parents moved to America from Dominica where her extended family still lives.

"My parents are from Dominica so they speak a kind of broken French," Toussaint said. "When they are speaking to each other or to our extended family, it would help to know French so I could figure out what they are saying. I am enjoying it because it is a cool language to know and you should always know another language."

Now that she is mastering the French language, Toussaint is hoping to put it to use this summer with a trip to Europe with teammates Lisa Jablonowski and Toi, who are both from

"Once the semester is over I am hoping to travel with Lisa and Amandine to Europe in May when they go back home," Toussaint said. "I would go with them and visit different countries. Mostly I want to go to France and see the culture is like there. Hopefully I would know enough of the French language by then that I could have conversations with people while I am there."

# Felicia Aiyeotan - Reaching Higher By Kristin Watkins

When you think of offseason workouts, perhaps getting in the gym and playing basketball comes to mind but that was the smallest part of sophomore center Felicia Aiyeotan's transformation this summer.

"This summer I did more conditioning, worked in the weight room and continued to eat right, and healthy," Aiyeotan said. "It was more of conditioning and the weight room with a little bit of basketball. We worked on my foot movement, trying to lift more weights to gain muscle. That helped with eating right because the more I eat right, the more muscle I'm going to gain. [Strength and conditioning] coach Morgan Foster did a great job of helping me with that."

Aiyeotan bought in to the work she needed to put in and made sure to make the most of her time, whether it was weightlifting or extra sessions with coaches.

"I got in the gym as much as I can," Aiyeotan said. "I certainly enjoyed being the weight room because there was a goal involved with it. I kept an open mind with it. I would go in excited each day thinking 'I am going to get stronger today!"

"I also worked with coach La Keshia Frett Meredith, coach [Tim] Taylor and a little bit with coach KG [Katherine Graham] doing different drills around the basket. Turning my back to the basket, moving my feet on defense to get the right angle to block the shot, just different things to help me. I think that is where your confidence grows because it is all how much work you put in and how hard you work. If you practice a shot behind-the-scenes, then when the lights come on you know that shot is going to go in because you practiced it so much."

There was one word in particular that comes from assistant coach La'Keshia Frett Meredith that has also helped push Aiyeotan to work harder.

"She has said a lot of things to me, but she would use the word 'soft' when I would block someone's shot," Aiyeotan said. "Her word is soft and I am trying my best to get out of that word and keep her from using it. She doesn't use it as often as she did my freshman year, but in some instances, like when I go for a rebound, she will still say 'that's soft.' So, I just try to be more aggressive and not make her use that word at all."

With all of the work put in, Aiyeotan saw the immediate payoff with 15 pounds of muscle gained entering the season. She can also tell a difference in her performance on the court, averaging 7.1 points per game and 7.7 rebounds per game.

"I definitely feel more confident, especially when I can see my numbers getting better," Aiyeotan said. "I could see how much muscle I gained over the course of the summer. I had to have more confidence because the goal was not to be pushed around during a game. When I was not getting pushed around as much at practice, it boosted my confidence knowing that I can stand my ground."

Now that UVA is in ACC action, head coach Joanne Boyled noted that Aiyeotan's presence in the post is even more important.

"I think that as games go on, she is getting more and more confident," Boyle said. "Because of that, we are seeing her more and we are demanding to see her more. She is just such a presence down low, whether she is scoring or not. She attracts so much defense and opens it up for other people. she works really hard and she is 6-foot-9 and draws a lot of attention. That alone is a reason to put her in the lineup. I think that the more minutes she has played, you can see her confidence. The more she is confident, the more the rest of the team is confident. She is a tough person to guard and there is nobody in the conference like her. I'm happy for her."

Now Aiyeotan is able to see what a difference she makes when on the floor for the Cavaliers and wants to be out there helping her teammates.

"What I try to do is see what I can bring to the team during a game, if it is defense, more rebounding, if it Is me communicating better and not letting my teammates get hit with a screen," Aiyeotan said. "Just being able to communicate and help my teammates out as much as I can. Having my presence on the court as much as I can and make sure I do my job is important for us, especially on defense because that is what I love the most. Being able to block shots and being able to help my teammates when they need it. Being a voice there for them as much as I can."

The progress that Aiyeotan has made in the gym as well as on the court is one she is proud of and wants to continue to work on moving forward.

"I feel like the more I get better, the higher the goals are going to be," Aiyeotan said. "Right now, I am taking little strides, but definitely want to be better and make more progress as time goes by."

There's a lot of preoccupation with times—constantly thinking about when you have to be where, when you have time to do what, etc. Things move quickly, and days blend together. But let me walk you through some of my favorite parts of being a student-athlete, some of my favorite moments from the day, and some of the things that make the student-athlete experience unique.

#### **Gym Time**

Today I scheduled an individual workout with a few of the coaches. There's been a lot of talk about respecting and protecting the time of the student-athletes and holding coaching staffs accountable for this. A good portion of this conversation revolves around "optional" activities—things that aren't necessarily accounted for in team schedules, but that players are expected to do. In essence, activities that are voluntary but also mandatory, and that, like anything else, account for time in our days.

For my part in this conversation, I'd say there is definitely an expectation for us players to get in the gym and get extra shots up. But this expectation isn't always coming from coaches. I think sometimes it comes from within the individual, from within the team, and is based on the culture we've created for ourselves. It's based on an understanding that if you're putting in work and getting better as an individual, then the team and program get better as a whole. Any successful program and/or athlete will stress how crucial extra time in the gym is. You simply cannot just rely on practice to give you the reps you need to stay sharp and consistent with your current skill set, and definitely not to grow and develop that skill set. And let me tell you, there's almost no better feeling than seeing your work pay dividends.

I cherish the extra time in the gym. It's where I go to think, to dream and work on my craft. I love looking at the mural of All-Americans behind the basket. That's my dream board. While I relish the extra time in the gym, it always helps to have people who make you want to get in the gym even more—people who make it fun, even when it's frustrating or exhausting. The coaches on our staff are those people. Each day I come into the gym, I can't help but think how fortunate I am to play for them and learn from them.

#### First Day Back

Today was the first day of classes. First days are always exciting and a little daunting when you realize you're going back to juggling school, basketball and life in general. But it's a time to make new friends, engage with new material, meet new professors and more. While it's common for me to wear sweats on any given day, I dress up on first days of school. For one, I believe you're never too old for first-day-of-school pictures. But more importantly, when I go into my classes, I don't want the first impression to be that I'm an athlete. I know some of the expectations that are associated with athletes, and I'm very conscious of changing those perceptions. I want my first impression to be as a student, and sooner or later, the cat will be out of the bag that I'm an athlete as well.



I'm looking forward to courses that force me to consider new concepts and ways of thinking. One of my professors today said something I thought was pretty remarkable: He was acknowledging the fact that it's a reading-intensive class and that he expects us to have fruitful discussions. Then he encouraged us, saying that while we should not be intimidated to participate, we should also not be vying to make the best comment. There's a culture of competition at UVA, and to combat this, the professor told us that learning is not a competition. It is, or should be, a collaborative effort. Because, after all, knowledge is not a scarce resource. That was reassuring to hear.

While I think I'll enjoy the content of my classes, I'm not too fond of how my schedule turned out. I have one class on Monday, Wednesday and Friday and three on Tuesday/ Thursday, from 9:30 to 2:00, straight through. I think people don't appreciate how challenging class scheduling can be for student-athletes. When you have to be done with classes by 2:00 virtually every day in order to block off time for practice, and then have to factor travel and competition days into your schedule, your course options are limited. And of course it doesn't help when several of the classes that you need or want to take coincide with one another. Next time you wonder why so many athletes end up in the same classes, there's your reason why.

### **Fueling the Machine**

I met with our nutritionist today and had BOD POD testing, which measures body composition and fat-to-muscle breakdown. We do the testing every six weeks to keep track of how our bodies are progressing and changing over the course of the season. It's a pretty drastic change. We're so fortunate to have great resources like sports nutrition at our disposal.

After the test we talked about how I'd been feeling physically and how I'd been fueling my body. I'm pretty intentional about the foods and fluids I put in my body; the problem for me is when I can eat. On days like tomorrow, when I get out of lift at 9:00 and have to rush to my 9:30 class, and then have class until 2:00, it's hard to get a meal in during the day.

I do always look forward to having dinner with my teammates in JPJ, however. It's ultra-convenient to go upstairs after practice and get a nice balanced meal. And meals are always better when shared with friends and family.

### **Getting Outside the Bubble**

In our hectic schedules, it's so important to find other things to get involved in that allow you to decompress. I enjoy mentoring and am a peer adviser for the Office of African-American Affairs and am a student-athlete mentor within the Athletics Department. This gives me an opportunity to meet people and make connections outside of my sport and beyond the athletics bubble.

This evening we had a Spring Kick-Off Event for student-athlete mentors where mentors like myself met with our first-year mentees and had a fun game night that included a round of musical chairs. It's funny to watch a group of athletes play games, because our competitive spirits definitely come out. There were a few broken chairs by the time a winner emerged. After going all day, this was a nice way to begin to unwind before having to start the grind all over the next day.



### Hoos Ecstatic to be Dancing Again By Jeff White (jwhite@virginia.edu)

CHARLOTTESVILLE --For the University of Virginia women's basketball team, the season started with a 15-point loss at Mississippi State.

More setbacks followed. Eight games into the season, UVA's record stood at 3-5. Ten games in, the Cavaliers were 4-6, a sobering start for a team with a stated goal of making the NCAA tournament.

Throughout that stretch of non-conference games, however, UVA's players continued to practice hard and remained confident they could turn their season around. And that they did, winning eight of their first nine ACC games.

"Never once did they ever hang their heads and say, 'This isn't going to happen,' "head coach Joanne Boyle recalled.

The Wahoos saw their perseverance rewarded Monday night. For the first time since 2010, UVA (18-13) is headed to the NCAA tournament.

Virginia, a No. 10 seed, will take on seventh-seeded California (21-10) at 5 p.m. Friday in Columbia, South Carolina. The winner will play No. 2 seed South Carolina (26-6) or 15th-seeded North Carolina A&T (23-8) on Sunday.

"I'm just really proud of the team for all the time and effort and belief in each other that they've put forth this year," said Boyle, who's in her seventh season at UVA.

The Cavaliers gathered Monday night at a local restaurant to watch the selection show on ESPN. Athletics director Carla Williams, who played in multiple NCAA tournaments as an undergraduate at Georgia, was there with her family, and the mood was festive.

A year ago, the 'Hoos experienced heartbreak on Selection Monday when they narrowly missed making the NCAAs. Bolstered by a formidable strength of schedule and a solid RPI, they were more confident heading into this year's selection

"We were told we had to improve our non-conference schedule," Boyle said. "So following suit with what the [NCAA selection] committee suggested we do, I felt like we did a really good job at that.'

The Cavaliers did not have to wait long for good news Monday night. The show started at 7 o'clock. At 7:07, ESPN unveiled the UVA-Cal matchup, and the celebration began. The players, who were sitting together at a table, leaped to their feet and screamed with joy, then shared embraces with Boyle and assistant coaches Tim Taylor, La'Keshia Frett Meredith and Katherine Graham.

Later during the show, Ron Sanchez, associate head coach

of the UVA men's team, stopped by to offer congratulations. "Last year we were heartbroken," said guard Aliyah Huland El, the Cavaliers' second-leading scorer. "We were absolutely expecting to have our name called, and I think we used that as motivation in the offseason and preseason and [in the WNIT] last year as well.

"This year it came to fruition. We worked for it, we deserved it, and we're so excited to be dancing this year.

Huland El is one of four seniors on the roster, along with guard J'Kyra Brown and forwards Lauren Moses and Jae'Lisa Allen.

"I don't know even if there's words to describe the feeling I felt," Moses said, "for not only me, being a fourth-year, but for this entire team.

Huland El said: "The fourth-years on this team have been working for this for four years now. We came in wanting to change the program, and time and time again we've been so disappointed, and this year it came to fruition."

This marks the first time since 2001 that UVA will be represented in both the men's and women's NCAA tournaments. The men's head coach, Tony Bennett, was at the Boar's Head Resort for his weekly radio show when he learned the women had been selected.

"Congrats to them," Bennett said. "They should have been in last year.'

Moments after the UVA-Cal game was announced, Boyle received a text from Lindsay Gottlieb.

They love these storylines, right?" Gottlieb wrote.

After Boyle left for UVA in 2011, Gottlieb took over as the Golden Bears' head coach. She'd previously been an assistant under Boyle at Richmond and Cal.

"She's one of my best friends," Boyle said.

If the Cavaliers win Friday, ESPN figures to have more fun in the second round. Defending NCAA champion South Carolina's head coach is Dawn Staley, the greatest player in the history of UVA women's basketball.

'Zero storylines," Boyle said, tongue in cheek.

During the regular season, Virginia faced three of the teams that were awarded No. 1 seeds in the NCAA tournament: Mississippi State, Notre Dame (twice) and Louisville (twice). Boyle hopes those experiences will help prepare the Cavaliers for what awaits them in the postseason.

Boyle said she wants her players to "go in with confidence and knowing that they have a good body of work, and they've been one of the best defensive teams in this conference.

After taking a couple of days off early last week, the 'Hoos reconvened Thursday to resume preparations at JPJ.

"It was our goal to get to the tournament last year," Huland El said. "But this year our goal was to get to the tournament and win a few games. We want to make a statement, to show that we're here and we're here to stay.'

Moses echoed her friend's comments.

"I came in here with a mission to turn this program around and to get this my senior year is just an amazing feeling," Moses said, "but I know we're not done here and that we have a long road to go. We're just going to take it day by day, one practice at a time, one game at a time.'

The Cavaliers have made four WNIT appearances under Boyle, who as a head coach has been to the NCAA tournament five times: once with Richmond and four times with Cal.

She's thrilled to be back in the NCAAs, Boyle said Monday night, but it's "not about me. It's about the team and the hard work that they're putting in ... The goal in this program has been: Let's get this program back to where it used to be. And I know it's not there yet, but [an important step is] being able to lay that foundation and getting it into the tournament and knowing what that feels like, and then being able to build off

"I'm just so happy for this team that has worked so hard and committed to putting the team first before any individual goals, and just working hard to dream big and understand that they know that they came here for a reason.

'Ît's a great academic school, but we wanted to make some noise in the basketball world as well."
