OPENING KICK

THE SOUTH'S OLDEST RIVALRY

- Virginia and North Carolina will meet for the 123rd time in the South's Oldest Rivalry, a series that began in 1892.
- UVA is looking for its first win over UNC at Scott Stadium since a 16-13 overtime triumph ten years ago (Oct. 18, 2008).

VIRGINIA VS. NORTH CAROLINA

- UVA trails the all-time series with North Carolina, 63-55-4.
- There is a difference in the series record between the two schools because of the game in 1956 that North Carolina forfeited for using an ineligible player. All of UNC's games in 1956 were forfeited by conference action. Both schools count the 1956 game as a win.
- Saturday's game will tie the rivalry for the second-longest series in NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision history.
- The two schools have met every season since 1919 and there have been only four seasons since 1900 when they did not meet (1906, 1909 and 1917-18, when football was postponed at both schools because of World War I).

FIVE TOP STORYLINES

- The Cavaliers have faced the Tar Heels more than any other school (122) in program history.
- Virginia is one win away from being bowl-eligible for the second year in a row. UVA has not been bowl-eligible in back-to-back years since going to four bowls in a row from 2002-05.
- UVA's defense has been solid at Scott Stadium, allowing five field goals and one touchdown in 12 quarters of play at home in 2018.
- HB **Olamide Zaccheaus** needs eight receptions to break **Billy McMullen's** UVA career record of 210.
- **Zaccheaus** is the only active player in the nation with at least 2,000 career receiving yards (2,277) and 450 career rushing yards (496). There is no other active player that even has 1,500 career receiving yards and 450 career rushing yards.

#NewStandard: BY THE NUMBERS

- 16** CB Bryce Hall is No. 1 in the ACC and No. 2 in the nation with 16 passes defended. He has 11 pass breakups and one interception.
- 36** HB Olamide Zaccheaus has a reception in 36-straight games. The streak started in Miami against the Hurricanes on Nov. 7, 2015.
- 123** Saturday is the 123rd meeting between UVA and UNC, making the series the Oldest Rivalry in the South.

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

The first documented Cavalier on horseback was Francis Bell, a Virginia student from Dublin, Va., in 1947. Bell rode onto the field dressed as Cavaliers for Virginia's home football game with Harvard on the afternoon of October 11.

The Cavalier on horseback returned as the University's mascot in 1963. The UVA Polo Club provided both the horse and rider. However, the mounted Cavalier and his horse parted company in 1974 with the inception of AstroTurf at Scott Stadium.

The mounted Cavalier made its return in the Florida Citrus Bowl at the end of the 1989 football season. Due to its instant popularity, the Cavalier on horseback returned the following season on a regular basis and continues to lead the Virginia football team onto the field at the beginning of all home games.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

THE MOST OFFENSE TYPICALLY WINS

- In UVA vs. UNC games since 1940, the winning team has out-rushed the loser 57 of 75 times, with one game featuring the same yardage for both.
- The winning team has had more offensive yards 69 times and has been outgained just 15 times since 1940. UVA was the most recent team (2014) to outgain UNC and lose (443-374).
- The loser has outgained the winner just eight times since 1975, but it has happened six times in the last 17 years, including in 2007, 2008, 2011 and 2014.

ON THE GROUND

- Since 2006, the Tar Heels have averaged 138.7 rushing yards per game vs. the Cavaliers, with UVA winning five of the last 11 meetings.
- Since 1996, UNC has scored 19 rushing touchdowns with three coming in 2015 and two coming in 1997, 2011 and 2016. In contrast, UVA has scored 30 times on the ground in that span.
- In the last 22 games, UNC's offense has scored 53 touchdowns, with 35 coming in six games (1997, 2002, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2016), while the defense has scored nine touchdowns (eight interceptions and one punt return).

TURNOVERS MAKE A DIFFERENCE

- Since 1982, the Cavaliers are 16-3-1 when committing fewer turnovers than the Tar Heels. The losses occurred in 1995, 2001 and 2016, while the tie was in 1984.
- Over the last 10 years, North Carolina has committed 18 turnovers, while UVA has committed 21 (which includes 10 combined from the 2010 & 2015 games).
- North Carolina is 10-2 vs. Virginia when committing fewer turnovers.
- There have been four games since 1982 where each team committed the same number of miscues and Virginia has won three (1985, 1988, 2003).

FIRST FAMILY TAKES IN 1928 MEETING

- President Calvin Coolidge and his wife, Grace, attended the 1928 Virginia vs. North Carolina Thanksgiving Day football game at UVA's Lambeth Field. The President was joined by the governors of both Virginia (Gov. Harry F. Byrd) and North Carolina (H.W. Chase). Over 20,000 spectators attended UNC's 24-20 win 90 years ago. Lambeth Field's grandstand only sat 8,000. Additional temporary bleachers helped hold the overflow crowd.

NATURE OF THE RIVALRY

- There is a strong historical lineage and academic standing between UVA and UNC.
- UVA was founded by Thomas Jefferson, the third President of the United States, while UNC was the first operational state university in the United States.
- UVA had its writer-in-residence William Faulkner, while UNC is the alma mater of Thomas Wolfe.
- President Woodrow Wilson attended UVA and was president of the Jefferson Literary and Debating Society, while President James K. Polk attended UNC.
- UVA and UNC were also the first future members of the ACC to be elected to the prestigious Association of American Universities. UVA was elected in 1904 and UNC in 1922.
- UVA was the opponent for the dedication game at UNC's Kenan Stadium in 1927.
- Kenan Stadium was used as a model by the designers of Scott Stadium.

Last Meeting

Kurt Benkert passed for 249 yards and two touchdowns to help Virginia beat North Carolina 20-14 the last time these teams met.

Jordan Ellis rushed for 136 yards for the Cavaliers, who were off to their best start since 2007. Virginia snapped its seven-game losing streak against North Carolina with its fourth consecutive victory overall.

Chris Peace sacked North Carolina's Brandon Harris on fourth down with 1:07 left to seal the win.

The Cavaliers took the lead for good on an 81-yard touchdown catch by Olamide Zaccheaus in the third quarter.

Michael Carter rushed for a 157 yards and two touchdowns for North Carolina. Carter ran for 127 yards and both of his scores in the third quarter as the Tar Heels came back from a 10-0 halftime deficit.

North Carolina lost its fourth straight game despite a change at quarterback.

The Cavalier defense held UNC to just four first downs and 75 yards of offense at halftime.

PEACE LEADS ACC LINEBACKERS IN SACKS/TFLS

- OLB Chris Peace leads the ACC's linebackers with 5.0 sacks and is tied for No. 8 among the nation's linebackers.
- Peace also shares the ACC lead for TFLs by a linebacker with 9.0. He is tied with Miami's Shaquille Quarterman.
- Peace led the ACC's linebackers in 2017 with 7.5 sacks.
- Peace is the only Cavalier who has started all 32 games of the Bronco Mendenhall era at UVA.

DEFENSE STRONG DURING CURRENT TWO-GAME WINNING STREAK

- During UVA's current two-game winning streak, the defense has been strong.
- Miami and Duke quarterbacks are a combined 37-of-69 passing (53.6) for 452 yards, five interceptions, one touchdown and have been sacked six times against UVA.
- During the UVA winning streak, opposing quarterbacks are averaging 6.0 yards per drop back and have had 12 passes broken up and 17 passes defended by UVA's defense.

POTENTIAL CAREER UVA RECORDS THAT COULD FALL SOON

- WR Joe Reed has 1,813 career kick return yards, needing 27 more to break the previous record held by Darius Jennings (2011-14). Jennings graduated with 1,839 career kick return yards.
- HB Olamide Zaccheaus has 203 career receptions, needing eight to break the previous record held by Billy McMullen (1999-2002). McMullen left UVA with 210 career receptions. Zaccheaus and McMullen are the only Cavaliers to reach 200 career receptions.

VIRGINIA STRONG IN STARTING FIELD POSITION

- In UVA's five wins this season its average starting field position starts at its own 37.2, while in the two losses the average starting field position was its own 26.5, a difference of 10.7 yards.
- In UVA's current two-game winning streak, its average starting field position is its own 39.5 yard line.

THORNHILL CLIMBS UVA CAREER INTERCEPTIONS LIST

- SS Juan Thornhill has 11 career interceptions, which puts him in a eight-way tie for No. 10 all-time at UVA.
- Thornhill's next interception will put him in a four-way tie for No. 7 at UVA with Bryan Shumock, Joe Crocker and Anthony Poindexter.
- Chase Minnifield sits at No. 6 with 13 career interceptions.

ELLIS COLLECTING THE YARDS THROUGH SEVEN GAMES

- TB Jordan Ellis has 619 rushing yards through seven games, which dating back to 2000 is the second most by a UVA running back at this point through the season. He is one of only two running backs since 2000 to have rushed for 600+ yards through a season's first seven games.
- Ellis has rushed for 600+ yards through the season's first seven games twice (2017-2018), while Antwoine Womack did so in 2000.
- Ellis is averaging 5.4 yards per rush, which is the most in 19 seasons by a Cavalier running back through seven games. His seven rushing touchdowns in the last 19 years trails only Wali Lundy's 12 rushing touchdowns in 2004, a season Lundy lead the ACC in scoring (8.5 ppg).

DUBOIS IN MIDST OF BREAKOUT SEASON

- WR Hasise Dubois is enjoying a breakout season. He currently has 30 receptions for 320 yards and two touchdowns.
- Through the first six games of 2018 he had 26 receptions for 279 yards and two scores. Those numbers already surpassed his combined career numbers from 2016 and 2017 entering this season.
- During his first two years on Grounds, he had 24 combined catches for 219 yards and one touchdown.
- He enters Saturday with 54 career receptions for 539 yards and three scores.

DEFENSE STOUT AT HOME

- Miami's fourth quarter touchdown run by Malik Rosier is the first offensive touchdown UVA allowed at Scott Stadium this season.
- UVA's defense has allowed five field goals and one touchdown in 12 quarters of play at Scott Stadium in 2018.

HALL DEFENDING PASSES AT A TORRID PACE

- UVA's Bryce Hall is No. 1 in the ACC and No. 2 in the nation with 16 passes defended.
- Hall has broken up 14 passes and intercepted two others.
- SS Juan Thornhill is No. 3 in the ACC with eight passes defended, including four interceptions.

TOUCHDOWNS COMING AT A DISTANCE

- Of UVA's 24 offensive touchdowns in 2018, 12 of them have been scored from 20+ yards out. Of those 12 touchdowns of 20+ yards, seven have gone for 35 yards or more.
- Bryce Perkins' 86-yard touchdown pass to Olamide Zaccheaus vs. Ohio is the longest scoring strike of the season for the Cavaliers and the 10th longest in UVA history.
- Jordan Ellis' 75-yard rushing touchdown against the Ohio is the second-longest scoring play of the season.
- UVA had three offensive touchdowns against Ohio that went for 75 yards or more, including Zaccheaus' 77-yard touchdown reception against Ohio.

PERKINS CLIMBING UVA SINGLE-SEASON QB RUSHING LIST

- QB Bryce Perkins has rushed for 463 yards this season, which is No. 4 all-time on UVA's single-season quarterback rushing list.
- Perkins needs seven rushing yards to pass Bill Dudley's 1940 mark of 469 rushing yards.
- More on page 13.

UVA DEFENSE HOLDS MIAMI IN CHECK

- UVA held Miami's offense to 339 yards of total offense. Miami tallied 100 of those yards on two plays, a 70-yard rush by Travis Homer and a 30-yard reception by Lawrence Cager.
- The other 54 plays the Miami offense recorded managed only 239 total yards (4.42 YPP).
- UVA also held Miami wide receiver Jeff Thomas in check. Entering the game last Saturday, Thomas was No. 2 in the nation with 24.75 yards per reception. Against UVA, he managed one catch for five yards, while being targeted four times.

HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE MIAMI WIN

- UVA defeated a ranked team for the first time since beating then-No. 21 Louisville in 2014 at Scott Stadium. It was the highest ranked win by UVA since beating then-No. 12 Georgia Tech for Homecomings in 2011.
- It was the first UVA victory over a ranked team under Bronco Mendenhall.
- It was Mendenhall's first victory over a ranked team since his BYU team beat then-No. 20 Boise State in 2015.
- UVA has won four of the last five games it has played against Miami at Scott Stadium.
- PK Brian Delaney kicked his first three career field goals, connecting on field goals of 26, 46 and 32 yards.
- Delaney's 46-yard field goal to end the first half was UVA's longest since connecting on a 46-yard field goal at Louisville in 2015.
- It was UVA's first 40+ yard field goal since the 2015 finale against Virginia Tech when Ian Frye connected on two field goals of 42 yards.
- UVA's 16-play drive that resulted in a 32-yard field goal by Delaney in the fourth quarter is the most plays on a drive this season for the Cavaliers. The drive also lasted 8:35, which is the longest drive of the season for the Cavaliers.

ZACCHEAUS IN A SMALL ACC CLASS

- HB Olamide Zaccheaus is one of three ACC players since 2000 to tally 2000+ career receiving yards and 450+ career rushing yards.
- Zaccheaus is also the only active FBS player to just have 1,500+ career receiving yards and 450+ career rushing yards.

VIRGINIA PENALTIES TRENDING DOWN

- UVA has 33 penalties and 306 penalty yards through the first seven games of the season. It is the fewest penalties through seven games in stats dating back to 2000.
- UVA ranks No. 4 in the ACC in fewest penalties per game and No. 5 fewest penalty yards per game, while ranking No. 15 nationally in fewest penalties per game and No. 23 nationally in fewest penalty yards per game.

ZACCHEAUS COLLECTING 100-YARD RECEIVING GAMES IN 2018

- HB Olamide Zaccheaus had three 100-yard+ receiving games in 2018 through the first five games of the season.
- Zaccheaus and WR Kris Burd in 2010 are the only Cavaliers to record at least three 100+-yard receiving games through the first five games of a season.
- With six career 100+-yard receiving games, Zaccheaus is tied with Terrence Wilkins for No. 6 all-time on the UVA career ledger.

CAVALIERS STRONG ON THIRD DOWN THROUGH SIX GAMES

- Through six games, Virginia has done well when it's faced a third down situation of 10 yards or less. UVA is 42-of-75 (56.0) on third downs where it needs 10 yards or fewer for a first down.
- UVA is 28-of-39 (71.2) on third downs where it needs five yards or fewer for a first down.
- Overall, UVA is 47-of-98 (48.0 percent) on third downs, which is No. 2 in the ACC and No. 15 nationally.

VIRGINIA DEFENSE HAS STARTED THE 2018 SEASON STRONG

- The Virginia defense has kept its six of seven opponents under 400 yards of total offense, yielding 225 to Richmond, 387 to Indiana, 364 to Ohio, 214 to Louisville, 339 to Miami and 320 to Duke.
- The last time UVA held its first four opponents of the season to less than 400 yards of total offense was 2009 when they opened the year with William & Mary (309), TCU (380), Southern Miss (344) and North Carolina (174).
- UVA yielded 433 yards of total offense to NC State in game No. 5 after the Wolfpack held the ball for 4:28 longer than the Cavaliers. The 2009 UVA defense did not surrender 400 yards of total offense until game No. 7.

UVA COLLECTING EXPLOSIVE PLAYS IN 2018

- UVA has three plays from scrimmage in 2018 that have gone for 75 yards or more, all touchdowns and all came against Ohio.
- Only the 1995 UVA team had as many plays from scrimmage go for 75 yards or more. All three of their plays also went for touchdowns.
- In 1995 Mike Groh found Demetrius "Pete" Allen in the Duke game for 82 yards. Groh later found Patrick Jeffers for 76 yards against Clemson. Tiki Barber rushed for an 81-yard touchdown against Michigan.
- Only the 1983, 2015 and 2016 teams had at least two in the same season.

BRONCO MENDENHALL IS IN SPECIAL COMPANY

- Bronco Mendenhall is one of three active coaches that has inherited at least two programs in his career that were coming off a losing season and in year one, or year two, played in a bowl game. The others to do it are Nick Saban (Alabama, LSU, Michigan State) and Mark Dantonio (Michigan State/Cincinnati).
- Mendenhall inherited a BYU team that went 5-6 in 2004 and in his first season the Cougars went 6-6 and played in the 2005 Las Vegas Bowl. Mendenhall took over a Virginia team that went 4-8 in 2015 and took the Cavaliers to the 2017 Military Bowl in year No. 2, finishing 6-7.

UVA STIFLES THE LOUISVILLE OFFENSE

- UVA held the Louisville Cardinals to 214 yards of total offense in each team's ACC opener on Sept. 22.
- The 214 yards of total offense are the fewest UVA has allowed to an ACC opponent since allowing 199 at Pitt in 2013.

"ZZ STOP" COMES UP BIG ON GOAL-LINE STAND AGAINST CARDINALS

- ILB Zane Zandier finished with eight tackles against Louisville, tying him for the team lead with Charles Snowden.
- No tackles were bigger for Zandier than the three he made on three consecutive rushes by Louisville during UVA's big goal-line stand in the third quarter.
- UL started the drive from the UVA three-yard line after a tipped Bryce Perkins pass by his own receiver led to a Louisville interception return to the UVA three.
- On three straight rushing plays, Zandier made two solo tackles and one assisted in forcing Louisville to attempt a 20-yard field goal for its only points of the day.

ONE-PLAY SCORING DRIVES ARE BOUNTIFUL VS. OHIO

- For the first time in program history, UVA had three one-play scoring drives in one game.
- UVA scored on a Jordan Ellis 18-yard touchdown rush, an 86-yard Olamide Zaccheaus receiving touchdown and a 75-yard Ellis rushing touchdown.
- Only once before had UVA had multiple one-play scoring drives in the same game, which came against Navy in 1990. Those plays went for 55 and 54 yards.
- Zaccheaus' 86-yard touchdown reception is the fourth-longest one-play scoring drive. Ellis' 75-yard rushing touchdown is tied for No. 7 all-time among UVA's one-play scoring drives. Another 75-yard score against Clemson in 1989 shares the spot, which was a Herman Moore receiving touchdown from Matt Blundin.

RECORD-SETTING DAY FOR ZACCHEAUS AGAINST OHIO

- HB Olamide Zaccheaus helped UVA with a key non-conference win over the Ohio Bobcats in Nashville.
- Zaccheaus set a UVA single-game record with 247 receiving yards, breaking a 44-year old record by Ken Shelton who had 241 receiving yards against William & Mary.
- The 247 receiving yards still is the second most by a FBS player this season, while Zaccheaus is the only ACC player with a game this season with 200+ receiving yards.
- Zaccheaus' 247 receiving yards ties him with Randy Marriott of UNC (1987) for No. 10 on the ACC's all-time ledger of single-game receiving yards.
- Zaccheaus scored on scoring strikes from Bryce Perkins of 86 and 77 yards, which is the only time in program history that a team, let alone one player, recorded multiple receptions of 75 yards or more in the same game.
- Zaccheaus was the only player in program history to record multiple receptions of 80 yards or more. He now has three, two of which have come against MAC schools. Zaccheaus had an 82-yard receiving touchdown against Central Michigan in 2016 and an 81-yard touchdown reception at North Carolina in 2017.

CAVALIERS HAVE BIG FIRST HALF AGAINST OHIO

- The Cavaliers scored 38 points in the first half against Ohio, which is the fourth-most points scored in a half in program history.
- It ties the 38 points, also scored in the first half, the Cavaliers scored against Duke in 1990.

BIG NUMBERS FOR ELLIS, PERKINS AND ZACCHEAUS

- In the win over Ohio, UVA had a quarterback (Perkins, 379), throw for 300+ yards, a running back (Ellis, 171) rush for 100+ yards and a receiver (Zaccheaus, 247) record 100+ receiving yards for the first time since the 2011 Maryland game.
- In the 2011 Maryland game Michael Rocco passed for 307 yards, Perry Jones rushed for 139 yards, while Kris Burd (112) and Tim Smith (101) each recorded over 100 yards receiving.

PERKINS SHOWCASES PASSING GAME AGAINST OHIO

- QB Bryce Perkins threw for a career-high 379 yards on 20-of-25 passing against the Ohio Bobcats. He became the 20th different Cavalier to pass for at least 300 yards in a game.
- His 379 yards are the sixth-most passing yards all-time in a game by a Cavalier.
- At one point Perkins completed 15 passes in a row against the Bobcats, which ranks No. 2 all-time at UVA for most completed passes in a row in a game. It also ties Shawn Moore for No. 2 all-time for career consecutive completions, who completed 15 passes over two games in 1989.
- Michael Rocco owns the record for most completions in a row with 18, doing so against Miami in 2012.

PERKINS CREATED MORE UVA FIRSTS AT INDIANA

- QB Bryce Perkins rushed for 123 yards at Indiana to become the first UVA quarterback to rush for 100+ yards in multiple games in a season since Bill Dudley did it four times in 1941.
- Perkins is also the first Cavalier in program history to rush for 100+ yards in each of his first two career games. Perkins also rushed for 108 yards in his UVA debut against Richmond on Sept. 1.
- The only Cavalier to become relatively close to the feat was Gary Helman who rushed for 100+ yards in two of his first three career games in 1969. He rushed for only 40 yards in his collegiate debut against Clemson, but followed up in career game No. 2 with 158 rushing yards against Duke. Then Helman rushed for 148 yards in career game No. 3 against William & Mary.

A PROGRAM FIRST AGAINST RICHMOND

- For the first time in program history, UVA had a quarterback run for at least 100 yards, a second player rush for at least 100 yards and a receiver collect at least 100 receiving yards in a game. Against Richmond QB Bryce Perkins rushed for 108 yards, TB Jordan Ellis rushed for 146 yards and HB Olamide Zaccheaus recorded 101 receiving yards.
- Twice before UVA had a quarterback rush for a 100+ yards, while another Cavalier also rushed for 100+ yards: 1967 vs. Buffalo (Frank Quayle, 151 and QB Gene Arnette, 119); 1975 vs. Maryland (QB Scott Gardner, 120 and Billy Copeland, 100).

THORNHILL ALL OVER THE PLACE AT INDIANA

- SS Juan Thornhill helped UVA hold Indiana scoreless in the second half.
- Thornhill blocked a IU PAT and returned it for a defensive two-point score. It was the first time UVA scored defensive extra points since Joe Crocker did so against NC State in 1994. Crocker's points came off an interception of a two-point conversion.
- Thornhill also intercepted the eighth pass of his career in the game and added seven tackles.
- Thornhill earned ACC Defensive Back of the Week for his efforts.

TRUE FRESHMAN STARTING ON THE DEFENSIVE LINE

- Against Richmond, NT Jordan Redmond became the first UVA true freshman to start a season opener on the defensive line since 2002 when DE Kwakou Robinson started against Colorado State. He is only the fourth UVA freshman (true or redshirt) since 1986 to start a season opener on the defensive line. The others are DE Matt Conrath (RS-Fr., 2008 vs. USC) and NT Tim O'Conner (RS-Fr., 1986 vs. South Carolina).

ARMSTRONG SEES TIME IN SEASON OPENER

- QB Brennan Armstrong made his collegiate debut against Richmond in the fourth quarter.
- Armstrong is the first UVA true freshman to play quarterback in a season opener since David Watford came off the bench against William & Mary in the 2011 opener.
- Armstrong enrolled early and took part of spring practice this year (like Watford in 2011).
- Armstrong also saw time in UVA's win over Louisville, rushing for 50 yards.

VIRGINIA RUSHING GAME SPRINTS IN OPENER

- Virginia rushed for 301 yards against Richmond in the season opener, the most rushing yards so far in the Bronco Mendenhall era.
- It was the first time the Cavaliers rushed over 200 yards since tallying 262 against Virginia Tech in 2015 and the first time reaching 300 rushing yards in a game since putting up 357 rushing yards against VMI in 2013.

OLAMIDE ZACCHEAUS NOTES

ZACCHEAUS IS A BIG OFFENSIVE WEAPON

- Senior Olamide Zaccheaus returns for his fourth season with Virginia. The HB led UVA with 895 receiving yards and a UVA single-season record 85 receptions. He added five touchdowns.
- Zaccheaus is the only UVA receiver in program history to record multiple receptions of 80 yards or more and he has three on his career resume. Zaccheaus notched an 82-yard touchdown against Central Michigan in 2016. He then scored on an 81-yard touchdown strike at North Carolina in 2017. Against Ohio this season Zaccheaus scored on an 86-yard touchdown strike.
- Olamide is Nigerian for "the blessing has come."

ZACCHEAUS RECEPTION STREAK CONTINUES

- HB Olamide Zaccheaus has a reception in 36 straight games, which is tied for the fourth-longest active streak in the nation.

BRYCE PERKINS NOTES

IT IS A PERK TO HAVE A NEW QB ON THE BLOCK

- QB Bryce Perkins made his first career FBS start at quarterback against Richmond in the season opener.
- Perkins transferred to UVA last January from Arizona Western Community College after leading the Matadors to the 2017 NJCAA Championship game, before falling 31-28 to East Mississippi.
- Perkins originally signed as a top recruit with hometown Arizona State, but never saw action during his two seasons in Tempe. He redshirted the 2015 season and missed the 2016 season with an injury.
- Perkins' father, Bruce, lettered at Arizona State in 1988 and 1989 as a full-back and later played briefly in the NFL. Perkins' older brother, Paul, was a three-year letterwinner at running back with the UCLA Bruins and currently plays with the New York Giants. Perkins' uncle, Don Perkins, played eight seasons in the NFL with the Cowboys.
- Perkins, who passed for 1,311 yards and rushed for 353 yards (5.1 avg.) at Arizona Western in 2017, is replacing Kurt Benkert as UVA's quarterback in 2018. Benkert set UVA's single-season passing mark (3,207) and total offense (3,144) record in 2017.

PERKINS IS UVA'S STARTING QUARTERBACK

- Bryce Perkins, a transfer from Arizona Western Community College, became (vs. Richmond) just the second Cavalier quarterback to start his UVA debut since 1977 when Bryan Shumock started the season opener against NC State. Shumock switched to defensive back for the 1978 season and led UVA with four interceptions.
- Former UVA quarterback Kurt Benkert also started his UVA debut against Richmond in 2016.
- Perkins was the 12th different UVA starting quarterback to start an opener in the last 14 seasons. The list includes: Kurt Benkert (2016-17), Matt Johns (2015), Greyson Lambert (2014), David Watford (2013), Michael Rocco (2011-12), Marc Verica (2010), Vic Hall (2009), Peter Lulich (2008), Jameel Sewell (2007), Christian Olsen (2006) and Marques Hagans (2005).

UVA QUARTERBACKS IN THEIR FIRST-CAREER START

- QB Bryce Perkins, a transfer from Arizona Western Community College, made his first collegiate start for the Cavaliers against Richmond (Sept. 1) in the season opener.

SCOTT STADIUM, HOME OF THE CAVALIERS

The Carl Smith Center, home of David A. Harrison III Field at Scott Stadium, with its unique architectural design, scenic setting on the University's Grounds and exceptional sight lines, is one of the nation's finest college football settings.

Opened in 1931, Scott Stadium might be one of the oldest campus college football stadiums in the nation, but you could never tell from its appearance. Numerous upgrades and expansions make it a modern home for the Cavaliers and their fans.

Scott Stadium was the gift of Frederic William Scott and Elisabeth Strother Scott, and was dedicated to the memory of his parents, Frederic Robert Scott and Frances Branch Scott.

Virginia played its dedication game at Scott Stadium on Oct. 15, 1931 against the Virginia Military Institute before a then-capacity crowd of 22,000. Prior to that season, the Cavaliers staged their home games at the University's Lambeth Field.

Virginia has played 466 games in the historic venue. UVA's all-time record at Scott Stadium stands at 263-192-12.

Bronco Mendenhall Head Coach • Third Season

Bronco Mendenhall is in his third season as Virginia's head football coach after being named the program's 40th head coach on Dec. 4, 2015.

In Mendenhall's second season on Grounds in 2017 he directed UVA to its first bowl game since 2011. He oversaw a defense that ranked No. 7 in the nation and No. 2 in the ACC against the pass (165.8). The group was headed by three-time first-team All-ACC player Quin Blanding, ACC Defensive Rookie of the Year Brenton Nelson and third-team All-ACC cornerback Juan Thornhill. Blanding finished his illustrious career with more All-America honors and as UVA's all-time record holder with 495 career tackles. The 495 career tackles rank tied for No. 6 all-time

in ACC history and are the most by any ACC defensive back. Blanding finished each of his four seasons No. 2 in the ACC in tackles. Inside linebacker Micah Kiser was named the Campbell Trophy winner (Academic Heisman) and led the ACC in tackles for the third year in a row. Only Boston College's Luke Kuechly (2009-11) had previously accomplished the feat in league history. Kiser was also a three-time first-team All-ACC honoree and received multiple All-America honors over the 2016 and 2017 seasons, including becoming the first Cavalier since Tiki Barber in 1996 to earn both academic and athletic All-America honors in the same season when he was a second-team CoSIDA Academic All-American in 2016.

Mendenhall saw the conclusion of quarterback Kurt Benkert's collegiate career in 2017. The UVA quarterback became the first player in program history to throw for over 3,000 yards in a season. Benkert finished 2017 with 3,207 passing yards and a single-season program record 298 completions. Benkert's 25 passing touchdowns in 2017 rank No. 2 all-time at UVA for a season. The starting quarterback for each of Mendenhall's first two seasons at Virginia, Benkert leaves No. 3 all-time at UVA in career passing yards (5,759) and passing touchdowns (46), which came in 24 career games for the Cavaliers.

In Mendenhall's first season on Grounds he oversaw a secondary that boasted first-team All-ACC honoree and All-American, Quin Blanding. Blanding finished the season No. 2 in the ACC in tackles for the third year in a row with 120 stops. Inside linebacker Micah Kiser, an All-American and first-team All-ACC honoree, thrived to lead the ACC in tackles for the second year in a row with 134, which is tied with former Cavalier great Wali Rainer for fourth-most in a single season in program history. Kiser was also a second-team CoSIDA Academic All-American, becoming the first Cavalier since Tiki Barber in 1996 to earn both academic and athletic All-America honors in the same season.

Offensively, in Mendenhall's first season, Taquan Mizzell became the first player in

ACC history to record at least 1,500 career rushing and 1,500 career receiving yards. UVA quarterback Kurt Benkert set a couple of passing marks in UVA's new offense, including a program record for passing yards in a game with 421 against Central Michigan, which was only the second time in program history a UVA quarterback surpassed 400 passing yards in a game. Benkert reached 1,000 passing yards in four games and 2,000 passing yards in eight games, setting a program record for fastest to that standard in a season.

Mendenhall came to Charlottesville after 11 years as the head coach at Brigham Young University. In his 11 seasons, from 2005-2015, Mendenhall compiled an overall record of 99-43 at BYU to rank 12th in total wins among all FBS teams during that time.

In the three seasons prior to Mendenhall becoming the head coach at BYU, the Cougars compiled an overall record of 14-21. Over Mendenhall's 11 years at BYU, the Cougars were one of only 11 programs to advance to a bowl game each season (includes the 2015 season). BYU joined by Alabama, Boise State, Clemson, Florida State, Georgia, LSU, Oklahoma, Oregon, Virginia Tech and Wisconsin on that list.

Among those 11 teams, only Florida State has achieved more bowl wins (seven) than BYU's six bowl game victories.

The success of Mendenhall's leadership approach in running the BYU football program was highlighted in a management book, *Running Into the Wind: Bronco Mendenhall -- 5 Strategies for Building a Successful Team*, written by Alyson Von Feldt and Paul Gustavson, a leading management consultant specializing in leadership development and organizational design.

Mendenhall was elected in 2013 to the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees as the District 8 Representative and also serves on the AFCA Ethics Committee.

Game Notes

- With the start, NT Jordan Redmond becomes the first true freshman to start a season opener on the defensive line for UVA since 2002 when DE Kwakou Robinson started against Colorado State. He is only the fourth UVA freshman (true or redshirt) since 1986 to start a season opener on the defensive line. The others are DE Matt Conrath (RS-Fr., 2008 vs. USC) and NT Tim O'Conner (RS-Fr., 1986 vs. South Carolina).
- Bryce Perkins' 36-yard rushing touchdown in the first quarter was the longest rush by a UVA quarterback since Matt Johns' 42-yard rush against Kent State in 2014.

- Perkins finished with 185 passing yards, giving him the xx most by a UVA quarterback starting his first game.
- With a career-high 146 rushing yards, Jordan Ellis became the 43rd player in program history to reach 1,000 career rushing yards.
- Ellis rushed for at least 100 yards for the second time in his career. He rushed for 136 yards at North Carolina in 2017.
- With both Perkins (108) and Ellis (146) rushing for over 100 yards, the duo becomes the 29th Cavaliers to do so in the same game. The last UVA to each rush for at least 100 yards in a game was Daniel Hamm (136) and Kevin Parks (135) in 2013 against VMI.
- With six catches, Olamide Zaccheaus has now recorded a reception in 30-straight games.
- Zaccheaus finished with 101 receiving yards, his fourth career game over 100 receiving yards.
- With 101 receiving yards, Zaccheaus passed Heath Miller (1,703) and Patrick Jeffers (1,785) into seventh on UVA's all-time receiving yards list.
- With six receptions, Zaccheaus passed Kris Burd (162) for No. 3 all-time at UVA in career receptions.
- With Ryan Nelson's start at left tackle, UVA has now started a redshirt freshman at left tackle in a season opener two years in a row. In 2017, Dillon Reinkensmeyer started at left tackle against William & Mary.
- DE Mandy Alonso's sack in the second quarter is the first solo sack of his career. He shared a sack at Miami in 2017.
- In the second quarter, WR Chuck Davis returned the first punt of his career (-1).

- Zaccheaus finished with a career-high 247 receiving yards, which is his second game of the season with 100+ receiving yards and the fifth of his career.
- The 247 receiving yards by Zaccheaus is a single-game UVA record for receiving yards in a game. The previous record was 241 receiving yards by Ken Shelton in 1974 against William & Mary.
- TB Jordan Ellis rushed for three touchdowns, the first time a Cavalier has done that since Kevin Parks against William & Mary in 2011.
- Ellis finished with a career-high 171 rushing yards, his second game this season and third of his career with 100 or more rushing yards.
- Ellis is the first Cavalier to score three touchdowns in a game since Canaan Severin caught three receiving touchdowns at Louisville in 2015.
