OPENING KICK

VIRGINIA HOSTS FLORIDA STATE SATURDAY NIGHT

 The Virginia Cavaliers host the Florida State Seminoles on Saturday night at Scott Stadium. It is only the third time since 2005 that FSU has visited Charlottesville.

VIRGINIA VS. FLORIDA STATE

- Virginia and Florida State are meeting for the 19th time in the programs' history, with FSU holding a 15-3 advantage in the series including a 6-2 mark in Charlottesville.
- UVA's first two wins in the series came over top-five ranked FSU teams – a 33-28 win over then-No. 2 FSU in 1995 and a 26-21 victory over then-No. 4 FSU in 2005. Those wins represent the two highest-ranked foes UVA has ever defeated.
- Virginia's win over then-No. 23 Florida State in the 2011 meeting proved to be historic for the Cavaliers as UVA became the first program in college football history to record road victories at Florida State and Miami in the same season. Those two programs have brought eight combined National Championships to the Sunshine State. UVA also defeated the Miami Hurricanes, 28-21, at then-Sun Life Stadium earlier during the 2011 season on ESPN's Thursday Night Football.
- UVA was the only team in college football history to accomplish the feat until North Carolina did so in 2016.

FIVE TOP STORYLINES

• Virginia is playing its third night game of 2019. It marks only the second season (1983) in program history in which UVA opened a season with three-straight night games. The Cavaliers are 61-47-1 all-time in night games, including 37-18-1 at Scott Stadium. Under Bronco Mendenhall, UVA is 5-4 in night contests. All three of UVA's wins against Florida

State came in night games, two of which (1995, 2005) took place at Scott Stadium.

- A win against FSU would give UVA a 2-0 start in ACC play for the second time in three seasons (2017) and for the fifth time since the 2007 season (started 4-0).
- Saturday marks only the third time in 19 meetings that FSU isn't ranked when they faced UVA and the first time the Cavaliers have been ranked and the Seminoles have not.
- · Against William & Mary the Cavaliers scored touchdowns in all three phases of the game (offense, defense, special teams) for the first time since 2002 against Akron. The Cavaliers scored five offensive touchdowns, as well as scores on a 100-yard kick return by Joe Reed and an 85-yard interception return by Nick Grant.
- Last time out **Bryce Perkins** became the fastest (15 games) Cavalier quarterback to reach both 1,000 career rushing yards and 3,000 career passing yards. The previous record was 31 career games by Shawn Moore (1987-90).

#TheStandard: BY THE NUMBERS

A win on Saturday against Florida State would mark the first 3-0 start to a season by the Cavaliers since the 2005 team started 3-0.

UVA is ranked No. 14 in the nation (No. 2 in the ACC) in total defense, allowing an average of 228 yards per game.

UVA and FSU are meeting for the 19th time in series history and for the first time in Charlottesville since 2010.

VIRGINIA FACTS

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT
The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

The first documented Cavalier on horseback was Francis Bell, a Virginia student from Dublin, Va., in 1947. Bell rode onto the field dressed as Cavaliers for Virginia's home football game with Harvard on the afternoon of October 11.

The Cavalier on horseback returned as the University's mascot in 1963. The UVA Polo Club provided both the horse and rider. However, the mounted Cavalier and his horse parted company in 1974 with the inception of AstroTurf at Scott Stadium.

The mounted Cavalier made its return in the Florida Citrus Bowl at the end of the 1989 football season. Due to its instant popularity, the Cavalier on horseback returned the following season on a regular basis and continues to lead the Virginia football team onto the field at the beginning of all home games.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wahhoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

IT'S BEEN GREAT SEEING YOU

- Because of the ACC's unbalanced schedule, UVA has not hosted Florida State since 2010.
- In 2013 the ACC announced a 12-year schedule for its rotating division crossover opponents through the 2024 season. Between 2013 and 2024 UVA and Florida State were only scheduled to meet this season and 2014.
- Virginia and Florida State played every season from 1993-2006, but have only played three times since (2010, 2011 and 2014).
- In 2024 when the already announced ACC rotating crossover conference schedule is complete, UVA and Florida State will have met just four times in 19 seasons between 2006-2024.

1995 FSU-UVA GAME FEATURED 62 FUTURE NFL PLAYERS

- The Cavaliers handed FSU its first-ever loss in the ACC and snapped FSU's 29-game conference winning streak when UVA's Anthony Poindexter and Adrian Burnim were both in on the goal-line tackle of Warrick Dunn as time expired in the 1995 win over then-No. 2 Florida State.
- In all, a total of 62 players on the FSU and UVA rosters (30 from UVA) went on to play in the NFL, including 45 players who participated in the game (22 from UVA). No other ACC game has had more future NFL participants.

"WE COULDN'T STOP THAT DADGUM NO. 18"

- The 2005 meeting between UVA and Florida State served as the Cavaliers' last home win in the series, as the Cavaliers outlasted FSU 26-21.
- Current UVA wide receivers coach Marques Hagans was a thorn in Florida State's side during the 2005 meeting, prompting then-head coach Bobby Bowden to respond post-game: "I've never seen a quarterback make as many one-man plays as he made tonight. We couldn't stop that dadgum No. 18."
- Hagans threw for a then-career-best 306 yards and two touchdowns and Connor Hughes kicked four field goals for the Cavaliers.
- Like UVA's victory in 1995, which ended with Warrick Dunn stopped inches from the goal line on the final play to preserve a 33-28 victory, this one went to the wire, too, sealed by Tony Franklin's interception of Drew Weatherford with 50 seconds left.

VIRGINIA - FLORIDA STATE CONNECTIONS

- UVA head coach Bronco Mendenhall faced Florida State twice as the head coach of BYU, losing at home in 2009 and in Tallahassee in 2010. With Saturday's game against FSU, Mendenhall will have coached against each of the last three FSU head coaches (Bobby Bowden, Jimbo Fisher and Willie Taggart), which have covered the program since 1976.

Last Meeting

The Cavaliers lost 34-20 to second-ranked Florida State the last time these two teams met.

The Cavaliers used two early interceptions by Florida State quarterback Jameis Winston to jump out to a 13-7 lead.

Seminoles freshman receiver Travis Rudolph stopped in the middle of his route with Florida State leading 7-0 and Maurice Canady was able to break off and pick off Winston's pass.

Virginia capitalized on the ensuing possession and Andrew Levrone hauled in a 16-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Greyson Lambert in front of cornerback P.J. Williams to tie it at 7-7.

Winston threw his second interception four plays later when he tried to force it to tight end Nick O'Leary. The ball was tipped in the air and gathered by Eli Harold.

The Cavaliers took their lone lead of the game on the next possession when Darius Jennings caught a 15-yard pass from Lambert, again on Williams. A missed extra point left Florida State trailing 13-7 at the end of the first quarter.

Things then fell off when Lambert threw an interception and was credited for a fumble on a failed backward pass. The Seminoles scored touchdowns on the first play of each ensuing possession and took a 28-13 lead into halftime.

Lambert finished with 220 passing yards with three touchdowns, one interception and one fumble. Kevin Parks led the team with 43 rushing yards while Canaan Severin had a team-high 56 receiving yards and the touchdown.

VIRGINIA RANKED AGAIN BY THE ASSOCIATED PRESS

- Virginia comes in this week at No. 25 in the *Associated Press* poll. It is the second time under Bronco Mendenhall the Cavaliers have been ranked by the AP. Last year UVA came in at No. 23 during week No. 10 of the season.
- It is the first time since 2005 that UVA has been ranked by the Associated Press in the month of September.

HOLLINS SHINES IN OFFENSIVE DEBUT

- •True freshman running back Mike Hollins scored a touchdown on his first career rush against William & Mary. The nine-yard scoring jaunt made Hollins the first Cavalier since Jordan Ellis (2015) to score a touchdown on his first collegiate rush. Ellis also did so against William & Mary.
- Hollins led UVA off the bench with 78 yards on 11 carries (7.1 average) and two rushing touchdowns.
- Hollins made his collegiate debut in the opener at Pitt on special teams.

CAVALIERS SCORE 50 AGAINST WILLIAM & MARY

• Virginia scored 52 points against William & Mary. It was the first time the Cavaliers scored 50 yards in a game since tallying 51 against Akron in 2004. It is the most points UVA has scored in a game since reaching 56 against North Carolina, also in 2004.

REED TAKING IT TO THE HOUSE

- WR Joe Reed recorded the fourth 100-yard kick return for a touchdown in program history with his lone return against William & Mary.
- Reed joins Tavon Mason (2001) and Marquis Weeks (2002 & 2004) as the only Cavaliers to record a 100yard kick return in program history.
- Reed is one of two players in the nation this season to notch a 100-yard kick return, joining USC's Velus Jones who did so in the season opener against Fresno State.
- Reed has returned four kicks in his career for a touchdown, which is a UVA record. No other player has returned more than two. No other player has returned kicks in three seprate seasons as Reed returned two in 2017, one in 2018 and one in 2019.

NICK GRANT'S PICK-6 PROVES PROPHETIC

- CB Nick Grant notched his first career interception and returned it 85 yards for a touchdown against William & Mary.
- The redshirt junior entered came to UVA in 2016 and was prophetic to call that he would return his first career INT for a touchdown. Grant said postgame: "You can ask all of my friends; I told them that my first career pick is going to the crib. It's going to be a touchdown and I've been saying that since my first year of college. It just so happened to come my way my fourth year. I've definitely dreamed about it my whole life. It's a DB's dream."
- Grant's 85-yard interception return is the third-longest in program history and is the longest in the nation this season.

"ZZ STOP" HELPS LEAD THE WAY FOR UVA'S TOP-20 DEFENSE

- ILB Zane Zandier currently leads Virginia with 18 tackles as UVA is ranked No. 14 in the nation (No. 2 in the ACC) in total defense, allowing an average of 228 yards per game.
- UVA is No. 14 in the nation (No. 2 in the ACC) in rushing defense, allowing 70.5 rushing yards per game.
- Against William & Mary, Zandier led the UVA defense with nine tackles, one sack and two tackles for loss in the team's 52-17 win vs. the Tribe. The Cavaliers held William & Mary to just eight first downs and 193 total yards of offense. The Tribe averaged 1.8 rushing yards per attempt and converted just 1-of-11 third-down attempts. The Cavaliers managed to record seven QB sacks during the contest.

UVA CONTINUES TO CLICK ON THIRD DOWN

- Virginia is No. 1 in the ACC and No. 16 in the nation in third-down conversion percentage (55.2) after two weeks.
- •The Cavaliers are continuing their success from 2018 when UVA was No. 1 in the ACC and No. 6 in the nation in third-down conversion percentage (49.1).
- •The 2018 season and so far the 2019 campaign are vast improvements from 2017 when the Cavaliers were No. 8 in the ACC and No. 74 in the nation at 39.2 percent.

CAVALIERS HAVE HELD THE ADVANTAGE IN FIELD POSITION

- •The Cavaliers have been +15 in field position so far this season
- UVA's average starting field position has been its own 42.5, while UVA opponents average its 27-yard line.
- UVA won the field position battle in 2018, averaging the 33-yard line to start a drive while opponents averaged the 27.7-yard line.

TRUE FRESHMAN STARTING ON THE DEFENSIVE LINE

- Against Pitt, NT Jowon Briggs became the fifth UVA freshman (true or redshirt) since 1986 to start a season opener on the defensive line. Briggs is also the second in two seasons as teammate NT Jordan Redmond (also a true freshman) did so last year against Richmond. Briggs and Redmond are the first UVA freshmen to start a season opener on the defensive line since 2002 when DE Kwakou Robinson started against Colorado State. The other two UVA freshmen to start an opener on the defensive line are DE Matt Conrath (RS-Fr., 2008 vs. USC) and NT Tim O'Conner (RS-Fr., 1986 vs. South Carolina).
- Briggs was part of UVA's run-stop game, helping limit Pitt to only 78 rushing yards on 30 carries (2.6 ypr).
 Briggs was 17-years old for the season-opener at Pitt, turning 18 on Sept. 1. The team sang him happy

TEN UVA TRUE FRESHMEN HAVE MADE DEBUT IN 2019

• Ten UVA true freshmen have appeared in a game in 2019. The full list includes: LS Enzo Anthony, DT Jowon Briggs, DB Tenyeh Dixon, WR Dorien Goddard, RB Mike Hollins, OL Ja'Quay Hubbard, ILB Nick Jackson, OLB Jairus Satiu, DE Ben Smiley III and WR Dontayvion Wicks.

CAVALIER DEFENSE SHUTS DOWN PITT'S RUSHING ATTACK

- Virginia held Pitt to 78 rushing yards on 30 rushes, which was only 2.6 yards per rush.
- During UVA's previous four-game losing streak to Pitt, the Panthers rushed for 780 yards on 166 carries and eight touchdowns. That comes to an average of 195 rushing yards on 41.5 carries (4.7 ypr) and a two-touchdown average during the UVA losing streak to Pitt. The Panthers rushed for 254 yards in the 2018 meeting and 209 yards in the 2016 meeting.
- UVA's defense as a whole was stout in the season opener at Pitt. If you take away the two Pitt scoring drives, which yielded 165 yards of total offense on 21 plays, UVA's defense held the Panthers to 98 yards of total offense on 50 plays (1.96).

TAULAPAPA PICKS UP THE TAILBACK MANTLE FOR THE CAVALIERS

- Sophomore running back Wayne Taulapapa, who lettered in 2018 on special teams, carried the ball for the first time in his collegiate career at Pitt in the season opener.
- Taulapapa, who made his first career start, rushed 10 times for 66 yards (6.6 ypr) and one touchdown as Virginia looks for a running back to replace 1,000-yard rusher Jordan Ellis from 2018. Taulapapa missed the William & Mary game with an injury.
- Taulapapa is a member of the 2016 recruiting class, but did not enroll until 2018 after serving a two-year LDS mission to Managua, Nicaragua.
- The native of Laie, Hawaii attended Punahou High School in Honolulu. Taulapapa's roundtrip to high school each day was an average of 3.5 hours (1:45 one way) on the road.

NASH GRIFFIN SHINES IN PUNTING DEBUT

- With the graduation of former All-ACC punter Lester Coleman, junior Nash Griffin made his punting debut in the season opener at Pitt. Griffin previously had appeared in 26 games from 2017-18 as UVA's holder. Griffin continues his holding duties in 2019.
- Griffin punted four times against the Panthers and averaged 45.5 yards per punt. Three of his punts went inside the 20-yard line and his long punt went 49 yards.
- Griffin received a day off against William & Mary as the Cavaliers did not punt at all in a game for the first time since 1989 vs. Duke.
- Griffin was high school basketball teammates at Lawrence Central High School in Indianapolis, Ind., with Kyle Guy, the 2019 NCAA Tournament's Most Outstanding Player from Virginia.
- Griffin was roommates for three years at UVA with Kyle Guy before he was drafted (and married) in the second round of the 2019 NBA Draft by the Sacramento Kings.

HALL MAKING THE START AT CB

- CB Bryce Hall has made 35 consecutive starts. That is the most in the nation among active cornerbacks. He made his first collegiate start on Oct. 15, 2016 when Pitt came to Scott Stadium.
- Hall is tied for No. 2 in the nation for consecutive starts among active defensive players. Below is where Hall ranks among the nation's defensemen with the most consecutive starts.

DELANEY NAMED ACC SPECIALIST OF THE WEEK (SEPT. 2)

- PK Brian Delaney booted three field goals (four total attempts) in UVA's 30-14 win at Pitt.
- He had field goals of 39, 36 and 45 yards. He finished the game with 12 points, the most among all week one ACC kickers. His three field goals tied for the most on the opening weekend among ACC players.
- Also, Delaney became the first Virginia kicker to make at least three kicks of 35 yards or greater in the same game since lan Frye did at Miami in 2015.

BRONCO MENDENHALL LED VIRGINIA TO BACK-TO-BACK BOWLS

- After playing in the Military Bowl in 2017, Bronco Mendenhall led Virginia to back-to-back bowls in 2018 for the first time since 2004 and 2005 after the Cavaliers earned a Belk Bowl invite.
- Mendenhall's Cavalier squad shutout South Carolina, 28-0, in the 2018 Belk Bowl to give UVA its first bowl victory since the 2005 Music City Bowl. UVA's shutout performance was the first over an SEC team in a bowl game by a non-SEC team since the 1975 Gator Bowl.

BRONCO MENDENHALL IS IN SPECIAL COMPANY

- Bronco Mendenhall is one of three active coaches that has inherited at least two programs in his career that were coming off a losing season and in year one, or year two, played in a bowl game. The others to do it are Nick Saban (Alabama, LSU, Michigan State) and Mark Dantonio (Michigan State/Cincinnati).
- Mendenhall inherited a BYU team that went 5-6 in 2004 and in his first season the Cougars went 6-6 and played in the 2005 Las Vegas Bowl. Mendenhall took over a Virginia team that went 4-8 in 2015 and took the Cavaliers to the 2017 Military Bowl in year No. 2, finishing 6-7.

RETURNING DEFENSE LOOKS TO BUILD UPON STRONG 2018

- While the UVA defense lost three players that are currently in the NFL, CB Tim Harris (49ers), OLB Chris Peace (Chargers) and SS Juan Thornhill (Chiefs), the unit returns 11 Cavaliers that started at least five games in 2018.
- The defense shined in 2018, finishing No. 12 in the nation in team passing efficiency defense (107.62), No. 16 in passing yards allowed (183.0), No. 20 in the nation in team defense (330.5) and No. 20 in scoring defense (20.1).
- UVA returns defensive starts in 2018 from Bryce Hall (13), Charles Snowden (13), Eli Hanback (12), Brenton Nelson (12), Jordan Mack (9), Zane Zandier (8), Robert Snyder (6), Mandy Alonso (5), Joey Blount (5), Darrius Bratton (5) and Jordan Redmond (5).
- UVA also returns Chris Moore, who had six starts in 2017 but missed 2018 with an injury.

RETURN OF THE MACK

- Senior inside linebacker Jordan Mack is UVA's leading returning tackler after finishing 2018 with 66 tackles. Despite missing four games with an injury in 2018, he still finished No. 2 on the team in stops behind current NFL safety Juan Thornhill (98).
- Mack is on the 2019 Bronko Nagurski Trophy Watch List and is UVA's candidate for the 2019 Campbell Trophy.
- Mack enters 2019 No. 2 in the ACC among active career tackle leaders with 220 stops (No. 17 nationally). Miami's Shaquille Quarterman (249) is the only ACC player with more career tackles entering 2019.
- He finished No. 5 in the ACC with 114 tackles in 2017 (No. 26 nationally). Joining 2017 Campbell Trophy winner Micah Kiser, an All-American, and fellow All-American Quin Blanding, Mack was a part of the only "Power 5" trio (one of two in FBS) to each have at least 100 tackles in the same season.
- Mack's older brother, Charles, is on staff at UVA as a regional scout for the football program. Charles was a four-year letterwinner at Richmond and was on the field for the Spiders when Jordan made his collegiate debut in 2016. Jordan and Charles' father, Charles Mack Sr., played football at Georgia Tech (1983-87).

PERKINS IS A THREAT ON THE RUN

- QB Bryce Perkins is the nation's leading returning quarterback when it comes to avoided tackles. He led all "Power 5" quarterbacks with 46 last season, second only to UConn's David Pindell (56).
- Among quarterbacks, Perkins was also tied for No. 7 in the nation in 2018 among rushes of 15+ yards. He recorded 13 rushes of 15+ yards, tying him with Heisman Trophy winner Kyler Murray. When you take out the three option quarterbacks ahead of Perkins (and Murray), the UVA signal caller ranked tied for No. 4.
- Of all the quarterbacks with more rushes of 15+ yards than Perkins in 2018, none threw for over 2,500 yards. Perkins logged 2,680 passing yards. Only Ohio's Nathan Rourke returns in 2019 having more rushes of 15+ yards than Perkins. Rourke had 17 in 2018.

PERKINS CAN JOIN SPECIAL COMPANY IN 2019

- Last year Perkins was one of two players in the nation with 2,600+ passing yards (2,680) and 900+ rushing yards (923), joining Heisman Trophy winner Kyler Murray (Oklahoma).
- Since the year 2000, Perkins and Murray are the only players in the nation in a single season to complete at least 64 percent of their passes, while also throwing for 2,000+ yards, rushing for 900+ yards and being responsible for at least 30 touchdowns.
- If Perkins manages 2,500+ passing yards, 500+rushing yards, 30+ touchdowns responsible for and completes at least 60 percent of his passes, he will join a special list of the following quarterbacks over the past 10 years to post multiple seasons with those numbers: Marcus Mariota (3 times), JT Barrett (3 times), Robert Griffin III, Taylor Kelly, Johnny Manziel, Brett Hundley, Dak Prescott, Marquise Williams and Deshaun Watson.

REED FINISHED 2018 WITH THE HOT HAND

- Over the last four games of the 2018 season, WR Joe Reed made nine receptions for 227 yards and five touchdowns. He averaged 25.2 yards per reception over that span.
- For the 2018 season, Reed averaged 18.6 yards per reception, which ranked No. 4 in the ACC and No. 19 in the nation. Reed added seven receiving touchdowns, which was second on the team.

REED IS SPECIAL ON "SPECIAL TEAMS"

- WR Joe Reed owns UVA's career all-time kick return yardage record with 2,394 career kick return yards.
- Reed also led UVA in 2018 in special teams tackles with seven. He has made five on kickoffs and two on punt returns.
- . • In 2018, Reed returned 26 kicks for 707 yards (27.2 yards per return), which was No. 2 in the ACC and No. 10 nationally.
- In 2017, Reed returned 29 kicks for 861 yards (29.7 yards per return), which was No. 1 in the ACC and No. 8 nationally.

MORE ON REED AND KICK RETURNS

- Since 2016, Joe Reed is the only "Power 5" player to average 27+ yards per kick return for his career as the senior owns a 28.2 career average.
- Reed is one of two active FBS players to average 27+ yards per return for their career. Houston's Marcus Jones joins Reed. Jones owns a career average of 27.6 yards per return, which includes his 2017 and 2018 seasons played at Troy. Per transfer rules, Jones is sitting out the 2019 season at Houston.
- Since 2000, Reed is one of eight "Power 5" players to average 27+ yards for a career. He is one of 22 FBS players since 2000 to average 27+ yards per kick return for a career.

JANA PUNCHES THE KEYS

- WR Terrell Jana taught himself to play the piano by watching YouTube videos in his spare time at Woodberry Forest. He originally started to learn a song to surprise his mom and ended up enjoying it so much he kept up the self-study.
- The song Jana set out to learn to play for his mom was Brian McKnight's "Crazy Love."

TEAM NOTES

CAMPBELL TROPHY NOMINEE HELPS WITH LOCAL CAFE

- · ILB Jordan Mack is UVA's 2019 nominee for the prestigious Campbell Trophy (Academic Heisman).
- A community involvement he is passionate about is his work with the Kindness Café + Play, which is a café in Charlottesville that employs people with cognitive disabilities, creating a space where people with and without disabilities interact as peers and where connections are made. Jordan's volunteer work with the café includes marketing and promotion of the café locally about the need for such an endeavor in the community.

HAILING FROM THE GRAND CANYON STATE; IT'S AN ASU CONNECTION

- QB Bryce Perkins and graduate transfer WR Terrell Chatman were both part of the same recruiting class at Arizona State in 2015. Both current Cavaliers utilized a redshirt year with the Sun Devils in 2015.
- Perkins spent two seasons at ASU before transferring to Arizona Western JC for the 2017 season, followed by his move to Virginia in 2018. Chatman comes to Virginia after graduating last spring from Arizona State.
- Perkins and Chatman hit it off immediately through the recruiting process and were even roommates in Tempe. The duo are rommates again, this time in Charlottesville.
- Also, UVA's current director of football development & performance, Shawn Griswold, was the head coach for sports performance at Arizona State from 2012-17, working with both Perkins and Chatman. Griswold has been at UVA since 2018.

UVA PASSING GAME UNDER BRONCO MENDENHALL

- Four of the top seven single-game passing contests from a quarterback standpoint have happened during the head coach Bronco Mendenhall and offensive coordinator Robert Anae's tenure at UVA (2016pres.).
- Kurt Benkert, the starting quarterback in 2017 and 2018 owns the No. 1 (455, vs. UConn, 2017), No. 2 (421, vs. Central Michigan, 2016) and No. 6 (384, at Miami, 2017) spots. Current UVA quarterback Bryce Perkins has the No. 7 spot (379, vs. Ohio, 2018).
- Virginia also amassed 5,003 yards of total offense in 2018, marking the fifth time in program history a Cavalier team recorded over 5,000 yards in a single season. UVA also set a single-season program record with 276 first downs.

UVA ROSTER HAS THE THIRD-MOST FRESHMEN AND REDSHIRT FRESHMEN IN FBS

- Virginia has 63 freshmen and redshirt freshmen on its roster in 2019, which is tied for No. 3 in FBS.
- UVA's 63 total freshmen and redshirt freshmen is the most among teams that played in bowl games in 2018. Also, 48.46 percent of UVA's roster is made up of freshmen and redshirt freshmen, which ranks No. 4 in FBS behind UCLA (53.3), Coastal Carolina (51.2) and Nebraska (50.9).

SCOTT STADIUM, HOME OF THE CAVALIERS

The Carl Smith Center, home of David A. Harrison III Field at Scott Stadium, with its unique architectural design, scenic setting on the University's Grounds and exceptional sight lines, is one of the nation's finest college football settings.

Opened in 1931, Scott Stadium might be one of the oldest campus college football stadiums in the nation, but you could never tell from its appearance. Numerous upgrades and expansions make it a modern home for the Cavaliers and their fans.

Scott Stadium was the gift of Frederic William Scott and Elisabeth Strother Scott, and was dedicated to the memory of his parents, Frederic Robert Scott and Frances Branch Scott.

Virginia played its dedication game at Scott Stadium on Oct. 15, 1931 against the Virginia Military Institute before a then-capacity crowd of 22,000. Prior to that season, the Cavaliers staged their home games at the University's Lambeth Field. Virginia has played 471 games in the historic venue. UVA's all-time record at Scott Stadium stands at 266-193-12.

BRYCE PERKINS NOTES

IT IS A PERK TO HAVE BRYCE AT QUARTERBACK

- QB Bryce Perkins returns to Charlottesville for his senior season after breaking UVA's single-season record for total offense during his first season on Grounds with 3,603 total yards in 2018. Perkins broke the previous record by 459 yards, which was set a year earlier by Kurt Benkert.
- Perkins was one of two players in the nation with 2,600+ passing yards (2,680) and 900+ rushing yards (923), joining Heisman Trophy winner Kyler Murray (Oklahoma) in 2018.
- In fact, since the year 2000, Perkins and Murray are the only players in the nation in a single season to complete at least 64 percent of their passes, while also throwing for 2,000+ yards, rushing for 900+ yards and being responsible for at least 30 touchdowns.
- Perkins transferred to UVA in January 2018 from Arizona Western Community College after leading the Matadors to the 2017 NJCAA Championship game, before falling 31-28 to East Mississippi.
- Perkins originally signed as a top recruit with hometown Arizona State, but never saw action during his two seasons in Tempe. He redshirted the 2015
- Perkins' father, Bruce, lettered at Arizona State in 1988 and 1989 as a fullback and later played briefly in the NFL. Perkins' older brother, Paul, was a three-year letterwinner at running back with the UCLA Bruins and currently plays with the New York Giants. Perkins' uncle, Don Perkins, played eight seasons in the NFL with the Cowboys.

PRO FOOTBALL FOCUS RATING BRYCE HALL

- Hall finished with an overall grade of 91.2 that included a coverage grade of 91.4, both of which lead all returning FBS cornerbacks, a group of 349 players who logged at least 200 snaps a season ago.
- There is no better returning cornerback from a season ago when it comes to tracking passes in the intermediate to deep range of the field, those passes targeted at least 10 yards downfield. Hall was targeted 44 times on throws in that range, allowing just 14 receptions while he came away with two interceptions and recorded 18 forced incompletions.
- According to PFF "Hall may be more important to his team's success than any other non-offensive player in the country."

HALL OF SPEED CLOCKED AT 22.3 MPH

- Hall was clocked at 22.3 mph via the Catapult system he was wearing when he made a touchdown-saving tackle on Miami's Travis Homer, a rush that went for 70 yards in the 2018 meeting at Scott Stadium.
- Hall's touchdown-saving tackle eventually forced Miami to kick a field goal in a game UVA won over the then-No. 16 Hurricanes, 16-13.

HALL ANCHORS VIRGINIA SECONDARY

- CB Bryce Hall returns for his senior season after earning second-team All-America honors in 2018 when he led the nation with 22 pass breakups and 24 passes defended.
- According to Pro Football Focus (PFF), Hall led the ACC in forced incompletion percentage (31.9 percent) in 2018. PFF has Hall ranked as the No. 1 defensive player in the country entering 2019 and the No. 4 FBS player overall.
- According to PFF, Hall ranked tied for first with LSU's Kristian Fulton in forced incompletion percentage (38.9 percent) in Cover-0 and Cover-1 looks
- Hall allowed just 2.9 yards after the catch in 2018 and had eight performances in which he held opposing receivers in his coverage to just single-digit yards after catch numbers.
- Hall has five career interceptions, three of which have come against former Duke quarterback and 2019 NFL first rounder Daniel Jones (Giants, sixth overall). Jones tossed nine interceptions in his three career games against Virginia.

Bronco Mendenhall Head Coach • Fourth Season

Bronco Mendenhall is in his fourth season as Virginia's head football coach after being named the program's 40th head coach on Dec. 4, 2015.

Mendenhall enters the 2019 season with a career record of 115-65, which includes a 99-43 mark in 11 seasons as the head coach at BYU. Between UVA and BYU, Mendenhall has led his teams to bowl games in 13-of-14 seasons as a head coach. That 92.9 percent rate ranks tied for No. 3 among active FBS head coaches with at least 10 years of FBS coaching.

After playing in the Military Bowl in 2017, Mendenhall led Virginia to back-to-back bowls in 2018 for the first time since

2004 and 2005 after the Cavaliers earned a Belk Bowl invite. Mendenhall's Cavalier squad shutout South Carolina, 28-0, in the 2018 Belk Bowl to give UVA its first bowl victory since the 2005 Music City Bowl. UVA's shutout performance was the first over an SEC team in a bowl game by a non-SEC team since the 1975 Gator Bowl.

Mendenhall is one of three active coaches that has inherited at least two programs in his career that were coming off a losing season and in year one, or year two, played in a bowl game. The others to do it are Nick Saban (Alabama, LSU, Michigan State) and Mark Dantonio (Michigan State/Cincinnati).

Year number three under Mendenhall saw great strides in performance on the field. UVA's defense finished No. 20 in the country and No. 3 in the ACC, allowing 330.5 yards per game, while finishing No. 21 in the nation and No. 3 in the ACC in scoring defense (20.1). UVA's defense finished No. 16 in the nation and No. 2 in the ACC in fewest passing yards allowed and the offense finished No. 6 in the nation and No. 1 in the ACC in third-down conversion percentage.

With Bryce Perkins at quarterback, UVA scored 370 points in 2018, which ranks No. 3 all-time for the Cavaliers. Perkins and Heisman Trophy winner Kyler Murray (Oklahoma) were the only players in the nation with 2,600+ passing yards and 900+ rushing yards. Under Mendenhall in 2018, Bryce Hall earned second-team All-America honors from both the Walter Camp Foundation and the Football Writers Association of America. Hall led the nation with 22 pass breakups and 24 passes defended. Hall, SS Juan Thornhill and HB Olamide Zaccheaus all earned first-team All-ACC accolades, leading UVA's eight selections. Thornhill finished 2018 No. 3 in the nation with six interceptions and Zaccheaus, the 2018 Belk Bowl MVP, was No. 1 in the ACC with 93 receptions (a UVA single-season record).

Zaccheaus leaves UVA with a program-record 250 career receptions, which ranks No. 6 all-time in ACC history.

Mendenhall came to Charlottesville after 11 years as the head coach at Brigham Young University. In his 11 seasons, from 2005-2015, Mendenhall compiled an overall record of 99-43 at BYU to rank 12th in total wins among all FBS teams during that time.

In the three seasons prior to Mendenhall becoming the head coach at BYU, the Cougars compiled an overall record of 14-21. Over Mendenhall's 11 years at BYU, the Cougars were one of only 11 programs to advance to a bowl game each season (includes the 2015 season). BYU joined by Alabama, Boise State, Clemson, Florida State, Georgia, LSU, Oklahoma, Oregon, Virginia Tech and Wisconsin on that list.

Among those 11 teams, only Florida State has achieved more bowl wins (seven) than BYU's six bowl game victories.

The success of Mendenhall's leadership approach in running the BYU football program was highlighted in a management book, Running Into the Wind: Bronco Mendenhall — 5 Strategies for Building a Successful Team, written by Alyson Von Feldt and Paul Gustavson, a leading management consultant specializing in leadership development and organizational design.

Mendenhall was elected in 2013 to the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees as the District 8 Representative and also serves on the AFCA Ethics Committee.

Mendenhall and his wife, Holly, have three sons, Raeder, Breaker and Cutter.

- UVA is 30-6-1 all-time against William & Mary.
- UVA is 24-4 all-time against William & Mary at home.
- UVA scored 21 points in the first quarter for the first time since the 2018 Ohio game in Nashville.
- UVA's 35 points in the first half are tied for No. 9 all-time for the first half in UVA history.
- UVA scored in all three phases of the game (offense, defense, special teams) for the first time since Sept. 21, 2002 against Akron.
- Virginia scored 50+ points in a game for the first time since beating Temple in 2005, 51-3.
- Virginia has scored on each of its opening drives in the first and second halves in both games this season. At Pitt UVA scored field goals in its opening possessions of each half. Against William & Mary, UVA tallied touchdowns.
- UVA's defense has not allowed an offensive touchdown in 10 of the last 12 quarters played.
- UVA did not punt in a game for the first time since 1989 against Duke.

CB Nick Grant collected his first career interception in the first quarter. He returned it 85 yards for a touchdown. It was the third-longest return in UVA program history.

- Grant's interception for a touchdown was the first by a Cavalier since Quin Blanding returned one 58 yards against Duke in 2017.
- WR Joe Reed had a 100-yard kickoff return for a touchdown in the second quarter, tying the program record for longest kick return for a touchdown. He is the fourth Cavalier to return a kick 100 yards for a touchdown and first since Marquis Week in 2004 against North Carolina.
- Reed extends his UVA career record for kick returns for a touchdown to four.
- With two kick returns for a TD in 2017 and one in 2018, Reed is the only UVA player to return a kick for a touchdown in three separate seasons.
- WR Terrell Chatman finished the game with a career-high three receptions. He hauled in his first Virginia touchdown on a 15-yard scoring strike from Bryce Perkins. It was the second career touchdown of Chatman's career. He tallied one last year against UTSA for Arizona State.
 WR Billy Kemp IV had a career-long 18-yard punt return in the first quarter.
- Kemp made his first career reception in the second guarter on a 15-vard haul.
- TB PK Kier had a career-long rush of 18 yards in the first quarter.
- •TB Mike Hollins rushed for his first career touchdown in the third quarter on his first career rush. He is the first Cavalier to accomplish that feat since Jordan Ellis in 2015 against William & Mary
- WR Hayden Mitchell made his first career catch in the fourth quarter. The reception went for 28 yards.
