FOR OPENERS

- UVA meets UMass for the third time.
- The UVA-UMass game is part of the semifinal round of the Air Force Reserve Tip Off Tournament.
- The Cavaliers have captured championships in each of their last six November tournaments (Emerald Coast Classic, Charleston Classic, Barclays Center Classic, Corpus Christi Challenge, NIT Season Tip-Off and Battle 4 Atlantis).
- UVA is 136-36 (.791) in non-conference action under Tony Bennett.

ALL-TIME VS. UMASS

- Virginia is 2-0 all-time against UMass with both wins coming at neutral sites.
- The Cavaliers posted a 71-56 win over UMass in the second round of the 1993 NCAA Tournament in Syracuse, N.Y.
- Cory Alexander tallied 17 points and current UVA associate head coach Jason Williford had 14 points and 10 rebounds in the NCAA Tournament win in 1993.
- Norman Nolan and Courtney Alexander led four players in double figures with 20 points each in the victory in Maui.

ALL-TIME VS. ATLANTIC 10 CONFERENCE OPPONENTS

- Virginia meets its first Atlantic 10 opponent after posting a 3-0 record against the league in 2018-19, defeating George Washington (76-57), Dayton (66-59) and VCU (57-49).
- The Cavaliers are 123-80 all-time against current Atlantic 10 members (13-4 vs. Davidson, 3-0 vs. Dayton, 0-3 vs. Fordham, 8-1 vs. George Mason, 27-24 vs. George Washington, 1-2 vs. LaSalle, 2-0 vs. UMass, 2-1 vs. Rhode Island, 52-36 vs. Richmond, 2-6 vs. Saint Joseph's, 0-1 vs. Saint Louis and 13-2 vs. VCU).
- Tony Bennett is 13-3 all-time vs. Atlantic 10 opponents at UVA.

ALL-TIME VS. ARIZONA STATE AND ST. JOHN'S

- UVA is 1-0 all-time against Arizona State and 2-6 against St. John's.
- The Cavaliers defeated the Sun Devils 70-64 in Puerto Rico during the 1999-2000 season.
- UVA has a two-game winning streak against the Red Storm, including a 68-50 win in the second round of the 2013 NIT at John Paul Jones Arena.

UVA RANKED NO. 7 IN LATEST AP POLL

- As of Nov. 20, Virginia ranks first in the nation in scoring defense (41.3), field goal percentage defense (28.2), personal fouls per game (9.5) and winning percentage (100.0), sixth in fewest fouls (38), 31st in defensive rebounds per game (31.3), 34th in rebound margin (10.0) and 40th in total blocks (22).

LAST TIME OUT

- No. 7 Virginia edged Vermont 61-55 in nonconference action at John Paul Jones Arena on Tuesday, Nov. 19.
- Mamadi Diakite matched a career high with 19 points and Kihei Clark tallied a career-best 15 points in the win.
- Braxton Key added 14 points and Jay Huff chipped in nine points and seven rebounds in his first career start.
- Anthony Lamb drilled seven 3-pointers en route to a game-high 30 points for Vermont.
- UVA trailed 49-48 with 5:25 left, but used a 9-0 run to pull away with its 20th-straight nonconference home win.

HOLDING FOES UNDER 50

- UVA is 3-0 when limiting opponents to fewer than 50 points.
- UVA is 90-2 when achieving the mark in the Tony Bennett era.
- Bennett-coached teams are 115-3 when holding opponents to fewer than 50 points (25-1 in three years at Washington State).
- UVA is 25-0 under Bennett when limiting foes to 40 or fewer points.

HOW ARE THESE CAVALIERS?

- The quartet of Mamadi Diakite, Kihei Clark, Braxton Key and Jay Huff lead Virginia into action this season.
- Diakite leads UVA in scoring (15.8 ppg) and is second in rebounding (8.3), while Clark is averaging 10 points, 5.0 rebounds and a team-high 5.5 assists.
- Key is averaging 11 points and a team-high 8.8 rebounds, and Huff has tallied 11 points, 8.0 rebounds and team-high 1.7 blocks.
- Kody Stattmann and newcomers Casey Morsell and Tomas Woldetensae have absorbed the minutes left by Ty Jerome, Kyle Guy and De'Andre Hunter on the perimeter.
- Stattmann is averaging 5.3 points, while Morsell has averaged 26 minutes per game.
- Woldetensae missed the JMU game with a foot injury, but has grabbed six rebounds against Columbia and Vermont.
- Justin McKoy has provided additional frontcourt depth, while walk-on Chase Coleman backs up point guard Kihei Clark.
- Francisco Caffaro made his UVA debut against Columbia.
- Walk-ons Austin Katstra and Jayden Nixon provide more depth.
- Forward Kadin Shedrick is expected to redshirt this season, while Sam Hauser will sit out the season after transferring from Marquette.

VIRGINIA HEAD COACH TONY BENNETT

- Three-time National and four-time ACC Coach of the Year Tony Bennett has a 258-89 (.744) mark in 11 seasons at Virginia and 327-122 (.728) career mark in 14 seasons.
- In 2018-19, Bennett led the Cavaliers to their first NCAA national championship, a share of their ninth ACC regular-season title and school-record 35 wins.
- Bennett became the 80th active Division I head coach to win his 300th career game against Marshall on Dec. 31, 2018.
- Bennett was named the USBWA Henry Iba National Coach of the Year for the third time in 2018 to rank second all-time behind legendary John Wooden, who captured the award six times.
- He has led UVA to outright ACC regular-season and tournament championships in the same season two times (2014 and 2018).
- Bennett has guided UVA to six straight NCAA Tournament appearances for the first time in school history and has led UVA to 29 or more wins for the fifth time in the past six seasons.
- Bennett is the sixth coach in ACC history to win at least three outright ACC regular-season titles (Frank McGuire, Vic Bubas, Dean Smith, Mike Krzyzewski and Roy Williams).
- Bennett has led UVA to a school-best 16 or more ACC wins in four of the last six seasons and a school-record seven straight seasons with 11 or more ACC wins.
- He has led UVA to a school-best eight straight 20-win seasons.
- Bennett has guided UVA to a school-record 89 wins over three seasons two times (2014-16 and 2017-19).
- Bennett has led UVA to seven consecutive postseason tournaments (NCAA in 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017 and 2018 and NIT in 2013).
- Bennett has led the Cavaliers to 30 wins in back-to-back seasons two times (2014-2015 and 2018-19).
- UVA is 136-36 (.791) in non-conference action (76-6 at JPI), 122-53 (.697) in ACC play and 146-26 (.849) at home under Tony Bennett.
- Bennett ranks fifth all-time in winning percentage at .697, among ACC head coaches with 100 or more ACC regular-season wins.

OUR DEFENSE NEVER RESTS

- UVA limited its first three opponents to fewer than 50 points for the first time in the shot clock era and first since 1948-49.
- UVA held both Syracuse and JMU to 34 points, marking the first time UVA has limited its first two opponents to fewer than 40 points in the shot clock era and since 1943-44.
- Syracuse's 34 points in the season-opener on Nov. 6, marked UVA's fewest points allowed to an ACC foe since holding Wake Forest to 34 on Feb. 25, 2015.
- The 34 points by Syracuse and JMU are tied for the fifth fewest for UVA in the shot clock era.
- UVA limited JMU to 22.6 percent shooting, tied for fifth lowest for a Cavalier opponent.
- UVA ranks second in the NCAA in scoring defense (41.3 ppg) after capturing its fifth NCAA scoring defense title in 2018-19 (56.1 ppg).
- The Cavaliers have limited three opponents (Syracuse, JMU and Columbia) to fewer than 50 points, 29 percent or less field goal shooting and 29 percent or less 3-point shooting.
- UVA has held all four opponents below 40 percent from the field.
- The Cavaliers have forced two shot clock violations in 2019-20.
- UVA has out-rebounded each of its four opponents.
- Bennett-coached teams have led the nation in scoring defense six times and finished in the top-five nationally in 10 of 13 seasons.

ABDUR-RAHIM, BEEKMAN AND MCCORKLE SIGN NLI'S

- Virginia announced the signings of guards Jabri Abdur-Rahim (Short Hills, N.J./Blair Academy), Reece Beekman (Baton Rouge, La./Scotlandville High School) and Carson McCorkle (Greensboro, N.C./Greensboro Day School) on Nov. 14.
- The 6-7, 205-pound Abdur-Rahim averaged 16.7 points and 8.7 rebounds during his junior season at Blair Academy in 2018-19. Abdur-Rahim was named New Jersey Gatorade Player of the Year after leading Blair Academy to the Prep A state championship.
- Beekman, a 6-2, 165-pound point guard, averaged 21.9 points, 10.2 rebounds and 10.2 assists as a junior for Scotlandville in 2018-19. He was named first-team all-state from USA Today and the Louisiana Sports Writers Association.
- The 6-3, 173-pound McCorkle tallied 15.9 points per game en route to AP and NCISAA 4A All-State honors at Greensboro Day School.

RECORDS WATCH

- Mamadi Diakite is ranked sixth on UVA's career blocks list with 122.
- Diakite needs five blocks to pass Kris Hunter (126 blocks from 1997-99) for fifth on the list.
- Diakite's 63 blocked shots in 2018-19 rank sixth on UVA's single-season list.

ABOUT THE 2019-20 SCHEDULE

- Three of Virginia's opponents are ranked in the AP Top-25 poll (Duke, Louisville and North Carolina), while four (Florida State, Vermont, Purdue and Virginia Tech) received votes.
- The Cavaliers will play 13 games against 2019 NCAA Tournament teams: home games against Duke, Florida State, Louisville, North Carolina, Syracuse, Vermont and Virginia Tech; road contests at Florida State, Louisville, North Carolina, Purdue, Syracuse and Virginia Tech.
- UVA will meet First Four NCAA Tournament teams Arizona State or St. John's in the Air Force Reserve Tip-Off Tournament on Nov. 24.
- Two opponents (Clemson and NC State) participated in the 2019 National Invitation Tournament.

VIRGINIA PICKED FOURTH IN THE ACC

- Virginia was picked to finish fourth in the ACC preseason poll.
- The Cavaliers, who were picked second and finished first last season, have finished at or higher than their predicted finish in 10 of the last 11 seasons.
- Duke is the preseason favorite, followed by North Carolina, Louisville, Virginia, Florida State, NC State, Notre Dame, Syracuse, Miami, Pitt, Clemson, Georgia Tech, Boston College, Virginia Tech and Wake Forest.

DIAKITE EARNS PRESEASON ALL-ACC HONORS

- Mamadi Diakite was named the preseason All-ACC first team.
- Diakite was joined on the All-ACC first team by preseason ACC Player of the Year Jordan Nwora (Louisville), Tre Jones (Duke), Cole Anthony (North Carolina) and John Mooney (Notre Dame).

WATCH ME NOW

- Kihei Clark (Bob Cousy Award) and Mamadi Diakite (Karl Malone Award) were named to Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame preseason award top-20 watch lists.
- The Cousy Award honors the nation's top point guard, while the Malone Award honors the top power forward.
- Diakite was also one of 50 players named to the Naismith Trophy Player of the Year watch list and one of 20 players named to the NABC Division I Player of the Year preseason watch list.
- Diakite was also named to the Wooden Award Preseason Top 50 List.

THE ELECTRIC 70s AND AWESOME 80s

- Virginia scored 70 or more points in 21 games (19-2) last season and is 125-8 when scoring at least 70 points under Tony Bennett.
- UVA scored 80 or more points in nine games (9-0) and is 35-1 when scoring 80 or more points under Bennett with its lone loss a 93-81 decision at North Carolina in 2012-13.
- Bennett was 4-0 when scoring 80+ points at Washington State.
- UVA scored 100 points against Marshall for the first time under Tony Bennett and added 97 points against Coppin State.
- UVA is 4-0 all-time when scoring 90 or more points under Bennett.

- Malcolm Brogdon (Indiana), Joe Harris (Brooklyn), De'Andre Hunter (Atlanta), Ty Jerome (Phoenix), Mike Scott (Philadelphia) and Devon Hall (Oklahoma City) are former Cavaliers who are playing in the NBA this season.
- Brogdon, who earned NBA Rookie of the Year honors for Milwaukee in 2016-17, is in his fourth season and first with Indiana.
- Harris is in his fifth NBA season (fourth with Brooklyn) and was the 2019 NBA All-Star Three-Point champion.
- Scott is in his eighth NBA season and second season with the Sixers.
- Hunter and Jerome were NBA first-round picks.
- Hall made his NBA debut with OKC on Nov. 12.
- Hall and Kyle Guy (Sacramento) are signed to two-way contracts.
- In addition, Dallas head coach Rick Carlisle is a Virginia alum who helped the Cavaliers to their last NCAA Final Four in 1984.

UVA VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

- UVA is 42-34 against ranked opponents in the Tony Bennett era, including an 11-3 mark in 2018-19.
- UVA's 11 ranked wins are a school record.
- The Cavaliers posted an ACC-record five ranked wins on the road in 2018-19, which tied UConn (1998-99) for the most all-time in poll history since 1948-49.
- UVA posted back-to-back wins vs. ranked opponents two times (Wisconsin and Maryland and Virginia Tech and Louisville) for the first time in the regular season since 1982 (Georgetown and Houston).
- The Cavaliers are 156-329 vs. ranked opponents since 1953-54.
- UVA is 1-30 all-time vs. No. 1-ranked opponents (86-73 win vs. No. 1 North Carolina on Jan. 30, 1986).

MORE THAN MANAGERS

- Virginia men's basketball managers and Charlottesville natives Grant Kersey and Matt Palumbo saw two minutes of action for the Cavaliers against JMU.
- Palumbo made his collegiate debut, while Kersey saw action in 10 games in a similar role last season.
- Coach Tony Bennett calls his team managers the "ultimate servants" of the Virginia men's basketball program.

THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME

- Virginia is 184-42 (.814), including a 3-0 mark in 2019-20, in 14 seasons at John Paul Jones Arena.
- UVA was 15-1 at JPJ last season and is 146-26 (.849), including a 11-11 (.910) mark the past eight seasons, at home under head coach Tony Bennett.
- Virginia is an ACC-leading 57-6 (.905) in league home games over the past seven seasons. Duke is second at 55-8 (.873).
- UVA has won 11 or more home games for 10 straight seasons.
- UVA has a 20-game nonconference home winning streak.
