Maryland (40-21) vs. Virginia (47-14)

VIRGINIA POST-GAME NOTES

- Virginia is now 36-30 all-time in the NCAA Tournament and 5-5 in the super regional round.
- Virginia left 14 runner's on base, the most since leaving 14 on base on May 16 at Wake Forest.
- Virginia hitters were hit by a pitch four times against Maryland, bringing its 2014 NCAA Tournament total to eight.
- UVa was 2-for-14 (.143) with runners in scoring position.
- Nathan Kirby allowed a first-inning run for only the second time all season.
- Kirby allowed a first-inning run for the first time since allowing one at Wake Forest on May 16.
- Kirby lasted only 4.2 innings, his shortest start of the season.
- Kirby's five earned runs is the most he yielded since giving up five on Feb. 16, 2013 vs. ECU.
- Kirby earned the loss for the first time since March 22 at Miami.
- Whit Mayberry went 4.1 out of the bullpen, his longest career relief appearance.
- Mayberry had a season-high six strikeouts, five of which were looking.
- Mike Papi's single in the first extended his reached base streak to 15 games.
- Papi finished with three hits, his team-leading 19th multi-hit game and third three-hit game of the season.
- With two walks, Papi broke the UVa record for walks on the season with 55.
- Derek Fisher's 12-game hitting streak was snapped after his 0-for-4 performance.
- Kenny Towns had his seven-game hitting streak snapped and left six-combined runner's on base when he ended three different innings.

MARYLAND POST-GAME NOTES

- Maryland is 5-6 all-time in the NCAA Tournament.
- Maryland is 1-0 all-time in the super regional round.
- Maryland has won 40 games for the first time in program history.
- With 10 hits, Maryland reached the 10-hit plateau for the 22nd time this season.
- Charlie White started the game off with a double to right field to extend his hitting streak to six games.
- White finished with three hits, his 20th multi-hit and fifth three-hit game.
- Maryland starter Jake Stinnett hit back-to-back hitters in the first inning. It was the first time all season he plunked multiple hitters in one inning.
- Maryland closer Kevin Mooney earned his 13th save of the season, tying a program record.
- Kevin Martir went 0-for-4 and snapped his 13-game hitting streak.
- Jose Cuas went 2-for-4, earning his 17th multi-hit game of the season.
- Brandon Lowe drove in two runs, his eighth multi-RBI game of the season.
