QUICK HITS

AROUND THE ACC

Boston College (3-0), Clemson (3-0), Duke (3-0), Syracuse (3-0), NC State (2-0) and Virginia Tech (2-0) remain undefeated through the first three weeks of the season.

■ It is the first time Boston College has been 3-0 since the 2007, when the Eagles started 8-0 behind QB Matt Ryan. The Eagles look to continue their winning ways when they travel to Purdue on Saturday.

■ Clemson is 3-0 for the fourth consecutive season and seventh time in the last eight years. The Tigers have now won 46 of their last 50 games, dating back to 2014. Clemson opens ACC play Saturday at Georgia Tech.

■ The Blue Devils are 3-0 for the second consecutive season, the first time they have opened with three wins in back-to-back seasons since 1987-88. Duke is also the first Power 5 team to post multiple road wins over Power 5 opponents this season, and has the nation's fourth-longest active win streak at six games. The Blue Devils face in-state opponent North Carolina Central on Saturday.

■ Syracuse is 3-0 for the first time under Dino Babers and the eighth time in program history. The Orange won its ACC opener for just the second time since joining the league in 2013. Syracuse welcomes UConn to the Carrier Dome on Saturday. The last time Syracuse was 4-0 was 1991.

■ The ACC and the SEC are the only two Power 5 conferences with six undefeated teams.

WEEK FOUR HIGHLIGHTS

• Three ACC contests highlight the fourth week of the season as Pitt travels to North Carolina for a 12:20 p.m. start on Raycom Sports, Louisville plays at Virginia in the ACC opener for both teams at 12:30 p.m. on RSN, and No. 3/2 Clemson faces Georgia Tech in Atlanta at 3:30 p.m. on ABC.

• Saturday will mark the 13th time in the last 15 meetings that at least one team in the Clemson-Georgia Tech rivalry has been nationally ranked. The Tigers have won each of the last three meetings.

• Louisville has won three straight against Virginia to grab a 4-2 series lead and a 3-1 edge in ACC play.

• North Carolina has won all five ACC meetings with Pitt, and the last seven games between the teams have been decided by a touchdown or less.

• The ACC's non-conference slate is highlighted by No. 23/25 Boston College at Purdue, No. 21/20 Miami vs. FIU, and No. 8/8 Notre Dame at Wake Forest. The Eagles and Boilermakers are meeting for the first time on the gridiron.

• Saturday marks Notre Dame's first visit to BB&T Field since a 24-17 win in the series opener in 2011.

• Miami's first game against crosstown foe FIU in 11 seasons includes the return of Butch Davis, the veteran Panthers head coach who posted a 51-20 record in six seasons at UM.

BRING YOUR A GAME

ACADEMICS

- Ten of 14 ACC Football teams earned a graduation success rate (GSR) at or above the FBS average of 76. That ties for first among Power 5 conferences, both in terms of percentage and in total number.
- The ACC remains the only Power 5 conference to have multiple teams score 90 or higher in GSR each year since 2005. Duke (96), Wake Forest (93) and Boston College (90) reached that plateau last year.
- In the 2017 U.S. News and World “Best Colleges” rankings, ACC member schools combine for an average rank of 54.2, marking the 11th straight year that the ACC has led all Power 5 conferences.

ATHLETICS

- The ACC is the only conference to win national championships in football, men’s basketball, women’s basketball and baseball over the last four years.
- The ACC has won a combined four football and men’s basketball national titles over the last five years, twice as many as any other conference.
- The ACC has had a team in either the College Football Playoff or the BCS National Championship Game in each of the past five years.
- The ACC led all conferences with 10 bowl teams in 2017. Over the last two years, the ACC has had a nation’s best 21 teams in bowl games.
- The ACC has earned at least six bowl bids in 17 consecutive seasons. The league ranks second among all conferences with 116 total bowl appearances since 2005.
- Since 2013, the ACC is second among all conferences with 54 postseason appearances, has the second-best record of any conference in BCS, New Year’s Six and CFP games, and is tied for the most national championships (Florida State in 2013, Clemson in 2016).
- Over the last four years, the ACC is 13-3 in games against the SEC on rivalry week, which features Clemson-South Carolina, Florida State-Florida, Georgia Tech-Georgia and Louisville-Kentucky. The league was 3-1 in 2017, winning all three games on the road.
- Two of the last five national champions have come from the ACC, and the league has had a team in the national championship game in three of the last five years. Both are tied for the most from any conference.
- An ACC football player has won the Heisman Trophy or the Campbell Trophy – commonly referred to as the “Academic Heisman” – in four of the last five years, something no other league can claim.



EXTRA YARD FOR TEACHERS

- The ACC is proud to continue its partnership with the College Football Playoff Foundation to inspire and empower teachers. ACC Football teams and the league will celebrate Extra Yard for Teachers Week from September 15-22.
- The College Football Playoff (CFP) Foundation will debut four vignettes from college football legends as part of the fourth annual Extra Yard for Teachers (EYFT) Week, held September 15-22. The vignettes, which will debut on EYFT social media channels, feature former student-athletes **Tony Dorsett (Pitt)**, “Mean” Joe Greene (North Texas), **Daryl Johnston (Syracuse)**, and Herschel Walker (Georgia).

IN THE NATIONAL STATS

- Duke, Virginia Tech and Boston College are three of the 14 remaining teams in the country that have not thrown an interception. BC has attempted 72 passes without a pick, Duke has attempted 71 and Virginia Tech has tried 49.
- Boston College, Syracuse and Miami are in the top 20 in the country in scoring offense. The Eagles are sixth nationally, scoring 52.7 points per game, while the Orange is 12th at 49.0 ppg and the Hurricanes are 14th at 47.7 ppg. Ten of the 14 ACC teams are averaging 30 or more points per game.
- Duke, Virginia Tech, Wake Forest, Miami and Virginia are ranked in the top 10 nationally in both fewest penalties per game and fewest penalty yards per game. Duke leads the nation in fewest penalties per game (2.67) and is second in fewest penalty yards per game (24.0).
- Greg Dortch of Wake Forest leads the nation with 224.7 all-purpose yards per game. Miami’s Jeff Thomas is sixth at 178.7. Dortch also leads the ACC and is second in the nation with 9.3 receptions per game.
- Clemson’s Clelin Ferrell and Boston College’s Wyatt Ray lead the nation with 1.67 sacks per game. Ferrell also ranks sixth nationally in tackles per game. Miami’s Gerald Willis III is fourth in the country in tackles per game.
- Miami’s Jeff Thomas has 11 catches for 304 yards and two touchdowns, and leads the nation with 27.6 yards per reception.
- NC State ranks eighth in the country with 367.5 passing yards per game. QB Ryan Finley is sixth in the nation with a 71.0 completion percentage and eighth in passing yards.
- Georgia Tech, Boston College, Wake Forest and Syracuse rank among the top 20 in rushing offense. The Yellow Jackets lead the nation at 392.7 yards per game. BC is eighth, Wake Forest is 15th and Syracuse is 19th.
- Miami leads the nation with 11.7 tackles for loss per game. The Hurricanes are also fourth nationally in total defense, allowing just 236.0 yards per game.

NON-CONFERENCE WINS

- The ACC won all five non-conference games last week, including victories by Duke over Baylor, Clemson over Georgia Southern, Miami over Toledo, Virginia over Ohio and Louisville over Western Kentucky. The ACC was the only Power 5 conference not to lose a non-conference game.
- The ACC is 24-7 in non-conference games, which is the second best win percentage of any conference.
- The ACC’s six true road non-conference wins are the most of any conference.
- The ACC’s three true road non-conference wins at Power 5 opponents are the most of any conference.

FOUR IN AP TOP 25

- Led by No. 3 Clemson, four ACC teams are ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 football poll (Sept. 16). Clemson received three first-place votes, but dropped one spot from the previous three weeks. Virginia Tech remained at No. 13, and Miami remained at No. 21 following a win over Toledo. Duke (61), NC State (10) and Syracuse (2) also received votes in the poll.
- Boston College returned to the AP Top 25 Poll for the first time since 2008 at No. 23. The last time Boston College was ranked in the AP Top 25 was Nov. 30, 2008 when the Eagles were ranked 18th nationally. BC is also ranked No. 25 in this week’s Amway Coaches Top 25.

NATIONAL RECOGNITION

- Boston College senior defensive end Wyatt Ray was named The Walter Camp Football Foundation National Defensive Player of the Week following his performance against Wake Forest. Ray set a school single-game record with four sacks as BC earned a 41-34 victory over the Demon Deacons. Ray also recorded a career-best eight tackles and had one quarterback hurry as the Eagles’ improved to 3-0, their best start to a season since 2007. Ray leads the country with 1.67 sacks per game.
- Boston College quarterback Anthony Brown was named a Manning Award Star of the Week and is part of the Davey O’Brien Award Great 8 list after throwing for a career-high 304 yards and five touchdowns in last week’s win at Wake Forest.

- Miami QB Malik Rosier joins Brown as a Manning Award Star of the Week after completing 13 of 23 pass attempts for 205 yards, and two touchdowns in the win over Toledo. He also rushed for 80 yards and three touchdowns.
