SETTING THE SCENE

- Indiana (1-0) opens its 59th season at Memorial Stadium (52,656; FieldTurf) on Saturday, Sept. 8, against the Virginia Cavaliers (1-0). Kickoff is set for 7:30 p.m. EDT on BTN.
- The Hoosiers are 40-18 in Memorial Stadium opens with wins in 14 of their last 16 and 31 of their last 36.
- IU is 7-14 all-time against ACC foes after its 34-17 win at Virginia last season (Sept. 9).
- The Cavaliers lead the all-time series 2-1 with a 47-7 victory in Charlottesville on Oct. 10, 2009, and a 34-31 triumph in the only meeting between the two teams in Bloomington on Sept. 10, 2011.
- This is the fourth straight year an ACC opponent has appeared on the schedule - Duke (2015), Wake Forest (2015, 16), Virginia (2017, 18) - and Indiana is 2-2 over the current stretch.
- Senior running back **Mike Majette** (Woodbridge, Va./Woodbridge Senior) and true freshman running back **Ronnie Walker Jr.** (Hopewell, Va./Hopewell) are the lone Hoosiers from Virginia.

THE COACHES

- **Tom Allen** was named Indiana's head coach on Dec. 1, 2016, and made his debut at the 2016 Foster Farms Bowl. The New Castle, Ind., native joined IU as associate head coach/defense on Jan. 15, 2016. Since his arrival, the Hoosiers are the most improved team nationally in total defense and passing defense, the sixth-most improved in third down defense and the ninth-most improved in points per game allowed. - Bronco Mendenhall is 9-17 in his third season as Virginia head coach. Mendenhall owns a 108-60 (.643) record in his 14th overall year with a previous stop at BYU (2005-15).

NEWS & NOTES

- Indiana will dedicate the Excellence Academy inside Memorial Stadium on Friday. (full info on page 3)
- IU has won 12 of its last 13 regular season non-conference games, including four straight overall and five consecutive on the road.
- The Hoosiers recorded three takeaways at FIU, the seventh time it has reached that mark under **Tom Allen**.
- Senior safety **Jonathan Crawford** delivered a pick-6, his first career score, and forced one fumble for his fifth career multi-takeaway game. He has had a hand in a team-leading 17 takeaways.
- Redshirt junior wide receiver **Donavan Hale** collected his first career two-touchdown game.
- Indiana played nine true freshmen and eight redshirt freshmen.
- IU is the 16th youngest team in the country and the fourth youngest in the Big Ten. Seventy-seven of the 116 (66.4 percent) Hoosiers are underclassmen (55 freshmen - 31 true, 22 sophomores).
- Indiana is wearing a helmet decal to honor Bill Mallory, the program's all-time winningest coach, who passed away in Bloomington on May 25, 2018. (full info on page 4)

MEMORIAL STADIUM OPENS THE EXCELLENCE ACADEMY

The Excellence Academy building provides a home for and thereby enhances the Excellence Academy program which, as set forth below in more detail, is one of the most innovative and effective personal development programs in all of intercollegiate athletics. The \$53 million, 66,575 square foot facility encloses the south end zone at Memorial Stadium and creates a bold new “front door” to campus for Memorial Stadium and more generally the Athletics campus. The Excellence Academy construction began in the spring of 2017 and was completed in the summer of 2018.

Dr. Lawrence D. Rink Center for Sports Medicine and Technology

As part of the Excellence Academy, the Dr. Lawrence D. Rink Center for Sports Medicine and Technology is home to the Irsay Family Wellness Clinic, the Center for Elite Athlete Development, as well as the Rehabilitation and Treatment Center. These facilities provide comprehensive physical and mental healthcare for IU student-athletes with physician offices, psychologist and nutritionist offices, exam rooms, diagnostic equipment, and the like; all-inclusive space and equipment to help prevent, diagnose, rehabilitate and treat injuries to student-athletes; and research and technology to apply science to the development of champion student-athletes.

Irsay Family Wellness Clinic

The Irsay Family Wellness Clinic aids in the physical and mental well-being of the nearly 650 students that participate in 24 varsity sports at Indiana. It houses exam rooms, x-ray machines, procedure rooms, physician offices, sports psychologist offices, a nutrition office and a consultation room.

Hancock Hiltunen Caito Center for Leadership and Life Skills

The Hancock Hiltunen Caito Center for Leadership and Life Skills offers multi-purpose space and offices dedicated to leadership development, service learning and career development for students who participate in collegiate athletics at IU.

Glass Family Leadership Suite

The Glass Family Student-Athlete Leadership Suite is housed in the Center for Leadership and Life Skills and provides a venue for important student leadership programming. This is made possible by the gift from Indiana University Vice President and Director of Athletics Fred Glass, and his wife Barbara. The suite is also a home for members of the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC), the recognized collective voice of student-athletes at IU as established by the Indiana University Bill of Rights, another innovation established by Glass.

Tobias Nutrition Center

The new state-of-the-art nutrition facility and dining space in the new IU Excellence Academy is named the “Tobias Nutrition Center” after Ambassador Randall L. Tobias and his wife Deborah Tobias. Lunch and dinner is served five days a week with a daily breakfast oasis for students. Service is in a food station concept with stations including Italian, grill, homestyle, subs and wraps, large salad, fruit and soup bar. Menu items are prepared fresh on site by dining staff at each of these stations. The breakfast oasis is a morning fueling station for students with a variety of options to start the day. Two large beverage stations are installed including a water bottle filling station as new electronic menu boards will display what is available each day.



TERRY TALLEN MAKES MAJOR GIFT FOR IU FOOTBALL COMPLEX RENOVATIONS

On April 20, 2018, Indiana University Vice President and Director of Intercollegiate Athletics Fred Glass announced a major gift by IU alumnus and former IU Football captain Terry Tallen to the Indiana University Bicentennial Campaign for Athletics. This \$2 million commitment helps provide funding for the renovation of the football team area in Memorial Stadium. In recognition of his gift, the area will be permanently named the Terry Tallen Indiana Football Complex.

The Terry Tallen Indiana Football Complex will fill 25,000+ square feet underneath the west stands of Memorial Stadium. The complex will include the Trent and Julie Green Locker Room (named in 2003), coaches’ locker room, team lounge, recruiting area, equipment room and Dr. John M. Miller Training Room (named in 1994).

Tallen graduated from the Indiana University Kelley School of Business in 1982, and while earning his degree, was also a three-year IU Football letterman. Terry was elected team co-captain in 1979 and 1980. The 1979 team was nationally ranked and won the Holiday Bowl, IU’s first bowl victory. Terry was named the United Press International’s Defensive Player of the Week following Indiana’s Homecoming victory over Wisconsin in 1980.

In 2001, Terry founded Tallen Capital Partners, LLC, and remains the company’s Chairman and CEO. Tallen Capital Partners, LLC is a privately held, vertically integrated retail and mixed-use real estate investment and development organization with offices in San Diego and San Francisco. Prior to founding Tallen Capital Partners and becoming an entrepreneur, Terry enjoyed a corporate career as a senior executive with some of our country’s largest public as well as private companies. He is considered one of the leading shopping center investors and developers in the Western U.S.

TEAM

• Every Indiana Football player was provided Riddell's new Speed Flex Precision Fit helmet, which utilizes two different layers of 3-D scanning technology to make a custom-made helmet for every individual player. The medical and equipment staffs of IU Athletics believe this to be the safest football helmet available. This year's new helmet is red matte with variations created by the use of decals. An additional color helmet will be added next year.

• With their 38-28 victory at Florida International, the Hoosiers have won 13 of its last 15 season openers. Indiana has won four straight road openers and **Tom Allen** is 2-0 in starts away from home.

• Ten true freshmen saw action in Allen's first campaign, while nine true freshmen earned time in the 2018 season opener: TE **Matt Bjorson**, S **Jamar Johnson**, Husky **Cam Jones**, S **Devon Matthews**, LB **Micah McFadden**, QB **Michael Penix Jr.**, RB **Stevie Scott**, ATH **Reese Taylor**, CB **Jaylin Williams**.

Additionally, eight redshirt freshmen took the field at Florida International.

• Taylor rushed three times for 40 yards with a long of 32, caught two balls for 12 yards and saw time at cornerback and on special teams.

He is also the team's third quarterback, the position where he earned Indiana's 2017 Mr. Football honors. Taylor led Indianapolis's Ben Davis High School to the 2017 state championship.

The two-time all-stater broke the Ben Davis career marks with 7,631 passing yards and 79 passing scores on 568-of-828 (68.6 percent) and rushed for 2,077 yards on 374 attempts (5.5 average) with 45 touchdowns.

• IU has met 10 top 10 and six top five teams in its last 35 games. Indiana has faced five additional top 20 teams in that span.

The Hoosiers defeated No. 17 Michigan State in 2016, and played three of the 10 top 10 and seven of the 15 top 20 teams to a one-possession game.

No. 3 Ohio State, No. 9, Penn State, No. 12 Michigan State, No. 14 Michigan and Iowa (RV) reside on IU's 2018 schedule.

• Indiana added linebackers coach **Kane Wommack** as its 10th assistant coach and named **Kasey Teegardin** as its safeties coach. **William Inge** assumed the role of special teams coordinator.

Mike Hart was promoted to assistant head coach and **Mark Hagen** was elevated to co-defensive coordinator (bios on page 18).

Additionally, Allen named **David Ballou** as director of athletic performance and added **Dr. Matt Rhea** as a speed specialist. Rhea is the only speed specialist with a PhD dedicated to a football program in the country (bios on page 6).

• IU welcomed one of its top signing classes in program history. Twenty-two of the 25 signed in the early period.

The Hoosiers also added three transfers, two of whom graduated from their previous institutions - offensive lineman **Nick Linder** (Miami, Fla.) and defensive lineman **Kayton Samuels** (Syracuse).

Sophomore linebacker **T.D. Roof** chose Indiana after he spent 2017 at Georgia Tech. Roof was deemed eligible this season through a legislative relief waiver.

Four members of the class - defensive lineman **James Head Jr.**, wide receiver **Jacolby Hewitt**, quarterback **Michael Penix Jr.** and running back **Ronnie Walker Jr.** - and Linder and Roof enrolled in classes in January and practiced this spring.

• Fifth-year senior wide receiver/return specialist **J-Shun Harris II** returned from his third ACL injury (right), which he sustained in game eight at Maryland last year. He came back to action in 2017 after he tore his right ACL during 2015 summer workouts and his left ACL in 2016 preseason camp.

• Fifth-year senior running back **Ricky Brookins** is a member of the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team and the Wuerrffel Trophy Watch Lists. Brookins spearheaded a GoFundMe page for football manager **Matt Stauder** that is approaching \$28,000.

Stauder is in his senior year at IU majoring in sports management and marketing. Last season, he unexpectedly lost his father to a heart attack. Shortly after, Stauder was diagnosed with Hodgkins Lymphoma cancer and began treatments in May.

Allen awarded Stauder with the game ball following the team's 2018 opening win at FIU.

• Redshirt junior defensive end **Gavin Everett** was awarded a scholarship during fall camp. The Center Grove, Ind., native joined the program in 2016 after he transferred from Western Illinois and was the first pick in the 2018 Cream & Crimson Spring Game Draft.

• Tight end **Ian Thomas** and linebacker **Chris Covington** were selected in the 2018 NFL Draft. Thomas went to Carolina with the first pick of round four. He became the highest drafted tight end in program history.

Dallas secured Covington in the sixth round. He became the first Indiana linebacker drafted since Van Waiters in 1988.

IU has had nine standouts drafted since 2014. Overall, 11 standouts from last season's roster received NFL opportunities via the draft, free agent deals or camp invites.

• Eleven Hoosiers currently reside on NFL rosters: WR **Simmie Cobbs Jr.** (Redskins), RB **Tevin Coleman** (Falcons), LB **Chris Covington** (Cowboys), OL **Dan Feeney** (Chargers), RB **Jordan Howard** (Bears), WR **Cody Latimer** (Giants), DL **Robert McCray III** (Chiefs), OL **Rodger Saffold** (Rams), OL **Jason Spriggs** (Packers), QB **Nate Sudfeld** (Eagles) and TE **Ian Thomas** (Panthers).

• Head coach **Tom Allen's** radio show, **Inside IU Football with Tom Allen**, will be held Wednesday evenings at 7:05 p.m. EDT on the IU Radio Network. **Don Fischer**, who is in his 46th season as The Voice of the Hoosiers (2nd-longest active FBS radio p-b-p), hosts the show live from the Bloomington Holiday Inn.

REMEMBERING COACH MALLORY



Bill Mallory, Indiana's all-time winningest football coach, died on May 25, 2018, surrounded by family in Bloomington. He was 82.

Mallory served 13 years at the helm of the Hoosiers and compiled a record of 69-77-3. After an 0-11 initial season, he ran off a 69-66-3 mark that featured seven winning seasons and six bowl appearances, both program records for an IU head coach, and included victories in the 1988 Liberty Bowl and the 1991 Copper Bowl.

The 2002 Indiana Athletics Hall of Fame inductee coached six first or second team All-Americans, two first round NFL draft picks and two players (Anthony Thompson, 2nd and Vaughn Dunbar, 6th) who finished in the top six in the Heisman Trophy voting. In 1987, Mallory became the first Big Ten coach to be awarded back-to-back Coach of the Year honors.

That same campaign, he led the Hoosiers to an 8-4 record, a second place Big Ten finish and a Peach Bowl appearance. Capped by its Liberty Bowl triumph, IU netted consecutive eight win seasons for the first time with an 8-3-1 ledger and concluded 1988 ranked 20th in the Associated Press (AP) Poll.

Mallory compiled a 168-129-4 (.565) career record at Miami University (1969-73), the University of Colorado (1974-78), Northern Illinois University (1980-83) and Indiana (1984-96). With the Hoosiers, Mallory became the fifth coach ever to guide three different programs to top 20 finishes in the national polls, joining Paul "Bear" Bryant, Dan Devine, Bowden Wyatt and Lou Holtz.

He earned his conference's Coach of the Year recognition on four occasions: 1973 (MAC), 1983 (MAC), 1986 (Big Ten) and 1987 (Big Ten). Mallory was honored as the Kodak District Coach of the Year in 1986 and 1987, and he was head coach of 1993 East Team in the East-West Shrine Bowl.

In Mallory's 27 seasons as a head coach, his teams defeated a dozen top 25 ranked programs, including both No. 9 Ohio State and No. 20 Michigan in 1987. He is the only Hoosiers coach to defeat both schools in the same season. Additionally, Mallory hoisted the Old Oaken Bucket seven times in 13 meetings with Purdue.

DEFENSE

- **Tom Allen** joined the Hoosiers as defensive coordinator in 2016 and has continued to run the defense after being named head coach on Dec 1, 2016. His defenses have reached heights not seen in a generation in Bloomington.
- Over Allen's first two seasons, Indiana was the most improved team nationally in total defense (-169.4 ypg) and passing defense (-134.1 ypg), the sixth-most improved in third down defense (-12.2 percent) and the ninth-most improved in points per game allowed (-12.3 ypg).
- Allen stresses to his defenders the importance of takeaways and their magic number per game is three.
- The defense reached that number four times in 2016, twice in 2017 and in the 2018 season opener at Florida International (2 fumbles, 1 INT).
- Senior safety **Jonathan Crawford** forced one fumble and added a pick-6 in the opening quarter, the fourth defensive touchdown in Allen's tenure.
- IU finished first nationally in three-and-outs (6.5), ninth in third down defense (29.9 percent – best program mark since 1992; 3rd in the Big Ten), 17th in passing defense (179.7 ypg – best program mark since 1995; 4th in the Big Ten) and 26th in total defense (340.1 ypg – best program mark since 1995) last year.
- A program record six defenders earned All-Big Ten honors in both 2016 and 2017.
- In 2017, the Hoosiers posted a pair of shutouts for the first time since 1993.

- Indiana whitewashed Rutgers, 41-0, en route to its first Big Ten shutout since 1993, and blanked Charleston Southern, 27-0.
- Prior to the Rutgers win, IU limited Illinois to 14 points in a 24-14 triumph. The 14 points were the fewest allowed by the program in a Big Ten road win since 1993.
- The Hoosiers allowed less than 100 yards passing in back-to-back games for the first time since 1989 when they held Charleston Southern to 0 and Michigan to 59.
- Against CSU, Indiana did not surrender a completion (0-for-10) for the seventh time in school history and the first time since 1985.
- Allen engineered one of the top defensive turnarounds nationally in 2016. IU improved in every major statistical category against a schedule featuring four top 10 opponents, a program first.
- The Hoosiers held their opponents to 380.1 total yards, down 129.4 yards from 2015, the largest improvement in the country, limited their foes to 94.1 fewer passing yards, also first nationally, 10.4 fewer points, which ranked fourth nationally, and gave up 25 fewer touchdowns than in 2015.
- A nominee for the 2016 Broyles Award, Allen led the program's first All-American at linebacker since 1987 in **Tegray Scales** (2016) and oversaw the first linebacker drafted since 1988 in **Chris Covington** (Dallas, 6th round in 2018 NFL Draft).

DEFENSIVE LINE

- Co-defensive coordinator **Mark Hagen** presides over a unit that returned 10 letterwinners, including Syracuse graduate transfer **Kayton Samuels**, and added five true and a pair of redshirt freshmen.
- In 2017, Indiana shared 11th nationally (T-4th in the Big Ten) with 3.0 sacks per game and sat 20th (3rd) with 7.3 tackles for loss.
- The previous year the Hoosiers were 31st in the country (5th in the Big Ten) with 2.5 sacks each outing and 20th (3rd) with 7.5 TFLs.
- IU is one of three Big Ten teams (Michigan and Penn State) to rank in the league's top five in sacks and tackles for loss per game in both 2016 and 2017.
- Three linemen have been recognized by the conference over the last two seasons, including **Robert McCray III** (2017), a free agent signing of the Kansas City Chiefs.
- **Jerome Johnson** (2017) claimed a spot on the BTN.com All-Freshman team and picked up right where he left off in the 2018 opener with four stops, one sack and one forced fumble.
- Five Hagen charges recorded five-plus tackles for loss in 2016 and 2017, while 10 registered a sack last year after nine carded one sack the previous season.
- Senior tackle **Jacob Robinson** started the 2018 opener, all 12 games in 2017 and seven at end and tackle in 2016. He has played in 37 total games.
- Last season, Robinson shared first among Indiana defensive linemen in stops (26), was second in TFLs (7.0, 4th on the team) and third in sacks (4.0, 4th on the team).
- Junior **Allen Stallings IV** collected 25 tackles, 15 solo, three sacks (16 yards), 5.5 tackles for loss (26 yards), one forced fumble, one safety and two quarterback hurries one year ago.
- He finished third among Hoosier D-linemen in stops, fourth in sacks and tied for fourth in TFLs.

- Johnson played in all 12 games at tackle and netted 18 tackles, 10 solo, with one sack and 3.5 stops for loss as a redshirt freshman.
- Samuels, a tackle, graduated in May 2018 with a degree in psychology and is pursuing his master's degree in informatics.
- With the Orange, he played in 34 games (24 starts) and recorded 44 tackles, 4.5 for loss, with one sack and one fumble recovery.
- Samuels owns 15 multi-tackle games.
- The team's top pass-rusher from 2016, fifth-year senior **Nile Sykes**, returns after he sustained a season-ending injury prior to 2017 fall camp.
- Sykes tallied 18 solos, five sacks (37 yards), seven tackles for loss (47 yards), one fumble recovery and two pass breakups in 2016.
- Stallings (Maywood, Ill./Oak Park and River Forest) and Sykes (Oak Park, Ill./Montini Catholic) are cousins.
- Redshirt junior **Gavin Everett** earned his first career start at Florida International and garnered four tackles, two for loss.
- Everett earned a scholarship during 2018 fall camp. The Center Grove, Ind., native joined the program in 2016 after he transferred from Western Illinois and was the first pick in the 2018 Cream & Crimson Spring Game Draft.
- Hagen is in his second stint at IU (2011-12) and was promoted to co-defensive coordinator in the offseason. He returned to Bloomington after a three-year stint with Texas A&M.
- A Carmel, Ind., native, Hagen was a four-year letterwinner (1987, 89-91), two-time second team All-Big Ten selection, three-time Academic All-Big Ten winner, 1992 Big Ten Medal of Honor recipient and a captain at linebacker for the Hoosiers.
- He owns 26 years of coaching experience, including 22 in the Big Ten and the SEC, has coached in 12 bowl games and mentored 21 NFL standouts.

LINEBACKERS

- **Kane Wommack** is in his first season as linebackers coach. He served as the University of South Alabama's defensive coordinator and linebackers coach in 2016 and 2017.
- Wommack worked with **Tom Allen** as an Ole Miss graduate assistant in 2012-13 when Allen was linebackers coach under defensive coordinator Dave Wommack, Kane's father.
- During Wommack's two seasons in Mobile, South Alabama was the 13th-most improved scoring defense (-10.8) and rushing defense (-69.2) in the nation.
- In 2016, he engineered one of the top turnarounds in the country. The unit was the fifth-most improved nationally in scoring defense (-10.3), one spot behind the Hoosiers, and ranked in the top 10 nationally in passing defense.
- Wommack is looking to replace a pair of stalwarts who moved on to the NFL.
- **Chris Covington** was selected with the 19th pick of the sixth round (193rd overall) by the Dallas Cowboys, while the Los Angeles Rams inked **Tegray Scales** to a free agent deal.
- Covington became the first IU linebacker drafted since Van Waiters in 1988 (Cleveland, round 3).
- The Chicago native finished 2017 with 85 tackles (3rd on the team, T-17th in the Big Ten), 50 solo (3rd,

- 16th), 12 for loss (2nd, T-13th), three sacks (22 yards), one fumble recovery, five pass breakups (T-3rd) and five quarterback hurries (2nd).
- Scales became the first Indiana linebacker to earn All-America honors (2016) since 1987 and the first to collect first team All-Big Ten (2017) since 1988.
- The Cincinnati native finished third on the Hoosiers career charts with 46 tackles for loss (152 yards), sixth with 18 sacks (104 yards) and 10th with 325 stops.
- Fifth-year senior **Dameon Willis Jr.** is the unit's leading tackler.
- He has appeared in 36 games and started four times, including the 2018 season opener where he led the team with six stops.
- Willis has 67 career tackles (23 in 2017, 22 in 2016, 16 in 2015) with one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and 1.5 TFLs.
- Redshirt junior **Reakwon Jones** has seen action in 22 games and started for the first time at Florida International (3 tackles, 1 TFL).
- Georgia Tech transfer **T.D. Roof**, who gained immediate eligibility after he was granted a legislative relief waiver this summer, played in all 11 games as a true freshman.
- Roof totaled 17 stops with a pair of sacks and one quarterback hurry in 2017.

STRENGTH & SPEED

In the offseason, **Tom Allen** made it known that the Hoosiers needed to get stronger and faster. Allen honed in on and hired director of athletic performance **David Ballou** and athletic performance coach/speed specialist **Dr. Matt Rhea**. The duo worked together at IMG Academy in Bradenton, Fla., in 2016, and joined the IU program following the 2017 season.



DAVID BALLOU

• A former Hoosier fullback, Ballou spent 2017 as the University of Notre Dame's co-director of football strength and conditioning after two seasons at IMG Academy. He spent the previous 14 years as the head strength and conditioning coach at Avon (Ind.) High School. Ballou lettered with the Hoosiers in 1997, 1998 and 1999, and was recognized as the Hoosier Strength Challenge Champion.

STRENGTH IMPROVEMENT

- Team has increased its average power output in single leg movements by 52 percent since January.
- The number of 500-pound squatters has increased from five to 29.
- Five times as many players are squatting 500-or-more pounds now than in February.
- The number of players bench pressing 400-or-more pounds has quadrupled.
- Recognized as the strongest Hoosier, **Wes Martin** benches 525 pounds and owns a max of 425 pounds in the hang clean.



DR. MATT RHEA

• Head of sport science at IMG Academy in 2016 and 2017, where he contributed to the optimal development of athletes through innovative athlete assessments and advanced strength and conditioning. Rhea is the only speed specialist with a PhD dedicated to a football program in the country

SPEED IMPROVEMENT

- In 2017, three players ran 21 MPH or faster and 10 ran over 20 MPH.
- During 2018 spring football, 12 players ran 21 MPH or faster and 24 ran over 20 MPH.
- During 2018 fall camp, 34 players ran over 21 MPH and 47 ran over 20 MPH.
- Husky **Marcelino Ball**, CB **Isaac James**, WR **Whop Philyor** and CB **Jaylin Williams** each have reached the 23 MPH mark.
- On average, the program has seen a 2.5 MPH improvement in top speed since January, which correlates to approximately a .25 second improvement in 40-yard sprint time.

SAFETIES/HUSKY

- **Jonathan Crawford** is the unquestioned leader in the defensive backfield. The senior safety has started all 39 games since his arrival.
- A 2018 Athlon preseason second team All-Big Ten selection, Crawford is the current Hoosiers leader with 212 tackles, 138 solos, 16 pass breakups, nine interceptions (T-8th in program history), five fumble recoveries, three forced fumbles, 13 takeaways and two blocked kicks.
- Crawford's nine picks share fifth nationally among active players.
- The Largo, Fla., native enjoyed his return to the Sunshine State in the 2018 opener at FIU.
- Crawford accounted for two takeaways in the first quarter, his fifth career multi-takeaway game. He forced a fumble on the opening drive and posted his first career pick-6 two drives later.
- The two-time honorable mention all-leaguer (2016-17) made 62 stops (4th on the team), 42 solo (5th), three for loss, eight PBUs (2nd), one INT (T-2nd), one fumble recovery (T-2nd) and one blocked field goal a season ago.
- As a sophomore, Crawford topped IU with seven takeaways (4 FRs and 3 INTs) and led the league and shared second nationally in fumble recoveries.
- He collected 2015 freshman All-American honors after he ranked first among all Big Ten freshmen and tied for fourth among all freshmen nationally with four interceptions.
- Crawford led league true freshmen with 76 overall tackles (2nd among all freshmen) and 48 solos (1st among all freshmen).
- He and Indiana redshirt junior wide receiver **Donavan Hale** are cousins.
- A 2016 freshman All-American and honorable mention All-Big Ten selection, **Marcelino Ball** returns to the husky position after he sustained a season-ending injury in week three last season.
- The 19-year old redshirt sophomore opened his 2017 campaign with a career-high tying 10 tackles,

- his second career double-digit game, with seven solos and a half-TFL against No. 2 Ohio State,
- Ball started 12 games and played in all 13 at the husky position during his true freshman campaign.
- He led all Big Ten freshmen in tackles and finished sixth overall, first among B1G true freshmen and third among true freshmen nationally with 60 solo stops.
- The Roswell, Ga., native finished third on the team in tackles, solos, interceptions (2, tied) and pass breakups (8). Ball added 4.5 tackles for loss and one fumble recovery.
- Football is in the Ball family as Marcelino is the younger brother of Marcus, a former NFL defensive back who played at the University of Memphis (2009-10), Reggie, Jr., a quarterback at Georgia Tech University (2003-06) and Raeshon, a defensive back at the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga (2006-08).

CORNERBACKS

- Indiana lost **Rashard Fant**, who signed a free agent deal with the Chicago Bears, but the cupboard is hardly bare.
- Junior **A'Shon Riggins** has appeared in 19 games with 12 starts, including the 2018 season opener. He earned 2016 BTN.com All-Freshman team honorable mention after he played in 12 games with eight starts.
- Riggins collected 37 tackles, 35 solo, with one sack, two TFLs, one interception (31 yards), nine pass breakups (2nd on the team) and one forced fumble.
- The Hamilton, Ohio, native recorded all of his passes defended (10) in Big Ten play, which shared sixth in the league, and posted two multi-PBU games.
- Riggins made his first start of 2017 and tallied a career-high seven tackles to go along with two pass breakups in the Virginia win.
- He missed six games due to injury, and made 14 stops overall, nine solo, with five PBUs.
- Redshirt junior **Andre Brown Jr.** started with Riggins in the opener.

- He returned after a medical redshirt season and collected 33 stops, including a career-high eight at Illinois, 22 solo, three for loss, one pass breakup and one takeaway in 11 games (10 starts).
- The Decatur, Ga., native forced his first career fumble, which he recovered (2nd of his career) and raced 22 yards for his first career touchdown in the Georgia Southern win.
- Brown started eight times and appeared in nine games as a true freshman in 2015, where he made 35 tackles, 27 solo, with one recovery and four PBUs.
- **Raheem Layne** was named IU's Defensive Newcomer of the Year in 2017.
- As a true freshman, he posted 13 stops in 12 games (1 start).
- Fant, IU's all-time leader with 58 passes defended and 53 pass breakups, appeared in 49 career games (36 starts) and made 132 tackles, 119 solo, five for loss (37 yards), five interceptions (68 yards), one pick-6 and three fumble recoveries.

OFFENSE

- **Mike DeBord** is in his second season as Indiana's offensive coordinator. He also serves as the Hoosiers associate head coach and tight ends coach.
- IU kicked off 2018 with 38 points and 465 total yards (252 passing, 213 rushing) at Florida International.
- Indiana finished third in the Big Ten (35th nationally) in passing offense (265.7), and sixth in scoring offense (26.8) and total offense (395.8) in 2017.
- Four Hoosiers earned All-Big Ten recognition, including returners **Wes Martin** (left guard) and **Luke Timian** (wide receiver).
- Three freshmen collected All-Freshman honors, quarterback **Peyton Ramsey**, running back **Morgan Ellison** and wide receiver **Whop Philyor**.
- IU's 21.5 seconds per play shared fourth nationally among power five schools (1st in the Big Ten), while its 81.1 plays per game ranked fifth nationally (1st in the Big Ten).
- DeBord spent the 2015 and 2016 seasons as offensive coordinator at the University of Tennessee, where the Volunteers averaged 35.8 points per game.
- UT finished 2016 with a school record 63 total touchdowns and 473 total points. The Volunteers, one of four teams to end the year in the top half of the SEC

- in scoring, passing, rushing and total offense, ranked 24th nationally (2nd in the SEC) with 36.4 points per game and 35th in red zone offense (87.8 percent).
- He has 36-plus years of experience, including 16 bowl appearances, with stints as head coach at Central Michigan University (2000-03), offensive coordinator at the University of Michigan (1997-99, 2006-07), and assistant coach with the Chicago Bears (2010-12) and the Seattle Seahawks (2008-09).
- DeBord owns a 76-26 (.745) overall record, including a 46-20 (.697) conference mark, entering his ninth year as an FBS offensive coordinator.
- Five starting quarterbacks DeBord has mentored as a coordinator - Tom Brady (Michigan), Joshua Dobbs (Tennessee), Brian Griese (Michigan), Chad Henne (Michigan) and Drew Henson (Michigan) - have reached the NFL.
- He has coached 53 overall players who have moved on to the NFL, including eight tight ends.
- DeBord served as Michigan's offensive coordinator from 1997-99 and again in 2006-07. In his first season as coordinator, the Wolverines won the national championship and DeBord was named Sporting News National Assistant Coach of the Year.

OFFENSIVE LINE

- Indiana boasts 130 starts among eight linemen, including three with at least 25 - fifth-year senior left guard **Wes Martin** (32), junior left tackle **Coy Cronk** (26) and center and Miami (Fla.) graduate transfer **Nick Linder** (25).
- Senior right tackle **Brandon Knight** (15), redshirt junior center **Hunter Littlejohn** (13), redshirt junior guard **Simon Stepaniak** (9), redshirt sophomore guard **Mackenzie Nworah** and fifth-year senior guard/tackle **Delroy Baker** (4) round out the returning starters.
- Cronk, Martin, Littlejohn, Stepaniak and Knight (from L-R) started in the 2018 opener and paved the way for 465 total yards (252 passing, 213 rushing) with just one sack allowed.
- In 2017, IU finished third in the Big Ten (35th nationally) in passing offense, and sixth in scoring offense and total offense despite using four different line combinations.
- Martin recorded the most pass blocking snaps (569) among guards nationally without allowing a sack en route to honorable mention All-Big Ten recognition.
- The West Milton, Ohio, native, has started 26 straight games at right guard. Martin got engaged this offseason and is a nominee for the National Football Foundation's National Scholar-Athlete Award.
- He was named a team captain, earned the team's Outstanding Lineman award, garnered his third Academic All-Big Ten honor and his second CoSIDA Academic All-District 5 accolade in 2017.
- Recognized as the strongest Hoosier, Martin benches 525 pounds and owns a max of 425 pounds in the hang clean.
- Martin (2015) and Cronk (2016) each have secured freshman All-American honors. Cronk has started all 25 games since his arrival in Bloomington.
- Knight appeared in the final 10 games with eight starts last year, played in 11 games at tackle and tight end as a true freshman, and started six at right tackle and played in eight overall in 2016 before he suffered a season-ending injury.

- Littlejohn entered 2017 with just one appearance (2016) before he went on to start all 12 games.
- Linder did not play in 2017 after he played in 31 games with 22 starts at center and four at left guard from 2014-16 with the Hurricanes.
- His brother, Brandon, is the Jacksonville Jaguars starting center.
- Former Hoosiers tackle **Jason Spriggs** and guard **Dan Feeney** were day two selections in the 2016 and 2017 NFL Drafts, respectively.
- Spriggs went to the Packers with pick No. 48 in 2016 and Feeney was selected by the Chargers with pick No. 71 in 2017.
- The duo became the fifth and sixth first team All-American offensive linemen in program history.
- Feeney became the first offensive lineman and just the sixth player in program history to earn All-America status over back-to-back campaigns.

WIDE RECEIVERS

- **Luke Timian** (95, 967, 4), **Nick Westbrook** (65, 1097, 7), **Whop Philyor** (35, 362, 3) and **Donavan Hale** (25, 396, 4) account for 220 receptions, 2,822 yards and 18 touchdowns.
- A 2017 Burlsworth Trophy nominee and honorable mention All-Big Ten pick, Timian was second on the team with 68 catches (3rd in B1G, T-39th nationally) for 589 yards (13th in B1G) to go along with two TDs.
- His 68 grabs share 6th on IU's single-season list.
- Timian averaged 5.7 receptions (3rd in B1G, T-31st nationally) and 49.1 yards (12th in B1G) per game.
- In conference games only, he averaged 6.2 catches (2nd) for 57.9 yards (7th)
- The 6-0, 195-pound fifth-year senior posted two double-digit reception games, which sat second in the Big Ten and shared ninth among Power 5 wideouts.
- Timian set a career-high with 13 catches (T-4th in program history and T-2nd for a B1G receiver in 2017) for 91 yards and one touchdown at Maryland.
- The Southlake, Texas, native who is nicknamed 'Big Tex' earned a scholarship during 2017 fall camp.
- Indiana's 2016 leading receiver, Westbrook sustained a season-ending ACL injury on the opening kickoff of the season-opening Ohio State game.
- Westbrook, a 2016 honorable mention All-Big Ten selection, was a preseason first team all-leaguer and Street & Smith's choice for best hands in the B1G.
- The Lake Mary, Fla., native entered 2017 as the lone Big Ten receiver on the Biletnikoff Award list and is one of three on the list this year.
- Westbrook caught 54 passes for an 18.4 average and six touchdowns in 2016.
- He came up five yards shy of becoming the seventh Hoosier to reach the 1,000-yard mark. Westbrook's 995 yards are seventh in Hoosiers history.
- The 6-3, 215-pound redshirt junior ranked second in the league in yardage (38th nationally), third in

- average per catch (T-27th) and average per game (79.3), seventh in receptions, tied for seventh in scores and tied for eighth in catches per game (4.2) en route to honorable mention All-Big Ten.
- Philyor, a 5-11, 180-pounder, made 33 receptions (3rd on team) for 335 yards (4th) and three touchdowns (T-3rd) in 11 games as a true freshman last year.
- His catches and TDs rank first, and yardage is third on Indiana's true freshman single-season lists
- The Tampa, Fla., native finished second among Big Ten true freshmen in receptions, shared third in scores and was fifth in yardage.
- Philyor's 13 catches against Maryland set a new IU true freshman record and his yardage was the best by a true freshman since 1997.
- He became just the fourth Hoosier true freshman (5th time) to eclipse 100 yards en route to Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors.
- His parents began calling him Whop because of his love for Burger King's Whoppers.
- Hale started the first two games and played in the first three in 2017 before he suffered a season-ending injury. He caught seven passes for 116 yards and a 32-yard touchdown.
- The 6-4, 229-pound redshirt junior out of Largo, Fla., returned with a bang in the 2018 opener.
- Hale tallied his first career multi-TD game (18, 2) and posted four catches for a team-high 60 yards.
- He corralled career-bests with five receptions for 67 yards in his first career start against No. 2 Ohio State in the 2017 opener.
- In 2016, Hale posted 13 receptions for 210 yards and one score.
- He arrived at IU as a quarterback in 2015 fall camp before moving to wideout. Hale and Indiana junior safety **Jonathan Crawford** are cousins.

QUARTERBACKS

- Redshirt sophomore **Peyton Ramsey** was named starter after competing for the job with true freshman **Michael Penix Jr.** during fall camp.
- In his fifth career start at Florida International last weekend, Ramsey matched a career-high with three touchdowns, completed 20-of-27 (74.1 percent) for 156 yards and rushed for 36 yards.
- Ramsey completed 134-of-205 (65.4) for 1,252 yards, 10 TDs and five interceptions in nine games (4 starts) in 2017.
- His completion percentage was second in the Big Ten (T-13th nationally) and ranks first in program single-season history.
- The Cincinnati native rushed for 226 yards on 92 attempts with two scores.
- Ramsey made his first career start and picked up his first career victory against Charleston Southern. He threw for 321 yards on 32-of-41 (78.0) with two touchdowns, rushed for 54 yards on 15 carries and recovered a fumble for a TD.
- The last Indiana freshman to throw for 300-plus yards was Kellen Lewis (321 yards) at Minnesota on Nov. 4, 2006, and Ramsey's 32 completions share eighth on IU's single-game list.
- In his first Big Ten start against No. 17 Michigan, Ramsey led the Hoosiers on two scoring drives (10 points) by throwing for 65 yards and one score in the final 4:06 to force overtime.
- Ramsey saw limited action against No. 2 Ohio State, the first of his collegiate career, before he hit his stride in the victory at Virginia.
- He completed 16-of-20 (80.0) for 173 yards and two touchdowns (29, 32 yards) in addition to 42 rushing yards on 12 attempts with a 26-yard TD.
- Ramsey's completion percentage is the second-highest single-game clip in IU lore.

- Ramsey played for his father, Doug, at Elder High School, where he was the two-time Greater Catholic League South Player of the Year.
- Peyton is named after Peyton Manning, his older brother Montana "Tanner" is named after Joe Montana and his younger brother Drew is named after Drew Bledsoe.
- Penix enrolled in 2018 spring classes and participated in practice.
- In his debut at FIU, Penix led two scoring drives (10 points) and went 8-of-10 for 96 yards and one score.
- Penix is the fifth IU true freshman quarterback to ever appear in a game.
- The southpaw threw for 61 touchdowns and just six interceptions in his two years as a starter (24 games) at Tampa Bay Technical High School.
- The team captain added 16 TDs on the ground.
- En route to Hillsborough County Player of the Year honors, Penix passed for 2,165 yards with 30 scores, five INTs and a 114.2 quarterback rating as a senior.
- He also rushed for 449 yards on 37 carries (12.1 average) with 10 touchdowns.
- Penix played center field on the baseball team, jumped 22 feet in the long jump and tallied a time of 22.8 in the 200-meter dash.
- **Nick Sheridan** is in his second season as Indiana's quarterbacks coach after three years as an offensive graduate assistant at the University of Tennessee.
- He was named one of the nation's top 30 coaches under 30 years of age by 247Sports in 2017.
- A quarterback at the University of Michigan (2006-09), Sheridan appeared in 12 games and made four starts. His father, Bill, is the linebackers coach at Boston College.

TIGHT ENDS

- In addition to his play-calling duties, Mike DeBord oversees the Hoosiers tight ends.
- He served as tight ends coach for the Seattle Seahawks in 2009, when John Carlson set franchise records for receptions and receiving yardage by a tight end, and for the Chicago Bears from 2010-12.
- DeBord has coached eight tight ends who have moved on to the National Football League after **Ian Thomas** was selected with the first pick of the fourth round in the 2018 NFL Draft by Carolina.
- In just one season under DeBord's tutelage, Thomas became the highest drafted tight end in IU history.

- Thomas finished second among Big Ten tight ends with 15.0 yards per reception (4th nationally, 11th overall in the Big Ten), tied for third with five receiving touchdowns (T-12th nationally), and was fourth in receiving yardage (37.6) and catches per game (2.5).
- His TDs rank second and yardage seventh on Indiana's single-season tight ends lists.
- In the 2018 season opener, redshirt freshman **Peyton Hendershot** earned the start and carded a 3-yard score.
- Fifth-year senior **Ryan Watercutter** caught 12 passes for 69 yards one season ago.
- The Fort Wayne, Ind., native earned a scholarship during fall camp and played in all 12 games (2 starts).

RUNNING BACKS

- **Mike Hart** is in his second season as IU's running backs coach and his first as assistant head coach.
- The University of Michigan's all-time rushing leader, Hart spent three years with the Indianapolis Colts before entering the coaching ranks in 2011.
- In his seven seasons as a coach (Syracuse, 2016; Western Michigan, 2014-15; Eastern Michigan, 2011-13), Hart has tutored three 1,000-yard rushers, two Mid-American Conference (MAC) Freshman of the Year and the 2014 MAC Offensive Player of the Year, Jarvion Franklin.
- Hart led the lone Power 5 freshman duo to rush for over 400 yards in 2017 - **Morgan Ellison** (704) and **Cole Gest** (428).
- Gest finished second on the team with 428 yards on 93 attempts (4.6 average) with one touchdown in 10 games as a redshirt freshman.
- His 428 yards were the fourth-highest freshman total in the Big Ten.
- The Lyndhurst, Ohio, product reached the century mark for the first time with 104 yards on a career-high 23 carries (4.5) with one score in the Rutgers win.
- Seniors **Mike Majette** and **Ricky Brookins** (fifth-year) bring valuable experience to the group.
- Majette owns 402 rushing yards on 103 attempts (3.9) and has caught 25 passes for 230 yards with

- two touchdowns, including a 9-yarder in the season opener at Florida International, in 26 games.
- Brookins has 242 rushing yards on 41 rushes (5.9) with one TD and 23 receptions for 140 yards.
- True freshman **Stevie Scott** led the way with 70 yards on 20 rushes at FIU.
- The Syracuse, N.Y., native was a 2016 all-state and All-Central New York selection before he was limited to three games due to injury in 2017.
- Ellison, Indiana's Offensive Newcomer of the Year, led the team with 704 yards, 143 attempts (4.9 average), six touchdowns and 64.0 yards per game.
- Each of the Hoosiers last four featured running backs have reached the NFL - **Devine Redding** (Kansas City), **Jordan Howard** (Chicago), **Tevin Coleman** (Atlanta) and **Stephen Houston** (New England, Pittsburgh and Baltimore).
- IU was one of five FBS schools (San Diego State, Arkansas, Baylor and Oklahoma) with at least four 1,000-yard rushers from 2014-16: Coleman (2,036 in 2014), Howard (1,213 in 2015) and Redding (1,012 in 2015 and 1,122 in 2016).
- Coleman (2015) and Howard (2016) became the first Indiana running backs to be drafted in consecutive years since 1990-92. Coleman was picked in the third round and Howard in the fifth round.

KICKERS/PUNTERS

- **Haydon Whitehead** is in his second season as Indiana's punter. He is a member of the Ray Guy Award Watch List for the second straight year.
- Whitehead kicked in his first American football game ever in the 2017 season opener against No. 2 Ohio State and enjoyed a strong debut campaign.
- The honorable mention All-Big Ten selection (coaches and media) averaged 40.7 yards on 85 punts.
- Whitehead landed 33 inside the 20-yard line (T-3rd nationally), 15 inside the 10 and four inside the 5.
- The Melbourne, Australia, native recorded five 50-plus yarders with a long of 56.
- Opponents only returned 25 punts for 124 yards (5.0 average) and Whitehead collected eight games with at least three punts placed inside the 20.
- Whitehead, who punts left-footed but is able to kick right-footed if necessary, enrolled in 2017 spring classes and participated in practice.
- The 22-year old played Australian Rules Football for 15 years. He made his first trip to the United States when he took his official visit to IU in December 2016.
- Whitehead trained under Nathan Chapman and John Smith at Prokick Australia, a training ground for punters and kickers in Melbourne.
- Prokick has produced the past five Ray Guy winners (2013-16), including all three finalists in 2016 and two of the three in 2017, in addition to current Steelers punter Jordan Berry.
- Senior **Dan Godsil** is in his fourth season as the Hoosiers long snapper. He has served as the team's long snapper in all 38 games since his arrival.

- Phil Steele named the Ottawa, Ohio, native a preseason first team All-American.
- Two-time Big Ten Bakken-Andersen Kicker of the Year (2015, 2017) Griffin Oakes graduated after one of the most decorated career in IU history.
- He ended his career as the program's leader in field goals (69), and second in extra points (147) and total points (354).
- Redshirt junior **Logan Justus** and true freshman **Charles Campbell** battled during fall camp for the starting job.
- A walk-on out of McCordsville, Ind., Justus is a left-footer who connected on a 36-yarder in his first career game at Florida International last weekend.
- Campbell was a 2017 Tennessee Mr. Football finalist (kicker), three-time district kicker of the year and two time all-state selection out of University School of Jackson.
- The Jackson, Tenn., product was a U.S. Army All-American and kicked in the 2018 U.S. Army All-American Bowl.
- Redshirt sophomore **Jared Smolar** recorded four touchbacks (7 kickoffs) in his Hoosiers debut at FIU.
- Smolar redshirted last year after he transferred from Rutgers University.
- The Valparaiso, Ind., native kicked in three games with the Scarlet Knights in 2016. He totaled 21 kickoffs with an average of 55.1 yards.

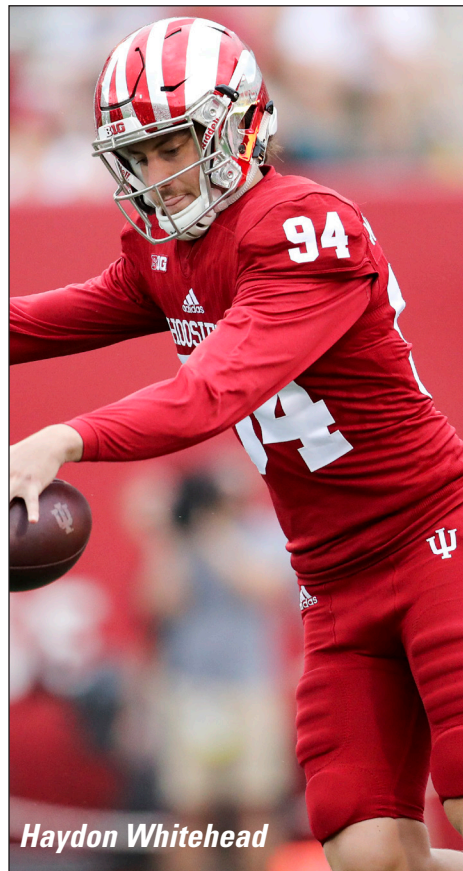
RETURN SPECIALISTS

- Fifth-year senior **J-Shun Harris II**, a Phil Steele preseason second team All-American and first team All-Big Ten selection, returned from his third ACL injury (right), which he suffered in game eight at Maryland last season, to play in the 2018 opener.
- He returned to action in 2017 after he tore his right ACL during 2015 summer workouts and his left ACL during 2016 preseason camp.
- Despite missing a quarter of the 2017 season, Harris earned honorable mention All-Big Ten from the coaches and media.
- The Fishers, Ind., native led the Big Ten and was second nationally with 19.0 yards per return at this time of his injury, while his average ranks fifth in conference single-season history.
- His two scores also led the league and tied for second nationally.
- Harris tied for the national lead in 40- and 30-plus yard returns (4, 1st in B1G), was tied for third in 70-plus (1, T-1st) and 50-plus (2, 1st), tied for seventh in 60-plus (1, T-1st) and tied for 11th in 20-plus (4, 2nd).
- Prior to the injury, his 44-yard punt return for a touchdown at Virginia was the first of his career, the first for a Hoosier since Mitchell Paige vs. Michigan in 2015, and was a career-long return.

- Harris totaled 109 punt return yards in the game, the most for any IU player in a single game since 1991, en route to Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week.
- He followed that up with a 70-yard return for a TD in the win over Georgia Southern, joining Rob Turner (1990) as the only players in program history to return a punt for a score in back-to-back games en route to his second straight B1G honor.
- Harris shares the Indiana record for most punt returns for a touchdown in a season with Paige (2015), Larry Highbaugh (1969), and Turner. Tim Wilbur holds the school career record with three TDs.
- He carded his second 50-plus yard return, a 53-yarder, to set up the Hoosiers final score against No. 17 Michigan.
- Harris finished the game with 74 yards (3 returns) and is in sixth place on the program's single-season list with 266 total yards.
- Harris was the first nominee for the 2017 Orange Bowl-FWAA Courage Award.
- Since the start of the 2015 season, Indiana is tied for sixth nationally in punt returns for touchdowns (4) and is 21st in punt return average (10.5).

- Tom Allen was named Indiana University's 29th head football coach on Dec. 1, 2016. He made his head coaching debut in the 2016 Foster Farms Bowl.
- The New Castle, Ind., native joined the Hoosiers staff as associate head coach/defense on Jan. 15, 2016, and has continued to oversee the defense as head coach.
- Allen's defenses have reached heights not seen in a generation in Bloomington. Since his arrival, Indiana is the most improved team nationally in total defense (-169.4 ypg) and passing defense (-134.1 ypg), the sixth-most improved in third down defense (-12.2 percent) and the ninth-most improved in points per game allowed (-12.3 ypg).
- IU finished ninth nationally in third down defense (29.9 percent – best program mark since 1992; 3rd in the Big Ten), 17th in passing defense (179.7 ypg – best program mark since 1995; 4th in the Big Ten) and 26th in total defense (340.1 ypg – best program mark since 1995) last year.
- A school record 13 Hoosiers earned 2017 All-B1G honors, including six defenders, which matched 2016's program mark. Eleven Indiana players were drafted or invited to NFL camps and five participated in the NFL Combine, both school records.
- Tight end Ian Thomas (4th round, Carolina) and linebacker Chris Covington (6th round, Dallas) were selected in the 2018 NFL Draft.
- Wide receiver Simmie Cobbs Jr., kicker Griffin Oakes and linebacker Tegray Scales collected first team all-league accolades. Oakes was named the Bakken-Andersen Kicker of the Year.
- IU ranked in the top six in the Big Ten in both total offense (6th) and total defense (6th) for the first time since 1991.
- Engineered one of the top defensive turnarounds in the country in 2016. The Hoosiers improved in every major statistical category against a schedule featuring four top 10 opponents, a program first.
- Indiana held its opponents to 380.1 total yards, down 129.4 yards from 2015, the largest improvement in the country, limited its foes to 94.1 fewer passing yards, also first nationally, 10.4 fewer points, which ranked fourth nationally, and gave up 25 fewer touchdowns than in 2015.
- A nominee for the 2016 Broyles Award, Allen led the program's first All-American at linebacker since 1987, Scales, who earned SI.com second team honors.
- Allen has strong ties to the Hoosier state as he served as head coach at Ben Davis High School (2004-06), defensive coordinator at Ben Davis (1998-03) and Marion High School (1997), and earned his master's degree from IU (2002).
- Over the last 23-plus seasons, the teams for which Allen has been a member of the coaching staff have posted a combined record of 228-76 (.750).
- A 26-year coaching veteran, Allen was the defensive coordinator at the University of South Florida in 2015.
- South Florida posted an 8-5 record and earned a trip to the Miami Beach Bowl. Allen mentored three all-conference selections and the American Athletic Conference's top scoring defense (19.6 ppg in league play).
- In his lone season in Tampa, USF tied for 13th nationally in tackles for loss (7.5 per game), tied for 14th in interceptions (17), tied for 24th in takeaways (25), tied for 26th in sacks (2.62 per game), 31st in rushing defense (141.4 ypg), 34th in passing efficiency defense (118.76) and 35th in scoring defense (22.9 ppg).
- Spent the 2012-14 campaigns as linebackers coach and special teams coordinator at Ole Miss, where he coached All-SEC linebackers Serderius Bryant and Denzel Nkemdiche.
- The Rebels closed out 2014 with a 9-3 record and ranked No. 9 after they met No. 6 TCU in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl. Ole Miss spent nine weeks in the Associated Press top 10 with a high-water mark of No. 3.
- In 2014, the Rebels led the nation in scoring defense (13.8 ppg) and allowed a national low 18 touchdowns.
- Ole Miss topped the SEC in five categories and ranked in the top 20 nationally in 11, including 10th in red zone defense, 11th in tackles for loss (7.5 per game), 12th in takeaways (28), 13th in total defense (321.2 ypg) and 13th in defensive touchdowns scored (4).
- Nkemdiche earned 2012 Freshman All-America honors and second team AP All-SEC after leading the Rebels in tackles (82), TFLs (13.0), forced fumbles (4) and interceptions (3).
- As assistant head coach at Arkansas State (2011), the Red Wolves led the Sun Belt Conference and ranked in the top 25 nationally in total defense (331.46 ypg) and scoring defense (20.77 ppg). ASU also finished eighth nationally in tackles for loss (7.62 per game) and 15th in sacks (2.69 per game).
- Arkansas State went 10-2 overall and 8-0 in the Sun Belt. Allen coached first team all-conference selection Demario Davis and second team pick Nathan Herrold. Davis was selected in the third round of the 2012 NFL Draft by the Jets.
- Prior to ASU, Allen served as the defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Drake University (2010). The Bulldogs allowed just 330 yards per game while ranking No. 6 nationally in the FCS in rush defense (94.2 ypg), No. 8 in sacks (33), No. 17 in tackles for loss (81) and No. 25 in scoring defense (20.4 ppg).
- At NAIA Lambuth University (2008-09), Allen was the assistant head coach, defensive coordinator and linebackers coach, and he was a part of two Mid-South Conference championships and the school's first undefeated regular season (11-0) in 2009. That defense ranked No. 4 nationally in scoring defense, No. 7 in pass defense and sacks, No. 9 in total defense and No. 12 in third down conversions.
- First collegiate coaching stop was at Wabash College, where as secondary coach and special teams coordinator the team won the NCAC championship and advanced to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Division II playoffs. Three defensive backs were named to the All-NCAC team.
- Prior to Marion H.S., Allen was defensive coordinator at Armwood High School (1995-96) and head coach at Temple Heights High School (1992-94) in Florida.
- Allen earned his bachelor's degree from Maranatha Baptist University (Wis.) in 1992. Tom and his wife, Tracy, have three children, Hannah (21), Thomas (19) and Britney (17). Thomas is a redshirt freshman linebacker with the Hoosiers.

DON FISCHER

This marks the 46th year that Don Fischer has been the radio play-by-play "voice" of Indiana University football and men's basketball games. He shares the fourth-longest football radio tenure in the nation. The past 32 years, Fischer has worked as an

independent contractor and is currently serving the Indiana University Radio Network owned by Learfield Communications out of Jefferson City, Mo.

In addition to broadcasting the games, Fischer hosts the weekly coaches radio talk shows for both the football and men's basketball programs. Fischer also offers stations a weekly talk show about IU football and basketball that airs in several markets around the state during the school year.

Fischer does freelance sportscasting, which included handling for 23 years the pre-season television play-by-play for the NFL's Indianapolis Colts (1995-2017).

During his 45 years with IU, Fischer has been named Indiana Sportscaster of the Year 29 times by two different organizations. The National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association has awarded him 25 times, while the Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association has named him its honoree four times.

He received the inaugural Woody Durham College Voice Award from the National Sports Media

Association, the University of North Carolina and Learfield Sports in June of 2018.

In October of 2010, Fischer was one of eight inductees into the Indiana Broadcast Pioneers Richard M. Fairbanks Hall of Fame. The Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association (ISSA) inducted Fischer into the ISSA Hall of Fame in 2004.

He has won several awards for best play-by-play performance, and he has been honored by IU with the J.W. Bill Orwig Medal, that goes to non-alumni for distinguished service to the University.

Fischer also has been named an Honorary "I" Man. In addition, the City of Indianapolis, and the State of Indiana have each honored Fischer with a special "Recognition Day" for his service and abilities as the play-by-play broadcaster for IU.

He has broadcast over 1,900 Indiana University games - a total that includes 10 bowl games, four NCAA basketball championship games and two N.I.T. championship games.

From 1973 through 1987, he worked for ABC Radio, Canada's CBC and several additional major market radio stations, including WIRE in Indianapolis, as their source for reports during the month of May coverage of the Indianapolis 500. During that period, Fischer also served WIRE and Network Indiana, a statewide news network, as their sports director.

A native of Rochelle, Ill., Fischer has been in the radio business for 52 years with stops in Butte, Mont.; Ottawa, Ill.; Springfield, Ill.; and Terre Haute, Ind. Fischer has four sons and 12 grandchildren. Don and his wife, Susy, reside in Greenwood, Ind.



BUCK SUHR

Buck Suhr rejoined the Indiana University Football Radio Network as color commentator in 2010. Suhr, who served in the same capacity from 1997-2001, reunited with the Voice of the Hoosiers, Don Fischer, and Joe Smith (pre-game, post-game and halftime).

Suhr was a member of the Hoosier football program for 18 years as a running backs coach and administrator. He spent 12 seasons (1984-95) as running backs coach under IU's all-time winningest coach, Bill Mallory. After his stint as a coach, where he tutored All-America selections Anthony Thompson

and Vaughn Dunbar, Suhr was named administrative assistant to the head coach and athletic director from 1996-2001.

As running backs coach, Suhr helped direct one of the nation's most productive rushing attacks. From 1984-95, the Hoosiers had three different 1,000-yard rushers who topped that mark on six separate occasions. In 1988, the IU offense rushed for a then-school record 2,963 yards.

During his tenure, Suhr coached Thompson, the 1989 Heisman Trophy runner-up, along with Dunbar and Alex Smith, the 1994 UPI National Freshman of the Year.

Suhr and his wife, Jane, are the parents Errek and the deceased Jenny Suhr. Errek played in 74 games and earned four letters as a guard for the IU men's basketball program from 2004-07. They have four grandchildren: Addy, Hayden, Taylor and Mack.



JOE SMITH

Joe Smith is in his 35th year with the IU Radio Network. He has handled pre-game, halftime, and post-game duties for Indiana football and men's basketball since 1983. Smith, the sports director of WGCL-AM 1370 in Bloomington, is in his

49th year of radio broadcasting in Bloomington. He began his broadcasting career in 1969 at WAIK Radio in Galesburg, Ill. From 1973-89, Smith worked on "RFD-4 Agri-Business Show" on WTTV-4 with the late Bob Cook. In 1998, Smith was named Indiana Sportscaster of the Year and in April 2003, he was inducted into the Indiana Sportswriters/Sportscasters Hall of Fame. Smith handled the IU TV Warmup Shows from 1978-82 and hosted several IU Coaches Shows from 1983-96 and again from 2002-04.

In June 2004, Smith received the J.W. Bill Orwig Medal that goes to non-alumni for distinguished service to the University.

Smith has two children, both of whom are Indiana University graduates. Jeff, currently resides in Brownsburg, Ind., with his wife, Kristen, and their sons, Jayden, Kaleb and Logan. Joe's daughter, Jamie, and her husband, Eric, currently reside in Bloomington with their son, Ethan and two daughters, Emerson and Carolina.

POST-GAME NOTES

TEAM

- Indiana has won 13 of its last 15 season openers and **Tom Allen** claimed his first victory in a season opener (1-1).
- IU has won 12 of its last 13 regular season non-conference games, including four straight overall and five consecutive on the road.
- The Hoosiers have won four straight road openers and Allen is 2-0 in starts away from home.
- Indiana is 3-0 all-time against Florida International, with a pair of wins in Miami.
- Senior safety **Jonathan Crawford**, fifth-year senior offensive lineman **Wes Martin**, senior defensive lineman **Jacob Robinson** and fifth-year senior wide receiver **Luke Timian** served as tonight's game captains.
- IU won the coin toss and elected to defer.
- The Hoosiers wore a helmet decal to honor Bill Mallory, the program's all-time winningest coach, who passed away in Bloomington on May 25, 2018.

DEFENSE

- **Jonathan Crawford** opened his 2018 campaign in a big way. The senior safety accounted for two takeaways in the first quarter, his fifth career multi-takeaway game. He forced a fumble, the third of his career, on FIU's opening drive and posted his first career pick-6 two drives later in the opening quarter.
- Crawford added three tackles. The Largo, Fla., native moved into a share of eighth on Indiana's career lists with nine interceptions. He has a hand in a team-leading 17 takeaways (9 INTs, 5 fumble recoveries, 3 forced fumbles).
- The interception return for a TD was the program's first since its last visit to Florida International on Sept. 1, 2016. Rashard Fant (34 yards) and Tegray Scales (16) each reached the end zone.
- True freshman safety **Devon Matthews** recovered Crawford's forced fumble.
- Redshirt sophomore defensive tackle **Jerome Johnson** picked up his second career sack in the third quarter. Johnson got credit for a forced fumble, which FIU recovered, and ended the evening with four tackles.
- Fifth-year senior defensive end **Nile Sykes** netted the team's third takeaway when he recovered a fumble in the second quarter, the second of his career.
- Tonight marked the seventh time in Tom Allen's tenure as defensive coordinator that the Hoosiers recorded at least three takeaways (2016 - 4, 2017 - 2, 2018 - 1).
- In his first career start, redshirt junior defensive end **Gavin Everett** posted a pair of tackles for loss and four stops overall.
- Fifth-year senior linebacker **Dameon Willis Jr.** topped Indiana with six tackles.
- Fifth-year senior defensive tackle **Ja'merez Bowen**, redshirt junior defensive end Gavin Everett, redshirt junior linebacker **Reakwon Jones** and junior safety **Khalil Bryant** earned their first career starts on defense.

OFFENSE

- In his fifth career start, redshirt sophomore **Peyton Ramsey** completed 20-of-27 for 156 yards and matched a career-high with three touchdowns. Ramsey added 36 yards on the ground.
- True freshman **Michael Penix Jr.** took over under center in the third quarter. He became the fifth true freshman quarterback in program history to play (Tim Clifford - 1977, Tre Roberson - 2011, Nate Sudfeld - 2012, Zander Diamont - 2014).
- Penix promptly led the Hoosiers on an 8-play, 72-yard scoring drive, culminating with a 9-yard touchdown pass to senior running back **Mike Majette**. The Tampa, Fla., native led the team to a field goal and his second drive and finished 8-of-10 for 96 yards.
- The TD grab was the second of Majette's career.
- Redshirt junior wide receiver **Donavan Hale** collected his first career two-touchdown game. He was the first Hoosier to reach the end zone in 2018, pulling in an 18-yard pass in the opening stanza, and added a 2-yarder in the second. Hale has four career scores and paced IU with 60 yards on four receptions.
- Redshirt freshman tight end **Peyton Hendershot** recorded his first career touchdown and his first career catch, from 3 yards out, to extend IU's lead to 21-7 in the second quarter.
- Sophomore wideout **Ty Fryfogle** finished with a career-high 5 receptions for a career-best 33 yards.
- True freshman **Reese Taylor** saw time on both sides of the ball. He rushed three times for 40 yards, caught two passes for 12 yards and made two tackles at cornerback.
- True freshman **Stevie Scott** led the way with 70 yards on 20 attempts.
- Fifth-year senior **Luke Timian** (50 yards) finished with a game-high six catches and redshirt junior **Nick Westbrook** (33 yards) added five grabs.
- IU had seven players rush the ball, totaling 213 yards (4.5 per rush)
- The Hoosiers had 10 players with receptions, tallying up 252 yards (9.0 per reception)
- Sophomore wide receiver **Whop Philyor** and redshirt freshman tight end **Peyton Hendershot** earned their first career starts on offense.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Redshirt junior kicker **Logan Justus** connected on his first career field goal attempt, from 36 yards, to give Indiana a 38-21 margin.
- Redshirt sophomore **Jared Smolar** recorded four touchbacks on his seven kickoffs.
