## #2 VIRGINIA CAVALIERS (11-1-1, 5-1-0 ACC)



## **LOUISVLLE CARDINALS** (7-6-2, 3-3-1 ACC)

#### THURSDAY'S GAME VS. LOUISVILLE:

- Virginia enters the match ranked as highly as No. 2 in the national rankings.
- The contest is the first at home in almost four weeks for the Cavaliers after an extended road trip in ACC play that saw UVA post a 3-0 record.
- •The match closes out the regular season portion of the home schedule and comes before a senior day contest against No. 1 Florida State on Sunday.

#### **SERIES HISTORY:**

- Virginia faced Louisville for the first time in program history last season.
- The match will be the first for the Cavaliers against the Cardinals in the friendly confines of Klöckner Stadium.

#### **LAST MEETING WITH LOUISVILLE:**

- UVA went on the road and picked up a 2-1 win almost a year ago at UL.
- Makenzy Doniak scored the game-tying goal in the match in the 24th minute of play after the Cardinals went up with a goal at the 19-minute mark.
- •Tina lordanou scored the game-winning goal in the 43rd minute of play.
- Morgan Reuther provided the assist on both goals in the Cavalier win.
- Morgan Stearns picked up the win allowing the one goal and posting one save as Louisville was held to only six shots for the game.

#### LAST TIME OUT FOR THE CAVALIERS:

- The Cavaliers posted a fourth straight victory, winning 4-2 at Boston College.
- The win was the third consecutive on the road for Virginia this season.
- Brittany Ratcliffe scored what proved to be the game-winning goal in the 80th minute of play off a shot from Betsy Brandon that hit the post.
- Makenzy Doniak tied the school record for points in a career with a goal and an assist to bring her four-year total to 138 points.
- It marked only the second road win for UVA over Boston College.

#### **HIGH SCORING HOOS:**

- The Cavaliers have picked up where 2014 left off, ranking among the national leaders in scoring with 3.08 goals per game (2nd) entering the week.
- Virginia led the nation in scoring in 2013 at 3.00 goals per game and finished second in 2014 with 3.38 goals per game.
- The Cavaliers are tied for second in the ACC with 40 goals scored on the year.
- UVa has 11 different goal scorers this season, including nine players with multiple goals through 13 games on the season.
- Virginia has scored at least two goals in 10 matches this season.
- 13 different Cavaliers have assisted on goals this season, paced by seven from Makenzy Doniak.
- Virginia is tied for sixth nationally in assists with 40 heading into the match.

#### **KLÖCK-WORK AT HOME:**

- Virginia posted a school-record 38 consecutive home games prior to a loss to No. 6 Notre Dame on September 25.
- It was the sixth-longest streak in NCAA Division I women's soccer history.
- Of those 38 wins, 27 were shutouts by the Cavaliers.
- Prior to the loss to the Fighting Irish, the Cavaliers last lost at home in the NCAA Tournament against Duke to end the 2012 season.
- Virginia followed up the loss with a 1-0 victory over No. 19 Duke on Sunday.
- The Cavaliers are 7-1 in the friendly confines of Klöckner Stadium in 2015.

#### DONIAK RISING UP THE UVA RECORD BOOK:

- Makenzy Doniak is closing in on the top spot of several offensive categories in Virginia history in her senior season.
- She ranks 2nd in goals (53), tied for first in points (138) and 5th in GWG (15).
- She became the first Cavalier to post two 40-point seasons (46 pts in 2013 and 51 pts in 2014).

#### **DONIAK TIES HUCLES FOR UVA CAREER POINTS RECORD:**

- Makenzy Doniak tied the UVA school record for points in a career this past Sunday when she tallied a goal and an assists at Boston College.
- The senior tied the mark set by Angela Hucles in the 1999 season.
- Doniak's goal in the first minute of play marked the first time for UVA to score a goal in the opening minute since Hucles did it in 1999.

#### **COX, REUTHER TALLY HAT TRICKS:**

- Meghan Cox and Morgan Reuther have both tallied hat tricks for the topranked Cavaliers this season and it's part of why the pair lead the squad in goals.
- Cox delivered her first career hat trick in the season opener against UNCW.
- Reuther delivered her second career hat trick in a 3-0 win over Harvard.

#### DONIAK, SONNETT NAMED TO MAC HERMANN TROPHY WATCH LIST:

- Makenzy Doniak and Emily Sonnett found themselves both on the pre season watch list for the MAC Hermann Trophy entering 2015.
- The award is presented annually to the top collegiate player.
- Doniak has been a semifinialst each of the previous two seasons, while departed senior Morgan Brian claimed the award in 2014.



#### **ACC SETTING THE STANDARD:**

- The ACC continues to set the standard when it comes to women's soccer on the national scene, boasting seven teams in the national rankings.
- Three of the top five teams all hail from the ACC in the Soccer America poll.
- Six of the top 10 come from the ACC in the latest poll released by Soccer America.

#### **VIRGINIA IN THE RPI:**

• The Cavaliers come in with an RPI of eight in the latest version released by the NCAA this week, the third highest in the ACC behind Florida State (1) and Clemson (2).

#### **CAVALIERS MOVING THE BALL AROUND**

- The Cavaliers have posted an 11-1-1 record this season, but Virginia hasn't been relying on one player to carry the load as six different players have game-winning goals this season.
- Alexis Shaffer leads the way with three GWG (Old Dominion, Duke, at Wake Forest).
- Makenzy Doniak (UNCW, Syracuse), Brittany Ratcliffe (at Clemson, at Boston College) and Morgan Reuther (Delaware, Harvard) all have two GWG.
- Courtney Petersen (Cal Poly) and Meghan Cox (at UCLA) have one GWG.

#### **SONNETT TRAVELING WITH USWNT:**

- Cavalier senior defender Emily Sonnett is currenty on the road traveling with the USWNT on its Victory Tour after winning the 2015 Women's World Cup.
- Sonnett was tabbed to practice with the team and fill out the roster as the UWNT faces Brazil in both Seattle and Orlando this week.

#### **SWANSON ASSISTED USWNT:**

- Virginia head coach Steve Swanson had a busy summer, serving as an assistant coach with the US Women's National Team.
- Swanson worked with the team last fall, missing only one game during the season as he helped train the team that won the 2015 Women's World Cup.

#### FORMER CAV COLAPRICO NAMED NWSL ROOKIE OF THE YEAR:

- Former Cavalier Danielle Colaprico was named the NWSL Rookie of the Year this past week after helping lead Chicago to a second-place finish.
- Colaprico started all 20 games, scoring one goal and played all but 24 minutes on the season.

#### SAUERBRUNN NAMED NWSL DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR:

- Former Cavalier Becky Sauerbrunn also picked up honors from the NWSL when she was named the Defensive Player of the Year this week.
- It marks the third consecutive season for Sauerbrunn to claim the award.

#### **UP NEXT:**

- The Cavaliers continue to play at home, hosting top ranked Florida State on Sunday at 1 p.m. to continue Atlantic Coast Conference play.
- The contest with the top-ranked Seminoles is a rematch of last season's national championship match and showdown against the only team to beat the Cavaliers a year ago.
