HOKIES

VIRGINIA VS VIRGINIA TECH

- The Cavaliers are 19-1 all-time against the Hokies.
- The last meeting between the teams was on April 16, 2014, when the Cavaliers earned a 17-12 victory in Blacksburg. After originally trailing 3-1, the Cavaliers went on an 8-1 run, including three goals scored in a span of 32 seconds.
- The one UVa loss occurred in Virginia's trip to Blacksburg in 2012, when the Hokies earned a 10-9 victory.

HOKIES NOTES

- Virginia Tech has struggled in division play, going 0-6 versus ACC opponents.
- The Hokies are coming off a close 13-11 loss to Boston College.
- Megan Will leads the team with 56 points on 45 goals and 11 assists.
- Meagh Graham is fifth in the ACC with 2.27 ground balls per game.

COMMONWEALTH CLASH

- Virginia closes out the regular-season on Friday, April 17 when it hosts Virginia Tech at 6 p.m.
- The April 17 game is sponsored by Virginia529, the official college savings plan of University of Virginia Athletics. There is one point at stake in the Virginia529 Commonwealth Clash, the new point rivalry series between University of Virginia and Virginia Tech. - Virginia hosts the Atlantic Coast Conference Women's Lacrosse Championship April 13-26 at Klockner Stadium
- All-session tickets are \$14 for reserved seats, \$10 for general admission adult tickets and \$8 for students and seniors. Single-session tickets are \$7 for reserved seats, \$5 for general admission adult tickets and \$4 for students and seniors.

HOOS HOT

- Casey Bocklet has had at least four points in seven of the last eight games, including scoring four goals with three assists against Louisville
- Bocklet has scored at least a hat trick in five of the last six games
- Bocklet won her third ACC Offensive Player of the Week award on Monday, the third time in the last four weeks she has earned the honor
- Kelly Boyd scored four goals with an assist against Louisville, her third four-goal game of the year
- Kasey Behr scored two goals with an assist against Louisville, her sixth multi-goal game of the year
- Liza Blue scored two goals with an assist against Louisville, her 14th consecutive game with multiple points
- Courtney Swan scored two goals with three assists against Louisville, the fifth time this season she had five or more points in a game
- The Cavaliers committed just two turnovers in the win over Louisville

- Courtney Swan leads the ACC, averaging 1.87 assists per game
- Swan is seventh in the nation with 28 assists
- Swan is fourth in the ACC and 15th in the nation, averaging 4.53 draw controls per game
- Swan is 11th in the ACC, averaging 3.60 points per game
- Casey Bocklet is third in the ACC, averaging 1.67 assists per game
- Bocklet is fifth in the ACC, averaging 3.80 points per game
- Bocklet is 13th in the nation with 25 assists
- Liza Blue is ninth in the ACC, averaging 2.47 goals per game
- Blue is 11th in the ACC in draw controls, averaging 2.53 per game
- Rachel Vander Kolk leads the ACC in total saves (116) and saves per game (7.73)
- Vander Kolk's 116 saves ranks 17th in the nation

ACC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Casey Bocklet is this week's ACC Offensive Player of the Week (April 14)
- Bocklet had seven points on four goals with three assists in the win over Louisville
- It was her third ACC Player of the Week honor in the last four weeks

RANKINGS

- Virginia has been ranked as high as No. 4 in the IWLCA poll this season, the highest in-season ranking for the Cavaliers since the 2010 season,
- Virginia finished the 2014 season with a final ranking of No. 4, but its highest in-season ranking was No. 6 that year
- Virginia has spent three weeks ranked in the top-five this season

SENIOR DAY

- Before Friday night's game, the seven members of the senior class will be honored in a pregame ceremony
- Over the last four, or in one case five years, these Cavaliers have helped Virginia make three trips to the NCAA Tournament, including leading Virginia back to the Final Four last season, and a probable return to the tournament this season. These seniors have helped elevate the team to its highest in-season ranking in the last five years, reaching No. 4 in the IWLCA polls after knocking off three undefeated teams this season.
- Collectively, these players have totaled over 600 points in their careers, scoring 419 goals with 197 assists. Three of them will be leaving their names in the Virginia career records list in the points, goals, assists and/or draw control categories. Four of them have earned All-America honors, one of them has started every single game since her freshman season. And one, Courtney Swan, has earned two prestigious academic honors, being named the Elite 89 Award winner at last season's NCAA Championship Weekend banquet, an award presented to the student-athlete with the highest GPA among all players in the championship games, as well as earning an ACC Postgraduate Scholarship this season.

SNAPPED SIX-GAME WIN STREAK

- Virginia had won six-straight games, its longest win streak since winning seven games in a row during the 2010 season, before falling to Notre Dame on Saturday
- Of those six victories, four were over ranked teams, three against top-10 teams and two against top-five teams

ONE-GOAL GAMES

- The Cavaliers have played four one-goal games this season, going 1-3 in those games
- Virginia earned a 16-15 road win at No. 9 Penn State
- The Cavaliers fell 13-12 in overtime to No. 16 Loyola and dropped regulation contests at No. 3 Syracuse and in the season-opening neutral-site game against No. 5 Northwestern

OPENING STRETCH

- The Cavaliers played five of their first six games on the road
- UVa played four top-10 opponents, all on the road, in its first six games, going 1-3
- The Cavaliers "home" opener against Harvard was relocated to Turf Field because of snow
- Virginia's first game at Klöckner Stadium was the 13-12 overtime loss to Loyola

100 CAREER GOALS

- Liza Blue scored her 100th career goal and won her 100th career draw control at Penn State
- Courtney Swan scored the 100th goal of her career against Duke
- Casey Bocklet scored the 100th goal of her career at Boston College

VS UNRANKED OPPONENTS

- Since 2007, Virginia has only lost four times to unranked opponents, going 53-4 in that span against teams not ranked in the IWLCA Top-20
- One of those losses came last season when Virginia fell 15-13 at then-unranked Princeton.

RECORD WATCH AND MILESTONES

- Liza Blue moved into the top-10 career list in goals scored in the Navy game
- Blue needs one goal to tie Debbie Easter (1980-83) for ninth place on the list at 130 goals and six goals to tie Brittany Kalkstein (2007-10) in eighth place
- Blue has 128 career draw controls, ranking seventh on the career draws list. She needs three to tie Caitlin Banks (2001-04) in sixth place.
- Courtney Swan's 255 career draws currently ranks second in the Cavalier record book. She is 32 draws shy of tying Brittany Kalkstein (2007-10) for the top total in career history
- Swan has 68 career assists, which ranks in 10th place on the career list. She needs two more to tie Anna Yates (1992-95) in ninth place
- Casey Bocklet has 75 career assists, ranking her in 8th place on the Virginia career assist list. She needs one assist to tie Caitlin Banks (2001-04) in 7th place and three to tie Blair Weymouth (2006-09) in sixth place
- Bocklet has 185 career points. She needs eight points to tie Caitlin Banks (2001-04) and Josie Owen (2008-12) in ninth place on the list

DEBUTS

- Freshman goalie Rachel Vander Kolk made her debut at Northwestern, logging five saves
- Freshman midfielder Meghan Heick also made her debut at Northwestern and was in the starting lineup for the first two games of the year
- Heick scored her first career goal at JMU
- Freshman midfielder Kasey Behr made her collegiate debut against Richmond, coming off the bench to score a goal, pick up a ground ball and win two draw controls
- Freshman midfielder Lilly DiNardo made her collegiate debut in the Harvard game
- Four Cavaliers made their Virginia debut at William & Mary. Freshmen Daniela Kelly, Jacqueline Wasilko and Ana Hagerup made their collegiate debuts in the game while Katherine Rueger, a transfer from Davidson, made her UVa debut
- Rueger picked up a ground ball and Hagerup took a shot in the W&M game

CAVALIERS VS RANKED OPPONENTS

- Virginia is 5-5 this season against ranked teams, 3-3 against top-10 teams and 2-2 against teams ranked 11-20
- Five of Virginia's first eight games were against top-10 opponents
- Eight of UVa's first 10 games were against top-20 opponents
- The game against BC was the second time this season UVa has taken on a team ranked second in the nation, falling to UNC when it was ranked No. 2
- The BC win was the second time in two weeks that Virginia took down a previously-undefeated team. Duke was 9-0, 3-0 ACC before coming to Charlottesville the Saturday before UVa defeated 10-0 BC in Newton

2014 NCAA TOURNAMENT

- This season Virginia has already played all three teams they faced during the 2014 NCAA Tournament, falling 13-12 in overtime to second-round opponent Princeton, falling 10-7 at North Carolina (last year's quarterfinal opponent) and 14-13 at Syracuse (last year's semifinal opponent).
- Virginia was one of six teams last season to earn a first-round bye, facing the Tigers in the 2nd round

ACC POSTGRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP

- Courtney Swan has been announced as one of 53 recipients of the prestigious Weaver-James-Corrigan Award.
- These ACC postgraduate scholarships are awarded to selected student-athletes who intend to pursue a graduate degree following completion of their undergraduate requirements. Each recipient will receive \$5,000 toward his or her graduate education. Those honored have performed with distinction in both the classroom and their respective sport, while demonstrating exemplary conduct in the community. An additional eight student-athletes who plan to enter a professional career in their chosen sport were named honorary recipients.

TEWAARATON WATCH LIST

- Casey Bocklet, Courtney Swan and Morgan Stephens were all named to the initial 50-player Tewaaraton Award Watch List.
- Liza Blue was one of five players added in the second round of midseason additions on April 9

ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK SWEEP

- Casey Bocklet was named the ACC Offensive Player of the Week and Rachel Vander Kolk was named the ACC Defensive Players of the Week (March 31)
- Bocklet, who was named the Co-Offensive Player of the Week the previous week, recorded a hat trick and added two assists against the previously unbeaten Eagles. She scored two of Virginia's first three goals at Boston College, setting the foundation for the Cavaliers' 6-0 run to start the game. In a 16-6 win at William & Mary, Bocklet recorded a career-high eight points on five goals and three assists. She has posted at least five points in each of Virginia's last three victories.
- Vander Kolk made an ACC single-game season-high 18 saves in Virginia's upset win at No. 2 Boston College and totaled 27 for the week after making nine in the 16-6 win at William & Mary. The freshman goalkeeper faced 41 shots by the Eagles, including five in the final two minutes of the game with Virginia leading 15-13. During that period, Vander Kolk came up with three saves and a ground ball after Cavalier teammate Wyatt Whitley caused a turnover in front of the net in the final 20 seconds of the game.
- It was the second career honor for Bocklet and the first for Vander Kolk

'HOOS IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

- Virginia is one of five programs in the NCAA to be ranked at least once in every year of the IWLCA Coaches Poll. The poll was created in 1988, with Dartmouth, Maryland, Penn State and Princeton joining Virginia as the only programs to be nationally ranked every year.
- Of those five programs, Virginia is the only program to be ranked in every week of the IWLCA coaches poll, a span of 279-straight polls.
- Of those 279 polls, the Cavaliers have been ranked among the top-10 in the nation on 241 occasions, the second-most among all NCAA programs.
- The Cavaliers have spent 15 weeks ranked No. 1, including the entire 1993 season, en route to the program's second national championship.
- Virginia debuted at No. 7 in the inaugural coaches poll on March 19, 1988. While the Cavaliers have climbed to a No. 1 ranking, the farthest they have ever fallen was to No. 19 on April 23, 2013. Virginia has only spent five weeks ranked outside the top-15.

IL NATIONAL ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

- Rachel Vander Kolk was named Inside Lacrosse's Co-National Rookie of the Week (March 31), the second time she earned this honor
- "For the Cavaliers, it was rookie Rachel Vander Kolk who made the ultimate difference in Virginia's victory over then-undefeated Boston College on Saturday. Squaring off against some of the nation's most prolific scorers, Vander Kolk made 18 saves to lift her team over its second ranked opponent in just eight days. The Severna Park (Md.) native has started in every game for UVA this season, and boasts a .413 save percentage."

ACC CO-PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Casey Bocklet was named the ACC Co-Player of the Week (March 24)

- "Bocklet scored a first-half hat trick, keying the host Cavaliers to a 7-3 lead by halftime, which was expanded to 9-3 before the Blue Devils rallied late, but not enough in Virginia's 13-10 win.
