## LEADING OFF

- Virginia needs a victory or a Virginia Tech loss or a Pittsburgh win to clinch a berth into the 2018 ACC Championship in Durham.
- Wake Forest and Virginia will square off for the first time since 2016 and the first time since 2014 in Winston-Salem.
- The Cavaliers will go for their fifth ACC series victory of the season with series wins over Boston College, Virginia Tech, Louisville and Georgia Tech in 2018.
- The road game on Thursday night will be the first for Virginia since a 2-1 win at Louisville on April 22.
- Including all three games at Wake Forest, Virginia will conclude the regular season with five games in six days.
- Wake Forest owns an 88-80 advantage in an all-time series that was first played in 1894. Under Brian O'Connor, 21-11 against the Demon Deacons.

## STARTING PITCHERS RULE THE WEEKEND

- Strong performances on the mound by Derek Casey on Friday night and Daniel Lynch on Monday night helped clinch Virginia's fourth ACC series victory of the season.
- Lynch fanned a career-high 13 batters in Monday night's series clincher. It marked the fifth time this season he's posted a double-digit strikeout total this season.
- Casey put forth his eighth quality start of the season in the series opener and was aided by a six-run fifth inning by the Cavalier offense.
- Georgia Tech's Connor Thomas limited Virginia to an unearned run in the middle game as he tossed his third complete game of the season.

## CAVALIER OFFENSE

- Virginia posted a six-run fifth inning in the series opener against Georgia Tech, the seventh time the Cavaliers have scored five or more runs in an inning.
- After matching a season-high in ACC play with 13 hits on Friday, Virginia racked up 14 in Monday night's finale.
- Of the 297 NCAA Division I teams, only Arkansas Pine-Bluff has struck out fewer times (271) than Virginia. Both the Cavaliers and Charlotte are tied for the second fewest team strikeouts with 272.

## ON THE MOUND

- Virginia comes into the weekend averaging 10.5 strikeouts per nine innings, the second highest total in the country.
  - Three of the team's seven shutouts have come in ACC play. The staff's seven shutouts are tied for the fourth most in the country. Only nine teams in the nation have seven or more shutouts in 2018.
  - Thursday's starter Derek Casey has produced a team-best eight quality starts and has pitched into the seventh inning in eight of his last nine starts.
  - Daniel Lynch is two strikeouts shy of reaching 100 for the season. His 98 Ks are the fourth most in the league. Teammate Derek Casey's 93 strikeouts are the sixth most in the league.
  - The last Virginia pitcher to record 100 strikeouts in a season was Connor Jones in 2015 with 113. The Cavaliers haven't had a pitching duo each strike out 100 batters since Danny Hultzen (165) and Tyler Wilson (124) in 2011.
  - As a pitching staff, Virginia owns a 2.83 strikeout to walk ratio, the second best in the ACC to Georgia Tech and 16th best in the country.
  - The relief combination of Bennett Sousa and Andrew Abbott have combined for eight wins and 11 saves. Seven of the 11 saves have been multi-inning saves.
  - Virginia starting pitchers have produced 19 quality starts (6 IP, 3 ER or less) this season, 13 have occurred in the 27 ACC games this season.
- ### PLAYER NOTES/TRENDS
- Andy Weber comes into the weekend ranked third in the league in batting average (.347), second in doubles (17) and eighth in RBI (45). In league play, he boasts the ACC's second highest average (.346) and 27 of his 44 RBI have come against conference opponents. He has been hitless in only eight games this season.
  - In the Georgia Tech series, freshman Tanner Morris went 6-for-11 (.545) with two runs scored and two RBIs. He has hit safely in his last four games, including his second four-hit effort of the season last Friday against Georgia Tech.
  - In his last five games, Alex Tappen is 8-for-18 (.444) with three doubles a triple and a home run. He was a double short of the cycle in Monday night's series finale against Georgia Tech. He plated the first run of Tuesday's midweek game against Richmond with the first of his two doubles on the night. He owns a team-best, six-game hit streak.
  - Justin Novak broke up Connor Thomas' no hitter in the fifth inning of the middle game against Georgia Tech. He finished with two, multi-hit efforts in the series and has hit safely in five-straight games where he's 7-for-17.
  - After missing the previous 37 games due to injury, junior Jake McCarthy returned to the lineup on Monday night and went 2-for-3 with an RBI. He's collected three RBIs in his first two game back.
  - Junior Nate Eikhoff is one of three Cavaliers this season to start all 49 games this season. He went 6-for-12 with two runs scored in three games vs. Georgia Tech.
- ### CLOSE CALLS
- 38.8% (19 of 49) of Virginia's games have been decided by one run, the highest percentage in the country.
  - Virginia played six-straight one run game for the first time in program history to close out the month of April, a span of 130 years and 4,112 games.
  - There have been four separate occasions in which the Cavaliers have played five-straight one-run games (1986, 1978, 1949 & 1906).
  - Virginia has played 19, one-run games this season and own a 10-9 mark.

- The 2-1 series-clinching win over Louisville on 4/22 was the 12th come-from-behind win of 2018 for the Cavaliers.
- The late inning rally was the second time Virginia has mounted a comeback in the eighth inning or later to clinch a series. The Cavaliers scored four runs over its final two turns at the plate to defeat rival Virginia Tech on April 8 and scored two in the ninth to defeat Louisville the ensuing Sunday.
- Brendan Rivoli has been in the thick of three, late game rallies. He tied the game against Virginia Tech with a triple in the bottom of the ninth of an eventual 6-5 walk-off win, delivered a walk-off double down the right field line to top George Washington in the 12th inning on April 17 and put Virginia ahead 2-1 with a run-scoring single in the top of the ninth against Louisville.

### HOF COMPANY

- Daniel Lynch struck out 10 or more batters in four-straight starts from 3/17-4/6, including a career-best 12-strikeout performance at Pitt on March 31. The only other pitcher in Virginia history to go four-straight games with 10+ strikeouts is UVA baseball Hall of Famer, Danny Hultzen. He struck out 10 or more in his first five starts of the 2011 season. Derek Casey struck out a career-high 12 batters in back-to-back starts, the first Cavalier pitcher to record 12 or more strikeouts in consecutive starts since UVA Baseball Hall of Famer Danny Hultzen in 2011.

### ACC PITCHER OF THE WEEK

• Derek Casey was named the ACC co-Pitcher of the Week on Monday (April 9) after tossing a complete game shutout against Virginia Tech last Friday (April 6.) He is the first Cavalier to be recognized by the league this season and the first Virginia pitcher to take home the award since Connor Jones did it twice in 2016.

• Casey did not walk a batter and only one Hokie baserunner reached second base. The right-hander fanned seven, upping his season total to 70.

• The nine-inning shutout was the first by a Virginia pitcher since Jones blanked Shotton College on April 8, 2016.

### SEASON STREAKS

• Nate Eikhoff had his hit streak of 16 games snapped on 3/24 at Miami. He is one of nine players since 2001 to have put together hit streaks of 16 or more. Eikhoff reached base in his first 21 games of the season

• Shortly after earning the starting CF job, Cayman Richardson strung together a hit streak of 15-straight games. He batted .390 in that span.

• Andy Weber continued a hit streak of four games started in 2017 and ran it all the way to 12 by hitting safely in his first eight games of 2018. Weber topped that by hitting safely 13-straight games from March 10-31.

• Weber had his 32-game reached base streak come to an end on May 12 against Georgia Tech. It was the longest streak by a Cavalier this season and the longest since Adam Haseley finished the 2017 season by reaching safely in 40-straight games.

### RETURN OF JACK WEILLER

• After seeing limited time as a freshman and missing the entire 2017 season with hip injury, Jack Weiller got his first collegiate start against Miami on Sunday, March 25.

• He recorded his first collegiate hit, a single through the left side in a midweek game against Longwood on March 27.

• Andrew Papantonis' first hit of his career was a two-run home run into the left field bleachers at Disharoon Park against Davidson on March 6.

### THREE RUNS, NO HITS, 12 INNINGS, WHAT?

• Six pitchers, Bobby Nicholson, Blake Rohm, Grant Donahue, Riley Wilson, Mack Meyer and Bennett Sousa combined to pitch the sixth no-hitter in program history on Feb. 28, 2018.

• Sousa was credited with the win after pitching the final 2.2 innings

• William & Mary scored three runs despite not recording a hit, one on a ground out in the top of the sixth and the game-tying run in the seventh. The Tribe took the lead after benefiting from three 11th inning Virginia errors.

• After scoring 35 runs in its two previous games, the Virginia offense was limited to eight hits and did not record an RBI in the contest.

### NO-HIT FACTS

• The no-hitter was the seventh this season in college baseball.

• Four of the six no-hitters in Virginia history have come in the Brian O'Connor era (2004-present).

• The combined no-hitter is the first in Virginia history.

• 11 innings matched the longest no-hitter in NCAA Division I baseball since 2002, the other occurred on Feb. 28, 2015 when Lehigh blanked Iona, 2-0.

• Of the 294 MLB no-hitters, an opponent has never scored more than two runs.

• Junior Jake McCarthy is a unanimous preseason All-American and garnered first team honors from D1Baseball.com and the NCBWA. He was recognized by Baseball America, *Collegiate Baseball*, and Perfect Game as a second team honoree.

• In addition to All-America honors, Baseball America tabbed McCarthy as the "fastest runner" on its list of players across the country with the best tools.

### VIRGINIA INJURY UPDATES

• A second team All-ACC selection as a sophomore, Simmons started all but three games for the Cavaliers in 2017. He was second on the team and fourth in the ACC with a .352 batting average. In conference play, he hit .374, tops on the team and the third highest average in the league.

• Junior preseason All-American Jake McCarthy was sidelined after sustaining a left wrist injury on March 6 vs. Davidson. He returned on May 14 against Georgia Tech after missing 37 games.

• Sophomore Evan Sperling was sidelined prior to the Miami series (March 23-25) with a forearm injury and made his first appearance in relief on May 15 against Richmond, working one inning. Prior to being sidelined, opponents had been hitting .152 off him in five starts.
