VIRGINIA VS NAVY

- This is the first ever meeting between the Cavaliers and the Midshipmen.
- This is the final non-conference game of the regular-season for the Cavaliers

NAVY NOTES

- Navy is coming off a loss to Colgate on March 28, just its second loss of the season.
- Navy is ranked fourth in the nation with 237 points this season
- The Middies are limiting opponents to 6.67 points per game, seventh-lowest in the NCAA, and are ranked fifth in the nation with a +6.92 scoring margin
- Katie Gallagher earned Patriot League Offensive Player of the Week for the week of March 23, after causing three turnovers in the win over American and tallying three goals, two ground balls and two caused turnovers in the win over Boston.
- In the same week, Loren Generi was named this week's Naval Academy Athlete Association Athlete of the Week after scoring nine points on five goals and four assists along with 14 draw controls throughout the week.
- Generi leads the nation with 58 points this season

ON DECK

- The Navy game is the first of four-straight home contests to close out the regular season
- The Cavaliers return to ACC action on Saturday, April 4, hosting No. 17 Notre Dame at 1 p.m.
- The Cavaliers will also be hosting the ACC Tournament at Klöckner Stadium April 23-26.

NO. 4 RANKING

- Virginia moved up one spot to No. 4 in this week's IWLCA Poll
- It is the highest in-season ranking for the Cavaliers since the 2010 season
- Virginia finished the 2014 season with a final ranking of No. 4. but its highest in-season ranking was No. 6 that year

ACC RANKINGS

- Courtney Swan leads the ACC, averaging 1.83 assists per game
- Swan is seventh in the nation with 22 assists
- Swan is third in the ACC and eighth in the nation, averaging 5.33 draw controls per game
- Casey Bocklet is third in the ACC, averaging 1.75 assists per game
- Bocklet is 10th in the nation with 21 assists
- Liza Blue is ninth in the ACC, averaging 2.50 goals per game
- Blue is 10th in the ACC in draw controls, averaging 2.83 per game
- Rachel Vander Kolk leads the ACC in total saves (88) and saves per game (7.33)

HOOS HOT

- Casey Bocklet has had at least four points in each of the last five games, including a career-high eight points (5g, 3a) at William & Mary
- Bocklet has scored 12 goals with six assists in the last three games
- Bocklet scored her four goals in the Duke game on four shots, her five goals at W&M on six shots and her hat trick at BC on four shots
- Liza Blue had back-to-back hat tricks last week at W&M and BC
- Blue has scored a goal in nine-straight games, including seven multi-goal performances, including her hat trick at W& M. Blue has contributed points in 39-straight games, dating back to 2013
- Kelly Reese had her third hat trick of the season at BC.
- Reese has scored a goal in five-straight games with four multi-goal perforances in that span
- Courtney Swan had six points at BC, scoring two goals with four assists
- •Swan had seven assists last week with three at W&M, moving her into the conference lead in assists per game (1.83) and seventh in the nation with 22 total assists
- Swan won 14 draw controls last week, seven in each game
- Morgan Stephens caused three turnovers at BC, picking up three ground balls and winning a pair of draws

- Virginia earned a 16-15 road win at No. 9 Penn State
- The Cavaliers fell 13-12 in overtime to No. 16 Loyola and dropped regulation contests at No. 3 Syracuse and in the season-opening neutral-site game against No. 5 Northwestern

OPENING STRETCH

- The Cavaliers played five of their first six games on the road
- UVa played four top-10 opponents, all on the road, in its first six games, going 1-3
- The Cavaliers "home" opener against Harvard was relocated to Turf Field because of snow
- Virginia's first game at Klöckner Stadium was the 13-12 overtime loss to Loyola

100 CAREER GOALS

- Liza Blue scored her 100th career goal and won her 100th career draw control in the Penn State game
- •Courtney Swan scored the 100th goal of her career against Duke
- Casey Bocklet scored the 100th goal of her career at Boston College

RECORD WATCH AND MILESTONES

- Liza Blue needs 3 goals to tie Cyn Mathes (1988-91) for 10th place on the Virginia career goals list. Blue has 122 career goals
- Blue has 145 career points. She needs 39 points to move into a tie for 10th place with Jamie Haas (1997, 99-01) and Brittany Kalkstein (2007-10)
- Blue has 124 career draw controls, ranking in eighth place on the list. She needs three more draws to move into a tie for seventh with Josie Owen (2008-12)
- Courtney Swan's 251 career draws currently ranks second in the Cavalier record book. She is 36 draws shy of tying Brittany Kalkstein (2007-10) for the top total in career history
- Swan has 62 career assists. She needs four more to tie Tyler Leachman (2003-06) in 10th place on the list
- Swan has 164 career points. She needs 20 points to move into a tie for 10th place on the career list with Jamie Haas (1997, 99-01) and Brittany Kalkstein (2007-10)

DEBUTS

- Freshman goalie Rachel Vander Kolk made her debut at Northwestern, logging five saves
- Freshman midfielder Meghan Heick also made her debut at Northwestern and was in the starting lineup for the first two games of the year
- Heick scored her first career goal at JMU
- Freshman midfielder Kasey Behr made her collegiate debut against Richmond, coming off the bench to score a goal, pick up a ground ball and win two draw controls
- Freshman midfielder Lilly DiNardo made her collegiate debut in the Harvard game
- Four Cavaliers made their Virginia debut at William & Mary. Freshmen Daniela Kelly, Jacqueline Wasilko and Ana Hagerup made their collegiate debuts in the game while Katherine Rueger, a transfer from Davidson, made her UVa debut
- Rueger picked up a ground ball and Hagerup took a shot in the W&M game

CAVALIERS VS RANKED OPPONENTS

- Virginia is 4-3 against top-10 teams this season and 5-4 against top-20 teams
- Five of Virginia's first eight games were against top-10 opponents
- Eight of UVa's first 10 games were against top-20 opponents
- The game against BC was the second time this season UVa has taken on a team ranked second in the nation, falling to UNC when it was ranked No. 2
- The BC win was the second time in two weeks that Virginia took down a previously-undefeated team. Duke was 9-0, 3-0 ACC before coming to Charlottesville the Saturday before UVa defeated 10-0 BC in Newton

VS UNRANKED OPPONENTS

• Since 2007, Virginia has only lost four times to unranked opponents, going 52-4 in that span against teams not ranked in the IWLCA Top-20 One of those losses came last season when Virginia fell 15-13 at then-unranked Princeton.

2014 NCAA TOURNAMENT

- This season Virginia has already played all three teams they faced during the 2014 NCAA Tournament, falling 13-12 in overtime to secondround opponent Princeton, falling 10-7 at North Carolina (last year's quarterfinal opponent) and 14-13 at Syracuse (last year's semifinal opponent).
- Virginia was one of six teams last season to earn a first-round bye, facing the Tigers in the 2nd round

ACC POSTGRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP

- Courtney Swan has been announced as one of 53 recipients of the prestigious Weaver-James-Corrigan Award.
- •These ACC postgraduate scholarships are awarded to selected student-athletes who intend to pursue a graduate degree following completion of their undergraduate requirements. Each recipient will receive \$5,000 toward his or her graduate education. Those honored have performed with distinction in both the classroom and their respective sport, while demonstrating exemplary conduct in the community. An additional eight student-athletes who plan to enter a professional career in their chosen sport were named honorary recipients.

TEWAARATON WATCH LIST

 Casey Bocklet, Courtney Swan and Morgan Stephens were all named to the 50-player Tewaaraton Award Watch List.

ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK SWEEP

- Casey Bocklet was named the ACC Offensive Player of the Week and Rachel Vander Kolk was named the ACC Defensive Players of the Week (March 31)
- Bocklet, who was named the co-Offensive Player of the Week the previous week, recorded a hat trick and added two assists against the previously unbeaten Eagles. She scored two of Virginia's first three goals at Boston College, setting the foundation for the Cavaliers' 6-0 run to start the game. In a 16-6 win at William & Mary, Bocklet recorded a career-high eight points on five goals and three assists. She has posted at least five points in each of Virginia's last three victories.
- Vander Kolk made an ACC single-game seasonhigh 18 saves in Virginia's upset win at No. 2 Boston College and totaled 27 for the week after making nine in the 16-6 win at William & Mary. The freshman goalkeeper faced 41 shots by the Eagles, including five in the final two minutes of the game with Virginia leading 15-13. During that period, Vander Kolk came up with three saves and a ground ball after Cavalier teammate Wyatt Whitley caused a turnover in front of the net in the final 20 seconds of the game.
- It was the second career honor for Bocklet and the first for Vander Kolk

IL NATIONAL ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

- Rachel Vander Kolk was named Inside Lacrosse's co-National Rookie of the Week (March 31), the second time she earned this honor
- "For the Cavaliers, it was rookie Rachel Vander Kolk who made the ultimate difference in Virginia's victory over then-undefeated Boston College on Saturday. Squaring off against some of the nation's most prolific scorers, Vander Kolk made 18 saves to lift her team over its second ranked opponent in just eight days. The Severna Park (Md.) native has started in every game for UVA this season, and boasts a .413 save percentage."

ACC CO-PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Casey Bocklet was named the ACC Co-Player of the Week (March 24)
- Bocklet helped lead Virginia to a pair of wins over ranked teams, including a road win at No. 12 JMU and upsetting previously-undefeated Duke at Klockner Stadium
- Bocklet scored four goals against Duke, on four shots, while also adding an assist
- Against JMU, Bocklet had one goal with three assists

LM NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Casey Bocklet was also named the Lacrosse Magazine National Player of the Week (March 24)
- "Duke had been playing like a well-oiled machine in 2014, with a perfect 9-0 mark going into a weekend trip to Klockner Stadium. There, they met the Cavaliers and Bocklet, and left with a 9-1 mark. Bocklet's performance in a dominating first half earns her Epoch/LM Player of the Week honors."
- "Bocklet scored a first-half hat trick, keying the host Cavaliers to a 7-3 lead by halftime, which was expanded to 9-3 before the Blue Devils rallied late, but not enough in Virginia's 13-10 win. Bocklet finished with a team-high four goals and an assist, leaving her with an even 16 and 16 on the spring. The win was Virginia's third straight and bumped the Cavaliers (6-4) back into the Nike/LM Top 10."

IL NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Courtney Swan was named the Inside Lacrosse National Player of the Week (March 3)
- During an action-packed week for Virginia (2-2), the No. 8 Cavaliers dropped a one-goal decision to Syracuse, 13-14, in the Carrier Dome on Monday evening before traveling to University Park on Saturday to take on the Penn State Nittany Lions.
- Against the Orange, Swan recorded four points (1g, 3a) and picked up a pair of draw controls. When Swan took on the Nittany Lions, however, she utterly dominated the field. The Vero Beach (Fla.) native poured in four goals and dished out four assists, while collecting nine of her team's 17 draw controls.

'HOOS IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

- Virginia is one of five programs in the NCAA to be ranked at least once in every year of the IWLCA Coaches Poll. The poll was created in 1988, with Dartmouth, Maryland, Penn State and Princeton joining Virginia as the only programs to be nationally ranked every year.
- Of those five programs, Virginia is the only program to be ranked in every week of the IWLCA coaches poll, a span of 277-straight polls.
- Of those 277 polls, the Cavaliers have been ranked among the top-10 in the nation on 239 occasions, the second-most among all NCAA programs.
- The Cavaliers have spent 15 weeks ranked No. 1, including the entire 1993 season, en route to the program's second national championship.
- Virginia debuted at No. 7 in the inaugural coaches poll on March 19, 1988. While the Cavaliers have climbed to a No. 1 ranking, the farthest they have ever fallen was to No. 19 on April 23, 2013. Virginia has only spent five weeks ranked outside the top-15.

IL NATIONAL ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

- The same week that Courtney Swan was the Inside Lacrosse National Player of the Week (March 3), goalkeeper Rachel Vander Kolk was named IL's co-National Rookie of the Week
- Sharing Rookie of the Week honors with Stanford's Allit DaCar, Vander Kolk was coming off a strong week against No. 5 Syracuse and No. 12 Penn State. Against the Orange, Vander Kolk posted a career-high 10 saves. Just days later, Vander Kolk bested her career-high with a 13 save performance against the Nittany Lions. The win over Penn State marked Virginia's first win over a ranked opponent this spring.
