FOR OPENERS

- UVA begins its 115th season of men's basketball, sporting a 1,632-1,168 (.583) all-time record.
- The Cavaliers are the first defending NCAA champion to open the next season with a true road game since UCLA opened the 1967-68 season at Purdue.
- UVA is 20-1 in its last 21 season-opening games, including a 73-42 win against Towson last season.
- Virginia has a six-game winning streak on opening night and is 9-1 in season openers under head coach Tony Bennett.
- The lone opening-night loss under Bennett came at George Mason (63-59) to begin the 2012-13 campaign.
- The Cavaliers are 92-22 all-time in 114 season-opening games.

UVA RANKED NO. 11/9 IN PRESEASON RANKINGS

- Virginia is ranked No. 11 in the Associated Press preseason poll and No. 9 in the USA Today Coaches' preseason poll, respectively.
- UVA has been ranked in the top 25 in the preseason rankings in seven of the past eight seasons.
- Dating back to 2017-18, UVA has been ranked in the AP poll for 36 straight weeks and had been ranked in the top 10 in each of the past 31 polls.

- The Cavaliers have an 11-game winning streak in ACC openers and are 10-0 in ACC openers under head coach Tony Bennett.
- Virginia is 31-35 all-time in ACC openers.
- The Cavaliers posted a 65-52 win against Florida State in last year's ACC season opener at John Paul Jones Arena.

ALL-TIME VS. THE ORANGE

- UVA is 7-5 all-time against Syracuse, including a 6-1 mark in ACC action, in the series that dates back to 1983-84.
- Virginia owns a three-game winning streak in the series, including a 79-53 win at Syracuse last season.
- The Cavaliers are 3-2 against the Orange at the Carrier Dome.
- UVA has held the Orange to 68 or fewer points in each of the last eight meetings between the teams.
- Head coach Tony Bennett is 6-2 all-time against Syracuse.

LAST TIME VS. THE ORANGE

- Then-No. 2 Virginia matched a school record with 18 3-pointers in its 79-53 win at Syracuse on Monday, March 4, 2019.
- Kyle Guy drilled a career-high 8 of 10 3-pointers en route to a game-high 25 points.

- Ty Jerome had 16 points and UVA record-tying 14 assists for his third career double-double.
- De'Andre Hunter (21 points) had career-bests with five 3-pointers and three blocked shots.
- Guy, Jerome and Hunter became the first trio of teammates in ACC history to make five or more 3-pointers in the same game.
- UVA trailed 34-32 at halftime before going on a 24-3 run in the second half to pull away from the Orange.

VIRGINIA PICKED FOURTH IN THE ACC

- Virginia was picked to finish fourth in the ACC preseason poll.
- The Cavaliers, who were picked second and finished first last season, have finished at or higher than their predicted finish in 10 of the last 11 seasons.
- Duke is the preseason favorite, followed by North Carolina, Louisville, Virginia, Florida State, NC State, Notre Dame, Syracuse, Miami, Pitt, Clemson, Georgia Tech, Boston College, Virginia Tech and Wake Forest.

HOO ARE THESE CAVALIERS?

- Mamadi Diakite, Kihei Clark, Braxton Key and Jay Huff headline Virginia's top returnees from last season's NCAA championship and ACC regular-season title team.
- Diakite started 22 games and is UVA's top returning scorer at 7.4 points per game. Diakite averaged 10.5 points, 8.2 rebounds & 2.7 blocked shots in the 2019 NCAA Tournament.
- Clark started 22 games and averaged 4.5 points and 2.6 assists during his freshman campaign.
- Key is UVA's top returning rebounder (5.3 per game), while Huff (4.4 ppg, 2.1 rpg) showed promise during limited action in 2018-19.
- Kody Stattmann and newcomers Casey Morsell and Tomas Woldetensae will take the minutes left by Ty Jerome, Kyle Guy and De'Andre Hunter on the perimeter.
- Stattman averaged 4.1 minutes in 18 games as a freshman. while Morsell tallied 17 points per game as a high school senior and Woldetensae averaged 17.3 points at Indian Hills Community
- Freshman Justin McKoy provides frontcourt depth, while freshman walk-on Chase Coleman could earn minutes in the backcourt.
- Redshirt freshman Francisco Caffaro is out with a leg injury.
- Recruited walk-ons Austin Katstra and Jayden Nixon provide depth.
- Forward Kadin Shedrick is expected to redshirt this season, while Sam Hauser will sit out the season after transferring from Marquette.

VIRGINIA HEAD COACH TONY BENNETT

- Three-time National and four-time ACC Coach of the Year Tony Bennett has a 254-89 (.741) mark in 10 seasons at Virginia and 323-122 (.726) career mark in 13 seasons.
- In 2018-19, Bennett led the Cavaliers to their first NCAA national championship, a share of their ninth ACC regular-season title and school-record 35 wins.
- Bennett became the 80th active Division I head coach to win his 300th career game against Marshall on Dec. 31, 2018.
- Bennett was named the USBWA Henry Iba National Coach of the Year for the third time in 2018 to rank second all-time behind legendary John Wooden, who captured the award six times.
- He has led UVA to outright ACC regular-season and tournament championships in the same season two times (2014 and 2018).
- Bennett has guided UVA to six straight NCAA Tournament appearances for the first time in school history and has led UVA to 29 or more wins for the fifth time in the past six seasons.
- Bennett is the sixth coach in ACC history to win at least three outright ACC regular-season titles (Frank McGuire, Vic Bubas, Dean Smith, Mike Krzyzewski and Roy Williams).
- Bennett has led UVA to a school-best 16 or more ACC wins in four of the last six seasons and a school-record seven straight seasons with 11 or more ACC wins.
- He has led UVA to a school-best eight straight 20-win seasons.
- Bennett has guided UVA to a school-record 89 wins over three seasons two times (2014-16 and 2017-19).
- Bennett has led UVA to seven consecutive postseason tournaments (NCAA in 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017 and 2018 and NIT in 2013).
- Bennett has led the Cavaliers to 30 wins in back-to-back seasons two times (2014-2015 and 2018-19).
- UVA is 133-36 (.787) in non-conference action, 121-53 (.695) in ACC play and 143-26 (.846) at home under Tony Bennett.
- Bennett ranks fifth all-time in winning percentage at .695, among ACC head coaches with 100 or more ACC regular-season wins.

ABOUT THE 2019-20 SCHEDULE

- Four of Virginia's opponents are ranked in the AP Top-25 preseason poll (Duke, Louisville, North Carolina and Purdue), while four (Florida State, Notre Dame, Syracuse and NC State) received votes.
- The Cavaliers will play 13 games against 2019 NCAA Tournament teams: home games against Duke, Florida State, Louisville, North Carolina, Syracuse, Vermont and Virginia Tech; road contests at Florida State, Louisville, North Carolina, Purdue, Syracuse and Virginia Tech.
- UVA will meet First Four NCAA Tournament teams Arizona State or St. John's in the Air Force Reserve Tip-Off Tournament on Nov. 24.
- Two opponents (Clemson and NC State) participated in the 2019 National Invitation Tournament.

OUR DEFENSE NEVER RESTS

- UVA captured its fifth NCAA scoring defense title after limiting opponents to 56.1 points per game in 2018-19.
- The Cavaliers limited 11 opponents to fewer than 50 points.
- UVA held 27 opponents to 40 percent or less field goal shooting and 28 opponents to 33 percent or less 3-point shooting.
- The Cavaliers forced 31 shot clock violations.
- UVA out-rebounded 30 opponents.
- Bennett-coached teams have led the nation in scoring defense six times and finished in the top-five nationally in 10 of 13 seasons.

DIAKITE EARNS PRESEASON ALL-ACC HONORS

- Mamadi Diakite was named the preseason All-ACC first team.
- Diakite was joined on the All-ACC first team by preseason ACC Player of the Year Jordan Nwora (Louisville), Tre Jones (Duke), Cole Anthony (North Carolina) and John Mooney (Notre Dame).

WATCH ME NOW

- Kihei Clark (Bob Cousy Award) and Mamadi Diakite (Karl Malone Award) were named to Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame preseason award top-20 watch lists.
- The Cousy Award honors the nation's top point guard, while the Malone Award honors the top power forward.
- Diakite was also one of 50 players named to the Naismith Trophy Player of the Year watch list and one of 20 players named to the NABC Division I Player of the Year preseason watch list.
- Diakite was also named to the Wooden Award Preseason Top 50

2018-19 IN REVIEW

- Virginia claimed its first NCAA National Championship.
- The Cavaliers had a school-record 35 wins.
- UVA captured a share of its ninth ACC regular-season title.
- \bullet The Cavaliers earned their fifth No. 1 seed for the ACC Tournament.
- The Cavaliers advanced to their third NCAA Final Four (1981, 1984, 2019), seventh Elite Eight (first since 2016) and 10th Sweet 16.
 Virginia has 29 or more wins in five of the last six seasons.
- UVÅ is 64-6 in past two seasons (31-3 & 35-3) becoming second ACC program with no more than three losses in consecutive seasons (NC State 73-74).
- UVA won 25 or more games for the ninth time with five of the nine under 10th year head coach Tony Bennett.
- UVA won 23 or more games for a school-best seventh straight year.
- UVA won 16 or more ACC games for the fourth time (2014, 2015, 2018, 2019).
- The Cavaliers have won 11 or more ACC games for a school-record seven consecutive seasons.
- UVA has won 15 or more home games in six of the last seven years.
 UVA has captured an ACC-record five ranked road wins, tied for most all-time with UConn (1998-99).
- UVA set a school record with 11 wins vs. ranked opponents.

HOLDING FOES UNDER 50

- Virginia held 11 opponents (11-0) to fewer than 50 points in 2018-19 and is 87-2 when achieving the mark in the Tony Bennett era.
- Bennett-coached teams are 112-3 when holding opponents to fewer than 50 points (25-1 in three years at Washington State).
- UVA is 23-0 under Bennett when limiting foes to 40 or fewer points.

UVA VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

- UVA is 42-34 against ranked opponents in the Tony Bennett era, including an 11-3 mark in 2018-19.
- UVA's 11 ranked wins are a school record.
- The Cavaliers posted an ACC-record five ranked wins on the road in 2018-19, which tied UConn (1998-99) for the most all-time in poll history since 1948-49.
- UVA posted back-to-back wins vs. ranked opponents two times (Wisconsin and Maryland and Virginia Tech and Louisville) for the first time in the regular season since 1982 (Georgetown and Houston)
- The Cavaliers are 156-329 vs. ranked opponents since 1953-54.
- UVA is 1-30 all-time vs. No. 1-ranked opponents (86-73 win vs. No. 1 North Carolina on Jan. 30, 1986).

RECORDS WATCH

- Mamadi Diakite enters this season ranked sixth on Virginia's career blocked shot list with 118.
- Diakite needs seven blocked shots to pass Kris Hunter (125 blocked shots from 1997-99) for fifth on the list.
- \bullet Diakite's 63 blocked shots in 2018–19 rank sixth on UVA's all-time single-season list.

THE ELECTRIC 70s AND AWESOME 80s

- Virginia scored 70 or more points in 21 games (19-2) last season and is 125-8 when scoring at least 70 points under Tony Bennett.
- UVA scored 80 or more points in nine games (9-0) and is 35-1 when scoring 80 or more points under Bennett with its lone loss a 93-81 decision at North Carolina in 2012-13.
- Bennett was 4-0 when scoring 80+ points at Washington State.
- UVA scored 100 points against Marshall for the first time under Tony Bennett and added 97 points against Coppin State.
- UVA is 4-0 all-time when scoring 90 or more points under Bennett.

CAVALIERS IN THE NBA

- Malcolm Brogdon (Indiana), Joe Harris (Brooklyn), De'Andre Hunter (Atlanta), Ty Jerome (Phoenix) and Mike Scott (Philadelphia) are former Cavaliers who are playing in the NBA this season.
- Brodgon, who earned NBA Rookie of the Year honors for Milwaukee in 2016-17, is in his fourth season and first with Indiana.
