QUICK HITS

ACC FIVE DAYS OF FOOTBALL

The ACC is the only conference in the country to play on five consecutive days in the first week of the 2018 season. Wake Forest kicks off the league's schedule with a Thursday night game at Tulane. On Friday, Duke plays host to Army, while Syracuse travels to Western Michigan. Saturday's slate includes eight ACC teams in action, including a prime time matchup between Louisville and preseason No. 1 Alabama. No. 8 Miami faces No. 25 LSU in Arlington, Texas, on Sunday evening. College football's opening weekend concludes with a top 20 ACC matchup between No. 19 Florida State and No. 20 Virginia Tech in Tallahassee, Florida.

ACC FOUR IN AP TOP 25

Led by No. 2 Clemson, four ACC teams are ranked in the preseason Associated Press Top 25 football poll. Clemson received 18 first-place votes to match its best preseason ranking. In 2016, the Tigers were No. 2 in the preseason and went on to win the national championship. It marks the fifth top 5 preseason ranking in the AP Poll in Clemson history, including 1984 (No. 4), 1988 (4), 2016 (2) and 2017 (5).

Miami was picked No. 8, its best preseason ranking since being No. 6 to start the 2004 season. Florida State was voted No. 19, followed by No. 20 Virginia Tech.

NC State (22 votes) and Boston College (18) also received votes in the poll.

ACC FIFTH OPENER FEATURING RANKED TEAMS

Monday night's game between No. 19 Florida State and No. 20 Virginia Tech is just the fifth opener in league history matching ranked ACC teams.

ACC SIX ON AP ALL-AMERICA TEAM

Four players from Clemson and two from Boston College headline the ACC contingent on the 2018 Associated Press Preseason All-America Team. The first-team All-America Tigers include OT Mitch Hyatt, last season's ACC Jacobs Blocking Trophy winner, defensive end Clelin Ferrell and defensive tackle Christian Wilkins. Defensive tackle Dexter Lawrence is a second-team selection. Boston College running back A.J. Dillon and safety Lukas Dennis are also second-team selections.

ACC PRESEASON PREDICTIONS

Three-time defending champion Clemson is the preseason favorite to claim another ACC football championship, according to a poll of 148 media members who voted at the 2018 ACC Kickoff. The Tigers, who posted a 12-2 overall record en route to earning a College Football Playoff berth for the third consecutive year in 2017, were also picked to repeat as Atlantic Division winners. Miami was picked to finish atop the Coastal Division for the second consecutive year.

ACADEMICS

- Ten of 14 ACC Football teams earned a graduation success rate (GSR) at or above the FBS average of 76. That ties for first among Power 5 conferences, both in terms of percentage and in total number.
- The ACC remains the only Power 5 conference to have multiple teams score 90 or higher in GSR each year since 2005. Duke (96), Wake Forest (93) and Boston College (90) reached that plateau last year.
- In the 2017 U.S. News and World "Best Colleges" rankings, ACC member schools combine for an average rank of 54.2, marking the 11th straight year that the ACC has led all Power 5 conferences.

ATHLETICS

- The ACC is the only conference to win national championships in football, men's basketball, women's basketball and baseball over the last four years.
- The ACC has won a combined four football and men's basketball national titles over the last five years, twice as many as any other conference.
- The ACC has had a team in either the College Football Playoff or the BCS National Championship Game in each of the past five years.
- The ACC led all conferences with 10 bowl teams in 2017. Over the last two years, the ACC has had a nation's best 21 teams in bowl games.
- The ACC has earned at least six bowl bids in 17 consecutive seasons. The league ranks second among all conferences with 116 total bowl appearances since 2005.
- Since 2013, the ACC is second among all conferences with 54 postseason appearances, has the second-best record of any conference in BCS, New Year's Six and CFP games, and is tied for the most national championships (Florida State in 2013, Clemson in 2016).

- Over the last four years, the ACC is 13-3 in games against the SEC on rivalry week, which features Clemson-South Carolina, Florida State-Florida, Georgia Tech-Georgia and Louisville-Kentucky. The league was 3-1 in 2017, winning all three games on the road.
- In 2017, the ACC led all conferences in wins (56) vs. teams with a .500-or-better record. Seven ACC schools had schedules ranked among the toughest 21 slates in the nation (based on opponent winning percentage).
- Two of the last five national champions have come from the ACC, and the league has had a team in the national championship game in three of the last five years. Both are tied for the most from any conference.
- An ACC football player has won the Heisman Trophy or the Campbell Trophy – commonly referred to as the "Academic Heisman" – in four of the last five years, something no other league can claim.

139 ballots, with Miami a distant second with five votes. The Atlantic and Coastal Division winners will meet in the 2018 Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game on Saturday, December 1, at Charlotte's Bank of America Stadium. If this year's media predictions prove correct, it will be a rematch of last year's 2017 title game, in which the then-defending national champion Tigers posted a 38-3 win over the Hurricanes en route to securing the CFP berth.

RETURNING QUARTERBACKS

Nine ACC teams return a quarterback in 2018 with at least 10 career starts, led by NC State's Ryan Finley (26), Duke's Daniel Jones (25) and Syracuse's Eric Dungey (25). North Carolina, Pitt and Wake Forest all return quarterbacks with limited starting experience. Louisville and Virginia are the only league schools with no starting experience at QB entering the season.

PASSING YARDS PER GAME

Four quarterbacks – Florida State's Deondre Francois, NC State's Ryan Finley, Syracuse's Eric Dungey, and Duke's Daniel Jones – enter the 2018 season ranked among the top 25 in ACC career passing yards per game. Francois, the 2016 ACC Rookie of the Year, played just one game last season before going down with an injury. He has averaged 254.3 yards passing over 14 career games, which would currently rank seventh in ACC history. Finley's 253.0 average would be eighth on the conference's all-time list, while Dungey's mark of 248.9 would be 10th.

GROUND GAME

Fourteen players who have rushed for more than 1,000 yards in their careers are slated to return for the 2018 season. Wake Forest's Matt Colburn II leads the way with 1,780 career rushing yards, including 904 last season. Rookie of the Year AJ Dillon had 1,589 rushing yards last year to finish second in the conference behind departed Louisville quarterback Lamar Jackson. Dillon was 12th in the nation with 123.2 rushing yards per game last year.
