GAME OVERVIEW

· Virginia returns to action on Saturday night for a non-conference tilt with Johns Hopkins in the battle for the Doyle Smith Cup. Faceoff is set for 6 p.m. at historic Homewood Field

• This week Virginia is ranked No. 9 in both the USILA coaches and Inside Lacrosse/Maverik media polls. Johns Hopkins is No. 15 in the coaches poll and No. 16 in the media poll.

THE SERIES VS. THE BLUE JAYS

• The 2019 season marks the 73rd straight season the Cavaliers and the Blue Jays have clashed in an all-time series that began in 1904. Johns Hopkins holds the all-time advantage with a 61-31-1 mark, however Virginia has won nine of the last 16 meetings, including a streak of six in a row before dropping six of the last 10 matchups. • Virginia's 93 all-time games against the Blue Jays is the most games the Cavaliers have played against any opponent in their history.

LAVIANO NAMED ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

 UVA's Ian Laviano has been named ACC Offensive Player of the Week for the second time this season (March 18) after leading the Cavaliers with a game-high five goals in their 13-11 triumph over then-No. 7 Notre Dame (March 16). He had the go-ahed goal and three scores during an 8-1 Cavalier run that finished the game. The win snapped a seven-game losing streak to the Irish.



Attackman Ian Laviano was named ACC Offensive Player of the Week for the second time in 2019 and for the third time in his career after helping lead UVA to its ACC win over No. 7 Notre Dame. The sophomore leads UVA with 22 goals in 2019.

#GOHOOS: BY THE NUMBERS

A win Saturday will give UVA its first five-game winning streak since opening the 2014 season 6-0.
Michael Kraus has at least one point in all 39 career games he has ap-

peared in. The active streak is tied for No. 4 in the nation.

Virginia and Johns Hopkins are meeting for the 94th time. UVA has played more games against Hopkins than any other program.

COVERING THE CAVALIERS

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

RADIO

Broadcasts are made from the radio broadcast facilities in Klöckner Stadium. There is one courtesy line available for use by visiting radio crews. Adequate space is available for the visiting team needs. Arrangement for broadcasts must be validated in advance through the UVA Athletics Media Relations Office.

INTERVIEWS

All requests for interviews with coaches and players should be made through Vincent Briedis in the Athletics Media Relations Office. Postgame interviews are conducted at field level following the postgame handshake. Locker rooms are closed.

THE SERIES VS. JOHNS HOPKINS

· Johns Hopkins holds a commanding 61-31-1 record in the all-time series.

• The rivalry between the two schools goes all the way back to two meetings in 1904, well before lacrosse was recognized as a varsity sport at UVA.

• The teams have met at least once every season since 1948, the longest current series of any Virginia opponent

• Virginia has closed the gap recently by winning 18 of the last 30.

- John Hopkins' 61 wins over Virginia are by far the most wins by any school over the Cavaliers.
- Virginia has also played more games against Hopkins than any one else (93).

• Five of the last seven regular season games have been won in overtime. Johns Hopkins won in 2012 at Klöckner Stadium and 2017 at Homewood Field, while UVA won 2014 and 2016 at klöckner Stadium, and in 2015 at Homewood Field.

• In 2015 meeting at Homewood Field UVA scored two goals in the final 1:34 of regulation to force overtime and for the second season in a row Greg Coholan scored an overtime goal to give UVA a win over the Blue Jays. Ryan Tucker added five goals in the win at Homewood Field, only UVA's 10th all-time win in 46 tries at Charm City's historic edifice. Coholan scored the overtime-winning goal in 2014 at Klöckner Stadium. Coholan scored with 20 seconds left in regulation to force overtime in the 2016 installment at Klöckner Stadium. Mike D'Amario scored an unassisted game-winning goal at 3:41 in the overtime period.

THE CLASH FOR THE DOYLE SMITH CUP

• Virginia and Johns Hopkins meet once again with the Doyle Smith Cup at stake.

The two schools have joined to honor E. Doyle Smith, Jr., for his lifetime of contributions to the lacrosse programs at both schools and on the national level with the annual winner laying claim to the cup.
Virginia won the cup the first five times it was presented before losing possession in 2011 at Homewood Field. Johns Hopkins won the 2012, 2013, 2017 and 2018 meetings as well.

The cup returned to Charlottesville with UVA's 11-10 OT win at Klöckner Stadium in 2014. A 16-15 OT win at Homewood Field in 2015 kept the cup in Charlottesville. UVA won the cup for the third year in a row after an OT win at home in 2016, a 13-12 triumph.
Smith served as team manager and statistician for Johns Hopkins under coach Bob Scott from 1963-1968.

• He enrolled at UVA to pursue a doctorate in the fall of 1968, and became the University's first full-time assistant sports information director, a position he held for 31 years until his retirement in 1999, serving as the lacrosse team's publicist for four head coaches—Buddy Beardmore, Glenn Thiel, Jim Adams and Dom Starsia.

• On the national level, Smith was one of the nation's foremost authorities on the sport as his name is synonymous with the game's history and record keeping.

• He served as the information director compiling the weekly rankings and statistics for the United States Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association (USILA) from 1973-95 and twice received its Man of the Year Award. The USILA media award bears his name.

• In 2000 he was elected to the US Lacrosse Hall of Fame and is believed to be the only individual inducted who never played or coached the game at some level.

• Smith passed away in June 2004, not long after the 2004 national championship game.

MORE ON THE HOPKINS SERIES

• The Blue Jays have dominated the series in Baltimore, winning 36-of-47 match-ups at Homewood Field (with one tie).

• The series is more even when played in Charlottesville with the Blue Jays holding the 22-16 advantage.

• Ten of the last 19 games have been barn burners decided by one goal (Hopkins won four).

This game features some historical patterns that could bode well for the Cavaliers. Known as a team that likes the up-tempo pace, Virginia would certainly like to see its offense explode vs. the Blue Jays since the Cavaliers are 24-11 all-time when scoring at least 10 goals, but have lost four of the last six times they have scored at least 10 goals.
In fact, when UVA scores more than 13+ goals they have won 17-of-22 games against Hopkins.

• The Cavaliers can also be successful if they are able to contain the Hopkins offense because they are 18-7-1 when allowing fewer than 10 goals (2008's 13-12 UVA overtime win ended a streak of 10 consecutive games with single-digit goals by the Blue Jays).

HISTORY SUGGESTS RANKINGS DON'T MEAN TOO MUCH

• One of the characteristics of the Virginia vs. Johns Hopkins series since the late 1980s is the inability to use rankings as a predictor of victory.

• The higher ranked team has lost 19 of the last 32 regular season meetings dating back to 1987.

In fact, from 1990-1995, the higher ranked squad lost each time.
UVA lost three of the last four regular season matchups as the higher ranked team, including 2012's No. 1 vs. No. 2 meeting - in 2011 UVA was No. 2 and Johns Hopkins was No. 11. UVA won the 2015 meeting in overtime, 16-15, as the No. 7 team and Johns Hopkins was the No. 19 team. The 2014 matchup went in favor of UVA, 11-10, in overtime as the Cavaliers were the No. 10 team in the nation and Johns Hopkins was No. 9. In 2016 Johns Hopkins was No. 8 and UVA was unranked for a Cavalier win.

• In 2018 Johns Hopkins won as the higher ranked team.

• UVA is ranked No. 9 this week, while Johns Hopkins is No. 15.

DEFENSE SHINES AGAINST NOTRE DAME

• Team defense against then-No. 7 Notre Dame was on point as they forced the Irish into a season-high 22 turnovers in UVA's 13-11 win. UVA's 11 caused turnovers were also a season high for a Notre Dame opponent.

• The Irish entered the game as the nation's No. 3 clearing team, but failed a season-high four clears against the Cavaliers.

UVA's defensive effort held Notre Dame's top two scorers to a combined three points (Bryan Costabile 1 goal, Brendan Gleason 2 assists).
UVA's SSDM John Fox caused two crucial turnovers in the game's final two minutes that helped preserve UVA's lead, including one to close the game on Notre Dame's final offensive possession.

KRAUS HEATING UP OVER LAST FOUR GAMES

Michael Kraus has been on fire during UVA's current four-game winning streak. He boasts 11 goals and nine assists for 20 total points.
UVA has also won three of those games in overtime. Kraus has had a hand in each of the game-winning goals in overtime. At Princeton and Syracuse he had the game-winning assist, while vs. Brown he had the game-winning goal.

• In the Notre Dame game, Kraus tied the game with his goal at 11:11 in the fourth quarter. The Cavaliers overcame a five-goal deficit in the second half and never trailed again.

UVA DEFENSE FORCING SHOT CLOCK VIOLATIONS

• UVA's defense has forced 10 shot clock violations through the first seven games of the season.

• On offense, UVA has only had two shot clock violations which came on back-to-back possessions at Princeton.

UVA ROCKING THE ASSISTS

• UVA has scored 87 goals through four games this year and has assisted 55 of them. That means UVA has recorded an assist on 63.2 percent of its goals in 2019.

DEFENDING THE CLEAR

• In seven games this season, UVA is limiting its opponents to a 72.4 clearing percentage (105-of-145), which is 5.7 failed clears per game by UVA opponents.

• Contrast, UVA is clearing at an 81.2 percent rate (108-of-133), failing 3.5 clears per game.

KRAUS HAS A POINT IN 39-STRAIGHT GAMES

• Michael Kraus has a point in all 39 games of his career, which ranks tied for No. 4 among active players.

DOX AITKEN SETS ANOTHER UVA RECORD

• M Dox Aitken reached 100 career points (75-25-100) on Feb. 18 vs. High Point. He is the quickest midfielder in UVA history to the milestone, reaching so in 36 games.

 Aitken broke the previous record of 39 games by Pete Eldredge (1969-72).

UVA RECORDS BACK-TO-BACK ROAD RANKED WINS

• UVA won in overtime, 15-14, at then-No. 14 Syracuse on March 2. With a win at then-No. 19 Princeton (12-11, OT), UVA won back-toback road games against ranked opponents for the first time since 2012.

• In a seven-day span in 2012, UVA won at then-No. 9 Maryland (12-8) on March 31, followed by a win at then-No. 9 UNC (15-10) on April 7.

UVA HAS NO EASY OUTS TO BEGIN THE 2019 SEASON

• Of UVA's first 12 opponents of the 2019 season, 10 have been ranked so far this season.

• This week eight of those opponents are currently ranked. UVA's win over then-No. 19 Princeton knocked the Tigers from the polls. UVA also plays Richmond, who dropped out of the Top 20 last week.

• UVA's first five games of 2019 feature an opponent currently ranked, or previously ranked in the polls in 2019.

• Of UVA's first 12 games, only Brown and Utah have not been ranked at some point this season. Brown was receiving votes heading into the UVA game.

AITKEN CLIMBS UVA MIDFIELDER SCORING LISTS

• Midfielder Dox Aitken (85) needs one goal to pass Chris Rotelli (85) for sole possession of No. 5 all-time at UVA for career goals among midfielders.

• With 85 career goals, Aitken has reached the 80-goal mark guicker than any other midfielder in UVA history.

• Aitken needs three points to pass Kyle Dixon (112) for No. 5 in career midfielder points at UVA.

 Aitken is only the second Cavalier midfielder to reach his 100th career point as a third year, joining Shamel Bratton.

• Bratton reached his 100th career point in career game No. 53, while Aitken is the quickest UVA midfielder to 100 points, doing so in 36 career games. Pete Eldredge (1969-72) was the previous record holder reaching 100 career points as a fourth year in career game 39.

• Currently UVA is No. 3 in the nation with 40.57 ground balls per game. • Entering 2019, UVA has led the nation in ground balls five of the last 10 years, including the last two seasons under Lars Tiffany.

• In 2018, UVA ranked No. 1 in the nation in ground balls (38.00).

• UVA is the only school in the nation to finish in the Top-5 nationally in ground balls per game nine times over the last 10 seasons.

• Duke is the closest team to UVA, finishing in the Top-5 four times during the same span.

• The only school in 2016 to finish with more ground balls per game was UVA head coach Lars Tiffany's 2016 Brown team.

VIRGINIA AND OVERTIME IN 2019

• UVA had a three-game stretch where the Cavaliers played three overtime games in a row.

• It is only the third time in program history UVA played three consecutive games that went to overtime. It was the first time in program history UVA won all three games with wins at then-No. 19 Princeton (12-11), at then No. 14 Syracuse (15-14) and vs. Brown (14-13).

UVA last played three consecutive overtime games in 2017, going 1-2 with wins vs. Cornell and back-to-back losses to Notre Dame and Johns Hopkins. UVA also played three overtime games in a row in the 1980 NCAA Tournament, beating Cornell and North Carolina before falling to Johns Hopkins in double OT for the NCAA title.
UVA has never played four consecutive overtime games.

• UVA is 5-2 all-time in overtime under Lars Tiffany, including 2-1 at Klöckner Stadium.

VIRGINIA ON THE GREEN GRASS OF KLÖCKNER

• Virginia owns a 140-39 (.7821) all-time record at Klöckner Stadium, including a 3-1 mark in 2019. UVA also is 11-3 all-time at Klöckner Stadium in the NCAA Tournament.

• UVA is 14-7 all-time at Klöckner Stadium under head coach Lars Tiffany.

Klöckner Stadium first hosted lacrosse in 1993.

TIFFANY CONNECTED TO UVA'S TITLE COACHES

• UVA head coach Lars Tiffany is connected in the lacrosse world to both Glenn Thiel and Dom Starsia, the two Virginia coaches who brought NCAA titles to Charlottesville.

• Tiffany played for Starsia at Brown and coached under Thiel at Penn State (2000-04).

VIRGINIA IN THE POLLS

• Virginia has been ranked in the top five of the USILA Coaches poll 281 weeks all-time.

• UVA has been ranked in the Top 10 in 423 polls all-time.

• The USILA Poll began in 1973.

TIFFANY DOES A RARE THING VS. BROWN

• UVA head coach Lars Tiffany has been the head coach at Stony Brook, Brown and now Virginia.

With UVA's win over Brown, Tiffany owns at least one career win over every program he has served as a head coach. Tiffany is 2-0 all-time against Stony Brook, winning once as the Brown head coach and once as the UVA head coach. Tiffany is 1-1 against Virginia, winning as the Brown head coach and losing as the Stony Brook head coach. He is 1-0 against Brown, winning at the Virginia head coach.
Only one other active coach that has had at least three DI head coaching jobs has career wins over each of the three programs he has coached. Tiffany joins Duke's John Danowski who coached C.W. Post when they were a DI program, as well as Hofstra and Duke. Danowski has beat all three of those DI programs as a DI head coach.

2019 CAPTAINS NAMED

• Midfielder Ryan Conrad, attackman Michael Kraus and midfielder Dave Smith have been selected by their peers as the captains of the 2019 men's lacrosse team.

• Conrad is the first back-to-back captain since Steele Stanwick in 2011 and 2012.

• Michael Kraus and Conrad in 2018 are the first two "third-years" named captain since Stanwick in 2011. Greg Coholan and Tanner Scales each were named captains as redshirt jurniors during their fourth year on Grounds.

FIRST-TIME OPPONENTS

• UVA has three first-time opponents on its schedule in 2019, hosting Lehigh (Feb. 16), Marist (April 20) and Utah (March 31).

• The last time UVA had at least three first-time opponents on its schedule was 2005 with regular season meetings with Manhattan and Mount St. Mary's, followed by an NCAA Tournament showdown with Albany.

After UVA took the lead for good, Moore scored unassisted to give UVA a two-goal cushion, 12-10. The Irish broke through with 2:54 left on a Quinn McCahon goal via a Brian Willetts pass. Notre Dame won the ensuing faceoff, but a clutch caused turnover from John Fox of Notre Dame's Griffin Westlin created another UVA offensive opportunity. With 54 seconds left, Dox Aitken stuck a high-to-high shot to give the Cavaliers the final two-goal win. The Irish won the following faceoff, but Moore and Fox each caused turnovers that derailed all comeback plans for Notre Dame.

FROM THE LOCKER ROOM

"What a game of runs. First it was Notre Dame's turn to pull far-far away from us over the second and third quarter, and they just made plays. They were picking up the tough ground balls and getting extra possessions, and then converting on man-up opportunities. I have to give them a lot of credit for their man-up and what they did to us in the first half. We have been down four [goals] and come from behind, but we hadn't been down five [goals] before. Fortunately, we were able to get those late ground balls. Ryan Conrad had seven ground balls and it was huge, he gives us those extra possessions.
