EYE ON THE TIGERS

Princeton makes its 22nd appearance in the NCAA Tournament with an 11-6 overall record. The Tigers were co-champions in the Ivy League and finished second at the Ivy League Tournament. Princeton is currently ranked No. 18 in the IWLCA poll and No. 17 in the Inside Lacrosse poll.

Eight players have 20 or more points in a potent offense led by junior Erin McMunn. McMunn has 52 points on 40 goals and 12 assists. Junior Erin Slifer has 44 points on 23 goals and a team-high 21 assists. Freshman Olivia Hompe comes in off the bench with 39 points on 19 goals and 20 helpers. Sophomore Alexandra Bruno adds 36 points on 24 goals and 12 assists and the Ivy League Midfielder of the Year Sarah Lloyd has 30 points with 25 coming via goals. Senior Mary-Kate Sivilli adds 28 points, followed by sophomore Anya Gersoff with 26 and freshman Anna Doherty with 25. The school record holder in draw controls, Lloyd has a team-high 33 this season while Slifer has 30 to her credit. Lloyd is also the team leader in ground balls with 24, with senior Liz Cutting following up with 23. Sophomore defender Liz Bannantine has 20 caused turnovers, with senior Colleen Smith second with 14 followed by Lloyd with 11. Junior Annie Woehling is 10-3 in net, starting the last 13 games. She has an 8.29 goals against average and a .453 save percentage.

THE SERIES

Princeton leads the all-time series with Penn State, 21-13 since the teams first met in 1982. Penn State won this year's meeting a 13-12 game, ending a five-game win streak for Princeton in the series. Two of the last four meetings have been one-goal games. This is the fourth NCAA tournament meeting for the teams, but the first on neutral territory. Princeton hosted Penn State on three previous occasions and is 2-1 in those games.

Erin McMunn and Sarah Lloyd have done well for themselves against Penn State. McMunn has 11 points on five goals and six assists over three games. Lloyd has nine goals and an assist in four games, including 17 draws, 10 ground balls and seven caused turnovers.

Penn State head coach Missy Dougherty was an assistant coach under Chris Sailer at Princeton from 2001-03, while Amy Altig was an assistant coach for the Tigers from 2007-2010.

SCOUTING THE NITTANY LIONS

Like Princeton, Penn State earned an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament. The team lost 13-10 to Johns Hopkins in the first round of the ALC Championship game after finishing the regular-season fourth in the league. With a 10-7 record the Nittany Lions are ranked No. 8 in the IWLCA poll and No. 11 in the Inside Lacrosse poll.

Another similarity is Penn State's offense, as eight players have 20+ points. Sophomore Madison Cyr is the leading scorer with 39 goals and seven assists for 46 points. Junior Maggie McCormick has 43 points on 19 goals and 24 assists. Senior Mackenzie Cyr also has 24 assists and has scored 16 goals for 40 points. Junior Tatum Coffey contributes 23 goals and 14 assists for 37 points. Sophomore Jenna Moschetti, junior Kelly Lechner and junior Jess Loizeaux have 33 points apiece and freshman Abby Smucker chips in 25. Moschetti has won a team-high 68 draw controls with Lechner adding support with 35 and Madison Cyr winning 31. Moschetti and senior Lauren Purvis match each other in ground balls with a team-high 27 each, while Purvis has caused a team-best 29 turnovers. Freshman Cat Rainone has emerged recently as the starting keeper, starting the last two games, including the game against Princeton. Rainone is 5-4 in goal with a 9.71 GAA and a .407 save percentage. Sophomore Emi Smith has equal numbers with a 5-3 mark with a 9.39 GAA and a .432 save percentage.

LAST TIME WE MET

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (4/26/14) – A second-half comeback from No. 19 ranked Princeton fell short by just one goal as the Tigers lost to No. 8 Penn State 13-12 in the regular-season finale.

Princeton (10-5) trailed 8-4 at halftime, the first time the team trailed at halftime in 13 games, since Georgetown on March 1. It was also the first time the team had been down by four goals since that Georgetown game.

The Nittany Lions took their largest lead of the game, 13-7, with 10 minutes to play in the second half. That's when the Tigers stormed back, going on a 5-0 run to make it a one-goal game.

It started on that next draw, as sophomore Alexandra Bruno won it and fed junior Erin McMunn for the score. Less than a minute later junior Blake Dietrick scored her first goal of the season. Sophomore Anna Menke received a pass from senior Mary-Kate Sivilli and buried one, and with less than six minutes remaining it was a 13-10 game.

Penn State (10-6) called a timeout but it didn't stop the Princeton rally. Freshman Amanda Leavell won the next draw but Sivilli's shot went into goalie Cat Rainone's stick. Dietrick caused a turnover, collected the ground ball and a clear was followed up with a free-position attempt. Bruno converted on the attempt with 3:10 left and just like that it was a one-goal game.

The Nittany Lions won the ensuing draw and ran two minutes off the clock before finally turning the ball over. A yellow card on Erika Spilker with 30 seconds remaining gave Princeton a chance and set up Lloyd for a free-position attempt. Lloyd's eight-meter shot was saved by Rainone, but Dietrick got the loose ball and fed Lloyd for the goal with 12 seconds left to make it 13-12.

Lloyd captured the next draw but time ran out before Princeton could get the equalizer.

Lloyd had a four-goal game with two draw controls and two ground balls. Bruno and Sivilli each had a goal and two assists, and Gersoff scored twice. Leavell and senior Colleen Smith won three draws apiece and sophomore Liz Bannantine had two caused turnovers. Senior Caroline Franke made two saves on three shots in the final 17:46, coming in on relief of starter Annie Woehling.

Mackenzie Cyr had a six-point game with three goals and three assists. Mosketti scored four goals and Lecher had two goals and an assist. Loizeaux and Madison Cyr tallied two goals each. Rainone finished the game with seven saves.

PSU had a slim 25-24 edge in shots, and won 13 ground balls to Princeton's 10. The Tigers won the battle at the center circle with 16 draws to 11. Princeton committed 11 turnovers and PSU eight.

The teams went back-and-forth with goals to start the game. Princeton got its first two goals from Lloyd and a man-up goal from Sivilli who assisted on Lloyd's first goal, with Bruno getting an assist as the team's sat 4-3 at 12:44. Rainone held up leading scorer McMunn for her fifth save of the day just 18 minutes into the game, letting the Princeton attack know it would have its work cut out for them.

PSU grabbed the first multiple-goal lead of the day as the Nittany Lions, as they closed out the half on a 4-1 run to lead 8-4 at the break.

The final Princeton goal scorer of the first half, Gersoff, got the second half started with a goal. Eighteen seconds later, Lloyd won the draw and scored for the hat trick and forcing PSU into a timeout with an 8-6 lead.

The Nittany Lions went on a 3-1 run to take a 12-7 lead at 17:46 and Princeton was forced to make some changes during a called timeout. Franke replaced Woehling who left with five saves.

After a yellow card to defender Maddy Rodriguez and four straight free-position attempts awarded to the Nittany Lions it seemed like Princeton wouldn't be able to get back in this one, especially after Mackenzie Cyr gave her team it's largest lead, 13-7 at 9:57.

TIGERS IN THE TOURNAMENT

The Tigers have made 21 appearances in the National Collegiate/NCAA Division I Women's Lacrosse Championship (1983, 1989, 1992, 1993, 1994, 1995, 1996, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2011, 2013) the third most appearances by a team. The team has 31-18 record in the tournament, and had a 12-year streak of NCAA tournament appearances from 1998-2009.

WE ARE THE CHAMPIONS

Princeton has won three national titles, in 1994, 2002 and 2003. The Tigers have made it to the championship round 11 times since the NCAA began the tournament in 1982.

BACK IN THE POLL

Princeton got back into the national polls on April 21 and is currently ranked No. 18 in the IWLCA poll and No. 17 in the Inside Lacrosse Poll. The Tigers received votes for six weeks (3/10-4/14), during which time they went 9-1.

Sarah Lloyd is the school record holder in draw controls with 145. She surpassed Hilary Maddox '00 former record of 131 against Yale on April 5.

CLOSING IN

Junior Erin McMunn is two goals away from her 100th career goal, with 98 after a 10-goal weekend in the Ivy League Tournament. She ranks 11th all-time in scoring at Princeton with 169 points. She is second all-time in assists with 71, 10 shy of the record.

WATCH THIS

Erin McMunn was named to the 2014 Tewaaraton Award Watch List. It marked the second season she has made the Tewaaraton Watch List. At the time of the announcement, McMunn was leading the team in scoring after two games with four goals and five assists for nine points, and on a 23-game scoring streak.

STAYING FRESH

Four Princeton freshman have started in games this season. Madeline Rodriguez has started in all 17 games, Anna Doherty in 14, Amanda Leavell in 11 and Olivia Hompe in eight. Midfielders Doherty and Hompe are in the top six on the team in scoring. Rodriguez and Leavell are defenders.

HOUSE WARMING

This is the third season at the Tigers' new field Sherrerd Field at Class of 1952 Stadium. Last year, Princeton posted an undefeated 7-0 record at home. It marked the seventh undefeated home season in program history. All-time Princeton is 215-81-4 when playing at home.

GO WEST

Princeton traveled to California for the first time in program history this season. The Tigers defeated both USC and San Diego State. It marked the furthest Princeton has gone for in-season play, surpassing Evanston, Ill.

HEFTY HARDWARE

Two members of the team are also a member of another Princeton varsity team:

Sophomore Anya Gersoff is a goalie for the field hockey team that won the 2013 national championship and two Ivy League titles.

Junior Blake Dietrick has won two Ivy League titles with women's basketball, playing in two NCAA Tournaments and one WNIT.

SUPER SAILER

US National Lacrosse Hall of Fame head coach Chris Sailer has coached and won more games in the NCAA Division I Women's Lacrosse Tournament than any other coach. Sailer has coached 47 tournament games and has a record of 30-17. Sailer is just the second coach to win 300+ games. In 27 years of coaching she has a 343-137 record, ranking second all-time amongst Division I coaches in wins and is second among active DI coaches. Only Cindy Timchal has more wins at 444-112 in her 33 years of coaching.
