Game Storylines

• Another crucial Coastal Division encounter is in store for the Panthers when they play at Virginia Friday night. The game will have significant championship implications. The Cavs are atop the Coastal with a 4-1 ACC record, while Pitt and Virginia Tech are tied for second with 3-1 marks.

• No. 23/22 Virginia is riding a three-game winning streak, defeating North Carolina last week, 31-21, to gain bowl eligibility with a 6-2 mark. The Panthers evened their record at 4-4 following a 54-45 victory over Duke.

• Since 2013, the Panthers own a 4-1 series advantage over Virginia in ACC play. (Pitt leads the overall series, 7-3.) The Cavaliers' last victory over Pitt was a 24-19 decision under the lights at Scott Stadium in 2014.

• Against Duke, the Panthers literally ran to victory, amassing 484 yards on the ground. The rushing total marked Pitt's highest since the Tony Dorsett era when it had a record 530 vs. Army in 1975.

• Freshman V'Lique Carter was dazzling in his college debut last week against Duke. Carter ran for 137 yards and two touchdowns on just seven carries, an incredible average of 19.6 per rush.

• With 795 total rushing yards this season, Qadree Ollison ranks third among ACC ball carriers. (His average of 99.4 yards per game also ranks third.) Ollison is striving to become only the sixth player in Pitt history to achieve multiple 1,000-yard rushing seasons.

• Pitt is averaging 227.9 rushing yards per game to rank 22nd nationally and fourth among ACC teams. The Cavs are surrendering only 113.0 yards on the ground to rank 20th in the nation and fourth in the ACC.

• Only a sophomore, placekicker Alex Kessman has the most 50yard field goals in Pitt history with five. Three of those kicks occurred this season, including a critical 54-yarder in last week's Duke victory.







 $\sqrt{}$ Pitt closed the 2017 season with a 24-14 victory over No. 2 Miami, the highest-ranked opponent the Panthers have ever defeated at home. Pitt snapped the nation's longest active winning streak at 15 games by beating the Hurricanes.

 $\sqrt{\text{Narduzzi}}$ is 2-0 as a head coach against teams ranked No. 2. In addition to the Miami victory in 2017, the Panthers defeated No. 2 Clemson, 43-42, in 2016. It was the Tigers' only loss that season as they finished with a 14-1 record and claimed the College Football Playoff national championship.

 $\sqrt{100}$ In 2016, Narduzzi's Panthers defeated two teams that finished in the top 5 of the final 2016 College Football Playoff rankings. Pitt defeated eventual national champion Clemson (43-42) and kept No. 5 Penn State out of the playoff field by defeating the Nittany Lions, 42-39.

 $\sqrt{}$ Twenty-four of Narduzzi's Pitt players have signed NFL contracts. The Panthers had five players selected in the 2017 NFL Draft and three more taken in 2018, marking Pitt's most draft selections over a two-year span since 2003-04.

√ In 2016, Quadree Henderson earned consensus All-America status as a return specialist after leading the country in kickoff return touchdowns (three) and combined kick return yards (1,166). Additionally, guard Dorian Johnson also was a first team All-American under Narduzzi.

 $\sqrt{10}$ In his debut campaign at Pitt in 2015, Narduzzi led the Panthers to an 8-4 regular-season record, their best 12-game mark since 2009, and a Military Bowl invitation. Pitt finished as the runnerup in the ACC Coastal Division with a 6-2 mark, its best conference record ever.

 $\sqrt{}$ Pitt boasted the ACC's top offensive and defensive newcomers in 2015. Safety Jordan Whitehead was named the league's Overall and Defensive Rookie of the Year. Tailback Qadree Ollison was named the Offensive Rookie of the Year following a 1,000-yard rushing campaign.

 $\sqrt{\text{Narduzzi}}$ arrived at Pitt following eight highly successful years as the defensive coordinator at Michigan State under Mark Dantonio. The Spartans were the only team to rank in the nation's top 10 in total defense and rushing defense each season from 2011-14.

 $\sqrt{}$ Michigan State boasted the nation's top rushing defense in 2014, yielding just 88.5 yards per game. The Spartans finished third nationally with 34 turnovers gained and eighth in total defense, holding opponents to just 315.8 yards per contest.

 $\sqrt{102014}$, the Spartans finished with a No. 5 national ranking and 11-2 record following a stirring 42-41 victory over Baylor in the AT&T Cotton Bowl. Narduzzi's defense shut out the high-scoring Bears in the fourth quarter, opening the door for 21 unanswered points by Michigan State.

 $\sqrt{100}$ In 2013, Michigan State finished No. 3 in the country following a Big Ten title and 24-20 victory over No. 5 Stanford in the Rose Bowl. Narduzzi was named the 2013 recipient of the prestigious Broyles Award, annually presented to the country's top assistant coach.

 $\sqrt{\text{Narduzzi's}}$ decorated defensive players at Michigan State included first team All-Americans in cornerback Darqueze Dennard, safety Kurtis Drummond, linebacker Greg Jones and defensive tackle Jerel Worthy. Dennard was a unanimous All-American in 2013, becoming the first Michigan State cornerback to earn that distinction. He also was the school's first winner of the Jim Thorpe Award, given to college football's top defensive back.

 $\sqrt{}$ Dennard was a first-round NFL Draft pick of the Cincinnati Bengals in 2014, the first Spartans defensive back taken in the initial round since 1961. In the 2015 draft, another Narduzzi pupil, Michigan State cornerback Trae Waynes, was a first-round pick of the Minnesota Vikings.

 $\sqrt{\text{Prior to Michigan State, Narduzzi spent three}}$ years (2004-06) as defensive coordinator under Dantonio at Cincinnati, helping the Bearcats to a pair of bowl invitations. In 2003, Narduzzi was the defensive coordinator at Miami of Ohio under the late Terry Hoeppner. The RedHawks stormed to a 13-1 record that season, capturing the Mid-American Conference championship and defeating nationally ranked Louisville in the GMAC Bowl to finish No. 10 in the Associated Press poll.

 $\sqrt{$ Narduzzi served as linebackers coach at Northern Illinois for three seasons (2000-02). NIU won a pair of MAC divisional titles during his tenure and in 2002 had the league's top rushing defense. From 1993-99, Narduzzi coached at his alma mater, Rhode Island, serving as the Rams' defensive coordinator his final two seasons. He began his coaching career at Miami of Ohio, working as a graduate assistant in 1990 and 1991, before earning his first full-time position as receivers coach for the 1992 season.

 $\sqrt{\text{Narduzzi}}$ was a starting linebacker under his father, the late Bill Narduzzi, as a freshman at Youngstown State University in 1985 before transferring to Rhode Island, where he became a three-year starter for the Rams from 1987-89. Bill Narduzzi was head coach at YSU from 1975-85. He led the Penguins to two NCAA Division II playoff appearances, including the national championship game in 1979, and twice was named the Ohio Valley Conference Coach of the Year. One of Bill's first coaching posts was as a freshman line coach at Pitt in 1962.

129 YEARS AND COUNTING

The 2018 campaign marks the 129th football season in Pitt history. The Panthers, who played their inaugural season in 1890, have a 721-531-42 all-time record (.573). The program's rich legacy includes 92 first team All-Americans, 24 College Football Hall of Famers, eight Pro Football Hall of Famers and nine national titles.

YOUR 2018 PITT TEAM CAPTAINS

As selected by their teammates, the captains for the 2018 Panthers are senior offensive lineman Alex Bookser, senior safety Dennis Briggs and senior linebacker Quintin Wirginis. Briggs was also elected a captain as a junior in 2017. He becomes Pitt's first multiple-time captain since defensive tackle Aaron Donald in 2012-13.

WORKING OVERTIME

Pitt outlasted Syracuse in overtime, 44-37, at Heinz Field on Oct. 6. The victory improved the Panthers' all-time OT record to 8-9. Pat Narduzzi is 2-0 in overtime as Pitt's head coach. (In addition to this year's Syracuse victory, the Panthers defeated Youngstown State, 28-21, in OT to open the 2017 season.)

ACTIVE DUTY FOR FOUR TRUE FROSH

Four true freshmen have seen active duty for Pitt thus far. On offense, wide receiver Shocky Jacques-Louis has played in all eight games, earning three starting assignments, while running back Mychale Salahuddin has played in three contests. Additionally, V'Lique Carter, who began the year in the secondary, made his Pitt debut in last week's Duke victory as an offensive player and rushed for 137 yards and two touchdowns.

Defensively, true frosh cornerback Marquis Williams has seen action in three games.

MORE FRESH FACES

Fifteen redshirt freshmen have made their collegiate debuts this season. That total includes seven players on offense (running back Todd Sibley Jr.; receivers Dontavius Butler-Jenkins and Michael Smith; offensive linemen Jerry Drake Jr., Gabe Houy and Carson Van Lynn; and tight end Grant Carrigan), six defensive players (cornerback Paris Ford; defensive linemen Deslin Alexandre and Jaylen Twyman; and linebackers Albert Tucker, Cam Bright and Kyle Nunn) and two specialists (punter Kirk Christodoulou and placekicker/holder Jake Scarton).

TOUGH NON-CONFERENCE TESTS


Prior to the 2018 season, ESPN.com rated Pitt's non-conference schedule as the toughest in the country. "The top spot was a nobrainer," ESPN Senior Staff Writer Chris Low wrote of the Panthers.

Of Pitt's four non-ACC games, three are against FBS opponents whose combined record this season is 21-2: Notre Dame (8-0), UCF (7-0) and Penn State (6-2).

Those three teams went a combined 34-5 in 2017. Pitt hosted historic rival Penn State of the Big Ten on Sept. 8. The Nittany Lions were 11-2 last year. The Panthers played on the road at UCF (Sept. 29), which claimed a national title with a 13-0 record in 2017. The Panthers' final non-ACC game of 2018 was in South Bend against Notre Dame (Oct. 13). The Fighting Irish were 10-3 last season.

RANKED FOES

Five Pitt opponents appear in this week's Top 25 polls: Notre Dame (No. 3 Associated Press/No. 3 USA Today Coaches Poll), UCF (No. 9/9), Penn State (No. 14/13), Syracuse (No. 22/24) and Virginia (No. 23/22).



Under Coach Pat Narduzzi, Pitt is 2-0 against opponents ranked No. 2. In addition to the 24-14 win over Miami to close the 2017 season, Narduzzi's Panthers knocked off No. 3/2 Clemson, 43-42, in Death Valley on Nov. 12, 2016. It would be the lone blemish of the season for the Tigers, who would go on to win the national title with a 14-1 record.

CLOSING 2017 WITH A BIG "W"

Pitt punctuated its 2017 season with an exclamation point, defeating No. 2 Miami at Heinz Field, 24-14, to knock the Hurricanes out of the College Football Playoff hunt. The Panthers limited Miami to 232 to-tal yards—and only 45 on the ground—while notching a season-high four sacks. The Hurricanes' rushing output was their lowest of the season while their total yardage was the second lowest. Offensively, Pitt was ignited by freshman quarterback Kenny Pickett, who in his first career start ran for two touchdowns and threw for another to hand Miami its first loss of the season.

The No. 2 Hurricanes became the highest-ranked opponent the Panthers had ever beaten in Pittsburgh. Prior to the win over Miami, the highest-ranked foe Pitt had defeated at home was No. 3 Ford-ham, 13-0, at Pitt Stadium on Nov. 8, 1941. Pitt snapped the nation's longest active winning streak at 15 games by beating the Hurricanes.

TOP 3 FOES: BEWARE THE PANTHERS

Pitt has actually won four consecutive games against top-3 teams when unranked dating back to the 2002 season. Three of those contests have been on the road.

ISN'T IT GRAND?

Only one player on Pitt's 2018 roster can claim a 1,000-yard rushing season as a collegian: senior running back Qadree Ollison, who netted 1,121 yards in 2015 en route to earning ACC Offensive Rookie of the Year honors. Ollison will attempt to become just the sixth player in Pitt history to achieve multiple 1,000-yard rushing seasons before his eligibility expires.

The last player to accomplish the feat was James Conner, who had 1,092 yards in 2016 and 1,765 yards in 2014. The other Panthers in this elite group are Tony Dorsett (four from 1973-76), Curvin Richards (1988-89), LeSean McCoy (2007-08) and Dion Lewis (2009-10).

CARTER INCREDIBLE IN DEBUT

Freshman V'Lique Carter was dazzling in his college debut last week against Duke. Carter ran for 137 yards and two touchdowns on just seven carries, an incredible average of 19.6 per rush. His scoring dashes covered 31 and 16 yards, the latter climaxing with an incredible dive into the end zone. Carter is the first Pitt player to achieve a 100-yard rushing game in his debut since Qadree Ollison had 207 yards and a TD on 16 carries as a redshirt freshman against Youngstown State in 2015. Carter is also the first true freshman to rush for 100 yards in his initial game since Dion Lewis had 129 yards and two TDs on 20 carries against Youngstown State in 2009.

HALL MAKES MARK

Pitt's rushing attack is boasted by two formidable senior tailbacks. In addition to leading rusher Qadree Ollison, Darrin Hall also plays a prominent role and currently has 429 yards and four touchdowns on 70 attempts (6.1 avg.). Hall had a season-high 107 yards and two touchdowns on 17 carries (6.3 avg.) in the 44-37 overtime win over Syracuse (Oct. 6). His TDs were critical to the final result: a seven-yard score that tied the game at 34 in the fourth quarter and a three-yard run that proved to be the game-winner in OT.

DARRIN DAZZLED AT DUKE IN 2017

Darrin Hall achieved one of the most prolific rushing games in school history while breaking a century-old school record in Pitt's 24-17 victory at Duke last season. Hall rambled for a career-high 254 yards and three touchdowns. He averaged a sensational 10.6 yards on 24 carries. Hall ripped off touchdown sprints of 79 and 92 yards. The latter score marked the longest touchdown run in Pitt history, eclipsing the 100-year-old record of 91 established in 1917 by George McLaren.

A NEW STANDARD

Darrin Hall's 92-yard touchdown run in Pitt's 24-17 win at Duke in 2017 is the longest in school history. Hall eclipsed a record that stood for 100 years: George McLaren's 91-yard scoring run against Syracuse on Oct. 20, 1917.

Pitt used one of the finest rushing days in school history to defeat Duke, 54-45, on Oct. 27. The Panthers piled up 484 yards and four touchdowns on 52 carries (9.3 avg.) against the Blue Devils. It marked the second-highest rushing total ever at Pitt, trailing only the school-record 530 yards gained at Army on Oct. 18, 1975.

PICKETT'S MEMORABLE FIRST START

In the first start of his college career, then-freshman Kenny Pickett accounted for three touchdowns (two rushing and one passing) in engineering the Panthers' 24-14 upset of No. 2 Miami to close the 2017 season. Pickett completed 18-of-29 passes (62%) for 193 yards with zero interceptions and was also Pitt's second-leading rusher with 60 yards on 13 carries (4.6 avg.). Pickett's six-yard touchdown rush gave the Panthers a 10-7 lead right before intermission. Late in the third quarter he connected with Qadree Ollison on a five-yard shovel pass to increase the advantage to 17-7. Pickett's final TD proved to be the clincher—a perfectly executed bootleg on fourth down that the freshman took for a 22-yard score.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

WIRGINIS LOST TO SEASON-ENDING INJURY

Pitt was dealt a significant blow the week of Oct. 8 when senior linebacker and team captain Quintin Wirginis sustained a non-contact knee injury in practice that resulted in season-ending surgery.

Through six games, Wirginis ranked as the Panthers' most productive defender, leading the team in tackles (41), tackles for loss (7.0), sacks (3.0) and forced fumbles (tied with two).

In what would be his final game of the season, a 44-37 overtime victory over Syracuse (Oct. 6), Wirginis was especially impactful. He collected eight tackles, including a six-yard sack, and forced a crucial fumble that was returned for a 35-yard touchdown by teammate Dane Jackson. Wirginis also applied pressure on a blitz that resulted in a game-ending interception in overtime by Therran Coleman.

GROUND DEFENSE

Under Pat Narduzzi, Pitt has held a total of 15 opponents under the 100-yard rushing mark. The Panthers are 12-3 overall in such games, including a 1-1 mark this season.

In the 2018 opener, a 33-7 win over Albany, Pitt yielded only 60 yards on 28 carries (2.14 avg.). In their Oct. 13 contest at Notre Dame, the Panthers limited the Irish to 80 yards on 38 carries (2.11 avg.) in a 19-14 setback.

STICKY FINGERS

Sophomore defensive end Rashad Weaver is tied for the national lead with three fumble recoveries. (His fumble recovery total makes him the sole leader in that category among ACC players.)

Weaver picked up two fumbles in the Sept. 8 Penn State game, returning one for 20 yards. He became the first Pitt player to recover two fumbles in a single game since linebacker Mike Caprara also had two against Penn State on Sept. 10, 2016. Weaver added another fumble recovery in the Sept. 15 victory over Georgia Tech.

As a team, the Panthers rank 41st nationally and fifth in the ACC in fumble recoveries with six. Other Pitt players with recoveries this season are junior cornerback Dane Jackson (against Syracuse, returned 35 yards for a touchdown), redshirt freshman linebacker Cam Bright (at North Carolina) and senior defensive end Dewayne Hendrix (against Duke).

IT'S BEEN AWHILE

Should defensive end Rashad Weaver recover a fourth fumble this season, it would be the first time in 37 years a Pitt player achieved that feat. The last time it occurred was during the 1981 season when defensive end Michael Woods collected a total of five fumble recoveries.

KNOCK IT LOOSE

The Panthers also have a player among the national leaders in forced fumbles. Cornerback Dane Jackson has three forced fumbles in seven games played this season. His average of 0.43 forced fumbles per contest ranks first in the ACC and sixth nationally.

SACK ATTACK

During the Pat Narduzzi era, Pitt has recorded four or more quarterback sacks in a game 14 times. The Panthers have an 11-3 record in those contests where they have compiled at least four sacks. In its 33-7 season-opening win over Albany, Pitt compiled five sacks. It marked the Panthers' highest sack total since also recording five against Duke on Nov. 19, 2016.

RARE GLORY

Rare is the time an interior lineman gets the glory of an interception but it happened in the Panthers' 44-37 overtime victory over Syracuse on Oct. 6. Junior defensive tackle Amir Watts had the first interception of his career when he snagged an Eric Dungey pass over the middle. The Panthers parlayed the pick into a field goal and 20-14 second-quarter lead.

It was the first interception by a Pitt interior defensive lineman since Chas Alecxih against Buffalo on Sept. 3, 2011.

COLEMAN'S CLINCHING INT

Sophomore safety Therran Coleman made the game-clinching play in Pitt's 44-37 win over Syracuse (Oct. 6) when he intercepted Eric Dungey in the end zone in overtime. Coleman snatched Dungey's pass away from Orange receiver Nykeim Johnson to end the game.

It was the first interception of Coleman's collegiate career.



Pitt has scored nine defensive touchdowns under Pat Narduzzi, including one this season (cornerback Dane Jackson's 35-yard fumble return against Syracuse).

The Pitt defense has scored 33 touchdowns since the 2001 season. The Panthers are 27-4 when scoring at least one defensive TD in a game during that span. (The losses occurred against Notre Dame and Navy in 2015, and Oklahoma State in 2016 and 2017.)

DAMAR'S LONG-DISTANCE RETURN

Junior safety Damar Hamlin made a key play in Pitt's season-opening 33-7 win over Albany when he halted the Great Danes' first drive with an interception at the Pitt 2. Hamlin returned the pick 79 yards, setting up the Panthers' second touchdown for an early 13-0 lead.

The 79-yard interception return marked Pitt's longest since October 16, 2010, when Ricky Gary had an 80-yard return for a score at Syracuse.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

KESSMAN GETS HIS KICKS

Sophomore placekicker Alex Kessman has twice notched a careerhigh 14 points in a game this season.

He initially set the personal milestone in Pitt's 44-37 overtime win over Syracuse (Oct. 6). Kessman was perfect on each of his eight kicks against the Orange (3-for-3 field goals and 5-for-5 PATs). His field goals came from 54, 55 and 45 yards. The 55-yarder set a Heinz Field record (NFL and college).

Kessman also accounted for 14 points in Pitt's 54-45 win over Duke (Oct. 27), again converting 3-of-3 field goals and each of his five PATs. His field goals covered 27, 54 and 48 yards.

Kessman currently leads the Panthers in scoring with 46 points on 7-of-10 field goals and 25-of-26 PATs.

LONGEST EVER AT HEINZ

Alex Kessman can now claim the longest field goal at Heinz Field by either a professional or collegian. On a notoriously difficult track for kickers, his 55-yarder against Syracuse (Oct. 6) eclipsed the prior Heinz record of 54 set by Old Dominion's Jarod Brown in 2013 against Pitt. The longest NFL field goal at Heinz Field is 53 yards by Chris Boswell (Pittsburgh Steelers) and Dan Bailey (Dallas Cowboys).

BIG FOOT

Alex Kessman has five of the seven longest field goals in school history: a Pitt record-tying 56-yarder, two 55-yard kicks and two 54-yarders. Kessman owns the distinction of having the most 50-yard field goals in Pitt history with five.

Since 1961 (57 years), Pitt has made only 17 field goals of 50 yards or more.

FFRENCH IS "FFAST"

When Pitt visited Notre Dame on Oct. 13, Maurice Ffrench made one of the game's most dramatic plays when he took the second-half's opening kickoff 99 yards for a touchdown, giving the Panthers a 14-6 lead. It marked Ffrench's second kick return TD of the season. He also owns a 91-yarder for a score in the opener against Albany.

Ffrench is the first Pitt player to have multiple kick return touchdowns in a season since Quadree Henderson had a school-record three in 2016, when Henderson was a consensus All-America return specialist.

YOU CAN'T GET MUCH LONGER

Maurice Ffrench's 99-yard kickoff return touchdown at Notre Dame (Oct. 13) is the longest by an ACC player this season and ranks seventh on a national scale.

FFRENCH AMONG THE NATION'S BEST

Maurice Ffrench has established himself as one of college football's top return threats.

Ffrench is tied for the national lead with two kickoff return touchdowns. (He is tied with USF's Terrence Horne and Utah State's Savon Scarver.)

Ffrench is the lone ACC player to return a kickoff for a touchdown this season.

He also ranks sixth nationally (first in the ACC) with a 29.6-yard kickoff return average (14 for 414).

OPENING THE 2018 SEASON IN STYLE

Pitt opened the 2018 season in explosive fashion against Albany when junior receiver Maurice Ffrench returned the game's opening kickoff for a 91-yard touchdown. It was the first kick return score of his collegiate career and the first time on record that the Panthers opened a season with a kickoff return TD.

Ffrench's return marked the second time in 27 games Pitt returned the game's opening kickoff for a score. The previous occasion was on Dec. 28, 2015, when Quadree Henderson had a 100-yard return against Navy in the Military Bowl.

PITT BLOCK PARTY

Pitt has 55 blocked kicks since the 2000 season. That total includes 10 blocks during Pat Narduzzi's tenure as Pitt head coach (since 2015).

TWO SPECIAL TEAMS "HOUSE CALLS"

Pitt is the only team in the ACC to score return touchdowns on both a kickoff and punt this season.

Maurice Ffrench is responsible for two kick return TDs, a 91-yarder against Albany (Sept. 1) on the opening kickoff of the 2018 season and a 99-yarder at Notre Dame (Oct. 13).

The punt return touchdown was scored by Rafael Araujo-Lopes at UCF (Sept. 29). Araujo-Lopes took a punt 86 yards for a score, marking the Panthers' longest punt return in at least four decades. (The Pitt record for longest punt return is a 90-yarder for a score by Jimmy Joe Robinson against Penn State in 1945.)

CHRISTODOULOU MAKES AMERICAN DEBUT

Redshirt freshman punter Kirk Christodoulou, in his first active season at Pitt, is averaging 38.8 yards on 37 punts. He has a season long of 56 yards (against Albany) and has placed eight inside the 20-yard line. Eight of his punts have resulted in a fair catch.

The 2018 season not only marks Christodoulou's collegiate debut but also his first official game action in America.

A native of Australia, Christodoulou enrolled at the University of Pittsburgh in January 2017. He was a standout Australian rules football player before embarking on his goal to play college football in the United States. Christodoulou worked with the renowned Prokick Australia program that has produced many successful collegiate and NFL punters.

Prokick Australia's "exports" include Pittsburgh Steelers punter Jordan Berry and all three 2016 Ray Guy Award finalists: winner Mitch Wishnowsky (Utah) as well as Michael Dickson (Texas; now with the Seattle Seahawks) and Cameron Johnston (Ohio State; now with the Philadelphia Eagles).
