## OPENING DRAW

### GAME OVERVIEW

- Virginia heads on the road for the first time this season, making its first-ever trip to Brown to face the Bears at Stevenson-Pincince Field. Faceoff is set for 12 p.m.
- This week Virginia is ranked No. 8 in the USILA coaches and Inside Lacrosse/Maverik media polls.

### THE SERIES VS. THE BEARS

- The Cavaliers and Bears are meeting for the 15th time in series history, but the first time in Providence.
- Of the 14 previous meetings, 10 have come at a neutral site and four in Charlottesville.
- UVA leads the all-time series, 12-2, including last year's overtime win at Klöckner Stadium. UVA's last lost in the meeting game in 2016. The 2016 meeting was played in the ACC Showcase game in Kennesaw, Ga. Current UVA head coach Lars Tiffany was the Brown coach for the 2016 meeting.
- The 2016 meeting was the last game Hall of Fame UVA coach Dom Starsia coached for Virginia. Starsia, like Tiffany, is a Brown alum. Starsia coached Tiffany at Brown.

### UVA COACHING STAFF RETURNS HOME

- Lars Tiffany was the head coach at Brown for 10 years (2007-16), guiding the Bears to three Ivy League championships, three NCAA appearances and the 2016 Final Four. Tiffany left Providence with a 95-56 record as the head coach of Brown. He brought Brown assistant coaches Kip Turner (UVA alum) and Sean Kirwan with him to Charlottesville.
- Sunday is the trio's first game at Stevenson-Pincince Field since May 14, 2016 when Tiffany's Brown team topped Johns Hopkins (17-8) in the first round of the 2016 NCAA Tournament.



Payton Cormier tied his career high with five points last time out against Air Force. The birthday boy scored three goals and two assists against the Falcons.

## COVERING THE CAVALIERS

**UNIQUELY UVA**

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

**Grounds:** The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

**First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year:** Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

**Commonwealth:** Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

**UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES**

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

**THE CAVALIER MASCOT**

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

**UNIVERSITY COLORS**

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

**WAH-HOO-WAH**

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

**THE SERIES VS. THE BEARS**

- Virginia leads the all-time series by an 12-2 margin.
- UVA and Brown last met in the ACC Showcase game in 2016. The game was played at Fifth Third Bank Stadium in Kennesaw, Ga. Brown won 19-11 en route to a Championship Weekend appearance.
- Prior to the 2016 meeting, the last meeting was during the 1996 season, a 16-15 overtime win by the Cavaliers in a game played at Hofstra.
- Ten of the 14 games in the series have been played at a neutral site, while the other three were played in Charlottesville.

**LAST MEETING: 2019 (UVA WINS IN OT)**

- UVA attackman Michael Kraus scored his fifth goal of the game with 1:02 left in the first overtime to lift the No. 12 Virginia Cavaliers past the Brown Bears, 14-13, at Klöckner Stadium the last time these teams met.
- Virginia won the overtime faceoff and with 1:02 left in the extra fame Kraus scored from 10 yards out on a clear look from Mikey Herring. It was Kraus' fifth goal of the game and capped a 6-1 UVA run to end the game. It was the second week in a row UVA used a 6-1 run to end a game and win in overtime, winning at then-No. 14 Syracuse last time out (15-14).
- The game was the third consecutive contest for the Cavaliers that went to overtime. It marks the first time in program history that UVA has played three consecutive overtime games and won each of them. It was the third time in program history UVA has played three consecutive overtime games. In the 1980 NCAA Tournament won two (Cornell & UNC) and lost in double-overtime in the NCAA final against Johns Hopkins. During the 2017 regular season UVA one won (Cornell), followed by two losses (Notre Dame & Johns Hopkins).
- The Bears went up 12-8 with 14:42 left in the game after Carson Song capped a 7-2 Brown run. Dox Aitken responded with a goal on a Matt Moore helper with 11:11 left in the game, jumpstarting a 6-1 UVA sprint to close the day.
- After Ian Laviano scored on a Herring assist with 8:03 left, Brown scored its last goal of the game in transition from George Pike. The Pike goal gave the Bears a three-goal lead, 13-10, with 6:52 left to play. The Pike goal came after Laviano was stuffed on the crease by Brown goalie Phil Goss.
- Laviano responded on another Herring helper at 5:51, cutting UVA's deficit back to two goals, 13-11. Petey LaSalla won the faceoff again for UVA and Kraus found Matt Moore with 5:05 left, cutting the deficit to one goal, 13-12.
- After an unnecessary roughness call on Brown's Matt McShea on the ensuing faceoff, Kraus tied the game with an extra-man goal at 3:21 via a Ryan Conrad helper. UVA won the following faceoff but could not find nylon to close regulation. Brown had the ball for the final two minutes of regulation but managed only two shots, one saved by UVA goalie Alex Rode. LaSalla won the overtime faceoff, setting up Kraus' heroics, but not without some drama first.
- It appeared Brown stopped UVA on two different occasions in overtime, but failed two clears to give the ball back to UVA. None were more important for UVA then when Jared Conners stripped Brown's Riley Stewart to set up the game's final sequence. In a game that saw 45 combined turnovers, Brown made 11 of theirs in the fourth quarter and overtime.

**UVA - BROWN CONNECTIONS**

- UVA head coach Lars Tiffany is a 1990 graduate of Brown. He was a two-time captain and three-year starter for former UVA and Brown head coach, Hall of Famer Dom Starsia.
- As a Brown student-athlete, Tiffany played on two Bears teams that advanced to the NCAA Tournament (1987 & 1990). He was Co-MVP of the Brown squad that captured its first-ever NCAA playoff victory in 1990 (12-9 vs. UMass).
- Tiffany was the head coach at Brown for 10 years (2007-16), guiding the Bears to three Ivy League championships, three NCAA appearances and the 2016 Final Four. Tiffany left Providence with a 95-56 record as the head coach of Brown. He brought Brown assistant coaches Kip Turner (UVA alum) and Sean Kirwan with him to Charlottesville.
- Virginia assistant coach and offensive coordinator Sean Kirwan is a 2012 graduate of Tufts in Boston. While at Tufts, Kirwan won a 2010 NCAA DIII title as a player and later as an assistant coach helped Tufts win an NCAA DIII title in 2014. Both those NCAA DIII titles came with Mike Daly as the Tufts head coach. Daly is now in his third season as the Brown head coach, replacing current UVA head coach Lars Tiffany. Daly won three NCAA DIII titles at Tufts (2010, 2014, 2015).

**FROM THE LOCKER ROOM**

"I loved how physical we played today. We came out with really good energy. We probably had too many penalties because of that physicality and energy, but that's the style of lacrosse we want to play and we just have to rely on our man-down defense to be solid. We did a decent job man-down today, but boy, the guy behind us [Alex Rode] is who bailed us out and allowed us to breathe a little better with Alex Rode being such a wall in the cage. Seeing an extension of what he did last May, and we've seen that in practice and throughout the scrimmages, and it was really wonderful to see that come to fruition in the first game of 2020. Offensively you can see how we can go on big runs. Certainly not happy with how we played lacrosse in the second half offensively. The No. 1 Virginia Cavaliers used a strong first quarter to outlast the No. 18 Lehigh Mountain Hawks, 12-8, at Klöckner Stadium.

Michael Kraus led the Cavaliers with four goals and one assist in the winning effort. The assist for Kraus gave him 100 for his career, making him the fourth Cavalier all-time to record 100+ career goals and 100+ career assists. He is also the 10th player in ACC history to accomplish this feat.

**HOW IT HAPPENED**

The Cavaliers opened the game on a 6-1 run to start the first quarter. Kraus scored three goals during the run, while UVA also received scores from Matt Moore, Jared Conners and Payton Cormier. Peter Garno found Cormier with 1:39 left in the first quarter to cap the strong UVA start.

Lehigh made it a game in the second quarter, scoring three-straight goals to cut UVA's lead to two goals, 6-4. Christian Mule' scored with 8:44 left in the first half to finish off the run. Lehigh didn't score again for the next 22:54 and UVA began to put the game out of reach, staking claim to a 9-4 advantage with 2:40 left to play in the third quarter. Goals by Moore and Kraus to start the fourth quarter solidified the UVA lead, 11-5, with 9:14 left to play as the Cavaliers held on for the victory.

**FROM THE LOCKER ROOM**

"Contested ground balls were the critical key today. We felt like when there were two or three Lehigh men and two to three Virginia men who came up with a lot of those extra possessions, which was critical in a game where the opponent was very strong at the faceoff x as Lehigh is with both [Conor] Gaffney and [Mike] Sisselberger. Our team defense, there was some really good communication going on out there. Give Lehigh's coaching staff credit for making adjustments throughout the game. Minor adjustments, trying to go after what we were doing defensively, so we had to make some adjustments. Our young defense, really kind of spearheaded by Kyle Kology and his decision-making. He [Kology] made some really good decisions on when to slide, when to support the dodger and changing some slides at times. It's really a credit to Kyle and the rest of the defense working together. Really appreciative of the fans coming out on a near freezing temperature day but what a beautiful, sunny day to play lacrosse at Klöckner again." – Lars Tiffany

No. 2 Virginia dropped its first game of the season, 16-12, to the Princeton Tigers at Klöckner Stadium. The loss snapped UVA's 10-game winning streak that dated back to an April 13, 2019 loss at Duke.

**HOW IT HAPPENED**

With Virginia leading, 7-6, with 3:58 left in the second quarter, Princeton went on a 6-1 run that put the Cavaliers on their heels for the rest of the afternoon. UVA scored on a Matt Moore singer at 4:06 in the second to tie the game, 6-6. On the ensuing faceoff, Petey LaSalla won the draw and streaked to give UVA its final lead of the game at 3:58 in the second quarter.

Tewaaraton Trophy candidate Michael Sowers, who tallied eight points in the game (4 goals, 4 assists), started the Princeton run with 1:53 left to play in the second quarter.
