OPENING KICK

UVA OPENS 130TH SEASON OF FOOTBALL

- The University of Virginia opens its 130th season of football Saturday against Pitt. UVA also opened the 2006 season at Heinz Field against the Panthers.
- It is the 89th season the Cavaliers have played in Scott Stadium.
- UVA is 82-38-9 (.671) all-time in season openers.
- The Cavaliers are 6-17-2 (.280) all-time when opening the season on the road. Saturday is UVA's first season opener on the road since 2015 when the Cavaliers played at then-No. 13 UCLA.
- UVA's last season-opening win the road was at Temple (44-14) in 2003.
- In his career as a head coach, Bronco Mendenhall is 10-4 in 14 season-openers.

VIRGINIA AT NFL STADIUMS

- Virginia is 11-20 all-time in venues that at the time of the contest were active NFL stadiums.
- Seven of the 14 NFL stadiums UVA has played in are still active today.
- After losing seven games in a row in NFL stadiums, UVA snapped the streak with a 28-0 triumph over South Carolina in the 2018 Belk Bowl (Carolina Panthers' Bank of America Stadium).
- UVA is 0-4 all-time at Heinz Field.
- Virginia also plays at the Miami Dolphins' Hard Rock Stadium this season, when the Cavaliers play the Miami Hurricanes on Oct. 11 (Fri.).

FIVE TOP STORYLINES

- UVA's season opener also serves as its ACC opener for the 18th time in program history. The last time this happened was 2003 (vs. Duke).
- Bronco Mendenhall** led UVA to back-to-back bowls (2017 & 2018) for the first time since the Cavaliers went to four bowl games in a row from 2002 to 2005.
- Last season quarterback **Bryce Perkins** became one of two FBS players (Kyler Murray, OU, 2018) since 2000 in a season to complete at least 64 percent of their passes, while also throwing for 2,000+ yards, rushing for 900+ yards and being responsible for at least 30 touchdowns.
- UVA is coming off a 28-0 win against South Carolina in the 2018 Belk Bowl. It was the first time a non-SEC team shutout an SEC team in a bowl game since the 1975 Gator Bowl.
- UVA is looking to win back-to-back-to-back season openers for the first time since winning four in a row from 2010-13. UVA beat William & Mary, 28-10, to open 2017 and topped Richmond, 42-13, to start 2018.

#TheStandard: BY THE NUMBERS

- 1 OLB Charles Snowden led the nation's linebackers in 2018 with nine pass breakups and 11 passes defended.
- 3 Bronco Mendenhall announced three captains on Aug. 26. CB Bryce Hall, QB Bryce Perkins and ILB Jordan Mack are UVA's 2019 captains.
- 20 Virginia ranked No. 20 in the nation in total defense in 2018, allowing an average of 330.5 yards per game.

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

The first documented Cavalier on horseback was Francis Bell, a Virginia student from Dublin, Va., in 1947. Bell rode onto the field dressed as Cavaliers for Virginia's home football game with Harvard on the afternoon of October 11.

The Cavalier on horseback returned as the University's mascot in 1963. The UVA Polo Club provided both the horse and rider. However, the mounted Cavalier and his horse parted company in 1974 with the inception of AstroTurf at Scott Stadium.

The mounted Cavalier made its return in the Florida Citrus Bowl at the end of the 1989 football season. Due to its instant popularity, the Cavalier on horseback returned the following season on a regular basis and continues to lead the Virginia football team onto the field at the beginning of all home games.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

NOTING VIRGINIA IN ACC OPENERS

- Virginia begins its 66th season competing in the Atlantic Coast Conference on Saturday against Pitt.
- Virginia holds a 26-39 all-time record in conference openers.
- This is the ninth season over the last 14 years that Virginia opens ACC play on the road.
- This is the third time UVA has opened ACC play against Pitt since the Panthers joined the league in 2013. UVA also opened up 2013 and 2015 ACC play at Heinz Field against the Panthers.

THE SERIES VS. THE PANTHERS

- Pitt leads the all-time series by an 8-3 margin.
- Between 1956 and 2012 UVA and Pitt only met twice in the regular season and once in a bowl game. Once Pitt joined the ACC in 2013, the two programs have met every season as members of the ACC Coastal Division.
- Until UVA's 44-14 win in the 2007 Scott Stadium meeting, Pittsburgh had won all three regular-season meetings. The Panthers won 26-0 in Charlottesville in 1953, 18-7 in Pittsburgh in 1955 and 38-13 in Pittsburgh in 2006.
- Virginia's 23-16 win over Pittsburgh in the 2003 Continental Tire Bowl in Charlotte, N.C., was one of the most closely contested games of the series.
- UVA's Tony Franklin played a big role on defense in the bowl game to end Larry Fitzgerald's 18-game streak with a touchdown reception.
- The teams seesawed back and forth in the first half with Virginia holding a 17-13 lead at halftime. The second half featured only field goals in UVA's seven-point win. Matt Schaub closed his stellar career by capturing MVP honors after passing for 244 yards. Former Pittsburgh Steeler tight end Heath Miller had a big day for UVA with four receptions for 84 yards, including a 52-yard touchdown reception from Schaub late in the first quarter for the game's first score.

MORE ON THE PITT SERIES DURING THE LEAN 1950'S

- The 26-0 loss in 1953 remains one of the worst offensive performances in the modern era of UVA football. The Cavaliers recorded three first downs, an all-time low, and had just 43 yards of total offense, their second-lowest modern-day total.
- Pittsburgh scored on its first possession 5:52 into the contest and scored in every quarter to win.
- In 1955, UVA ended more than 80 scoreless minutes against Pitt when halfback Ralph Kneeland scored UVA's first touchdown in the series on an eight-yard run at the 9:39 mark of the second quarter. That score gave UVA a brief 7-6 lead, but Pitt halfback Lou Cimarolli scored the game-winner on a 32-yard dash midway through the third quarter.

PITTSBURGH BOYS RETURN HOME

- Virginia has two student-athletes on its roster that hail from Pittsburgh. ILB Zane Zandier (Thomas Jefferson HS) and OT Derek Devine (North Allegheny HS) return home on Saturday for UVA's season opener against the Panthers.
- OT Ja'Quay Hubbard is from Sharpsville, Pa., which is roughly 75 miles north of Pittsburgh.

VIRGINIA - PITT CONNECTIONS

- Virginia's director of football development & performance, Shawn Griswold, spent the 2011 season at Pitt as the Panthers' director of strength and conditioning. He followed Todd Graham to Arizona State in 2012.
- Pitt special teams coordinator and running backs coach Andre Powell spent five years as an assistant coach at Virginia (1996-2000) under Hall of Fame head coach George Welsh. Among his pupils were future NFL players Tiki Barber, Germaine Crowell, Thomas Jones, Charles Kirby, Pat Washington and Terrence Wilkins.
- Pitt wide receivers coach Chris Beatty spent one year on Mike London's staff at Virginia (2015). He was the assistant head coach and running backs coach for the Cavaliers. A native of the Commonwealth of Virginia, Beatty spent eight years (1998-2005) as a head coach at the high school level in Virginia.

Last Meeting

Virginia fell 23-13 to Pitt on a rainy night at Scott Stadium the last time these teams met.

The Cavaliers finished with 249 yards, while Pitt tallied 315 yards with 254 yards rushing. Virginia took a 10-7 lead into the half, but the Panthers outscored the Cavaliers 17-3 in the second half.

UVA scored to tie the game 7-7 on a 42-yard pass to Terrell Jana at the end of the first quarter then took a 10-7 lead with a minute to go before the half. Pitt took a 14-10 lead at the end of the third quarter. UVA cut it to one on a 42-yard field goal by Brian Delaney, but the Panthers responded with a 75-yard rush on the first play of the ensuing drive.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL TURNS 150 IN 2019

- College football embarks on its 150th season in 2019. The first college football game took place on Nov. 6, 1869 when Princeton visited Rutgers.
- The special CFB150 logo will appear on uniform patches, helmet decals, field stencils, public service announcements, TV telecasts, social media channels and numerous other places during the season.
- Virginia is celebrating its 130th season of fielding a college football team. UVA's first college football game was on Nov. 20, 1888 when the Cavaliers shutout Pantops Academy, 20-0.
- Virginia has fielded a football team every season since, except for 1917 and 1918 due to World War I.

**FIFTEEN RETURNING STARTERS IN 2019**

- The 2019 roster features 15 returning starters (six on offense, nine on defense, plus a placekicker and holder).
- Virginia has had at least 10 returning starters every season since 1998.
- Overall, 32 returning Cavaliers have started at least one game at UVA.
- Virginia opened fall practice with 46 returning letterwinners from 2018 - 22 on offense, 21 on defense and three on special teams. Here is a 11-year breakdown of returning UVA letterwinners.

BRONCO MENDENHALL LED VIRGINIA TO BACK-TO-BACK BOWLS

- After playing in the Military Bowl in 2017, Bronco Mendenhall led Virginia to back-to-back bowls in 2018 for the first time since 2004 and 2005 after the Cavaliers earned a Belk Bowl invite.
- Mendenhall's Cavalier squad shutout South Carolina, 28-0, in the 2018 Belk Bowl to give UVA its first bowl victory since the 2005 Music City Bowl. UVA's shutout performance was the first over an SEC team in a bowl game by a non-SEC team since the 1975 Gator Bowl.

BRONCO MENDENHALL IS IN SPECIAL COMPANY

- Bronco Mendenhall is one of three active coaches that has inherited at least two programs in his career that were coming off a losing season and in year one, or year two, played in a bowl game. The others to do it are Nick Saban (Alabama, LSU, Michigan State) and Mark Dantonio (Michigan State/Cincinnati).
- Mendenhall inherited a BYU team that went 5-6 in 2004 and in his first season the Cougars went 6-6 and played in the 2005 Las Vegas Bowl. Mendenhall took over a Virginia team that went 4-8 in 2015 and took the Cavaliers to the 2017 Military Bowl in year No. 2, finishing 6-7.

RETURNING DEFENSE LOOKS TO BUILD UPON STRONG 2018

- While the UVA defense lost three players that are currently in the NFL, CB Tim Harris (49ers), OLB Chris Peace (Chargers) and SS Juan Thornhill (Chiefs), the unit returns 11 Cavaliers that started at least five games in 2018.
- The defense shined in 2018, finishing No. 12 in the nation in team passing efficiency defense (107.62), No. 16 in passing yards allowed (183.0), No. 20 in the nation in team defense (330.5) and No. 20 in scoring defense (20.1).
- UVA returns defensive starts in 2018 from Bryce Hall (13), Charles Snowden (13), Eli Hanback (12), Brenton Nelson (12), Jordan Mack (9), Zane Zandier (8), Robert Snyder (6), Mandy Alonso (5), Joey Blount (5), Darrius Bratton (5) and Jordan Redmon (5).
- UVA also returns Chris Moore, who had six starts in 2017 but missed 2018 with an injury.

RETURN OF THE MACK

- Senior inside linebacker Jordan Mack is UVA's leading returning tackler after finishing 2017 with 66 tackles. Despite missing four games with an injury in 2018, he still finished No. 2 on the team in stops behind current NFL safety Juan Thornhill (98).
- Mack is on the 2019 Bronko Nagurski Trophy Watch List and is UVA's candidate for the 2019 Campbell Trophy.
- Mack enters 2019 No. 2 in the ACC among active career tackle leader with 220 stops (No. 17 nationally). Miami's Shaquille Quarterman (249) is the only ACC player with more career tackles entering 2019.
- Finished No. 5 in the ACC with 114 tackles in 2017 (No. 26 nationally). Joining 2017 Campbell Trophy winner Micah Kiser, an All-American, and fellow All-American Quin Blanding, Mack was a part of the only "Power 5" trio (one of two in FBS) to each have at least 100 tackles in the same season.
- Mack's older brother, Charles, is on staff at UVA as a regional scout for the football program. Charles was a four-year letterwinner at Richmond and was on the field for the Spiders when Jordan made his collegiate debut in 2016. Jordan and Charles' father, Charles Mack Sr., played football at Georgia Tech (1983-87).

PERKINS IS A THREAT ON THE RUN

- QB Bryce Perkins is the nation's leading returning quarterback when it comes to avoided tackles. He led all "Power 5" quarterbacks with 46 last season, second only to UConn's David Pindell (56).
- Among quarterbacks, Perkins was also tied for No. 7 in the nation in 2018 among rushes of 15+ yards. He recorded 13 rushes of 15+ yards, tying him with Heisman Trophy winner Kyler Murray. When you take out the three option quarterbacks ahead of Perkins (and Murray), the UVA signal caller ranked tied for No. 4.
- Of all the quarterbacks with more rushes of 15+ yards than Perkins in 2018, none threw for over 2,500 yards. Perkins logged 2,680 passing yards. Only Ohio's Nathan Rourke returns in 2019 having more rushes of 15+ yards than Perkins. Rourke had 17 in 2018.

PERKINS ON THE VERGE OF 1,000-CAREER RUSHING YARDS

- Perkins needs 77 rushing yards to become the 44th Cavalier in program history with 1,000 career rushing yards. He would be only the third UVA quarterback to reach the milestone and first since Shawn Moore in 1990.
- In addition to 77 rushing yards, Perkins needs 320 passing yards to become the second Cavalier to amass 1,000 career rushing yards and 3,000 career passing yards, joining Shawn Moore (1987-90). Appearing in only 13 career games, Perkins is on track to reach the plateau faster than Moore (31 games).

PERKINS CAN JOIN SPECIAL COMPANY IN 2019

- Last year Perkins was one of two players in the nation with 2,600+ passing yards (2,680) and 900+ rushing yards (923), joining Heisman Trophy winner Kyler Murray (Oklahoma).
- Since the year 2000, Perkins and Murray are the only players in the nation in a single season to complete at least 64 percent of their passes, while also throwing for 2,000+ yards, rushing for 900+ yards and being responsible for at least 30 touchdowns.
- If Perkins manages 2,500+ passing yards, 500+ rushing yards, 30+ touchdowns responsible for and complete at least 60 percent of his passes, he will join a special list of the following quarterbacks over the past 10 years to post multiple seasons with those numbers: Marcus Mariota (3 times), JT Barrett (3 times), Robert Griffin III, Taylor Kelly, Johnny Manziel, Brett Hundley, Dak Prescott, Marquise Williams and Deshaun Watson.

HALL ANCHORS VIRGINIA SECONDARY

- CB Bryce Hall returns for his senior season after earning second-team All-America honors in 2018 when he led the nation with 22 pass breakups and 24 passes defended.
- According to Pro Football Focus (PFF), Hall led the ACC in forced incompleteness percentage (31.9 percent) in 2018. PFF has Hall ranked as the No. 1 defensive player in the country entering 2019 and the No. 4 FBS player overall.
- According to PFF, Hall ranked tied for first with LSU's Kristian Fulton in forced incompleteness percentage (38.9 percent) in Cover-0 and Cover-1 looks.
- Hall allowed just 2.9 yards after the catch in 2018 and had eight performances in which he held opposing receivers in his coverage to just single-digit yards after catch numbers.
- Hall has five career interceptions, three of which have come against former Duke quarterback and 2019 NFL first rounder Daniel Jones (Giants, sixth overall). Jones tossed nine interceptions in his three career games against Virginia.

HALL MAKING THE START AT CB

- Hall enters 2019 with 33 consecutive starts. That is the most in the nation among active cornerbacks. He made his first collegiate start on Oct. 15, 2016 when Pitt came to Scott Stadium.
- Hall is tied for No. 2 in the nation for consecutive starts among active defensive players. Iowa State DE JaQuan Bailey (33) and Oregon LB Troy Dye (33) are also tied with Hall. Kansas State DT Ryan Lacker (35) leads the nation's active defensive players in consecutive starts.

HOO IS THE NEXT OFFENSIVE WEAPON?

- UVA lost TB Jordan Ellis and HB Olamide Zaccheaus to graduation. The offensive duo in 2018 gave the Cavaliers a 1,000-yard rusher and 1,000-yard receiver in the same season for only the second time in program history (1990). Ellis finished with 1,026 rushing yards and Zaccheaus notched 1,058 receiving yards in 2018.
- UVA has a stable of running backs looking to replace Ellis' productivity, which includes PK Kier (junior), Wayne Taulapapa (sophomore), Chris Sharp (senior), Lamont Aitkins (sophomore) and Mike Hollins (freshman).
- At receiver, joining top returners Hasise Dubois and Joe Reed is rising third year Terrell Jana, sophomores Billy Kemp IV and Tavares Kelly Jr. Freshmen Dorian Goddard and Dontayvion Wicks look to add depth.
- UVA also welcomed two graduate transfers at wide receiver for 2019: Dejon Brissett (Richmond) and Terrell Chatman (Arizona State).

DUBOIS AND REED LOOK TO LEAD THE RECEIVING CORPS


- WRs Hasise Dubois and Joe Reed are on the verge of becoming the 40th and 41st Cavaliers to record at least 1,000-career receiving yards.
- Dubois holds the slight advantage in the race between the duo who will reach the career 1,000-yard plateau first, needing 203 yards. Reed needs 214 yards.
- The duo combined to catch 77 receptions for 1,043 yards and 12 touchdowns. They are looking to lead a receiving corps that lost Olamide Zaccheaus to graduation, UVA's career and single-season receptions leader. Zaccheaus became only UVA's third 1,000-yard single-season receiver in 2018 after breaking his own single-season receptions record with 93 for 1,058 yards and nine touchdowns.

QB Bryce Perkins needs 77 rushing yards to become the 44th Cavalier in program history with 1,000 career rushing yards. He would be only the third UVA quarterback to reach the milestone and first since Shawn Moore in 1990.

REED FINISHED 2018 WITH THE HOT HAND

- Over the last four games of the 2018 season, WR Joe Reed made nine receptions for 227 yards and five touchdowns. He averaged 25.2 yards per reception over UVA's last four games.
- For the season Reed averaged 18.6 yards per reception, which ranked No. 4 in the ACC and No. 19 in the nation. Reed added seven receiving touchdowns, which was second on the team.

REED IS SPECIAL ON "SPECIAL TEAMS"

- WR Joe Reed owns UVA's career all-time kick return yardage record with 2,246 career kick return yards.
- Reed also led UVA in 2018 in special teams tackles with seven. He has made five on kickoffs and two on punt returns.
- In 2018, Reed returned 26 kicks for 707 yards (27.2 yards per return), which was No. 2 in the ACC and No. 10 nationally.
- In 2017, Reed returned 29 kicks for 861 yards (29.7 yards per return), which was No. 1 in the ACC and No. 8 nationally.

MORE ON REED AND KICK RETURNS

- Since 2016, Joe Reed is the only "Power 5" player to average 27+ yard per kick return for his career as the senior enters 2019 with a 27.4 career average.
- Reed is one of two active FBS players to average 27+ yards per return for their career. Houston's Marcus Jones joins Reed. Jones owns a career average of 27.6 yards per return, which includes his 2017 and 2018 seasons played at Troy.
- Since 2000, Reed is one of eight "Power 5" players to average 27+ yards for a career. He is one of 22 FBS players since 2000 to average 27+ yards per kick return for a career.

JANA PUNCHES THE KEYS

- WR Terrell Jana taught himself to play the piano by watching YouTube videos in his spare time at Woodberry Forest. He originally started to learn a song to surprise his mom and ended up enjoying it so much he kept up the self-study.
- The song Jana set out to learn to play for his mom was Brian McKnight's "Crazy Love."

CAMPBELL TROPHY NOMINEE HELPS WITH LOCAL CAFE'

- ILB Jordan Mack is UVA's 2019 nominee for the prestigious Campbell Trophy (Academic Heisman).
- A community involvement he is passionate about is his work with the Kindness Café + Play, which is a café in Charlottesville that employs people with cognitive disabilities, creating a space where people with and without disabilities interact as peers and where connections are made. Jordan's volunteer work with the café includes marketing and promotion of the café locally about the need for such an endeavor in the community.

HAILING FROM THE GRAND CANYON STATE; IT'S AN ASU CONNECTION

- QB Bryce Perkins and graduate transfer WR Terrell Chatman were both part of the same recruiting class at Arizona State in 2015. Both current Cavaliers utilized a redshirt year with the Sun Devils in 2015.
- Perkins spent two seasons at ASU before transferring to Arizona Western JC for the 2017 season, followed by his move to Virginia in 2018. Chatman comes to Virginia after graduating last spring from Arizona State.
- Perkins and Chatman hit it off immediately through the recruiting process and were even roommates in Tempe. The duo are roommates again, this time in Charlottesville.
- Also, UVA's current director of football development & performance, Shawn Griswold, was the head coach for sports performance at Arizona State from 2012-17, working with both Perkins and Chatman. Griswold has been at UVA since 2018.

SEVEN CAVALIERS FROM KEY POSITIONS OWN 30+ CAREER GAMES PLAYED

- Entering 2019, six different Cavaliers have appeared in at least 30 career games at Virginia.
- Bryce Hall, Eli Hanback and Chris Sharp leads the way with 38 games played each. Hasise Dubois (37), Joe Reed (37), Tanner Cowley (34) and Jordan Mack (34) all have appeared in at least 30 career games for UVA.

2018 WAS A BIG CHANGE FOR UVA ON THIRD DOWN

- Virginia was No. 1 in the ACC and No. 6 in the nation in third-down conversion percentage (49.1), which was a vast improvement from 2017 when the Cavaliers were No. 8 in the ACC and No. 74 in the nation at 39.2 percent.

UVA PASSING GAME UNDER BRONCO MENDENHALL

- Four of the top seven single-game passing games from a quarterback standpoint have happened during the head coach Bronco Mendenhall and offensive coordinator Robert Anae's tenure at UVA (2016-pres.).
- Kurt Benkert, the starting quarterback in 2017 and 2018 owns the No. 1 (455, vs. UConn, 2017), No. 2 (421, vs. Central Michigan, 2016) and No. 6 (384, at Miami, 2017) spots. Current UVA quarterback Bryce Perkins has the No. 7 spot (379, vs. Ohio, 2018).
- Virginia also amassed 5,003 yards of total offense in 2018, marking the fifth time in program history a Cavalier team recorded over 5,000 yards in a single season. UVA also set a single-season program record with 276 first downs.

UVA ROSTER HAS THE THIRD-MOST FRESHMEN AND REDSHIRT FRESHMEN IN FBS

- Virginia has 63 freshmen and redshirt freshmen on its roster in 2019, which is tied for No. 3 in FBS.
- UVA's 63 total freshmen and redshirt freshmen is the most among teams that played in bowl games in 2018. Also, UVA's 48.46 percent of its roster is made up of freshmen and redshirt freshmen, which ranks No. 4 in FBS behind UCLA (53.3), Coastal Carolina (51.2) and Nebraska (50.9).

SCOTT STADIUM, HOME OF THE CAVALIERS

The Carl Smith Center, home of David A. Harrison III Field at Scott Stadium, with its unique architectural design, scenic setting on the University's Grounds and exceptional sight lines, is one of the nation's finest college football settings.

Opened in 1931, Scott Stadium might be one of the oldest campus college football stadiums in the nation, but you could never tell from its appearance. Numerous upgrades and expansions make it a modern home for the Cavaliers and their fans.

Scott Stadium was the gift of Frederic William Scott and Elisabeth Strother Scott, and was dedicated to the memory of his parents, Frederic Robert Scott and Frances Branch Scott.

Virginia played its dedication game at Scott Stadium on Oct. 15, 1931 against the Virginia Military Institute before a then-capacity crowd of 22,000. Prior to that season, the Cavaliers staged their home games at the University's Lambeth Field.

Virginia has played 470 games in the historic venue. UVA's all-time record at Scott Stadium stands at 265-193-12.

BRYCE PERKINS NOTES

IT IS A PERK TO HAVE BRYCE AT QUARTERBACK

- QB Bryce Perkins returns to Charlottesville for his senior season after breaking UVA's single-season record for total offense during his first season on Grounds with 3,603 total yards in 2018. Perkins broke the previous record by 459 yards, which was set a year earlier by Kurt Benkert.
- Perkins was one of two players in the nation with 2,600+ passing yards (2,680) and 900+ rushing yards (923), joining Heisman Trophy winner Kyler Murray (Oklahoma) in 2018.
- In fact, since the year 2000, Perkins and Murray are the only players in the nation in a single season to complete at least 64 percent of their passes, while also throwing for 2,000+ yards, rushing for 900+ yards and being responsible for at least 30 touchdowns.
- Perkins transferred to UVA January 2018 from Arizona Western Community College after leading the Matadors to the 2017 NJCAA Championship game, before falling 31-28 to East Mississippi.
- Perkins originally signed as a top recruit with hometown Arizona State, but never saw action during his two seasons in Tempe. He redshirted the 2015 season and missed the 2016 season with an injury.
- Perkins' father, Bruce, lettered at Arizona State in 1988 and 1989 as a fullback and later played briefly in the NFL. Perkins' older brother, Paul, was a three-year letterwinner at running back with the UCLA Bruins and currently plays with the New York Giants. Perkins' uncle, Don Perkins, played eight seasons in the NFL with the Cowboys.

PRO FOOTBALL FOCUS RATING BRYCE HALL

- Hall finished with an overall grade of 91.2 that included a coverage grade of 91.4, both of which lead all returning FBS cornerbacks, a group of 349 players who logged at least 200 snaps a season ago.
- There is no better returning cornerback from a season ago when it comes to tracking passes in the intermediate to deep range of the field, those passes targeted at least 10 yards downfield. Hall was targeted 44 times on throws in that range, allowing just 14 receptions while he came away with two interceptions and recorded 18 forced incomplections.
- According to PFF - "Hall may be more important to his team's success than any other non-offensive player in the country."

HALL OF SPEED CLOCKED AT 22.3 MPH

- Hall was clocked at 22.3 mph via the Catapult system he was wearing when he made a touchdown-saving tackle on Miami's Travis Homer, a rush that went for 70 yards in the 2018 meeting at Scott Stadium.
- Hall's touchdown-saving tackle eventually forced Miami to kick a field goal in a game UVA won over the then-No. 16 Hurricanes, 16-13.

Bronco Mendenhall Head Coach • Fourth Season

Bronco Mendenhall is in his fourth season as Virginia's head football coach after being named the program's 40th head coach on Dec. 4, 2015.

Mendenhall enters the 2019 season with a career record of 115-65, which includes a 99-43 mark in 11 seasons as the head coach at BYU. Between UVA and BYU, Mendenhall has led his teams to bowl games in 13-of-14 seasons as a head coach. That 92.9 percent rate ranks tied for No. 3 among active FBS head coaches with at least 10 years of FBS coaching.

After playing in the Military Bowl in 2017, Mendenhall led Virginia to back-to-back bowls in 2018 for the first time since 2004 and 2005 after the Cavaliers earned a Belk Bowl invite. Mendenhall's Cavalier squad shutout South Carolina, 28-0, in the 2018 Belk Bowl to give UVA its first bowl victory since the 2005 Music City Bowl. UVA's shutout performance was the first over an SEC team in a bowl game by a non-SEC team since the 1975 Gator Bowl.

Mendenhall is one of three active coaches that has inherited at least two programs in his career that were coming off a losing season and in year one, or year two, played in a bowl game. The others to do it are Nick Saban (Alabama, LSU, Michigan State) and Mark Dantonio (Michigan State/Cincinnati).

Year number three under Mendenhall saw great strides in performance on the field. UVA's defense finished No. 20 in the country and No. 3 in the ACC, allowing 330.5 yards per game, while finishing No. 21 in the nation and No. 3 in the ACC in scoring defense (20.1). UVA's defense finished No. 16 in the nation and No. 2 in the ACC in fewest passing yards allowed and the offense finished No. 6 in the nation and No. 1 in the ACC in third-down conversion percentage.

With Bryce Perkins at quarterback, UVA scored 370 points in 2018, which ranks No. 3 all-time for the Cavaliers. Perkins and Heisman Trophy winner Kyler Murray (Oklahoma) were the only players in the nation with 2,600+ passing yards and 900+ rushing yards. Under Mendenhall in 2018, Bryce Hall earned second-team All-America honors from both the Walter Camp Foundation and the Football Writers Association of America. Hall led the nation with 22 pass breakups and 24 passes defended. Hall, SS Juan Thornhill and HB Olamide Zaccheaus all earned first-team All-ACC accolades, leading UVA's eight selections. Thornhill finished 2018 No. 3 in the nation with six interceptions and Zaccheaus, the 2018 Belk Bowl MVP, was No. 1 in the ACC with 93 receptions (a UVA single-season record).

Mendenhall came to Charlottesville after 11 years as the head coach at Brigham Young University. In his 11 seasons, from 2005-2015, Mendenhall compiled an overall record of 99-43 at BYU to rank 12th in total wins among all FBS teams during that time.

In the three seasons prior to Mendenhall becoming the head coach at BYU, the Cougars compiled an overall record of 14-21. Over Mendenhall's 11 years at BYU, the Cougars were one of only 11 programs to advance to a bowl game each season (includes the 2015 season). BYU joined by Alabama, Boise State, Clemson, Florida State, Georgia, LSU, Oklahoma, Oregon, Virginia Tech and Wisconsin on that list.

Among those 11 teams, only Florida State has achieved more bowl wins (seven) than BYU's six bowl game victories.

The success of Mendenhall's leadership approach in running the BYU football program was highlighted in a management book, *Running Into the Wind: Bronco Mendenhall -- 5 Strategies for Building a Successful Team*, written by Alyson Von Feldt and Paul Gustavson, a leading management consultant specializing in leadership development and organizational design.

Mendenhall was elected in 2013 to the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees as the District 8 Representative and also serves on the AFCA Ethics Committee.

Mendenhall and his wife, Holly, have three sons, Raeder, Breaker and Cutter.
