### CAVALIERS AT THE NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

- UVA is making its 11th straight appearance at the NCAA Championships.
- The Cavaliers' best finish in the NCAA Championships under head coach Steve Garland is 15th in the 2010 season.
- Senior George DiCamillo is making his fourth appearance at the NCAA Championships after competing in 2013, 2015 and 2016.
- Making his third appearance at the NCAA Championships is junior Andrew Atkinson at 157 pounds. Atkinson also competed in 2015 and 2016.
- Sam Krivus and Jack Mueller are making their first NCAA Championship appearances at 149 and 125 pounds, respectively.

### UVA AT THE 2016 NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

- Virginia sent five wrestlers to the 2016 NCAA Championships in Madison Square Garden: Nick Herrmann (125), DiCamillo (133), Atkinson (157), Zach Nye (197) and Pat Gillen (285).
- DiCamillo went 2-2 as the 6th seed at 133 pounds, being eliminated by Utah Valley's Jade Rauser on Friday evening.
- Atkinson went 0-2 in 2016, falling to No. 9 seed Richie Lewis of Rutgers and Spartak Chino of Ohio in the wrestlebacks.

### CAVALIERS VS. THE NCAA TOURNAMENT FIELD

- All four UVA wrestlers have familiar faces throughout the brackets from the season. DiCamillo and Krivus both faced seven wrestlers in their respective brackets in 2017, while Mueller faced eight and Atkinson faced 13.
- At 125 pounds, Mueller wrestled eight matches against NCAA Tournament participants, including four against seeded wrestlers. He went 4-4 in those matches.
- At 141 pounds, DiCamillo wrestled 12 matches against those seven NCAA participants, including twice each against Kevin Jack, Joey Ward and Jaydin Eirmann. DiCamillo went 8-4 in those 12 matches.
- At 149 pounds, Krivus wrestled eight matches against seven wrestlers who were selected for the NCAA Tournament. Krivus went 3-5 in those matches, including splitting two matches with NC State's Sam Speno.
- At 157 pounds, Atkinson faced 13 wrestlers selected for the 2017 NCAA Championships for a total of 16 matches. The junior went 7-9 in those matches, including twice facing Jake Faust (Duke) and Sal Mastriani (VT).

### QUICK NOTES

- 2017 marks the 11th consecutive season for UVA to compete at the NCAA Championships.
- The Cavaliers have four wrestlers in the field with Jack Mueller (125), George DiCamillo (141), Sam Krivus (149) and Andrew Atkinson (157).
- Senior George DiCamillo is looking to earn All-America honors for the first time in his career after narrowly missing in the previous two seasons, going 2-2.
- Two UVA wrestlers are seeded in the event, with Mueller seeded No. 10 at 125 pounds and DiCamillo seeded sixth at 141 pounds.
- Krivus and Mueller make their first appearance, Atkinson makes his third and DiCamillo makes his fourth.

## FAMILIAR MATCHUPS LOOM FOR CAVALIERS

- In his first round matchup at 157 pounds, Andrew Atkinson will face 10th-seeded Colin Heffernan of CMU. They faced off in a dual meet in November with Heffernan taking an 8-6 decision.
- Should both win their first-round match, 10-seed Jack Mueller would face 7th-seeded Sean Russell (Edinboro) in the second round. Mueller defeated Russell 6-2 at the Southern Scuffle. Should he advance twice, a potential matchup with 2nd-seeded Joey Dance looms at 125 lbs.

## DICAMILLO CLIMBING WINS LEDGER

- Redshirt senior George DiCamilo has hit the century mark for career wins, passing 100 wins at the Southern Scuffle to open the new year.
- DiCamillo holds 111 wins heading into the 2017 NCAA Championships, putting him tied for fifth with Rocco

- With one wins, DiCamillo can move into a tie for fourth all-time with Tim Foley (1999-2004) who posted 112 wins in his career.

## HOOS EMBRACE ROLE OF ROAD WARRIORS

- Virginia embraced the role of road warriors in the 2016-17 season and are hoping that experience can be helpful in the postseason.
- The Cavaliers wrestled 16 opponents this season with 12-of-16 coming away from home. UVA only wrestled four teams at home across three home dates.
- Of the Cavaliers' 12 road contests, five were against nationally-ranked foes, including the first two duals at No. 11 Michigan and No. 17 Central Michigan.
- Virginia's three home dates were scattered on Nov. 20 (Lock Haven, Maryland), Jan. 29 (No. 7 NC State) and Feb. 12 (No. 24 Pitt).

## MUELLER AMONG NCAA STATISTICAL LEADERS

- True freshman Jack Mueller enters this weekend's NCAA Championships ranked atop the NCAA in tech falls with 11 in 43:02.
- Mueller led the nation for most of the season before Wisconsin's Connor Medbury briefly took the national lead with 11.
- Mueller's 11 tech falls have come in 43:02, putting him ahead of Medbury who has 11 in 51:20.

## LIGHTER WEIGHTS DRIVE UVA SUCCESS IN 2017

- It's no secret the driving force in Virginia success this season has been the lighter weights - driven by success of Mueller and DiCamillo.
- The lower five weight classes for UVA have combined for a 107-39 record (54-24 in duals) with practically no

changes in lineup through 16 duals. The lineup remained constant for UVA with only Krivus and Atkinson missing one dual each.

## BONUS-POINT WINS THE NORM FOR MUELLER

- Bonus-point victories have been the norm for freshman Jack Mueller as the 125-pounder has turned heads.
- In all, 18-of-24 victories for Mueller have been bonus point victories, including 11 tech fall wins.
- Mueller is undefeated in when the victory is by fall (4-0) and technical fall (11-0). He has a winning record in major decisions (3-2).

## CAVALIERS PUSH TOWARD MASTERS DEGREES

- Five members of the 2016-17 Cavalier squad are currently working toward master's degrees, continuing a tradition established under Steve Garland.
- Currently, Ray Bethea (Higher Education), Chuck Boddy and Chris Yankowich (Commerce), and Will Mason and M.J. Roberson (Kinesiology) are working toward a master's degree.
- Since 2008, 28 Cavaliers will have earned master's degrees while wrestling for Steve Garland.

## ALL-AMERICA COACHING STAFF

- Virginia's coaching staff consists of three former All-Americans, including a pair of national champions.
- Head coach Steve Garland was the national runner-up at 125 pounds in 2000.
- Associate head coach Jordan Leen was the 2008 national champion at 157 pounds for Cornell.
- First-year assistant coach Mark Ellis was the 2009 national champ at heavyweight for Missouri and a two-time All-American.

## VIRGINIA HEAD COACH STEVE GARLAND

- Head coach Steve Garland is in his 11th year at the helm of his alma mater.
- In his tenure Garland has posted an 142-67 dual record and is the second winningest coach in program history.
- His UVa wrestlers have won eight All-America honors and 16 individual ACC titles.
- Garland guided UVA to six straight top-30 finishes at the NCAA Championships (2000-15), marking the first time UVA has recorded six straight NCAA top-30 finishes in program history.
- The 2010 ACC Coach of the Year, Garland led Virginia to an ACC championship and a 15th-place finish at NCAAs in 2010 (UVA's best NCAA finish since 1957).
- He is an alum of the program and was the NCAA runner-up at 125 pounds in 2000 and the 1997 ACC champ at 126 pounds.
