### **OPENING KICK**

### **CAVALIERS HEAD TO THE "DERBY CITY"**

• UVA returns to the road on Saturday when the Cavaliers face ACC cross-division rival, the Louisville Cardinals. It is UVA's third trip to the "Derby City" since Louisville joined the ACC in 2014.

### THE LOUISVILLE SERIES

- Saturday marks the eighth time in series history the Cavaliers and Cardinals have met in football and the sixth time in ACC play.
- Louisville leads the all-time series, 4-3. UL also leads the series, 3-2, since Louisville joined the ACC in 2014. Except for 2016 Heisman Trophy winner Lamar Jackson's final minute heroics in 2016 at Scott Stadium, the home team has won every game in the series.
- The first five games of the series were won by a touchdown or less, including the first three on field goals in the closing minutes.

### **FIVE TOP STORYLINES**

- Virginia is playing its fifth all-time game in the city of Louisville and fourth against the Cardinals. UVA first played in the "Derby City" 121 years ago against Vanderbilt. UVA won the 1898 meeting with the Commodores, 18-0.
- · Virginia needs one win to become bowl-eligible for the third year in a row. It would mark the first time UVA was bowl-eligible in back-to-back-to-back seasons since going to four bowls in a row (2002, 2003, 2004, 2005). UVA head coach Bronco Mendenhall is one of three active coaches

WR Joe Reed is the only player in FBS history to have 2,700+ career kick return yards (2,837) and a career kick return average of 28+ yards (29.2). He is currently No. 2 in the nation (No. 1 ACC) with

a 39.4 kick return average.

that has inherited at least two programs in his career that were coming off a losing season and in year one, or year two, played in a bowl game. The others to do it are Nick Saban (Alabama, LSU, Michigan State) and Mark Dantonio (Michigan State/Cincinnati).

- ILB Jordan Mack is No. 1 in the ACC with 7.0 sacks (No. 11 in the nation) and is No. 3 among the nation's linebackers.
- WR Joe Reed has 2,837 career kick return yards and is averaging 29.2 yards per kick return while in a UVA uniform. He is the only player in FBS history to have 2,700+ career kick return yards and a career average per kick return of 28+ yards.
- UVA's defense is No. 5 in the nation with 28 sacks (4.0 per game). The Cavalier linebacking corps alone has 19.5 sacks (2.8 per game) which, is more than the overall totals of 100 other FBS teams thus far.

### VIRGINIA FACTS

### UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

### UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT
The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

The first documented Cavalier on horseback was Francis Bell, a Virginia student from Dublin, Va., in 1947. Bell rode onto the field dressed as Cavaliers for Virginia's home football game with Harvard on the afternoon of October 11.

The Cavalier on horseback returned as the University's mascot in 1963. The UVA Polo Club provided both the horse and rider. However, the mounted Cavalier and his horse parted company in 1974 with the inception of AstroTurf at Scott Stadium.

The mounted Cavalier made its return in the Florida Citrus Bowl at the end of the 1989 football season. Due to its instant popularity, the Cavalier on horseback returned the following season on a regular basis and continues to lead the Virginia football team onto the field at the beginning of all home games.

### UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

### WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wahhoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

### CAVALIERS MAKING THEIR FOURTH ALL-TIME TRIP TO THE "DERBY CITY"

- Virginia is making its fifth all-time journey to Louisville, Ky., but only its fourth road game to play the Cardinals. UVA and the Cardinals also met in 1988 at the old Cardinal Stadium, and in 2015 and 2017 at the new Cardinal Stadium.
- The Cavaliers first played in the Commonwealth of Kentucky on Nov. 12, 1898 against Vanderbilt. UVA won, 18-0, against the Commodores.
- UVA's first-ever game in the city of Louisville fell on the same weekend 121 years prior to this season's meeting in Derby City with the Cardinals.
- With the help of the University of Louisville's Archives and Special Collections, and the Nov. 13, 1898 edition of Louisville's *Courier-Journal*, it was determined the game was played at Fontaine Ferry Park, which was slightly south of the terminus of Market Street near the Ohio River.
- Fontaine Ferry gets its name from a family of French Huguenot descents that settled in Louisville in the early 1800s and operated a ferry across the Ohio River. By 1898, under new ownership, the grounds housed a hotel, velodrome, outdoor restaurant, bandstand and grandstand for events like football. In the early 1900s, Fontaine Ferry became Louisville's premier amusement park. In 1997 the \$1.2 million Shawnee Park Sports Complex was built on the former Fontaine Ferry site.
- According to the Nov. 13, 1898 edition of Louisville's *Courier-Journal*, the UVA football team attended "The Royal Box" at Macauley's Theatre after the win over Vanderbilt. The theatre was located on Walnut Street, which is current day Muhammad Ali Boulevard. It was reported that the squad occupied three boxes and they filed in "to a ripple of applause" from the audience. According to Louisville's *Courier-Journal*, each player wore a big yellow chrysanthemum and a "large streamer of orange and blue."

### MORE ON THE LOUISVILLE SERIES

- The two schools first met at Louisville in 1988, a 30-28 Cardinal win. Louisville kicker Ron Bell connected on a 39-yard field goal with 10 seconds left in the game to give the Cardinals the triumph at Old Cardinal Stadium. UVA had led Louisville 28-14 after scoring on its opening drive of the second half, but Louisville scored 16 unanswered points to snatch the victory away from the Cavaliers.
- The tables were flipped when the series moved to Charlottesville in 1989. Jake McInerney kicked a 37-yard field goal as time expired to lift UVA over Louisville, 16-15.
- McInerney's kick is one of two field goals in UVA history to win a game with zeros on the clock. The most recent was in 2011 when Robert Randolph chipped a 23-yard game-winner at Indiana.
- Shawn Moore gave UVA a 13-9 lead with his 4-yard passing strike to Herman Moore in the closing seconds before halftime. Louisville used two fourth-quarter field goals to build a 15-13 lead before McInerney's heroics.
- On UVA's game-winning drive, Moore orchestrated the offense on a 10-play, 60-yard drive, to set up McInerney's field goal. The drive included a 25-yard quarterback draw by Moore as the UVA signal caller accumulated for 40 yards during the drive with his own legs.
- PK Ian Frye's 42-yard field goal with 1:24 left won the game for the Cavaliers in 2014. Frye's field goal is the third-longest game-winning field goal in UVA program history.

### UVA'S YEARLY ACC ATLANTIC DIVISION FOE

- The ACC said so long to Maryland when Louisville joined the league on July 1, 2014. Maryland had served as UVA's annual Atlantic Division crossover opponent every season since the ACC created the division format in 2005.
- Louisville not only takes Maryland's spot in the Atlantic Division, but also serves as UVA's annual crossover opponent.

### **UVA VS. TEAMS FROM THE BLUEGRASS STATE**

- Virginia has played 11 games against teams from the Commonwealth of Kentucky.
- UVA is 5-6 all-time against teams from the "Bluegrass State."
- UVA played Centre College from Danville, Ky., at Lambeth Field in Charlottesville in 1919, a 49-7 loss.
- UVA played Kentucky in 1902, 1903 and 1930. The 1902 and 1930 games against the Wildcats were played in Lexington, Ky., while the 1903 meeting was in Charlottesville.
- Including the 1898 meeting in Louisville between UVA and Vanderbilt, UVA has played six all-time games in the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

### HEISMAN MOMENT FOR JACKSON AT SCOTT

- When Louisville came to Scott Stadium in 2016, Lamar Jackson had a Heisman Trophy moment helping the Cardinals beat the Cavaliers, 32-25.
- With just over two minutes to play and No. 5 Louisville suddenly trailing Virginia 25-24, Lamar Jackson answered for the Cardinals. He engineered a 75-yard drive and capping it by floating a perfectly placed 29yard touchdown pass to Jaylen Smith with 13 seconds remaining as the Cardinals survived Virginia, 32-25.
- It was Jackson's fourth touchdown pass and helped the Louisville quarterback capture the 2016 Heisman Trophy.
- Virginia had scored with 1:57 remaining and used a 2-point conversion to take a 25-24 lead, whipping the crowd at Scott Stadium into a frenzy.
- To date, it is the only time the visiting team in this series won the game.

### **VIRGINIA - LOUISVILLE CONNECTIONS**

- UVA's Tavares Kelly attended St. Thomas Aquinas High School (Fort Lauderdale, Fla.), as did Louisville's Devante Peete, Trenell Troutman and Dejmi Dumervil-Jean. The NFL announced that St. Thomas Aquinas High School had the most alums on NFL rosters entering the 2019 season with 13.

### **Last Meeting**

Virginia opened 2018 ACC play with a 27-3 win over Louisville at Scott Stadium last time these teams met.

The UVA defense held Louisville without a touchdown, recorded two interceptions and recovered a fumble in the win. The Cavaliers capitalized on the turnovers with two touchdowns and a field goal.

It was the first time since 2010 that Louisville had not scored a touchdown in a regular season game. The Cavaliers led with 401 total yards on offense to 214 for the Cardinals. UVA scored three unanswered touchdowns to close out the

Following Louisville's field goal in the third quarter, UVA drove the field and Bryce Perkins found Chris Sharp for a three-yard touchdown reception to go up 13-3.

Louisville was driving before a Bryce Hall interception was returned for 19 yards to give the Cavaliers the ball. On third and 14, Perkins connected with Joe Reed for a 44-yard touchdown reception to put UVA up 20-3. The Cavaliers secured the game with an eight-yard touchdown run by Perkins after a fumble recovery by the defense.

### **CAVALIER DEFENSE IS STOUT ON THIRD DOWN**

- UVA's opponents have only been successful 20.3 percent (15-74) of the time when faced with a 3rd-and-5 or longer against the Cavalier defense. When faced with 3rd-and-4 or closer they succeed 58.3 percent (14-of-24) of the time.
- UVA is No. 9 in the nation and No. 1 in the ACC in third down defense (29.6).

### VIRGINIA WHEN IT IS GOAL-TO-GO

• Not counting the end of the William & Mary game when UVA was in "Victory Formation" - UVA is a perfect 16-of-16 on scoring opportunities when on offense and it is goal-to-go. UVA has scored 13 touchdowns and three field goals. Two of those field goals came in the loss at Miami.

### HOLDING OPPONENTS IN CHECK WHEN IT COMES TO TOTAL OFFENSE

- For the first time since 1995, UVA has started a season holding each of its first seven opponents under 400 yards of total offense. The 1995 team also held its first seven opponents under 400 yards of total offense. The last time UVA held its first eight opponents under 400 yards of total offense was 1969 when the Cavaliers held all 10 opponents under 400 yards of total offense.
- UVA has yielded 400+ yards of total offense in only two of its last 20 games dating back to the start of the 2018 season. Dating back to the start of the 2017 season, UVA has yielded 400+ yards of total offense to its opponents in six of its last 33 games.

### "ZZ STOP" HELPS LEAD THE WAY FOR UVA'S TOP-20 DEFENSE

- ILB Zane Zandier currently is No. 2 on the team with 52 tackles as UVA is ranked No. 8 in the nation (No. 2 in the ACC) in total defense, allowing an average of 270.3 yards per game.
- Zandier intercepted his first career pass in the third quarter against ODU and returned it 22 yards for a touchdown. It is the second UVA interception by a linebacker this season (Matt Gahm at Pitt).
- Zandier's INT is the first pick-six by a UVA linebacker since Byron Thweatt returned an interception 53 yards against Virginia Tech in 1998.
- UVA is No. 14 in the nation (No. 2 in the ACC) in rushing defense, allowing 96.0 rushing yards per game. The Cavaliers are No. 4 in the nation with 4.00 sacks per game and No. 9 in the nation (No. 2 in the ACC) in tackles for loss per game (8.3).

### REED IS DANGEROUS WITH THE BALL

- WR Joe Reed is the only player in the nation with 400+ receiving yards (400) and 400+ kick return yards (591).
- He is currently No. 2 in the nation with a 39.4 yards per kick return.
- Reed is the only player in the nation this season with 15 or fewer kick returns and over 500 kick return vards.
- Reed leads the nation in the following return categories: kick returns of 50+ yards (4), 60+ yards (3), 70+ yards (3), 80+ yards (2) and 90+ yards (2).
- Reed is the only player in the nation with 500+ kick return yards and a return average of 31+ yards per return this season.
- Reed leads UVA with 42 receptions and four receiving touchdowns, while he is second on the squad with 400 receiving yards.

### REED ON THE ACC ALL-TIME KICK RETURN LIST

- •WR Joe Reed recorded his fifth career kick return for a touchdown with a 95-yard return against Duke. It was the second kick return for a touchdown this season for Reed, which is tied for the nation's lead. Earlier in the season Reed notched the fourth 100-yard kick return for a touchdown in program history with his lone return against William & Mary.



Against William & Mary in week No. 2, QB Bryce Perkins became the 44th Cavalier in program history with 1,000 career rushing yards. He is only the third UVA quarterback to reach the milestone and the first since Shawn Moore in 1990.

### PERKINS RUSHES FOR THREE TOUCHDOWNS AGAINST DUKE

• QB Bryce Perkins rushed for three touchdowns against Duke. Last time a UVA QB did that was Shawn Moore against Georgia Tech in 1990.

### **CAVALIERS HAVE HELD THE ADVANTAGE IN FIELD POSITION**

- The Cavaliers have been +10.9 in field position so far this season.
- UVA's average starting field position has been its own 37.7, while UVA's opponents average is the 26.8-yard line.
- UVA won the field position battle in 2018, averaging the 33-yard line to start a drive while opponents averaged the 27.7-yard line.

### **DUBOIS IS "CLUTCH CITY" ON THIRD DOWN**

- Dubois has been one of Bryce Perkins' main targets on third down, catching nine passes on third down with eight going for a first down and one for a touchdown.
- Overall, of Dubois' 36 receptions 23 (63.9 percent) have gone for a first down and two for touchdowns.
- In 2018, Dubois made 32 first downs on 52 receptions (61.5 percent) with five touchdowns.

### PERKINS RUSHING ON THIRD AND FOURTH DOWN

• QB Bryce Perkins is 15-of-20 this season picking up a first down when rushing on third or fourth down with four touchdowns. He is 12-of-17 on third down rushing for a first down and 3-of-3 on fourth down rushing for a first down.

### **DUBOIS HAD CAREER DAY AT NOTRE DAME**

- WR Hasise Dubois had a career day last time out at No. 10 Notre Dame. He set career marks for catches (9) and yards receiving (143), while also scoring an acrobatic touchdown to give UVA a 17-14 lead heading into halftime.
- Dubois' 143 receiving yards are the most by an opponent at Notre Dame Stadium since Oct. 17, 2009 when USC's Anthony McCoy had 153 receiving yards against the Irish.
- Dubois' 143 receiving yards is the third most against the Irish since the start of the 2014 season. Former Cavalier Canaan Severin had the most (153) during the 2015 meeting, while Clemson's Justyn Ross had 148 receiving yards against the Irish in last year's Cotton Bowl semifinal game for the College Football Playoff.

### PERKINS' SECOND HALF AGAINST FLORIDA STATE AIDS THE CAUSE

- QB Bryce Perkins was precision in the second half against Florida State as the Cavaliers were trailing the Seminoles, 14-10, at the half.
- Perkins started the second half connecting on 16-straight passes, two short of tying the UVA record (18 by Michael Rocco vs. Miami, 2012). In the second half he was 17-of-19 passing for 156 yards and one touchdown.
- Perkins also scored the crucial two-point conversion with his feet to put UVA up 31-24 with 2:34 left to play. Perkins had been flushed as far back as the 15-yard line before scrambling and scampering into the end zone.

### VIRGINIA OWNED THE CLOCK IN SECOND HALF AGAINST FLORIDA STATE

- Virginia only had four offensive drives in the second half against Florida State and they ended in punt, touchdown, touchdown and touchdown.
- Of the 30 possible minutes of play in the second half, UVA held possession for 19:12 of it.
- Overall, UVA held possession of the ball against the Seminoles for 39:44, which is the fifth-longest time of possession advantage UVA has had in program history. Four of the Top 10 games of longest TOP have come in the Bronco Mendenhall era at UVA.
- $\bullet$  UVA is No. 1 in the ACC and No. 7 in the nation in time of possession, averaging possession 33:57 per game.

### CAVALIER OFFENSE GRINDS IN THE FOURTH QUARTER VS. FSU

- Virginia had three offensive drives that resulted in touchdowns in the fourth quarter against Florida State.
- Over those three offensive drives the Cavaliers amassed 222 yards of total offense on 28 plays (7.9 yards per play). UVA tallied two 11-play, 75-yard touchdown drives, followed by a six-play, 72-yard touchdown drive that proved to be the game-winning score.

### VIRGINIA IN THE RANKINGS THIS SEASON

- Virginia fell out of the Associated Press Top 25 and USA Today Coaches polls after the loss at Miami. Under Bronco Mendenhall the Cavaliers have been ranked by the AP six times overall, five of which this season.
- This year marked the first time UVA had been ranked five weeks in a row in the Associated Press poll since the 2004 season when the Cavaliers were ranked in every single Associated Press poll.
- It is the first time since 2005 that UVA has been ranked by the Associated Press in the month of September.

### **2019 VIRGINIA FOOTBALL**

### **NICK GRANT'S PICK-6 PROVES PROPHETIC**

- CB Nick Grant notched his first career interception and returned it 85 yards for a touchdown against William & Mary.
- •The redshirt junior came to UVA in 2016 and was prophetic to call that he would return his first career INT for a touchdown. Grant said postgame: "You can ask all of my friends; I told them that my first career pick is going to the crib. It's going to be a touchdown and I've been saying that since my first year of college. It just so happened to come my way my fourth year. I've definitely dreamed about it my whole life. It's a DB's dream."
- Grant's 85-yard interception return is the third-longest in program history and is the fifth-longest in the nation this season. Below are the longest INT returns in FBS this season:

### **HOLLINS SHINES IN OFFENSIVE DEBUT**

- •True freshman running back Mike Hollins scored a touchdown on his first career rush against William & Mary. The nine-yard scoring jaunt made Hollins the first Cavalier since Jordan Ellis (2015) to score a touchdown on his first collegiate rush. Ellis also did so against William & Mary.
- Hollins led UVA off the bench with 78 yards on 11 carries (7.1 average) and two rushing touchdowns.
- · Hollins made his collegiate debut in the opener at Pitt on special teams.

### TRUE FRESHMAN STARTING ON THE DEFENSIVE LINE

- Against Pitt, NT Jowon Briggs became the fifth UVA freshman (true or redshirt) since 1986 to start a season opener on the defensive line. Briggs is also the second in two seasons as teammate NT Jordan Redmond (also a true freshman) did so last year against Richmond. Briggs and Redmond are the first UVA freshmen to start a season opener on the defensive line since 2002 when DE Kwakou Robinson started against Colorado State. The other two UVA freshmen to start an opener on the defensive line are DE Matt Conrath (RS-Fr., 2008 vs. USC) and NT Tim O'Conner (RS-Fr., 1986 vs. South Carolina).
- Briggs was part of UVA's run-stop game, helping limit Pitt to only 78 rushing yards on 30 carries (2.6 ypr).
- Briggs was 17-years old for the season-opener at Pitt, turning 18 on Sept. 1. The team sang him happy birthday on the return flight to Charlottesville after it was officially Sept. 1.

### FOURTEEN UVA TRUE FRESHMEN HAVE MADE DEBUT IN 2019

• Fourteen UVA true freshmen have appeared in a game in 2019. The full list includes: LS Enzo Anthony, DT Jowon Briggs, DB Antonio Clary, DB Fentrell Cypress II, DB Tenyeh Dixon, PK Justin Duenkel, WR Dorien Goddard, RB Mike Hollins, OL Ja'Quay Hubbard, ILB Nick Jackson, OL Jonathan Leech, OLB Jairus Satiu, DE Ben Smiley III and WR Dontayvion Wicks.

### CAVALIER DEFENSE SHUTS DOWN PITT'S RUSHING ATTACK

- Virginia held Pitt to 78 rushing yards on 30 rushes, which was only 2.6 yards per rush.
- During UVA's previous four-game losing streak to Pitt, the Panthers rushed for 780 yards on 166 carries and eight touchdowns. That comes to an average of 195 rushing yards on 41.5 carries (4.7 ypr) and a two-touchdown average during the UVA losing streak to Pitt. The Panthers rushed for 254 yards in the 2018 meeting and 209 yards in the 2016 meeting.
- UVA's defense as a whole was stout in the season opener at Pitt. If you take away the two Pitt scoring drives, which yielded 165 yards of total offense on 21 plays, UVA's defense held the Panthers to 98 yards of total offense on 50 plays (1.96).

### TAULAPAPA PICKS UP THE TAILBACK MANTLE FOR THE CAVALIERS

- Sophomore running back Wayne Taulapapa, who lettered in 2018 on special teams, carried the ball for the first time in his collegiate career at Pitt in the season opener.
- Taulapapa, who made his first career start, rushed 10 times for 66 yards (6.6 ypr) and one touchdown as Virginia looks for a running back to replace 1,000-yard rusher Jordan Ellis from 2018. Taulapapa missed the William & Mary game with an injury.
- Taulapapa is No. 20 in the nation and No. 3 in the ACC with seven rushing touchdowns in 2019.
- Taulapapa is a member of the 2016 recruiting class, but did not enroll until 2018 after serving a two-year LDS mission to Managua, Nicaragua.
- The native of Laie, Hawaii attended Punahou High School in Honolulu. Taulapapa's roundtrip to high school each day was an average of 3.5 hours (1:45 one way) on the road.

### **NASH GRIFFIN SHINES IN PUNTING DEBUT**

- With the graduation of former All-ACC punter Lester Coleman, junior Nash Griffin made his punting debut in the season opener at Pitt. Griffin previously had appeared in 26 games from 2017-18 as UVA's holder. Griffin continues his holding duties in 2019.
- Griffin punted four times against the Panthers and averaged 45.5 yards per punt. Three of his punts went inside the 20-yard line and his long punt went 49 yards.
- Griffin received a day off against William & Mary as the Cavaliers did not punt at all in a game for the first time since 1989 vs. Duke.
- Griffin was high school basketball teammates at Lawrence Central High School in Indianapolis, Ind., with Kyle Guy, the 2019 NCAA Tournament's Most Outstanding Player from Virginia.
- Griffin was roommates for three years at UVA with Kyle Guy before he was drafted (and married) in the second round of the 2019 NBA Draft by the Sacramento Kings.

- PK Brian Delaney was named ACC Specialist of the Week after the Pitt game, while WR Joe Reed earned the same accolade after the William & Mary game.
- QB Bryce Perkins was Co-ACC Quarterback of the Week after the Florida State game.
- OLB Charles Snowden was the Walter Camp National Defensive Player of the Week and the ACC Linebacker of the Week after the Old Dominion game.
- S Joey Blount was named the ACC Defensive Back of the Week after the Duke game.

### **BRONCO MENDENHALL HAS CAREER WINS AGAINST ALL CONFERENCES**

• Bronco Mendenhall has at least one career win against all 10 of the current football conferences.

### BRONCO MENDENHALL LED VIRGINIA TO BACK-TO-BACK BOWLS

- After playing in the Military Bowl in 2017, Bronco Mendenhall led Virginia to back-to-back bowls in 2018 for the first time since 2004 and 2005 after the Cavaliers earned a Belk Bowl invite.
- Mendenhall's Cavalier squad shutout South Carolina, 28-0, in the 2018 Belk Bowl to give UVA its first bowl victory since the 2005 Music City Bowl. UVA's shutout performance was the first over an SEC team in a bowl game by a non-SEC team since the 1975 Gator Bowl.

### **BRONCO MENDENHALL IS IN SPECIAL COMPANY**

- Bronco Mendenhall is one of three active coaches that has inherited at least two programs in his career that were coming off a losing season and in year one, or year two, played in a bowl game. The others to do it are Nick Saban (Alabama, LSU, Michigan State) and Mark Dantonio (Michigan State/Cincinnati).
- Mendenhall inherited a BYU team that went 5-6 in 2004 and in his first season the Cougars went 6-6 and played in the 2005 Las Vegas Bowl. Mendenhall took over a Virginia team that went 4-8 in 2015 and took the Cavaliers to the 2017 Military Bowl in year No. 2, finishing 6-7.

### **RETURN OF THE MACK**

- Senior inside linebacker Jordan Mack is UVA's leading returning tackler after finishing 2018 with 66 tackles. Despite missing four games with an injury in 2018, he still finished No. 2 on the team in stops behind current NFL safety Juan Thornhill (98).
- Mack is on the 2019 Bronko Nagurski Trophy Watch List and a semifinalist for the 2019 Campbell Trophy.
- Mack enters 2019 No. 2 in the ACC among active career tackle leaders with 220 stops (No. 17 nationally). Miami's Shaquille Quarterman (249) is the only ACC player with more career tackles entering 2019.
- He finished No. 5 in the ACC with 114 tackles in 2017 (No. 26 nationally). Joining 2017 Campbell Trophy winner Micah Kiser, an All-American, and fellow All-American Quin Blanding, Mack was a part of the only "Power 5" trio (one of two in FBS) to each have at least 100 tackles in the same season.
- Mack's older brother, Charles, is on staff at UVA as a regional scout for the football program. Charles was a four-year letterwinner at Richmond and was on the field for the Spiders when Jordan made his collegiate debut in 2016. Jordan and Charles' father, Charles Mack Sr., played football at Georgia Tech (1983-87).

### **REED IS SPECIAL ON "SPECIAL TEAMS"**

- WR Joe Reed owns UVA's career all-time kick return yardage record with 2,837 career kick return yards.
- Reed also led UVA in 2018 in special teams tackles with seven. He has made five on kickoffs and two on punt returns.
- In 2018, Reed returned 26 kicks for 707 yards (27.2 yards per return), which was No. 2 in the ACC and No. 10 nationally. In 2017, Reed returned 29 kicks for 861 yards (29.7 yards per return), which was No. 1 in the ACC and No. 8 nationally.

- The song Jana set out to learn to play for his mom was Brian McKnight's "Crazy Love."

### CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIFINALIST HELPS WITH LOCAL CAFE

- ILB Jordan Mack is a semifinalist for the prestigious Campbell Trophy (Academic Heisman). He was named one of 185 semifinalists (six in the ACC) on Sept. 25.
- A community involvement he is passionate about is his work with the Kindness Café + Play, which is a café in Charlottesville that employs people with cognitive disabilities, creating a space where people with and without disabilities interact as peers and where connections are made. Jordan's volunteer work with the café includes marketing and promotion of the café locally about the need for such an endeavor in the community.

### HAILING FROM THE GRAND CANYON STATE; IT'S AN ASU CONNECTION

- QB Bryce Perkins and graduate transfer WR Terrell Chatman were both part of the same recruiting class at Arizona State in 2015. Both current Cavaliers utilized a redshirt year with the Sun Devils in 2015.
- Perkins spent two seasons at ASU before transferring to Arizona Western JC for the 2017 season, followed by his move to Virginia in 2018. Chatman comes to Virginia after graduating last spring from Arizona State.
- Perkins and Chatman hit it off immediately through the recruiting process and were even roommates in Tempe. The duo are rommates again, this time in Charlottesville.
- Also, UVA's current director of football development & performance, Shawn Griswold, was the head coach for sports performance at Arizona State from 2012-17, working with both Perkins and Chatman. Griswold has been at UVA since 2018.

### SCOTT STADIUM, HOME OF THE CAVALIERS

The Carl Smith Center, home of David A. Harrison III Field at Scott Stadium, with its unique architectural design, scenic setting on the University's Grounds and exceptional sight lines, is one of the nation's finest college football settings.

Opened in 1931, Scott Stadium might be one of the oldest campus college football stadiums in the nation, but you could never tell from its appearance. Numerous upgrades and expansions make it a modern home for the Cavaliers and their fans.

Scott Stadium was the gift of Frederic William Scott and Elisabeth Strother Scott, and was dedicated to the memory of his parents, Frederic Robert Scott and Frances Branch Scott.

Virginia played its dedication game at Scott Stadium on Oct. 15, 1931 against the Virginia Military Institute before a then-capacity crowd of 22,000. Prior to that season, the Cavaliers staged their home games at the University's Lambeth Field. Virginia has played 474 games in the historic venue. UVA's all-time record at Scott Stadium stands at 269-193-12.

## **BRYCE PERKINS NOTES**

- IT IS A PERK TO HAVE BRYCE AT QUARTERBACK

   QB Bryce Perkins returns to Charlottesville for his senior season after breaking UVA's single-season record for total offense during his first season on Grounds with 3,603 total yards in 2018. Perkins broke the previous record by 459 yards, which was set a year earlier by Kurt Benkert.
- Perkins was one of two players in the nation with 2,600+ passing yards (2,680) and 900+ rushing yards (923), joining Heisman Trophy winner Kyler Murray (Oklahoma) in 2018.
- In fact, since the year 2000, Perkins and Murray are the only players in the nation in a single season to complete at least 64 percent of their passes, while also throwing for 2,000+ yards, rushing for 900+ yards and being responsible for at least 30 touchdowns.
- Perkins transferred to UVA in January 2018 from Arizona Western Community College after leading the Matadors to the 2017 NJCAA Championship game, before falling 31-28 to East Mississippi.
- Perkins originally signed as a top recruit with hometown Arizona State, but never saw action during his two seasons in Tempe. He redshirted the 2015 season and missed the 2016 season with an injury.

  Perkins' father, Bruce, lettered at Arizona State in 1988 and 1989 as a fullback
- and later played briefly in the NFL. Perkins' older brother, Paul, was a three-year letterwinner at running back with the UCLA Bruins and currently plays with the Detroit Lions. Perkins' uncle, Don Perkins, played eight seasons in the NFL with the Cowboys.



### PRO FOOTBALL FOCUS RATING BRYCE HALL

- Hall finished with an overall grade of 91.2 that included a coverage grade of 91.4, both of which lead all returning FBS cornerbacks, a group of 349 players who logged at least 200 snaps a season ago.
- There is no better returning cornerback from a season ago when it comes to tracking passes in the intermediate to deep range of the field, those passes targeted at least 10 yards downfield. Hall was targeted 44 times on throws in that range, allowing just 14 receptions while he came away with two interceptions and recorded 18 forced incompletions.
- According to PFF "Hall may be more important to his team's success than any other non-offensive player in the country."

### HALL OF SPEED CLOCKED AT 22.3 MPH

- Hall was clocked at 22.3 mph via the Catapult system he was wearing when he made a touchdown-saving tackle on Miami's Travis Homer, a rush that went for 70 yards in the 2018 meeting at Scott Stadium.
- Hall's touchdown-saving tackle eventually forced Miami to kick a field goal in a game UVA won over the then-No. 16 Hurricanes, 16-13.

### HALL ANCHORS VIRGINIA SECONDARY

- CB Bryce Hall returns for his senior season after earning second-team All-America honors in 2018 when he led the nation with 22 pass breakups and 24 passes defended.
- According to Pro Football Focus (PFF), Hall led the ACC in forced incompletion percentage (31.9 percent) in 2018. PFF has Hall ranked as the No. 1 defensive player in the country entering 2019 and the No. 4 FBS player overall.
- According to PFF, Hall ranked tied for first with LSU's Kristian Fulton in forced incompletion percentage (38.9 percent) in Cover-0 and Cover-1 looks
- Hall allowed just 2.9 yards after the catch in 2018 and had eight performances in which he held opposing receivers in his coverage to just single-digit yards after catch numbers.
- Hall has five career interceptions, three of which have come against former Duke quarterback and 2019 NFL first rounder Daniel Jones (Giants, sixth overall). Jones tossed nine interceptions in his three career games against Virginia.

# Bronco Mendenhall Head Coach • Fourth Season

Bronco Mendenhall is in his fourth season as Virginia's head football coach after being named the program's 40th head coach on Dec. 4, 2015.

Mendenhall enters the 2019 season with a career record of 115-65, which includes a 99-43 mark in 11 seasons as the head coach at BYU. Between UVA and BYU, Mendenhall has led his teams to bowl games in 13-of-14 seasons as a head coach. That 92.9 percent rate ranks tied for No. 3 among active FBS head coaches with at least 10 years of FBS coaching.

After playing in the Military Bowl in 2017, Mendenhall led Virginia to back-to-back bowls in 2018 for the first time since

2004 and 2005 after the Cavaliers earned a Belk Bowl invite. Mendenhall's Cavalier squad shutout South Carolina, 28-0, in the 2018 Belk Bowl to give UVA its first bowl victory since the 2005 Music City Bowl. UVA's shutout performance was the first over an SEC team in a bowl game by a non-SEC team since the 1975 Gator Bowl.

Mendenhall is one of three active coaches that has inherited at least two programs in his career that were coming off a losing season and in year one, or year two, played in a bowl game. The others to do it are Nick Saban (Alabama, LSU, Michigan State) and Mark Dantonio (Michigan State/Cincinnati).

Year number three under Mendenhall saw great strides in performance on the field. UVA's defense finished No. 20 in the country and No. 3 in the ACC, allowing 330.5 yards per game, while finishing No. 21 in the nation and No. 3 in the ACC in scoring defense (20.1). UVA's defense finished No. 16 in the nation and No. 2 in the ACC in fewest passing yards allowed and the offense finished No. 6 in the nation and No. 1 in the ACC in third-down conversion percentage.

With Bryce Perkins at quarterback, UVA scored 370 points in 2018, which ranks No. 3 all-time for the Cavaliers. Perkins and Heisman Trophy winner Kyler Murray (Oklahoma) were the only players in the nation with 2,600+ passing yards and 900+ rushing yards. Under Mendenhall in 2018, Bryce Hall earned second-team All-America honors from both the Walter Camp Foundation and the Football Writers Association of America. Hall led the nation with 22 pass breakups and 24 passes defended. Hall, SS Juan Thornhill and HB Olamide Zaccheaus all earned first-team All-ACC accolades, leading UVA's eight selections. Thornhill finished 2018 No. 3 in the nation with six interceptions and Zaccheaus, the 2018 Belk Bowl MVP, was No. 1 in the ACC with 93 receptions (a UVA single-season record).

Zaccheaus leaves UVA with a program-record 250 career receptions, which ranks No. 6 all-time in ACC history.

Mendenhall came to Charlottesville after 11 years as the head coach at Brigham Young University. In his 11 seasons, from 2005-2015, Mendenhall compiled an overall record of 99-43 at BYU to rank 12th in total wins among all FBS teams during that time.

In the three seasons prior to Mendenhall becoming the head coach at BYU, the Cougars compiled an overall record of 14-21. Over Mendenhall's 11 years at BYU, the Cougars were one of only 11 programs to advance to a bowl game each season (includes the 2015 season). BYU joined by Alabama, Boise State, Clemson, Florida State, Georgia, LSU, Oklahoma, Oregon, Virginia Tech and Wisconsin on that list.

Among those 11 teams, only Florida State has achieved more bowl wins (seven) than BYU's six bowl game victories.

The success of Mendenhall's leadership approach in running the BYU football program was highlighted in a management book, Running Into the Wind: Bronco Mendenhall — 5 Strategies for Building a Successful Team, written by Alyson Von Feldt and Paul Gustavson, a leading management consultant specializing in leadership development and organizational design.

Mendenhall was elected in 2013 to the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees as the District 8 Representative and also serves on the AFCA Ethics Committee.

Mendenhall and his wife, Holly, have three sons, Raeder, Breaker and Cutter.

#### **Game Notes**

- UVA is 30-6-1 all-time against William & Mary.
- UVA is 24-4 all-time against William & Mary at home.
- UVA scored 21 points in the first quarter for the first time since the 2018 Ohio game in Nashville.
- UVA's 35 points in the first half are tied for No. 9 all-time for the first half in UVA history.
- UVA scored in all three phases of the game (offense, defense, special teams) for the first time since Sept. 21, 2002 against Akron.
- Virginia scored 50+ points in a game for the first time since beating Temple in 2005, 51-3.
- Virginia has scored on each of its opening drives in the first and second halves in both games this season. At Pitt UVA scored field goals in its opening possessions of each half. Against William & Mary, UVA tallied touchdowns.
- $\bullet$  UVA's defense has not allowed an offensive touchdown in 10 of the last 12 quarters played.
- UVA did not punt in a game for the first time since 1989 against Duke.

CB Nick Grant collected his first career interception in the first quarter. He returned it 85 yards for a touchdown. It was the third-longest return in UVA program history.

- Grant's interception for a touchdown was the first by a Cavalier since Quin Blanding returned one 58 yards against Duke in 2017.
