The Virginia women's basketball team (17-15, 6-10 ACC) takes on Rutgers (19-14, 8-10 Big Ten) in the second round of the Women's National Invitation Tournament on Sunday, March 20 at 2 p.m. in Piscattaway, N.J.

The winner of this game will advance to play the winner of Hofstra and Villanova with date and location to be determined later.

Both Rutgers and Virginia are coming off two-point wins in the first round in games that were decided in the final two seconds. Rutgers Kahleah Copper scored the game-winning basket in the final two seconds against Georgetown. Cooper ended the game with 21 points and nine rebounds.

For the Cavaliers, senior Faith Randolph (Derwood, Md.) grabbed a steal with 28 seconds remaining in a tie game at VCU. Randolph drove towards the hoop and was fouled with 1.8 seconds remaining, making both free throws to give the Cavaliers a 52-50 victory. Randolph finished with 21 points, five rebounds, three assists and two steals. It was her second 20-point game of the season and moved her into 20th place on the Cavalier career point list with 1,310 .

The Rutgers/Georgetown game had 12 ties and seven lead changes while the Cavaliers and Rams had four ties and 10 lead changes.

Rutgers, the 2014 WNIT Champions, are now 7-O in WNIT games. Virginia is 11-5 with their top finish being four trips to the quarterfinals (2006, 2007, 2011, 2012). Virginia head coach Joanne Boyle won the WNIT championship in 2010 as the head coach at Cal.

Sunday will mark the second meeting between the Scarlet Knights and Cavaliers this season. RU defeated Virginia, 60-48, during its run to the 2015 Paradise Jam title. Sophomore Lauren Moses, who would later be named to the Paradise Jam All-Tournament Team, scored 18 points with seven rebounds.

## HOOS HOT

- Faith Randolph has scored in double figures in each of the last six games, including a 21-point performance at VCU, her secondhighest scoring game of the season
- Randolph went 1-of-2 from three-point range at Virginia Tech, ending an 0-of-9 stretch since her return from injury (Feb. 14). She was 3-of-6 at VCU
- Randolph is 19-of-21 from the free throw line since returning, including going 4-of-4 against VCU
- Aliyah Huland El scored a team-high 16 points in the ACC Tournament game against Duke, the sixth time this season she has led the team in scoring and the first time since scoring 13 points against Richmond
- Huland El was in the starting lineup against the Blue Devils and at VCU, her seventh and eighth starts of the season and first since Jan. 27 at NC State
- Huland El is averaging 12.0 points per game in the last two contests
- J'Kyra Brown is averaging 7.5 points in the last two games
- Brown matched her season-high by playing 30 minutes at VCU, making her fourth start of the season
- Debra Ferguson played a season-high 13 minutes and scored a season-high six points against VCU


## VIRGINIA VS RUTGERS

- RU is led by Second Team All-Big Ten honorees Kahleah Copper and Tyler Scaife. Scaife, who used a coast-to-coast layup to help the Scarlet Knights to the 2014 WNIT title in a 56-54 victory over UTEP, leads Rutgers at 17.6 points per game. Copper, the 2014 WNIT MVP, is adding in 17.5 points per game along with a team-leading 8.0 rebounds per game.
- Rutgers also features Honorable Mention All-Big Ten and Big Ten All-Defensive Team honoree Rachel Hollivay. Hollivay is averaging 7.3 points per game and is the Scarlet Knights' all-time leading shot blocker.
- In the last five contests, Rutgers has averaged 33.2 points in the paint.
- In the Paradise Jam game this season, the Cavaliers trailed by just two points, 29-27, at the half, and tied the game 33-33 on a three-pointer with 6:34 remaining in the third quarter, but made just 5-of-26 shots in the remainder of the game (19.2 percent) to fall to the Scarlet Knights.
- Virginia got back to within two, 42-40, after redshirt sophomore J'Kyra Brown started the fourth quarter making three (of four) free throws, but Rutgers went on an 11-2 run, with a hardfought Moses layup the only score for the Cavaliers in that threeminute span, to take control of the game.
- Rutgers shot 53.7 percent (22-of-41) while the Cavaliers finished at 28.8 percent (17-of-59). The Cavaliers were 10-of-18 (55.6 percent) from the stripe against RU. The Cavaliers forced 19 Scarlet Knight turnovers, scoring 19 points off the miscues. Rutgers held a 38-28 rebounding edge.


## WNIT

- This is Virginia's sixth trip to the WNIT in the tournament's 19-year history
- Joanne Boyle's California team won the 2010 WNIT title with a victory over Miami in Berkeley. In addition to Boyle, Virginia's assistant AD for basketball administration Sarah Holsinger, video coordinator James Rogol, graduate assistant Griffin Springfield and media relations director Melissa Dudek were also part of the Cal championship team's administrative staff
- Virginia has made four trips to the quarterfinals (2006, 2007, 2011, 2012)
- Last season, UVA fell in the first round with a 59-52 loss at Old Dominion
- Breyana Mason scored 17 points with six assists in the loss to ODU
- This will be the second-ever postseason game in the career of senior Faith Randolph. Her freshman season, UVA turned down a WNIT bid because of a roster decimated by injuries. Two years ago, the Cavaliers had a losing record and did not qualify


## GATORADE HIGH SCHOOL STATE PLAYERS OF THE YEAR

- Two of UVA's incoming recruits earned Gatorade State Player of the Year honors last week
- Guard Jocelyn Willoughby out of Newark Academy was named the New Jersey Gatorade Player of the Year. She led the Minutemen to a 20-6 record and the Non-Public B North quarterfinals this past season. Willoughby averaged 21.9 points, 12.8 rebounds, 3.9 blocks, 3.8 assists and 3.1 steals per game. She is a two-time First Team All-State and All-County selection.
- Guard Dominique Toussaint out of Christ the King was named the New York Gatorade Player of the Year. Toussaint led the Royals to an 18-8 record and a berth in the semifinals of the state Class AA Catholic high school championships, scheduled for March 11. Toussaint is averaging 19.7 points, 6.8 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 2.7 steals per game.
- Toussaint was also named Miss New York Basketball


## MIKAYLA VENSON

- Virginia women's basketball head coach Joanne Boyle announced on Tuesday (March 15) that sophomore guard Mikayla Venson (Arlington, Va.) has left the program. Venson's departure from the team is immediate and she will not compete with the team in the Women's National Invitation Tournament. UVA opens the WNIT at VCU on Thursday (March 17).


## FREE THROWS

- Virginia leads the ACC in free throw shooting efficiency at 75.2 percent, which ranks 27 th in the nation
- Virginia has shot 80.0 percent or better in nine of the last 11 games including going 7 -of- 8 at Louisville and 15-of-16 against North Carolina, but 3-of-10 (30.0 percent) in the ACC Tournament game against Duke, UVA's lowest percentage in a game since going 3-of-12 (25.0 percent) in a game against South Dakota State at the Junkanoo Jam in the Bahamas on Nov. 24, 2006
- The Cavaliers only had two free throw attempts at Duke, matching the fewest attempts by an ACC team in a game this year (they made both)

## REBOUNDING MARGIN

- Virginia is second-to-last in the ACC in rebounding margin (-2.5) and was last in rebounding margin in conference games (-7.2)
- The Cavaliers have been outrebounded by double digits in six of the last 11 games and have only two conference games in which they outrebounded their opponent


## ACC TOURNAMENT

- Virginia earned a first-round bye and were the No. 9 seed, falling to eight-seed Duke, 57-53, in the second round
- The Cavaliers are 0-3 in ACC Tournament second round games and have fallen in the second round in each of the last three years
- Joanne Boyle is now 0-6 against her alma mater
- Faith Randolph and Aliyah Huland El combined to score UVA's first 15 points, with Randolph scoring seven and Huland El eight, staking the Cavaliers to a 15-8 lead in the first five minutes of the game
- Virginia's largest lead was a 9-point advantage with 2:21 remaining in the first quarter
- Duke had a 7-0 run at the end of the first quarter; the Blue Devils also scored seven-straight in the second quarter.
- In the third quarter, Virginia hit one field goal in the final 6:09 of the period, with Moses hitting a jumper with six seconds remaining. The Cavaliers were 2 -of-15 shooting in the final nine minutes of the period, including missing nine-straight shot attempts
- Virginia had three players finish in double figures, with Aliyah Huland El scoring 16 points with a team-high 6 rebounds, and Faith Randolph and Lauren Moses each contributing 11
- Moses was 5 -of-7 shooting but 1-of-6 from the free throw line
- The Cavaliers, who lead the ACC and are 15th in the nation in free throw shooting percentage, were 3 -of-10 from the freethrow line, their lowest percentage in a game since going 3-of-12 (25.0 percent) in a game against South Dakota State at the Junkanoo Jam in the Bahamas on Nov. 24, 2006


## RALLY TIME

- Virginia erased a 14-point deficit to comeback to win against Green Bay in the opener of the Paradise Jam
- In the final game of the Paradise Jam, Virginia twice erased doubledigit deficits against Tulane, 11 points in the first quarter and 10 points in the third, but ultimately fell 67-62
- After trailing by 14 points at halftime at Ohio State, 43-29, UVA pulled to within three, 59-56, with 1:56 remaining in the third quarter but ultimately fell 93-73
- Virginia trailed by seven points, 49-42, at Wake Forest, tying the game with 44 seconds remaining and taking the lead with 16 second left
- UVA trailed by 14 points, 30-16, with 2:08 remaining in the first half, but trailed by one, 39-38, at the end of the third quarter. After Pitt built back up a 12 -point lead, $52-40$, with $3: 46$ remaining in the game, Virginia again got to within one point, 54-53, with 30 seconds remaining, but could not complete the comeback.
- At VCU in the WNIT first round, Virginia trailed by 11 points, 47-36, with 7:32 remaining in the game. A three-pointer from J'Kyra Brown with $1: 48$ remaining tied up the game at $48-48$. The Cavaliers outscored the Rams 18-7 in the fourth quarter.


## WINS AT BC AND VS CLEMSON

- Faith Randolph returned earlier than expected after breaking her thumb in the Notre Dame game. Randolph returned in the road game at BC which the Cavaliers won, 61-50, snapping a sixgame losing streak
- Mikayla Venson posted a game-high 19 points including three-of-four shooting from three-point range. Lauren Moses recorded an impressive double-double, scoring 11 points to go along with a career-high 15 rebounds.
- Virginia entered the final quarter with an 18-point lead (50-32) but the Eagles scored 11 unanswered points to close within 50-43 before Huland El converted a basket with 5:19 remaining to play. A three-point basket by BC's Kelly Hughes cut UVA's lead to six points but the Eagles could never get closer as Venson responded with her own long-range jumper to put the Cavaliers ahead 52-43.
- Virginia defeated Clemson 65-48 to win two of Randolph's first three games back.
- Randolph had the first double-double of her career with 13 points and 13 rebounds
- Clemson tied the game, 33-33, with 5:46 remaining in the third quarter, but the Cavaliers answered with a 32-8 run to put the game out of reach.


## FIRST COMMONWEALTH CLASH

- The Cavaliers had won 18 -straight match-ups against the Hokies before falling 66-46 on Feb. 7. Virginia Tech's last victory in the series had been Jan. 22, 2007
- The Cavaliers trailed by three points after the first quarter and ended the first half on a 6-0 run to trail by just two, 28-26, at the break, but the Hokies built up a double-digit lead in the third quarter and put the game away by outscoring the Cavaliers 21-8 in the final period.
- Virginia shot just 28.6 percent overall, going 16-of-56, including making just one three-pointer on 12 attempts. The Hokies connected on 42.6 percent of their shots (20-of-47). Virginia Tech also held a 42-29 advantage in rebounding.


## RALLY IN RALEIGH COMES UP SHORT

- After trailing by 14 points in the third quarter, the Cavaliers rallied in the fourth quarter, starting the period on an 8-0 run and pulling to within three, 50-47, with five minutes remaining, but a late 9-O run by the Wolfpack put an end to UVA's comeback bid - Virginia shot 37.7 percent (20-of-53) while NC State went 23-of-55 ( 41.8 percent). The Wolfpack held a 34-31 edge in rebounding. The Cavaliers committed 17 turnovers while NC State had 11


## LOSS AT FSU

- UVA fell 70-48 at No. 14 Florida State
- The Seminoles scored 50 of their 70 point in the paint, while UVA managed just 18 points down low
- Virginia committed 22 turnovers to FSU's 12 (-10)
- The Seminoles outrebound the Cavaliers 42-26 (-16)
- Breyana Mason scored a team-high 15 points, her first time leading the team in scoring this season
- Shakayla Thomas came off the bench to score 20 points in 16 minutes for FSU on 10-of-13 shooting

## 41 POINTS VS. LOUISVILLE

- UVA's 59-41 loss to No. 23 Louisville was the Cavaliers' lowest-scoring game since a 62-41 loss at Duke in 2013 and only the third time since the start of the 1978-79 season that a Cavalier team scored 41 or fewer points in a game.
- In the three-game span including Notre Dame, Wake Forest and Louisville, Virginia averaged 46.3 points per game with 15 made field goals per game, shooting 30.8.
- A 21-3 second-quarter run helped Louisville, which led the entire game, take a 33-18 lead into the halftime break. The Cardinals scored 25 points off 19 Virginia turnovers while the Cavaliers scored seven points off 13 Louisville miscues.
- Virginia only had four assists in the game with Mikayla Venson accounting for all four
- Louisville outrebounded the Cavaliers 34-29


## COLD SHOOTING AGAINST NOTRE DAME

- The Cavaliers made just eight baskets in each half, shooting 29.6 percent (16-of-54) against Notre Dame
- Faith Randolph and Lauren Moses combined to go 4-of-23
(17.3 percent)
- Notre Dame dominated on second-chance points (18-2)
- Mikayla Venson was 4-of-8 from three while the rest of the team went 1-of-7


## ACC CO-PLAYER OF THE WEEK (DEC. 28)

- Faith Randolph was named Atlantic Coast Conference Women's Basketball Co-Player of the Week with Notre Dame's Lindsay Allen.
- Virginia's Randolph matched her career high with 26 points at No. 9/10 Ohio State. The senior from Derwood, Maryland, started a furious UVA third-quarter comeback, hitting three early 3 -pointers as part of a 14-point quarter that turned a 14-point halftime deficit into a three-point game with 1:56 remaining in the third quarter. Randolph shot 50-percent from the field, which included a 66.7 clip from long range.
- This was the second ACC weekly honor of Randolph's career and first for a UVA player this season.


## ACC OPENER AGAINST MIAMI

- Virginia upset No. 22 Miami, its first win over a ranked team this season and the 55th time in program history that the Cavaliers have defeated a higher-ranked team and the 24th time that an unranked UVA squad has defeated a ranked opponent
- Leading by one after the first quarter, Virginia shot 63.2 percent (12-of-19) in the second in outscoring Miami 28-9 and followed that up by outscoring the Hurricanes 23-12 in the third when the Cavaliers had their largest lead of 33 points. Miami scored 24 points in the fourth period to narrow the deficit, but the Cavaliers still managed to open the conference season with a 20-point victory over a ranked opponent.
- Miami committed 28 turnovers with UVA scoring 26 points off
- The Cavaliers were 6-of-9 (66.7 percent) from three-point range, with Aliyah Huland El going 3-of-3 from beyond the arc.
- Faith Randolph was one of five Cavaliers to finish the game in double figures, scoring 16 points while also contributing eight assists, four steals and four rebounds.

- Mikayla Venson averaged 17.9 points per game in the seven games in the month moving into the top-10 in scoring in the conference for the first time in her career (currently 9th)
- Venson is 20-of-22 (90.9 percent) from the free throw line and 19-of-43 (45.3 percent) from three [43-95]
- Venson has 43 field goals and 24 assists
- Faith Randolph averaged 14.4 points per game and 4.0 rpg
- Randolph has 26 assists (3.7 per game) and a
2.1 assist-to-turnover ratio
- Lauren Moses averaged 11.7 points and 9.0 rpg (33 O-boards, 30 defensive)
- Moses moved into the top-10 in the ACC in rebounding (currently T-6th)
- Aliyah Huland El averaged 11.6 points in 21.0 minutes per game


## CAVALIER CLASSIC

- Virginia went 2-O in their home tournament, downing Coppin State 75-40 and Richmond 71-51 - Virginia was +15 rebounding in the tournament and +5 on the turnover margin
- Lauren Moses was named the tournament MVP. Moses scored a combined 30 points with 19 rebounds
- Against Coppin State, Moses started the game making her first seven field goal attempts, finishing the game 7 -of- 8 shooting with 17 points and five rebounds.
- Against Richmond, Moses logged her third double-double of the season, scoring 13 points with a career-high 14 rebounds. She grabbed eight of those rebounds in the first 8:03 of the year
- Mikayla Venson was named to the All-Tournament Team, averaging 13.5 points per game. Venson scored 16 points with four assists, three rebounds and a steal in the opener against Coppin State
- Faith Randolph scored a combined 20 points in the two games, but tallied 11 assists, nine rebounds and three steals


## AT OHIO STATE

- After trailing by 14 points at halftime at Ohio State, 43-29, UVA pulled to within three, 59-56, with 1:56 remaining in the third quarter but ultimately fell 93-73
- Mikayla Venson scored 24 points, going 4-of-5 from three-point range. Venson scored 10 points in the fourth quarter.
- Faith Randolph matched her career high with 26 points, going 4-of-6 from three-point range. Randolph scored 14 points in the third quarter, hitting all four of her threes in the period
- Ohio State outscored Virginia 54-18 in the paint

## ASSISTS VS CHARLESTON SOUTHERN

- Faith Randolph dished eight assists against Charleston Southern, matching her career high as she also dished eight assists last season in the upsetwin over No. 8 Louisville (3/1/15)
- Mikayla Venson also matched her career high with six assists against CSU
- Randolph and Venson combined for 14 of UVA's season-high 20 assists in the game
- It was the first time since the Delaware State game last season (12/6/15) that the Cavaliers had 20 or more assists in a game


## CAREER HIGHS

- The Virginia sophomores had a span of fourstraight games in which they posted career-high points
- Aliyah Huland El had her first career 20-point game at Auburn (11/19), matching that career-best in the next game against Longwood (11/22)
- Mikayla Venson scored a career-high 25 points against Green Bay in the Paradise Jam (11/26)
- Lauren Moses scored a career-high 18 points the next night against Rutgers (11/27)
- Venson topped her 25-point performance by scoring 28 points against lowa (12/O2), scoring 15 of those points in the fourth quarter


## FIELD TRIP DAY

- The Cavaliers had their third highest home attendance in program history with 10,048 at the Bowling Green game
- There were over 6,300 students from kindergarten through eighth grade in attendance at the game from 40 different middle and elementary schools


## UVA DEFENSE VS BOWLING GREEN

- Virginia's 68-39 victory over Bowling Green was the first time since Dec. 28, 2012 that the Cavaliers held an opponent to under 40 points
- It was the fourth time in the Joanne Boyle era that the opponent made a dozen or fewer field goals (the Falcons were 12-of-44)
- The Cavaliers forced a season-high 24 turnovers, including three 10 -second violations and two charges - 11 of the 12 Falcons committed at least one turnover and every player who was on the court for more than three minutes had at least one turnover
- Virginia was +15 in rebounding, their secondhighest rebounding differential of the season and the second-straight game of having a double-digit edge in rebounds


## BIG TEN/ACC CHALLENGE

- The Cavaliers have a $5-4$ record all-time in the Challenge after falling 85-73 to lowa this year
- The Hawkeyes broke open a tight game in the third quarter, outscoring the Cavaliers 23-10 in the period, taking a 20-point lead at the start of the fourth quarter. The Cavaliers mounted a 9-2 run midway through the fourth quarter, narrowing the gap to 11, 71-60, with 4:41 remaining, but lowa scored fivestraight points to take back control of the game and hand Virginia its third-straight loss
- Mikayla Venson had her second 20-point game of the season, finishing with a career-high 28 points, including scoring 15 points in the fourth quarter.
- Faith Randolph finished the game with 12 points, going 6-of-11 from the field.
- Both teams had hot-shooting performances with the Hawkeyes shooting 52.7 percent (29-of-55) and the Cavaliers 50 percent ( 29 -of-58). Iowa made 10 three-pointers, going 10-of-24 from long range. Venson and Breyana Mason combined to make six threes for the Cavaliers.
- The ACC won five games on Day II of the Challenge to rally for the second-straight tie. The ACC has never lost the Challenge


## PARADISE JAM

- Virginia went 1-2 in the tournament in the Virgin Islands, tying for second place
- The Cavaliers won the opener against Green Bay, 68-59
- Virginia trailed by as many as 14 points in the game and was down 35-22 with 1:35 remaining in the first half, but a 25 -point performance from Mikayla Venson and a huge third-quarter in which UVA outscored Green Bay 22-7 helped the Cavaliers open the tournament with a victory.
- Virginia fell 60-48 to Rutgers, the tournament champions
- The Cavaliers trailed by just two points, 29-27, at the half, and tied the game 33-33 on a three-pointer from Mikayla Venson with 6:34 remaining in the third quarter, but made just 5-of-26 shots in the remainder of the game (19.2 percent) to fall to the Scarlet Knights.
- Virginia dropped the final game to Tulane, 67-62
- For the second time in the tournament, the Cavaliers rallied to erase a double-digit deficit, trailing by as many as 11 points in the game and by 10, 40-30, with 4:35 remaining in the fourth quarter. Virginia closed out the third quarter on a 15-2 run, taking a 45-42 lead into the fourth. Tulane retook the lead, 50-47, on a three-pointer with 7:03 remaining in the game and never trailed again. The Green Wave outscored the Cavaliers 25-17 in the final period, making six of their final eight field goal attempts to close out their victory.
- Faith Randolph scored 19 points. Aliyah Huland El just missed her first career double-double with nine points and 10 rebounds


## RUNS AGAINST LONGWOOD

- The Cavaliers used a 9-0 run in the first quarter, a 16-0 run in the second quarter and a 14-0 thirdquarter run to down the Lancers and improve to 4-0 on the season.
- Longwood only scored four points in the third quarter


## ROAD WIN VS THE SEC

- A big first-quarter by Mikayla Venson and a career-high 20 points from Aliyah Huland El helped the Cavaliers earn a 69-52 road victory at Auburn.
- Randolph finished the game with 15 points, with eight of those coming in the first quarter. Venson scored 14 points, including 10 in the second quarter. Huland El came off the bench to make 6-of-15 attempts from the field and 7-of-8 from the free throw line to tally her career-high 20 points
- The Tigers had a 43-39 edge in rebounding. Virginia shot 44.8 percent in the first half (13-of-29) but only made 9-of-34 (26.5 percent) in the final two quarters to shoot 34.9 percent for the game. Auburn shot 34.4 percent.


## BALANCED SCORING IN THE FIRST TWO GAMES

- Virginia has had a very balanced approach to both scoring and rebounding in the first two games
- Six Cavaliers averaged 10 or more points a game in first two contests
- In the 86-50 victory over Norfolk State, seven Cavaliers finished the game in double-digits, the first time in program history that seven players reached that benchmark in a single game
- In the opening 70-66 win at Middle Tennessee, five Cavaliers finished in double figures, a feat that the team accomplished just three times last season.
- The Virginia bench is averaged 32.5 points per game. Last year, the non-starters contributed 11.1 points per game


## SIGNING DAY

- Head coach Joanne Boyle signed two five-star recruits and added a third with high-level international experience
- Jocelyn Willoughby is ranked the No. 8 wing in her class and No. 47 player overall by ESPN-W and No. 5 at her position and No. 28 overall by Prospects Nation. Willoughby is a standout at Newark Academy. She became the first player at her school to score 1,000 career points, doing so in her sophomore season. As a freshman and sophomore, she helped lead Newark to two-straight seasons with 21-or-more wins and back-to-back Prep B girls' basketball state titles.
- Dominique Toussaint, a 5-9 guard from Staten Island, N.Y., averaged 21.5 points, 6.4 rebounds and 3.2 assists per game as a junior. She was named the 2015 Queens Player of the Year, CHSAA Sportsmanship Player of the Year and earned First Team honors after helping lead Christ the King to the CHSAA Class AA State Semi-Final as a junior. Toussaint also earned Tri-State Second Team and NYS All-Tournament Team honors as she was a member of the team that won the NYC High School Championship and finished second in the New York State Federation Champion in 2014-15. She is ESPN-W's No. 48 overall recruit and No. 12 at her position and ranked at No. 25 by Prospect Nation in the 2016 class.
- Lisa Jablonowski, a 6-3 forward from Luxembourg, brings international experience as she has competed in 46 games in international tournaments. In 2015, Jablonowski averaged 14.6 points per game, 8.6 rebounds per game and 3.4 assists per game in the U18 European Championship. She received the Best Sportswoman, the most prestigious award in Luxembourg, for her performance in the 2014-15 season. A three-time MVP of the U16 and U18 divisions, she helped her team win the Luxembourg Cup in 2014 and guided them to second place finishes in the U14, U16 and U18 championships.


## PRESEASON ALL-ACC

- Senior guard Faith Randolph was named to the 10-player Blue Ribbon Panel and the ACC Head Coaches' Preseason All-ACC Teams.
- Randolph ranked sixth in the conference in scoring at 16.4 points per game. Randolph tallied 11 20-point games last season en route to scoring her 1,000th career point during the 2015 ACC Tournament.
- Randolph was first on the team in steals ( 1.4 per game), third in rebounds (3.9), and third in assists (2.2). Among ACC players, she ranked first in freethrow percentage (90.7).
- Randolph was the 2014 ACC Sixth Player of the Year and a 2015 All-ACC Second Team honoree.
- Ataira Franklin was the last Cavalier to earn conference preseason accolades, earning them both her junior and senior seasons (2012 and 2013).


## CAVALIERS EIGHTH IN ACC PRESEASON POLL

- For the second time in the last three seasons, Virginia was picked to finish eighth in the preseason ACC polls.
- Last season, Virginia was tabbed to finish 10th in prognostications, going on to finish ninth with eight ACC teams making the NCAA Tournament. Virginia earned the conference's automatic qualifier into the WNIT.
- Six of the Cavaliers' top seven scorers from last season are back: Faith Randolph ( 16.4 ppg ) Mikayla Venson ( 11.9 ppg ), Breyana Mason ( 9.5 ppg ), Lauren Moses ( 6.1 ppg ), Aliyah Huland El ( 5.6 ppg ) and Sydney Umeri ( 2.7 ppg ).


## SUMMER PLAYING TIME

- In June, senior guard Faith Randolph traveled to Giżycko, Poland, playing point guard for an Athletes in Action team.
- The United States' contingent stayed at Poland's Olympic Training Center, taking on teams from Poland, Latvia and France.
