# **OPENING KICK**

# **UVA HEADS TO THE TRIANGLE ON SATURDAY**

 Virginia returns to the road for an ACC matchup at NC State. It is UVA's first contest with the Wolfpack since invading Carter-Finley Stadium in 2012, a 33-6 Cavalier victory. • The game will air on Raycom Sports, which is on the CW (WVIR-D2) in Charlottesville.

#### **FIVE TOP STORYLINES**

- $\bullet$  Virginia and  $\overline{\text{NC}}$  State are meeting for the 58th time in a series that began in 1904, but are meeting for only the fifth time over the last 15 seasons.
- Virginia makes the trip to Raleigh for the first time since 2012 and only the third time since the 2003 meeting.
- UVA is coming off an ACC win over Louisville, 27-3, marking the first time the Cavaliers have held an ACC team without a touchdown since winning at Maryland, 20-9, on Oct. 17, 2009. It was also the first time Louisville was held without a touchdown in the regular season since 2010 against Pitt.
- OLB Charles Snowden led UVA with eight tackles, two pass breakups, an interception, recovered a fumble and notched one sack to help UVA limit the Louisville offense to just 214 yards of total offense.
- QB **Bryce Perkins** is one of eight FBS quarterbacks since 2000 to record 800+ passing yards, 300+ rushing yards, 9+ passing touchdowns and 3+ rushing touchdowns through the first four games of the season. A complete list is on page six.

# VIRGINIA FACTS

# UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

# UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT
The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

The first documented Cavalier on horseback was Francis Bell, a Virginia student from Dublin, Va., in 1947. Bell rode onto the field dressed as Cavaliers for Virginia's home football game with Harvard on the afternoon of October 11.

The Cavalier on horseback returned as the University's mascot in 1963. The UVA Polo Club provided both the horse and rider. However, the mounted Cavalier and his horse parted company in 1974 with the inception of AstroTurf at Scott Stadium.

The mounted Cavalier made its return in the Florida Citrus Bowl at the end of the 1989 football season. Due to its instant popularity, the Cavalier on horseback returned the following season on a regular basis and continues to lead the Virginia football team onto the field at the beginning of all home games.

# UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

#### WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wahhoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

# **VIRGINIA VS. NC STATE**

- Virginia trails the all-time series with NC State, 22-34-1, including a 9-16 mark in Raleigh. The teams are meeting for only the fourth time in Raleigh since a 2003 showdown between current NFL signal callers Matt Schaub and Phillip Rivers.
- Saturday's meeting is the first in the series since UVA's 33-6 triumph in 2012 at Carter-Finley Stadium
- Sixteen of Virginia's 22 series wins have occurred since 1983; UVA is 16-9 since then. Nine of the last 15 games have been decided by 10 points or fewer, including the 2007 meeting in Raleigh a five-point Wolfpack win.

# A BATTLE TO THE FINISH

- Nine of the last 15 meetings between Virginia and NC State have gone down to the wire featuring amazing comebacks and nail-biting finishes on both sides.
- •Trailing by five with the ball in 2007, Virginia had a chance but Willie Young sacked backup quarterback Peter Lalich on fourth down to seal it with 17 seconds left.
- Jason Snelling scored on a 17-yard run with 1:31 to play to lift UVA to a 14-7 win in 2006 at Scott Stadium.
- •The 2003 match-up featured two NFL quarterbacks— Virginia's Matt Schaub and Philip Rivers from NC State in a game that saw four ties and five lead changes before the Wolfpack pulled out a 51-37 win.
- Cornerback Jamaine Winborne batted away a ball intended for Bryan Peterson in the end zone to preserve UVA's 14-9 win in 2002.
- Virginia won three straight from 1998-2000 and every win was sparked by a second half comeback.
- The Cavaliers used a 14-point second half outburst in 1998 to win 23-13 at home.
- The following year UVA erupted for 30 points in the third quarter to break open a tight ballgame (19-10 at halftime) and win 47-26 in 1999.
- Fullback Tyree Foreman broke loose for a 38-yard touchdown run with 9:49 remaining to provide the winning points in UVA's 24-17 triumph in 2000.

# **VIRGINIA - NC STATE CONNECTIONS**

- NC State assistant head coach for defense and cornerbacks coach George Barlow was an assistant head coach and defensive back coach at New Mexico in 2009 and 2010, facing Bronco Mendenhall's BYU teams.
   BYU topped New Mexico in both the 2009 and 2010 meetings.
- NC State tight ends and fullbacks coach Eddie Faulkner was the tight ends coach at Wisconsin in 2012 when current UVA graduate assistant coach Drew Meyer was a freshman punter.

# **2018 VIRGINIA FOOTBALL**

#### **STRANGE GAME BACK IN '44**

- •The 1944 meeting between these two teams, played in Norfolk, ranks as one of the strangest games in college football history.
- •The Wolfpack pulled out a 13-0 win in a driving rainstorm by recovering two UVA fumbles in the end zone for touchdowns.
- While that is remarkable in itself, the Wolfpack failed to make a first down and had just 10 yards of total offense, an NCAA record for fewest yards gained by a winning team and one of only two games in Bowl Subdivision history where the winning team failed to make a first down.

#### **SLOWING STATE'S GROUND GAME**

- •The Cavaliers' ability to contain the NC State rushing attack has been one of the factors enabling them to win eight of the last 12 games against the Wolfpack.
- Virginia has won all 11 meetings against the Wolfpack going back to World War II when holding them to fewer than 100 yards rushing.
- •The only time in the modern day history of the series (since 1937), NC State won when rushing for fewer than 100 yards occurred in 1944 when the Wolfpack gained just 10 yards and won one of the oddest games in college football history. That game is the only time in series history the Wolfpack rushed for fewer than 110 yards and still won.
- Conversely, NC State has won 17 of the 18 games since 1937 when rushing for at least 200 yards. (The only time NC State rushed for at least 200 yards and failed to win occurred in 1998 as State gained 211 yards in a 23-13 loss).

#### **GRINDING OUT THE YARDS**

- Virginia has had at least one 100-yard rusher in nine of the last 16 games against NC State and has gained at least 200 yards rushing in 11 of the last 18 games against the Wolfpack.
- When outrushing the Wolfpack, Virginia is 17-8 since 1944.
- •The team with the most rushing yards has won 11 of the last 13 meetings and 43 of 52 games since 1944. At one point the team with the most rushing yards won 18 consecutive games between 1963-82.
- In their last eight wins over NC State going back to 1995, the Cavaliers have averaged 204.9 yards rushing per game.
- On the other hand, the Wolfpack has gained more than 200 yards only twice since 1981 (1997, '98).



TB Kevin Parks rushed for 115 yards and one touchdown in UVA's 33-6 win over NC State the last time the two teams met in 2012 at Carter-Finley Stadium.

# **Last Meeting**

When Virginia wasn't taking the ball from Mike Glennon, the Cavaliers were throwing him to the turf.

Their defense forced five turnovers and six sacks in a 33-6 rout of North Carolina State the last time these two teams met.

Phillip Sims ran for one touchdown and threw for another, and Kevin Parks rushed for 115 yards and a late 31-yard touchdown for the Cavaliers.

The defense held N.C. State to 19 yards rushing with three interceptions, two fumble recoveries and a safety. It sacked Glennon five times and his backup once.

And not to be outdone, the offense rolled up 446 total yards. Sims was 8 of 10 for 115 yards with a 38-yard touchdown pass to Tim Smith and a 1-yard TD run that started the scoring for Virginia. Backup Michael Rocco added an 18-yard touchdown pass to Darius Jennings.

- Since 2000 only eight FBS quarterbacks have 800+ passing yards, 300+ rushing yards, 9+ passing touchdowns and 3+ rushing touchdowns through the first four games of the season. UVA's Bryce Perkins is one of those players.
- $\bullet$  This is the third year in a row that a quarterback has accomplished this feat and all of them belong to the ACC.

# VIRGINIA DEFENSE HAS STARTED THE 2018 SEASON STRONG

- •The Virginia defense has kept its first four opponents under 400 yards of total offense, yielding 225 to Richmond, 387 to Indiana, 364 to Ohio and 214 to Louisville.
- The last time UVA held its first four opponents of the season to less than 400 yards of total offense was 2009 when they opened the year with William & Mary (309), TCU (380), Southern Miss (344) and North Carolina (174).

# **UVA STIFLES THE LOUISVILLE OFFENSE**

- UVA held the Louisville Cardinals to 214 yards of total offense in each team's ACC opener on Sept. 22.
- The 214 yards of total offense are the fewest UVA has allowed to an ACC opponent since allowing 199 at Pitt in 2013.

# HIGHLIGHTS IN ACC WIN OVER LOUISVILLE

- UVA held Louisville without a touchdown for only the second time in Bobby Petrino's Louisville tenure.
- The last time Louisville was held without a touchdown in the regular season was on Oct. 30, 2010 against Pitt, when both teams were still in the Big East.
- It was was the first time since 2009 that UVA held an ACC opponent without a touchdown. The last time was at Maryland when UVA won 20-9 on Oct. 17, 2009.
- It was also the second time this season that UVA held an opponent without an offensive touchdown. UVA also kept the Richmond offense out of the end zone.
- UVA kept Louisville from scoring in the first half, marking the second time this season UVA has kept an opponent scoreless in a half. The Cavaliers did not let Indiana score in the second half.
- Hunter Pearson became the ninth true freshman to see time for UVA in 2018, coming on to connect on a 28-yard and 24-yard field goal attempts. He was a perfect 2-of-2 on field goals and 3-of-3 on PATs.

# "ZZ STOP" COMES UP BIG ON GOAL-LINE STAND AGAINST CARDINALS

- ILB Zane Zandier finished with eight tackles against Louisville, tying him for the team lead with Charles Snowden.
- No tackles were bigger for Zandier then the three he made on three consecutive rushes by Louisville during UVA's big goal-line stand in the third quarter.
- UL started the drive from the UVA three-yard line after a tipped Bryce Perkins pass by his own receiver led to a Louisville interception return to the UVA three.
- On three straight rushing plays, Zandier made two solo tackles and one assisted in forcing Louisville to attempt a 20-yard field goal for its only points of the day.

#### **2018 VIRGINIA FOOTBALL**

#### **TOUCHDOWNS COMING AT A DISTANCE**

- Of UVA's 17 offensive touchdowns in 2018, 10 of them have been scored from 20+ yards out. Of those 10 touchdowns of 20+ yards, six have gone for 35 yards or more.
- Byrce Perkins' 86-yard touchdown pass to Olamide Zaccheaus vs. Ohio is the longest scoring strike of the season for the Cavaliers and the 10th longest in UVA history
- Jordan Ellis' 75-yard rushing touchdown against the Ohio is the second-longest scoring play of the season.
- UVA had three offensive touchdowns against Ohio that went for 75 yards or more, including Zaccheaus' 77-yard touchdown reception against Ohio.

# CAVALIERS STRONG ON THIRD DOWN THROUGH THREE GAMES

- •Through three games, Virginia has done well when its faced a third down situation of 10 yards or less. UVA is 30-of-45 (66.7) on third downs where it needs 10 yards or fewer for a first down.
- UVA is 19-of-22 (86.4) on third downs where it needs five yards or fewer for a first down.
- Overall, UVA is 32-of-58 (55.2 percent) on third downs, which is No. 2 in the ACC and No. 9 nationally.

#### ONE-PLAY SCORING DRIVES ARE BOUNTIFUL VS. OHIO

- For the first time in program history, UVA had three one-play scoring drives in one game.
- UVA scored on a Jordan Ellis 18-yard touchdown rush, an 86-yard Olamide Zaccheaus receiving touchdown and a 75-yard Ellis rushing touchdown.
- Only once before had UVA had multiple one-play scoring drives in the same game, which came against Navy in 1990. Those plays went for 55 and 54 yards.
- Zaccheaus' 86-yard touchdown reception is the fourth-longest one-play scoring drive. Ellis' 75-yard rushing touchdown is tied for No. 7 all-time among UVA's one-play scoring drives. Another 75-yard score against Clemson in 1989 shares the spot, which was a Herman Moore receiving touchdown from Matt Blundin.

#### **UVA COLLECTING EXPOLSIVE PLAYS IN 2018**

- UVA has three plays from scrimmage in 2018 that have gone for 75 yards or more, all touchdowns and all came against Ohio.
- Only the 1995 UVA team had as many plays from scrimmage go for 75 yards or more. All three of their plays also went for touchdowns.
- In 1995 Mike Groh found Demetrius "Pete" Allen in the Duke game for 82 yards. Groh later found Patrick Jeffers for 76 yards against Clemson. Tiki Barber rushed for an 81-yard touchdown against Michigan.
- Only the 1983, 2015 and 2016 teams had at least two in the same season.

# RECORD-SETTING DAY FOR ZACCHEAUS AGAINST OHIO

- HB Olamide Zaccheaus helped UVA with a key non-conference win over the Ohio Bobcats in Nashville.
  Zaccheaus set a UVA single-game record with 247 receiving yards, breaking a 44-year old record by Ken
- Shelton who had 241 receiving yards against William & Mary.

   Zaccheaus' 247 receiving yards ties him with Randy Marriott of UNC (1987) for No. 10 on the ACC's all-time ledger of single-game receiving yards.
- Zaccheaus scored on scoring strikes from Bryce Perkins of 86 and 77 yards, which is the only time in program history that a team, let alone one player, recorded multiple receptions of 75 yards or more in the same game.
- Zaccheaus was the only player in program history to record multiple receptions of 80 yards or more. He now has three, two of which have come against MAC schools. Zaccheaus had an 82-yard receiving touchdown against Central Michigan in 2016 and an 81-yard touchdown reception at North Carolina in 2017.

# **CAVALIERS HAVE BIG FIRST HALF AGAINST OHIO**

- The Cavaliers scored 38 points in the first half against Ohio, which is the fourth-most points scored in a half in program history.
- It ties the 38 points, also scored in the first half, the Cavaliers scored against Duke in 1990.

# **BIG NUMBERS FOR ELLIS, PERKINS AND ZACCHEAUS**

- In the win over Ohio, UVA had a quarterback (Perkins, 379), throw for 300+ yards, a running back (Ellis, 171) rush for 100+ yards and a receiver (Zaccheaus, 247) record 100+ receiving yards for the first time since the 2011 Maryland game.
- In the 2011 Maryland game Michael Rocco passed for 307 yards, Perry Jones rushed for 139 yards, while Kris Burd (112) and Tim Smith (101) each recorded over 100 yards receiving.

# PERKINS SHOWCASES PASSING GAME AGAINST OHIO

- QB Bryce Perkins threw for a career-high 379 yards on 20-of-25 passing against the Ohio Bobcats. He became the 20th different Cavalier to pass for at least 300 yards in a game.
- His 379 yards are the sixth-most passing yards all-time in a game by a Cavalier.
- At one point Perkins completed 15 passes in a row against the Bobcats, which ranks No. 2 all-time at UVA for most completed passes in a row in a game. It also ties Shawn Moore for No. 2 all-time for career consecutive completions, who completed 15 passes over two games in 1989.
- Michael Rocco owns the record for most completions in a row with 18, doing so against Miami in 2012.

# PERKINS CREATED MORE UVA FIRSTS AT INDIANA

- QB Bryce Perkins rushed for 123 yards at Indiana to become the first UVA quarterback to rush for 100+ yards in multiple games in a season since Bill Dudley did it four times in 1941.
- Perkins is also the first Cavalier in program history to rush for 100+ yards in each of his first two career games. Perkins also rushed for 108 yards in his UVA debut against Richmond on Sept. 1.
- The only Cavalier to become relatively close to the feat was Gary Helman who rushed for 100+ yards in two of his first three career games in 1969. He rushed for only 40 yards in his collegiate debut against Clemson, but followed up in career game No. 2 with 158 rushing yards against Duke. Then Helman rushed for 148 yards in career game No. 3 against William & Mary.

#### **ZACCHEAUS PASSES 3,000 CAREER ALL-PURPOSE YARDS**

- With 247 all-purpose yards against Ohio, Olamide Zaccheaus became the 19th Cavalier all-time to reach 3,000 career all-purpose yards.
- He is the fifth Cavalier to pass the 3,000 all-purpose yard mark since 2012.
- Since the 2012 season Perry Jones, Kevin Parks, Darius Jennings and Taquan Mizzell all crossed 3,000 career all-purpose yards.
- Zaccheaus is just outside UVA's career Top 15 list with 3,258 all-purpose list.
- Zaccheaus needs 16 all-purpose yards to tie Jerrod Washington for No. 15 all-time at UVA

#### BRONCO MENDENHALL IS IN SPECIAL COMPANY

- Bronco Mendenhall is one of three active coaches that has inherited at least two programs in his career that were coming off a losing season and in year one, or year two, played in a bowl game. The others to do it are Nick Saban (Alabama, LSU, Michigan State) and Mark Dantonio (Michigan State/Cincinnati).
- Mendenhall inherited a BYU team that went 5-6 in 2004 and in his first season the Cougars went 6-6 and played in the 2005 Las Vegas Bowl. Mendenhall took over a Virginia team that went 4-8 in 2015 and took the Cavaliers to the 2017 Military Bowl in year No. 2, finishing 6-7.

#### A PROGRAM FIRST AGAINST RICHMOND

- For the first time in program history, UVA had a quarterback run for at least 100 yards, a second player rush for at least 100 yards and a receiver collect at least 100 receiving yards in a game. Against Richmond QB Bryce Perkins rushed for 108 yards, TB Jordan Ellis rushed for 146 yards and HB Olamide Zaccheaus recorded 101 receiving yards.
- •Twice before UVA had a quarterback rush for a 100+ yards, while another Cavalier also rushed for 100+ yards: 1967 vs. Buffalo (Frank Quayle, 151 and QB Gene Arnette, 119); 1975 vs. Maryland (QB Scott Gardner, 120 and Billy Copeland, 100).

# THORNHILL ALL OVER THE PLACE AT INDIANA

- SS Juan Thornhill helped UVA hold Indiana scoreless in the second half.
- •Thornhill blocked a IU PAT and returned it for a defensive two-point score. It was the first time UVA scored defensive extra points since Joe Crocker did so against NC State in 1994. Crocker's points came off an interception of a two-point conversion.
- Thornhill also intercepted the eighth pass of his career in the game and added seven tackles.
- Thornhill earned ACC Defensive Back of the Week for his efforts.

#### TRUE FRESHMAN STARTING ON THE DEFENSIVE LINE

• Against Richmond, NT Jordan Redmond became the first UVA true freshman to start a season opener on the defensive line since 2002 when DE Kwakou Robinson started against Colorado State. He is only the fourth UVA freshman (true or redshirt) since 1986 to start a season opener on the defensive line. The others are DE Matt Conrath (RS-Fr., 2008 vs. USC) and NT Tim O'Conner (RS-Fr., 1986 vs. South Carolina).

# TWELVE CAVALIERS MAKE COLLEGIATE DEBUT IN SEASON-OPENING WIN

• UVA had 12 collegiate debuts against Richmond. QB Brennan Armstrong\*\*, DT Tommy Christ, DT Aaron Faumui\*\*, OT Bobby Haskins\*\*, WR Tavares Kelly\*\*, HB Billy Kemp\*\*, OT Ryan Nelson, WR Ugo Obasi\*\*, NT Jordan Redmond\*\*, ILB Robert Snyder, OT Ryan Swoboda, OLB Noah Taylor\*\*. \*\*-denotes true freshman

# PERKINS SHINES IN VIRGINIA DEBUT

- QB Bryce Perkins made his UVA and FBS debut against Richmond in the season opener.
- He finished with 108 rushing yards, 185 passing yards and accounted for four touchdowns (two rushing, two passing).
- With two rushing touchdowns, Perkins became the first UVA quarterback to rush for two touchdowns in a game since Jameel Sewell at Southern Mississippi in 2009.
- Perkins finished with 108 rushing yards, becoming the first UVA quarterback to rush for at least 100 yards in a game since Sewell (104) did so against Virginia Tech in 2009.
- Perkins finished with 185 passing yards, giving him the 10th most by a UVA quarterback starting his first game.
- Perkins' 36-yard rushing touchdown in the first quarter against Richmond was the longest rush by a UVA quarterback since Matt Johns' 42-yard rush against Kent State in 2014. Perkins followed that up with his career long rush of 47 yards at Indiana.

# FIRST CAREER STARTS AGAINST RICHMOND

• LT Ryan Nelson, QB Bryce Perkins, NT Jordan Redmond, OLB Charles Snowden and CB Darrius Bratton all made their first collegiate starts against Richmond in the season opener.

#### VIRGINIA RUSHING GAME SPRINTS IN OPENER

- Virginia rushed for 301 yards against Richmond in the season opener, the most rushing yards so far in the Bronco Mendenhall era.
- It was the first time the Cavaliers rushed over 200 yards since tallying 262 against Virginia Tech in 2015 and the first time reaching 300 rushing yards in a game since putting up 357 rushing yards against VMI in 2013.

# ARMSTRONG SEES TIME IN SEASON OPENER

- QB Brennan Armstrong made his collegiate debut against Richmond in the fourth quarter.
- Armstrong is the first UVA true freshman to play quarterback in a season opener since David Watford came off the bench against William & Mary in the 2011 opener.
- Armstrong enrolled early and took part of spring practice this year (like Watford in 2011).

#### **UVA HAS THIRD-MOST UNDERCLASSMEN IN THE NATION**

- UVA has the third-most underclassmen on its roster in the nation with 88.
- UVA ranks No. 4 in the nation with 71 percent of its roster being underclassmen.
- UVA has 26 sophomores, 18 redshirt freshmen and 44 freshmen on its roster of 123.

#### JOE REED IS A THREAT ON KICK RETURN

- In 2017, wide receiver Joe Reed returned 29 kicks in 2017 for 861 yards (29.7 yards per return), which was No. 1 in the ACC and No. 8 nationally.
- Reed had eight returns of 30 yards or more. That is the most by a Cavalier since Cedric Peerman returned nine kicks in 2005 for 30 yards or more.
- With only 56 kick returns to his career resume, Reed already ranks No. 4 all-time at UVA in career kick return yards with 1,539.
- Reed's 861 kick return yards in 2017 are the second most in a season by a Cavalier, trailing only Khalek Shepherd's single-season program record of 929 in 2012.
- Reed's best game this season was against Georgia Tech when he had a career-high 170 return yards and the program's eighth-longest return which went 92 yards for a touchdown
- Reed's 25.1 yards per kick return average was No. 3 in the ACC and No. 21 in the nation in 2016.

#### **COLEMAN A PROVEN COMMODITY IN THE PUNT GAME**

- Senior Lester Coleman returns to the fold in 2018 after earning second-team All-ACC honors as a punter.
- Coleman finished 2017 No. 4 in the ACC with a 43.7 punting average. He led the ACC with 23 punts of 50 yards or more and was No. 2 in the ACC, No. 7 nationally, with 29 punts inside the 20. Also, 16 of his 29 punts inside the 20 were downed inside the 10-yard line. Coleman also set a UVA single-season record with six punts of 60 yards or more.
- Coleman sat his first three years on Grounds before making his collegiate debut in the 2017 season opener against William & Mary. He sat the 2015 and 2016 seasons behind former first-team All-ACC punter Nicholas Conte.
- Coleman did not punt in high school until his senior season. He had played defensive line and receiver at Woodberry Forest. His high school needed a punter and because Lester's older brother, James, had walked on to UVA as a punter in 2012, Lester was asked to punt without any experience. Lester's brother, James, redshirted at UVA in 2012 and punted two times over three seasons (2013-15) before using his fifth year to be the starting punter at Western Michigan in 2016.
- Lester Coleman averaged 52.3 yards per punt over his seven punts against Boston College (Oct. 21) to break the single-game UVA punting record.
- The previous record belonged to Ryan Weigand, who averaged 51.6 yards per punt at Wyoming in 2007.

#### **PLAYERS EARN THEIR NUMBERS**

- On the night of Saturday, Aug. 11, inside the locker room at Scott Stadium, 41 players earned their numbers in a special ceremony.
- On the night of Sat., Aug. 18, another 20 Cavaliers selected their numbers, including five first years.
- •Throughout the season players that earn their numbers will have the opportunity to make a selection on Thursdays after practice.
- To date, 88 Cavaliers have earned numbers.

#### **ZACCHEAUS IS A BIG OFFENSIVE WEAPON**

- Senior Olamide Zaccheaus returns for his fourth season with Virginia. The HB led UVA with 895 receiving yards and a UVA single-season record 85 receptions. He added five touchdowns.
- Zaccheaus is the only UVA receiver in program history to record multiple receptions of 80 yards or more and he has three on his career resume. Zaccheaus notched an 82-yard touchdown against Central Michigan in 2016. He then scored on an 81-yard touchdown strike at North Carolian in 2017. Against Ohio this season Zaccheaus scored on an 86-yard touchdown strike.
- · Olamide is Nigerian for "the blessing has come."

- HB Olamide Zaccheaus has a reception in 33 straight games, which is tied for the second-longest active streak in the nation.

#### **BRYCE PERKINS NOTES**

# IT IS A PERK TO HAVE A NEW QB ON THE BLOCK

- QB Bryce Perkins made his first career FBS start at quarterback against Richmond in the season opener.
- Perkins transferred to UVA last January from Arizona Western Community College after leading the Matadors to the 2017 NJCAA Championship game, before falling 31-28 to East Mississippi.
- Perkins originally signed as a top recruit with hometown Arizona State, but never saw action during his two seasons in Tempe. He redshirted the 2015 season and missed the 2016 season with an injury.
- Perkins' father, Bruce, lettered at Arizona State in 1988 and 1989 as a full-back and later played briefly in the NFL. Perkins' older brother, Paul, was a three-year letterwinner at running back with the UCLA Bruins and currently plays with the New York Giants. Perkins' uncle, Don Perkins, played eight seasons in the NFL with the Cowboys.
- Perkins, who passed for 1,311 yards and rushed for 353 yards (5.1 avg.) at Arizona Western in 2017, is replacing Kurt Benkert as UVA's quarterback in 2018. Benkert set UVA's single-season passing mark (3,207) and total offense (3,144) record in 2017.

#### PERKINS IS UVA'S STARTING QUARTERBACK

- Bryce Perkins, a transfer from Arizona Western Community College, became (vs. Richmond) just the second Cavalier quarterback to start his UVA debut since 1977 when Bryan Shumock started the season opener against NC State. Shumock switched to defensive back for the 1978 season and led UVA with four interceptions.
- Former UVA quarter bak Kurt Benkert also started his UVA debut against Richmond in 2016.
- Perkins was the 12th different UVA starting quarterback to start an opener in the last 14 seasons. The list includes: Kurt Benkert (2016-17), Matt Johns (2015), Greyson Lambert (2014), David Watford (2013), Michael Rocco (2011-12), Marc Verica (2010), Vic Hall (2009), Peter Lalich (2008), Jameel Sewell (2007), Christian Olsen (2006) and Marques Hagans (2005).

# **UVA QUARTERBACKS IN THEIR FIRST-CAREER START**

- QB Bryce Perkins, a transfer from Arizona Western Community College, made his first collegiate start for the Cavaliers against Richmond (Sept. 1) in the season opener.

# SCOTT STADIUM, HOME OF THE CAVALIERS

The Carl Smith Center, home of David A. Harrison III Field at Scott Stadium, with its unique architectural design, scenic setting on the University's Grounds and exceptional sight lines, is one of the nation's finest college football settings.

Opened in 1931, Scott Stadium might be one of the oldest campus college football stadiums in the nation, but you could never tell from its appearance. Numerous upgrades and expansions make it a modern home for the Cavaliers and their fans.

Scott Stadium was the gift of Frederic William Scott and Elisabeth Strother Scott, and was dedicated to the memory of his parents, Frederic Robert Scott and Frances Branch Scott.

Virginia played its dedication game at Scott Stadium on Oct. 15, 1931 against the Virginia Military Institute before a then-capacity crowd of 22,000. Prior to that season, the Cavaliers staged their home games at the University's Lambeth Field. Virginia has played 466 games in the historic venue. UVA's all-time record at Scott Stadium stands at 262-192-12.

# **Bronco Mendenhall** Head Coach • Third Season

Bronco Mendenhall is in his third season as Virginia's head football coach after being named the program's 40th head coach on Dec. 4, 2015.

In Mendenhall's second season on Grounds in 2017 he directed UVA to its first bowl game since 2011. He oversaw a defense that ranked No. 7 in the nation and No. 2 in the ACC against the pass (165.8). The group was headed by three-time first-team All-ACC player Quin Blanding, ACC Defensive Rookie of the Year Brenton Nelson and third-team All-ACC cornerback Juan Thornhill. Blanding finished his illustrious career with more All-America honors and as UVA's all-time record holder with 495 career tackles. The 495 career tackles rank tied for No. 6 all-time

in ACC history and are the most by any ACC defensive back. Blanding finished each of his four seasons No. 2 in the ACC in tackles. Inside linebacker Micah Kiser was named the Campbell Trophy winner (Academic Heisman) and led the ACC in tackles for the third year in a row. Only Boston College's Luke Kuechly (2009-11) had previously accomplished the feat in league history. Kiser was also a three-time first-team All-ACC honoree and received multiple All-America honors over the 2016 and 2017 seasons, including becoming the first Cavalier since Tiki Barber in 1996 to earn both academic and athletic All-America honors in the same season when he was a second-team CoSIDA Acdemic All-American in 2016.

Mendenhall saw the conclusion of quarterback Kurt Benkert's collegiate career in 2017. Mendenhall saw the conclusion of quarterback Kurt Benkert's collegiate career in 2017. The UVA quarterback became the first player in program history to throw for over 3,000 yards in a season. Benkert finished 2017 with 3,207 passing yards and a single-season program record 298 completions. Benkert's 25 passing touchdowns in 2017 rank No. 2 all-time at UVA for a season. The starting quarterback for each of Mendenhall's first two seasons at Virginia, Benkert leaves No. 3 all-time at UVA in career passing yards (5,759) and passing touchdowns (46), which came in 24 career games for the Cavaliers.

In Mendenhall's first season on Grounds he oversaw a secondary that boasted first-team

In Mendenhall's first season on Grounds he oversaw a secondary that boasted first-tean All-ACC honoree and All-American, Quin Blanding. Blanding finished the season No. 2 in the ACC in tackles for the third year in a row with 120 stops. Inside linebacker Micah Kiser, an All-American and first-team All-ACC honoree, thrived to lead the ACC in tackles for the second year in a row with 134, which is tied with former Cavalier great Wali Rainer for fourth-most in a single season in program history. Kiser was also a second-team CoSIDA Academic All-American, becoming the first Cavalier since Tiki Barber in 1996 to earn both academic and athletic All-America honors in the same season.

Offensively, in Mendenhall's first season, Taquan Mizzell became the first player in

ACC history to record at least 1,500 career rushing and 1,500 career receiving yards. UVA quarterback Kurt Benkert set a couple of passing marks in UVA's new offense, including a program record for passing yards in a game with 421 against Central Michigan, which was only the second time in program history a UVA quarterback surpassed 400 passing yards in a game. Benkert reached 1,000 passing yards in four games and 2,000 passing yards in eight games, setting a program

record for fastest to that standard in a season.

Mendenhall came to Charlottesville after 11 years as the head coach at Brigham Young University. In his 11 seasons, from 2005-2015, Mendenhall compiled an overall record of 99-43 at BYU to rank 12th in total wins among all FBS teams during that time.

In the three seasons prior to Mendenhall becoming the head coach at BYU, the Cougars compiled an overall record of 14-21. Over Mendenhall's 11 years at BYU, the Cougars were one of only 11 programs to advance to a bowl game each season (includes the 2015 season). BYU joined by Alabama, Boise State, Clemson, Florida State, Georgia, LSU, Oklahoma, Oregon, Virginia Tech and Wisconsin on that list.

Among those 11 teams, only Florida State has achieved more bowl

wins (seven) than BYU's six bowl game victories.

The success of Mendenhall's leadership approach in running the BYU football program was highlighted in a management book, Running Into the Wind: Bronco Mendenhall — 5 Strategies for Building a Successful Team, written by Alyson Von Feldt and Paul Gustavson, a leading management consultant specializing in leadership development and organizational design.

Mendenhall was elected in 2013 to the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees as the District 8 Representative and also serves on the AFCA Ethics Committee.

- Junior defensive lineman Cassius Peat is the son of Todd Peat, who played six seasons in the NFL with the Cardinals and Raiders as an offensive guard. His older brother, Andrus, was an All-American at Stanford and a former first round draft pick by the Saints (2015).
- Walk-on second year Tristan Hillerich is one of four boys. His parents, Brent and Colleen, are proud parents of two sets of twins. Tristan has a twin brother, Bart, while the pair has a younger set of twin brothers, Quinn and Grady.
- Virginia has five players on its roster who are the sons of former Cavalier football players. Joey Blount (Tony Blount), Germane Crowell (Germane Crowell, Sr.), Tucker Finkelston (Tim Finkelston), Mikey McDonald (Geoff McDonald) and Andrew Yavinsky (Marc Yavinsky).
- WR Chuck Davis won \$100,000 playing the Virginia Lottery in June 2017. He spent \$1 for a Cash 5 game ticket at a 7-Eleven in Ashburn, Va. He used the numbers on his grandmother's license plate on the car he drove to the market.
- DB Donovan Rolle participated in the 2011 and 2013 Scripps National Spelling Bee.
- S Vinnie Vladic's father, Larry Vladic, was college football teammates at Oregon State with UVA head coach Bronco Mendenhall in 1986 and 1987.
- Walk-on first year S Cole Lytle has a twin brother, Adam, who is a walk-on freshman on the Virginia Tech football team. Lytle's older sister, Ashley, is a UVA alum, while his older brother, Dean, currently attends Virginia Tech.

#### GAME 1 • UVA 42, Richmond 13 Sept. 1 • Charlottesville, Va.

#### **Game Notes**

- With the start, NT Jordan Redmond becomes the first true freshman to start a season opener on the defensive line for UVA since 2002 when DE Kwakou Robinson started against Colorado State. He is only the fourth UVA freshman (true or redshirt) since 1986 to start a season opener on the defensive line. The others are DE Matt Conrath (RS-Fr., 2008 vs. USC) and NT Tim O'Conner (RS-Fr., 1986 vs. South Carolina).
- Bryce Perkins' 36-yard rushing touchdown in the first quarter was the longest rush by a UVA quarterback since Matt Johns' 42-yard rush against Kent State in 2014.
- With two rushing touchdowns, Bryce Perkins became the first UVA quarterback to rush for two touchdowns in a game since Jameel Sewell at Southern Miss in 2009.
- Perkins finished with 108 rushing yards, becoming the first UVA quarterback to rush for at least 100 yards in a game since Jameel Sewell (104) did so against Virginia Tech in 2009.
- Perkins became only the 13th Cavalier quarterback to rush for at least 100 yards in a game.
- Perkins finished with 185 passing yards, giving him the xx most by a UVA quarterback starting his first game.
- With a career-high 146 rushing yards, Jordan Ellis became the 43rd player in program history to reach 1,000 career rushing yards.
- Ellis rushed for at least 100 yards for the second time in his career. He rushed for 136 yards at North Carolina in 2017.
- With both Perkins (108) and Ellis (146) rushing for over 100 yards, the duo becomes the 29th Cavaliers to do so in the same game. The last UVA to each rush for at least 100 yards in a game was Daniel Hamm (136) and Kevin Parks (135) in 2013 against VMI.
- With six catches, Olamide Zaccheaus has now recorded a reception in 30-straight games.
- Zaccheaus finished with 101 receiving yards, his fourth career game over 100 receiving yards
- With 101 receiving yards, Zaccheaus passed Heath Miller (1,703) and Patrick Jeffers (1,785) into seventh on UVA's all-time receiving yards list.
- With six receptions, Zaccheaus passed Kris Burd (162) for No. 3 all-time at UVA in career receptions.
- With Ryan Nelson's start at left tackle, UVA has now started a redshirt freshman at left tackle in a season opener two years in a row. In 2017, Dillon Reinkensmeyer started at left tackle against William & Mary.
- DE Mandy Alonso's sack in the second quarter is the first solo sack of his career. He shared a sack at Miami in 2017.
- In the second quarter, WR Chuck Davis returned the first punt of his career (-1).

# GAME 3 • UVA 45, Ohio 31 Sept. 15 • Nashville, Tenn.

#### **Game Notes**

- Due to the Commonwealth of Virginia being under a state of emergency due to Hurricane Florence, UVA's home game with Ohio was moved to Nashville, Tenn., and Vanderbilt Stadium
- UVA played its first game in Nashville since the 2005 Music City Bowl.
- UVA scored 40+ points in a game for the second time in 2018.
- Finishing with 552 total yards of offense, UVA surpassed 500 yards of total offense for the first time since tallying 626 yards of total offense last season against UConn.
- UVA is 2-0 all-time in neutral site games in Nashville.
- UVA is 2-0 all-time against Ohio.
- Virginia scored 38 points in the first half, which is the most the Cavaliers have scored in a half since scoring 38 in the first half against Duke in 1990. It also is tied with that Duke game for the fourth-most points scored in a half in UVA history.
- Virginia scored on its opening possession for the second game in a row.
- UVA had three one-play scoring drives in the first quarter.
- The three one-play scoring drives are the most for a game in program history, surpassing the 1990 Navy game when it had two.
- Olamide Zaccehaus' 86-yard touchdown reception is the fourth-longest one-play scoring drive in program history.
- QB Bryce Perkins threw for a career-high 379 passing yards.
- Perkins is the 20th different UVA quarterback to throw for at least 300 yards in a game.
- Zaccheaus's 86-yard touchdown reception in the first quarter was a career long and his third reception of 80 yards or more, which extends his UVA record.
- Zaccheaus finished with a career-high 247 receiving yards, which is his second game of the season with 100+ receiving yards and the fifth of his career.
- The 247 receiving yards by Zaccheaus is a single-game UVA record for receiving yards in a game. The previous record was 241 receiving yards by Ken Shelton in 1974 against William & Mary.
- •TB Jordan Ellis rushed for three touchdowns, the first time a Cavalier has done that since Kevin Parks against William & Mary in 2011.
- Ellis finished with a career-high 171 rushing yards, his second game this season and third of his career with 100 or more rushing yards.
