QUICK HITS

AROUND THE ACC

Four teams from the ACC - Clemson (4-0), Duke (4-0), NC State (3-0) and Syracuse (4-0) - remain undefeated heading into week five of the 2018 season. That ties for the most undefeated teams among Power 5 conferences.

■ Clemson is 4-0 for the fourth straight year, and is only the third team in ACC history to accomplish that feat (FSU 1992-97, FSU 2012-15). The Tigers rank fourth in the nation in total defense.

■ Duke moved into the Associated Press Top 25 poll for the first time this season at No. 22. Dating back to last year, Duke has won seven consecutive contests and owns the fourth-longest active win streak in the nation. The seven-game winning streak is Duke's longest since winning eight in a row in 2013.

■ NC State moved to 3-0 last week with a 37-20 road win at Marshall. Behind the play of quarterback Ryan Finley, the Wolfpack as won five straight dating back to last season, which is the seventh-longest streak in the country. Finley is averaging 352.0 yards passing per game, and is only the third ACC QB since 2000 to start a season with three straight games of 300-plus passing yards.

■ Syracuse is 4-0 for the first since 1991, and just the fifth time in school history. The Orange lead the league and is 10th in the nation in scoring offense at 49.5 points per game.

WEEK FIVE HIGHLIGHTS

- North Carolina travels to Miami for a Thursday night contest on ESPN at 8 p.m. from Hard Rock Stadium in Miami Gardens, Florida. The Hurricanes are 18-5 all-time in ESPN Thursday night games, including a win over the Tar Heels in 2013. The Hurricanes are 11-1 in Thursday night home games.

- In a battle of unbeaten teams, third-ranked Clemson plays host to Syracuse on Saturday at noon on ABC. The home-standing Tigers seek to avenge their only ACC loss of the 2017 season, while the Orange will try to spring an upset for the second consecutive year.

- In Raleigh, North Carolina, undefeated NC State takes on Virginia at 12:20 p.m. on Raycom Sports. The game features the league's top two players in total offense. NC State's Ryan Finley leads the ACC with 353.7 total yards per game, while Virginia's Bryce Perkins is second at 296.0. This will mark the first time NC State and Virginia have met on the gridiron since the 2012 season. NC State head coach Dave Doeren is in his sixth year with the Wolfpack and is facing the Cavaliers for the first time.

- With each team looking for its first conference win, Florida State travels to Louisville for a 3:30 p.m. kick-off on ESPN2. Florida State has won 14 of the 18 all-time meetings in the series, but the Cardinals have claimed the two most recent.

- The final game of the day matching two ACC teams is Virginia Tech at No. 22/23 Duke at Wallace Wade Stadium. Kickoff is set for 7 p.m. and the game will

ACADEMICS

- Ten of 14 ACC Football teams earned a graduation success rate (GSR) at or above the FBS average of 76. That ties for first among Power 5 conferences, both in terms of percentage and in total number.
- The ACC remains the only Power 5 conference to have multiple teams score 90 or higher in GSR each year since 2005. Duke (96), Wake Forest (93) and Boston College (90) reached that plateau last year.
- In the 2017 U.S. News and World “Best Colleges” rankings, ACC member schools combine for an average rank of 54.2, marking the 11th straight year that the ACC has led all Power 5 conferences.

ATHLETICS

- The ACC is the only conference to win national championships in football, men’s basketball, women’s basketball and baseball over the last four years.
- The ACC has won a combined four football and men’s basketball national titles over the last five years, twice as many as any other conference.
- The ACC has had a team in either the College Football Playoff or the BCS National Championship Game in each of the past five years.
- The ACC led all conferences with 10 bowl teams in 2017. Over the last two years, the ACC has had a nation’s best 21 teams in bowl games.
- The ACC has earned at least six bowl bids in 17 consecutive seasons. The league ranks second among all conferences with 116 total bowl appearances since 2005.
- Since 2013, the ACC is second among all conferences with 54 postseason appearances, has the second-best record of any conference in BCS, New Year’s Six and CFP games, and is tied for the most national championships (Florida State in 2013, Clemson in 2016).
- Over the last four years, the ACC is 13-3 in games against the SEC on rivalry week, which features Clemson-South Carolina, Florida State-Florida, Georgia Tech-Georgia and Louisville-Kentucky. The league was 3-1 in 2017, winning all three games on the road.
- Two of the last five national champions have come from the ACC, and the league has had a team in the national championship game in three of the last five years. Both are tied for the most from any conference.
- An ACC football player has won the Heisman Trophy or the Campbell Trophy – commonly referred to as the “Academic Heisman” – in four of the last five years, something no other league can claim.

be televised on ESPN2. A tightly contested series has the Hokies holding a 3-2 edge in the last five meetings, including a 24-21 win in their last appearance in Durham, North Carolina.

- The ACC’s non-conference slate is highlighted by Temple at Boston College at noon on ESPNU, Bowling Green at Georgia Tech at noon on RSN, and Pitt at UCF at 3:30 p.m. on ESPNU.
- Pitt will try to derail the longest winning streak in the nation as UCF has won 16 straight. The last time UCF played a non-conference opponent from the ACC was in 2014, when the team lost 34-27 to NC State in the St. Petersburg Bowl.

• Boston College’s Steve Addazio leads the Eagles against Temple, where he was head coach in 2011 and 2012 prior to taking the reins at BC. Addazio led the Owls to a 13-11 record in his two seasons, including a 9-4 mark in 2011 and the school’s first bowl game victory in more than 20 years.

IN THE NATIONAL STATS

- Three of the nation’s top defenses reside in the ACC. Miami enters the week ranked No. 2 in total yards allowed (223.8 ypg), while Clemson is fourth in the country (251.8 ypg). The Hurricanes lead the nation in third down conversion defense, are fifth in rushing defense and sixth in passing yards allowed. NC State is ninth in the country in scoring defense, allowing just 13.3 points per game.
- NC State, Clemson, Duke, Virginia and Miami all rank among the top 30 in scoring defense. Virginia has allowed just one touchdown in the last six quarters of action.

- NC State ranks fourth in the country in passing offense, throwing for 370.7 yards per game. QB Ryan Finley is fourth nationally in passing yards (352.0 ypg) and fifth in total offense. Wide receiver Kelvin Harmon leads the league and is ninth nationally with 104.0 receiving yards per game.
- Duke is one of just five schools that has yet to throw an interception. The others are Boise State, LSU, Kansas and Georgia Southern. The Blue Devils have attempted more passes (117) than any of those other four schools. NC State and Virginia Tech have had just one pass intercepted this season.
- Syracuse, Miami and Boston College rank among the top 20 in scoring offense. The Orange are 10th nationally with 49.5 ppg, followed by No. 18 Miami (43.5) and No. 20 Boston College (42.8).
- BC’s AJ Dillon leads the ACC and is eighth in the country with 122.8 rushing yards per game. Since Dillon became the Eagles’ starting running back on Oct. 14, 2017, he leads all players nationally with 158.8 rushing yards per game. His 1,747 rushing yards over the 11 games rank second overall, behind only Jonathan Taylor of Wisconsin. Taylor has rushed for 1,838 yards over the same time period, but played in two additional games compared to Dillon.

THREE IN AP TOP 25

- Led by No. 3 Clemson, three ACC teams are ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 football poll (Sept. 23). Miami moved up to No. 16 following a win over FIU. Duke entered the poll at No. 22, while Virginia Tech and Boston College both fell out after losses this past weekend. Virginia Tech (55), NC State (28) and Syracuse (25) received votes in the poll.
- Duke returned to the AP Top 25 poll for the first time since Oct. 25, 2015 (No. 22). As a ranked squad, the Blue Devils hold an all-time record of 92-45-5, including a 5-4 ledger in the David Cutcliffe Era.

NATIONAL RECOGNITION

- Syracuse junior wide receiver/kick returner Sean Riley (Los Angeles, Calif.) was named to the Paul Hornung Award Weekly Honor Roll for his performance in the Orange’s 51-21 win against UConn. The honor roll recognizes college football players who demonstrate outstanding versatility each week. Riley had a career-high 290 all-purpose yards on 12 touches. He caught six passes for a career-high 120 yards and a touchdown, and also ran back three punts for 110 yards, including a 69-yard return for a touchdown. In addition, Riley posted 11 yards rushing and 49 kickoff return yards.
- North Carolina’s Nathan Elliott was named one of The Manning Award’s eight “Stars of the Week.” Elliott completed 22 of 31 pass attempts for a career-high 313 yards, two touchdowns, and zero interceptions in a 38-35 win over Pittsburgh.

ACC COACHING EXPERIENCE

• Twelve of the 14 ACC football coaches had head coaching experience prior to their current position, including four that previously held a head coaching job at a Power 5 school. In addition, eight of the coaches have been a head coach for 10 years or more.

FIVE ACC COACHES IN TOP 25 WIN PERCENTAGE

• Among active coaches, five current ACC head coaches rank among the top 25 in the nation in career winning percentage, led by Clemson's Dabo Swinney at No. 5 with a .776 mark.
