FRIDAY'S GAME VS. HOWARD:

- UVA is ranked No. 1 in the rankings and a top seed in the NCAA Tournament.
- Howard enters the contest on an eight-match unbeaten streak.
- Virginia holds a 28-12-3 record at home in NCAA Tournament games.

SERIES HISTORY:

• This is the first meeting between Howard and Virginia

LAST TIME OUT FOR THE CAVALIERS:

- Virginia played FSU to a 2-2 draw in the ACC Women's Soccer Championship finals, but failed to claim the title in a 7-6 shootout with the Seminoles.
- •The Cavaliers twice rallied after falling behind Florida State in each half.
- Makenzy Doniak scored both goals for the Cavaliers, one unassisted and the other off a double pass from Meghan Cox and Veronica Latsko.
- The teams matched each other 5-for-5 in the first wave of penalty kicks before moving to a sudden victory scenario.
- Florida State blocked the seventh kick by Virginia and converted their own kick to grab the title.

CAVALIERS CLAIM ACC REGULAR SEASON TITLE:

- Virginia claimed the ACC regular-season championship with a 9-1-0 mark.
- It marks the second regular-season title for the Cavaliers in three years.
- The championship is also the second ACC regular-season title for Virginia under head coach Steve Swanson (2013, 2015).

VIRGINIA IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT:

- Virginia is 36-24-5 all-time in the NCAA Tournament (.592 win percentage).
- UVA has advanced to consecutive College Cups including the 2014 finals.
- Virginia is 32-13-4 (.700 win percentage) in NCAA play under Steve Swanson.

HIGH SCORING HOOS:

- The Cavaliers have picked up where 2014 left off, ranking among the national leaders in scoring with 3.26 goals per game (2nd) entering the tournament.
- Virginia led the nation in scoring in 2013 at 3.00 goals per game and finished second in 2014 with 3.38 goals per game.
- The Cavaliers are tops in the ACC with 62 goals scored on the year.
- UVA has 14 different goal scorers this season, including 10 players with at least three goals through 19 games on the season.
- Virginia has scored at least two goals in 17 matches this season.
- 15 different Cavaliers have assisted on goals this season, paced by 10 from Makenzy Doniak.
- Virginia is third nationally in assists with 55 heading into the tournament and second nationally with 2.89 assists per game.

KLÖCK-WORK AT HOME:

- Virginia posted a school-record 38 consecutive home games prior to a loss to No. 6 Notre Dame on September 25.
- It was the sixth-longest streak in NCAA Division I women's soccer history.
- Of those 38 wins, 27 were shutouts by the Cavaliers.
- Prior to the loss to the Fighting Irish, the Cavaliers last lost at home in the NCAA Tournament against Duke to end the 2012 season.
- Virginia followed up the loss with a 1-0 victory over No. 19 Duke on Sunday.
- The Cavaliers are 8-1 in the friendly confines of Klöckner Stadium in 2015.

DONIAK RISING UP THE UVA RECORD BOOK:

- Makenzy Doniak is closing in on the top spot of several offensive categories in Virginia history in her senior season.
- She ranks 1st in goals (60), first in points (155) and 5th in GWG (16).
- She became the first Cavalier to post two 40-point seasons (46 pts in 2013 and 51 pts in 2014). She has 30 points in 2015.

DONIAK SETS UVA CAREER POINTS RECORD:

- Makenzy Doniak tied the UVA school record for points in a career Oct. 18 when she tallied a goal and an assist at Boston College.
- Doniak's goal in the first minute of play at BC marked the first time for UVA to score a goal in the opening minute since Hucles did it in 1999. She has since done that again this season, adding a first-minute goal at NC State.
- The senior broke the mark with four goals at NC State, passing Angela Hucles' record set in the 1999 season and has 151 points currently.

DONIAK SETS SINGLE-GAME RECORD FOR GOALS AT NC STATE:

- Makenzy Doniak set the single-game record for goals when she scored four in the first half at NC State.
- The performance marked the first time in school history a Cavalier scored four goals in a single game.

DONIAK SETS UVA CAREER GOALS RECORD:

- Makenzy Doniak set the school record for goals in a career when she scored both goals in a 2-2 draw with FSU in the 2015 ACC Championship.
- Doniak passed the mark of 59 goals set by Angela Hucles in the 1999 season.



CAVALIERS HONORED BY ACC:

- Virginia picked up several accolades from the ACC with the announcement of the 2015 honors at the end of the regular season.
- Makenzy Doniak was named ACC Offensive Player of the Year while Emily Sonnett was named ACC Defensive Player of the Year.
- Head coach Steve Swanson was named ACC Coach of the Year
- Six players earned All-ACC recognition: Doniak and Sonnett (1st team), Alexis Shaffer (2nd team), Brittany Ratcliffe (3rd team), and Betsy Brandon and Courtney Petersen (freshman team).

SONNETT NAMED ESPNW NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE YEAR:

• Senior defender Emily Sonnett earned national recognition on Wednesday when she was named National Player of the Year by ESPNW.

COX, REUTHER TALLY HAT TRICKS:

- Meghan Cox and Morgan Reuther have both tallied hat tricks for the topranked Cavaliers this season and it's part of why the pair lead the squad in goals.
- Cox delivered her first career hat trick in the season opener against UNCW.
- Reuther delivered her second career hat trick in a 3-0 win over Harvard.

DONIAK, SONNETT NAMED TO MAC HERMANN TROPHY WATCH LIST:

- Makenzy Doniak and Emily Sonnett found themselves both on the pre season watch list for the MAC Hermann Trophy entering 2015.
- The award is presented annually to the top collegiate player.
- Doniak has been a semifinialst each of the previous two seasons, while departed senior Morgan Brian claimed the award in 2014.

ACC SETTING THE STANDARD:

- •The ACC continues to set the standard when it comes to women's soccer on the national scene, boasting seven teams in the national rankings.
- Three of the top five teams all hail from the ACC in the Soccer America poll.
- Five of the top 10 come from the ACC in the latest poll released by the NSCAA.

CAVALIERS MOVING THE BALL AROUND

- The Cavaliers have posted a 16-1-2 record this season, but Virginia hasn't been relying on one player to carry the load as nine different players have game-winning goals this season.
- Alexis Shaffer leads the way with four GWG (Old Dominion, Duke, at Wake Forest, Florida State).
- Makenzy Doniak has three GWG (UNCW, Syracuse, NC State), while Brittany Ratcliffe (at Clemson, at Boston College) and Morgan Reuther (Delaware, Harvard) each have two GWG.
- Courtney Petersen (Cal Poly), Meghan Cox (at UCLA), Brianna Westrup (Louisville), Betsy Brandon (at Pitt) and Kirsten McNabb (vs. Clemson) have one GWG each.

DONIAK TWICE EARNS ACC WEEKLY HONORS:

- Makenzy Doniak has earned ACC Player of the Week honors twice this year.
- She was named Offensive Player of the Week following a 4-2 win at Boston College when she tied the UVA career points record.
- Doniak earned the honor again after a five goal, two assist week last week when she scored four goals at NC State and a goal with two assists at Pitt.

STEARNS EARNS ACC WEEKLY HONORS:

- Morgan Stearns was named ACC Defensive Player of the Week (Oct. 27).
- She posted shutout victories over Louisville and No. 1 Florida State to help the Cavaliers move to the top of the ACC standings.

SONNETT GETS CAP WITH USWNT:

- Cavalier senior defender Emily Sonnett missed two matches as she hit the road traveling with the USWNT on its Victory Tour.
- Sonnett was tabbed to practice with the team and fill out the roster as the UWNT faced Brazil earning her first cap in Orlando on Oct 25.

SWANSON ASSISTED USWNT:

- Virginia head coach Steve Swanson had a busy summer, serving as an assistant coach with the US Women's National Team.
- Swanson worked with the team last fall, missing only one game during the season as he helped train the team that won the 2015 Women's World Cup.

FORMER CAV COLAPRICO NAMED NWSL ROOKIE OF THE YEAR:

- Former Cavalier Danielle Colaprico was named the NWSL Rookie of the Year this past week after helping lead Chicago to a second-place finish.
- Colaprico started all 20 games, scoring one goal and played all but 24 minutes on the season.

SAUERBRUNN NAMED NWSL DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR:

- Former Cavalier Becky Sauerbrunn also picked up honors from the NWSL when she was named the Defensive Player of the Year this week.
- It marks the third consecutive season for Sauerbrunn to claim the award.

CAVALIERS MAKE THE GRADE:

- The Cavaliers were recognized for academic achievement as a recipient of the NSCAA Team Academic Award earlier this year.
- Three Virginia players were recognized as CoSIDA Academic All-District selections with Makenzy Doniak and Morgan Stearns receiving first team selection and Morgan Reuther earning second team honors.
- Doniak and Stearns are now eligible for CoSIDA Academic All-America honors by virtue of selection to an All-District first team.
- Virginia posted a 1000 Academic Progress Rating for the 2014-15 academic year.
