OPENING KICK

UVA OPENS 129TH SEASON OF FOOTBALL

- The University of Virginia opens its 129th season of football Saturday against Richmond.
- Richmond is receiving votes in the preseason FCS poll.
- It is the 88th season the Cavaliers have played in Scott Stadium.
- UVA is 81-38-9 (.676) all-time in season openers.
- The Cavaliers are 75-21-7 (.767) in home season openers and have won 18 of their last 23 season openers in Scott Stadium.
- In his career as a head coach, Bronco Mendenhall is 9-4 in 13 season-openers.

VIRGINIA VS. RICHMOND, CAA

- Virginia owns a 28-3-2 edge in the all-time series with Richmond. UVA won 10 meetings in a row dating back to 1947, before falling 37-20 in the 2016 season-opening game to the Spiders.
- The Cavaliers own a 59-10-3 record against current members of the CAA.

FIVE TOP STORYLINES

- The Cavaliers open their 129th season of football on Saturday night against the Richmond Spiders. It is UVA's first night game to open a season since the Cavaliers hosted William & Mary to open the 2011 season.
- Virginia is opening its season against Richmond for the seventh time. UVA is 5-1 all-time when opening a campaign against the Spiders with wins coming in 1893, 1894, 1979, 2010 and 2012. All six of the previous season openers against Richmond were also played in Charlottesville.
- UVA is looking to win back-to-back season openers for the first time since winning four in a row from 2010-13. UVA beat William & Mary, 28-10, to open 2017.
- **Bronco Mendenhall** is facing an FCS team for the 11th time as a head coach. He is 9-1 all-time against FCS competition. Mendenhall has faced Eastern Illinois (1-0), Eastern Washington (1-0), Idaho State (2-0), Northern Iowa (1-0), Richmond (0-1), Savannah State (1-0), Wagner (1-0), Weber State (1-0) and William & Mary (1-0).
- **Olamide Zaccheaus** enters 2018 with 157 career receptions. He needs 54 catches to break **Billy McMullen's** UVA record of 210. With 43 receptions, Zaccheaus will become only the second player in program history to reach 200 career receptions.



HB Olamide Zaccheaus broke UVA's single-season record for receptions with 85 catches in 2017.

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

The first documented Cavalier on horseback was Francis Bell, a Virginia student from Dublin, Va., in 1947. Bell rode onto the field dressed as Cavaliers for Virginia's home football game with Harvard on the afternoon of October 11.

The Cavalier on horseback returned as the University's mascot in 1963. The UVA Polo Club provided both the horse and rider. However, the mounted Cavalier and his horse parted company in 1974 with the inception of AstroTurf at Scott Stadium.

The mounted Cavalier made its return in the Florida Citrus Bowl at the end of the 1989 football season. Due to its instant popularity, the Cavalier on horseback returned the following season on a regular basis and continues to lead the Virginia football team onto the field at the beginning of all home games.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

- One of Richmond's coaches has a direct link with the Virginia program.
- UR co-special teams coordinator/running backs coach Sparky Woods served as quarterbacks coach at Virginia from 1997-98, tutoring future NFL quarterback Aaron Brooks.

TALE OF TWO BROTHERS

- Virginia junior linebacker Jordan Mack is the younger brother of former Richmond defensive back, Charles Mack.
- The Mack brothers hail from Lithonia, Ga., and both played high school football at the Wesleyan School.
- Jordan Mack made his collegiate debut and first collegiate start against Richmond in the 2016 meeting, facing his older brother. In that game, Jordan Mack made three tackles, while Charles Mack made one.
- Their father, Charles Mack, played football at Georgia Tech from 1983-87.
- Their cousin, Jimmy Coleman, played football at Tulane.

- Saturday is the six-year anniversary to when UVA opened the 2012 season with a 43-19 win over Richmond.
- Former UVA quarterback Michael Rocco threw for 311 yards and a touchdown to lead the Cavaliers.
- Rocco finished 25-of-37 with a touchdown on a short pass that Darius Jennings took 51 yards for a score.
- Kevin Parks ran for two touchdowns and Perry Jones ran for another for UVA.
- The Cavaliers took a 16-0 lead in the first 6:27, had to settle for two field goals in the second quarter and put the game away with touchdown runs by Parks in the third quarter and Jones early in the fourth.
- The Cavaliers outgained Richmond 523-201 in the first three quarters, and much of the Spiders' yards came after the game was well in Virginia's control.
- Rocco later went on to graduate from Richmond after he transferred following the 2012 season.

The others to do it are Nick Saban (Alabama, LSU, Michigan State) and Mark Dantonio (Michigan State/Cincinnati).
- Mendenhall inherited a BYU team that went 5-6 in 2004 and in his first season the Cougars went 6-6 and played in the 2005 Las Vegas Bowl. Mendenhall took over a Virginia team that went 4-8 in 2015 and took the Cavaliers to the 2017 Military Bowl in year No. 2, finishing 6-7.

JOE REED IS A THREAT ON KICK RETURN

- In 2017, wide receiver Joe Reed returned 29 kicks in 2017 for 861 yards (29.7 yards per return), which was No. 1 in the ACC and No. 8 nationally.
- Reed had eight returns of 30 yards or more. That is the most by a Cavalier since Cedric Peerman returned nine kicks in 2005 for 30 yards or more.
- With only 56 kick returns to his career resume, Reed already ranks No. 4 all-time at UVA in career kick return yards with 1,539.
- Reed's 861 kick return yards in 2017 are the second most in a season by a Cavalier, trailing only Khalek Shepherd's single-season program record of 929 in 2012.
- Reed's best game this season was against Georgia Tech when he had a career-high 170 return yards and the program's eighth-longest return which went 92 yards for a touchdown
- Reed's 25.1 yards per kick return average was No. 3 in the ACC and No. 21 in the nation in 2016.

RETURN OF THE MACK

- Junior inside linebacker Jordan Mack is UVA's leading returning tackler after finishing 2017 with 114 tackles.
- While former Cavaliers Micah Kiser (145) and Quin Blanding (137) finished No. 1 and No. 2 in the ACC in tackles three years in a row, Mack finishing No. 5 in the ACC and No. 28 nationally in tackles was mostly an after thought. In 2017 UVA was the only "Power 5" to have three players with at least 100 tackles. New Mexico State was the only other school in the nation to also accomplish that feat in 2017.
- Mack returns the second-most tackles in ACC entering 2018, chasing only Duke's Joe Giles-Harris (125), who finished No. 3 in the ACC in tackles in 2017.
- Mack is tied for No. 14 in the nation among all tacklers returning in 2018.

IT IS A PERK TO HAVE A NEW QB ON THE BLOCK

- QB Bryce Perkins is set to make his first career FBS start at quarterback against Richmond.
- Perkins transferred to UVA last January from Arizona Western Community College after leading the Matadors to the 2017 NJCAA Championship game, before falling 31-28 to East Mississippi.
- Perkins originally signed as a top recruit with hometown Arizona State, but never saw action during his two seasons in Tempe. He redshirted the 2015 season and missed the 2016 season with an injury.
- Perkins' father, Bruce, lettered at Arizona State in 1988 and 1989 as a fullback and later played briefly in the NFL. Perkins' older brother, Paul, was a three-year letterwinner at running back with the UCLA Bruins and currently plays with the New York Giants. Perkins' uncle, Don Perkins, played eight seasons in the NFL with the Cowboys.
- Perkins, who passed for 1,311 yards and rushed for 353 yards (5.1 avg.) at Arizona Western in 2017, is set to replace Kurt Benkert as UVA's quarterback in 2018. Benkert set UVA's single-season passing mark (3,207) and total offense (3,144) record in 2017.

A THORN IN THE SIDE OF AN OFFENSE

- SS Juan Thornhill is one of the nation's best at what he does on defense.
- Thornhill has played corner and safety at UVA and owns 23 career starts between the two positions.
- Thornhill earned third-team All-ACC honors in 2017 after finishing No. 3 in the ACC in both interceptions (4) and passes defended (16).
- Thornhill also is a stellar tackler, finishing 2017 with 63 tackles, including a career-high three for a loss against Navy in the Military Bowl.
- He also finished No. 2 on the team with seven special teams tackles.

STRONG SECONDARY RETURNS IN 2018

- While UVA lost a lot on defense with the graduation of FS Quin Blanding, DE Andrew Brown and ILB Micah Kiser, it returns a pretty good secondary that finished No. 7 in the nation and No. 2 in the ACC with 165.8 passing yards allowed per game.
- UVA's defense also ranked No. 9 nationally and No. 2 in the ACC in Red Zone defense in 2017.
- UVA returns defensive secondary starts from Bryce Hall (13), Brenton Nelson (13), Juan Thornhill (12), Chris Moore (7), Joey Blount (1) and Tim Harris (1).
- CB Myles Robinson started three games in 2016 before suffering a season-ending injury.
- CB Tim Harris has 22 career starts, but has missed most of 2016 and 2017 with injury.

BLOUNT LOOKS TO MAKE DEFENSIVE IMPACT IN YEAR TWO

- With the graduation of UVA's all-time career tackle leader Quin Blanding, sophomore Joey Blount looks to have a big impact on defense.
- As a first year in 2017, Blount led UVA with 13 tackles on special teams, 11 of which came on kickoffs.
- Blount recorded his first career double-digit tackle game against Boston College, notching 10 stops while seeing his most playing time on defense in 2017.
- Blount made his first collegiate start at cornerback at Pitt in 2017 for the injured Juan Thornhill.
- Blount is the son of former UVA safety, Tony Blount, who played for the Cavaliers from 1976-79 and owns the 11th-longest interception return (63) in program history.

DEFENSE GETS COOK AND HARRIS BACK FOR SIXTH SEASON

- UVA's defense welcomes the return of ILB Malcolm Cook and CB Tim Harris, each returning for a sixth season.
- Cook missed the entire 2016 season with a medical condition, while Harris received a medical hardship after appearing in two games. Harris suffered a season-ending injury in the 2017 season opener against William & Mary, receiving a second medical hardship in as many years.
- Harris owns 22 career starts, while Cook was slated as a starter at OLB in Bronco Mendenhall's 3-4 in 2016 before a medical condition almost halted his athletic career.
- Of Harris' 22 starts, 21 of them took place between 2013-15. Harris missed the 2013 season opener against Mendenhall's BYU team with an injury, but played in the last 11 games of the year. He later played in the 2014, 2015, 2016 and 2017 season openers.
- Injuries slowed Cook in 2014 and 2015 before missing 2016 with a medical condition. He made six starts in 2017, including a career-high 13 tackles in the season-opening win against William & Mary.
- Harris and Cook, both hail from Richmond, enrolled together in 2013.

ZACCHEAUS IS A BIG OFFENSIVE WEAPON

- Senior Olamide Zaccheaus returns for his fourth season with Virginia. The HB led UVA with 895 receiving yards and a UVA single-season record 85 receptions. He added five touchdowns.
- Zaccheaus is the only UVA receiver in program history to record two receptions of 80 yards or more. Zaccheaus notched a career-high 82-yard touchdown against Central Michigan in 2016. He then scored on an 81-yard touchdown strike at North Carolina in 2017.
- Zaccheaus enters 2018 No. 4 all-time at UVA with 157 career receptions and No. 9 all-time with 1,695 receiving yards.
- Zaccheaus has also rushed for 468 yards and two scores over his first three seasons on Grounds.
- Olamide is Nigerian for "the blessing has come."

ZACCHEAUS RECEPTION STREAK ONE OF THE NATION'S LONGEST

- HB Olamide Zaccheaus has a reception in 29 straight games, which is tied for the third-longest active streak in the nation.
- Zaccheaus' streak started in his second career college game, Nov. 7, 2015, at Miami.

SIX CAVALIERS FROM KEY POSITIONS OWN 30+ CAREER GAMES PLAYED

- Entering 2018, six different Cavaliers have appeared in at least 30 career games at Virginia.
- OLB Chris Peace and HB Olamide Zaccheaus leads the way with 37 games played each. Tim Harris (34), Evan Butts (33), Jordan Ellis (33) and Juan Thornhill (33) all have appeared in at least 30 career games for UVA.

COLEMAN A PROVEN COMMODITY IN THE PUNT GAME

- Senior Lester Coleman returns to the fold in 2018 after earning second-team All-ACC honors as a punter.
- Coleman finished 2017 No. 4 in the ACC with a 43.7 punting average. He led the ACC with 23 punts of 50 yards or more and was No. 2 in the ACC, No. 7 nationally, with 29 punts inside the 20. Also, 16 of his 29 punts inside the 20 were downed inside the 10-yard line. Coleman also set a UVA single-season record with six punts of 60 yards or more.
- Coleman sat his first three years on Grounds before making his collegiate debut in the 2017 season opener against William & Mary. He sat the 2015 and 2016 seasons behind former first-team All-ACC punter Nicholas Conte.
- Coleman did not punt in high school until his senior season. He had played defensive line and receiver at Woodberry Forest. His high school needed a punter and because Lester's older brother, James, had walked on to UVA as a punter in 2012, Lester was asked to punt without any experience. Lester's brother, James, redshirted at UVA in 2012 and punted two times over three seasons (2013-15) before using his fifth year to be the starting punter at Western Michigan in 2016.
- Lester Coleman averaged 52.3 yards per punt over his seven punts against Boston College (Oct. 21) to break the single-game UVA punting record.
- The previous record belonged to Ryan Weigand, who averaged 51.6 yards per punt at Wyoming in 2007.

FROM THE VALLEY OF THE SUN TO THE BASE OF THE BLUE RIDGE

- UVA welcomes two junior college transfers from Arizona in 2018. DL Cassius Peat (Scottsdale CC) and QB Bryce Perkins (Arizona Western) first met on the high school football fields and basketball courts in the Phoenix area.
- Peat, the first prep player in Arizona history to win four consecutive state (DI) basketball titles with Corona del Sol High School, always got the better end of the basketball matchup against Perkins' Chandler High School. Perkins, however, got the better end of the football matchups as he led Chandler High School to the 2014 state football championship.
- As a senior at Corona del Sol, Peat was basketball teammates with former Duke All-American Marvin Bagley III on what was perhaps one of the best Arizona high school basketball teams ever in 2014-15. Peat started on that team with Bagley, current Arizona guard Alex Barcello, former Portland State guard and current Cal State San Bernardino guard Tyrell Henderson and current New Mexico forward Dane Kuiper. Peat at the time had signed an NLI to attend Michigan State to play football.

PLAYERS EARN THEIR NUMBERS

- On the night of Saturday, Aug. 11, inside the locker room at Scott Stadium, 41 players earned their numbers in a special ceremony.
- On the night of Sat., Aug. 18, another 20 Cavaliers selected their numbers, including five first years.
- Throughout the season players that earn their numbers will have the opportunity to make a selection on Thursdays after practice.
- To date, 82 Cavaliers have earned numbers.

SCOTT STADIUM, HOME OF THE CAVALIERS

The Carl Smith Center, home of David A. Harrison III Field at Scott Stadium, with its unique architectural design, scenic setting on the University's Grounds and exceptional sight lines, is one of the nation's finest college football settings.

Opened in 1931, Scott Stadium might be one of the oldest campus college football stadiums in the nation, but you could never tell from its appearance. Numerous upgrades and expansions make it a modern home for the Cavaliers and their fans.

Scott Stadium was the gift of Frederic William Scott and Elisabeth Strother Scott, and was dedicated to the memory of his parents, Frederic Robert Scott and Frances Branch Scott.

Virginia played its dedication game at Scott Stadium on Oct. 15, 1931 against the Virginia Military Institute before a then-capacity crowd of 22,000. Prior to that season, the Cavaliers staged their home games at the University's Lambeth Field.

Virginia has played 464 games in the historic venue. UVA's all-time record at Scott Stadium stands at 260-192-12.

Bronco Mendenhall Head Coach • Third Season

Bronco Mendenhall is in his third season as Virginia's head football coach after being named the program's 40th head coach on Dec. 4, 2015.

In Mendenhall's second season on Grounds in 2017 he directed UVA to its first bowl game since 2011. He oversaw a defense that ranked No. 7 in the nation and No. 2 in the ACC against the pass (165.8). The group was headed by three-time first-team All-ACC player Quin Blanding, ACC Defensive Rookie of the Year Brenton Nelson and third-team All-ACC cornerback Juan Thornhill. Blanding finished his illustrious career with more All-America honors and as UVA's all-time record holder with 495 career tackles. The 495 career tackles rank tied for No. 6 all-time

in ACC history and are the most by any ACC defensive back. Blanding finished each of his four seasons No. 2 in the ACC in tackles. Inside linebacker Micah Kiser was named the Campbell Trophy winner (Academic Heisman) and led the ACC in tackles for the third year in a row. Only Boston College's Luke Kuechly (2009-11) had previously accomplished the feat in league history. Kiser was also a three-time first-team All-ACC honoree and received multiple All-America honors over the 2016 and 2017 seasons, including becoming the first Cavalier since Tiki Barber in 1996 to earn both academic and athletic All-America honors in the same season when he was a second-team CoSIDA Academic All-American in 2016.

Mendenhall saw the conclusion of quarterback Kurt Benkert's collegiate career in 2017. The UVA quarterback became the first player in program history to throw for over 3,000 yards in a season. Benkert finished 2017 with 3,207 passing yards and a single-season program record 298 completions. Benkert's 25 passing touchdowns in 2017 rank No. 2 all-time at UVA for a season. The starting quarterback for each of Mendenhall's first two seasons at Virginia, Benkert leaves No. 3 all-time at UVA in career passing yards (5,759) and passing touchdowns (46), which came in 24 career games for the Cavaliers.

In Mendenhall's first season on Grounds he oversaw a secondary that boasted first-team All-ACC honoree and All-American, Quin Blanding. Blanding finished the season No. 2 in the ACC in tackles for the third year in a row with 120 stops. Inside linebacker Micah Kiser, an All-American and first-team All-ACC honoree, thrived to lead the ACC in tackles for the second year in a row with 134, which is tied with former Cavalier great Wali Rainer for fourth-most in a single season in program history. Kiser was also a second-team CoSIDA Academic All-American, becoming the first Cavalier since Tiki Barber in 1996 to earn both academic and athletic All-America honors in the same season.

Offensively, in Mendenhall's first season, Taquan Mizzell became the first player in ACC history to record at least 1,500 career rushing and 1,500 career receiving yards. UVA quarterback Kurt Benkert set a couple of passing marks in UVA's new offense, including a program record for passing yards in a game with 421 against Central Michigan, which was only the second time in program history a UVA quarterback surpassed 400 passing yards in a game. Benkert reached 1,000 passing yards in four games and 2,000 passing yards in eight games, setting a program record for fastest to that standard in a season.

Mendenhall came to Charlottesville after 11 years as the head coach at Brigham Young University. In his 11 seasons, from 2005-2015, Mendenhall compiled an overall record of 99-43 at BYU to rank 12th in total wins among all FBS teams during that time.

In the three seasons prior to Mendenhall becoming the head coach at BYU, the Cougars compiled an overall record of 14-21. Over Mendenhall's 11 years at BYU, the Cougars were one of only 11 programs to advance to a bowl game each season (includes the 2015 season). BYU joined by Alabama, Boise State, Clemson, Florida State, Georgia, LSU, Oklahoma, Oregon, Virginia Tech and Wisconsin on that list.

Among those 11 teams, only Florida State has achieved more bowl wins (seven) than BYU's six bowl game victories.

The success of Mendenhall's leadership approach in running the BYU football program was highlighted in a management book, *Running Into the Wind: Bronco Mendenhall -- 5 Strategies for Building a Successful Team*, written by Alyson Von Feldt and Paul Gustavson, a leading management consultant specializing in leadership development and organizational design.

Mendenhall was elected in 2013 to the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees as the District 8 Representative and also serves on the AFCA Ethics Committee.
