LEADING OFF

- Tuesday's contest will be the first of a two-game midweek series against the Monarchs. The two teams will square off again on Tuesday, April 24 at Harbor Park in Norfolk.
- ODU owns a 33-28-2 advantage in the all-time series that dates back to 1965. Virginia has claimed the last two meetings but the Monarchs are winners of four of the last six against the Cavaliers.
- After playing six of its last seven games on the road, Virginia opens up a 10-game home stand on Tuesday that includes ACC series against Virginia Tech (April 6-8) and North Carolina (April 13-15).
- The Cavaliers are 4-2 against teams from the Commonwealth this season.
- Virginia comes into Tuesday having won 21 of the last 23 midweek contests including a 5-2 mark this season.
- Against non-conference opponents at home, Virginia has won 31 of its last 35 games.

LAST MEETING

- Virginia pounded out 18 hits and matched a season-high with 18 runs in an 18-5 win at Disharoon Park on April 4.
- Pavin Smith hit two home runs including a grand slam in the third inning. He drove in a career-high seven runners in the contest.
- The 18 runs by Virginia were the most ever scored in 63 all-time meetings against the Monarchs.

WEBER EMERGENCE

- Junior Andy Weber leads the team in batting average (.365), runs (22), hits (42), doubles (9), triples (2), RBI (25) and total bases (61).
- He had a career-high 13-game hitting streak come to a close in Sunday's loss at Pitt. It was his second hit streak of 12 or more after closing 2017 with four-straight games with a hit and starting the 2018 season hitting safely in the first eight games.
- Sunday proved to be just his third hitless game of 2018. He has reached base in all but two contest this season.
- In five games last week, Weber was 10-for-21 (.476) five doubles, a triple and seven RBI.
- His 19 hits and two triples in ACC play are the tied for the most amongst his ACC cohorts.

ON THE MOUND

- Bobby Nicholson will make his fourth midweek start of the season for Virginia. In three previous midweek starts, has allowed just two earned runs over 16.2 innings pitched.
- In three of his four starts in 2018 he has pitched at least five innings went a career-high six in a 3-2, no-decision against JMU on March 14. He struck out a career-high seven batters and did not issue a walk.

ACC/NATIONAL RANKS

- Virginia comes into Tuesday's contest ranked second in the country in strikeouts per nine innings (11.0). The Cavaliers as a staff have fanned 10 or more in 19 of the 28 games this season.
- Led by Derek Casey (63) and Daniel Lynch (58) Cavalier pitchers have struck out 307 batters, the most of any team in the ACC.
- The Virginia offense has struck out an ACC-low, 157 times in 28 games. The Cavaliers fanned 14 times in the three-game set at Pittsburgh.
- With 10 hits in five games last week, Andy Weber vaulted up to the fourth spot in the ACC hit totals with 42.
- The Cavaliers have totaled 29 sacrifice bunts, tied for second-highest total in the country.
- Caleb Knight is tied for second in the country with 13 hit by pitches. He has reached base safely in 26 of the 27 games he's played in.

HIT STREAKS

- Nate Eikhoff had his hit streak of 16 games snapped on 3/24 at Miami. He is one of nine players since 2001 to have put together hit streaks of 16 or more.
- Andy Weber continued a hit streak of four games started in 2017 and ran it all the way to 12 by hitting safely in his first eight games of 2018. Weber topped that by hitting safely 13-straight games from March 10-31, a span of 13 games.

RETURN OF JACK WEILLER

- After seeing limited time as a freshman and missing the entire 2017 season with hip injury, Jack Weiller got his first collegiate start against Miami on Sunday, March 25.
- He recorded his first collegiate hit, a single through the left side in a midweek game against Longwood on March 27.

HALL OF FAME COMPANY

- Derek Casey struck out a career-high 12 batters in back-to-back starts, the first Cavalier pitcher to record 12 or more strikeouts in consecutive starts since UVA Baseball Hall of Famer Danny Hultzen in 2011.
- Casey went on to strike out 10 or more in three-straight starts, also a feat accomplished by Hultzen in 2011.
- Hultzen went on to become the second overall pick in the 2011 draft of the Seattle Mariners and was inducted into the Inaugural UVA Baseball Hall of Fame this past January.

FIRST HIT, FIRST HR

- Andrew Papanonis' first hit of his career was a two-run home run into the left field bleachers at Disharoon Park against Davidson on March 6.

NO-HIT RECAP

- Six pitchers, Bobby Nicholson, Blake Rohm, Grant Donahue, Riley Wilson, Mack Meyer and Bennett Sousa combined to pitch the sixth no-hitter in program history on Feb. 28, 2018.
- Sousa was credited with the win after pitching the final 2.2 innings
- William & Mary scored three runs despite not recording a hit, one on a ground out in the top of the sixth and the game-tying run in the seventh. The Tribe took the lead after benefiting from three 11th inning Virginia errors.
- After scoring 35 runs in its two previous games, the Virginia offense was limited to eight hits and did not record an RBI in the contest.

NO-HIT FACTS

- The no-hitter was the seventh this season in college baseball.
- Four of the six no-hitters in Virginia history have come in the Brian O'Connor era (2004-present).
- The combined no-hitter is the first in Virginia history.
- 11 innings matched the longest no-hitter in NCAA Division I baseball since 2002, the other occurred on Feb. 28, 2015 when Lehigh blanked Iona, 2-0.
- Of the 294 MLB no-hitters, an opponent has never scored more than two runs.

THE DISH

- The University of Virginia department of athletics and the Virginia Athletics Foundation announced on Feb. 20 that a generous commitment was made by an anonymous donor to rename the Virginia baseball stadium Davenport Field at Disharoon Park
- The name change was formally approved by the University of Virginia Board of Visitors on March 2, 2018.

MCCARTHY PRESEASON ACCOLADES

- Junior Jake McCarthy is a unanimous preseason All-American and garnered first team honors from D1Baseball.com and the NCBWA. He was recognized by Baseball America, *Collegiate Baseball*, and Perfect Game as a second team honoree.
- In addition to All-America honors, Baseball America tabbed McCarthy as the "fastest runner" on its list of players across the country with the best tools.
- McCarthy was listed on the Golden Spikes Award preseason watch list. He is one of eight ACC players on the initial 55-player list. Last year, Virginia's Adam Haseley was a finalist for the award annually bestowed on the nation's top amateur baseball player.

2018 HOOS KEY FIGURES

- Virginia returns 23 letterwinners from a year ago, including three starting pitchers that made 10+ starts in 2017.
- The Cavaliers' projected lineup features five returners (McCarthy, Andy Weber, Caleb Knight, Nate Eikhoff and Justin Novak) that saw action in 40 or more games last season. Novak, Weber and Charlie Cody have each appeared in 80 or more games over the course of their careers. Novak is the team's active leader with 124 career games played.

O'CONNOR TO COACH TEAM USA

- Virginia head coach Brian O'Connor will serve as the pitching coach for U.S. Collegiate National team this summer.
- Current LSU head coach Paul Maineri will serve as the manager for Team USA this summer.
- O'Connor spent nine seasons working as an assistant on Maineri's staff at Notre Dame from 1995-2003.
- While working together, the Irish posted an overall record of 399-160-1, won six conference championships and made six trips to the NCAA Tournament.

- O'Connor's college coach at Creighton, Jim Hendry, will also be on staff as the bench coach. Hendry now works for the New York Yankees as a special assignment scout.

VIRGINIA INJURY UPDATES

- It was announced shortly before the start of the 2018 season that outfielder Cameron Simmons will miss the year due to a left shoulder injury.
- A second team All-ACC selection as a sophomore, Simmons started all but three games for the Cavaliers in 2017. He was second on the team and fourth in the ACC with a .352 batting average. In conference play, he hit .374, tops on the team and the third highest average in the league.
- Junior preseason All-American Jake McCarthy was sidelined after sustaining a left wrist injury on March 6 vs. Davidson. He is expected to miss six weeks and make a full recovery.
- Sophomore Evan Sperling was sidelined prior to the Miami series (March 23-25) with a forearm injury and does not have a timetable for a return. Opponents had been hitting .152 off him in five starts, the
