TODAY'S GAME

- Virginia is making its 14 NCAA semifinal appearance in program history, and its first since 2007. This is the Cavaliers' eighth trip to the semifinals under head coach Julie Myers.
- The Cavaliers are 33-23 in the NCAA Tournament with eight trips to the National Championship game and three NCAA Titles (1991, 1993, 2004)
- Virginia is making its first trip to the semifinals since 2007 when the Cavaliers defeated Duke, 14-13 to advance to the national championship game
- Virginia fell 15-13 to Northwestern in the 2007 NCAA title game.
- The Cavaliers are playing in their 19th-consecutive NCAA Tournament, all under head coach Julie Myers, and their 27th overall NCAA Tournament appearance

WHAT HAS VIRGINIA DONE LATELY?

- After starting the 2014 season 4-6, Virginia has won eight of its last ten games, including victories over No. 9 Notre Dame, No. 6 Boston College, No. 7 Duke and No. 4 North Carolina
- The Cavaliers' two losses during that span have come against the NCAA Tournament's top-seed, Maryland
- Virginia is shooting 52.3 percent in the NCAA Tournament. The Cavaliers are shooting 46.4 percent overall this season
- Virginia is 7-of-13 on free position attempts in the NCAA Tournament and 20-of-22 on clear attempts
- Senior Liza Blue has seven points (5 goals, 2 assists) with eight draw controls in the NCAA Tournament. In the four games since the end of the regular season, Blue has 13 points (11 goals, two assists) with 14 draw controls.
- Senior captain Maddy Keeshan has scored five goals in the NCAA Tournament and caused a pair of turnovers
- Junior Daniela Eppler has eight ground balls in the NCAA Tournament and 14 since the end of the regular season.

'HOOS VS ORANGE

- Virginia owns an 11-5 edge in the series
- From 2005-2011, Virginia won seven-straight games between the two teams, but Syracuse has won the last three meetings, including an 18-14 victory earlier this season (Feb. 23)
- This is the first-ever postseason meeting between the two teams

STAT COMPARISONS

- Syracuse is fifth in the nation, averaging 14.67 goals per game, and leads all Division I teams with 455 points. Virginia is 12th in both goals per game (13.3) and total points (373).
- Syracuse has scored 188 first-half goals while allowing opponents 79 in the opening period. Virginia outscores opponents 131-109 in the first half.

SYRACUSE NOTES

- Syracuse advanced with an 11-9 victory over seventh-seeded Boston College
- The Orange will make its fifth appearance in the Final Four in the last seven years. It marks the first time Syracuse has advanced to the national semifinals in three consecutive seasons.
- Syracuse improved its record to 20-2, marking the first time it has won 20 games in a season
- Syracuse's only two losses this season have come against Maryland
- Syracuse has a pair of 2014 Tewaaraton Award finalists on their team. Also a 2013 Tewaaraton Award finalist, attacker Alyssa Murray became just the second player in Orange history to record 300 points, 200 goals and 100 assists in her career. Her 97 points rank fifth in the country, and she currently sits in the nation's top 20 in points per game, goals, assists and assists per game.
- The nation's leading scorer with 107 points (73 goals, 34 assists), attacker Kayla Treanor was named ACC Offensive Player of the Year, All-ACC First Team and ACC All-Tournament Team. Her 70 goals are good for second-best in the nation. She is a member of the U.S. Women's National Team.

HOMECOMING

- Twelve Cavaliers hail from the state of Maryland with five players listing Baltimore as their hometown (Caroline Seats, Posey Valis, Daniela Eppler, Brooke and Kelly Boyd)
- Three players, including starting defender Kelsey Gahan and starting goalkeeper Liz Colgan, are from Cockeysville, which is located eight miles north of Towson.
- Assistant coach Jessy Morgan is also a Baltimore native and was just inducted into the McDonogh School (Owings Mills, Md.) Athletic Hall of Fame in its latest induction class in April.

FINAL FOUR EXPERIENCE

- There are only two players on the team who have been to a Final Four before.
- Casey Bocklet won a National Championship with Northwestern in 2012.
- Liza Blue went with the Cavalier field hockey team to the Final Four as a freshman in 2010, but this is her first National Semifinal with lacrosse.

SCORING STREAKS

- Liza Blue has scored a goal in each game this season and, going back to last year, has scored a goal in 26-straight games.
- Kelly Boyd had a seven-game goal-scoring streak snapped against Princeton, but with an assist against the Tigers, she has contributed points in each of the last ten games
- Courtney Swan had a six-game scoring streak snapped in the ACC Tournament game against Duke. Swan had a streak of 21 games contributing points snapped against UNC
- Daniela Eppler had a five-game goal-scoring and an eight-game point streak snapped against North Carolina

HOOS HOT

- Liza Blue scored five goals in the ACC Tournament quarterfinal game against Maryland, her second five-goal game of the season. Blue has scored 11 goals in the four games since the end of the regular season.
- Blue leads the team with 55 goals. Is second in points (65) and draw controls (56). She is fifth in the ACC in goals per game (2.75) and 14th in points per game (3.25)
- Courtney Swan had a six-point performance in the Princeton victory with four goals and two assists, but did not have any points against UNC. In her last five games, Swan has scored 10 goals with eight assists.
- Swan ranks sixth in the ACC and 21st in the nation, averaging 3.95 points per game
- Swan is 10th in the ACC and 35th in the nation, averaging 2.65 goals per game
- Swan is fourth in the ACC and 16th in the nation in draw controls, averaging 4.60 per game
- Casey Bocklet has seven goals and seven assists in the four games since the end of the regular season. Bocklet is now tied with Swan for the team assist lead, ranking 7th in the ACC with 1.30 per game

IN GOAL

- Liz Colgan is ranked seventh in the nation and leads the ACC in saves per game, averaging 9.45 per contest.
- Colgan has made 195 saves so far this season, ranking third in the nation. Stetson's Caili Guilday leads NCAA Division I with 210.
- She had six saves against Princeton, snapping a streak of six-straight games with double-digit saves
- Colgan ranks third in the ACC and 19th in the nation with a 46.2 save percentage.

DEFENSE

- Daniela Eppler had a career-high five ground balls against Princeton and picked up three more against UNC. Eppler is tied with Liz Colgan for 10th in the ACC with 1.80 per game
- Maddy Keeshan is 14th in the ACC with 1.70 ground balls per game
- Morgan Stephens is ninth in the ACC in caused turnovers, averaging 0.95 per game
- Against North Carolina, Mary Alati had two caused turnovers, including causing UNC to turn the ball over in the final 30 seconds, and three ground balls, including picking up the ground ball after the final UNC turnover to help cement the victory.

IN THE RECORD BOOKS

- Courtney Swan's 92 draw controls this season is already the second-highest single-season total in program history. Swan's 83 draws last season now ranks third. Swan is 5 draw controls shy of tying the single-season mark of 97 set in 2010 by Brittany Kalkstein
- Swan's 183 career draws currently ranks third in the Cavalier record book. She is 12 draws shy of tying Lauren Aumiller (2000-03) for second place
- Liz Colgan's 195 saves is the fifth-highest single-season total in program history. She is four shy of tying Michelle Cusimano's mark of 199 from 1995 in fourth place.
- With five saves, Colgan would become just the fourth player in Cavalier history to log 200 saves in a season

VS RANKED OPPONENTS IN 2014

- The Cavaliers are 6-5 against top-20 teams
- The Cavaliers are 5-5 against top-10 teams
- The Cavaliers are 1-4 against top-5 teams

VS UNRANKED OPPONENTS

- Since 2007, Virginia has only lost four times to unranked opponents, going 51-4 in that span against teams not ranked in the IWLCA Top-20
- One of those losses came earlier this season when Virginia fell 15-13 at then-unranked Princeton.

NON-CONFERENCE

- Virginia finished its regular-season non-conference slate with a 6-3 record.

2014 CAPTAINS

- Fourth-years Maddy Keeshan and Ashlee Warner are this year's team captains, as determined by a vote of the team.

ALL-ACC

- In the first year of having first and second team designation in All-Conference honors, goalkeeper Liz Colgan was named to the first team
- Attacker Courtney Swan and defender Morgan Stephens earned second team honors

IWLCA ALL-SOUTH REGION

- Four Cavaliers earned first team honors, the most since the 2008 season: goalkeeper Liz Colgan, attackers Liza Blue and Courtney Swan and defender Morgan Stephens
- Midfielder Maddy Keeshan was named to the second team

IWLCA ALL-AMERICAN

- Goalkeeper Liz Colgan was named to the first team. Attacker Courtney Swan and defender Morgan Stephens were second team. Attacker Liza Blue was on the third team
- Colgan was the first Virginia player to earn first-team honors since 2010 and the first Cavalier goal keeper to earn first team honors since 1996

TEWAARATON NOMINEE

- Courtney Swan was one of 27 women to move from the Watch List to become one of the nominees for the award.

FEB. 23: No. 2 SYRACUSE 18, No. 9 UVa 14

- Two 4-0 runs by Syracuse in the midst of the first period spelled the difference as the Orange were victorious over Virginia at Klöckner Stadium in each team's ACC opener
- Syracuse held an 11-7 advantage at halftime, with both teams scoring seven second-half goals
- Courtney Swan had six points, with four goals and a pair of assists. Swan also won 10 draw controls.
- Liz Colgan made nine saves.
- Syracuse's Kayla Treanor scored five goals with two assists. Devon Collins scored four goals. Kailah Kempney had five assists while also scoring a goal
- Virginia had a 19-15 edge in draw controls. Syracuse led 34-32 in shots.

NCAA TOURNAMENT QUARTERS

- After falling in the NCAA Tournament to the Tar Heels in three of the last four seasons, Virginia earned a 10-9 upset victory at Chapel Hill against the No. 3 seed
- Virginia erased a four-goal second half deficit by going on a 6-0 run
- During Virginia's 6-0 run, North Carolina went a span of over 12 minutes in which they did not have a possession. Virginia scored on five-consecutive shots and won six-straight draw controls during their run
- After a turnover, North Carolina had a shot at an empty net with 2:16 remaining that would have tied the game, but a Virginia defender managed to get just enough of the shot to deflect it wide
- After UNC got the Cavaliers to turn the ball over with 26 seconds left in the game, Mary Alati forced a Tar Heel turnover, coming up with the ground ball that helped Virginia run out the clock and secure the victory
- Casey Bocklet had two goals and three assists
- Liza Blue had two goals, two assists and three draws
- Liz Colgan made nine saves, including six in the second half

NCAA TOURNAMENT SECOND ROUND

- After earning a first-round bye, sixth-seeded Virginia defeated Princeton, 13-11, in Charlottesville
- Virginia jumped out to a 4-0 lead with Swan scoring a hat trick in the first ten minutes of the game. The Cavaliers took an 8-4 advantage into halftime
- Princeton scored the first two goals of the second half to cut the deficit to two, 8-6. Virginia had four different players score during a 4-0 run that gave the squad a 12-6 lead heading into the final 14 minutes of play. Princeton countered with a 4-0 run of its own, capped by back-to-back goals by Sivilli within a minute of one another, to narrow the score to 12-10 with 3:29 remaining.
- Liza Blue won the final three draw controls of the game to help Virginia seal the victory.
- Courtney Swan had six points with four goals and two assists, also winning five draws. Blue scored three goals with five draws. Daniela Eppler picked up a career-high five ground balls.

ACC TOURNAMENT VS DUKE

- 5-seed Virginia upset 4-seed Duke 7-5 in the opening round of the ACC Tournament.
- Virginia won all seven draw controls in the second half and held an 11-3 overall edge in draws. Casey Bocklet scored three unassisted goals in the first half and also added a second-half assist. Liz Colgan finished the game with 10 saves, including stopping eight shots in the first half.
- Duke outshot the Cavaliers 16-9 in the first half, but both teams took nine shots in the second period. Each team had 13 ground balls with Daniela Eppler picking up three and Colgan corraling four.

REGULAR-SEASON FINALE

- No. 15 Virginia closed out the 2014 regular season with a 17-12 victory at Virginia Tech
- After trailing 3-1 ten minutes into the game, the Cavaliers went on an 8-1 run, which included scoring three goals in a span of 32 seconds, to take a 9-4 lead with 3:42 left in the first half.
- Virginia outshot the Hokies 17-9 in the first half but Virginia Tech held an 18-11 edge in the second half. Virginia had a 17-14 edge in draw controls. The Cavaliers committed seven turnovers in the second half with the Hokies committing two.
- Courtney Swan had her second eight-point game of the season, scoring five goals with three assists.

'HOOS IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

- Virginia is one of five programs in the NCAA to be ranked at least once in every year of the IWLCA Coaches Poll. The poll was created in 1988, with Dartmouth, Maryland, Penn State and Princeton joining Virginia as the only programs to be nationally ranked every year.
- Of those five programs, Virginia is the only program to be ranked in every week of the IWLCA coaches poll, a span of 268-straight polls.
- Of those 268 polls, the Cavaliers have been ranked among the top-10 in the nation on 229 occasions, the second-most among all NCAA programs.
- The Cavaliers have spent 15 weeks ranked No. 1, including the entire 1993 season, en route to the program's second national championship.
- Virginia debuted at No. 7 in the inaugural coaches poll on March 19, 1988. While the Cavaliers have climbed to a No. 1 ranking, the farthest they have ever fallen was to No. 19 on April 23, 2013. Virginia has only spent five weeks ranked outside the top-15.

BACK-TO-BACK TOP-10 WINS

- No. 16 Virginia upset No. 9 Notre Dame (at ND) and No. 6 Boston College (on UVa's Senior Day) in back-to-back games
- Behind 11 first-half saves by Liz Colgan the Cavaliers held the Irish to one goal in the opening 30 minutes, leading a 4-1 at the break.
- In the second half, Virginia had a 13-4 edge in draw controls, helping the Cavaliers secure their first conference win of the season.
- Kelly Boyd, Courtney Swan and Maddy Keeshan each scored a hat trick with Boyd also adding an assist. Casey Bocklet scored a goal with three assists.
- Virginia held a slight advantage in shots, 31-27. Notre Dame was 0-of-4 on free position shots while UVa made 2-of-4.
- Colgan finished the game with 16 saves. Notre Dame's Allie Murray made 10 saves.
- Swan won a game-high seven draw controls while also causing three turnovers
- Against Boston College, Virginia held a 7-2 lead with five minutes left in the first half, but BC scored four goals before the break, including scoring with 3.8 seconds left in the period, to go into the break trailing by a point, 7-6.
- The score was tied four different times in the second half.
- With the score tied 12-12, Liza Blue started a string of four-straight Cavalier goals by scoring off a feed from junior Casey Bocklet with 10:02 remaining. Posey Valis capped the run with an empty-netter with 56 seconds remaining to give UVa a 16-12 advantage. BC won the ensuing draw control, scoring 20 seconds later. The Eagles again won the draw and scored with 23 seconds left in the game to narrow the gap to 16-14. BC again won the draw control with Cali Ceglarski getting fouled with six seconds remaining, setting up a free position attempt. Liz Colgan made a save on her shot and was able to hold onto the ball until time expired.
- Virginia only committed one turnover in the second half.
- Colgan finished the game with 10 saves.
- Maddy Keeshan scored four goals. Fellow senior Liza Blue scored three goals with three assists while also winning five draw controls. Courtney Swan scored four goals with two assists, winning six draws.

VIRGINIA FOUR-GAME WIN STREAK

- Virginia's four-game win streak earlier this season was the team's longest since 2010.
- In the middle two games, Virginia outscored opponents 15-2 in the first half, holding both American and Notre Dame to a lone goal in the opening frame.
- In the first three games, Virginia has outscored opponents 29-7 in the first half.
- During the win streak, Courtney Swan has scored 14 goals with three assists. Liza Blue has scored 11 goals with five assists.
- Kelly Boyd scored eight goals on 10 shots.
- Liz Colgan saved 52.2 percent of the shots she has faced in the last four games.
- 14 different Cavaliers scored at least one goal.
- In the four games, Virginia is shooting 57.5 percent and is 8-of-13 on free position attempts.
- Virginia had a 51-25 draw control advantage in the first three games of the streak.
- Junior Casey Bocklet had three assists in each of the four games.

VARIED ATTACK

- Against American, freshman Besser Dyson and sophomore Brooke Boyd became the 17th and 18th different Cavaliers to score a goal this season. It was also the first career goal for both players.

22 SAVES AGAINST UNC/ 14 VS LOYOLA

- Senior goalkeeper Liz Colgan logged 22 saves against North Carolina, at the time the highest single-game save tally this season by any goalie in NCAA Division I.
- It was also the highest number of saves in a game for a Cavalier goalkeeper since Michelle Cusimano logged 26 saves in the 14-13 overtime loss to Princeton in the 1994 NCAA National Semifinal game.
- It was only the 11th time in school history that a goalkeeper logged more than 20 saves in a single game.
- The 22 saves ties for fourth-most in a game by a Cavalier goalie. The record mark of 27 was set in 1981 by Heather Dow against Richmond.
- Colgan had 14 saves against Loyola which had been the most saves by a Cavalier goalie since Ginger Miles logged 15 against North Carolina on March 19, 2005.

COMEBACK AGAINST JMU

- The JMU comeback was the first time this season the Cavaliers overcame a halftime deficit and came back to win a game.
- JMU scored three times in the final 2:10 of the first half to take an 8-5 lead at the break
- The Cavaliers trailed 9-5 with 24:16 remaining in the game, but rallied to score seven-straight goals.
- James Madison committed 10 turnovers in the second half, while Virginia turned the ball over only four times in the period. The Cavaliers took 16 shots in the half while JMU attempted six.
- Overall, UVa outshot JMU 31-20. James Madison also struggled from the eight-meter line, going 0-of-4 on free position shots.
- Liz Blue had three goals and an assist. Casey Bocklet also scored a hat trick.

SWAN'S 8-POINT GAMES

- Courtney Swan scored four goals with four assists in the 22-9 victory at William & Mary.
- She scored her four goals on just five shots.
- Eight points was a career high and the most by a Cavalier player since Charlie Finnigan had eight pints against Syracuse in 2011
- Swan matched the eight points with five goals and three assists at Virginia Tech in the season-finale
- The eight points ties for the second-highest total by an ACC player in a game this season and her eight points at Virginia Tech was the highest in a conference game.

RECRUITING CLASS NEWS AND NOTES

- Kasey Behr, Lilly DiNardo, Ana Hagerup, Meghan Heick, Daniela Kelly, Rachel Vander Kolk and Jacqueline Wasilko have signed National Letters of Intent to play for the Cavaliers beginning with the 2015 season.
- The recruiting class was ranked No. 3 by *Inside Lacrosse* magazine.
