VIRGINIA-VIRGINIA TECH SERIES

- Virginia holds a 92-79 advantage in the all-time series with the Hokies.
- Virginia Tech won three of four games last year against UVa, including two of three in Blacksburg and one at the ACC Baseball Championship.
- UVa has won 10 of the 12 games against Virginia Tech in Charlottesville since the Hokies joined the ACC in 2006.
- UVa is 19-7 against Virginia Tech since Brian O'Connor's first year in 2004.

VIRGINIA AGAINST IN-STATE FOES

- Under the current coaching staff (since 2004), the Cavaliers have a 94-16-1 record against in-state opponents, including a 4-1 mark this year.
- UVa was 9-3 last year against foes from the commonwealth of Virginia in 2013.

GOOD GLOVES TO START SEASON

- Virginia has started the season strong in the field, committing just 12 errors in 24 contests; that equates to a .987 fielding percentage, second best in the nation (Stony Brook, .989).
- The Cavaliers tied for seventh in the ACC last year with a .969 fielding percentage while committing 75 errors, the program's most since 2008 (79).
- UVa has just three errors in nine games of ACC play (.988).

PITCHING SENSATIONAL IN EARLY GOING

- Virginia's pitching has been another strong point in the first month and a half. The Cavaliers lead the ACC and rank 13th nationally with a 2.26 ERA.
- Batters are hitting .199 against UVa, fourth lowest nationally.
- UVa has given up three runs or fewer in 21 of its 24 games this year, including a streak of 18 straight at one point.

COGSWELL TURNS IT ON

- Second baseman Branden Cogswell has bounced back from a slow start at the plate to push his batting average over .300 for the first time this year.
- He is batting .436 (17-for-39) over his last 11 games after sitting at .200 through the first 13 contests.
- Cogswell had a career-high four hits Sunday at Miami.

CAVALIERS SLOW OPPOSING RUNNING GAME

- Virginia has limited its opponents to seven stolen bases, second fewest in the ACC (FSU, 6).
- UVa has given up just three stolen bases in the last 23 games; the Cavaliers allowed four stolen bases in the season opener versus Kentucky.
- Primary catcher Nate Irving has thrown out 6-of-12 potential base stealers this year, including six of the last eight.
- Virginia Tech's Saige Jenco ranks second in the ACC with 11 stolen bases in 15 attempts.

CAVALIERS GETTING THE BUNTS DOWN

- Virginia is far and away the leader in the ACC in sacrifice bunts with 35 (Maryland is second with 25).
- Twenty of the bunts have come in nine games of ACC play.
- The Cavaliers are tied for fourth nationally in the category.
- UVa laid down an NCAA record-tying eight bunts in its win over Boston College on March 15 (game 1 of DH).

HOWARD ACC PLAYER OF WEEK

- Nick Howard is the ACC's Player of the Week after going 8-for-16 with two runs, eight RBI and four doubles last week.
- He had three multiple-hit games and drove in runs in all four games.
- He also had a career-high four RBI Thursday in a 14-4 win over Princeton.
- Howard backed up his award by hitting the go-ahead, two-run single in the ninth inning of the Monday win at Miami.

YOUNG ROTATION THRIVING IN EARLY ACC PLAY

- Virginia has the youngest weekend pitching rotation in the ACC this year, with a trio of sophomores manning the starting staff.
- UVa is the only ACC team to start all underclassmen on the weekend this year.
- Brandon Waddell has made 22 career weekend starts, while Nathan Kirby has recorded seven and Josh Sborz six.
- The three have combined to go 11-3 with a 2.22 ERA this year. Each recorded a quality start last weekend at Miami.

KIRBY AIMS FOR ANOTHER QUALITY START

- Nathan Kirby has recorded a quality start in each of his six starts this year (at least 6 IP and 3 runs or fewer allowed).
- He is one of 12 pitchers nationally to do so this year and the only one from a power conference.
- The others: Chase Angelle (Lamar), Bryan Bonnell (UNLV), Chris Carmain (Northeastern), Montana Durapau (Bethune-Cookman), Erick Fedde (UNLV), Aaron Garza (Houston), Jared Gaynor (George Mason), A.J. Ladwig (Wichita State), Chase Mallard (UAB), Shane McCain (Troy), Tate Scioneaux (Southeastern Louisiana).

NO FREE 90S

- Virginia prides itself on not giving easy passes to potential baserunners, which is the case again in 2014.
- UVa pitchers rank 38th nationally in fewest walks per nine innings (2.79).
- UVa pitchers rank fourth nationally in fewest hits allowed per nine innings (6.26) and eighth in walks/hits per nine innings (WHIP - 1.01). Both totals also are tops in the ACC.

FISHER OUT 4-6 WEEKS WITH BROKEN HAMATE BONE

- Starting outfielder Derek Fisher will miss four to six weeks because of a broken hamate bone in his right wrist.
- Fisher suffered the injury during the Duke series and had surgery on the fracture on Monday, March 17.
- A 2014 Preseason All-American, Fisher started each of the Cavaliers' first 14 games this season in left field and is batting .333 this year.

CLOSE GAMES THE NORM IN EARLY PORTION OF SEASON

- Virginia has been tested in its early schedule. Fourteen of the Cavaliers' 24 games have been determined by four runs or fewer.
- Five of the Cavaliers' nine ACC games have been decided by one run, including all three of the contests at Duke.
- Last year, 31 of UVa's 62 games were decided by five runs or more.

CAVALIERS ENJOY THEIR HOME FIELD

- Virginia is 13-1 at home this year, boosting its record to 314-63 (.832) at Davenport Field since 2004.
- UVa posted a 35-5 mark in 2013 and sold a record number of season tickets prior to the start of the 2014 season.
- Virginia has ranked among the top 20 nationally in attendance each of the last four years.

MAYBERRY NAMED CANDIDATE FOR LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS AWARD

- Virginia's Whit Mayberry has been named one of 30 candidates for baseball's Lowe's Senior CLASS Award.
- To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as a senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence – community, classroom, character and competition.
- Mayberry earned a bachelor's degree in Commerce last year and is pursuing a master's in Educational Psychology – Social Foundations.

CAVALIERS PATIENT, PUT BALL IN PLAY

- Through 24 games, Virginia batters own more walks (110) than strikeouts (107).
- The Cavaliers are the only ACC team to have fewer strikeouts than walks this year.
- UVa has struck out the fewest times of any ACC team (VT has second fewest with 122).

PINERO LONE ROOKIE IN EVERYDAY LINEUP

- Freshman Daniel Pinero has been a mainstay at shortstop this season, starting all 24 games there and batting .316 (second on team and 18th in ACC).
- With his start at shortstop on opening day, Pinero became the first UVa freshman to start the season opener at shortstop in Brian O'Connor's 11 years as head coach.
- The last UVa rookie to start the season opener at shortstop was Mark Reynolds in 2002. Reynolds currently is in spring training with the Milwaukee Brewers.

FIVE CAVALIERS EARN PRESEASON

ALL-AMERICA HONORS

- Five Cavaliers earned preseason All-America honors from at least one media outlet – Branden Cogswell, Brandon Downes, Derek Fisher, Nick Howard and Mike Papi.
- It marks the most All-Americans of any team in the nation as well as the most UVa has ever had in the pre-season.

THE SEASON TO THIS POINT (A QUICK SEASON SYNOPSIS)

- Virginia has won each of its six weekend series, including sweeps of East Carolina, Monmouth and Boston College.
- UVa leads the ACC Coastal Division by two games at 7-2.
- Pitching and defense have carried the Cavaliers; UVa ranks eighth nationally in ERA (2.26) and second in fielding (.987).
- Virginia allowed three runs or fewer in 17 straight games from Feb. 15-March 20 and in 21 of 24 games this year.
- Starting left fielder Derek Fisher has missed the last 10 games with broken hamate bone; he had surgery March 17 and is expected to miss 4-6 weeks.
- UVa's vaunted offense has scuffled at times, but has started to come around of late with the Cavaliers batting .310 in their last 10 games.

- Eleven pitchers, including 2013 weekend starters Brandon Waddell and Nick Howard, are back.
- Virginia also welcomes in a freshman class of nine players ranked as the 14th-best nationally by Baseball America.

O'CONNOR THIRD AMONG ACTIVE COACHES IN WIN PCT., 13TH ALL-TIME

- Virginia head coach Brian O'Connor is 481-165-2 (.743) in 11 seasons at the helm of the Cavaliers.
- Entering the year, O'Connor's 74 percent winning percentage ranked third among active Division I head coaches behind only North Carolina's Mike Fox (.747), Florida State's Mike Martin (.743).
- O'Connor also ranks 13th all-time in career winning percentage among all coaches with at least 10 years of head coaching experience.

SIZE AND STRENGTH UP AND DOWN LINEUP

- This isn't a football team – but the UVa lineup might look like it. UVa has a unique combination of size and physicality in 2014.
- Virginia's eight returning position starters all measure at least 6-foot, with five at 6-foot-3 or taller.

- More than 110,000 fans have attended Virginia games each of the past four seasons as UVa has ranked among the top 20 programs nationally in attendance each of the last three years.
- Davenport Field will seat 5,025 per game this year, slightly up this year after the addition of The Clubhouse, a reserved club in left-center field. The entire reserved section in the grandstand is sold out again this year.
