#### THE SERIES VS. THE BEARS

- The Cavaliers and Bears are meeting for the 14th time in series history, but for only the fourth time at UVA.
- Of the 13 previous meetings, 10 have come at a neutral site and three in Charlottesville. This series has never been played at Brown in Rhode Island.
- UVA leads the all-time series, 11-2, but lost the last meeting in 2016. The 2016 meeting was played in the ACC Showcase game in Kennesaw, Ga. Current UVA head coach Lars Tiffany was the Brown coach for the 2016 meeting.
- The 2016 meeting was the last game Hall of Fame UVA coach Dom Starsia coached for Virginia. Starsia, like Tiffany, is a Brown alum. Starsia coached Tiffany at Brown.

#### GRECO NAMED ACC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Defenseman Logan Greco is the reigning ACC Defensive Player of the Week after he helped UVA win at then-No. 14 Syracuse in overtime.
- Greco shut Cuse's Nate Solomon down, allowing one assist in the six-on-six. Solomon also had a game-high three turnovers while being guarded by Greco

#### **COVERING THE CAVALIERS**

#### **UNIQUELY UVA**

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

#### **UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES**

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

#### THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

#### UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

#### WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoowah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

All requests for interviews with coaches and players should be made through Vincent Briedis in the Athletics Media Relations Office. Postgame interviews are conducted at field level following the postgame handshake. Locker rooms are closed.

#### THE SERIES VS. THE BEARS

- Virginia leads the all-time series by an 11-2 margin.
- UVA and Brown last met in the ACC Showcase game in 2016. The game was played at Fifth Third Bank Stadium in Kennesaw, Ga. Brown won 19-11 en route to a Championship Weekend
- Prior to the 2016 meeting, the last meeting was during the 1996 season, a 16-15 overtime win by the Cavaliers in a game played at Hofstra.
- Ten of the 13 games in the series have been played at a neutral site, while the other three were played in Charlottesville. These teams have never met at Brown.

#### **UVA - BROWN CONNECTIONS**

- UVA head coach Lars Tiffany is a 1990 graduate of Brown. He was a two-time captain and three-year starter for former UVA and Brown head coach, Hall of Famer Dom Starsia.
- · As a Brown student-athlete, Tiffany played on two Bears teams that advanced to the NCAA Tournament (1987 & 1990). He was Co-MVP of the Brown squad that captured its first-ever NCAA playoff victory in 1990 (12-9 vs. UMass).
- Tiffany was the head coach at Brown for 10 years (2007-16), guiding the Bears to three lvy League championships, three NCAA appearances and the 2016 Final Four. Tiffany left Providence with a 95-56 record as the head coach of Brown. He brought Brown assistant coaches Kip Turner (UVA alum) and Sean Kirwan with him to Charlottesville.
- Virginia assistant coach and offensive coordinator Sean Kirwan is a 2012 graduate of Tufts in Boston, While at Tufts, Kirwan won a 2010 NCAA DIII title as a player and later as an assistant coach helped Tufts win an NCAA DIII title in 2014. Both those NCAA DIII titles came with Mike Daly as the Tufts head coach. Daly is now in his third season as the Brown head coach, replacing current UVA head coach Lars Tiffany. Daly won three NCAA DIII titles at Tufts (2010, 2014, 2015).

#### MORE ON TIFFANY, STARSIA AND BROWN

- Current UVA head coach Lars Tiffany and former UVA head coach Dom Starsia each coached at Brown for 10 seasons. Counting Starsia's 101-46 career record at Brown, the Bears have a 196-102 alltime record in 20 seasons under Starsia and Tiffany.
- Starsia was the head coach at Brown from 1983-92.
- Both Tiffany and Starsia appeared in the 2012 movie Crooked Arrows, playing themselves.

#### TIFFANY AIMS TO DO A RARE THING ON SUNDAY

- UVA head coach Lars Tiffany has been the head coach at Stony Brook, Brown and now Virginia.
- A win over Brown will give Tiffany at least one career win over a program he has served as a head coach. Tiffany is 2-0 all-time against Stony Brook, winning once as the Brown head coach and once as the UVA head coach. Tiffany is 1-1 against Virginia, winning as the Brown head coach and losing as the Stony Brook head coach.
- Only one other active coach that has had at least three DI head coaching jobs has career wins over each of the three programs he has coached. Tiffany would join Duke's John Danowski who coached C.W. Post when they were a DI program, as well as Hofstra and Duke. Danowski has beat all three DI programs as a DI head coach.

#### VIRGINIA ON THE GREEN GRASS OF KLÖCKNER

- · Virginia owns a 138-39 (.7797) all-time record at Klöckner Stadium, including a 1-1 mark in 2019. UVA also is 11-3 all-time at Klöckner Stadium in the NCAA Tournament.
- UVA is 12-7 all-time at Klöckner Stadium under head coach Lars Tiffany.
- Klöckner Stadium first hosted lacrosse in 1993.

#### DOX AITKEN SETS ANOTHER UVA RECORD

- M Dox Aitken reached 100 career points (75-25-100) on Feb. 18 vs. High Point. He is the guickest midfielder in UVA history to the milestone, reaching so in 36 games.
- Aitken broke the previous record of 39 games by Pete Eldredge (1969-72).

#### **UVA RECORDS BACK-TO-BACK ROAD RANKED WINS**

- UVA won in overtime, 15-14, at then-No. 14 Syracuse on March 2. With a win at then-No. 19 Princeton (12-11, OT), UVA won back-toback road games against ranked opponents for the first time since
- In a seven-day span in 2012, UVA won at then-No. 9 Maryland (12-8) on March 31, followed by a win at then-No. 9 UNC (15-10) on April 7.

#### **UVA HAS NO EASY OUTS TO BEGIN THE 2019 SEASON**

- Of UVA's first 12 opponents of the 2019 season, 10 have been ranked so far this season.
- This week eight of those opponents are currently ranked. UVA's win over then-No. 19 Princeton knocked the Tigers from the polls. UVA also played previously ranked Lehigh, who has dropped three games in a row after losing their top two goal scorers to injury.
- UVA's first five games of 2019 feature an opponent currently ranked, or previously ranked in the polls in 2019.
- Of UVA's first 12 games, only Brown and Utah have not been ranked at some point this season. Brown is receiving votes this week.

#### **UVA ROCKING THE ASSISTS**

• UVA has scored 60 goals through four games this year and has assisted 37 of them. That means UVA has recorded an assist on 61.7 percent of its goals in 2019.

#### **DEFENDING THE CLEAR**

- In five games this season, UVA is limiting its opponents to a 73.3 clearing percentage (77-of-105), which is 5.6 failed clears per game by UVA opponents.
- Contrast, UVA is clearing at an 79.1 percent rate (72-of-91), failing 3.8 clears per game.

The No. 6 Virginia Cavaliers fell in the season opener against the No. 4 Loyola Greyhounds, 17-9, at the Ridley Athletic Complex.

The Greyhounds' goalie Jacob Stover was hot between the pipes, saving 18 shots by the Cavaliers. UVA opened the game with an extra-man goal by junior Dox Aitken 48 seconds into the game on a Michael Kraus helper. Loyola outscored UVA 8-3 the rest of the first half to take a four-point lead into the intermission, 8-4.

#### **HOW IT HAPPENED**

UVA was leading 1-0 when a 3-0 Loyola run gave the Greyhounds the lead for good, 3-1. Two goals by Loyola's Pat Spencer sparked a five-goal first quarter for LU.

After being outshot in the first quarter, 15-6, the Cavaliers managed 13 shots in the second quarter but only managed one goal as Stover made six saves in the second quarter.

Stover made seven saves in the third quarter as the Greyhounds started to pull away from UVA. Loyola picked up 11 ground balls in the fourth quarter and outscored UVA 5-2 in the final frame to solidify the win. Spencer and Kevin Lindley each scored five goals in the winning effort for Loyola, while Spencer also added two assists.

#### FROM THE LOCKER ROOM

"Fantastic overall effort from the entire Loyola team. It would be easy to focus on a Herculean effort by their goalie, Jacob Stover, and certainly look at potentially the nation's best player in Pat Spencer and what those two did, but that would take away from the entire team effort that we encountered. It was a heck of a team effort by Loyola on both sides of the field. We tried to hold our slides on defense and they made us pay for that. When we did slide and double the ball, they seemed to find openings. It was one of those frustrating days as defensive coordinator trying to figure out the magic formula and there wasn't one. It is easier to learn from the sting of a loss and we have the opportunity to learn from this loss. I love this team." - Lars Tiffany.

The No. 11 Virginia Cavaliers used an 8-2 run to overcome an early deficit and dispose of the Lehigh Mountain Hawks, 11-8, at Klöckner Stadium. The game which was originally scheduled for Saturday was moved up a day due to a forecast for inclement weather in the Charlottesville area.

Cavalier goalie Alex Rode made three key saves in the third quarter, two of which came in man-down situations. The saves aided Virginia in holding Lehigh scoreless for 19:57 from the second quarter until the fourth quarter.

#### **HOW IT HAPPENED**

For the second week in a row UVA scored first, but then found itself in a hole. With a 2-0 lead over the Mountain Hawks, Lehigh responded by scoring five goals in a row to take a 5-2 lead at 7:42 in the second quarter.

Lehigh owned a two-goal lead, 6-4, at halftime. UVA, who handed Lehigh three extra-man goals in the first half on four penalties, settled in nicely. Dox Aitken scored a big goal to lead the third-quarter scoring. Michael Kraus scored back-to-back goals to give UVA the lead for good.

#### FROM THE LOCKER ROOM

"We had a couple man down stops in the third quarter and those two stops were big. Rode made a couple nice saves that could have been big momentum goals for Lehigh. From there we just got smarter about what we were doing physically. We're a physical team, we put some people on the ground after they take shots and we want to get after it in the ride. We take a lot of pride in our riding here and we had another good game in that phase. You have to put a lot of pressure on the ball and sometimes we do foul. Michael Kraus right here at the midline got that hold and I can't get upset with Michael because we're asking him to be relentless. We tell our attackmen that they are the defensive frontline of a football team, you got to get pressure. If we can get pressure with three or four rushing the passer then we don't have to implement a 10-man [ride] and we can cause turnovers, which we saw tonight. But it starts with our defensive line, they have to pressure. We tell them you don't have to make the sack, just force a bad pass or an interception because our safeties, our middies, they're ready to jump on errant passes." - Lars Tiffany

Michael Kraus found Ian Laviano 1:02 into overtime and the No. 12 Virginia Cavaliers escaped New Jersey with a 12-11 triumph over the No. 19 Princeton Tigers at Class of 1952 Stadium.

UVA goalie Patrick Burkinshaw made his first collegiate start and collegiate debut against the Tigers. He was stingy in the goal, saving 24 shots. The 24 saves set a UVA freshman goalie record, a UVA first career goalie start record, a Class of 1952 Stadium record and is tied for the most single-game saves in the nation this year. Brukinshaw made six fourth-quarter saves, but no was bigger than the clutch save he made with 32 seconds left in regulation on a Charlie Durbin missile from 10 yards out. Durbin had already found nylon four times on the afternoon.

#### **HOW IT HAPPENED**

With Princeton leading 11-10 with 6:55 left in regulation, the UVA defense held firm and kept the Tigers scoreless for the game's final 7:57, including overtime. Ryan Conrad scored an unassisted goal at 4:01 in the fourth quarter to tie the game, 11-11.

The Cavaliers also overcame a two-goal deficit early in the third quarter, 7-5 and 9-7. A Laviano goal at the end of the third quarter, followed by a Kraus goal at the start of the fourth tied the game at 9-9. It was one of seven ties in the game.

#### FROM THE LOCKER ROOM

"At UVA we believe in creating a culture of competition and you have to earn your playing time all year, not just in the Fall or in préseason. We are not going to create a starting lineup game number one and stick with it. We believe that creates better intensity in practice and continually promotes each man's moment and what we saw today was positive output of that process. In practice we have seen Patrick Burkinshaw emerge and we let the goalies know on Thursday Patrick earned the start. What a performance by Patrick in his first career start. I want to give Patrick tremendous credit in the power of believing. He believes in himself. He had the eye and said 'I am ready coach." - Lars Tiffany
