ACC QUICK HITS

■ Twelve of 14 ACC teams are in action in week 10, including five conference matchups and two non-conference games. Virginia and North Carolina, which are tied atop the Coastal Division, cap the action Saturday night at 7:30 p.m. on ACCN. Virginia has won the last two head-to-head meetings in "The South's Oldest Rivalry," which was first played in 1892. Pitt is one of four teams with two losses in the Coastal Division, and plays at Georgia Tech at 4 p.m. on RSN. Virginia Tech, which is 2-2 in the Coastal Division, steps out of conference for a 2:30 p.m. matchup at Notre Dame.

■ In the Atlantic Division, a pair of noon games kick off the weekend when Syracuse plays host to Boston College on ACCN and Wake Forest welcomes NC State to Winston-Salem on ESPN. The Wolfpack and Deacons have played every year since 1910.

■ The annual cross-divisional rivalry between Miami and Florida State kicks off at 3:30 p.m. on ABC. Miami holds a 33-30 edge in the all-time series, which was first played in 1951, and has won two in row over the Seminoles.

■ There are 16 conference games remaining that involve at least one Coastal Division team, and entering week 10, there are 65,536 possible end-of-season standings scenarios. Following this week's games, there will be 8,192 possible scenarios, and after games of Nov. 9, the number decreases to 1,024 possible scenarios.

■ The ACC has posted 22 wins against teams with a .500 record-or-better, which ties for the most of any conference.

■ The ACC is the most competitive conference in the country with 17 of 32 conference games (53.1 percent) decided by one possession. That is the highest percentage of any Power 5 conference. Nine ACC games have been decided by three points or fewer, the most of any Power 5 league.

■ Including non-conference games, Miami and North Carolina have each played seven games decided by one possession, which ties for the most in the country. Pitt has played six games decided by eight points or fewer, Wake Forest has played five and Florida State and Virginia Tech have played four. North Carolina's four losses have come against teams that are a combined 24-3.

by one possession, which is more than all but one conference. In those 32 games, the Coastal teams are exactly 16-16 and have scored 778 points and allowed 778 points. Overall, all games involving at least one Coastal team have been decided by 1.7 points per game.

■ In ESPN's Football Power Index, 13 of the ACC's 14 teams are ranked in the top 76 of FPI, the most of any conference. FPI is a measure of team strength that is meant to be the best predictor of a team's performance going forward for the rest of the season.

■ The ACC boasts two of the top 10 offenses in the country in No. 4 Clemson and No. 5 Wake Forest. Four ACC teams rank among the top 15 defenses in the country, including No. 4 Clemson. The Tigers are the only team in the country in the top five in both total offense and total defense.

■ The league is on pace to have 12 bowl eligible teams and is the only conference in the country with 12 teams with a .500 record-or-better.

■ In the NCAA strength of schedule ranking, Louisville has played the nation's third-most difficult schedule based on past opposition. Louisville's opponents are a combined 39-15 (.722). It is the most difficult schedule to date of any Power 5 team. Florida State ranks fourth, followed by No. 6 North Carolina, No. 18 Miami and No. 23 Pitt.

■ Led by Pitt, seven ACC teams rank among the top 20 nationally in sacks per game. The Panthers lead the nation with 38 sacks in seven games (4.75/gm) and are followed by No. 4 Virginia (4.0), No. 7 NC State (3.71), No. 9 Clemson (3.63), No. 12 Virginia Tech (3.57) and No. 18 Syracuse (3.13) and Miami (3.13).

■ Clemson and Wake Forest are ranked in both the AP Top 25 Poll and the Amway Coaches Poll. Clemson is fourth in the AP poll and third in the Coaches poll. Wake Forest is No. 23 in the AP poll and No. 22 in the Coaches poll. Pitt, Virginia and Virginia Tech are receiving votes in at least one of the polls.

■ Clemson has won 23 consecutive games. That is the second-longest streak in ACC history and the longest active streak in the country. The league record is 29 straight by Florida State from 2012-14.

■ Clemson has won a nation's best 26 consecutive regular season games. The last time the Tigers lost a regular season game was at Syracuse on Oct. 13, 2017. Clemson has won 57 of its last 59 regular season games.

■ Clemson registered its 750th all-time victory with a 45-14 win over Florida State on Oct. 12. Clemson, which now has 752 wins, leads all ACC teams and ranks 15th among all FBS schools. Virginia Tech is 16th with 748. Georgia Tech (19th, 737) and Syracuse (22nd, 722) also rank among the top 25 in wins.

■ Eleven ACC head coaches have won at least 50 career games, including five with more than 100 victories. The five 100-win coaches are UNC's Mack Brown (248), Wake Forest's Dave Clawson (124), Clemson's Dabo Swinney (124), Virginia's Bronco Mendenhall (120) and Duke's David Cutcliffe (115). No other conference has as many coaches with 100 career wins.

■ Two of the five active coaches to win a national title reside in the ACC. Dabo Swinney led Clemson to national

titles in 2016 and 2018. UNC's Mack Brown won a national title at Texas in 2005.

■ Wake Forest place-kicker Nick Sciba has converted 23 consecutive field goals (last 11 of 2018; all 12 in 2019). The ACC record is 27 by Marc Primanti of NC State (last seven of 1995; all 20 in 1996). Sciba was a Lou Groza Star of the Week for his performance against FSU. He made all five field goals, including a 25-yard game-winner in a 22-20 win.

■ Junior RB Cam Akers has been named to the Paul Hornung Award Honor Roll for his performance in Florida State's 35-17 win over Syracuse. Akers carried the ball 23 times for 144 yards and four touchdowns, completed two passes from the wildcat position and caught two passes. Akers' record-tying four rushing scores included runs of 23, three and six yards in the first half, when he also ran for a two-point conversion. His final touchdown was a seven-yard run in the third quarter that put the game out of reach.

■ Clemson running back Travis Etienne has 46 career rushing touchdowns, which ties Florida State's Dalvin Cook (2014-16) for fifth in ACC history. Pitt's James Conner (2013-14, 2016) holds the ACC career mark with 52. Etienne also has 49 career touchdowns (46 rushing, 3 receiving), which is tied for seventh in league history.

■ Virginia kick returner Joe Reed is close to becoming the second player in ACC history with 3,000 kickoff return yards. Reed currently ranks second behind ACC record-holder T.J. Graham of NC State (2008-12). Syracuse's Sean Riley ranks seventh with 2,377 kickoff return yards.

■ BC running back AJ Dillon is on pace to set the ACC record for rushing yards per game. He is currently averaging 120.7 rushing yards per game, which is just ahead of the record set by FSU's Dalvin Cook set from 2014-16 (117.5 ypg). Dillon is also climbing the ACC career rushing chart, currently ranking 13th in league history.

■ The ACC leads the country with nine starting quarterbacks in the NFL. NC State leads all schools with three starters – Jacoby Brissett (Colts), Philip Rivers (Chargers) and Russell Wilson (Seahawks). Other starters from the ACC include Boston College's Matt Ryan (Falcons), Clemson's Deshaun Watson (Texans), Duke's Daniel Jones (NY Giants), Florida State's Jameis Winston (Buccaneers), Louisville's Lamar Jackson (Ravens) and North Carolina's Mitch Trubisky (Bears).

CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIFINALISTS

■ Six student-athletes from the ACC – Clemson center Sean Pollard, Duke quarterback Quentin Harris, Miami wide receiver K.J. Osborn, Pitt tight end Jim Medure, Virginia linebacker Jordan Mack and Wake Forest running back Cade Carney – have been named semifinalists for the 2019 William V. Campbell Trophy® Presented by Mazda, announced by the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame (NFF). Celebrating its 30th year in 2019, the award recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation for his combined academic success, football performance and exemplary leadership. An ACC player has won three of the last five Campbell Trophies and each of the last two.

AROUND THE ACC

■ **Boston College (BCeagles.com):** AJ Dillon became Boston College's all-time leading rusher with 76 yards rushing against Clemson. Dillon broke the record with a 10-yard carry in the third quarter to move past Andre Williams into the top spot in BC history. He now has 3,741 rushing yards.

■ **Clemson (ClemsonTigers.com):** Clemson has produced at least 550 yards in three straight games for the first time since 2013; scored 45 points in three consecutive games for the first time since 2012; and rushed for at least 275 yards in three straight games for the first time in the Dabo Swinney era.

■ **Duke (GoDuke.com):** QB Quentin Harris has tallied at least one rushing score in five of Duke's eight games.

■ **Florida State (Seminoles.com):** Akers tied an FSU

• The celebration will showcase the rich history and traditions of the sport and its contribution to American society, while also promoting the opportunity it continues to provide to thousands of student-athletes across all levels of college football.

• The Anniversary date for college football is November 6, 2019, marking 150 years since the first game between Princeton and Rutgers, November 6, 1869. The game was played on a plot of ground where present day Rutgers gymnasium now stands in New Brunswick, N.J. Rutgers won the first game, 6-4. There will be a number of special commemorations during Anniversary Week in November.



record with 4 rushing touchdowns in the Noles' 35-17 win over Syracuse, rushing for 144 yards on 20 carries (7.2 ypc). Akers ranks in the top 10 nationally in rushing yards, rushing yards per game, scoring, total touchdowns and rushing touchdowns.

■ **Georgia Tech (RamblinWreck.com):** Georgia Tech scored a season-high 28 points in the win over Miami. RB Jordan Mason ran for a career-high 141 yards a week after rushing for 106 vs. Duke.

■ **Louisville (GoCards.com):** Louisville has intercepted a pass in four straight games for the first time since 2016. The Cards have six interceptions in the last four games as a team. UofL has forced nine turnovers in the last four games. UofL has forced multiple turnovers in the last four games for the first time since 2016.

■ **Miami (HurricaneSports.com):** Miami kept Pitt out of the end zone for the second consecutive season. The Hurricanes limited Pitt to three points a year ago, and this year held the Panthers to four field goals in a 16-12 win.

■ **North Carolina (GoHeels.com):** With the win over Duke, Mack Brown became the winningest coach in Carolina football history with 73 victories. His career record with the Tar Heels is 73-50-1. Dick Crum held the previous record with 72 wins since 1987.

■ **NC State (GoPack.com):** Wolfpack WR Devin Carter set career-bests with six catches for 140 yards against Boston College. It marked his first game over 100 yards receiving.

■ **Pitt (PittsburghPanthers.com):** Junior PK Alex Kessman opened the scoring against Miami with a 54-yard field goal. It was Kessman's seventh career field goal of more than 50 yards, extending his own school record. Kessman now has kicked two field goals at Heinz Field longer than the NFL record of 53 yards.

■ **Syracuse (Cuse.com):** The Orange has played three consecutive games without turning the ball over. The last time Syracuse turned the ball over was a fumble on Sept. 28 in the fourth quarter versus Holy Cross – a stretch of 242 offensive plays.

■ **Virginia (VirginiaSports.com):** WR Joe Reed surpassed 100 career receptions in the Louisville game. He is the 24th Cavalier in program history to reach 100 career catches. He is the 22nd Cavalier in program history to have 100 career receptions and 1,000 career receiving yards. He is the second Cavalier to reach both plateaus this season, joining Hasise Dubois.

■ **Virginia Tech (HokieSports.com):** The North Carolina game was the first time since Sept. 22, 2007, that Virginia Tech had three players complete a pass. All three (Hendon Hooker, Ryan Willis and Quincy Patterson) threw a touchdown.

■ **Wake Forest (GoDeacs.com):** PK Nick Sciba made all five field goal attempts in a 22-20 win over Florida State. Sciba has made a nation's best 23 consecutive field goals.

■ Five active ACC running backs have rushed for at least 2,000 career yards, led by Boston College's AJ Dillon and Clemson's Travis Etienne, who each have more than 3,000 yards.

ACC FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME TICKETS ON SALE OCT. 1

■ Tickets for the 2019 ACC Football Championship Game are now on sale via Ticketmaster. Tickets can also be purchased on the ACC's official website, theACC.com, and at the Bank of America Stadium Ticket Office. Prices start at \$45 for upper level seating and \$55 for lower level seating. This year all tickets for the game will follow the Bank of America mobile ticket process. Fans must access their digital tickets through their mobile phones in order to enter the stadium.

■ The 15th annual ACC Football Championship Game is set for a prime time kickoff and will be nationally televised at 7:30 p.m. on ABC. ACC Football Championship Games played at Bank of America Stadium have had an average attendance of more than 70,000 with four sellouts.

■ Ten different ACC teams have competed in the game, including a different Coastal Division team each of the previous six years.

Owned and operated by ESPN in partnership with the Atlantic Coast Conference, ACC Network (ACCN) is a new 24/7 national network dedicated to ACC sports that launched on August 22, 2019. Approximately 450 live contests including 40 regular-season football games, 150 men's and women's basketball games, and 200 other regular-season competitions and tournament games from across the conference's 27 sponsored sports will be televised annually, plus a complement of news and information shows and original programming. Together, the ACCN and its digital platform, ACC Network Extra (ACCNX), will feature 1,350 ACC events in its first year. ESPN has been televising ACC content since 1979 and has exclusive rights to every conference-controlled game across all sports and championships.

FOUR NEW COACHES IN 2019

The ACC has four new coaches in 2019, including Geoff Collins at Georgia Tech, Scott Satterfield at Louisville, Manny Diaz at Miami and Mack Brown at North Carolina. Collins and Satterfield had successful stints at Temple and Appalachian State, respectively. Diaz, Miami's defensive coordinator the last three seasons, earned his first head coaching job after Mark Richt announced his retirement. Brown returns to the Tar Heels, where he coached from 1988-97 and entered 2019 as the winningest active coach in the country.

 The ACC has won seven national championships in football, men's basketball, women's basketball and baseball since 2015. That is the most of any conference. The ACC is the only conference to win each of those four titles over that stretch.

 The ACC has won more football national titles than any other conference since 2013 (three of the last six) and more men's basketball national championships than any other league since 2015 (three of the last five).

 ACC Champion Clemson won the league's eighth football national championship in 2018 with a 44-16 win over previously unbeaten Alabama. The 28-point margin of victory was the largest over a No. 1 ranked team in ACC history.

 The ACC has had a team in either the College Football Playoff or the BCS National Championship Game in each of the past six years.

 The ACC matched its league record with 11 bowl teams in 2018, including Boston College, Clemson, Duke, Georgia Tech, Miami, NC State, Pitt, Syracuse, Virginia, Virginia Tech and Wake Forest. The 11 bowl teams tied for the most among any conference.

 The ACC finished the bowl season with six postseason wins, which tied for the most among all conferences.

 The ACC is the only conference to send every team to at least one bowl game over the last three seasons. In addition, the ACC is tied for the most bowl teams (32) among all conferences over the last three years (11 in 2016, 10 in 2017, 11 in 2018).

 Since 2013, the ACC has the second-best record of any Power 5 conference in the BCS, New Year's Six and CFP games, and has the most national championships (Florida State in 2013, Clemson in 2016 & 2018).

 The ACC's 19 postseason wins over the last three (2016-18) years are the most of any conference.

 A league-record 10 ACC teams were ranked last year in the AP Top 25 poll, including Boston College, Clemson, Duke, Florida State, Miami, NC State, Pitt, Syracuse, Virginia and Virginia Tech. The previous ACC record for most teams ranked in a season was nine in 2008. The 10 ranked teams are tied for most among all conferences.

 An ACC football player has won the Heisman Trophy or the Campbell Trophy – commonly referred to as the “Academic Heisman” – in five of the last six years, something no other league can claim. Clemson DT Christian Wilkins won the Campbell Trophy last year. He is the second consecutive winner from the ACC.

 In 2019, ACC teams will play more games (20) against Power 5 competition (including Notre Dame) than any of their peers.

 This year, ACC teams will play more games against non-conference teams (16) ranked in last year's final Associated Press Top 25 than any other Power 5 conference.

 ACC teams will play 26 games against non-conference opponents that participated in bowl games in 2018, the highest total among Power 5 conferences.

 The ACC is in its sixth year of a 12-year agreement with the Capital One Orange Bowl, which will host an ACC team—either its champion or next available team—in all years when the Orange Bowl is not a semifinal site for the College Football Playoff. The opponent will be the highest ranked available team from the SEC, Big Ten or Notre Dame.

 Eleven ACC football teams have an APR higher than the Division I average of 968, which ties for most among peer conferences. In all sports, the ACC leads all Power 5 conferences with 95 teams from member schools recognized in the most recent NCAA APR Public Recognition Awards.

 Ten of 14 ACC Football teams earned a graduation success rate (GSR) at or above the FBS average. That was second-most among Power 5 conferences, both in terms of percentage and in total number.

 The ACC remains the only Power 5 conference to have multiple teams score 90 or higher in GSR each year since 2005. Duke (96), Wake Forest (93) and Boston College (90) reached that plateau last year.

 In its 2018 U.S. News and World “Best Colleges” rankings, ACC member schools combine for an average rank of 54.7, marking the 12th straight year that the ACC has led all Power 5 conferences.

ACC DIVISIONAL TIEBREAKER

If more than one team in the same division is tied for the best winning percentage in its Conference games, the procedures listed below will be followed to determine the division's representative in the ACC Championship Game:

Two-Team Tie:

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall win percentage. (Divisional and non-divisional) and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken from first-to-last using the league's tiebreaking procedures.
4. Overall win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined win percentage vs. all non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based on their order of finish (overall conference win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional teams based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the higher ranking by the Team Rating Score metric provided by SportSource Analytics following the conclusion of regular season games.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.

Three-Team (or More) Team Tie

(Once a team is eliminated from the tie, the tie-breaker procedures restart for the remaining teams. If the three (or more) team tie can be reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaker format will then be applied.)

1. Combined head-to-head win percentage among the tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall (divisional and non-divisional) Conference win percentage, and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken first to last, using the league's tie-breaker policies.
4. Combined win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Overall win percentage versus non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based upon their order of finish (overall win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional opponents based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the higher ranking by the Team Rating Score metric provided by SportSource Analytics following the conclusion of regular season games.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.



ACC BOWL SELECTION PROCESS

College Football Playoff (four teams)

The Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl and PlayStation Fiesta Bowl are national semifinal sites for the 2019 season. There is no limit on how many teams from one conference can appear in the CFP.

ACC Champion - Top Four CFP Ranking

If the ACC Champion is in the top four of the final CFP rankings, it will play in one of the national semifinal games.

ACC Champion - Not in Top Four CFP Ranking

If the ACC Champion is not in the top four of the final CFP rankings, it will appear in the Capital One Orange Bowl against the highest ranked available team from the Big Ten, SEC or Notre Dame following team selection by the Rose (Big Ten) and Sugar (SEC) Bowls.



HOME OF THE ACC

Capital One Orange Bowl

The Capital One Orange Bowl will host the ACC Champion (or highest ranked ACC team not ranked in the top four against the highest ranked available team from the Big Ten, SEC or Notre Dame following team selection by the Rose (Big Ten) and Sugar (SEC) bowls.

VRBO Citrus Bowl/Camping World Bowl

If the ACC opponent in the Capital One Orange Bowl is from the Big Ten, then an ACC team will be selected for the VRBO Citrus Bowl. The Camping World Bowl has the first pick of an ACC team after the CFP, New Year's Six Bowls and Citrus Bowl are filled.

Wake Forest - Dave Clawson (34-36 in sixth season at Wake Forest; 124-116 in 20th season overall)

Notes: The 113th meeting in a rivalry that dates back to 1895 and has been played consecutively every year since 1910 • The Demon Deacons' win last year was their second straight in the series • The Wolfpack leads 41-24-1 in ACC games and holds a 21-16-1 lead in games played in Winston-Salem • QB Jamie Newman threw a 32-yard touchdown pass to Jack Freudenthal with 30 seconds left to give Wake Forest a 27-23 upset victory in last year's game at the Wolfpack's Carter-Finley Stadium • The win was Wake Forest's first in Raleigh since 2006, but the Demon Deacons have won nine of their last 11 home games versus the Wolfpack • Wake Forest has clinched bowl eligibility for the fourth straight season under head coach Dave Clawson • NC State needs two more wins to become bowl eligible for the ninth time in 10 years and the sixth consecutive season under head coach Dave Doeren.

Notes: The Orange seeks its second consecutive win in this long-time rivalry, while Boston College will attempt to win on successive trips to Syracuse for the first time since 1969 and 1971 • The Orange has won 20 of the previous 26 games between the teams played in Syracuse • The Orange holds a 4-3 edge in the last seven games of the series which was first played in 1924 and saw the teams meet every year from 1971 through 2004 • Syracuse is Boston College's second-most played football opponent of all-time behind Holy Cross (82 meetings) • The Orange has won four of six games versus the Eagles since joining the ACC in 2013, including a 42-21 win at Chestnut Hill last season • QB Eric Dungey threw for 362 yards and three touchdowns and ran for three more scores as Syracuse rolled in the 2018 regular-season finale for both teams.

Notes: Virginia Tech visits Notre Dame for the second time in four seasons • Saturday marks the second consecutive year that the teams have met following Notre Dame's 45-23 victory last season in Blacksburg • QB Ian Book completed 25 of 35 passes for 271 yards and two touchdowns to key the Irish's road win • The only other previous meeting between the teams came at South Bend in 2016, when the Hokies rallied from 17 points down to post a 34-31 win • QB Jerod Evans threw for 267 yards and two touchdowns and ran for another, while PK Joey Slye's 20-yard field goal with 4:16 remaining proved the difference • Virginia Tech has six games scheduled against the Fighting Irish between now and 2036 • The Hokies are the third of five ACC opponents on this year's Notre Dame schedule • The Fighting Irish, who have already defeated Louisville and Virginia, will face visit Duke on Nov. 9 and play host to Boston College on Nov. 23.

Notes: Clemson faces its third non-conference opponent of the season and the first of two in-state non-league opponents in the month of November • The Tigers will close the regular season with a road trip to South Carolina on Nov. 30 • Clemson and Wofford last met in the 2015 season opener, when QB Deshaun Watson's two touchdown passes helped lift the Tigers to a 49-10 victory • The Tigers have won five straight in the series since the Terriers' 14-13 win at Clemson in 1933 • The series was first played in 1896 (a 16-0 Clemson road win) • Although every game between the schools since 1940 has been played in Death Valley, Wofford was the host school for seven of the first 10 series meetings • Current Wofford second-year head coach Josh Conklin has strong ACC ties after serving as defensive coordinator at Pitt for three seasons (2015-17).

Notes: The teams are even at 3-3 in previous ACC matchups, • Three games of the last four games have been decided by five points or less, including the Panthers' 24-19 win last season at Heinz Field • RB Qadree Ollison rushed for 91 yards and two touchdowns to lead Pitt, which built off the September win and eventually claimed the Coastal Division title • The series began with three games in Pittsburgh in 1918-20, with the Panthers winning each • The Yellow Jackets then won the next four meetings between the teams – including the Sugar Bowl to close the 1955 season, the Gator Bowl the following year, and regular-season games in 1974 and 1976 – before the current Coastal Division rivalry emerged with the Panthers' entry into the ACC in 2013 • The Panthers hold a 3-2 edge over Georgia Tech in Atlanta, though the Yellow Jackets prevailed 35-17 in the most recent matchup two seasons ago.

Notes: Miami holds a 33-30 edge in the all-time series, which was first played in 1951 • Florida State closed the gap by winning seven consecutive games in the rivalry before the Hurricanes stopped the run with a 24-20 road victory in Tallahassee in 2017, followed by last year's stunning win at Miami Gardens • QB N'Kosi Perry threw four touchdown passes, and No. 17 Miami pulled off its biggest comeback ever against Florida State by rallying from 20 points down midway through the second half to top the Seminoles 28-27 • It marked the fifth straight game in the series decided by five or fewer points • Miami holds a 15-10 edge over Florida State in games played in Tallahassee • The Seminoles have won 10 of the 15 ACC meetings between the schools since Miami joined the conference for the 2004 season • The teams have met every year since 1969.

Notes: Following seven straight UNC wins from 2010 through 2016, Virginia has won the last two head-to-head meetings in “The South’s Oldest Rivalry,” which was first played in 1892 • Saturday’s game will mark the 124th meeting between the programs and the 51st in Chapel Hill • UNC is 33-14-3 in previous home games versus the Cavaliers and leads 35-29-1 in ACC play • QB Bryce Perkins threw for three touchdowns and ran for another to lead Virginia’s 10-point win last season in Charlottesville • The Cavaliers won 20-14 on their most recent trip to Chapel Hill in 2017, capturing their first road win in the series since winning at Kenan Stadium in both 2007 and 2009 • Saturday will mark the 57th consecutive year the teams have met • Every game between the schools since 1944 has been played at UNC or UVA • The earlier days of the series featured a combined 23 neutral site games in Richmond, Norfolk and Atlanta.
