OPENING KICK

UVA BACK IN ACTION AFTER BYE WEEK

- Virginia returns to ACC play on Friday night when the Cavaliers head to the Sunshine State to face the Miami Hurricanes.
- UVA is 29-31 all-time when coming off a bye week and 2-1 under head coach Bronco Mendenhall, defeating Duke (28-21) in 2017 and then-No. 16 Miami (16-13) last year. UVA is 3-1 all-time against Miami when facing the Hurricanes after a bye.

VIRGINIA VS. MIAMI

- This is the 17th meeting between the Coastal Division rivals. With UVA winning five of the last nine meetings, Miami leads the series by two games, 9-7.
- Miami won the first three games in the series (1996, 2004, 2005), but it's been a narrow 7-6 UVA advantage since.
- Since the Hurricanes' arrival in the Atlantic Coast Conference (2004), Miami leads the series narrowly, 8-7, in ACC play.

FIVE TOP STORYLINES

- Friday is the earliest date on the schedule that UVA has ever played Miami and is only the fourth time the game has been contested in the month of October. UVA is 3-0 against Miami in the 10th month of the year, winning in 2010 (Oct. 30) at Scott Stadium, 24-19, in 2011 (Oct. 27) on a Thursday night at Hard Rock Stadium, 28-21 and last year (Oct. 13) at Scott Stadium, 16-13.
- The Cavaliers are ranked No. 20 this week in the *Associated Press* Poll. It makes the second time in series history with the Hurricanes where UVA is ranked and Miami is not. The other time was 2007 when then-No. 23 UVA topped an unranked Miami team 48-0 in the Canes' final game at the Orange Bowl.
- Virginia is playing its fifth night game of 2019, tying a regular season program record (1983). The Cavaliers are 63-47-1 all-time in night games, including 7-4 under **Bronco Mendenhall**.
- ILB **Jordan Mack** is tied for No. 1 in the ACC with 6.0 sacks (No. 6 in the nation) and is tied for No. 2 among the nation's linebackers, 0.5 behind Iowa State's O'Rien Vance. He has at least 0.5 sacks in seven-straight games dating back to the 2018 Virginia Tech game and 8.0 sacks during his current streak. Mack was one of two active FBS players (only linebacker) to have an active streak of seven games with at least 0.5 sacks heading into week No. 6 of the college football season. During UVA's bye week Ohio State's defensive lineman Chase Young extended the nation's longest current sack streak to eight games. Young has 12.5 sacks over OSU's last eight games. Ohio State is off this week.
- UVA's defense is No. 2 in the nation with 4.8 sacks per game. UVA's linebacking corps alone has 17 sacks (3.4 per game) which, not counting UVA, is more than the overall totals of all but 14 FBS teams thus far.



WR Hasise Dubois led UVA with nine catches for 143 yards and a touchdown last time out at then-No. 10 Notre Dame. It was the most receiving yards by an opponent at Notre Dame Stadium since 2009.

- 3** A win at Miami will give UVA a 3-0 start in the ACC for the first time since the 2007 Cavaliers opened up league play with a 4-0 record.
- 10** UVA is ranked No. 10 in the nation (No. 2 in the ACC) in total defense, allowing an average of 275.4 yards per game.
- 16** WR Joe Reed needs 16 receptions to become the 22nd Cavalier all-time to reach 100 career catches and 1,000 career receiving yards.

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

The first documented Cavalier on horseback was Francis Bell, a Virginia student from Dublin, Va., in 1947. Bell rode onto the field dressed as Cavaliers for Virginia's home football game with Harvard on the afternoon of October 11.

The Cavalier on horseback returned as the University's mascot in 1963. The UVA Polo Club provided both the horse and rider. However, the mounted Cavalier and his horse parted company in 1974 with the inception of AstroTurf at Scott Stadium.

The mounted Cavalier made its return in the Florida Citrus Bowl at the end of the 1989 football season. Due to its instant popularity, the Cavalier on horseback returned the following season on a regular basis and continues to lead the Virginia football team onto the field at the beginning of all home games.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

MORE ON THE UVA-MIAMI SERIES

- The first match-up occurred in the 1996 Carquest Bowl at then-Joe Robbie Stadium, a 31-21 victory by Miami.
- That game was the final collegiate action for several notable Cavaliers, including Tiki and Ronde Barber, James Farris, Jon Harris and Jamie Sharper.
- In addition to this Cavalier quintet, the game featured a large number of future pros.
- Of the 44 starters in the game, 20 were drafted by NFL teams (11 UVA, 9 Miami). The group of NFL draftees included nine first-round picks. Twenty-one Cavaliers and 22 Hurricanes went on to play in the NFL.
- Friday is the sixth time UVA and Miami have played a night game. UVA is 4-1 all-time against Miami when playing at night. UVA closed Miami's tenure at the Orange Bowl with a 48-0 win in 2007, followed by a Thursday Night win at Hard Rock Stadium in 2011, defeating the Hurricanes 28-21. UVA defeated Miami in a Saturday night game in 2014 at Scott Stadium, 30-13. Most recently, UVA topped then-No. 16 Miami at Scott Stadium last year, 16-13, in a night game. The lone loss came in the 1996 Carquest Bowl (31-21), the first game in the all-time series.

UVA ACCOMPLISHED THIS FLORIDA FEAT

- UVA's trip to then-Sun Life Stadium in 2011 resulted in the Cavaliers' 28-21 victory. The win set the table for Virginia to become the first program in college football history to win road games at Miami and Florida State in the same season. UVA later won in 2011 at then-No. 23 FSU, 14-13.
- UVA was the only team in college football history to accomplish the feat until North Carolina did so in 2016.
- Florida State and Miami have brought eight combined national titles to the Sunshine State.
- UVA defeated FSU earlier this season at home, 31-24, giving the Cavaliers a second chance to sweep the ACC Florida schools in the same season.

LAST-SECOND HEROICS IN 2012

- The 2012 game at Scott Stadium saw last-second heroics by the Cavaliers.
- Michael Rocco tossed a 10-yard pass to Jake McGee in the back of the end zone with six seconds left to beat Miami, 41-40 at Scott Stadium. The touchdown capped a 10-point, fourth quarter comeback.
- Rocco was 29-of-37 for 300 yards and four touchdowns in the win.
- McGee had four catches for 26 yards including the game-winning score.
- WR Dominique Terrell had a career day in the 2012 meeting with nine catches for 127 yards.
- The victory serves as the most recent UVA "last-minute win," which means the winning score came with 60 seconds or less remaining in the game.

VIRGINIA - MIAMI CONNECTIONS

- UVA's defensive back Brenton Nelson was born in Miami and played three seasons at Winter Springs High School near Orlando before his family moved to Maryland and he enrolled at DeMatha.
- UVA's Tavares Kelly attended St. Thomas Aquinas High School (Fort Lauderdale, Fla.), as did Miami's Mike Harley, Al Blades, Jr., and Michael Irvin, II. The NFL announced that St. Thomas Aquinas High School had the most alums on NFL rosters entering the 2019 season with 13.

Last Meeting

Virginia held on for a 16-13 win over then-No. 16 Miami the last two times these teams met.

The Cavaliers had 231 total yards to 339 for Miami. UVA never trailed in the game, scoring the first 10 points of the contest. Virginia's defense held the Hurricanes without a first down in four of their first five drives.

Senior Juan Thornhill nabbed two interceptions and Joey Blount had one to lead the defense. Senior Jordan Ellis had a seven-yard touchdown run and Brian Delaney was 3-for-3 on field goals, scoring his first career field goal in the second quarter.

UVA was leading 16-6 before Miami drove 93 yards for a touchdown to make it 16-13. On the onside kick attempt, Evan Butts grabbed the kick and returned it for 30 yards to give UVA the ball at the 27. A personal foul penalty on Miami gave UVA the first down to keep possession. Virginia kicked the field goal to go ahead 19-13, but a roughing the kicker penalty on Miami made it a UVA first down with 30 seconds to go as the Cavaliers ran down the clock and take the win 16-13.

VIRGINIA AT NFL STADIUMS

- Virginia is 12-20 all-time in venues that at the time of the contest were active NFL stadiums.
- Seven of the 14 NFL stadiums UVA has played in are still active today.
- After losing seven games in a row in NFL stadiums, UVA snapped the streak with a 28-0 triumph over South Carolina in the 2018 Belk Bowl (Carolina Panthers' Bank of America Stadium).
- With its first-ever win at Heinz Field in the season opener against Pitt, UVA has a two-game winning streak at NFL stadiums.

VIRGINIA SUSTAINS SPOT IN THE RANKINGS

- Virginia comes in this week at No. 20 in the *Associated Press* poll. It is the sixth week under Bronco Men-denhall the Cavaliers have been ranked by the AP and the fifth week this season.
- It is the first time UVA has been ranked five weeks in a row in the Associated Press poll since the 2004 season when the Cavaliers were ranked in every single *Associated Press* poll.
- It is the first time since 2005 that UVA has been ranked by the *Associated Press* in the month of September.

DUBOIS HAS CAREER DAY AT NOTRE DAME

- WR Hasise Dubois had a career day last time out at No. 10 Notre Dame. He set new career marks for catches (9) and yards receiving (143), while also scoring an acrobatic touchdown to give UVA a 17-14 lead heading into halftime.
- Dubois' 143 receiving yards are the most by an opponent at Notre Dame Stadium since Oct. 17, 2009 when USC's Anthony McCoy had 153 receiving yards against the Irish.
- Dubois' 143 receiving yards is the third most against the Irish since the start of the 2014 season. Former Cavalier Canaan Severin had the most (153) during the 2015 meeting, while Clemson's Justyn Ross had 148 receiving yards against the Irish in last year's Cotton Bowl semifinal game for the College Football Playoff.

DUBOIS IS "CLUTCH CITY" ON THIRD DOWN

- Dubois has been one of Bryce Perkins' main targets on third down, catching four passes on third down with three going for a first down and one for a touchdown.
- Overall, of Dubois' 25 receptions 16 (64.0 percent) have gone for a first down and two for touchdowns.
- In 2018, Dubois made 32 first downs on 52 receptions (61.5 percent) with five touchdowns.

THE 100/1,000 CLUB AT VIRGINIA

- WR Hasise Dubois is the 21st Cavalier in program history to reach 100 career receptions and 1,000 career receiving yards, reaching both milestones at No. 10 Notre Dame on Sept. 28.
- WR Joe Reed is already a member of the 1,000 career receiving yards club, reaching the milestone one game (Old Dominion) prior to Dubois. Reed needs 16 receptions to also reach the 100 career catch club, joining Dubois as the 22nd Cavalier in the 100/1,000 career club.

OLUWATIMI THE PROTECTOR

- Olusegun (Victor) Oluwatimi, has played 288 snaps on the offensive line of UVA's 335 offensive plays. He has taken 279 snaps at center, six at right guard and three at left guard. Oluwatimi only played nine plays against Old Dominion due to an injury.
- So far this season Oluwatimi has allowed zero sacks and zero quarterback hits.

CAVALIERS HAVE BEEN A STRONG SECOND HALF TEAM

- Virginia is currently outscoring its opponents 79-45 in the second half, including shutting out both Pitt and Old Dominion in the third and fourth quarters.
- UVA yielded only 46 yards of total offense to Old Dominion in the second half.
- At No. 10 Notre Dame UVA was outscored 21-3 in the second half in parts to four second-half turnovers, in which the Irish scored 21 points off of them.
- For the season, UVA has yielded an average of 116 yards of total offense in the second half. The UVA offense is edging its opponent in the second half (181.4).

"ZZ STOP" HELPS LEAD THE WAY FOR UVA'S TOP-20 DEFENSE

- ILB Zane Zandier currently leads the team with 37 tackles as UVA is ranked No. 10 in the nation (No. 2 in the ACC) in total defense, allowing an average of 275.4 yards per game.
- Zandier intercepted his first career pass in the third quarter against ODU and returned it 22 yards for a touchdown. It is the second UVA interception by a linebacker this season (Matt Gahm at Pitt).
- Zandier's INT is the first pick-six by a UVA linebacker since Byron Thweatt returned an interception 53 yards against Virginia Tech in 1998.
- UVA is No. 15 in the nation (No. 3 in the ACC) in rushing defense, allowing 91.4 rushing yards per game. The Cavaliers are No. 2 in the nation with 4.80 sacks per game and No. 75 in the nation (No. 1 in the ACC) in tackles for loss per game (8.8).

REED IS DANGEROUS WITH THE BALL

- WR Joe Reed is the only player in the nation with 300+ receiving yards (322) and 300+ kick return yards (341).
- He is currently No. 4 in the nation with a 34.1 yards per kick return.
- Reed leads UVA with 32 receptions and four receiving touchdowns, while he is second on the squad with 322 receiving yards.

REED ON THE ACC ALL-TIME KICK RETURN LIST

- WR Joe Reed is No. 5 in ACC history with 2,587 kick returns yards and tied for No. 3 all-time in kick return average.
- He is the only player in ACC history to be ranked in the Top 5 in career kick return yardage and career yards per kick return.
- Reed is the only player in ACC history with 1,700+ career kick return yards and an average of 28+ per return.

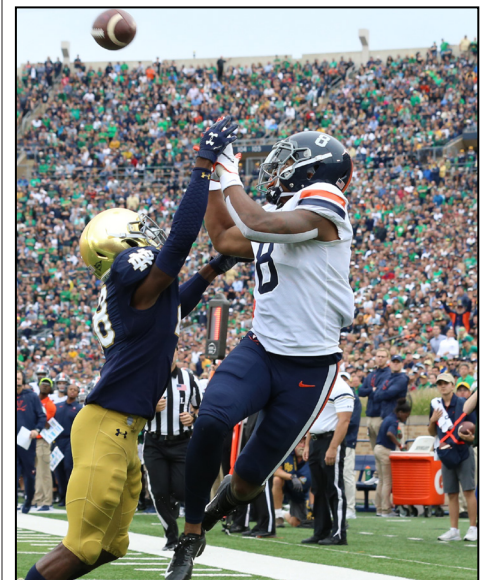

WR Hasise Dubois became the 41st Cavalier in program history to reach 1,000 career receiving yards when he did so at No. 10 Notre Dame on Sept. 28. He joined teammate Joe Reed who reached the plateau a week earlier.

Against William & Mary in week No. 2, QB Bryce Perkins became the 44th Cavalier in program history with 1,000 career rushing yards. He is only the third UVA quarterback to reach the milestone and the first since Shawn Moore in 1990.

CAVALIERS HAVE HELD THE ADVANTAGE IN FIELD POSITION

- The Cavaliers have been +8.4 in field position so far this season.
- UVA's average starting field position has been its own 36.6, while UVA's opponents average is the 28.2-yard line.
- UVA won the field position battle in 2018, averaging the 33-yard line to start a drive while opponents averaged the 27.7-yard line.

PERKINS RUSHING ON THIRD AND FOURTH DOWN

- QB Bryce Perkins is 7-of-9 this season picking up a first down when rushing on third or fourth down. He is 5-of-7 on third down rushing for a first down and 2-of-2 on fourth down rushing for a first down.

VIRGINIA DEFENSE CAPTURING THE SACK

- The Virginia defense has 24 sacks through the first five games of the season, making the Cavaliers one of 12 schools in all of FBS since 2000 to reach 24+ sacks through the first five games of a season. This year's Florida, Pitt and SMU squads join the Cavaliers on the list.
- This year's UVA and Pitt teams join 2010's Florida State squad as the only ACC teams since 2000 to have at least 24 sacks through the season's first five games.

PERKINS' SECOND HALF AGAINST FLORIDA STATE AIDS THE CAUSE

- QB Bryce Perkins was precision in the second half against Florida State as the Cavaliers were trailing the Seminoles, 14-10, at the half.
- Perkins started the second half connecting on 16-straight passes, two short of tying the UVA record (18 by Michael Rocco vs. Miami, 2012). In the second half he was 17-of-19 passing for 156 yards and one touchdown.
- Perkins also scored the crucial two-point conversion with his feet to put UVA up 31-24 with 2:34 left to play. Perkins had been flushed as far back as the 15-yard line before scrambling and scampering into the end zone.

VIRGINIA OWNED THE CLOCK IN SECOND HALF AGAINST FLORIDA STATE

- Virginia only had three offensive drives in the second half against Florida State and they ended in punt, touchdown, touchdown and touchdown.
- Of the 30 possible minutes of play in the second half, UVA held possession for 19:12 of it.
- Overall, UVA held possession of the ball against the Seminoles for 39:44, which is the fifth-longest time of possession advantage UVA has had in program history. Four of the Top 10 games of longest TOP have come in the Bronco Mendenhall era at UVA.
- UVA is No. 1 in the ACC and No. 14 in the nation in time of possession, averaging possession 33:51 per game.

CAVALIER OFFENSE GRINDS IN THE FOURTH QUARTER VS. FSU

- Virginia had three offensive drives that resulted in touchdowns in the fourth quarter against Florida State.
- Over those three offensive drives the Cavaliers amassed 222 yards of total offense on 28 plays (7.9 yards per play). UVA tallied two 11-play, 75-yard touchdown drives, followed by a six-play, 72-yard touchdown drive that proved to be the game-winning score.

REED TAKING IT TO THE HOUSE

- WR Joe Reed recorded the fourth 100-yard kick return for a touchdown in program history with his lone return against William & Mary.
- Reed joins Tavon Mason (2001) and Marquis Weeks (2002 & 2004) as the only Cavaliers to record a 100-yard kick return in program history.
- Reed is one of seven players in the nation this season to notch a 100-yard kick return, joining USC's Velus Jones, Kansas State's Malik Knowles, Maryland's Javon Leake, Southern Mississippi's Jaylond Adams, UCLA's Demetric Felton and Utah State's Savon Scarver.
- Reed has returned four kicks in his career for a touchdown, which is a UVA record. No other player has returned more than two. No other player has returned kicks in three separate seasons as Reed returned two in 2017, one in 2018 and one in 2019.

NICK GRANT'S PICK-6 PROVES PROPHETIC

- CB Nick Grant notched his first career interception and returned it 85 yards for a touchdown against William & Mary.
- The redshirt junior entered came to UVA in 2016 and was prophetic to call that he would return his first career INT for a touchdown. Grant said postgame: "You can ask all of my friends; I told them that my first career pick is going to the crib. It's going to be a touchdown and I've been saying that since my first year of college. It just so happened to come my way my fourth year. I've definitely dreamed about it my whole life. It's a DB's dream."
- Grant's 85-yard interception return is the third-longest in program history and is the fourth-longest in the nation this season.

HOLLINS SHINES IN OFFENSIVE DEBUT

- True freshman running back Mike Hollins scored a touchdown on his first career rush against William & Mary. The nine-yard scoring jaunt made Hollins the first Cavalier since Jordan Ellis (2015) to score a touchdown on his first collegiate rush. Ellis also did so against William & Mary.
- Hollins led UVA off the bench with 78 yards on 11 carries (7.1 average) and two rushing touchdowns.
- Hollins made his collegiate debut in the opener at Pitt on special teams.

TRUE FRESHMAN STARTING ON THE DEFENSIVE LINE

- Against Pitt, NT Jowon Briggs became the fifth UVA freshman (true or redshirt) since 1986 to start a season opener on the defensive line. Briggs is also the second in two seasons as teammate NT Jordan Redmond (also a true freshman) did so last year against Richmond. Briggs and Redmond are the first UVA freshmen to start a season opener on the defensive line since 2002 when DE Kwakou Robinson started against Colorado State. The other two UVA freshmen to start an opener on the defensive line are DE Matt Conrath (RS-Fr., 2008 vs. USC) and NT Tim O’Conner (RS-Fr., 1986 vs. South Carolina).
- Briggs was part of UVA’s run-stop game, helping limit Pitt to only 78 rushing yards on 30 carries (2.6 ypr).
- Briggs was 17-years old for the season-opener at Pitt, turning 18 on Sept. 1. The team sang him happy birthday on the return flight to Charlottesville after it was officially Sept. 1.

TWELVE UVA TRUE FRESHMEN HAVE MADE DEBUT IN 2019

- Twelve UVA true freshmen have appeared in a game in 2019. The full list includes: LS Enzo Anthony, DT Jowon Briggs, DB Antonio Clary, DB Tenyeh Dixon, WR Dorian Goddard, RB Mike Hollins, OL Ja’Quay Hubbard, ILB Nick Jackson, OL Jonathan Leech, OLB Jairus Satiu, DE Ben Smiley III and WR Dontayvion Wicks.

CAVALIER DEFENSE SHUTS DOWN PITT’S RUSHING ATTACK

- Virginia held Pitt to 78 rushing yards on 30 rushes, which was only 2.6 yards per rush.
- During UVA’s previous four-game losing streak to Pitt, the Panthers rushed for 780 yards on 166 carries and eight touchdowns. That comes to an average of 195 rushing yards on 41.5 carries (4.7 ypr) and a two-touchdown average during the UVA losing streak to Pitt. The Panthers rushed for 254 yards in the 2018 meeting and 209 yards in the 2016 meeting.
- UVA’s defense as a whole was stout in the season opener at Pitt. If you take away the two Pitt scoring drives, which yielded 165 yards of total offense on 21 plays, UVA’s defense held the Panthers to 98 yards of total offense on 50 plays (1.96).

TAULAPAPA PICKS UP THE TAILBACK MANTLE FOR THE CAVALIERS

- Sophomore running back Wayne Taulapapa, who lettered in 2018 on special teams, carried the ball for the first time in his collegiate career at Pitt in the season opener.
- Taulapapa, who made his first career start, rushed 10 times for 66 yards (6.6 ypr) and one touchdown as Virginia looks for a running back to replace 1,000-yard rusher Jordan Ellis from 2018. Taulapapa missed the William & Mary game with an injury.
- Taulapapa is No. 27 in the nation and No. 4 in the ACC with five rushing touchdowns in 2019.
- Taulapapa is a member of the 2016 recruiting class, but did not enroll until 2018 after serving a two-year LDS mission to Managua, Nicaragua.
- The native of Laie, Hawaii attended Punahou High School in Honolulu. Taulapapa’s roundtrip to high school each day was an average of 3.5 hours (1:45 one way) on the road.

NASH GRIFFIN SHINES IN PUNTING DEBUT

- With the graduation of former All-ACC punter Lester Coleman, junior Nash Griffin made his punting debut in the season opener at Pitt. Griffin previously had appeared in 26 games from 2017-18 as UVA’s holder. Griffin continues his holding duties in 2019.
- Griffin punted four times against the Panthers and averaged 45.5 yards per punt. Three of his punts went inside the 20-yard line and his long punt went 49 yards.
- Griffin received a day off against William & Mary as the Cavaliers did not punt at all in a game for the first time since 1989 vs. Duke.
- Griffin was high school basketball teammates at Lawrence Central High School in Indianapolis, Ind., with Kyle Guy, the 2019 NCAA Tournament’s Most Outstanding Player from Virginia.
- Griffin was roommates for three years at UVA with Kyle Guy before he was drafted (and married) in the second round of the 2019 NBA Draft by the Sacramento Kings.

HALL MAKING THE START AT CB

- CB Bryce Hall has made 38 consecutive starts. That is the most in the nation among active cornerbacks. He made his first collegiate start on Oct. 15, 2016 when Pitt came to Scott Stadium.
- Hall is tied for No. 2 in the nation for consecutive starts among active defensive players. Below is where Hall ranks among the nation’s defensemen with the most consecutive starts.

- PK Brian Delaney was named ACC Specialist of the Week after the Pitt game, while WR Joe Reed earned the same accolade after the William & Mary game.
- QB Bryce Perkins was Co-ACC Quarterback of the Week after the Florida State game.
- OLB Charles Snowden was the Walter Camp National Defensive Player of the Week and the ACC Linebacker of the Week after the Old Dominion game.

BRONCO MENDENHALL HAS CAREER WINS AGAINST ALL CONFERENCES

- Bronco Mendenhall has at least one career win against all 10 of the current football conferences.

BRONCO MENDENHALL LED VIRGINIA TO BACK-TO-BACK BOWLS

- After playing in the Military Bowl in 2017, Bronco Mendenhall led Virginia to back-to-back bowls in 2018 for the first time since 2004 and 2005 after the Cavaliers earned a Belk Bowl invite.
- Mendenhall’s Cavalier squad shutout South Carolina, 28-0, in the 2018 Belk Bowl to give UVA its first bowl victory since the 2005 Music City Bowl. UVA’s shutout performance was the first over an SEC team in a bowl game by a non-SEC team since the 1975 Gator Bowl.

BRONCO MENDENHALL IS IN SPECIAL COMPANY

- Bronco Mendenhall is one of three active coaches that has inherited at least two programs in his career that were coming off a losing season and in year one, or year two, played in a bowl game. The others to do it are Nick Saban (Alabama, LSU, Michigan State) and Mark Dantonio (Michigan State/Cincinnati).
- Mendenhall inherited a BYU team that went 5-6 in 2004 and in his first season the Cougars went 6-6 and played in the 2005 Las Vegas Bowl. Mendenhall took over a Virginia team that went 4-8 in 2015 and took the Cavaliers to the 2017 Military Bowl in year No. 2, finishing 6-7.

RETURN OF THE MACK

- Senior inside linebacker Jordan Mack is UVA's leading returning tackler after finishing 2018 with 66 tackles. Despite missing four games with an injury in 2018, he still finished No. 2 on the team in stops behind current NFL safety Juan Thornhill (98).
- Mack is on the 2019 Bronko Nagurski Trophy Watch List and a semifinalist for the 2019 Campbell Trophy.
- Mack enters 2019 No. 2 in the ACC among active career tackle leaders with 220 stops (No. 17 nationally). Miami's Shaquille Quarterman (249) is the only ACC player with more career tackles entering 2019.
- He finished No. 5 in the ACC with 114 tackles in 2017 (No. 26 nationally). Joining 2017 Campbell Trophy winner Micah Kiser, an All-American, and fellow All-American Quin Blanding, Mack was a part of the only "Power 5" trio (one of two in FBS) to each have at least 100 tackles in the same season.
- Mack's older brother, Charles, is on staff at UVA as a regional scout for the football program. Charles was a four-year letterwinner at Richmond and was on the field for the Spiders when Jordan made his collegiate debut in 2016. Jordan and Charles' father, Charles Mack Sr., played football at Georgia Tech (1983-87).

REED IS SPECIAL ON "SPECIAL TEAMS"

- WR Joe Reed owns UVA's career all-time kick return yardage record with 2,587 career kick return yards.
- Reed also led UVA in 2018 in special teams tackles with seven. He has made five on kickoffs and two on punt returns.
- In 2018, Reed returned 26 kicks for 707 yards (27.2 yards per return), which was No. 2 in the ACC and No. 10 nationally. In 2017, Reed returned 29 kicks for 861 yards (29.7 yards per return), which was No. 1 in the ACC and No. 8 nationally.

MORE ON REED AND KICK RETURNS

- Since 2016, Joe Reed is the only "Power 5" player to average 27+ yards per kick return for his career as the senior owns a 28.1 career average.
- Reed is one of two active FBS players to average 27+ yards per return for their career. Houston's Marcus Jones joins Reed. Jones owns a career average of 27.6 yards per return, which includes his 2017 and 2018 seasons played at Troy. Per transfer rules, Jones is sitting out the 2019 season at Houston.
- Since 2000, Reed is one of eight "Power 5" players to average 27+ yards for a career. He is one of 22 FBS players since 2000 to average 27+ yards per kick return for a career.

JANA PUNCHES THE KEYS

- WR Terrell Jana taught himself to play the piano by watching YouTube videos in his spare time at Woodberry Forest. He originally started to learn a song to surprise his mom and ended up enjoying it so much he kept up the self-study.
- The song Jana set out to learn to play for his mom was Brian McKnight's "Crazy Love."

CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIFINALIST HELPS WITH LOCAL CAFE

- ILB Jordan Mack is a semifinalist for the prestigious Campbell Trophy (Academic Heisman). He was named one of 185 semifinalists (six in the ACC) on Sept. 25.
- A community involvement he is passionate about is his work with the Kindness Café + Play, which is a café in Charlottesville that employs people with cognitive disabilities, creating a space where people with and without disabilities interact as peers and where connections are made. Jordan's volunteer work with the café includes marketing and promotion of the café locally about the need for such an endeavor in the community.

HAILING FROM THE GRAND CANYON STATE; IT'S AN ASU CONNECTION

- QB Bryce Perkins and graduate transfer WR Terrell Chatman were both part of the same recruiting class at Arizona State in 2015. Both current Cavaliers utilized a redshirt year with the Sun Devils in 2015.
- Perkins spent two seasons at ASU before transferring to Arizona Western JC for the 2017 season, followed by his move to Virginia in 2018. Chatman comes to Virginia after graduating last spring from Arizona State.
- Perkins and Chatman hit it off immediately through the recruiting process and were even roommates in Tempe. The duo are roommates again, this time in Charlottesville.
- Also, UVA's current director of football development & performance, Shawn Griswold, was the head coach for sports performance at Arizona State from 2012-17, working with both Perkins and Chatman. Griswold has been at UVA since 2018.

UVA PASSING GAME UNDER BRONCO MENDENHALL

- Four of the top seven single-game passing contests from a quarterback standpoint have happened during the head coach Bronco Mendenhall and offensive coordinator Robert Anae's tenure at UVA (2016-pres.).
- Kurt Benkert, the starting quarterback in 2017 and 2018 owns the No. 1 (455, vs. UConn, 2017), No. 2 (421, vs. Central Michigan, 2016) and No. 6 (384, at Miami, 2017) spots. Current UVA quarterback Bryce Perkins has the No. 7 spot (379, vs. Ohio, 2018).
- Virginia also amassed 5,003 yards of total offense in 2018, marking the fifth time in program history a Cavalier team recorded over 5,000 yards in a single season. UVA also set a single-season program record with 276 first downs.

SCOTT STADIUM, HOME OF THE CAVALIERS

The Carl Smith Center, home of David A. Harrison III Field at Scott Stadium, with its unique architectural design, scenic setting on the University's Grounds and exceptional sight lines, is one of the nation's finest college football settings.

Opened in 1931, Scott Stadium might be one of the oldest campus college football stadiums in the nation, but you could never tell from its appearance. Numerous upgrades and expansions make it a modern home for the Cavaliers and their fans.

Scott Stadium was the gift of Frederic William Scott and Elisabeth Strother Scott, and was dedicated to the memory of his parents, Frederic Robert Scott and Frances Branch Scott.

Virginia played its dedication game at Scott Stadium on Oct. 15, 1931 against the Virginia Military Institute before a then-capacity crowd of 22,000. Prior to that season, the Cavaliers staged their home games at the University's Lambeth Field.

Virginia has played 473 games in the historic venue. UVA's all-time record at Scott Stadium stands at 268-193-12.

BRYCE PERKINS NOTES

IT IS A PERK TO HAVE BRYCE AT QUARTERBACK

- QB Bryce Perkins returns to Charlottesville for his senior season after breaking UVA's single-season record for total offense during his first season on Grounds with 3,603 total yards in 2018. Perkins broke the previous record by 459 yards, which was set a year earlier by Kurt Benkert.
- Perkins was one of two players in the nation with 2,600+ passing yards (2,680) and 900+ rushing yards (923), joining Heisman Trophy winner Tyler Murray (Oklahoma) in 2018.
- In fact, since the year 2000, Perkins and Murray are the only players in the nation in a single season to complete at least 64 percent of their passes, while also throwing for 2,000+ yards, rushing for 900+ yards and being responsible for at least 30 touchdowns.
- Perkins transferred to UVA in January 2018 from Arizona Western Community College after leading the Matadors to the 2017 NJCAA Championship game, before falling 31-28 to East Mississippi.
- Perkins originally signed as a top recruit with hometown Arizona State, but never saw action during his two seasons in Tempe. He redshirted the 2015 season and missed the 2016 season with an injury.
- Perkins' father, Bruce, lettered at Arizona State in 1988 and 1989 as a fullback and later played briefly in the NFL. Perkins' older brother, Paul, was a three-year letterwinner at running back with the UCLA Bruins and currently plays with the Detroit Lions. Perkins' uncle, Don Perkins, played eight seasons in the NFL with the Cowboys.

PRO FOOTBALL FOCUS RATING BRYCE HALL

- Hall finished with an overall grade of 91.2 that included a coverage grade of 91.4, both of which lead all returning FBS cornerbacks, a group of 349 players who logged at least 200 snaps a season ago.
- There is no better returning cornerback from a season ago when it comes to tracking passes in the intermediate to deep range of the field, those passes targeted at least 10 yards downfield. Hall was targeted 44 times on throws in that range, allowing just 14 receptions while he came away with two interceptions and recorded 18 forced incompletions.
- According to PFF - "Hall may be more important to his team's success than any other non-offensive player in the country."

HALL OF SPEED CLOCKED AT 22.3 MPH

- Hall was clocked at 22.3 mph via the Catapult system he was wearing when he made a touchdown-saving tackle on Miami's Travis Homer, a rush that went for 70 yards in the 2018 meeting at Scott Stadium.
- Hall's touchdown-saving tackle eventually forced Miami to kick a field goal in a game UVA won over the then-No. 16 Hurricanes, 16-13.

HALL ANCHORS VIRGINIA SECONDARY

- CB Bryce Hall returns for his senior season after earning second-team All-America honors in 2018 when he led the nation with 22 pass break-ups and 24 passes defensed.
- According to Pro Football Focus (PFF), Hall led the ACC in forced incompleteness percentage (31.9 percent) in 2018. PFF has Hall ranked as the No. 1 defensive player in the country entering 2019 and the No. 4 FBS player overall.
- According to PFF, Hall ranked tied for first with LSU's Kristian Fulton in forced incompleteness percentage (38.9 percent) in Cover-0 and Cover-1 looks.
- Hall allowed just 2.9 yards after the catch in 2018 and had eight performances in which he held opposing receivers in his coverage to just single-digit yards after catch numbers.
- Hall has five career interceptions, three of which have come against former Duke quarterback and 2019 NFL first rounder Daniel Jones (Giants, sixth overall). Jones tossed nine interceptions in his three career games against Virginia.

Bronco Mendenhall Head Coach • Fourth Season

Bronco Mendenhall is in his fourth season as Virginia's head football coach after being named the program's 40th head coach on Dec. 4, 2015.

Mendenhall enters the 2019 season with a career record of 115-65, which includes a 99-43 mark in 11 seasons as the head coach at BYU. Between UVA and BYU, Mendenhall has led his teams to bowl games in 13-of-14 seasons as a head coach. That 92.9 percent rate ranks tied for No. 3 among active FBS head coaches with at least 10 years of FBS coaching.

After playing in the Military Bowl in 2017, Mendenhall led Virginia to back-to-back bowls in 2018 for the first time since

2004 and 2005 after the Cavaliers earned a Belk Bowl invite. Mendenhall's Cavalier squad shutout South Carolina, 28-0, in the 2018 Belk Bowl to give UVA its first bowl victory since the 2005 Music City Bowl. UVA's shutout performance was the first over an SEC team in a bowl game by a non-SEC team since the 1975 Gator Bowl.

Mendenhall is one of three active coaches that has inherited at least two programs in his career that were coming off a losing season and in year one, or year two, played in a bowl game. The others to do it are Nick Saban (Alabama, LSU, Michigan State) and Mark Dantonio (Michigan State/Cincinnati).

Year number three under Mendenhall saw great strides in performance on the field. UVA's defense finished No. 20 in the country and No. 3 in the ACC, allowing 330.5 yards per game, while finishing No. 21 in the nation and No. 3 in the ACC in scoring defense (20.1). UVA's defense finished No. 16 in the nation and No. 2 in the ACC in fewest passing yards allowed and the offense finished No. 6 in the nation and No. 1 in the ACC in third-down conversion percentage.

With Bryce Perkins at quarterback, UVA scored 370 points in 2018, which ranks No. 3 all-time for the Cavaliers. Perkins and Heisman Trophy winner Kyler Murray (Oklahoma) were the only players in the nation with 2,600+ passing yards and 900+ rushing yards. Under Mendenhall in 2018, Bryce Hall earned second-team All-America honors from both the Walter Camp Foundation and the Football Writers Association of America. Hall led the nation with 22 pass breakups and 24 passes defended. Hall, SS Juan Thornhill and HB Olamide Zaccheaus all earned first-team All-ACC accolades, leading UVA's eight selections. Thornhill finished 2018 No. 3 in the nation with six interceptions and Zaccheaus, the 2018 Belk Bowl MVP, was No. 1 in the ACC with 93 receptions (a UVA single-season record). Zaccheaus leaves UVA with a program-record 250 career receptions, which ranks No. 6 all-time in ACC history.

Mendenhall came to Charlottesville after 11 years as the head coach at Brigham Young University. In his 11 seasons, from 2005-2015, Mendenhall compiled an overall record of 99-43 at BYU to rank 12th in total wins among all FBS teams during that time.

In the three seasons prior to Mendenhall becoming the head coach at BYU, the Cougars compiled an overall record of 14-21. Over Mendenhall's 11 years at BYU, the Cougars were one of only 11 programs to advance to a bowl game each season (includes the 2015 season). BYU joined by Alabama, Boise State, Clemson, Florida State, Georgia, LSU, Oklahoma, Oregon, Virginia Tech and Wisconsin on that list.

Among those 11 teams, only Florida State has achieved more bowl wins (seven) than BYU's six bowl game victories.

The success of Mendenhall's leadership approach in running the BYU football program was highlighted in a management book, *Running Into the Wind: Bronco Mendenhall -- 5 Strategies for Building a Successful Team*, written by Alyson Von Feldt and Paul Gustavson, a leading management consultant specializing in leadership development and organizational design.

Mendenhall was elected in 2013 to the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees as the District 8 Representative and also serves on the AFCA Ethics Committee.

Mendenhall and his wife, Holly, have three sons, Raeder, Breaker and Cutter.

- Zandier's INT is the first pick-six by a UVA linebacker since Byron Thweatt returned an interception 53 yards against Virginia Tech in 1998.
- With 40 receiving yards, WR Joe Reed becomes the 40th Cavalier all-time to reach 1,000-career receiving yards. He reached the plateau on his 25-yard receiving touchdown in the fourth quarter.
- TB Wayne Taulapapa put UVA up in the fourth quarter with his fifth rushing touchdown of the season on a seven-yard scamper.
- With one passing touchdown and one rushing touchdown, QB Bryce Perkins has rushed and passed for a touchdown in a game for the eighth time in his UVA career.
- RB Lamont Atkins had a career-long 34-yard reception in the fourth quarter.
