FOR OPENERS

- UVA begins its 114th season of men's basketball, sporting a 1,597-1,165 (.578) all-time record.
- UVA is 19-1 in its last 20 season-opening games, including a 60-48 win against UNCG last season.
- Virginia has a five-game winning streak on opening night and is 8-1 in season openers under head coach Tony Bennett.
- The lone opening-night loss under Bennett came at George Mason (63-59) to begin the 2012-13 campaign.
- The Cavaliers are 91-22 all-time in 113 season-opening games.
- UVA is 5-0 all-time vs. Towson.

UVA RANKED NO. 5 IN PRESEASON RANKINGS

- Virginia is ranked No. 5 in the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches' preseason polls.
- UVA has been ranked in the top 10 in the preseason ranking in four of the past five seasons.
- The Cavaliers were unranked in the 2017-18 preseason polls, but became the fourth team in the Top 25 era (1990-present) to earn a No. 1 ranking after being unranked in the preseason (Kansas, 1990; Syracuse, 2010; Baylor, 2017).
- Dating back to last season, UVA has been ranked in the AP poll for 17 straight weeks and has been ranked in the top 10 in each of the past 13 polls.

ALL-TIME VS. THE TIGERS

- UVA is 5-0 all-time against Towson in the series that dates back to 1985-86.
- The Cavaliers have won all five of the meetings in Charlottesville, including a 57-50 win at John Paul Jones Arena in the 2011-12 season.
- Virginia head coach Tony Bennett is 1-0 all-time vs. Towson.

LAST TIME VS. TOWSON

- Sammy Zeglinski scored 20 points and Joe Harris added 17 as Virginia defeated Towson 57-50 on Dec. 30, 2011.
- Harris added seven rebounds as the Cavaliers owned a 32-29 margin on the glass.
- Kris Walden led Towson with 15 points and Marcus Damas had 13.
- UVA shot just 34.8 percent from the field, but made 18 free throws.

VIRGINIA HEAD COACH TONY BENNETT

- Three-time National and ACC Coach of the Year Tony Bennett has a 219-86 (.718) mark in nine seasons at Virginia and 288-118 (.709) career mark in 12 seasons overall.
- In 2017-18, Bennett led Virginia to its eighth ACC regular-season title, third ACC Tournament championship, school-record 31 wins, ACC-record 17 league wins and ACC-record 9-0 mark on the road.
- Bennett was named the USBWA Henry Iba National Coach of the Year for the third time to rank second all-time behind legendary John Wooden, who captured the award six times.
- Bennett also earned Division I national coach of the year honors from the AP, USA Today and NABC.
- He has led UVA to outright ACC regular-season and tournament championships in the same season two times (2014 and 2018).
- Bennett has guided UVA to five straight NCAA Tournament appearances for the first time in school history and has led UVA to a school-record six straight seasons with 23 or more wins.
- Bennett is the sixth coach in ACC history to win at least three outright ACC regular-season titles (Frank McGuire, Vic Bubas, Dean Smith, Mike Krzyzewski and Roy Williams).
- Bennett has led UVA to a school-best 16 or more ACC wins in three of the last five seasons.
- Bennett has led UVA to a school-record six straight seasons with 11 or more ACC wins.
- He has led UVA to a school-best seven straight 20-win seasons.
- Bennett guided UVA to a school-record 89 wins over three seasons from 2014-16, eclipsing 88 wins from 1981-83.
- Bennett has led UVA to seven consecutive postseason tournaments (NCAA in 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017 and 2018 and NIT in 2013).
- In 2015-16, Bennett led UVA to its first NCAA Elite Eight appearance since 1995 with 29 wins.
- Bennett was named 2015 USBWA National Coach of the Year and ACC Coach of the Year after leading Virginia to a then-school-record tying 30 wins and its second consecutive ACC regular-season title.
- Bennett led the Cavaliers to 30 wins in back-to-back seasons (2014-2015) for the first time in school history.
- UVA is 114-35 (.765) in non-conference action, 105-51 (.673) in ACC play and 128-25 (.837) at home under Tony Bennett.
- Bennett ranks sixth all-time in winning percentage at .673, among ACC head coaches with 100 or more ACC regular-season wins.

ABOUT THE 2018-19 SCHEDULE

- Seven of Virginia's opponents are ranked in the AP Top-25 preseason poll (Duke, North Carolina, Virginia Tech, Syracuse, Florida State and Clemson), while six (Maryland, Notre Dame, Louisville, Miami, NC State and Marshall) received votes.
- The Cavaliers will play 12 games against 2018 NCAA Tournament teams: home games against Duke, Florida State, Marshall, Miami, Syracuse and Virginia Tech; road contests at Clemson, Duke, North Carolina, NC State, Syracuse and Virginia Tech
- UVA could meet NCAA Tournament teams Butler, Florida and Oklahoma in Battle 4 Atlantis.
- Four opponents (Boston College, Middle Tennessee, Notre Dame and Louisville) participated in the 2018 National Invitation Tournament.

GETTING DEFENSIVE

- UVA allowed 54 points per game (2nd best in school history) in 2017-18.
- The Cavaliers allowed 53.1 points per ACC game, marking the third-lowest figure in ACC history.
- UVA held 24 opponents to 60 or fewer points.
- UVA was 12-0 when limiting foes to fewer than 50 points.
- UVA held 25 foes to less than 43 percent shooting.
- The Cavaliers held 17 opponents to 30 percent or less shooting from 3-point range.
- Bennett-coached teams have led the nation in scoring defense five times and finished in the top-five nationally in nine of 12 seasons.
- Bennett-coached teams are 101-3 when holding opponents to fewer than 50 points during his 12-year coaching career.

THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME

- Virginia is 166-41 (.801), including a 16-1 mark in 2017-18, in 12 seasons at John Paul Jones Arena.
- UVA was 16-1 at JPJ last season and is 128-25 (.837), including a 93-10 (.903) mark the past six seasons, at home under head coach Tony Bennett.
- Virginia is an ACC-leading 49-5 (.907) in league home games over the past six seasons. Duke is second at 48-6 (.889).
- UVA has won 11 or more home games for nine straight seasons.

THREE CAVALIERS EARN PRESEASON ALL-ACC HONORS

- The Cavaliers' Kyle Guy joined preseason ACC Player of the Year Luke Maye (North Carolina), RJ Barrett (Duke), Tyus Battle (Syracuse) and Ky Bowman on the All-ACC first team.
- Virginia's De'Andre Hunter and Ty Jerome were joined on the second team by Zion Williamson (Duke), Justin Robinson (Virginia Tech) and Marcquise Reed (Clemson).

WATCH ME NOW

- Ty Jerome (Bob Cousy Award), Kyle Guy (Jerry West Award) and De'Andre Hunter (Julius Erving Award) were named to Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame preseason award watch lists.
- Guy and Hunter are among 50 players to watch for the 2019 Citizen Naismith Trophy Men's Player of the Year honor and 20 players for the NABA Division I Player of the Year award.

2017-18 IN REVIEW

- Virginia claimed its eighth ACC regular-season title and third ACC Tournament title.
- The Cavaliers won a school-record 31 games and earned their first No. 1 ranking in the AP poll since 1982.
- Virginia earned its school-record fifth consecutive NCAA Tournament bid, earning its first No. 1 overall seed and sixth No. 1 seed in school history.
- The Cavaliers led the nation in scoring defense for the fourth time under head coach Tony Bennett at 54 points per game. UVA also ranked first in the nation in turnovers per game at 8.5 per game.
- Tony Bennett was named the NCAA Division I Coach of the Year by the Associated Press, United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA), National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC), Naismith, Basketball Times, USA Today and Sports Illustrated.
- Kyle Guy became Virginia's ninth All-America selection, earning third-team honors from the NABC and AP.

TYING US TOGETHER

- Point guard Ty Jerome leads UVA into action this season after averaging 10.6 points and 3.9 assists in 2017-18.
- Jerome earned All-ACC third-team honors and was an ACC Tournament second-team selection.
- Jerome ranked fourth in the ACC in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.44) and seventh in steals (1.62).

2018-19 Opponents in Bold

THIS GUY GETS BUCKETS

- Third-team All-American and All-ACC first team selection Kyle Guy led UVA in scoring (14.1 ppg) and 3-pointers (83).
- Guy averaged 16.7 points to earn ACC Tournament MVP honors.
- Guy has scored 20 or more points in six career games (4 in 2017-18), including a career-high 29 points at VCU (11/17/17).
- In 2017-18, Guy reached double figures in 28 games and led the Cavaliers in scoring in 15 contests.
- Guy made at least one 3-pointer in UVA's first 28 games, which marked the fourth longest streak in UVA history.
- Guy has shot 42.5 percent (134 of 315) from 3-point range during his career and has made five or more 3-pointers in seven games.
- Guy holds UVA's career 3-point percentage record, edging Keith Freeley's (2000-01) mark of 42.1 percent.

DRE HAD HIS WAY

- ACC Sixth Man of the Year and All-ACC Rookie Team honoree De'Andre Hunter averaged 9.2 points and 3.5 rebounds in 2017-18.
- Hunter shot 48.8 percent from the field, 38.2 percent from 3-point range and 75.5 percent from the free throw line.
- Hunter reached double figures in 16 games, including team highs against Monmouth (career-high 23), Georgia Tech (17), Virginia Tech (14), Syracuse (15), Miami (ACC-high 22) and Pitt (14, including career-high 10 rebounds).
- Hunter was named ACC Co-Rookie of the Week following his 22-point performance at Miami.
- He banked in the game-winning 3-pointer at Louisville (3/1/18).
- Hunter fractured his left wrist during the ACC Tournament and missed the NCAA Tournament.

HOLDING FOES UNDER 50

- Virginia is 76-2 when holding opponents under 50 points in the Tony Bennett era (12-0 in 2017-18).
- Bennett-coached teams are 101-3 when holding opponents to fewer than 50 points (25-1 in three years at Washington State).
- UVA held Wisconsin, Clemson at Pitt under 40 points and is 21-0 under Bennett when limiting foes to 40 or fewer points.

UVA VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

- UVA is 31-31 against ranked opponents in the Tony Bennett era, including a 5-1 record in 2017-18 (wins over No. 12 North Carolina, No. 18 Clemson, No. 4 Duke, No. 19 Clemson and No. 12 North Carolina and a loss at No. 18 West Virginia).
- The Cavaliers are 146-327 vs. ranked opponents since 1953-54.
- UVA's win over then-No. 4 Duke on Jan. 27 marked the Cavaliers first road win vs. a top-5 ranked foe since 1993 (77-69 over No. 3 Duke).
- UVA is 1-29 all-time vs. No. 1-ranked opponents (86-73 win vs. No. 1 North Carolina on Jan. 30, 1986).

- UVA scored 80 or more points in three games this season and is 26-1 under Bennett when scoring 80 or more.
- UVA's lone loss under Bennett when scoring 80 or more was a 93-81 loss at UNC in 2012-13.
