HOOS VS ORANGE

- Virginia owns an 11-6 edge in the series
- From 2005-2011, Virginia won seven-straight games between the two teams, but Syracuse has won the last five meetings, including a 16-8 victory in last season's NCAA semifinals

SYRACUSE NOTES

- Syracuse is 3-0 this season with a pair of wins over Canisius and an 18-10 victory over No. 19 Denver
- The Orange are averaging 19.3 goals per game
- Kayla Traynor has 11 goals this season
- Kailah Kempney has won 28 draw controls

SCORING STREAKS

- Liza Blue had a 27-game goal scoring streak, which dated back to the 2013 season) snapped in the season-opener at Northwestern. She rebounded by scoring a hat trick at Richmond on Wednesday
- Blue had an assist against Northwestern, extending her consecutive games in which she has contributed points to 29
- Casey Bocklet has contributed points in eight straight games going back to last season

HOOS HOT

- Both Liza Blue and Mary Alati score hat tricks at Richmond
- Blue also had two assists against Richmond for five points
- Last season, Blue had five games in which she contributed five or more points
- Casey Bocklet had four points against Richmond with two goals and two assists
- Daniela Eppler scored the first goal of the season for the Cavaliers, nine seconds into the Northwestern game
- Eppler added two more goals against Richmond
- Kelly Reese had the first multi-goal game of her career, netting a pair against Northwestern

LAST TIME OUT

- Virginia rebounded from its season-opening 6-5 loss to No. 5 Northwestern with a 14-6 victory at Richmond
- Virginia scored six-straight goals in the second half to put the game out of reach
- UVa won all eight draw controls in the first half and finished with a 14-8 edge
- Liza Blue had a hat trick and two assists for five points
- Mary Alati also scored three goals, on four shots, the first hat trick of her career.

ON DECK

- Virginia travels to No. 10 Penn State, playing Saturday, Feb. 28 at 3 p.m. before playing the home opener against Harvard on Tuesday, March 3 at 4 p.m.

OPENING STRETCH

- Virginia plays five of its first six games on the road
- The Cavaliers will face four top-10 teams in its first six games, all on the road, including the season-opener against No. 5 Northwestern in the Cobb County Classic game in Kennesaw, Ga.

RECORD WATCH AND MILESTONES

- Swan's 194 career draws currently ranks third in the Cavalier record book. She is one draw shy of tying Lauren Aumiller (2000-03) for second place
- Liza Blue has 95 careers goals, five shy of hitting the century mark

DEBUTS

- Freshman goalie Rachel Vander Kolk made her debut at Northwestern, logging five saves
- Freshman midfielder Meghan Heick also made her debut at Northwestern and has been in the starting lineup both games this year
- Freshman midfielder Kasey Behr made her collegiate debut against Richmond, coming off the bench to score a goal, pick up a ground ball and win two draw controls
