OPENING DRAW

GAME OVERVIEW

- Virginia welcomes the Princeton Tigers to Klöckner Stadium on Saturday. Faceoff is set for 12 p.m.
- This week Virginia is ranked No. 2 in both the USILA coaches poll Inside Lacrosse/Maverik media polls. Princeton is receiving votes in both polls.

THE SERIES VS. THE TIGERS

- Saturday marks the 27th all-time meeting between the Cavaliers and Tigers.
- UVA and Princeton are meeting for the third year in a row.
- UVA leads the all-time series 16-10. UVA is 1-3 all-time in the NCAA Tournament against Princeton. The losses in the 1994 and 1996 NCAA Tournaments came in the title game, while the 2000 setback was in the semifinal round. UVA's last NCAA meeting with Princeton (2012) is the Cavaliers' only win against the Tigers in the NCAA Tournament. It was a 6-5 triumph at Klöckner Stadium.

UVA ON THE GREEN GRASS OF KLÖCKNER

- Virginia owns a 149-39 (.7914) all-time record at Klöckner Stadium, including a 2-0 mark in 2020 and are winners of 11 of last 12 played in the historic edifice. UVA also is 12-3 all-time at Klöckner Stadium in the NCAA Tournament.
- UVA is 22-7 all-time at Klöckner Stadium under head coach Lars Tiffany.
- Klöckner Stadium first hosted lacrosse in 1993.



Michael Kraus is just the fourth Cavalier all-time and 10th in ACC history to record 100+ career goals and 100+ career assists.

COVERING THE CAVALIERS

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

Adequate space is available for the visiting team needs. Arrangement for broadcasts must be validated in advance through the UVA Athletics Media Relations Office.

All requests for interviews with coaches and players should be made through Vincent Briedis in the Athletics Media Relations Office. Postgame interviews are conducted at field level following the postgame handshake. Locker rooms are closed.

THE SERIES VS. THE TIGERS

- Virginia holds a 16-10 lead in the all-time series.
- The first meeting occurred in 1948, but it wasn't until the 1990s that the two schools began to meet with regularity (an annual series began in 1992).
- The annual series was contested from 1992-2008.
- In addition to the regular season series, the two teams have battled in the NCAA Tournament championship game twice (1994, '96), in the semifinals once (2000) and the first round once (2012).
- Virginia has won six in a row and eight of the last nine match-ups.
- The Cavaliers are 6-2 in Princeton, including winning the last four.
- The one-goal win in 2006 was Virginia's closest game as the Cavaliers rolled to the 2006 national title undefeated.
- The 2006 and 2007 games have been 7-6 Cavalier victories with Ben Rubeor scoring the winning goal each time.
- UVA's 9-7 win over the Tigers in 1998 ended their 29-game winning streak

HISTORY SUGGESTS A TIGHT CONTEST

- One of the most prominent characteristics of the Princeton series is how close the games have been—a game decided by more than three goals qualifies as a rout.
- Only five of the last 21 meetings since 1992 have been decided by more than three goals.
- One goal has been the margin on nine occasions (including 7-6 Cavalier wins in 2006 and 2007, 6-5 in 2012 and 12-11 in overtime last year), while five more have been decided by two goals and four by three goals
- Princeton has had remarkable success vs. Virginia in tight games, winning five of the nine one-goal games
- The Cavaliers have won four of five games decided by two goals and three of the three three-goal games.
- Since 1992, Virginia's average margin of victory is 2.8 goals, while Princeton's is 2.4.

LAST MEETING (UVA AT PRINCETON - 2019)

• Michael Kraus found Ian Laviano 1:02 into overtime and the then-No. 12 Virginia Cavaliers escaped New Jersey with a 12-11 triumph over then-No. 19 Princeton Tigers at Class of 1952 Stadium.

• With Princeton leading 11-10 with 6:55 left in regulation, the UVA defense held firm and kept the Tigers scoreless for the game's final 7:57, including overtime. Ryan Conrad scored an unassisted goal at 4:01 in the fourth quarter to tie the game, 11-11.

• The Cavaliers also overcame a two-goal deficit early in the third quarter, 7-5 and 9-7. A Laviano goal at the end of the third quarter, followed by a Kraus goal at the start of the fourth tied the game at 9-9. It was one of seven ties in the game.

• Former UVA goalie Patrick Burkinshaw made his first collegiate start and collegiate debut against the Tigers. He was stingy in the goal, saving 24 shots, which was a Class of 1952 Stadium record, a UVA single-game freshman record.

• UVA's ot winner at Princeton was one of five overtime games for the Cavaliers (all UVA wins) in 2019. It was the first of three straight won by the Cavaliers. The other two came in the NCAA Tournament.

DOX AITKEN LEADS THE NATION'S MIDFIELD

• Senior Dox Aitken has 114 career goals, which leads all active midfielders.

• He is the only midfielder currently playing that has 100+ career goals.

KRAUS HAS A POINT IN 51-STRAIGHT GAMES

• Michael Kraus has a point in all 51 games of his career, which ranks tied for No. 2 among active players.

• Saturday's game will pit No. 2 on the list (Kraus) vs. No. 4 on the list, Princeton's Michael Sowers

• Virginia has four players with an active point streak of 20+ games, making the Cavaliers the only team with at least three players on its roster with active streaks of 20+ games with at least one point.

• Kraus ranks No. 2 in the nation at 51 games, while Ian Laviano ranks No. 16 with a streak of 32 games. Matt Moore is No. 18 in the nation with a streak of 29 games and Dox Aitken is No. 27 in the nation with a streak of 24 games with at least one point.

• Last time out against Lehigh, A Michael Kraus became the fourth Cavalier to record 100+ career goals and 100+ career assists. He joins Kevin Pehlke, Danny Glading and Steele Stanwick to reach this milestone in a UVA uniform.

MATT MOORE RETURNS

- A Matt Moore moved to attack in 2019 and became the first 40-40 player in UVA history, finishing the season with 46 goals and 43 assists.
- Moore has picked up where he left off in 2019, already leading UVA with six goals and four assists. His 10 points also leads the team.

VIRGINIA IN THE POLLS

- Virginia has been ranked in the top five of the USILA Coaches poll 290 weeks all-time.
- UVA has been ranked in the Top 10 in 435 polls all-time.
- UVA has been ranked No. 1 in the nation in 68 all-time polls.
- UVA owned the preseason No. 1 ranking for the first time since 2012.
- UVA was the USILA's preseason No. 1 team in 2011 and 2012.
- The USILA Poll began in 1973.

TIFFANY CONNECTED TO UVA'S TITLE COACHES

- UVA head coach Lars Tiffany is connected in the lacrosse world to both Glenn Thiel and Dom Starsia, the first two Virginia coaches who brought NCAA titles to Charlottesville.
- Tiffany played for Starsia at Brown and coached under Thiel at Penn State (2000-04).
- Tiffany became the third UVA coach to win an NCAA title with the Cavaliers' 2019 win.

VIRGINIA IS A GROUND BALL MACHINE

- Entering 2020, UVA has led the nation in ground balls six of the last 11 years, including the last three seasons under Lars Tiffany.
- UVA is the only school in the nation to finish in the Top-5 nationally in ground balls per game 10 times over the last 11 seasons.
- Duke is the closest team to UVA, finishing in the Top-5 four times during the same span.
- The only school in 2016 to finish with more ground balls per game was UVA head coach Lars Tiffany's 2016 Brown team.

The No. 1 Virginia Cavaliers used a strong first half to outlast the No. 14 Loyola Greyhounds, 12-9, at Klöckner Stadium.

Cavalier goalie Alex Rode tied his career high with 19 saves, including 13 in the first half as Virginia built a 9-3 heading into intermission.

HOW IT HAPPENED

UVA opened the game on a 4-1 run in the first quarter, netting goals by Ian Laviano, Matt Moore and two from Payton Cormier. Moore's unassisted score at 3:16 in the first capped the run. After Loyola scored an extra-man goal at 13:42 by Adam Poitras, via a Aidan Olmstead helper, The Cavaliers reeled off five-straight goals, taking a commanding 9-2 lead.

Peter Garno started the spurt with his first collegiate goal, while Moore scored two more goals and assisted another. Michael Bienkowski capped the run on a Laviano assist. The seven-goal UVA lead was insurmountable for the Greyhounds, despite finishing the game on a 7-3 streak

FROM THE LOCKER ROOM

"I loved how physical we played today. We came out with really good energy. We probably had too many penalties because of that physicality and energy, but that's the style of lacrosse we want to play and we just have to rely on our man-down defense to be solid. We did a decent job man-down today, but boy, the guy behind us [Alex Rode] is who bailed us out and allowed us to breathe a little better with Alex Rode being such a wall in the cage. Seeing an extension of what he did last May, and we've seen that in practice and throughout the scrimmages, and it was really wonderful to see that come to fruition in the first game of 2020. Offensively you can see how we can go on big runs. Certainly not happy with how we played lacrosse in the second half offensively. Give credit to Loyola's zone defense and their goalie play, but I thought we became a little tight and we have to make sure we aren't going a little shorter with our possessions and that we're playing a little more free and looser." – Lars Tiffany

The No. 1 Virginia Cavaliers used a strong first quarter to outlast the No. 18 Lehigh Mountain Hawks, 12-8, at Klöckner Stadium.

Michael Kraus led the Cavaliers with four goals and one assist in the winning effort. The assist for Kraus gave him 100 for his career, making him the fourth Cavalier all-time to record 100+ career goals and 100+ career assists. He is also the 10th player in ACC history to accomplish this feat.

HOW IT HAPPENED

The Cavaliers opened the game on a 6-1 run to start the first quarter. Kraus scored three goals during the run, while UVA also received scores from Matt Moore, Jared Conners and Payton Cormier. Peter Garno found Cormier with 1:39 left in the first quarter to cap the strong UVA start.

Lehigh made it a game in the second quarter, scoring three-straight goals to cut UVA's lead to two goals, 6-4. Christian Mule' scored with 8:44 left in the first half to finish off the run. Lehigh didn't score again for the next 22:54 and UVA began to put the game out of reach, staking claim to a 9-4 advantage with 2:40 left to play in the third quarter. Goals by Moore and Kraus to start the fourth quarter solidified the UVA lead, 11-5, with 9:14 left to play as the Cavaliers held on for the victory.

FROM THE LOCKER ROOM

"Contested ground balls were the critical key today. We felt like when there were two or three Lehigh men and two to three Virginia men who came up with a lot of those extra possessions, which was critical in a game where the opponent was very strong at the faceoff x as Lehigh is with both [Conor] Gaffney and [Mike] Sisselberger. Our team defense, there was some really good communication going on out there. Give Lehigh's coaching staff credit for making adjustments throughout the game. Minor adjustments, trying to go after what we were doing defensively, so we had to make some adjustments. Our young defense, really kind of spearheaded by Kyle Kology and his decision-making. He [Kology] made some really good decisions on when to slide, when to support the dodger and changing some slides at times. It's really a credit to Kyle and the rest of the defense working together. Really appreciative of the fans coming out on a near freezing temperature day but what a beautiful, sunny day to play lacrosse at Klöckner again." – Lars Tiffany
