The Virginia women's basketball team (4-1) will face host-school Florida International (0-4) in the consolation final of the FIU Thanksgiving Classic Tournament on Sunday, Nov. 30 at 2 p.m. in Miami, Fla.

The Cavaliers suffered their first defeat of the season, falling 64-62 in their opening-round game against Toledo. Virginia held a 10-point lead, 51-41, with 11 minutes remaining in the game, but Florida International chipped away at the deficit, coming back to tie and then take a 56-55 lead with 3:22 remaining. The final minute of play included three lead changes beginning with Toledo taking a 61-60 lead with 32 seconds remaining after Virginia committed an offensive foul. Freshman guard Mikayla Venson (Arlington, Va.) swung the score back in UVa's favor, pulling up for a free-throw-line jump shot with 13 seconds remaining. Zanoguera hit a three-pointer with five seconds left in the game to give the Rockets a 64-62 lead. Venson fired off a three-point attempt as the buzzer sounded, but it clanged off the rim.

Junior guard Faith Randolph (Derwood, Md.) had her third 20-point game of the season, scoring 21 points, including making five three-pointers. Randolph is 14-of-26 from three-point range this season, making 53.8 percent of her attempts from long range.

Freshman forward Lauren Moses (Mount Holly, N.J.) went 6-of-10 from the field, scoring a career-high 14 points with a career-high eight rebounds.

Freshman guard Mikayla Venson (Arlington, Va.) scored nine points with four rebounds. Venson is now tied for third on the team in scoring, averaging 9.4 points per game. Venson also had a team-high four assists with one turnover, raising her season assist-to-turnover ratio to 1.55.

INTERVIEW POLICY

All interview requests for Virginia women's basketball must be made through Melissa Dudek in the Virginia Athletics Media Relations Office. Players' individual phone numbers will not be given to the media at any time. Game day interviews will not be granted until the postgame press conference opportunity. Please give a minimum of 24 hours notice for all interview requests.

HOT SHOOTING

- Sarah Imovbioh was 7-of-9 (77.7 percent) from the field against Auburn and 7-of-8 from the line
- Mikayla Venson was 6-of-8 from the field against Radford and 3-of-4 against Auburn. All four of her shots against Auburn were from beyond the arc.
- Breyana Mason was 4-of-6 (66.7 percent) shooting against Auburn

DISHING IT OUT

- Breyana Mason had a season-high six assists against Xavier and has a team-leading 21 this season. She finished the 2013-14 season with 37 assists
- Mason is second in the ACC with 5.3 assists per game
- Mason is among the top-five in the ACC in assist-to-turnover ratio at +3.5, which ranks 36th nationally

THREE-POINT SHOOTING

- The Cavaliers were 7-of-10 from three-point range against Auburn, the first time Virginia had a 70 percent or better three-point efficiency since making 5-of-7 (71.4 percent) against UCSB in an NCAA Tournament game in 2008.
- Faith Randolph came into the week 9-of-16 (56.3 percent) from three-point range this season, ranking second in the ACC and 31st in the nation
- Randolph was a combined 5-of-6 from three in the two games last week
- Breyana Mason went 5-of-7 from three point range in the opener against Ohio State, but hadn't taken another three-point shot until going 0-for-1 against Toledo
- Virginia as a team ranks third in the ACC with a 38.6 percent three-point shooting percentage

BLOCKED SHOTS

- Last season, the Cavaliers averaged 1.4 blocked shots per game, which ranked 337th nationally out of 343 teams
- This season, the Cavaliers are averaging 4.8 per game which ranks 61st in the nation.
- This season, Virginia already has 19 blocked shots. They finished last season with 42.
- Freshman forward Lauren Moses has seven blocked shots, knocking down two at least one shot in each game this season
- Sarah Imovbioh had four blocked shots last season. This year, she already has three.

RECEIVING VOTES

- For the second-straight week, Virginia received votes in the USA Today Coaches' Poll.

HOMETOWN GIRL

- Sophomore guard Tiffany Suarez is a Miami native, a graduate of Our Lady of Lourdes High School
- Last season in her first collegiate games in her home state, she scored 17 points at the FGCU Tournament, including logging her first double-digit scoring effort against FGCU with 13 points

FIU THANKSGIVING CLASSIC TOURNAMENT

- Virginia will open the tournament by facing Toledo, playing in the second game on Friday.
- The winners of Friday's games will play one another on Sunday in the tournament championship game. Friday's losing teams will play one another on Sunday in the consolation final.
- On Sunday, Arizona will be playing in the 11:30 game and Florida International in the 2 p.m. game. If FIU wins on Friday night, the 2 p.m. game will be the championship game. If Arizona wins, the 11:30 a.m. game will be the championship game.
- The Toledo Rockets have a balanced scoring attack with only one player, Inma Zanoguera, averaging in double figures, but have six players averaging 8.0 or more points per game. Sophie Reecher leads the squad with 9.3 rebounds per game.
- The Rockets are coming off a 66-48 loss at No. 24 Purdue last Sunday. Freshman Jay-Ann Brao-Harriott came off the bench to lead the team with a 13-point performance.
- Virginia and Toledo have only played each other once with Virginia winning 95-64 in a 1993 contest in Charlottesville.
- Arizona is coming off a 61-34 victory over UC Santa Barbara in a game played Tuesday afternoon in Tucson. Candice Warthen scored 15 points with six rebounds. Labrittney Jones scored 10 points with seven rebounds.
- Arizona has a couple of close, tough losses this season, falling 76-72 in the home opener to Bakersfield and 57-54 at Texas Tech.
- Candice Warthen is averaging 13.6 points per game.
- Virginia is 3-1 all-time against Arizona with the Cavaliers logging a 70-65 victory in 2003 at the Rainbow Wahine Classic.
- Head coach Joanne Boyle's Cal teams were 11-1 against Arizona in her five seasons in the Pac-12.
- Florida International is off to an 0-3 start including a 97-49 loss at Florida Gulf Coast
- Taylor Shade leads the team with 15.0 points per game. Marita Davydova is averaging 11.3 points and 8.3 rebounds per game.
- Virginia is 3-0 all-time against Florida International with the Cavaliers last earning a 78-65 victory over the Panthers in Charlottesville in 2001.

RAINING THREES VS AUBURN

- Virginia won its fourth-straight game with a 66-51 victory
- The Cavaliers broke open a five-point game by going on a 19-3 run early in the second half, making 10 of their first 13 field goal attempts in the period while Auburn went 3-of-14 in the same span. The Tigers also committed five turnovers during that same span.
- Virginia's hot-shooting second-half performance propelled the Cavaliers to a 20-point advantage with 9:16 remaining in the second half. Virginia held a 21-point lead heading into the final two minutes of play, but Auburn capitalized on four late UVa turnovers to go on a 6-0 run to close out the game.
- The Cavaliers shot 70.0 percent from three-point range, making seven of 10 while Auburn was 8-of-20 for 40.0 percent. It was the first time Virginia had a 70 percent or better three-point efficiency since making 5-of-7 (71.4 percent) against UCSB in an NCAA Tournament game in 2008.
- Sarah Imovbioh had her third double-double of the season, reaching double figures in points and rebounds by halftime and finishing with 21 points and 13 rebounds. Faith Randolph scored 18 points on 6-of-13 shooting, including going 3-of-4 from three-point range. Mikayla Venson scored 10 points.

ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK (NOV. 17)

- Virginia senior center Sarah Imovbioh has been named the Atlantic Coast Conference Women's Basketball Player of the Week
- Imovbioh set the Virginia single-game rebounding record with 24 boards against Ohio State, and accounted for almost half of Virginia's 51 total rebounds in the game.
- Against Radford, Imovbioh only played 20 minutes, but still nearly had another double-double with 14 points and 9 boards.
- Imovbioh averaged 16 points and 16.5 rebounds in UVa's two wins.
- Imovbioh is the first Cavalier to earn this honor since Chelsea Shine was named the ACC Player of the Week on Nov. 21, 2011 after Virginia upset No. 3 Tennessee, 69-64, in overtime.

ROAD WIN AT XAVIER

- Virginia led nearly the entire game, taking a 37-25 lead into halftime.
- Xavier made just one three pointer on 11 attempts in the first half, but went 7-of-14 after the break, including Jada Byrd hitting a three-pointer as time expired, to cut the final deficit to single digits.
- The Cavaliers were 3-of-7 from three-point range and 10-of-12 from the free throw line, shooting 46.8 percent overall from the field. Virginia outrebounded Xavier, 44-33, with UVa scoring 17 second-chance points.
- Faith Randolph scored 26 points, matching her career high. Randolph went 8-of-8 from the free throw line, helping her to her second 25-point game of the season.
- Sarah Imovbioh finished with 18 points and 13 rebounds.
- Breyana Mason (6) and Mikayla Venson (5) accounted for 11 of Virginia's 14 assists.

ROUTING RADFORD

- Virginia closed out the opening homestand with a 75-47 victory over Radford.
- UVa had four players end the game in double-figures. Mikayla Venson (12 points on 6-of-8 shooting), Sarah Imovbioh (14 points with nine rebounds in 20 minutes on the court), Breyana Mason (11 points, five assists.) and Faith Randolph (11).
- Virginia never trailed in the game, holding a 31-21 advantage at half-time and outscored the Highlanders 44-26 after the break.
- Virginia forced 20 turnovers, with seven different Cavaliers getting at least one steal, scoring 21 points off the miscues. Radford outrebounded Virginia 43-38, scoring 23 second-chance points to Virginia's 13.

OHIO STATE OPENER

- Virginia topped Ohio State, 87-82 in the season-opener
- Sarah Imovbioh pulled in a school-record 24 rebounds while also scoring 18 points for her 16th career double-double.
- The game, which featured 18 lead changes and six ties, was knotted 79-79 with a minute remaining. Randolph drove through the Ohio State zone, converting a layup with 51 seconds left on the clock to give UVa an 81-79 advantage. After Ohio State missed a three-pointer on the opposite end, Lauren Moses came up with the rebound, her seventh of the game. The Cavaliers went 6-for-6 from the free throw line in the final 36 seconds of the game to secure the season-opening victory.
- Breyana Mason scored a career-high 22 points, going 8-of-11 from the field including making five of seven three-point attempts, with six assists.
- Faith Randolph led the Cavaliers with a 25-point performance.
- Virginia has won nine of its last ten season-openers and has never lost a home opener at John Paul Jones Arena, winning its first home game in each of the last 15 seasons.

NO. 13 RECRUITING CLASS MAKING ITS DEBUT

- The players that made up the Cavaliers second-straight top-15 recruiting class are poised to make their collegiate debuts.
- Point guard Mikayla Venson (Arlington, Va.) was the No. 8 player at her position according to Hoop-Gurlz and the top-ranked recruit in the state of Virginia despite only playing high school basketball her freshman season at Yorktown.
- Venson played AAU ball through her junior year, but hasn't played in an official basketball game in over a year.
- Another five-star recruit, wing Aliyah Huland El (Randolph, N.J.) scored over 2,200 points in her high school career, while also setting records for rebounds, assists and blocks.
- Huland El was a three-sport star at Randolph High School in New Jersey, also setting school records in volleyball for career kills (despite only playing three years) and holds the school record in the triple jump.
- Forward Lauren Moses led Rancocas Valley Regional High School to four-straight State Championship games and two stats titles (2011, 13).
- Moses was Rancocas Valley's all-time leading scorer, breaking the previous mark set by UVa alum Demya Walker.
- Jae'Lisa Allen made her collegiate debut against Radford, playing the final four minutes of the game

HIGH POWERED PREP SCORING

- The Cavaliers have three players who scored over 1800 points in their prep careers.
- Aliyah Huland El leads the pack with 2286 followed by Breyana Mason at 1979 and Lauren Moses at 1823.
- Mason was the 2013 Gatorade High School State Player of the Year for Virginia.

2015-16 RECRUITING CLASS

- The Cavaliers signed three post players (two forwards and a center) to join the team in 2015-16
- Debra Ferguson, a 6-4 center from Madison Heights, Va., has averaged 10.7 points, 8.0 rebounds and 2.3 blocks per game.
- Ferguson, whose Amherst County High is located an hour south of Charlottesville, is a two-time Second-Team All-Seminole District honoree and also named First-Team All-Conference 23 last season.
- Moné Jones, a 6-3 forward from Durham, N.C., averaged 10 points, eight rebounds, six blocks and 1.5 assists per game last season, helping to lead Riverside High to the state tournament's elite eight.
- Jones is ESPN-W's No. 61 overall recruit and ranked No. 11 at her position.
- Jones earned PAC 6 All-Conference honors in 2012, 2013, and 2014 in both basketball and volleyball.

- Jones participated in the 2014 USA Basketball Women's U18 National Team Trials last May.
- Shakyna Payne, a 6-3 forward from Acworth, Ga. (the same hometown as sophomore forward Sydney Umeri), averaged 12.6 points, 10.7 rebounds and 1.2 blocks per game last season at Etowah High School, leading her team in rebounding all three years, before transferring to Southwest Atlanta Christian Academy for her senior season.
- After earning All-County honorable mention as a freshman, she was named to the second team her sophomore year before garnering first-team accolades last season.

NOTES ON ACC WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

- ACC women's basketball teams went 30-4 last week to improve to 50-7 overall against non-conference competition. ACC teams own three wins over ranked foes (No. 23/23 UCLA, No. 21/19 Oklahoma State and No. 15/17 Michigan State) and are 7-3 against teams from the Power 5 Conferences.
- Five ACC teams are among the Top 25 in the latest Associated Press Poll. Notre Dame is the highest ranking ACC team at No. 2 followed by Duke at No. 8, North Carolina at No. 11, Louisville at No. 12 and Syracuse at No. 22. NC State and Florida State are receiving votes in AP Poll.
